Swimming Pool

A favorite of the campsite team, the new heated swimming pool will appeal to young and old alike! You can take a dip or sunbathe according to the current schedule. During periods of high traffic and heat waves, lifeguards take two 30-minute breaks per day.

This new space, the terrace and river dock, will undoubtedly become one of your favorites! It's the perfect spot to admire the stunning sunsets over the Saint-François River, as well as a safe access point for fishing, regardless of the water level in the river.

This magnificent multifunctional walk that runs along the campsite and the river remains a must during your stay! 4.5 km long, it now extends beyond the Domaine Trent. Access gate near the pool. You will need your barrier code to open it.

Just like at home, the campground provides **recycling, composting, waste bins**, and **specific bins for bottle deposits**. A sorting station is now available at the campground exit.

All profits from bottle deposits go to the GARAF school program in Drummondville. Since 2024, we have been collaborating with GARAF on our environmental projects, such as managing invasive exotic plants and planting trees.

Did you Know That?

Did you know that the wood you burn could be a ticking time bomb for the campground's forest and the whole region?

Transporting firewood is an important vector of tree diseases. Some harmful and newly established insects (like the emerald ash borer) or those that are making their way here (like the Asian long-horned beetle) represent significant risks to our forests.

To reduce these risks, please leave your firewood at home and get your wood directly from the campground.

The health of our forests could depend on this simple gesture.

Check-in and check-out

Camping: Check-in 3 p.m. | Check-out 2 p.m.

Ready-to-camp: Check-in 5 p.m. | Check-out 12 noon

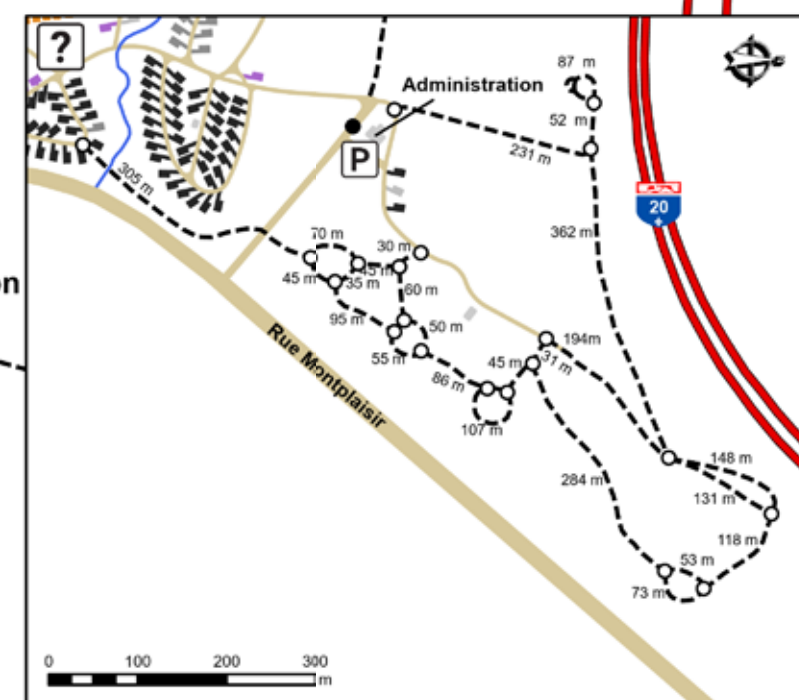

A campsite can accommodate 6 campers (**maximum 4 adults - 18 years+**).

Adult visitors must pay an access fee and are allowed on campsites from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. The total number of people on the site must never exceed 12.

A **curfew** is in effect **from 11 p.m. to 8 a.m.**
