Athletics, Harkins-style

An athletic program that produces

George Harkins' work pays off

Somewhere in that mob of marathon runners on the cover is George Harkins. Like most of the entrants, he was a part-time jogger running last year's Montreal Marathon as a personal challenge. Most of Harkins' time -- about over 12 hours a day from September to June -- is spent running the athletic program at Seminaire Salesiens in Sherbrooke.

Harkins has moulded a unique physical education department that is compatible with the Salesiens religious order's mission -- to work with young people and combine healthy mind and a fit body to mold a "whole man".

The seminary opened their Don Bosco St. site in 1962 and Harkins gradually introduced athletics without the luxury of proper facilities. The St. Pat's High School graduate left Sherbrooke to study in the United States and returned as a deacon in 1962.

"We started with nothing," Harkins recalls. "We had soccer, lacrosse, riflery, broomball, outdoor hockey, indoor floor hockey, softball and track

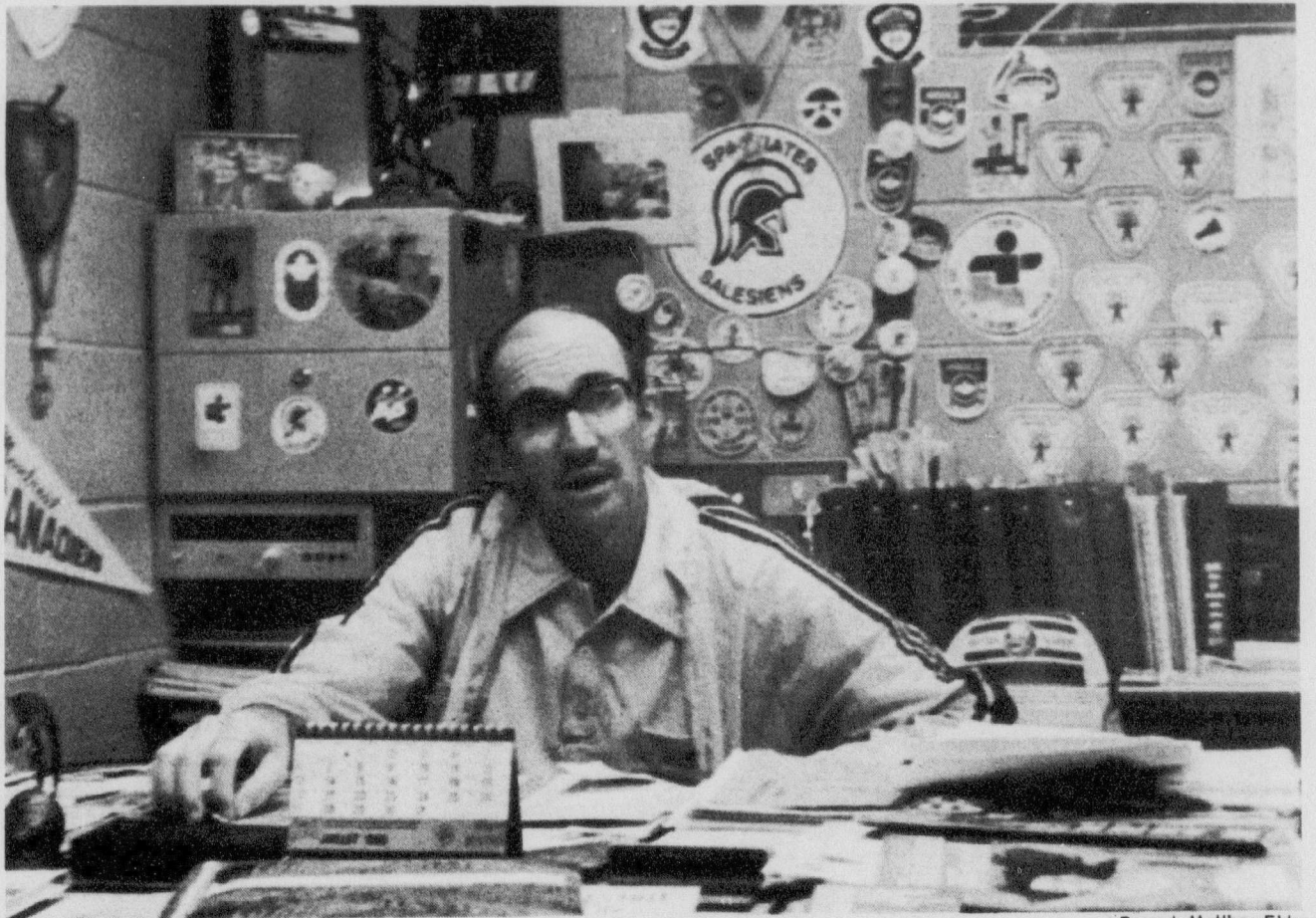
school's impressive sports complex opened. It includes a double gymnasium, weight room (with Universal), gymnastics hall and locker rooms.

The building has been designed with extensions in mind. Harkins hopes a swimming pool and hockey arena may someday be added.

For a school of 500, such additions might seem a little far fetched. But Salesiens has a history of cooperating with the community and a cooperative effort isn't out of the question. Cooperation begins with the parents who must arrange transportation if their boy is to participate in the interscholastic sports. Bus transportation cannot be arranged after 4 o'clock.

Harkins maintains contacts with the Universite de Sherbrooke and the anglophone Eastern Townships Regional School Board schools. Several phys ed students from U de S are part-time coaches at Salesiens and the seminary's athletes often make use of the university's fine facilities.

