

Alumni petition calls on BU to scrap Schultz

In 2009, Bishop's University presented an honorary doctorate to Albert Schultz, the founder of Toronto's Soulpepper Theatre company, describing him as a person whose life and accomplishments reflect what Bishop's University believes in. Last week Schultz resigned from Soulpepper after four women came forward with allegations of sexual harassment.

Following those allegations, Kristina Vidug, a graduate of Bishop's class of 2009, felt like something needed to be done.

"The name was immediately familiar to me," the alumna said, explaining that she quickly remembered the honouree from her own convocation and proceeded to write out the petition not long after the news of the complaints against Schultz first came to light.

The petition, sponsored through the

Donal Ryan's The Spinning Heart: Perplexing Complexity!

For fans of contemporary Irish writers— and I know there are many of you out there— here is an author to put on your bookshelves beside Colm Toibin, Sebastian Barry, Anne Enright, J.M. Synge, and Neil Jordan, to name but a few. Published in 2012, this slim volume was the winner of the Book of the Year at the Irish Book Awards in 2012, and long-listed for the Guardian First Book Award in 2013, as well as the Man Booker Prize that same year. Since then Ryan has gone on to write *The Thing about December* (2013), *A Slanting of the Sun* (2015) and *All We Shall Know* (2016). *The Spinning Heart* is set in Ireland in

2007. The country, like much of the world, has been experiencing an economic renaissance, only to see it all fall apart within a few years with the crash of global markets. The events that befall the small town, somewhere in the County Tipperary/County Clare area, are not so different from anywhere else, but Ryan's telling of the tale, from the perspective of 21 locals, is what sets this book apart.

Consider this opener: "My father still lives back the road past the weir in the cottage I was reared in. I go there every day to see is he dead and every day he lets me down. He hasn't yet missed a day of letting me down. He smiles at me; that terrible smile. He knows I'm coming to check is he dead. He knows I know he knows...We look at each other for a while and when I can no longer stand the stench off of him I go away. Good luck, I say, I'll see you tomorrow. You will, he says back. I know I will. Every day he lives lowers the price I'll get (for the cottage). He knows that too; he stays alive to spite me...I was let go from my job two months ago and it was the best medicine he could have got. It gave him an extra six months, I'd say. If he ever finds out how Pokey Burke shafted me, he'll surely make a full recovery."

Each of the 21 characters, young and old, male and female, has a chapter to him or herself, expressing thoughts and feelings in a distinctively Irish way—square:queer; auld fella:father; wan:girl-friend, to name but a few. Certainly one of the very enjoyable aspects of the book once you get past the difficulty (for me anyway) of decoding the jargon, is the earthy quality of the language and culture these inhabitants of the Irish countryside bring to life. Bobby Mahon, the narrator of the first chapter in which he lets the reader know in no uncertain terms how he feels about his "da", is one of the most eloquent and well-spoken of the group. As a casualty of the economic collapse, Bobby, although one of the most solid and well-respected of the villagers, is flirting with his own personal implosion. Ultimately Bobby emerges as the main character, with the subsequent chapters offering unique glimpses into Bobby's personality and actions. He is the connecting thread that runs throughout the book.

When Bobby's odious, drunken father, Frank, turns up dead, the townsfolk generally assume it was Bobby who

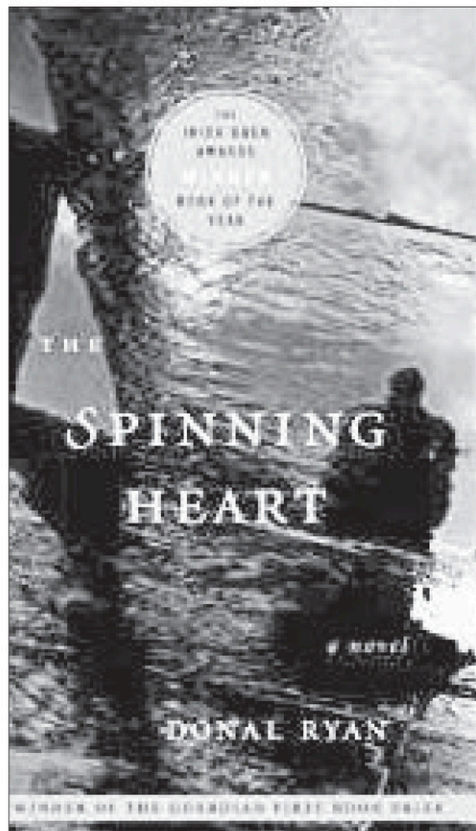
killed him, but few condemn him for it. Interestingly, in Frank's chapter, the reader learns about Frank's past and why he is such a difficult to be with, much less love. One of the hallmarks of Ryan's approach to his story is compassion, even for such a low-life as Frank. "I was never able to talk to that boy without upsetting him. His mother had a fool made out of him, kissing him and telling him he was beautiful every two minutes. I was forced to bring balance. I had to prepare him for the hard world....He'd have gotten some hop if I'd left him off out thinking he was the boy his mother told him he was. She only ever had eyes for him from his first days on this earth...The sadder she looked the faster the brutal sharp words flowed from me, some making tiny little nicks, more tearing deep into her. Her soul suffered death by a thousand million cuts. I knew I was doing it and I couldn't stop."

With each chapter the reader learns a little more about life in that time and place: Josie (Joseph)Burke, Pokey's father, works hard for years, but is cursed with a son who has no soul and very few smarts, and who squanders his family's fortune and hangs the town out to dry; Realtin, the shallow single mother lives in one of the two occupied homes on the "ghost estate" that resulted from Pokey's departure, and is rumored to be having an affair with Bobby when he tries to help her finish her home; Hillary, Realtin's best friend, is determined to set her straight on the way things REALLY are regarding Bobby's presence in her life.

For me, appreciation for the author's purpose and style only came during our book club discussion. While I was reading it, I kept trying to locate a plot, a tangible story line, a climax. Don't do this: you risk overlooking the beauty of the prose, and Ryan's skill in getting into the "heads" of all 21 characters. What seemed fragmented and incomplete to me upon first reading emerged as a technically difficult but beautiful tour de force, well worth the time you will spend on it. Available through the Library by inter-library loan.

Amos J and La Voix friends coming to Theatre Lac-Brome

Even though the French television show La Voix was a high pressure singing competition, some contestants saw past the competitive aspects and became fast friends during the filming of the show.

