and R. catholic churches. Distant from Welland, the county town, 8 miles, from Buffalo, N. Y., 20 miles, fare 80c.; from Hamilton 60 miles. Mail daily. Population about 1500.

The southern terminus, head office and works of the Midland Railway of Canada, (formerly known as the Port Hope, Lindsay and Beaverton road) are situated here, and the gauge of this road being the same as that of the Grand Trunk, with which it forms a junction, every facility is afforded for the shipment of its through freight. The Grand Trunk railway has a station at which all trains stop. The steamers of the Canadian Navigation Co. call here regularly; there is a daily steamer to Charlotte, N.Y., the port of Rochester, on the opposite shore of the lake. The Montreal Telegraph Co. and Dominion Telegraph Co. have offices here. **ST CATHARINES**—An incorporated town on the Welland canal, township of Grantham, county of Lincoln. It is the county seat and a very flourishing place. Manufacturing of machinery and agricultural implements is carried on to a large extent. The surrounding country is highly picturesque. For this reason, and because it also possesses the already well-known mineral spring, it is called the Saratoga of British America. The value of the waters, as a remedial agent, were first brought to the notice of the public by Colonel Stephenson, who likewise erected the Stephenson house, a delightful hotel, large enough to accommodate 400 visitors. The spring first discovered, the water of which is used both externally and internally, supplies, on an average, 130,000 gallons per day. Of this amount a large quantity, partially evaporated is sent throughout the country in its concentrated form, and although saline in its nature is, nevertheless, unfit for the manufacture of salt. A second boring in this vicinity has resulted in the discovery of another well, the properties of which are similar to those of the one first discovered. The hotels are equal to any in the Province, and are fitted up with a chaste elegance adapted to the taste of the most fastidious. Montreal Telegraph Co. and Dominion Telegraph Co. have offices and the Great Western railway a station here. It is also a station of the Welland railway. An omnibus is in regular connection with each train. Distant from the Niagara Suspension Bridge 12 miles, from the Falls of Niagara 12 miles, from Hamilton 32 miles, from Toronto, by rail, 71 miles, by water 33 miles, from London 108 miles. Mail daily. **STRATFORD**—The chief town of the county of Perth, on the River Avon, at the junction of the five townships of North Easthope, South Easthope, Ellice, Gore of Downie, and Downie. On the opening of the Grand Trunk railway, Stratford was created an inland port of entry. The foundation stone of the

Town hall was laid in 1864 on the tercentenary, festival of Shakspeare's birth at Stratford upon Avon in England. Stratford is an important station of the Grand Trunk railway, being at the junction of the main line from Toronto to Sarnia, with the Buffalo and Goderich branch from Goderich to Buffalo, and with the London and St Mary's branch, which connects with the Great Western railway at London. The directors of the Grand Trunk Railway Co. have recently decided upon removing all their works to the West, with the exception of the car wheel manufactory which remains at Brantford, to this town, and ground has been taken up, and building commenced. This will greatly tend to increase the population and prosperity of Stratford. Already from 300 to 400 houses and cottages are in course of construction for the reception of the workmen and their families, who will number about 2000 souls. A new and commodious station has just been erected, which, in beauty and internal accommodation, exceeds any other on the line. It is proposed to build a railway from Stratford to Saugeen. Stratford being the centre of a very fertile and thickly settled country has become an important market for grain and produce of all kinds. It possesses also good water power, and extensive mills. Mr. Sharman, proprietor of the Stratford agricultural works, manufactures here a special article in the shape of the little giant thunder separator for farmers use. Montreal Telegraph Co. has an office here. \* **TORONTO**—The "Queen City of the West," and capital of the Province, is situated on the north-west shore of Lake Ontario, county of York. The city faces a spacious bay. From a distance it presents no striking aspect, owing to its site being rather flat, but on nearing it, especially from the lake, it gradually unfolds itself. Magnificent buildings come into view, topped by the domes and spires of the churches and public buildings, giving it an imposing and picturesque appearance. The city, which was originally called York and founded in 1784, is laid out with singular regularity, in the form of a parallelogram, the streets intersecting each other at right angles. King and Yonge are the two principal streets: the former—the great thoroughfare and promenade—with its broad sidewalks and handsome well-filled shops, runs parallel with the bay; the latter, intersecting it, runs northward through a rich and prosperous agricultural country, forming a sort of irregular village of upwards of thirty miles in length. The Esplanade facing the bay, with its lines of quays and parallel lines of railway, presents at all times an animated scene. Toronto has many industrial establishments, including foundries, mills, tanneries, breweries, distilleries, and a great variety of other factories, all thriving and prosperous. The public buildings of the city are numerous, and many of them extremely handsome, such for instance as St James' and St Michael's Cathedrals, the General Hospital, Exhibition buildings, Lunatic asylum, City hall, Trinity college, St Lawrence market, Music hall, Kossin and Queen's hotels, Post office, Banks, Masonic hall, Normal, Model, Parochial and other schools, Convents, Churches, Girls' home, Gaol, &c. Osgoode hall, the seat of the Superior Courts of Law and Equity for the Province, situated on Queen street, and the University of Toronto and University college, standing retired amid the sequestered shades of University Park, are noble edifices. A magnetic observatory established by the Imperial Government in 1840, is attached to the University. Its position is lat 43° 39' 4" N., long 79° 21' 5" W., or 5h. 17m. 26s. slow of Greenwich time. The University Park, with its beautiful monument to the
