THE BRITISH TIMBER TRADE MARKET.

The London Timber Trades' Journal, which reached us by the last mail, devotes more than its usual amount of space to an elaborate review of the present state of the London market and the prospects of the timber trade generally in Great Britain.

A Vienna correspondent explains that Russia will only accept a formula of invitation binding her to permit a free discussion of all questions which she may feel called upon to come to an understanding with England as to the modification to be proposed at the Congress.

A Vienna despatch says the propositions which Schouvaloff took to London, and which were accepted by the British cabinet, were that the Southern boundary of Bulgaria to be a line from Burgas to Philippopolis and Varna; Turkey to retain Balacon as a condition of the Danubian frontier; the substitution of European for Russian control in carrying out the treaty, and the remaining questions to be left to the Congress.

The Times says it may be safely concluded the prospects are more hopeful than hitherto, but some not unimportant points must be settled before the invitations are finally issued.

A despatch from Athens reports the Cretans have refused the amnesty offered through the British Consul, but offered to accept a regular removal of difficulties in the way of the Congress is anticipated here as hopefully as before.