Next week, local singer songwriter Amos Joannides (Amos J), a Season 5 contestant, will be joined by three fellow La Voix quarterfinalists Andy Bastarache, Willis Pride and Jean-Sébastien Carré for a concert at Theatre Lac-Brome, part of a brief Quebec/New Brunswick tour.

"This is an experiment," said Joannides, who came up with the idea for the tour. If the four scheduled dates go well, the four-man group will consider expanding the tour, Joannides said.

"January is a down time for most musicians," Joannides said. During a conversation with Bastarache, he threw out the idea of putting a tour together with some like-minded musicians from La Voix.

Willis and Carré quickly jumped on board.

"There's a reason we chose each other," Joannides said, explaining that even though they all knew it was an elimination style competition, they became friends early on.

Bastarache and Joannides started out on the same team together with coach Marc Dupré.

According to Joannides, he and Bastarache first met on set when Bastarache was sitting in a van singing and Joannides recognized the song and added a harmony.

"These guys are amazing," Joannides said, excited to share the stage with his fellow quarterfinalists, this time in the spirit of collaboration rather than com-

petition.

The show will mostly include well-known popular music, although Joannides said he will play a few originals as well.

"There will be a lot of sharing," commented Joannides. It won't simply be four separate shows brought together. "I've been busy learning harmonies, guitar parts. We are all on stage at the same time," he said.

"It's like a band with four lead singers," he said, explaining that the show is modeled loosely after the iconic Eagles Unplugged concert.

"People have no idea," Joannides said, explaining that what people saw on La Voix is just the tip of the iceberg. "These guys are awesome," Joannides said, pointing to the Pride's jazz chops, Bastarache's proficiency as a multi-instrumentalist and Carré's experience as a violinist in Celine Dion's band in Los Vegas.

While on La Voix, the competitors were limited in their song selections to approved lists the show would provide. There was also the added stress of live televised performances and of course, the need to please the judges and spectators to stay on the show.

According to Joannides, the upcoming tour will see the musicians at their best, without a competition or the other stresses that go along with a live television show.

"This is about friends getting together and enjoying music," Joannides said.

The first stop for the tour will be in Moncton, New Brunswick, on Andy Bastarache's home turf. Joannides said the La Voix is a very popular among the Maritime Acadian population.

The four singers will then make their way to Knowlton, Joannides' familiar

stomping ground, for a show Theatre Lac-Brome on Jan.18.

The tour will conclude at Petite Campus in Montreal on Jan.20.

Joannides said the group deliberately left Jan.19 open. If the first night at Theatre Lac-Brome, which seats roughly 150

people should sell out, they would open up a second night.

"The new strategy for the vitality of our regions and territories is based on an inversion of the usual way of doing things," the Minister said. "We asked regional representatives; mayors, prefects in the MRC, to define their own priorities for the next five years in terms of social and economic development (...) Now every ministry will have to adapt its policies and adapt its actions to take into account those priorities determined by the regions."

Coiteux said that the Eastern Townships region has proven particularly responsive to the new model, submitting 16 priorities with the common thread of attracting and keeping labour in the region.

"The object is to have variations in our ways of doing things to take into account the specific realities of each region," the Minister said, pointing to his regional tour as a way of keeping in touch with the needs of local municipalities.

During his visit to Magog on Thursday morning, Coiteux announced \$13,000 for a regional integrated focus group on social development being spearheaded by the Des Sommets School Board and the regional Public Health Department. The new project has been designed to help bring together existing groups that

work in the region to support early childhood education, dropout prevention, the battle against poverty, and the formation of healthy lifestyles.

"We are convinced that, together, the partners of this new regional working group will be able to mutually benefit from their diverse expertise and contribute to a healthy, educated, and engaged population," said Doctor Melissa Genereux, Director of public health for the Eastern Townships with the CIUSSS-de l'Estrie-

CHUS, Chair of the Eastern Townships Committee for healthy lifestyles, and member of the transitional roundtable group for regional social development. Doctor Genereux explained that the overall funding raised, which is roughly \$26,000 to 27,000, will be used to hire the Niska consulting firm to help facilitate face-to-face meetings between different groups already at work within the region.

online petition-making platform change.org, points out that Schultz's degree was conferred during the period of

time in which the four women allege they were harassed. It then draws a comparison between Schultz and film producer Harvey Weinstein, who recently had his honorary degree from the Uni-

versity of Buffalo revoked amid allegations of sexual harassment and assault, and concludes with the argument that based on Bishop's core values, the school should revoke Schultz' honorary degree, "to demonstrate their commitment to their values and to show support to the victims of his harassment."

It gained 1000 signatures between Wednesday evening and Thursday afternoon, having at that point been signed by more than 5,800 people. Vidug said that her original goal was to try to get as many signatures as there are students at the school today, but in less than a week she has far surpassed that number.

"I didn't anticipate that it would be so successful, so fast," Vidug said, explaining that the petition was picked up by the website and promoted through one of its newsletters, spreading her message much farther than she had expected. Despite the international signatories, however, a look at the comments of those who have signed reveals that Vidug is not the only Bishop's grad to feel uncomfortable with her alma mater continuing to honour Schultz.

Bishop's University Principal Michael Goldbloom said that he has been thinking about the matter since the news broke and went as far as to research what procedure the school has in place to revoke a degree. The answer to that question, as it turns out, is none at all.

"There is Nothing in the university's statutes that anticipates the revocation of an honorary degree," Goldbloom said, explaining that as a result, before any decision is made about Schultz's degree, the school will undertake a process of outlining what the criteria for that decision might be.

"We need to take this seriously, it is a serious matter," the Principal said, explaining that taking the time to outline clear rules now will make the matter of revoking a degree more clear in the future should the question arise again. He added that to the best of his knowledge, Bishop's has never before revoked an honorary degree.

On the specific situation with Schultz, Goldbloom referred to a short statement he sent out to staff, faculty, and students on Thursday afternoon stating that, "although (the allegations against Schultz) have not been proven in court and it may be many months before the legal process is concluded, I want to reiterate that sexual aggression is a very serious matter, must not be tolerated, and violates Bishop's fundamental values."

It will be in the hands of the university's Degree Committee, the same group which approves candidates for Honorary Degrees, to come up with the process to follow and the criteria to govern the removal of an Honorary Degree. According to Goldbloom, Bishop's is in the majority of Universities in not having a specific process at this point in time.

"I think what is most important is that we get this right," the principal said, expressing a need for a "thoughtful mechanism" to deal with this and all future questions relating to honorary degrees.

Given the time involved in assembling the committee and the process required to add items to the University's statutes, Goldbloom said that the final decision is not likely to be resolved before the end of the semester.

