To all to whom these presents shall come or whom the same may concern
Greeting

Whereas it is expedient to erect into a Township

Enrolled in the Office
of Enrollments, at
Montreal on Monday
the Eighteenth day of
September 1848

a certain tract of Our waste Land situate, lying and being in Our District of Quebec in Our said Province, and in and by the Report of The Honorable James Harvey Price Esquire, Our Commissioner of Crown Lands of Our said Province, made and certified to Our Governor General of Our said Province, described as follows, that is to say:

"All that certain tract or parcel of land lying and being situate in the County of Saguenay in Our said District of Quebec, in that part of the Province of Canada formerly Lower Canada, bounded and abutted as follows, to wit; On the south west by the River Saguenay, on the north west by the Township of Tremblay and on the north east and south east by waste Lands of the Crown. Beginning on the north bank of the Saguenay at a post and stone boundary erected for the south westernmost corner of the Township of Harvey (heretofore erected) and the south easternmost corner of the said Township of Tremblay; thence running along the division line between the said Township of Tremblay, and the said tract or parcel of Land, astronomically north fifteen degrees, East, five hundred and fifty two chains seventy links, more or less, to a post and stone boundary, forming the northwesternmost corner of the said tract or parcel of land; thence, astronomically south, seventy five degrees East, seven hundred and twenty chains more or less to a post and stone boundary forming the north easternmost corner. of the said tract of land. thence, astronomically south, fifteen degrees, west, six hundred and four chains, eighty three links, more or less to the River Saguenay; thence westwardly along the bank of the said River Saguenay, as it winds and turns, to the place of beginning; the said Tract or parcel of Land containing thirty nine thousand acres more or less, and the usual allowance for highways; When of heretofore been

been laid out and subdivided into farm lots by actual admeasurement in the
said Ranges A, One and Two, of the depth of fifty five chains twenty seven
links more or less, each; save and except the broken Ranges A and One
and each of the said Ranges has been subdivided into lots of the perpendicular
breadth of nineteen chains more or less and numbered from North west to South
east, as follows: Range A from lot number Ten to lot number twenty two
inclusive and lots numbers thirty seven and thirty eight, being broken lots, bounded in front
by the River Saguenay; Range One from lot number One to lot number thirty eight, inclusive
and lots A and B, containing each one hundred acres more or less, and the usual allowance
for highways, save and except the irregular lots bounded in front by the River Saguenay, and
Range Two into thirty eight lots, namely from lot number One to lot number thirty eight, inclusive
being all regular lots, and containing each one hundred acres, more or less, and the usual allowance
for highways. The whole as represented on the plan herunto annexed, as near as the nature and
circumstances of the case will permit, conformable to the actual survey of the outlines and of the
said Three Ranges of the said tract or parcel of land to be hereafter known and designated as
the Township of Harvey as aforesaid. — Now Know Ye that We of Our especial grace
certain knowledge and mere motion have created, erected and constituted, and by these presents do
create, erect and constitute the said tract of Our waste land so as aforesaid hereinbefore described,
and every part and parcel thereof, a Township for ever, from and after the first day of October next
to be, continue, and remain a Township, and by the name of Harvey for ever hereafter to be
called known and distinguished. And We do moreover, of Our especial grace, certain knowledge
and mere motion, declare that these Our Letters Patent shall be good and effectual in Law, to
all intents, constructions and purposes whatsoever, notwithstanding any misbunding, misnaming
or other imperfections or omissions of or concerning the said tract of land hereby erected into the
Township of Harvey as aforesaid.

In Testimony Whereof We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent
and the Great Seal of Our said Province of Canada to be herunto affixed.
Witness Our Right Trusty and Right Well beloved Cousin James Earl of Elgin
and Clarendon Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of The
Thistle Governor General of British North America and Captain General and
Governor in Chief in and over Our Provinces of Canada Nova Scotia, New
Brunswick and the Island of Prince Edward and Vice Admiral of the same
Ic. Ic. Ic. At Montreal in Our said Province this Sixteenth day of
September in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty eight and
in the Twelfth year of Our Reign.
