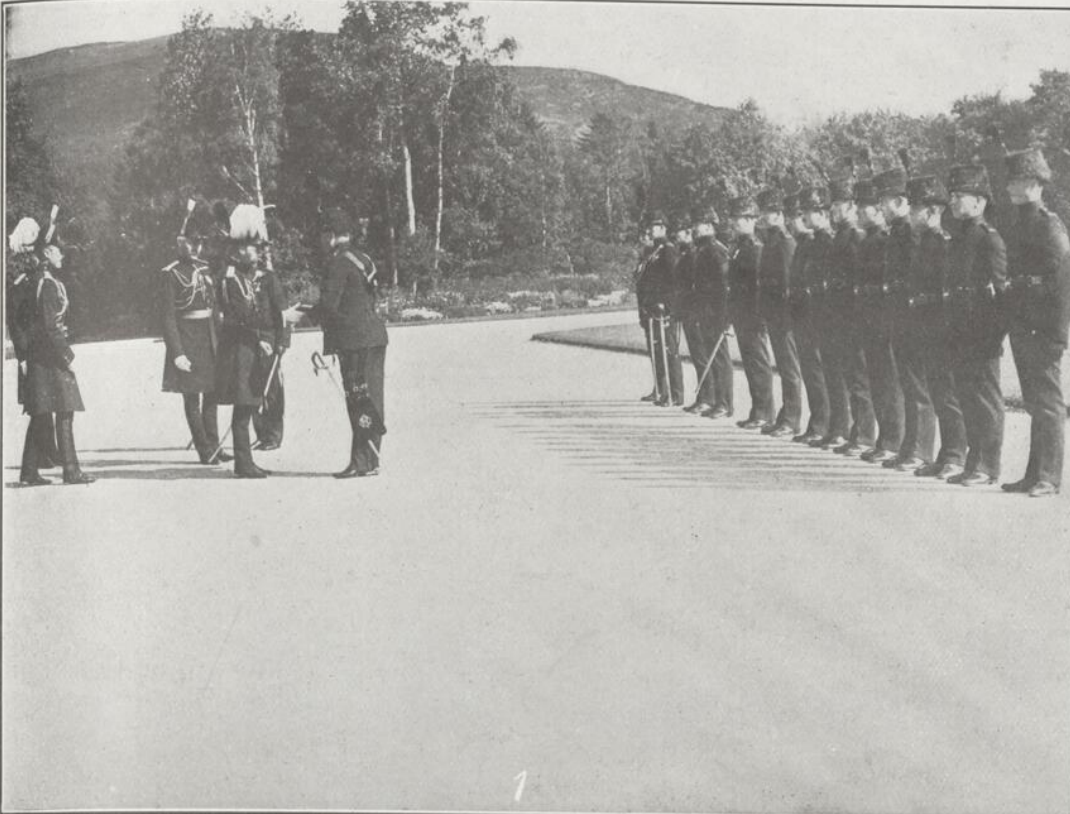
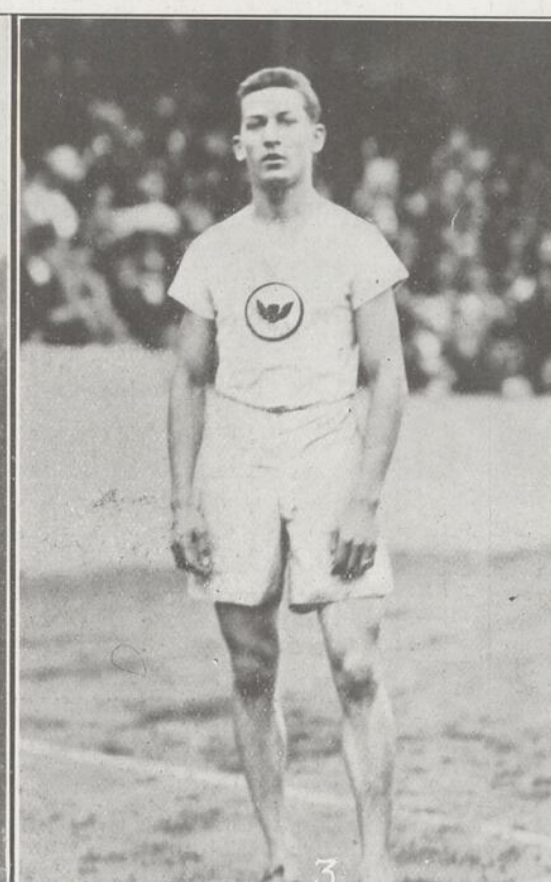
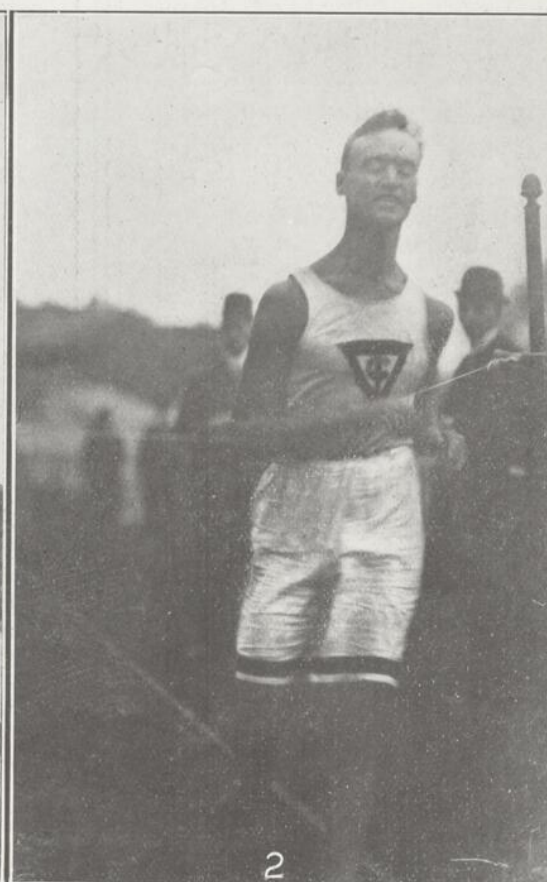