Tenant's Association pleads for register signatures

In response to the opening of the Register in opposition to the City's \$26 million loan for the proposed Wellington Inc. project, the Sherbrooke Tenant's Association (ALS) met with the public on January 8 and 9 to get a feel for public opinion.

Unsurprisingly, the organization found that several people met were unaware of the register. The official announcement was made January 3 after the holidays just five days before the reg-

ister's opening, the week January 8, with little fanfare, despite the fact that the City had forty-five days to adopt the loan.

Other criticisms heard were the fact that there was only one place to sign and people wondered why borough offices were not being used to accommodate people living at the further ends of the City or working outside the city. Several others mentioned that they voted for Mayor Steve Lussier because he had promised, among other things, a moratorium on the project.

The big surprise, however, according to the association, was that everyone it

met opposed either the \$26 million loan or the entire project for various reasons, including the gentrification of the district, which reinforced the Associations demand for a referendum when details of the whole project become known.

The ALS is condemning the undemocratic approach of the register due to the lack of information made available prior to this project's adoption and the lack of time and publicity but also because the consortium behind the project has the power to impose a schedule. In addition, the ALS recalls promises made by both the former City Council and the new one

that the project to revitalize Wellington Street South would include the announcement of social measures that have yet to be announced.

"A project of this size affecting a significant part of our population should necessarily be submitted by referendum vote when the entire project is known and before it is completed," the ALS says in a press release.

The ALS is encouraging the public to take advantage of the final signing day to sign the register between 9 am and 7 pm at 191 rue du Palais at City Hall.

Magog ranks 6th in province for crime

Magog ranks 6th among the most dangerous cities in Quebec for all crimes combined, according to the most recent ranking by Toronto's Maclean's magazine, ahead of Sherbrooke and Quebec City.

Data was drawn from police reports for the year 2016 in major cities across Canada and include a total, of 229 municipalities. For comparative purposes, this ranking was developed based on the Crime Severity Index, a Statistics Canada tool that measures crimes reported to the police based on their volume and

severity.

Magog stands out from the crowd when it comes to crimes related to the trafficking and production of cannabis. It is ranked 9th in Canada and second in the province behind Montreal. In 2016, the Régie de police de Memphrémagog (RPM) reported 29 cases for such crimes.

Magog also ranks high for crimes committed by young people and arrests for impaired driving. In these two categories, the city leads the way at the provincial level and is ranked 39th in Canada. According to the 2016 reports, the RPM processed 19 files relating to criminal acts committed by persons under 18-years-of-age. In addition, dur-

ing the same period, police arrested 132 drivers intoxicated by alcohol or drugs.

Cities that placed higher in Quebec

are Montréal, Saint-Jérôme, Saint-Eustache, Saguenay, and Thetford Mines.

Magog Hospital emergency room overcrowding reaches 300 per cent

La comité de vigie sur les soins de santé Memphrémagog, a health care watchdog committee, has sounded the alarm over the decline in health services in the region and says it's time for Quebec Premier Philippe Couillard to take a look at the situation.

According to a press release sent out by the watchdog group, on Wednesday afternoon, the occupancy rate at the health center in Magog is reported to have reached 300 per cent, enough for the committee to publically denounce

the situation.

Committee President Jean-Guy Gingras described the situation in the emergency room on Wednesday as a real crisis. At approximately 3:00 pm, three ambulances were waiting to drop patients off, 21 people were on stretchers, and several others were standing because of lack of seating.

Overcrowding in the region's emergency rooms has been an issue since the beginning of flu season with similar overloads being reported at both the Fleurimont and Hotel-Room hospitals.

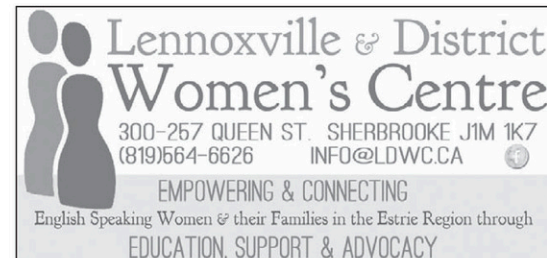

Consumer society no longer serves our needs

My parents were born in Vancouver — Dad in 1909, Mom in 1911 — and married during the Great Depression. It was a difficult time that shaped their values and outlook, which they drummed into my sisters and me.

“Save some for tomorrow,” they often scolded. “Share; don’t be greedy.” “Help others when they need it because one day you might need to ask for their help.” “Live within your means.” Their most important was, “You must work hard for the necessities in life, but don’t run after money as if having fancy clothes or big cars make you a better or more important person.” I think of my parents often during the frenzy of pre- and post-Christmas shopping.

We moved to Ontario after the Second World War. We were destitute. (As Canadians of Japanese descent, we had been treated as enemy aliens and lost everything, including all rights as Canadian citizens.) I needed a coat for the cold eastern winter, so my parents purchased a new one — a big expense for farm labourers. Unfortunately, I was 11 and going through a growth spurt and quickly outgrew the coat, so it was passed on to my twin sister, Marcia. She wore it for longer but also outgrew it and gave it to our younger sister, Aiko. My parents boasted that the coat was so well made, “it went through three children.” It’s been a long time since I’ve heard durability as a positive attribute of a product. In today’s fashion-obsessed

