

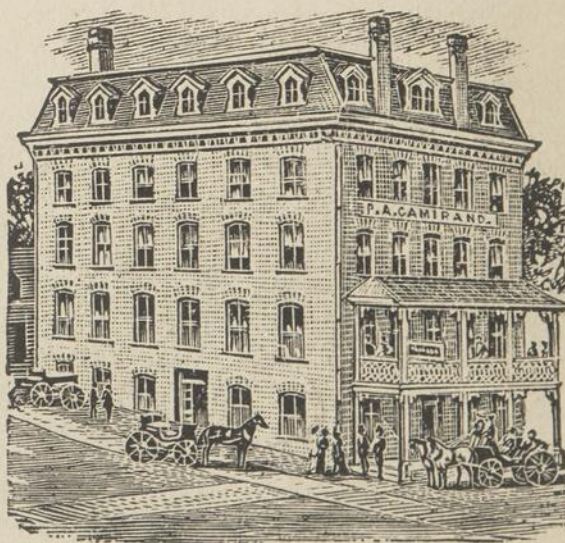

## THE CITY OF SHERBROOKE.

---

The City of Sherbrooke, the principal city in the Eastern Townships of the Province of Quebec, and the *chef-lieu* of the district of Saint-Francis, is pleasantly situated at the junction of the rivers St. Francis and Magog. 101 miles distant from Montreal and 125 miles from Quebec. It contains about 8,600 inhabitants of whom a slight majority are of French Canadian origin and the remainder mostly of British and Irish descent. Its unsurpassed water power and extensive manufactories have made it a place of note, while its steady but sure progress assure its place among the important cities of the Dominion. The river Magog which is supplied from Lake Memphremagog (Little Memphremagog being used as a reservoir) here makes a descent into the St. Francis river of 120 feet within half a mile and offers an uninterrupted succession of valuable water privileges which are controlled by the British American Land Company, a chartered English Company, dating back to 1833, with a capital of £300,000, the greater portion of which is held by London capitalists.

The facilities for transport and communication afforded by the various lines of railway passing through or terminating in the city, make it a place of great importance as a commercial depot and a manufacturing centre. The Grand Trunk has a station here, the Short Line of the Canada Pacific passes through the city (having bought the Magog and Waterloo and International Railways) and are about to erect a commodious depot; the Boston & Maine, connecting directly with New York and Boston, branches off from the Grand Trunk at Lennoxville, only three miles distant, and practically has its Canadian terminus in Sherbrooke, and the Quebec Central, a line promoted and built by residents of the city, is essentially a home railway, although its extension opens up a wide range of country.

The formation of these improved means of communication has had a marked effect upon the development of the city as can be seen at once by a glance at its history, which is coeval with the present century.

In the year 1796, Gilbert, Abraham, Joseph, Cornelius, Jacob and Isaac Hyatt, brothers, of the town of Arlington, Vt., owing to political causes, came to Canada and settled on part of the tract now known as the township of Ascot and subsequently obtained extensive grants for themselves and their associates. The township was organized March 5th 1803.

On the 5th of May, 1805, the township of Orford was erected and granted to Luke Knowlton and associates.

At this time the site of the City was known as the "Lower or Big Forks," the first settlers, so far as can be ascertained, having been David Moe, Gilbert Hyatt and Samuel Terrill. The first named built a frame barn, the remains of which are still to be seen on the road to Lennoxville, just on the border of the present corporate limits, on which was cut the date 1800, and this is one of the oldest, if not the oldest, landmark now in existence connected with the early history of the settlement. Terrill located at a point opposite the mouth of the Magog River and a little later Hyatt built a grist mill, both on the Ascot side, and near it Jonathan Parker built the first clothing and card dressing works. Jonathan Ball built the first saw mill, on the Orford side, and William R. Willard, the first tannery. At an early period, the exact date of which cannot now be traced, John and Samuel Ball were the proprietors of extensive tracts, on both sides the Magog, which they sold to C. F. H. Goodhue and the Hon. W. B. Felton. This property, with the water power, was afterwards purchased by the British American Land Company and by them sold in lots. The slow progress made at that time may be gathered from the fact that in the year 1819 but seven log houses had been erected. In those early days the pioneers used to go down the St. Francis River to Three Rivers in scows, seven feet in length, progress being made by what is known as "poling." The trip there and back generally occupied three months, and a main feature in the commissariat of each scow was a barrel of potatoe whiskey from which the crew helped themselves according to inclination.