Queen's Own Rifles, Toronto, Reached Montreal To-day After Eventful and History-making Trip to Motherland



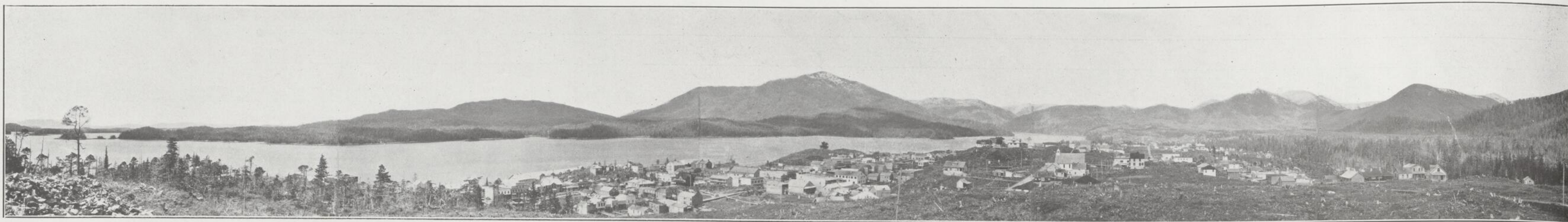

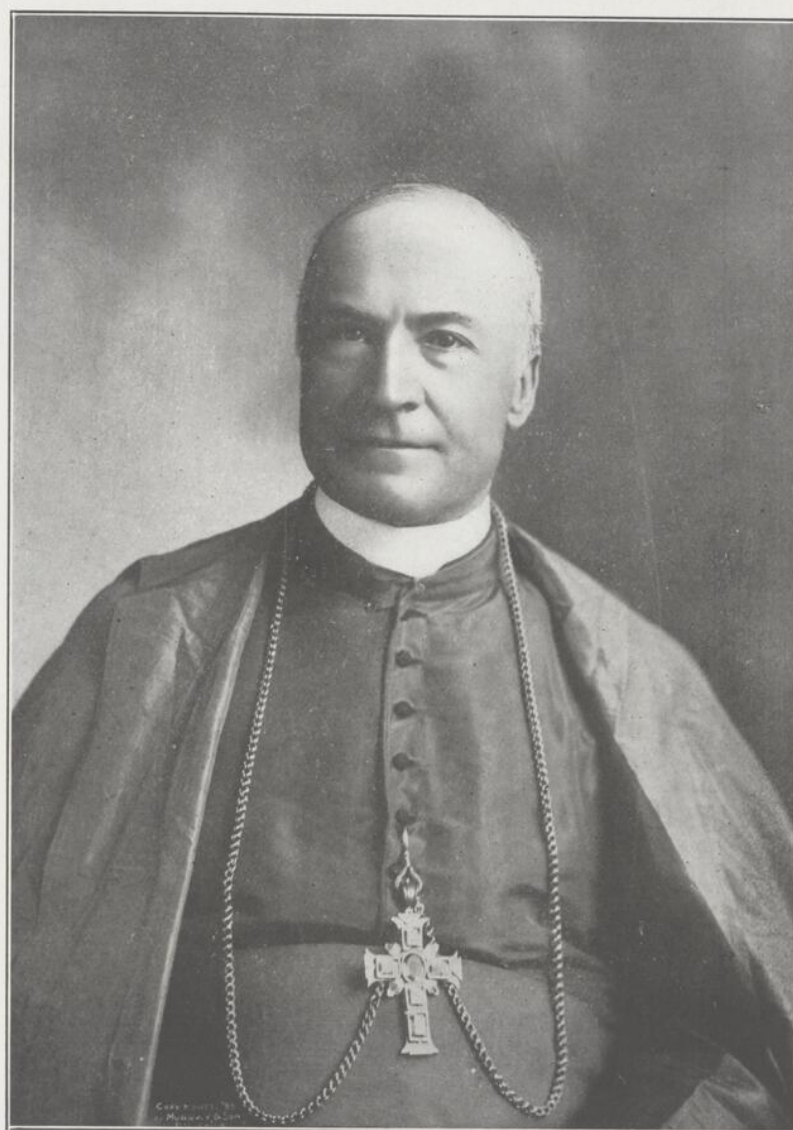

With Millais and Dante Gabriel Rossetti, he was the founder of the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood, and an artist of the loftiest inspiration. Two of his pictures have been seen by Canadians during recent years, namely: "The Light of the World" and "The Shadow of Death" (the latter was exhibited at the Toronto Exhibition last month). Towards the end of his life the great painter was nearly blind. To his dying hour he was tended by the loving care of his wife, who is seen in the above picture leading him from Windsor Castle after a royal garden party.