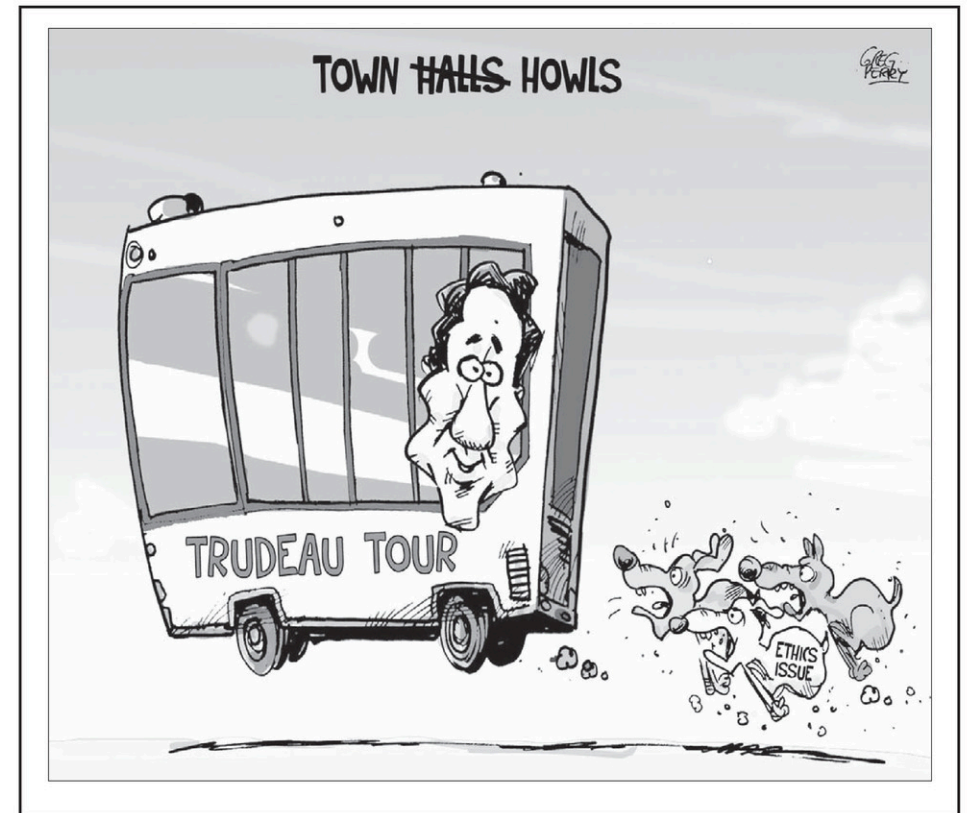
world, how many children would accept hand-me-downs from siblings?

How did “throw-away”, “disposable” and “planned obsolescence” become part of product design and marketing? It was deliberate. Wars are effective at getting economies moving, and the Second World War pulled America out of the Great Depression. By 1945, the American economy was blazing as victory approached.

But how can a war-based economy continue in peacetime? One way is to continue hostilities or their threat. The global costs of armaments and defence still dwarf spending for health care and education. Another way to transform a wartime economy to peacetime is consumption. Adam Smith, the father of modern economics, wrote in 1776, “Consumption is the sole end and purpose of all production.”

Seized upon by the Council of Economic Advisers to the President under Dwight Eisenhower in the 1950s, consumption was promoted as the engine of the economy. Retailing analyst Victor Lebow famously proclaimed in 1955: “Our enormously productive economy demands that we make consumption our way of life, that we convert the buying and use of goods into rituals, that we seek our spiritual satisfaction and our ego satisfaction in consumption. We need things consumed, burned up, worn out, replaced and discarded at an ever-increasing rate.”

Now, we are no longer defined by our societal roles (parents, churchgoers, teachers, doctors, plumbers, etc.) or po-



litical status (voters) but as “customers,” “shoppers” or “consumers.” The media remind us daily of how well we’re supporting continued economic growth, using the Dow Jones average, S&P Index, price of gold and dollar’s value.

But where is the indication of our real status — Earthlings — animals whose very survival and well-being depend on the state of our home, planet Earth? Do we think we can survive without the other animals and plants that share the biosphere? And does our health not reflect the condition of air, water and soil that sustain all life? It’s as if they matter only in terms of how much it will cost to maintain or protect them.

Nature, increasingly under pressure from the need for constant economic growth, is often used to spread the con-

sumption message. Nature has long been exploited in commercials — the lean movement of lions or tigers in car ads, the cuteness of parrots or mice, the strength of crocodiles, etc. But now animals are portrayed to actively recruit consumers. I’m especially nauseated by the shot of a penguin offering a stone to a potential mate being denigrated by another penguin offering a fancy diamond necklace.

How can we have serious discussions about the ecological costs and limits to growth or the need to degrow economies when consumption is seen as the very reason the economy and society exist?

Canada, allies to discuss whether to start intercepting North Korean vessels

Canada and other countries that supported South Korea during the Korean War will sit down in Van-

couver next week to mull ways to tighten the screws on North Korea - including whether to start intercepting North Korean vessels.

U.S. State Department officials have

confirmed that China and Russia were not invited to next Tuesday's meeting, which Canada is co-hosting with the U.S. in response to North Korea's recent nuclear and ballistic missile tests.

Instead, only those countries that deployed troops as part of the United Nations during the Korean War between 1950 and 1953 have been invited to participate in the discussions, which China has blasted as “Cold War thinking.”

The meeting is expected to put a heavy emphasis on finding ways to crack down on the many smuggling and money-laundering schemes that Pyongyang has employed to help it side-

step sanctions and pay for its nuclear program.

Brian Hook, director of policy for U.S. Secretary of State Rex Tillerson, said a naval interdiction will be one option discussed by participants to stop smuggling by sea alongside tougher financial monitoring and sanctions.

Hook defended the decision not to invite China and Russia, which another official said was made with Canada, even though some have questioned what progress can be made without two of North Korea's most important neighbours.

Opening to the Spirit

Today's word: Encounter

1) How much of life is shaped by the people we encounter! A random meeting can change forever the direction of the path we're on, lead to new experiences, fresh ideas, or invite new ways of thinking, a wider worldview.

If, as theologian Martin Buber has written, "all life is meeting" ~ well, I can attest to that. In ministry, I spend a fair amount of time in meetings of many kinds, church governance, social justice, worship and events planning, finance and fundraising, community outreach, pastoral care - to name a few. The power of these encounters with others, where we put our heads together and conspire to accomplish good things, reminds me that most of what we do is done in relationship. We accomplish very little on our own, and depend upon the shared energy, insights and passion of countless others.

Buber was not simply speaking of meetings we schedule in our calendars for which we have pre-conceived agendas. We are born into a context of encounters that have much to do with how our personalities, values and behavioural patterns will unfold. The very fact of my being here, writing these words, has much to do with the chance encounter of an airline mechanic and a young woman behind the soda counter in a small lakeside town three-quarters of a century ago. Had they not encountered each other, I'd not be here - at least as who I am. And all the people I've encountered since my arrival have something to do with how life has unfolded.

These days, DNA tests have become popular as a way of discovering our genetic and cultural roots. But much of where we've come from is the result of the people we meet. Vive la interdependence!

2) Growing up a shy person, I used to be afraid of many types of encounters. From telephoning strangers, to the first day of camp, to going to parties where I did not know everyone, encounters with the unknown were terrifying.

I'm not sure when that changed. I

think it had something to do with being less concerned with what people thought of me, and more interested in what I could learn about others when I dug a little deeper. I discovered, in a very real sense, that you can't judge a book by its cover. Humans have such hidden depths when you can remain curious about how the dust jacket got to be so worn in spots.

