RADNOR FORGES, a post village in Champlain co., Three Rivers district, Que., in the municipality of Fermont, a station on the Three Rivers and Grandes Piles branch of the C. P. R., 2 miles from St. Maurice and 15 miles from Three Rivers. It contains an Episcopal church, 2 schools (Protestant and Catholic), and a free public reading room and library. The village is the seat of a large iron industry, owned and controlled by the Canada Iron Furnace Co., Ltd., Montreal, with furnace for the manufacture of charcoal, pig iron, used principally for the manufacture of carwheels, the capacity of furnace being about 12,000 tons per annum.

The manufacture of charcoal for the furnace is also largely carried on in the village, which is situated about the centre of the Three Rivers bog ore iron district. It also contains a large limestone quarry, operated by the same company, with modern plant for the manufacture of pressed and re-pressed bricks, also a saw mill worked by water-power, and the "Radnor" mineral water spring, the

RICHMOND, a progressive post town in Richmond co., St. Francis district, Que., situated on the east bank of the St. Francis River, at the junction of the Montreal, Portland & Quebec branches of the G.T.R., 76½ miles east of Montreal. It has 4 churches (Roman Catholic, Episcopal, Presbyterian and Methodist), 50 stores, 3 hotels, 3 saw and grist mills, 7 factories, including Grand Trunk machine shops, last, boot and sash and door factories, 2 banks (Eastern Townships and Molsons), 2 printing offices and 1 newspaper (Times Guardian), besides telegraph and express offices. On the opposite side of the St. Francis River is Melbourne Village, which is practically a suburb of Richmond, and is connected with the latter by the longest span highway bridge in the world. (Montreal to Ottawa short line), 16 miles north-west of Vaudreuil, and 41 miles west of Montreal. It is 8 miles east of St. Eugene, Ont., on the same line, and 75 miles east of Ottawa. It is the seat of Bourget college and St. Anne's convent. The Sanctuary of Notre Dame de Lourdes, in Rigaud Mt., is in the summer season a place of frequent pilgrimage. The village has 1 R. C. church, 6 stores, 1 foundry, 1 branch bank, saw, grist, carding and fulling mills, besides express and telegraph offices. Pop. of village, about 800; of parish, 1,050.

RIMOUSKI, an incorporated town and watering place, capital of Rimouski co. and district, Que., on the south shore of the St. Lawrence, and on the I.C.R., 180 miles from Quebec. It contains besides the county buildings, 1 Roman Catholic cathedral, 1 seminary with commercial school, 2 convents (those of St. Rosary Sisters and Charity Sisters), 1 Brothers' monastery, 2 banks (Eastern Townships and Nationale), 1 normal school, 3 saw and 3 flour mills, wood pulp and sash and door factories, 1 hospital, 1 court house, 1 gaol, 2 telephone offices, customs and quarantine offices, 39 stores, 3 hotels, 5 boarding houses, 1 printing office and 2 telegraph offices. It is the last point of contact on the St. Lawrence of the I.C.R. with navigable waters. It is also the last port of call for European steamers to take on passengers and freight before proceeding on their voyage. Vessels of the largest tonnage load here with timber for foreign ports. ST. JEAN (LA VILLE DE), or ST. JOHNS (the Town of) is situated

about 27 miles from Montreal, and is the chef-lieu of Iberville on the Richelieu River. It is an old military fort. The fort itself was built about 1748, by the late Sieur de Lery, Jr., at the request of M. de La Gallisonniere, who was then Governor of Canada. The materials used in the erection of the fort of St. Jean were taken from the old fort of Ste. Therese in 1747. During the war of 1812, the fort of St. Jean was used to build many men-of-

war. In 1815, when peace was restored, St. Jean started as a small village; and during that year about fifteen small houses were erected by the residents. It was then called "Town of Dorchester." The first wooden bridge connecting St. Jean with Iberville was built in 1825, and on the 6th of November, 1828, the late Rev. Remi Gaulin, who was then the first parish priest, blessed the first Catholic church, which, although of very modern appearance, was considered to be one of the best primitive churches of that time on the borders of the Richelieu river. The first church was dedicated to "St. Jean L'Evangeliste," under which name it is still known. The late Father Gaulin remained a few years with his parishioners and subsequently was raised by the Catholic Church as Bishop of Kingston, Ont. From that time, St. Jean started to rise as a business centre and kept steadily doing so. In order to promote business, a railway company, called the Champlain & St. Laurent was organized about 1831, and the following year (1832), a bridge was built between St. Jean and Laprairie, a distance of 14 1-2 miles. The rails were built of wood, and the first passenger and freight train between the two above-named places was officially inaugurated in July, 1836. St. Jean was erected as a municipality on the 9th of September, 1831, but it was not until the 27th of August, 1835, that it was officially recognized by the late Lord Aylmer, who was then Governor General of Canada. It is to-day one of the best manufacturing centres of the Province of Quebec, and among the most important works to be found there are those of the Dominion Sanitary Pottery Co., the Singer Sewing Machine Co., the Molleur's Straw Hat Factory, the Canadian Trenton Potteries, the St. John's Wax Taper Factory, the Richelieu Cordage Co., the Butter Factory, the Poulin Door and Sash Factory, the Eureka Glove Works, Standard Drain Pipe, Stewart, Denault & Co., Limited, the Standard Glove Manufacturing Co., the Seigniorial Office Barony of Longueuil, St. John's Electric Light Co., Limited, St. John's Foundry Co., the V. Trahan Lumber Yards, the Cousins Hay, Grain & Feed Co., etc., etc. The town is now a modern one, where handsome stone and cement buildings are very numerous; the streets are wide and thoroughly cleaned. In this respect it beats several older cities. It is strictly forbidden to throw waste paper on streets, and the garbage is removed several times weekly by ex-

pert employes. The fashionable quarter of the town contains several attractive cottages, in front of which may be found gardens, also sporting grounds. Two weekly papers are published here every Thursday, one, in French and one in English. The leading churches are St. Jean L'Evangeliste and Notre Dame Auxiliatrice (Roman Catholic), the Anglican, Episcopal and Methodist churches. There is a handsome commercial college or academy for boys, a large convent for girls, under the tuition of the Ladies of the Congregation of Notre-Dame, a large hospital under the Grey Nuns, a Jardin de l'Enfance for youths, a commercial and classical college under the Fathers of Ste. Marie de Monnoir, and three or four laity schools for youths. There are several banks and insurance offices, as well as wholesale and retail stores, and the town has an efficient service of police and fire protection. The town is connected by railway communication and about twenty trains a day stop here. The Dominion Government is actually digging the river so as to facilitate additional accommodation to hay and lumber traders who are extensively importing and exporting. Telegraph and telephone offices are opened at both ends of the town, and the Government is seriously considering the opening of a large ship canal between St. Jean and Longueuil, at a probable cost of \$10,000,000. When this canal is opened, it will give direct river communication to Montreal, as Longueuil is situated directly opposite Montreal. It has a fine waterwork, which is about to be purchased by the town, and the town itself is lighted by electricity. The C.P.R. and "La Ville de St. Jean" are actually spanning the Richelieu River with two handsome iron bridges, which will cost about \$100,000. One of these bridges (the C.P.R.) will be used for their passenger and freight trains, while the other will be a foot and vehicle bridge. Population, 6,500.
