THE QUEEN AND ROYAL FAMILY.

Her Majesty **ALEXANDRINA VICTORIA**, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, &c., Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India, Shri Shri Rani Victoria, Kaiser-i-Hind). Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the throne 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV.; was crowned 28th June, 1838; and married 10th February, 1840, to His late Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel, PRINCE CONSORT, DUKE OF SAXONY, PRINCE OF COBOURG AND GOTHA, who was born 6th August, 1819; died 14th December, 1861. Her Majesty is the only child of His late Royal Highness, Edward Duke of Kent, fourth son of King George III. The children of Her Majesty are:

Her Royal Highness Victoria Adelaide Mary Louisa, PRINCESS ROYAL OF ENGLAND AND PRUSSIA, born November 21, 1840, and married to His Royal Highness William, the late Emperor of Germany, January 25, 1858, and has issue living, three sons and four daughters.

His Royal Highness ALBERT EDWARD, PRINCE OF WALES, DUKE OF SAXONY, CORNWALL AND ROTHEWAY, EARL OF DUBLIN, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., K.T.S., G.C.B., P.C., general, colonel of the 10th Hussars, and colonel-in-chief of the Rifle Brigade, born 9th of November, 1841; married 10th March, 1863, to the Princess Alexandra Caroline Mary Charlotte Louisa Julia (born 1st December, 1844), eldest daughter of the King of Denmark, and has issue His Royal Highness Prince Albert Victor Christian Edward, born 8th January, 1864; His Royal Highness Prince George Frederick Ernest Albert, born 3rd June, 1865; Her Royal Highness Princess Louisa Victoria Alexandra Dagmar, born 20th February, 1867; Her Royal Highness Princess Victoria Alexandra Olga Mary, born 6th July, 1868; Her Royal Highness Princess Maud Charlotte Mary Victoria, born 26th November, 1869, and His Royal Highness Prince Alexander John C. Albert, born 6th April, 1871, died 7th April, 1871.

Her Royal Highness Alice Maud Mary, born April 25, 1843, married His Royal Highness Prince Frederick Louis of Hesse, July 1, 1862, died Dec. 14, 1878; issue living, four daughters and one son.

His Royal Highness Alfred Ernest Albert, Duke of Edinburgh, born Aug. 6, 1844; married the Grand Duchess Marie of Russia, Jan. 9, 1874, and has issue a son and four daughters.

Her Royal Highness Helena Augusta Victoria, born May 25, 1846; married to His Royal Highness Prince Frederick Christian Charles Augustus of Schleswig-Holstein Sonderburg-Augustenburg, July 5, 1866, and has issue living, one son and two daughters.

Her Royal Highness Louisa Carolina Alberta, born March 18, 1848; married to the Marquis of Lorne, eldest son of the Duke of Argyll, March 21, 1871.

His Royal Highness Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, born May 1, 1850; married Princess Louise Margaret of Prussia, March 13, 1879; issue, a daughter, born Jan. 15, 1882, a son, born Jan. 13, 1883, and a daughter born March 17, 1886.

His Royal Highness Leopold George Duncan Albert, Duke of Albany, born April 7, 1853; married April 22, 1882, Princess Helen of Waldeck; died March 29, 1884; issue a daughter, born Feb. 26, 1883, and a son born July 19, 1884.

“Provided that in all cases of rate payers having two or more pleasure vehicles in their possession, they shall not be liable to pay the tax on more vehicles than they have horses to drive the same; the highest description of vehicles, however, to be assessed in preference to those of a lesser value.”

Dogs—to be licensed annually at the office of the Chief of Police; amount of license,—\$2 for a male, and \$3 for a female dog.

Tariff of Rates.—To be collected annually by the Chief of Police for licenses issued to carters and others using hackney-carriages or vehicles for the conveyance of passengers, or the transport of goods, wares, merchandise, building materials, produce or other articles in the city of Montreal.