When you truly listen in such a way that the owner of the book allows the cover to be cracked open and starts to reveal the contents of the pages, then you are in for a real treat! When we can trust one another enough for this to happen we begin to see our true shining essence. At our core we are all beautiful, though the years and the sorrows may cause our covers to become cracked, worn and uninviting. As we start to read the pages inside we may even get a glimpse of another's soul. It is a privileged moment, a gift that only authentic, empathetic listening can generate.

Such an encounter is as far away from fear as you can get.

3) I was having breakfast with my brother before we went to spend a day at an arena to watch curling. The room was full but eventually a space opened up at a table opposite a couple. The man smiled and looked oddly familiar. After introducing myself and chatting for a few moments I discovered that he and I had attended the same musical earlier last fall, and he had probably served me a drink at the bar during intermission. We chatted like old friends in no time.

Chance encounters happen to me more often than you would think. I tend to talk to most everyone and it doesn't take long here in the Townships to discover that the perfect stranger you just met is your long lost cousin, twice removed, who shares similar family stories. The word encounter is the significant one. When we let down our defenses, share our experiences and really open up to others we can make some amazing connections. Each person in our communities has a unique identity, passions and dreams. We are enriched when we allow ourselves to become vulnerable and reach out with a friendly

smile.

Some of my favourite gospel stories involve encounters Jesus had with unexpected people, like: Nicodemus the priest, The Samaritan woman at the well, Zaccheus the tax collector, or the Canaanite woman who taught Jesus a lesson about inclusion. Each incident was an opening for the spirit.

Who will we encounter this weekend for the first time? What connections will we make that might make a difference in our lives?

4) Life has a way of directing us into each other's presence, guiding two divergent or parallel paths to intersect in some moment of time. From which encounter, events proceed and continue to engage new encounters with friends, family, coworkers, strangers.

We happen upon each other in the course of our comings and goings, and the course we are on is forever changed. Crossing the street at a particular semi-fare, accepting an invitation to a dinner party, bumping into someone at the grocery store, choosing a seat on the plane, stopping for a quick coffee, or greeting a stranger in the queue ~ we've no idea who next will become a character in the novel our life is writing. Or what doors will open, what new beginnings we will encounter in human form.

The role of chance in determining how events unfold was explored in the novels of British writer John Fowles, inviting us to imagine alternative existences. Given how one thing leads to an-

other, not always according to some pre-ordained plan, much of our lives are built on chance encounters. And could be radically different, had we made alternative choices, shifted our plans, met different people along the way. In the midst of a story line he was developing, he'd sometimes stop to ask: but what if it all had been otherwise? What if he'd not made this trip, or that decision, or she'd engaged in a spontaneous last minute change of plans, taken this road instead of the other? What might have happened? And from that change in premise, a whole new story would evolve.

Some of the most important encounters of my life have been unplanned, and we may at any moment be entertaining angels unawares. Let us welcome random encounters, and pray to be open to the unknown blessings they may have in store.

One word, four voices - now it's your turn to reflect: What power does encounter have in your life?

William Wright (1865-1938) : Owner of the Sherbrooke House and the New Sherbrooke Hotel

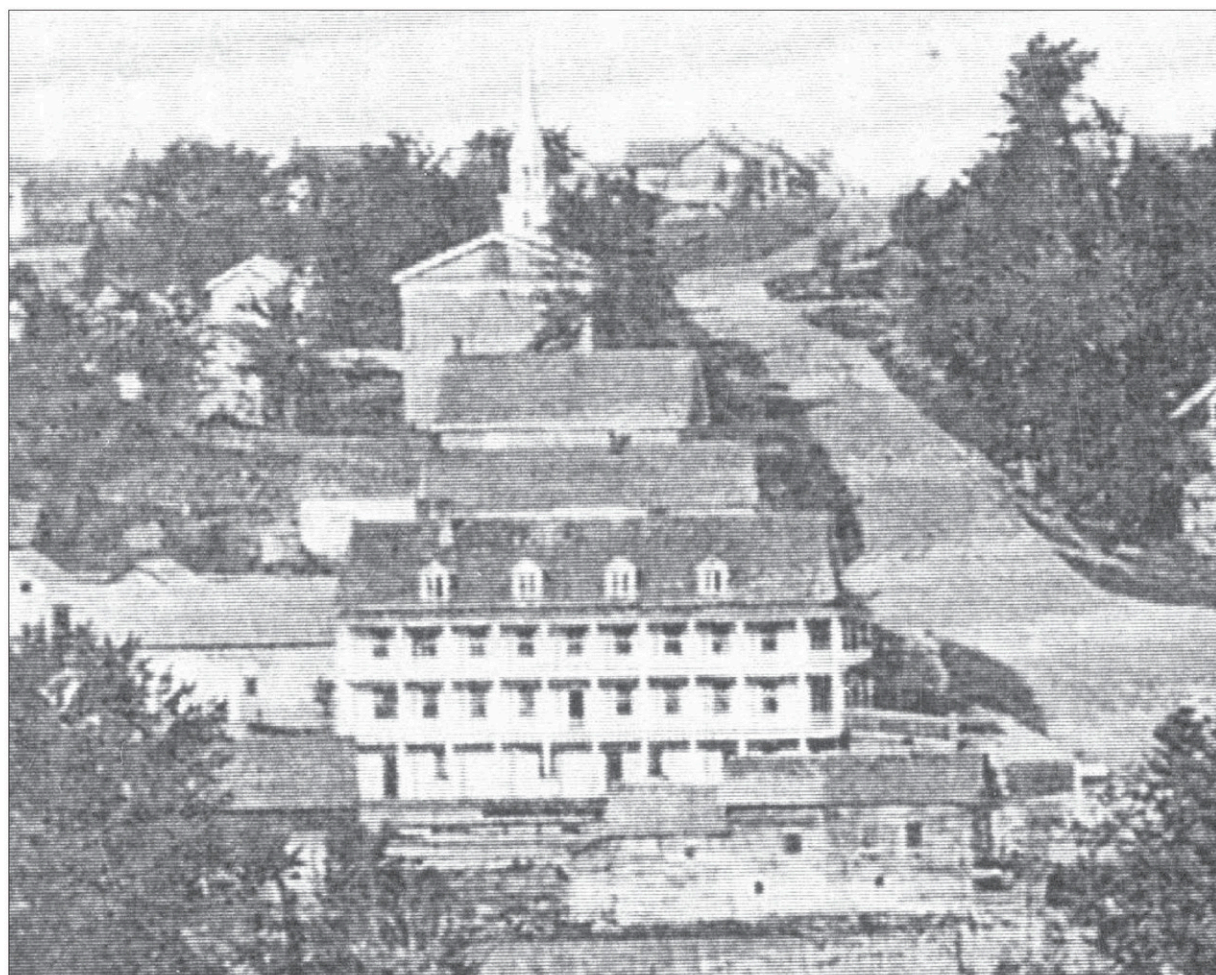
In 1955, a Sherbrooke street is named after an important local hotel owner at the beginning of the 20th century.