Although stores, woollen, grist and saw mills were gradually erected and in 1822 when the District of St. Francis was formed, the first Court House was erected, it was not until 1852 that the town of *Sherbrooke* was incorporated, with G. F. Bowen, Esq., as Mayor. The limits embrace territory comprised in the two townships of Ascot and Orford.

The Grand Trunk Railway was completed through this dis-

trict in 1852, and since that time the progress of the then town of Sherbrooke has been more rapid.

In 1866, the business of the Paton Manufacturing Company was established and it was incorporated in 1868. This is the most important manufacturing concern in the Eastern Townships and gives employment to about 600 hands.

In 1871 the population was 4,450, in 1873, 5,500, and at the present time it is about 9,500.

Although it is not the object of this work nor the intention of its compilers to enter into the discussion of any political theory, still, as the recital of a matter of fact, there can be no doubt that the operation of the National Policy has also materially aided the formation and growth of manufacturing enterprises within its borders and at the present time the City of Sherbrooke possesses numerous and prosperous manufacturing establishments, the development of which most of the owners claim to have taken place since the inauguration of that feature as a system of government.

In 1875, Sherbrooke was formed into a City and various powers given to the Municipal Councillors, more in accordance with the wants of the inhabitants than afforded by the Municipal Code.

The hilly nature of its site affords good views and commanding situations for dwelling houses, advantages the inhabitants have not failed to avail themselves of. The private residences are neat and attractive in appearance and are, in general, adorned with well kept lawns and ornamental gardens.

The aspect of Sherbrooke from the grounds of the Eastern Township Agricultural Association, in East Sherbrooke, where a commanding view is obtained, is very pleasant and presents a picturesque picture, the natural features combined with the neat appearance of the buildings suggesting the idea of a desirable dwelling place.

The Public Buildings compare favorably with those in any city in the Dominion.

The Eastern Townships Bank and the new Post Office, (the latter building including the Custom House and other official departments) are imposing granite buildings and would be ornaments to any locality.

The Churches are well represented. The Roman Catholic Cathedral which crowns the top of Sherbrooke's highest hill ; St. Patrick's Church, on King and Gordon streets, and St-Jean-Bap-

tiste Church, in East Sherbrooke, afford accommodation for about 3,000 worshippers of that faith.

The Episcopal Church of England has two sacred edifices for the members : St. Peters, on Commercial St., and the Church of the Advent, in East Sherbrooke.

The Methodists have lately built a neat and commodious building, on Court Street, which has been appropriately described as a gem of architecture.

The Presbyterians have a church on Factory Street and are now making arrangements for the erection of a more modern and suitable place of meeting, and the Baptists have just opened a small but convenient place of worship on Queen Street.

Other religious bodies find accommodation in some of the halls to be found in the city.

In Educational Institutions Sherbrooke possesses advantages which afford valuable opportunities for the acquisition of learning.

The Roman Catholics have a large, complete and well managed college.

Bishops College and School at Lennoxville (Church of England Institutions) are of more than Provincial note and have turned out some of the most eminent students in the Dominion.

The nuns of Notre-Dame direct the studies at a girls school where both Catholic and Protestant students may be found. There is a first class Academy for young men. The Young Ladies Academy and a number of District Schools, both Catholic and Protestant, are located in suitable buildings, constructed on the latest models, equipped with all modern conveniences and appliances and superintended by competent and painstaking teachers whose work is acknowledged and commended by the Government Inspectors, whose special business it is to watch over their progress and report as to their standard.