The licenses for carts, trucks, and other vehicles used for the conveyance of goods, wares, merchandise, &c., shall be divided into three classes, as follows:—

The first class shall include all carts, trucks, waggons, and other vehicles running within the city for hire or reward, not otherwise expressly provided for, and shall pay:—

For every cart, truck, or other two-wheeled vehicle—Two Dollars.....	\$2.00
For every waggon or four-wheeled vehicle, drawn by one horse—Six Dollars.....	6.00

For every waggon or four-wheeled vehicle drawn by two horses, and made to carry a load under 4,000 lbs. weight—Seven Dollars.....	7.00
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For every heavy waggon, float or other four-wheeled vehicle, drawn by two or more horses, and made to carry heavy articles or materials weighing 4,000 lbs., or upwards—Nine Dollars.....	9.00
For every diable—Four Dollars.....	4.00

The second-class shall include all carts, waggons or other vehicles used by merchants, traders, manufacturers, contractors, for the conveyance or delivery of the articles or effects dealt in, manufactured, or made use of by them, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for in the first-class—Two Dollars and fifty cents..... 2.50

The third-class shall include all carts, waggons, or vehicles used by expressmen, bakers, brewers, distillers, farmers, or gardeners, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for in the first-class—Five Dollars..... 5.00

1. For every hearse drawn by one horse ...	10 00.
2. For every hearse drawn by two horses....	14 00

Parties obtaining licenses, as aforesaid, shall moreover pay the annual assessment on all working horses, employed in drawing the above-mentioned vehicles or carriages at the rate of two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) each, and also twenty-five cents for each number granted by the Chief of Police.

TARIFF OF WATER RATES.

Dwelling Houses.—For every Tenement or Dwelling House occupied by one family only:—
 When assessed at a yearly rental not exceeding \$30 per annum, \$5 00; when assessed at a yearly rental exceeding \$30 but not over \$40, \$5.75; when assessed at a yearly rental exceeding \$40 but not over \$50, \$6.50; and so on, continuing

according to the same scale, that is to say, adding for every additional sum of \$10 or any part thereof, \$0.75; for every additional family lodging in or occupying any part of such Tenement or Dwelling House, an additional rate shall be exacted equal to one-third of the rate imposed for a single family.

Stores, Shops, Offices, &c.—For each House, part of a House or Tenement occupied as a Store, Shop, Office, Warehouse, Manufactory, or other place of business:—when assessed at a yearly rental not exceeding \$50 per annum, \$4.00; when assessed at a yearly rental exceeding \$50 but not over \$75, \$5.00; when assessed at a yearly rental exceeding \$75 but not over \$100, \$6.00; and so on, continuing according to the same scale, that is to say, adding for every additional sum of \$25, or any part thereof, *One Dollar*, \$1.00.

Stores, Shops, Offices and other places of business, when attached to a Dwelling occupied by the same party, to be charged at Dwelling House rates on the full rental of the whole tenement, when such rental does not exceed one hundred dollars per annum.

Schools, Churches, Hospitals, &c.—Every building used as a college, academy, seminary of learning or school, all churches, poor or alms houses, nunneries, houses of industry, and generally all religious or charitable institutions, hospitals and reformatories shall be charged at Shop Rates, to be based and determined upon the interest, at four per cent. of the actual value of the property in each case, the said value as set forth and established in and by the assessment roll last made and revised; provided that all such institutions, with the exception of churches, may, if they see fit, use water by meter and pay therefor at the same rate as distilleries, breweries and other establishments hereinafter mentioned.

Hotels, Taverns, or Eating Houses, Restaurants.—When assessed at a yearly rental not exceeding \$100 per annum, \$12.00; when assessed at a yearly rental exceeding \$100 but not over \$150, \$17.00; when assessed at a yearly rental exceeding \$150 but not over \$200, \$22.00; and so on, continuing according to the same scale, that is to say, adding for every additional sum of \$50 or any part thereof, *Five Dollars*, \$5.00.

Provided that for Hotels whose assessed rental per annum will be \$400 and over, and which will be provided with at least twenty furnished rooms for the accommodation of travellers, water shall be charged by meter and paid for at the same rate as distilleries, breweries, &c.

Hand Hoses.—For the right to attach and use a hose of not more than one-fourth of an inch orifice, for watering purposes, \$2.00.

Building Materials payable in advance.—For every thousand bricks used, the water therefor to be charged, \$0.08; for every toise of Masonry, the water therefor to be charged, \$0.05; for every thousand yards of plastering, \$4.00.

Fountains.—Fountains shall only be supplied with water at the discretion of the Water Committee, and when so supplied shall be charged as follows: for every 100 gallons of water, \$0.03; the quantity used to be determined in all cases by the estimate of the Water Committee or by meter.

Baths.—Public Baths, or baths for the use of which a charge is made—for each tub, \$6.00; with power to the Water Committee to charge by meter if they see fit.

Horses and Cows.—For each horse, \$2.00; for each cow, \$1.00; livery stable keepers shall pay—for each single stall, whether occupied or unoccupied, \$2.00; hotel and tavern keepers shall be charged—for each single stall, whether occupied or unoccupied, \$1.00.

