By providing you with this new bin, a necessary tool to increase the quantities of recyclable materials to be collected in your household, the municipal administration supports your recycling efforts while assuring you of a cleaner neighbourhood.

IT IS:

- ♥ Our ergonomic design for handling and carrying
- ♥ To be carried with one hand
- ♥ Superior volume compared to the regular bin
- ♥ Cleaner at the curb: a lid restrains the recyclable materials
- ♥ Adapted for co-mingled materials
- ♥ Suitable for high density neighbourhoods of Montréal

WHY RINSE CONTAINERS?

It's always necessary to rinse containers to prevent mould and unpleasant odours. This way, we avoid contaminating other recyclable materials such as paper and cardboard, and having to landfill other materials that could be recycled. It's also a matter of cleanliness and hygiene for employees of recycling and sorting facility.

HOW TO RECUPERATE SOFT PLASTICS?

Soft plastics like bread bags and plastic packaging could clog the recycling and sorting centre machinery. So it's important to place all such items in a single bag and knot it for pick up.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT SHOULD I DO WITH MY OLD RECYCLING BIN?

Why not give it a new lease on life, by using it as a carrier or to store gardening tools and other items?

CAN I SET OUT ITEMS LIKE CARDBOARD BOXES NEXT TO MY BIN?

Recycling rules vary from one borough to another, so call 311 for information.

WHO OWNS THE BIN?

The Montréal recycling bin belongs to the city. You must not take your bin with you if you move. It must not be altered, painted or used for storing anything other than recyclables. You are responsible for picking up your bin as soon as possible after it is emptied, to avoid blocking traffic.