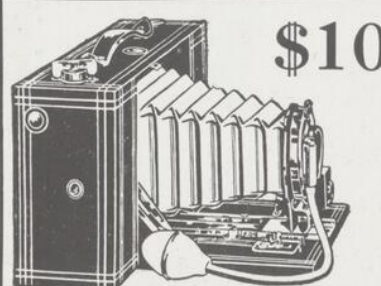

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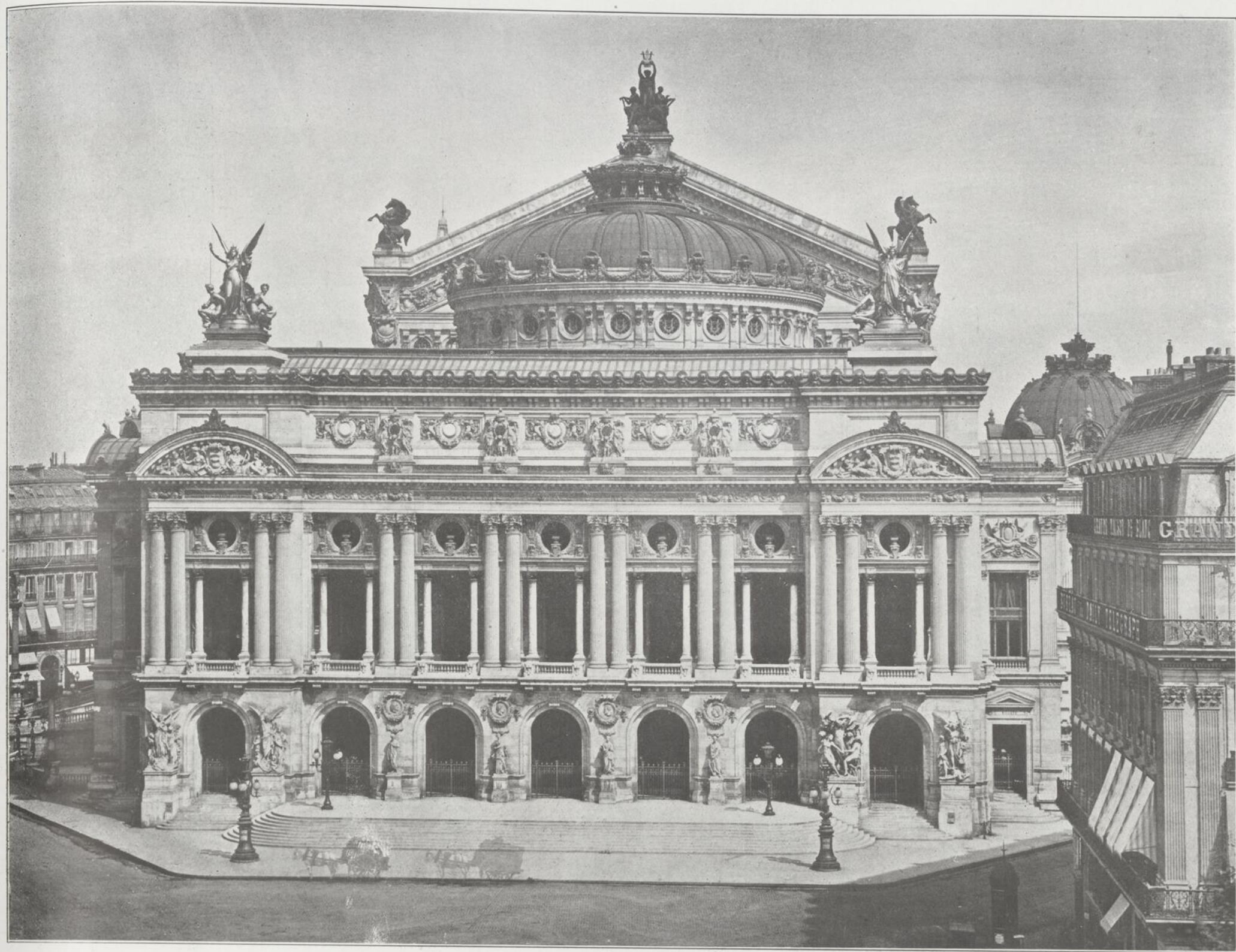

The World's Greatest Opera House, Which Witnessed Brilliant Functions During Reign of Last French Emperor



THE NINTH PLATE IN THE STANDARD'S SERIES OF GREAT TRAVEL PICTURES—The Grand Opera, Paris, showing the beautiful and artistic facade. Of the many buildings in Paris devoted to theatrical entertainments, there is only one, at once the largest and the most beautiful, which is of real architectural importance—the Grand Opera, or National Academy of Music and Dancing. The Opera House, which covers 23½ acres, is the finest theatre in the world. The process of erection, directed by Charles Garnier, lasted from 1861 to 1875, required 673,295 days' work, and cost \$1,440,000—considerably more than St. Paul's Cathedral, London. The front is decorated on the ground story by allegorical groups (Music by Guillaume; Lyrical Poetry by Joffroy; Lyrical Drama by Perraud; and Dancing by Carpeaux) and allegorical figures. In the first story a row of coupled Corinthian columns (each consisting of a single block) forms an open gallery, above which are seven busts of famous musicians: Mozart, Beethoven, etc. Above the architrave of the front appears the dome that covers the auditorium, and behind that rises the vast pediment above the stage, decorated at the corners with enormous groups. On the summit of the pediment an Apollo, raising aloft his lyre, is seen against the sky, and forms the culminating point of the whole edifice. The interior is decorated throughout in the most gorgeous manner with massive gilding, flamboyant scroll-work, statues, paintings, etc. The grand vestibule, grand stair-case, the avant-foyer or corridor leading to the foyer, the foyer or crush-room itself, are especially worthy of mention. The auditorium is seated for 2,156.