Water Closets.—For each Pan Closet supplied from a cistern, with a service box and valve, \$4.00; for each Pan Closet with Underhays, or any other regulator approved of by the Water Department, \$3.00; for each Hopper Closet with Underhays, or any other regulator approved of by the Water Department, \$3.00; for each Closet of any kind, with cistern, service box, and double valve, \$4.00; trough Closets with self-acting valve, or cock, for each seat, or for every two lineal feet, \$3.00; for any other kind of closet, each, \$15.00.

In dwellings where there is more than one water closet, each additional water closet shall be charged at half rates.

“In dwelling houses or tenements assessed on a yearly rental of one hundred and fifty dollars or under, no charge shall be made for water closets: provided that the exemption thus granted shall not be held as depriving the City from the right to cut off the supply of water in all cases of non-payment of the ordinary annual water-rates.”

Urinals.—For each urinal with self-acting valve, or cock, running only when being used: In a Dwelling House or Store, \$1.00; in a Bank or public building, \$1.50; in a Hotel, Restaurant, Saloon or Tavern, \$3.00; for any other kinds of Urinals, \$15.00.

Steam Engines.—For stationary high pressure Engines, working not over twelve hours per day:

For each horse power, \$7.00; or for every hundred gallons of water (the supply to be determined by meter), \$0.03; for stationary low pressure Engines: for every 100 gallons of water (the supply to be determined as above, by meter), \$0.03.

All rates herein imposed for Steam Engines shall be separate from and over and above any other rate for water imposed on the premises.

Distilleries, Breweries, &c.—Distilleries, Breweries, Dye Houses, Railway, Printing and Photographic establishments, and all manufacturing establishments, Colleges, Seminaries, Nunneries, Hospitals, Asylums, Academies, Houses of Industry and Reformatories, may be supplied by meter and charged as follows:

When the quantity used averages 1,000 gallons per day or less, at the rate of 30 cents per 1,000 gallons; when the quantity used averages from 1,000 to 2,000 gallons per day at the rate of 29 cents per 1,000 gallons.

From 2,000 to 3,000...	\$0.28	From 6,000 to 7,000...	\$0.21
From 3,000 to 4,000...	0.27	From 7,000 to 8,000...	0.19
From 4,000 to 5,000...	0.25	From 8,000 to 9,000...	0.17
From 5,000 to 6,000...	0.23	From 9,000 to 10,000...	0.15

When the quantity averages over 10,000 gallons per day, 15 cents per 1,000 gallons.

Provided that Charitable Institutions, wholly supported by means of public subscriptions, shall be charged at the rate of one and a half cent per 100 gallons.

The meters shall be furnished by the City and placed within the premises of the consumers, whose duty it shall be to see that the same are protected from frost or injury, the whole under

the direction of the Water Department; such meters shall at all times be accessible to the Corporation Meter Inspector.

An annual rent shall be paid by the consumers for the cost and care of such meters, as follows :

For a 1/2 inch meter..	\$3.00	For a 2 inch meter..	\$14.00
For a 3/4 " "	3.75	For a 3 " "	25.00
For a 1 " "	4.75	For a 4 " "	45.00
For a 1 1/2 " "	8.00	For a 6 " "	100.00

The above rent to be paid semi-annually, that is to say: one half on the first day of May and the other half on the first day of November in each year.

Persons desirous of supplying their own meter may do so with the previous sanction and written permit of the Superintendent of Water Works.

When water is required for purposes not specified in the foregoing Tariff, the rate shall be fixed by the Water Committee.

The Water Committee shall have power to ascertain, by meter, the quantity of water used in any of the above cases, and charge accordingly.

Discount on Taxes.—Sec. 1.—A discount of three per cent. shall be allowed every year to all rate payers in the city of Montreal, who will pay on or before the first day of October, and a discount of two per cent. to those who will pay in the month of October, the amount of assessment and taxes (drain accounts and special assessments for street improvements excepted) due by them respectively for the then current year.

Sec. 2.—“A discount of five per cent. shall be allowed to all water tenants who will pay in one instalment the whole of the said rates on or before the fifteenth August in each and every year.”

TARIFF OF CARTAGE.

From any place to any other in the First Division, or from any place exclusive of the Harbor wharves to any other place in the City, and vice versa, provided the distance do not exceed 1/2 of a mile.