The Morey Art and Library Building, a handsome structure, contains a free Reading Room, well supplied with newspapers and journals and an excellent Loan Library, most ably managed, and which is constantly adding both French and English Literature to its stock of books. It also contains the nucleus of an Art and Natural History Collection, while the Art Gallery affords an attractive Lecture Hall.

The streets and buildings are well lighted with gas, and lately the electric light furnishes brilliant illumination to many tasty and well stocked stores, while in the near future we may expect the latter mode of lighting to be extended throughout the

city, as negotiations are now going on and arrangements have been almost completed for its adoption in all the thoroughfares.

There are four newspapers published in Sherbrooke: two French and two English. Three of them are published weekly and one of them twice a week.

The *Sherbrooke Gazette*, the oldest newspaper in this part of the country, is owned, printed and published by Mr. George H. Bradford. It is liberal conservative in principles and gives an independent support to that party, though it does not hesitate to speak out boldly against any measure not conducive to the public good. It has a circulation of 3,200 and is edited by Mr. Edwin Avery.

The *Weekly Examiner* is published by Messrs. W. A. Morehouse & Co. It was first started in 1878 and is a well conducted and readable publication. It gives a general adherence to the Reform cause and claims a circulation of 2,300.

*Le Pionnier* is published by the Eastern Townships Typographical Company, with Mr. J. A. Chicoyne as manager and editor in chief. It is a recognized exponent of French Canadian opinion in Canada and exerts an influence not confined to the territorial district it represents. Its circulation is 2,200.

The *Progrès de l'Est*, published by Messrs. Belanger & Co., although the youngest newspaper in the city, is a bright, sparkling, newsy journal, edited by some of the best journalistic talent in the city. It is published twice a week and is an able advocate of Nationalist views.

In the supply of Dry Goods, Clothing, Provisions, Boots, Ornaments, Hardware, Agricultural Implements, Machinery, Stoves, Furniture, Carriages,—in a word, all the requirements of a highly civilized and cultivated community, Sherbrooke offers comparison with any city on the continent. We need not particularize, for a reference to the pages which follow will convince every one that nothing can be sought for but it can be obtained from its enterprising and courteous store-keepers.

A good meat and vegetable market is held on Saturdays and is supplied by a large number of farmers from the surrounding country who always find throngs of eager customers.

As the *chef-lieu* of St. Francis, Sherbrooke is of course the head quarters of the lawyers of the district and has always maintained a high reputation for the learning, the skill and the intelligence of the members of that profession who practise here.

The Medical Profession is well represented and its Physicians and Surgeons, though not numerous, are able and skilful.

The Catholic Hospital affords not only the necessary accommodation for cases of accident or emergency, but is also used as a home for invalids whose old age or ailments require constant nursing.

A Protestant hospital is likely also to be established shortly, the Act of incorporation being now before the Quebec Legislature.

The conveniences and surroundings of the City and neighbourhood make it a desirable place for business or residence. It unites all the comforts of the city with the salubrity and picturesque beauty of the country. Its rise and progress are a source of legitimate pride to its citizens who rightly regard it as destined to become one of the great manufacturing centres of the continent, the means of gathering and diffusing the production of native industry, the beloved home of native talent, the proof and the result as well as the means of developing the growing wealth and importance of a large district whose wonderful resources become year by year more fully recognised and appreciated as they become more generally known.

The City is divided into four different wards, namely: the Centre ward, bounded north by the Magog river, south by King st., east by the St-Francis river and west by the Magog river; the East ward comprises all that part of the city situate on the east side of the St. Francis river; the North ward, all that part of the city situate on the north side of the Magog to the St. Francis river and limits to the Township of Orford; the South ward, all that part of the city situate on the south side of King street to the St. Francis and Magog rivers and limits to the Township of Ascot.