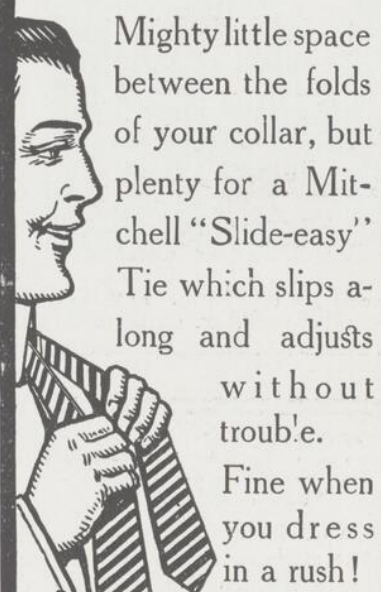

DEATH OF MR. HOLMAN-HUNT.

WELL advanced in his eighty-fourth year, the veteran painter of "The Light of the World" and many other equally famous pictures, Mr. William Holman-Hunt, died recently at his house in Melbury road, London.

His extraordinary career began in the office of an auctioneer, in which he was placed by a commercially-minded father, who strongly disapproved of his son's expressed desire to become an artist.

In these days, it is told, young Hunt would amuse himself by drawing flies on the ground-glass windows of the office, much to his own amusement and to the aggravation of his employer, who mistook the pictured insects for genuine flies, which resisted all his efforts to brush them away.

Holman-Hunt will be best remembered for his picture, "The Light of the World" and for his connection with the famous Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood.

Of the picture two examples are extant. The original, painted between the years 1851 and 1853, was exhibited in the Academy of 1854, and was the property of a Mr. Combe, of Oxford, whose widow afterwards presented it to Keble College.

Here it met with little appreciation, and was hung in such a position that the effect of neighboring hot water pipes was such as to seriously damage the painting. This defect was discovered in 1886, and Mr. Hunt spent some weeks in renovating his work himself.

Afterwards more trouble arose with the Keble authorities, and Mr. Hunt decided to paint a much larger replica of his own picture. This on completion