Articles not herein enumerated of a convenient bulk, not over 1,500 lbs. weight, 15 cts. Ashes, pot or pearl, two barrels, 15 cts. Beef, pork or fish, five barrels or tierces, 15 cts. Coal or coke, half a chaldron or half a ton, 15 cts. Crockery, one crate or one hogshead, 15 cts. Flour or fruit, seven barrels, 15 cts. Grain not over 1,500 lbs. weight, 15 cts. Lumber sawn, from yard or boat, 500 feet broad measure, 15 cts. Salt or rice, six bags or six barrels, 15 cts. Firewood, dry, from yard or boat, half a cord, three feet long, 15 cts. Firewood, green or from rafts, half a cord, three feet long, 20 cts. Furniture or luggage, per load, 20 cts. Lumber, green or hard from rafts, 500 feet broad measure, 20 cts. Molasses, sugar or oil, one puncheon, hogshead or load, 20 cts. Pig iron, lead, copper, or tin, one ton, 25 cts. Bar iron or steel, one ton, 30 cts. For every additional half mile for all above description of goods, 10 cents, and from any of the Harbor wharve to any place in the 2nd or 3rd division within 1/2 a mile distance from the boundary line of the first division, and vice versa, or from any place [exclusive of the wharves] to any other in the City, and vice versa, provided the distance do not exceed 1 1/4 mile,—instead of 15, 20, 25 and 30 cts., the rate shall be 25, 30, 35 and 40 cents.

From any place in the Western section of the first Division.

To the stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine Canal, 20 cts. The stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine canal, 25 cts. The Basins above Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine canal, 25 cts. The Basins above Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine Canal, and the stores, stations, factories, etc., at Point St. Charles, 35 cents. The stores, factories, etc., at and above St. Gabriel Locks, north of Lachine Canal, 30 cents. The St. Bonaventure Street Railway Station, 20 cents. St. Bonaventure Street, from the lower wharves of the Harbor, 35 cts. And vice versa for one load.

And from any place in the Eastern section of the first Division—instead of 20, 25, 25, 35, 39, 20, 25 cents, the rates shall be 25, 30, 30, 40, 35, 25, 30 cents.

For any excess over the quantity or weight fixed for a load, additional pro rata rates shall be paid.

If delay is caused to the carter by the employer, beyond the time usually required for loading, the carter shall be paid extra for such delay at the rate of five cents for every quartet of an hour.

If a carter is called, and there be no load ready for him, or if he be unable to load the goods or articles for want of assistance, he shall be paid as if he carried a load the distance thus unnecessarily travelled.

DIVISIONS REFERRED TO ABOVE.

First Division.—The First Division shall comprise the East, Centre, and West Wards (including the south-west side of McGill street and the north-west side of Craig street), and shall be sub-divided into two sections, Eastern and Western, the line of demarcation between them being the centre of St. Lambert and St. Jean Baptiste streets.

Second Division.—The Second Division shall comprise the St. Ann, St. Antoine, and St. Lawrence Wards (exclusive of McGill and Craig streets).

Third Division.—The Third Division shall comprise (exclusive of Craig street) the St. Louis, St. James and St. Mary Wards.

TARIFF OF FARES FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

One horse vehicles.—Time allowed—Fifteen minutes, for one or two persons, 25 cents; for three or four persons, 40 cents. Time allowed—Thirty minutes, for one or two persons, 40 cents; for three or four persons, 60 cents.

For the first hour.—For one or two persons, 75 cents; for three or four persons, \$1. For every subsequent hour, for one or two persons, 60 cents; for three or four persons, 75 cents.

Two horse vehicle.—Time allowed—Fifteen minutes, for one or two persons, 50 cents; for three or four persons, 65 cents. Time allowed—Thirty minutes, for one or two persons, 65 cents; for three or four persons, 75 cents. For one or two persons, \$1; for three or four persons, \$1 25 cents.

Baggage.—For each trunk carried in any such vehicle, 10 cents;

No charge for travelling bags, valises, boxes or parcels which passengers can carry by the hand;

a. When the drive exceeds half an hour, hour rate to be charged : fractions of hours for any drive exceeding one hour shall be charged at *pro rata* hour rates as above established for drives by the hour ;

b. For drives between midnight and four o'clock in the morning, fifty per cent. shall be added to the tariff rates above established ;

c. The tariff by time shall apply to all drives extending beyond the city limits, provided the engagement be made within said limits.

CHIMNEY SWEEPING.

Clauses of Municipal Act regulating dates for sweeping, tariff to be charged therefor, &c.

