It is satisfactory to learn from Sir Charles Tupper that the Canadian Pacific Company have definitely established their headquarters at Winnipeg.

The Boston Journal is of opinion that if the Tariff Commission Bill, now before Congress, passed by the body, as is probable, it might be amiss to authorize the Commission to consider the subject of a Commercial Treaty with Canada in connection with the revision of the Tariff.

A TELEGRAPHIC despatch from Chicago says the smallpox plague is increasing there alarmingly, from thirty to forty new cases being reported daily.

COMMANDER CHEYNE'S proposed trip to the North Pole by balloon does not seem to have been to any considerable extent, and the gallant Commander, it is said, has turned his attention to a field of exploration which, if it proves less hazardous and success in it less glorious, will nevertheless be more practicable and useful and better worth the expenditure of Government money.

This official announcement of Mr. C. Holland, general manager of the Ontario Bank, that the deficiency in the accounts of the late Mr. Fisher, local manager of the bank at Toronto, will not exceed \$33,000, and that the bank will not suffer loss through it, while it will be gratifying to the shareholders, will also meet with the general approval of business men.

Noon Telegrams. THE LOSS OF THE "RODGERS." The Herald's correspondent at Yokohama, April 2, that the Governor of Sredin, Kolymsk, who left Jilder at Verkhoyansk, states that Jilder's journey to Verkhoyansk, after his arrival at the latter part of February, and told the Governor of the steamer "Rodgers" was burned on 1st January.

DEATH OF DARWIN. LONDON, April 20.—Charles Robert Darwin, M.A., F.R.S., the well known scientist, is dead. He was ill for some days, and was supposed to be recovering, but had a relapse on Tuesday and never rallied.

BERNHARDT IN SPAIN.—MADRID, April 21.—Sara Bernhardt left for Lisbon and Oporto. She will go afterwards to Barcelona and Brussels before going to London, which she will visit during the latter part of the season.

THE HOUSE OF COMMONS ON WEDNESDAY.—The House of Commons met at 10 o'clock on Wednesday morning, the 18th inst., and was opened by Mr. Ashton Dilke, who proposes to throw upon the community the expense of a returning officer in conducting a Parliamentary election.

THE RUSSIAN JEWS.—LONDON, April 21.—The Council of the Russian Empire has been instructed to draw a law defining the position of the Jews in Russia. At a private meeting in Berlin to assist the emigration of Russian Jews 70,000 marks were subscribed.

THE MOVEMENTS OF THE CLUB NATIONAL IN FAVOR OF THE POLAR EXPEDITION.—The movement inaugurated by the Club National in favor of the polar expedition, and the attendance of Canada received still further strength at a meeting of the Club National on Wednesday evening, when the following resolutions were unanimously adopted:
