ECLIPSES.

There will be five eclipses this year, viz: two of the sun and three of the moon.

1^o—6th January. The moon will be eclipsed visibly at Quebec; beginning at 1h. 58m. morning; conjunction 3h. 0m.; middle 3h. 8m.; end 4h. 18m.; duration of the eclipse 2h. 20m; digits eclipsed 5^o 45' on the northern limb of the moon.

2^o—20th January. The sun will be eclipsed, invisibly at Quebec, but centrally in New Zealand, Buenos Ayres, and the Southern part of Chili.

3^o—1st July. The moon will be eclipsed visibly, in part, at Quebec. The moon will rise eclipsed at 7h 50m evening; middle 7h 54m; end 9h 32m. Duration of the eclipse 3h 16m; digits eclipsed 10^o 18' on the moon's southern limb.

4^o—16th July. The sun will be eclipsed invisibly at Quebec, but visibly in all Europe.

5^o—26th December. The moon will be eclipsed, visibly, in part, at Quebec. The moon will rise totally obscured at 4h. 13m. evening; conjunction 4h. 54m; middle 4h. 46m; end of the moon's being totally obscured 5h. 35m; end of the eclipse 6h. 35m, its duration 3h. 38m; digits eclipsed 20^o 7'. The southern limb of the moon will first emerge from the shadow of the earth.

Of the Changes of the Moon.

Many persons, understanding that the mean time between one new Moon and another is 29 days, 12 hours, 44 minutes and a fraction, imagine that, to find the full or quarters of the Moon, they have only to add a half or fourth part of that time; and when they do not find the changes marked in the Calendar to correspond with this method, they impute it to mistake in the calculation of those changes. It is therefore necessary to put them in mind, that the great inequality of the Moon's motions renders the above rule extremely inaccurate, so that nineteen times in twenty, it must fail in giving the true conjunction or change.

3^o — 1 Juillet — Eclipsé de lune, visible en partie, à Québec. — La lune se levera éclipsée à 7h. 50m. du soir — milieu à 7h. 54m. — fin à 9h. 32m — Durée de l'éclipsé, 3h. 16m. — Doigts éclipsés, 10^o 18' sur le bord méridional de la lune.

4^o — 16 Juillet — Eclipsé de soleil, invisible à Québec, mais visible dans toute l'Europe.

5^o — 26 Décembre — Eclipsé de lune, visible, en partie, à Québec. — La lune se levera totalement obscurcie à 4h. 13m. du soir — conjonction à 4h. 54 — milieu à 4h. 46m. — fin de l'obscurité totale à 5h. 35m — fin de l'éclipsé à 6h. 35m. — Durée de l'éclipsé, 3h. 38m. — Doigts éclipsés 20^o 7' — Le bord méridional de la lune sortira le premier de l'ombre.

Full Moon.

This Tide Table shows the time of high water on any day of the moon's age nearly, and the stream continues to run one hour and a half after high water, or, in the seaman's phrase, it flows "a Tide and Quarter Tide," and this is to be observed in every part of the River.

RULE. Having found the age of the moon at the top of each month in the Calendar, look in the left column of the table for the day from new to the full moon then in the right column the day from the full to the new moon, and in the middle column you will find the time when it is high water ashore.

1831

The allies ratify the treaty for the separation of Belgium from Holland—Don Pedro sails from Nantes and lands at Oporto with an expedition, to place the Crown of Portugal in the hands of his daughter Donna Maria. Reform bills for England, Ireland and Scotland, become law.—Resistance to tithes and disturbed state of Ireland. Otto, son of the King of Bavaria placed on the throne of Greece by the allies—new boundaries fixed.—Israhim of Egypt takes St. Jean d'Acve and Damaskus.—Unsettled state of Europe continues.—About 6000 souls carried off by the Indian Cholera in Quebec and Montreal, from June to September; ravages in the country parts of the district of Montreal and some parishes in that of Quebec—spreads throughout the United States; great mortality at Charleston and New Orleans from cholera and fever.