Sec. 93.—Each chimney in use in the said city shall be swept by licensed sweeps three times at least in the course of every twelve months, to be computed from the first day of January in each and every year, namely:—once between the first of January and the first of May, once between the first of May and the first of September, and once between the first of September and the first of January in each and every year.

Sec. 94.—The said inspector may grant licenses to sweep chimneys as aforesaid to so many qualified persons as he may deem necessary; and he may revoke and withdraw the said licenses whenever and as often as he may deem expedient; provided, however, that no licensed sweep shall use any brush, broom or other contrivance for the purpose of sweeping chimneys without first having submitted the same to the inspector of buildings for his approval.

Sec. 95.—The inspector may for the purposes aforesaid divide the city into as many districts as he may deem necessary to efficiently carry out the provisions of the next preceding sections, and he may assign a district to every such sweeper, subject, however, to such changes from time to time as the said inspector may deem expedient to make.

Sec. 96.—Such sweepers will be under the superintendence of the said inspector, and it shall be their duty to obey such orders and instructions as he may from time to time issue in connection with the sweeping of chimneys.

Sec. 97.—The following shall be the fees to be demanded and received by each licensed sweep for cleansing and sweeping chimneys.

For sweeping each chimney in a one story house, eight cents.

For sweeping each chimney in a two stor house, ten cents.

For sweeping each chimney in a three story house, thirteen cents.

For sweeping each chimney in a house of four or more stories, fifteen cents.

When any sweeper is specially called upon, outside of his ordinary rounds, to sweep any chimney, the charge in that case shall be twenty-five cents.

Sec. 98.—Such fees shall be payable by the occupant of the house or building wherein such chimneys have been swept, so soon after, and as often as such chimneys are swept; and any person who shall refuse or neglect to pay such fees, or shall prevent any such sweeper from entering into any house or building, or shall in any way obstruct or molest him in the execution of his duties, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

Sec. 99.—Whenever any chimney shall take fire, and it shall appear that the occupant of the house or building where such chimney may be had refused or neglected to have the same swept at any of the periods hereinbefore specified, every such occupant shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

Sec. 100.—The word "Chimney" as applied to the next preceding sections shall mean the interior flue of such chimney.

COURTS OF JUSTICE,

SUPREME COURT OF THE DOMINION.

The Supreme Court, as a high Court of Appeal, constituted by Dominion Statute (Revised Statutes of Canada, Chap. 135), is composed of a Chief Justice and five Puisne Judges, and has appellate, civil and criminal jurisdiction within and throughout the Dominion of Canada. The Judges reside at Ottawa, where the Supreme Court holds annually three Sessions—the first beginning on the third Tuesday in February, the second on the first Tuesday in May, and the third on the fourth Tuesday in October.

THE EXCHEQUER COURT OF THE DOMINION.

The Exchequer Court constituted under a Dominion Statute, 50-52 Vict. Chap. 16, is presided over by one judge and has original exclusive jurisdiction in all claims, suits or actions against the Crown. It has concurrent jurisdiction in relation to revenue cases and the enforcement of penalties, in cases in which it is sought at the instance of the Attorney-General of Canada to impeach or annul any patent of invention or any patent case or other instrument respecting lands: cases against Crown officers for anything done or omitted to be done as such officer, and all actions or suits in which the Crown is plaintiff or petitioner.

LETTER RATES, ETC.

Canada.—Letters posted in Canada, addressed to any place within the Dominion, 3 cents per oz. If unpaid, such letters cannot be forwarded, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office. If insufficiently prepaid, the letter will (provided at least a partial prepayment is made) be forwarded to its destination and double the deficiency charged on delivery. Letters mailed at any office for delivery at or from the same office, provided that the office is not one at which free

delivery by letter carriers is established, are charged 1 cent per oz., and must be at least partially prepaid; otherwise they are sent to the Dead Letter Office. All postage must be prepaid by postage stamps. Letters of this nature mailed at and for delivery from an office at which there is a free delivery by letter carriers are liable to 2 cents per ounce.

Post Cards.—From any place in Canada to any other place in Canada or to the United States, 1 cent each. British and Foreign, 2 cents each.

United Kingdom.—Postage on letters, 5 cents per ½ oz., whether by Canadian or New York Steamers. If sent unpaid, double postage will be charged.

Newfoundland.—Letters, post cards and parcels, same rates and regulations as to United Kingdom. Other matter same rates and regulations as for domestic post.

Bermuda.—Letters, 5 cts. per ½ oz. Newspapers and printed matter generally, 1 cent per 2 oz.

