INSPECTOR GENERAL'S OFFICE, CUSTOMS DEPARTMENT, Toronto, 11th June, 1858. HIS EXCELLENCY the GOVERNOR GENERAL is in Council, having had under consideration on the 22d ultimo, the Departmental Circular of the Customs Department, dated 29th April, 1858, by which importers of goods, in every case, are allowed to deduct the discount actually made for cash, or that which, according to the custom of Trade is allowed for cash, has been pleased to rescind the same, and to direct that no such deductions be allowed hereafter, and that the duties be collected upon the amount of the invoice without regard to such discount. And notice is hereby given that such Order applies to goods then in bond, as well as goods imported since the passing of the Order in question. By Command, R. S. M.