William George Wright was born in Lévis, October 19, 1865. He was the son of Elizabeth Wright and George W. Wright, a sergeant in H. M. 17th Regiment of Foot. Elizabeth had likely married him in England around 1864 and they came to Canada at the beginning of 1865. William went to school in Lévis and later in the City of Québec. Among other courses, he studied French. In 1882, he worked as an office clerk for a Lévis grocery store and then in the City of Québec in the timber industry. In 1891, he moved to Montreal and was a travelling merchant in Eastern Quebec and the Atlantic Provinces. While looking for work, William came to Sherbrooke in 1896 and lived on former Goodhue Street, where the federal building now stands. He began working at the Jenckes Machine Co. and then, in 1898, at the Continental Hotel on Wellington Street. In 1899, he became joint owner of the Sherbrooke House, at the corner of du Dépôt and King Ouest. He lived in the hotel. In 1902, he married Emma Abbie Hall (1869-1934). They had three daughters : Mary Almira (1904-1904), Bertha Elizabeth (1905-1926) and Irene Ruth (1908-1990). William Wright belonged to the Church of the Advent on Bowen Sud. For many years, he was president of the Protestant School Board. When his hotel burnt in 1902, he rebuilt it right after and changed its names to the New Sherbrooke Hotel. In 1972, the hotel again went up in flames. Emma and William stayed in the hotel after they married until 1909. William had become the sole owner in 1907. He bought a 20 acre farm on Park Street (Woodward Street since 1913). There he raised race horses at which he took to races both in Canada and in the USA. On the farm, near today's Wright

Street (named for him in 1955), he built a splendid home in the neo-Tudor style. He named it The Gables and lived there until his death. In 1911, apart from his wife and three daughters, his mother in law, Flora Hall also lived there, along with three servants, in a nearby house. William died in 1938 in Sherbrooke and was buried in Elmwood Cemetery. His house (No 685) as well as the one of the servants (No 717) were owned from 1940 to 1990 by his daughter Irene and her husband, Roland (Rollie) Badger. In 1999, the property was bought by psychiatrist Angelo Fallu, where he opened the Woodward Clinic that specializes in evaluation and follow-up services for persons with ADHD (attention deficit/hyperactivity disorder).

I am having a hard time walking because I have a big boot on my left leg. But other than that I'm doing pretty good. To be 81 years old and put myself through what I've been through, it's kinda tough sometimes on the old man but I don't intend to retire. I will be out there on the road and I'll see you real soon."

Kristin Kreuk on 'weird experience' of making new CBC series 'Burden of Truth'

Viewers have watched former "Smallville" and "Beauty and the Beast" star Kristin Kreuk grow up on television.

The 35-year-old Vancouver-native has spent half her life in the spotlight. She was still a teenager when "Smallville" launched in 2001, making her an instant Comic-Con crush as Clark Kent's girlfriend Lana Lang. After a dozen years as a CW ingenue, she finally felt like the grown-up on the set while making CBC's "Burden of Truth," which premieres Wednesday.

Compounding that feeling is working opposite young actresses who were her

age when she started out on "Smallville."

"To be around them, it feels like, 'Oh God, your entire life I've been on a set,'" says Kreuk during a press tour in Cannes, where the series was being shopped internationally.

"That's a weird experience for me to own."

These young actresses didn't grow up watching "Smallville," Kreuk points out, "because they would have been three!"

The new hour-long drama is about a big city lawyer who tackles a troubling case that brings her back in touch with her small-town roots. The series was shot in Selkirk, Man., about 70 kilometres outside of Winnipeg.

In a season-long storyline, Kreuk's character — fast-rising corporate lawyer Joanna Hanley — is dispatched to the prairie town of Millwood to quickly shut down a case against a giant pharmaceutical company. Young girls at the local high school have come down with a mysterious illness causing uncontrollable seizures. Hanley is there, essentially, to buy off the victims and their families.

The series was created by Brad Simpson, a story editor and writer who previously worked on "Rookie Blue" and the short-lived Toronto cop drama "King." It was developed at eOne "but it wasn't going anywhere," says seasoned executive producer Ilana Frank ("Saving Hope," "Rookie Blue").

Simpson, Frank's stepson, relinquished the producer role and Adam Pettie ("Saving Hope") was brought in as showrunner.

"I thought: this has got to be made," says Frank. "Kristin was already attached so some of the hard work was done already."

Kreuk, also an executive producer, huddled with Simpson in the early going to define her character and continues that collaboration with Pettie.

"I feel like she's a creation of all of us," says Kreuk, who sees the young lawyer as "a little socially awkward — like me."

Frank thinks of the series "as a cross

President Winfrey? No way, says Trump: 'I'll beat Oprah'

President Winfrey? No way, says political prognosticator Donald Trump.

"I'll beat Oprah," the president declared flatly at a White House meeting Tuesday — though he quickly added, "I don't think she's going to run."

Asked about all the presidential speculation suddenly swirling around Winfrey, the typically pugilistic Trump steered clear of nasty nicknames and colorful insults while sizing up such a potential celebrity showdown.

"Oprah would be a lot of fun," said Trump, who added that he knows her "very well."

Trump appeared on Winfrey's long-running talk show in 1988 and again with his family in 2011, during her final season.

As Democrats encouraged Winfrey to consider a bid, her best friend, CBS News host Gayle King, said Tuesday that Winfrey is "intrigued" by the idea.

"She loves this country and would like to be of service in some way, but I don't think she's actively considering it at this time," King said, noting that she had spoken to Winfrey at length the night before. "I also know that after years of watching the Oprah show, you always have the right to change your mind."

The presidential buzz follows Winfrey's impassioned call for "a brighter morning even in our darkest nights" at the Golden Globes on Sunday night in a speech that left some viewers contemplating the idea of the Democratic Party embracing a celebrity candidate of its own to challenge Trump in 2020. Trump, of course, was a businessman-turned-reality-television-star before his extraordinary political rise.