United States.—The rate on letters to the United States is the same as in Canada, and at least one rate must be prepaid.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Persons posting letters containing value should be careful to require them to be registered, and to obtain from the postmaster a certificate of receipt for registration.

The charge for registration (use registration stamp), in addition to the postage, is, on all classes of matter, five cents.

Both the postage charge and registration fee must, in all cases, be prepaid by stamp.

Registered letter stamps have been issued of the denomination of 5 cents, which may be obtained at any Stamp Agency.

Registration stamps cannot be used in payment of postage.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a letter; but a registered letter can be traced where an unregistered letter cannot, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proven.

BOOK POST, ETC.

A book packet may contain any number of separate books, publications, works of literature or art, maps or prints, photographs, daguerreotypes when not on glass, or in frames containing glass; and the books, maps, etc., may be either written, printed or plain, or any mixture of the three, provided that no letter be enclosed or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter; and may be either British, Colonial or Foreign. Limit of weight for domestic post, 5 lbs.; for foreign post, 4 lbs. Limit of size, two feet in length, or one foot in width or depth.

Book packets must be open at both ends or both sides, and must not contain any letter or sealed inclosure.

The rate on book packets between any two places in Canada and to Newfoundland is 1 cent per 4 oz., which must be prepaid by stamps.

The rate to Great Britain and the United States is 1 cent per 2 oz.

MISCELLANEOUS MATTER.

Miscellaneous matter, described as under, may pass between places in the Dominion of Canada upon prepayment of a rate of 1 cent per 4 oz. The limit of weight is 4 lbs. The regulations of the British Post Office do not admit of the transmission by mail to the United Kingdom (or other countries beyond the sea) of miscellaneous matter as such; but a great part of the matter referred to under that head may be forwarded to the United Kingdom by book post.

On all books, pamphlets, occasional publications, printed circulars, prices current, handbills, and other matter wholly in print, and on packages of seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots, scions or grafts, patterns or samples of goods or merchandise, the rate of postage is one cent for each four ounces or fraction of four ounces; and on all book and newspaper manuscripts, printers' proof sheets, whether corrected or not, maps, prints, drawings, engravings, lithographs, photographs, when not on glass or in cases containing glass; sheet music, whether printed or written; documents partly printed or written, not being letters, or intended to serve the purpose of letters—such as deeds, insurance policies, militia and school returns, or other documents of like nature,—and on all other miscellaneous matter transmissible by post and not otherwise herein expressly provided for, the rate of postage is one cent for each two ounces or fraction of two ounces; and the postage rate must in every case be prepaid by postage

stamps, or stamped post bands or wrappers; provided that no letter or other communication is intended to serve the purpose of a letter be sent or inclosed in any such package or thing mentioned, and that the same be sent in covers open at the ends or sides, or otherwise so put up as to admit of the contents being, if necessary, easily withdrawn for examination by the officers of the Post Office to ensure compliance with this provision (if enclosed in sealed envelopes notched at the ends or sides, or with the corners cut off, letter rate of postage will be charged); and that the postage rate be prepaid by postage stamp or stamped post bands or wrappers in all cases. Limit of weight, 4 lbs.

No packet of miscellaneous matter can be transmitted by mail if it exceed 24 inches in length or 12 inches in width or depth.

Legal and commercial papers generally including Bank Pass-Books are liable to letter rate of postage, except when sent as parcels by Parcel Post, and the exceptions above given to matter of that class are restricted to the documents specified, such as deeds and insurance policies.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers and periodicals printed and published in Canada, and issued not less frequently than once a month from a known office of publication or news agency, and addressed and posted to and from the same for transmission by mail to regular subscribers or news agents in Canada, the United States and Newfoundland, are sent free; if addressed to Great Britain, they may be posted by the same on prepayment of a rate of one cent for each pound weight in bulk, or fraction of a pound; and such newspapers and periodicals are to be put up into packages delivered into the Post Office, and the postage rate thereon prepaid by the publisher or news agent, being the sender thereof, under such regulations as the Postmaster-General may from time to time make.

On all newspapers and periodicals posted in Canada, other than those addressed to regular subscribers or news agents, and bona fide specimen copies, from office of publication or news agency, including all newspapers and periodicals published less frequently than once a month, the rate will be one cent per 4 oz., to be invariably prepaid by postage stamp.

Newspapers and periodicals weighing less than 1 oz. each may be posted singly, if prepaid by postage stamp $\frac{1}{2}$ cent each.

