THE many and increasing complaints made against Persons who are not branched Pilots, for bringing up and taking down Vessels, lead this Corporation to put Masters of such Vessels on their guard, and to request them not to neglect asking for the Branch, and the distinguishing number of the persons who apply to them, which by law every Pilot is bound to have on his boat and boat sails.

The Trinity Board in giving this Caution, have in view the protection of the real Pilot who serves an apprenticeship of five years, and then undergoes an examination, previous to his being branched. They also think it proper to mention, that should accidents happen to Vessels, when in Pilot water, not having a Branch Pilot on board, the Insurance on Ship and Cargo may be materially affected, and become liable to controversy.

The Archbishop of Malines (Abbé de Pradt) who puts forth semi-annually or quarterly, a long dissertation upon the affairs of one or other of the four great divisions of the globe, issued in Paris, in April last, a thick pamphlet entitled "Parallele between the Powers England and Russia in reference to Europe, followed by a view of Grecian concerns." It contains, like the other productions of the Abbé, some useful information and ingenious ideas, with much verbiage and random speculation. He represents all the other powers of Europe, as dependent on England and Russia, whose political character and resources of every kind he investigates and compares, in the spirit of Liberalism, and the intention to induce Europe to prefer the banners of England.

A large octavo volume has just appeared at Boston, with the title—"A Military Journal during the American Revolutionary War, from 1775 to 1785, describing interesting events and transactions of this period, with numerous historical facts and anecdotes from the original manuscript; to which is added an appendix, containing biographical sketches of several general officers; by James Thatcher, M. D. late Surgeon in the American Army."