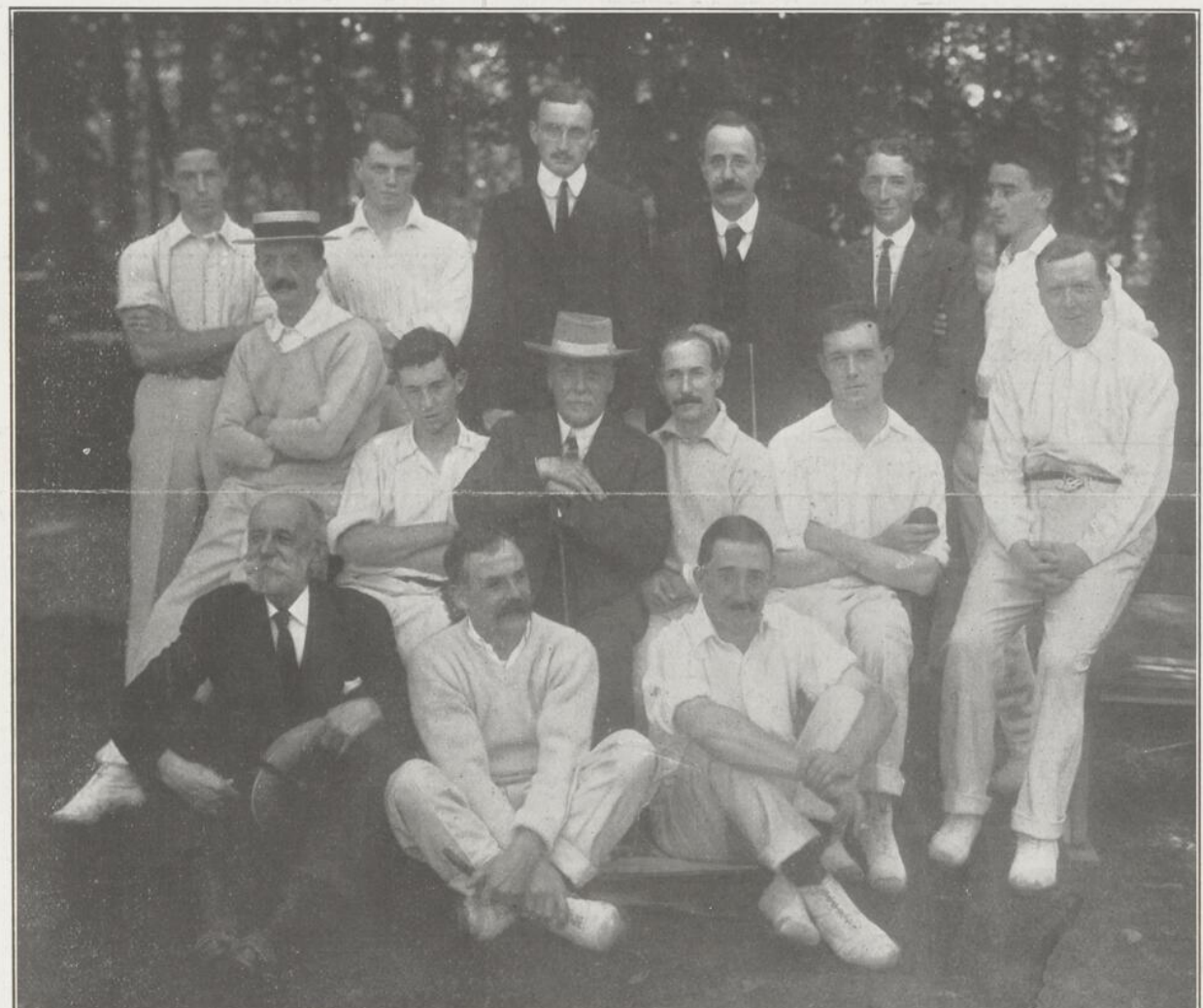

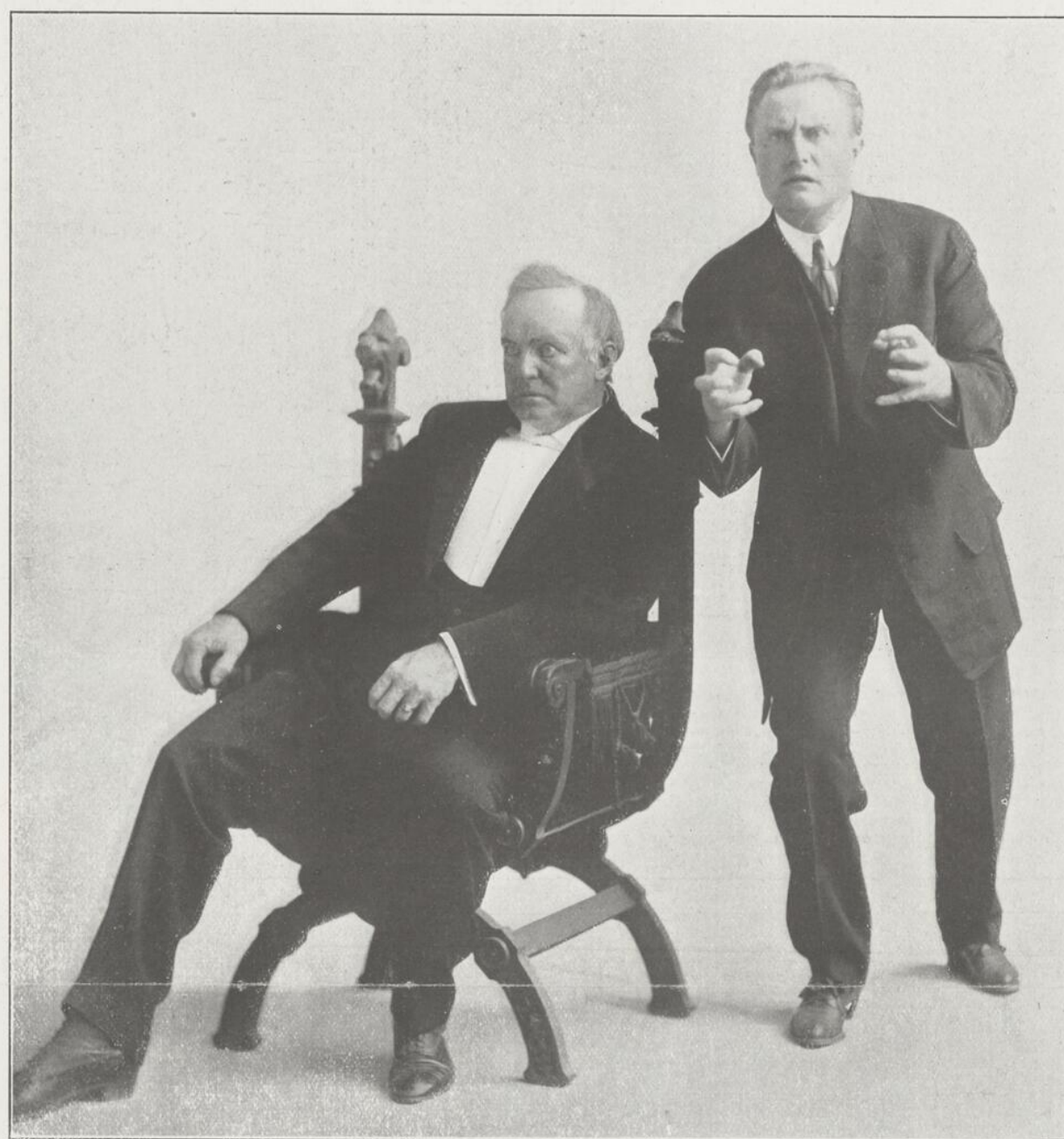

tion was sent round the world for exhibition, and was viewed by hundreds of thousands. It now has a permanent home in the south-west aisle of St. Paul's Cathedral, where it was unveiled in June, 1908. During its tour of the world it was hung for several weeks in the Art Gallery, Montreal, where its beauty was