The postage on specimen newspapers is one cent per lb.

TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS.

Transient newspapers and periodicals include all newspapers and periodicals in Canada, other than Canada newspapers sent from the office of publication, and British newspapers posted by news agents for regular subscribers in Canada. When addressed to any place within the Dominion, Newfoundland, or the United States, they must be prepaid the following rates by postage stamp:—

If weighing less than 1 oz., half a cent each.

If weighing over 1 oz., one cent per four oz., or fraction of four oz.

On transient newspapers addressed to the United Kingdom the rate will be one cent per 2 oz.—to be prepaid by postage stamp. Canada newspapers posted from the office of publication to subscribers in the United Kingdom—if to be sent in the mails forwarded via New York must

be prepaid by postage stamp at the transient paper rate of one cent per 2 oz.; but if sent by Canada Packet, such papers may pass, as now, on repayment by the publisher, at the rate of one cent per pound. All newspapers and periodicals prepaid at the bulk rate of 1 cent per lb. must be stamped "Prepaid by Publisher" at the Post Office where the newspaper or periodical is mailed. The English Post Office requires each newspaper or periodical to be stamped. If sent in packages the English Post Office declines to accept them.

PATTERNS AND SAMPLES WITHIN THE DOMINION.

Patterns and samples of merchandise and goods for sale, not exceeding 24 oz. in weight, may be posted, in Canada, to be forwarded to any place within the Dominion, on prepayment by postage stamp of a rate of 1 cent per 4 oz., under the following regulations:

If such rate be not fully prepaid by the stamps affixed, the packet to be rated with the deficient postage, and a fine of 5 cents in addition.

Packages of samples and patterns, addressed to any place in Canada, may be registered by affixing thereto stamps to the value of 5 cents in addition to the postage rate, and provided such packet be handed into the Post Office for registration.

Patterns or samples must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination. Samples, however, of seeds, drugs, etc., which cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen, or such like material, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened; or in bags entirely closed, provided that they be transparent, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents.

The packet may bear on the outside the address of the sender, in addition to the address of the person for whom it may be intended; and also a trade mark or number, and the price of the sample enclosed; inside, there must be no enclosure but the samples or patterns themselves. The particulars, however, of the trade marks, numbers, and prices may be marked on the articles themselves instead of on the outside of the packet, at the option of the sender.

Goods sent for sale or in execution of an order, however small the quantity may be, or any article sent by one private individual to another, which are not actually trade patterns or samples, are not admissible.

UNITED KINGDOM AND UNITED STATES.

Patterns and samples of merchandise, when addressed to places in the United Kingdom and United States, must not exceed 8 oz. in weight, and must be prepaid by postage stamp at the following rates:—1 cent per 2 oz. or fraction of 2 oz., with a minimum prepayment of 2 cents covering a weight of 4 oz.

USEFUL HINTS.

Register all valuable letters. Transmit money by Money Orders. Make complaints and inquiries in writing, and address the Postmaster-General at Ottawa. Preserve, and request correspondents to preserve, envelopes of misssent or delayed letters. Send to the Postmaster-General envelopes of letters about which you seek information or make complaint. In addressing letters add the name of the county and province in which the office addressed is located. Place stamp on the right hand upper corner of the

address side. Put your own name and full address in or on letter, to insure return if it cannot be delivered.

PARCEL POST.

The charge on parcels by the Parcel Post to places within the Dominion is 6 cents for every 4 oz. or fraction thereof (with 5 cents additional if registered). No letter must be inclosed; if any discovered, the amount paid will be forfeited, and the parcel charged at unpaid letter rates. No parcel must exceed 5 lbs. in weight, and must be prepaid by stamps.

Eye-glasses and spectacles may be sent by mail when properly put up and prepaid by Parcel Post.

PARCEL POST WITH THE UNITED KINGDOM AND NEWFOUNDLAND.

An arrangement has been entered into with the Post Office of the United Kingdom and Newfoundland for a Parcel Post, under which closed parcels not exceeding 5 lbs. in weight may be posted in the United Kingdom and Newfoundland, when addressed for delivery at certain Post Offices in Canada, and may in like manner be posted at those Canadian Post Offices for destinations in the United Kingdom and Newfoundland.

The parcels exchanged with the United Kingdom will pass exclusively in the Weekly Mails conveyed by the Canadian Steamers to and from the St. Lawrence in summer and Halifax in winter, and such parcels cannot be sent via New York.

