Madam Minister,

The Comité de transition de l'agglomération des Îles-de-la-Madeleine (the "Transition Committee") is submitting its final report containing information that will complete the decree of reconstitution of Municipalité de Grosse-Île and the decree of agglomeration of Îles-de-la-Madeleine. This report is an opportunity for us to review the work that is yet to be accomplished.

We believe we have succeeded in discharging a large share of the responsibilities related to our mandate, including the preparation of the first budget. As we write these lines, the Committee has proceeded to assign positions for the distribution of human resources, except for that of Administrative Secretary, which is the object of an external posting.

In the last phase now beginning, the principal task is to assist the Chief Electoral Officer in her duties.

Concerning the sharing of material resources, since Grosse-Île's assets include no vehicles and no buildings other than the former municipal office, all that remains is the distribution of the equipment used by the Transition Committee. Moreover, we hope to provide Grosse-Île with a suitable building that can accommodate the municipal offices.

We will proceed to train personnel, purchase software and update the computer hardware. The Committee's offices will be closed and the equipment moved in December.

Madam Minister, please be assured that we will be efficient and available in discharging the final tasks to be performed, with a concern for providing the Grosse-Île community with the necessary tools for its municipal activity.

Here are our final recommendations for the preparation of the decree of reconstitution of Grosse-Île and the decree of agglomeration of Îles-de-la-Madeleine.

GROSSE-ÎLE

1. Decree of Reconstitution

The municipality is a local municipality governed by the Québec Municipal Code (R.S.Q., c. C-27.1).

The territory of the municipality is as described in the appended description by the Minister of Natural Resources and Wildlife.

The first municipal council session will be held at 214 Route 199 in Grande-Entrée.

The team will be composed of the Director General and Clerk, Ms. Janice Turnbull, appointed on August 9, assisted by Ms. Mireille Chevarie, Bookkeeping Technician, Ms. Marlene Boudreault, Leisure Coordinator/Organizer and Gymnasium Technician, Ms. Tracey Clark, Building Maintenance and Labourer and, finally, the person who will have obtained the position of Administrative Secretary.

The municipality is deemed to have obtained recognition under the second paragraph of subsection 29.1 of the Charter of the French Language (R.S.Q., c. C-11).

2. Decree of Agglomeration

Regarding the decree of agglomeration, we understand that its various provisions reflect a new functioning to be established, in accordance with the spirit of Bills 9 and 75 and which we expect will allow effective cooperation for the good of the community of the entire archipelago.

For the purposes of constituting the Agglomeration Council, the Council of the central municipality is composed of members who have been elected to it and the Mayor of the reconstituted municipality.

The Mayor of the central municipality is the Chairman of the Agglomeration Council and the Clerk will be Mr. Jean-Yves Lebreux, Clerk of Municipalité des Îles-de-la-Madeleine, until it is decided otherwise.

3. The Agglomeration Arterial Road Network

The following thoroughfares constitute the agglomeration arterial road network: (maps are appended)

- Grosse-Île Sector: none.
- Havre-aux-Maisons Sector: Chemin de la Pointe-Basse, Chemin des Échoueries, Chemin des Montants and part of Chemin de la Dune-du-Sud.
- Havre-Aubert Sector: Chemin de la Montagne, Chemin de l'Étang-des-Caps, Chemin d'en Haut and Chemin du Sable.
- Île Centrale Sector: Chemin des Caps, Chemin Noël, Chemin Poirier, Chemin du Gros-Cap, Chemin de la Belle-Anse, Chemin du Phare and the end of Chemin de l'Étang-du-Nord leading to Complexe de la Côte.

4. Equipment, Infrastructures and Activities of Collective Interest

Following the decision to maintain Cap-aux-Meules within Municipalité des Îles-de-la-Madeleine, the Transition Committee does not recommend any addition to the list in the Schedule to Bill 9, which reads as follows:

- Regional swimming pool;
- Corporation culturelle Arrimage;
- Programme Villes et villages d'art et de patrimoine.

5. Distribution of Assets and Liabilities

Assets

The former municipal office located at 246 Route 199, according to the deed of sale of November 16, 1982, with the designation corresponding to a part of lot ONE subdivision of original lot number TWENTY-FOUR (24-1 Part) of the cadastre of Grosse-Île and bearing the registration number 01023 0275 53 0566 becomes the property of the reconstituted municipality.

After the discussions currently in progress with the central municipality, Grosse-Île will obtain a portion of the equipment purchased for the Committee's work, principally sufficient computer workstations to provide the personnel with the furniture and equipment that will be necessary to them.

Grosse-Île will again become the owner of the equipment that belonged to it before the merger. The newspaper "First Informer" benefits from the loan of a desk and 5 chairs. The following equipment is stored at Havre-aux-Maisons:

Every document of the municipality which, before its constitution, was the property of Municipalité de Grosse-Île, shall become the property of the reconstituted municipality.

Liabilities

The tables appended to this report present the distribution of the debt. Under the reconstitution of Municipalité de Grosse-Île, the debts are divided into three categories:

- Debts of the Ordinary Council of the central municipality (Table 1);
- Debts of the Council of Municipalité de Grosse-Île (tableau 2);
- Debts of the Agglomeration Council (Table 3).

The ministerial directive on the distribution of assets and liabilities provides that the debts contracted by the existing Municipalité des Îles-de-la-Madeleine, between the date of the merger and January 1, 2006, and which pertains to the agglomeration powers, will be applied to the Agglomeration Council of the central municipality. The debts pertaining to proximity powers will be distributed among the municipalities according to the benefit they derive from the goods, services or activities funded. For this category of debts, the Committee has applied the directive in its entirety.

Regarding debts contracted by the former municipalities before the merger, the directive provides that these debts shall remain the responsibility of these former municipalities unless they had been pooled at the time of the merger, in which case they shall become agglomeration debts.

Pursuant to the merger decree, all loan by-laws, except those concerning the water and sewer system, were pooled at the time of the merger (Section 68 of Order-in-Council 1043-2001 amended by Section 3 of Order-in-Council 593-2002). Consequently, regarding the by-laws adopted before the merger, the rules of financing of these by-laws, as amended by Section 68 of the merger decree, as the case may be, would continue to apply normally.

However, the Transition Committee considers that this rule is inappropriate regarding several loan by-laws which were adopted before the merger and were pooled. While pooling of the debt pertaining to a group of municipal equipment or goods could be justified in the context of a merger of all the municipalities of the archipelago, such pooling may be difficult to maintain in the context of reconstitution of a former municipality, particularly when this equipment or these goods will no longer benefit the reconstituted municipality directly. The geographic remoteness of Municipalité de Grosse-Île justifies an exception.

Consequently, the Transition Committee recommends that Municipalité de Grosse-Île no longer participate in the debts that were pooled at the time of the merger unless these debts concern goods, services or activities related to an agglomeration power, work performed on a thoroughfare of the arterial road network or equipment, infrastructure or activities of collective interest. The appended tables present the exceptions recommended by the Transition Committee to the ministerial directive.

4. Surplus and Deficit

The reserved surplus of Grosse-Île as at December 31, 2004 amounted to \$37,080. However, the accumulated deficit of Municipalité des Îles-de-la-Madeleine totalled \$264,705. The surplus may fluctuate according to the result of Municipalité des Îles-de-la-Madeleine for the 2005 fiscal year.

5. Conclusion

We submit this final report, which contains the Committee's recommendations with the information available to date. We are at your disposal to answer any questions concerning the performance of our mandate.