admired by thousands. Another of Mr. Hunt's pictures, "The Shadow of Death," was exhibited this

year in the Art Gallery at the Toronto Exhibition. It was a comparatively small canvas, but it attracted widespread attention.

Of the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood the dead artist was the last survivor. It had its beginning in the early days, when, as a student in the academy schools, young Holman-Hunt made the acquaintance of two other students—Millais and Dante Gabriel Rossetti. These three—later others, among them Burne-Jones and Madox Brown, became associated with them—revolted

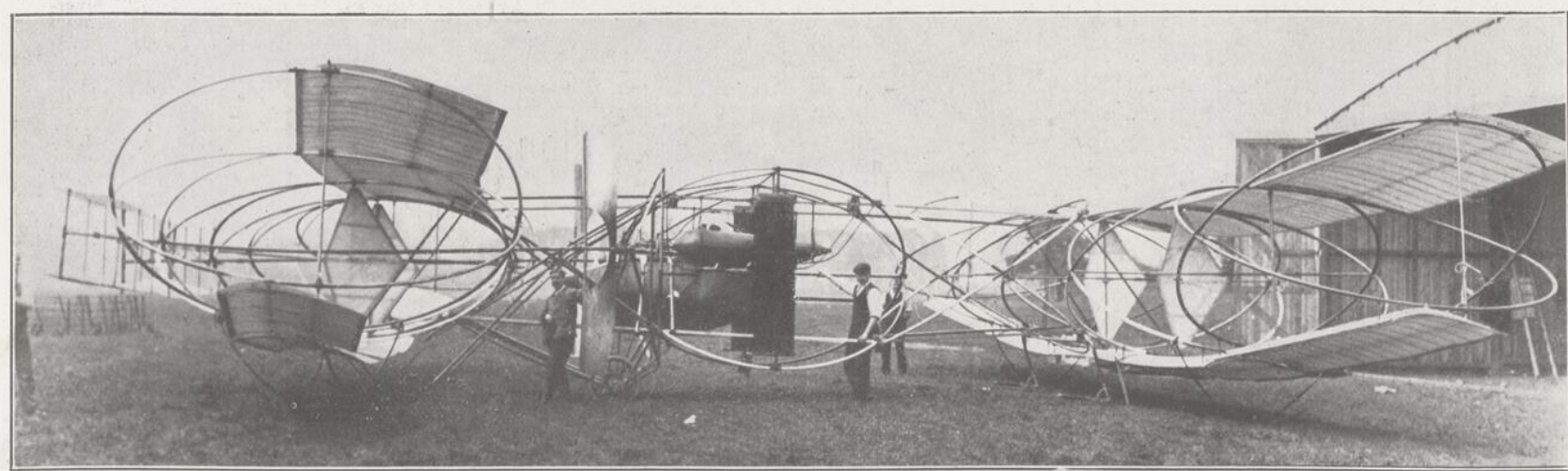
against the then recognized canons of painting, advocating a closer study of nature and a return to the methods of painters before Raphael's time.