The Parcel Post with the United Kingdom and Newfoundland will be governed by the following regulations:—

1. A parcel must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight.
2. The dimensions of a parcel must not exceed 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth.
3. A parcel must not contain any explosive, combustible, or dangerous articles, nor any article of a perishable or fragile character, nor liquids or matters likely to injure other parcels or mail transmissions.
4. All parcels must be securely and substantially packed and closed.
5. Each parcel must be plainly directed and such direction must include the name and full address of the person for whom the parcel is intended.
6. For each parcel the sender must fill up a Customs Declaration. On this form the sender will supply an accurate statement of the contents and value of the parcel, also the address thereof, with signature, and place of abode of the sender. The Customs Declaration must be securely affixed by mullage or paste to the parcel to which it relates.

Parcels from the United Kingdom will be liable to Canadian Custom duties, and under existing regulations must be examined for the purpose by an officer of the Customs in the presence of the persons addressed.

PARCEL POST CHARGE.

All the Dominion, except British Columbia, 25 cents per pound or fraction of a pound. British Columbia, 30 cents per pound or fraction of a pound

Propayment by postage stamp is required, but when a parcel is posted in the United Kingdom or Newfoundland, for British Columbia, and by inadvertence prepaid at a lower rate than that applicable to that Province, the parcel will come to Canada, liable to collection by the

Canada Post Office, on delivery, of the deficient postage, and it will moreover be optional with the Canada Post Office to impose a fine in addition.

FIFTH CLASS MATTER.

Postage rate one cent per ounce or fraction of an ounce, to be prepaid by postage stamp. Miscellaneous articles of merchandise, including seeds, bulbs, etc., to United States, and generally all matter permitted to pass by mail in Canada, which is of the nature of a letter, and therefore subject to letter rate of postage and not entitled to be posted at a lower rate than 5th class under one or the other classes, may pass as 5th class when addressed to any destination within the Dominion or United States. Fifth class matter must be so packed or put up as to be opened to examination of contents, and must not exceed 4 pounds in weight, nor 2 feet in length by one foot in width or depth. When passing between Canada and the United States it will be subject to Customs regulations if liable to duty. The registration charge on 5th class matter is 5 cents in addition to postage.

MONEY ORDERS.

In sending money by mail it is always best to transmit by money order, if possible.

Mother House of the Sisters of Charity, commonly called "Sisters of Providence"

This institution was founded in 1843 by the Most Reverend late Bishop Bourget.

The Right Reverend Archbishop Edouard Chs. Fabre, superior; Rev. A. Faubert, chaplain; Sister Marie Godefroi, superioress general; Sister Cécile, Sister Arsène, Sister Marguerite du Sacré

Cœur, Sister Elizabeth, general assistants. Sister de l'Immaculée Conception, general secretary; Sister Madeleine, general depositary. 583 professed sisters, of which 522 are on mission. 109 novices and postulants.

The Sisters of the Mother House perform the following good works: Visits to the poor, sick and prisoners of the parishes of St. Vincent de Paul and Hochelaga.

During the course of last year, 8000 visits were made and 943 meals given to the poor.

A dispensary in favor of the poor was founded in 1875 Sister Pierre Claver, directress. Over 426 poor were attended at their homes by the visiting physicians. Number of prescriptions served gratis during the year, 2051.

The Jardin de l'Enfance, a boarding kindergarten, for boys, was founded in 1888. Number of pupils 76. 270 boys and girls attend the Infant School (Salle d'Asile).

The following institutions are also under the direction of "Les Sœurs de Charité de la Providence."

Asile de la Providence (1631 St. Catherine St. Receives aged and infirm women. Sister Marie Edwidge, superioress, 51 sisters; 170 aged and infirm persons; 16 lady boarders. The statement for last year shows that 45,517 visits were made to the sick and poor of the city, 895 received night attendance and 11,324 meals were given.

Dispensary—founded in 1863—Sister Agathe, directress, number of prescriptions served gratis during the past year 28,936. Over 2,913 poor were attended at their home by the visiting physicians.

Institution des Sourdes Muettes (410 St. Denis st.)—Founded in 1851 for the reception and instruction of deaf and dumb girls. Rev. F. Reid, chaplain. Sister Charles de la Providence, superioress; 50 sisters and 250 pupils. Meals served to the poor of the city 3,190. Visits to the sick and poor, 1060. 297 received night attendance.

Hospice St. Alexis.—(145 St. Denis st.) Founded in 1853.

Externat St. Jacques.—Founded in 1857, Day school for young girls.