Trump's daughter Ivanka endorsed

Oprah's message, if not a political future, in a tweet Monday: "Just saw ?Oprah's empowering and inspiring speech at last night's #GoldenGlobes. Let's all come together, women & men, & say #TIMESUP! #UNITED"

Winfrey, in September and October, publicly dismissed the notion of seeking the nation's highest office, though she noted that Trump's victory made her rethink the requirements of the office.

The 64-year-old media mogul has become a cultural phenomenon. She was born into a poor home in Mississippi but broke through as a television news and talk show personality in the 1980s. Over 30-plus years, she became the face of television talk shows, starred and produced feature films, and began her own network.

Trump's kind words for Oprah are not new. In a 1999 interview, he praised her as a strong choice for vice-president.

2018 Canadian Championship schedule unveiled

In the other semi-final, Toronto (first) will face the winner of the second qualification round between USL club Ottawa Fury FC (fourth) and the winner of the first qualification round.

The 2018 edition of the Canadian Championship will feature an additional qualifying round with PLSQ champions AS Blainville hosting League1 Ontario (L10) winners Oakville Blue Devils before

traveling to play the return leg in Oakville.

The first leg of the final will be played on August 8 and the second leg will be played on August 15.

The Impact won the first edition of the tournament in 2008, as well as in 2013 and 2014. The last title led the team to the Champions League final against Mexican club América.

In 2018, the CONCACAF Champions League format will change to a single-elimination tournament with the winner qualifying for the 2018 FIFA Club World Cup.

Restless legs worsened by iron deficiency and lack of sleep

Dear Doctor: I am 56 and in menopause. A couple of months ago, I started having severe restless leg syndrome, which even included my arms. I am now taking ropinirole before bed every night - I also take Pristiq for depression. Although the medication has eliminated my restless leg syndrome, I worry about potential long-term effects. Any idea what could cause restless leg syndrome?

Dear Reader: Restless leg syndrome (RLS) is appropriately named. The syndrome is defined by an uncomfortable urge to move one's legs or arms during periods of inactivity. Because most people are less active in the evening,

these symptoms often are first noted at that time. People describe the feeling as a pulling, creeping, cramping, crawling or tingling sensation that makes them feel an urge to move in order to relieve it. The periodic leg movements can also awaken people with the condition - or those who sleep with them.

Restless leg syndrome occurs more often in people of Northern European ancestry; it's rare in those from East Asia and from Africa. Overall, it affects 2 to 3 percent of the population.

There is no specific cause of RLS, although genetic factors can play a part. Forty to 60 percent of people with RLS report a family history of the condition. Low iron storage can also be a factor, as can alterations in the brain function of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

Certain medications can worsen RLS symptoms, such as the antihistamine diphenhydramine and antidepressants. Thus, the antidepressant Pristiq (desvenlafaxine) could make your symptoms worse, but there are no specific studies of its connection with RLS.

Because poor sleep can aggravate RLS, be sure you are getting good rest. Exercise also appears to decrease symptoms, as can reductions in caffeine. Doing mental activities during a person's evening "down time," such as crossword puzzles, can reduce the focus on symptoms.

Medication that binds dopamine receptors, such as the ropinirole that you're taking, can decrease the symp-

toms of restless legs. Such medications are started at night and, although they can initially cause drowsiness, this subsides after 10 to 14 days. One problem with such drugs is that they can lead to rebound symptoms - that is, the restless leg sensations - in the morning. An even bigger problem is that long-term use can lead to decreased effectiveness, a shorter duration of action, symptoms noted earlier in the day and a spread of symptoms into the arms; these problems can worsen with increased dosages. To reduce the likelihood of this, I'd recommend staying on low doses of the drug and not taking it on a nightly basis, if possible.

You might also want to consider the anti-seizure medications gabapentin or pregabalin. They may not be as effective as ropinirole, but there is less likelihood of rebound or worsening of symptoms. Benzodiazepines, such as clonazepam, can be used for RLS, but can lead to tolerance or even dependency.

In summary, have your doctor check your blood ferritin level, a marker for iron stores. If it's low, consider iron supplementation. Also, be sure to increase your levels of exercise, decrease your caffeine intake and try mental activities at night.

If you feel that your symptoms are worsening on the ropinirole, talk to your doctor further. You have other options.

How to get all-day energy

FROM CONSUMER REPORTS(R) By the editors of Consumer Reports

No one is immune to the occasional bout of low energy and weariness. But timed right, small changes in your routine can give you a lift during the day and improve sleep, says Consumer Reports.

See your doctor if you have other symptoms — such as unexplained weight gain or loss, fever, shortness of breath, morning headaches or difficulty concentrating — or recently started a new medication. Otherwise, Consumer Reports suggests giving these seven strategies a try for a month to see whether your energy levels reboot.

Morning

— Let the sunshine in. The brain makes melatonin, the hormone that causes sleepiness, when it's dark. Morning light helps stop the production of melatonin, says Shelby F. Harris, Psy.D., director of the Behavioral Sleep Medicine Program at Montefiore Medical Center in New York City. Upon awakening, open the curtains or shades, sit by a window while you eat breakfast or take a morning walk. Continue to expose

yourself to light during the day to keep your body's sleep-wake cycle synchronized.

— Take a drink break. Even mild dehydration can zap energy, memory and attention, according to a 2016 study published in the American Journal of Clinical Nutrition. Older adults can have a tougher time staying hydrated, in part because the mechanism that triggers thirst may become less efficient with age. To compensate, make it a point to drink at regular intervals throughout the day, beginning in the morning. Coffee and tea count (they have only a mild diuretic effect, if any), as do foods with a high water content, such as soup and most fruits and vegetables.

Afternoon

— Get moving. It seems counterintuitive, but physical activity is a powerful antidote for fatigue. And it doesn't have to be strenuous: In a small University of Georgia study, couch potatoes who engaged in a 20-minute, low-intensity aerobic exercise routine three times per week for six weeks reduced their fatigue by 65 percent; those who engaged in moderate-intensity exercise lowered it by 49 percent.

— Stop sipping coffee and tea. Thanks to their caffeine, both are great pick-me-ups, but it's a good idea to limit the stimulant to 400 mg per day (roughly two to four 8-ounce cups of coffee) and taper off by late afternoon. Consumer Reports notes that caffeine can disrupt sleep when it's consumed even six hours before bedtime.

Evening

— Power down. Dim the lights, switch off the TV and put away smartphones, tablets and computers at least an hour before bedtime. This will trigger your brain to start producing melatonin.

