**CHATHAM**—The county town of Kent, on the river Thames, at the junction of the four townships of Dover, Chatham, Harwich and Raleigh. It has a separate municipality. The river runs into Lake St Clair about 18 miles from the town, and when the dredging of the bar is complete, will be navigable thus far for vessels drawing from 8 to 10 feet of water. A number of sailing craft and some steamers are continually passing. Owing to the fine agricultural country round, this is one of the largest markets in Canada, the business in grain alone amounting to as much as \$500,000 per annum. There is also a large traffic in pork, and in all other country produce. Wood in all shapes forms a staple commodity here, a large trade being done in lumber, square timber, railroad ties, staves, and especially cord wood. There has been much tobacco grown in the neighborhood, 1000 hogsheads having been shipped in a year. There are large foundries, machine shops, woollen mills, pot and pearl asheries, soap and candle and other factories in the town. There is a fine station of the Great Western railway here, and an office of the Montreal Telegraph Co. Distant from Windsor by rail 46 miles, fare \$1.50, by water 60 miles, fare 75c.; from London 60 miles, fare \$1.95; from Hamilton 148 miles, fare \$4.40; from Toronto 176 miles, fare \$5.40. Mail daily. Population about 6,000.

**CLIFTON**—An incorporated town on the west bank of the Niagara river, township of Stamford, county of Welland. It is situated at the celebrated suspension bridge, which crosses the river about one mile below the historically known Niagara Falls, and which connects Western Canada with the State of New York by railway. This bridge is said to be one of the most scientific public works on the continent. It is suspended 250 feet above the river, from towers 75 feet in height, by means of four wire cables, each 10 inches in diameter; the distance between

the towers being 822 feet. The total length of wire in these cables is computed at 4,000 miles. There are two roadways, one above the other, the upper one being exclusively for railways, having three different gauges laid down, the lower one for carriages, pedestrians, &c. Here is Barnett's world renowned museum, acknowledged by connoisseurs to be the choicest collection of relics contained by any similar establishment in Canada. This town is rapidly rising into first importance. The exports are larger here than at any other port in Ontario, and the imports and trade generally are steadily increasing. In the year 1868, 8,230 gallons of petroleum or earth oils, 2,002 mille of shingles, 2,721 horned cattle, 11,185 sheep, 1,673 swine, 533,996 lbs. of wool, and 140,039 bushels of grain were exported from this place. The scenery in the vicinity is grand and imposing, especially near the whirlpool, which is situated at a bend of the river about a mile below the town. Montreal and Dominion Telegraph Companies have offices here, and the former Company opens an office at the Clifton House during the summer months. This place is the eastern terminus of the Great Western railway, which connects with the Erie and Niagara railway which connects with the Toronto steamers at Niagara also passes through the town, and has a station here. Distant from Niagara 13 miles, from St Catharines 13 miles, from Buffalo, in the State of New York, 33 miles, from Toronto 80 miles, from Windsor, the western terminus of the Great Western railway, 229 miles, from Montreal 416 miles. Mail daily. Population about 3,500.

**COBOURG**—An incorporated town very pleasantly situated on the north shore of Lake Ontario, in the township of Hamilton, county of Northumberland. At present it is the county town of the united counties of Northumberland and Durham, but as both are rapidly increasing in wealth and population, a separation may be necessary ere long. Though scarcely what may be called a flourishing or progressive place, Cobourg possesses most of those advantages which conduce to prosperity, and, no doubt, as capital accumulates in the county and is devoted to the development of the natural resources with which the vicinity abounds, to the establishment of manufactures and to the extension of lines of railways, it will rank with any town in the Province. It is the market town of an exceedingly beautiful and fertile section of country, has excellent rail and water communications, and a safe and commodious harbor, from which considerable quantities of farm produce, lumber and iron ore are annually exported. The town, which is lit with gas, is very prettily laid out, the broad and spacious streets for the most part intersecting each other at right angles, and being adorned with several fine public buildings, and numerous elegant residences. The most noticeable amongst the former are Victoria hall, containing the Town hall, corporation and county offices, erected at a cost of over \$100,000, the churches of the various denominations, and Victoria college.

This latter institution was founded as an academy in 1836, and as a university in 1841, and is under the management of the Wesleyan methodist church in Canada. It has faculties of law and medicine in Montreal and Toronto. The manufacturing interests of Cobourg are represented by the Victoria Woollen mills, a car factory, and several foundries, mills and breweries. It is the southern terminus of the line of road belonging to the Cobourg, Peterborough and Marmora Railway and Mining Co., which is used principally for bringing the products of the Company's mills and mines to the front. The road at present is constructed to Harwood, on Rice Lake, 14 miles, a steamer plying between this port and the Narrows on the River Trent, whence there is a branch line of road, 8 miles, to Blairton where the mines are situated. There is a first-class station of the Grand Trunk railway within the limits of the town, at which all trains stop. The steamers of the Canadian Inland Navigation Co. call here daily, and there is also a daily steamer to Charlotte, the port of Rochester, on the opposite shore of Lake Ontario. The Montreal Telegraph Co. and the Dominion Telegraph Co. have offices here. Distant from Toronto 69 miles, fare by boat \$2, by rail \$2.35; from Montreal 264 miles, fare by boat, cabin \$7, deck \$2.50. By rail first class \$7.25, second class \$4.50; from Rochester 68 miles, fare \$2.50. Mail twice daily each way. Population about 6000.

**GODERICH**—The chief town of the county of Huron is situated on the east shore of the lake of the same name, at the mouth of the river Maitland. The surrounding country is very fertile and picturesque, and the town is much frequented during the summer by visitors from all parts, to take advantage of the cool breezes which are continually blowing from the lake. Large quantities of wheat are annually raised and exported from this neighborhood. Goderich has a good and convenient harbor, which is to be deepened and improved by government at a great expense. A gunboat is usually stationed here. A large elevator is constantly in use during the summer for the shipping. Goderich is also celebrated for her salt wells and fisheries. There are now eight salt wells in operation, the brine being pumped up from a depth of about 1000 feet, evaporated by various processes. During last year 60,500 lbs. of salt were shipped, and since the imposition of a protective duty of 25c. per barrel on American salt it is estimated the demand will this year reach at least 100,000 lbs., which amount the wells are fully able to supply. The fisheries prosecuted at various points along the coast have also been productive of considerable wealth to the town. The boats employed in this service number 30 and bring in on the average 1500 lbs. of fish each daily. These fish are packed in ice, and shipped to Buffalo and Rochester for the American markets, a considerable number being cured here. The land to the north of Goderich not having been brought into the market for sale and settlement until within the last fifteen years, the progress and prosperity of the place was for a long period much retarded; but it is now rapidly advancing in commercial importance and population. It has daily communication by steamboats during summer with Sarnia and Detroit, and steamers leave at regular intervals for Kincardine, Port Head, Baie du Dard, and Saugeen, and ports further north on the same shore. A large portion of the travel and traffic of Lake Superior and the Great West passes through this place. Montreal Telegraph Co. has an office here. Goderich is the western terminus of the Buffalo and Goderich branch of the Grand Trunk railway. Distant from Stratford 45 miles, from Paris 77 miles, from Guelph 85 miles, from Toronto 133 miles. Mail daily. Population about 4,500.
