GREAT BRITAIN.

RUSSIA.
TOMSK, Siberia, July 24.—A steamer starts for St. Petersburg to-morrow with Melville and two sailors of the "Jeannette." Lieut. Barry, Gilder and another officer of the steamer "Rodgers" return from Irkutsk to the Lena Delta, in order to follow during the winter the coast as far as the frontier of European Russia, thereby completing Melville's search to Olmitz.

UNITED STATES.
NEVADA CITY, July 25.—The residence of J. H. Boardman was burned last night. His wife and two children were injured, and it is supposed have perished.

PAOLA, Ind., July 25.—A mob to-day hanged one John Archer, the murderer of Archer, and threw the body into the river.

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., July 25.—N. Baker's house was burned this morning. Mrs. Baker and Mrs. Anderson were arrested for possession of the Imperial Chateau, presented under the Empire to the late Emperor as a reward for his military services.

MADRID, July 25.—A small box sent from Granada to Sagasta, Prime Minister, has been tampered with and found to contain a quantity of dynamite. Several persons have been arrested on suspicion.

VINNA, July 25.—A conflict occurred on the railway between the peasants and laborers at Dondorf. Fourteen persons were killed.