— Make over your bedtime habits. To get the seven to nine hours of slumber you need to restore body and mind, improve your sleep hygiene. Keep your bedroom dark, use your bed only for sex and sleep (no pets allowed), and stick with a regular sleep schedule.

disrespectful. He should want to integrate his newfound daughter with the rest of his family, not hide you from each other. If she's going to be in his life, she needs to be in yours, too. Before issuing any ultimatums involving divorce, try digging deeper with the help of marriage counseling to unearth the truth of the matter.

Dear Annie: Reading the news about sexual harassment, one might get the idea that only men are guilty of this. I know this is not true. I know for a fact, because it happened to me when I was an elementary teacher working with a female principal.

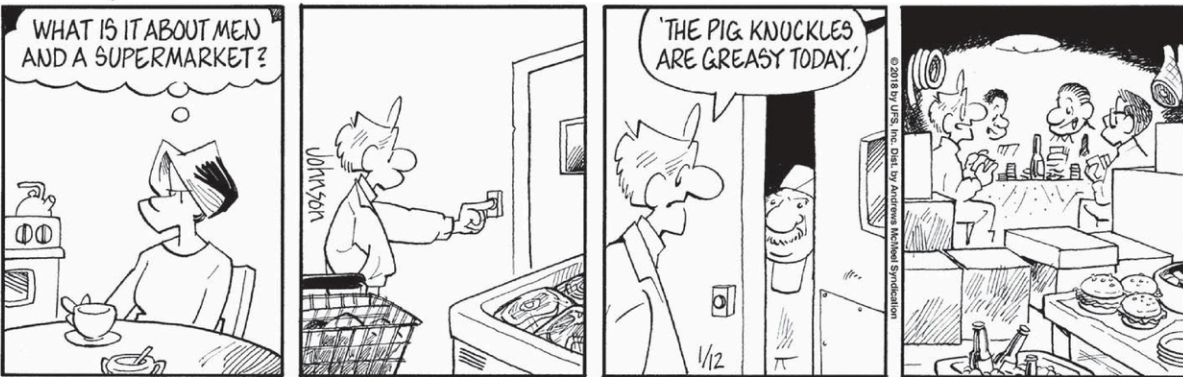

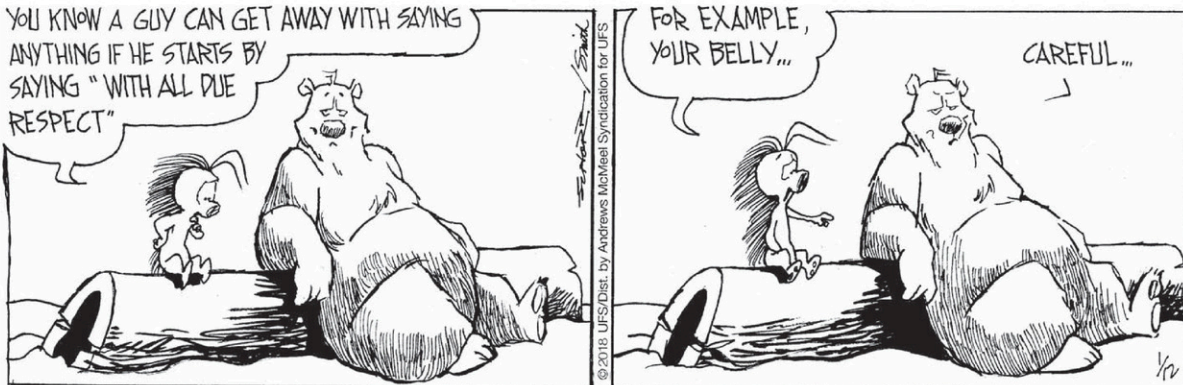

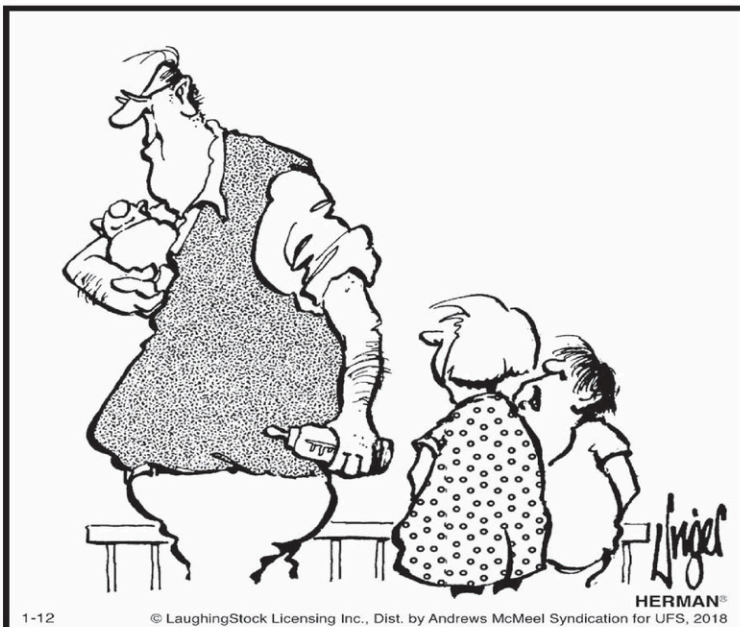

After you bid it, you play it too

It does not matter how good your bidding was if you do not make your contract.

This was an excellently bid slam during the World Youngster (under 20) Pairs in Lyon, France, last August. It was also nicely played by Jean-Baptiste Laine from France (South). How did he handle six clubs after West led the diamond three?

The bidding had a modern slant. The two-diamond rebid by Martin Nataf (North) was an artificial game-force, the XYZ convention. North's four-club continuation promised excellent club support and slam interest; four hearts was a control-bid; four no-trump was Roman Key Card Blackwood; five hearts showed two key cards (as North knew, two aces) and denied the club queen. North settled for six clubs, having no way to find out if his partner had king-doubleton of diamonds without going above six clubs. (Several pairs played in six diamonds, many doubled by East.)

West, hoping his partner had an ace because North had not investigated a grand slam, led his singleton.

Laine won with dummy's ace and drew two rounds of trumps, believing that East's jack indicated an initial doubleton. (In contrast, see tomorrow's

column.) Declarer correctly left the last trump outstanding and played a diamond. East took that trick and shifted to a heart. South won with his ace, played a club to dummy's queen, ruffed a diamond in his hand and claimed, stating that he would cash the spade ace, ruff something on the board and run the diamonds.

Plus 1,370 was worth 60 matchpoints out of 64.