They were met with the most discouraging criticism, even anger, but for the sturdy championship of their cause by John Ruskin, might have been driven from all pursuit of art for ever.

Holman-Hunt and his companions, however, slowly forced their way to favor.

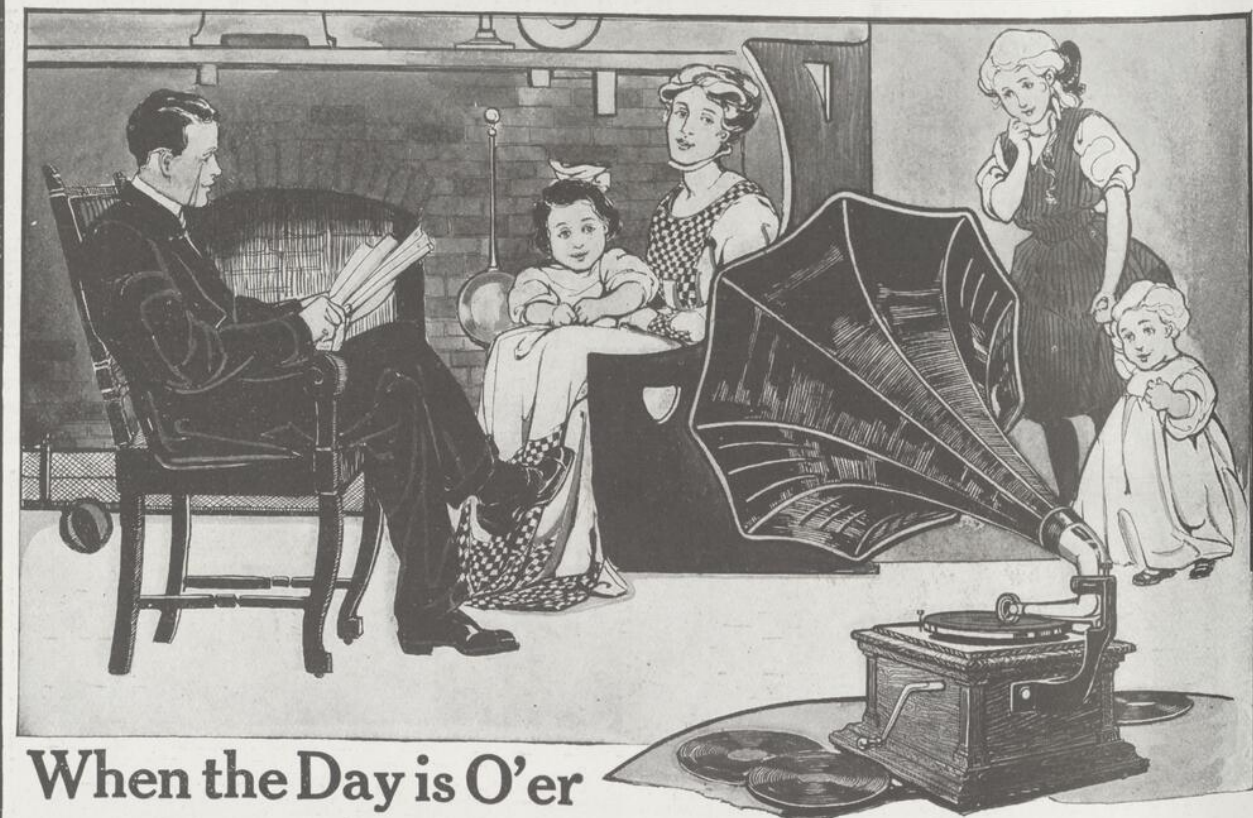