"You have to be regionally-minded," he says.

few francophone schools in the area to compete against the ETRSB schools. Harkins is always ready to cooperate with Alexander Galt, Richmond Regional, Stanstead College and Bishop's College School and this spirit of communication is seen in Harkins' Spartiates Track and Field Club.

The Spartiates -- also the name of the seminary's teams -- are independent of Salesiens and the ETIAC, but draw many of their athletes from the community.

It's a program for competitive athletes, however. Youths who want to get in shape at a recreational level are encouraged to join the U de S 'Programmes d'animation sportive pour les jeunes'. Information can be obtained from Jean Poirier at 565-5670.

"Why limit track and field to just the summer?" Harkins asks. The club runs year-round training programs. Many athletes participate in other sports -- "Running, jumping and throwing are basic to all sports," Harkins says.

He points to Wendy Simons as a good example of the program. Simons recently put in excellent times in the 100 and 200-metres at the Canadian junior championships in Sudbury. "The Simons contacted me and said they thought Wendy had potential," Harkins says. "We put her on a year-round program and look how she's done."

"The Townships has

great potential for athletes. We have a beginning for future Canadian champions. All of Quebec, for that matter, is coming of age (at the national level)."

But Harkins is quick to add that the club is only trying to promote physical fitness and not produce superhuman, winning athletes. "We don't want a robot. We want to give youth a chance -- to taste it, chew on it and digest it. The rhythm of growth must be respected; structural and motivational factors must be respected. Physical activity has a place in life.

"Sometimes a young person will respond to sports and become interested in his schoolwork as well.

So much of it depends on the family, which can help or hinder his interests. If their child is involved in the athletic program, at least the parents know where his child is and what he's doing," he adds.

Harkins stresses that facilities, scheduling and system are nowhere near as important as the people who institute them. "We have top notch instructors (both at Salesiens and the Spartiates Club), and that's the most important thing."

There's a small model of a Greek warrior's helmet on the desk in his trophy-laden office. His program promotes fitness, a prerequisite of the Spartan citizen in ancient Greece, and Harkins himself sets

an example. He has been in training for three years and came in 870th at last year's Montreal Marathon -- 8,000 joggers started the 26-mile race and his time was three hours, 25 minutes.

He's not stopping there. He'll run another marathon later this year and next and is aiming at a berth in the Boston Marathon in two years' time.

The Spartiates are hosting their invitational track and field meet at the Universite de Sherbrooke track tomorrow. Athletes will compete in midget, juvenile and open classes. The meet gets underway at 9:30 a.m.

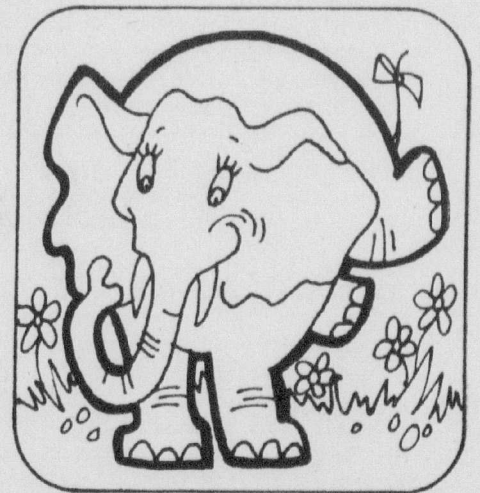

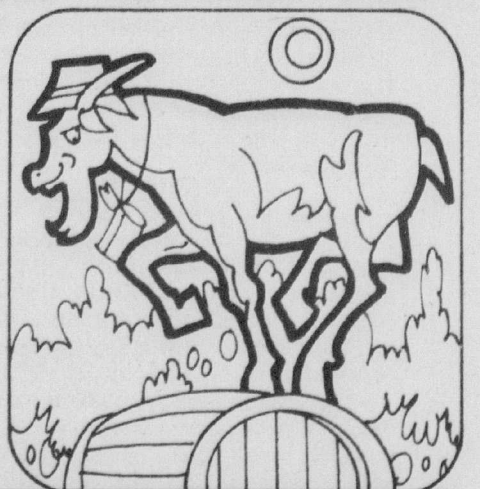

Trip over Niagara Falls was accident

It's been 20 years, but Roger Woodward says he gets annoyed whenever his name is linked with Niagara Falls daredevils.

Woodward was seven years old on July 9, 1960, when he survived a plunge down the 60-metre Horseshoe Falls with nothing but a lifejacket for protection. He had been in a boat that capsized in the Upper Rapids.

"I didn't conquer the falls and I don't want to ever be portrayed as someone who did," said Woodward, who now lives in Orlando, Fla.

James Honeycutt, operator of the boat that capsized, was swept over the falls to his death. Woodward's sister, Deanne, then 17, was pulled from the water above the falls.

Art Carney has learned that bridging the generation gap sometimes has its pitfalls.

In Texas to film a rock musical, *Roadie*, Carney reminisced to a real roadie that his first movie was a musical, *Pot of Gold*, in 1941.

The astonished roadie, to whom 1941 was just a date in the history books, said: "Far out, man. They were making dope movies back then?"

A pain in the asp? Englishman Mike Dickson climbed out of a glass tank in Siegen, West Germany, after sharing it for two months with 25 deadly snakes.

Dickson, 25, said the first two days were the worst when a tree snake bit him "in the trousers."

The feat earns him a world record.

Antiques stolen from Bing Crosby's London apartment three days before his death in 1977 have been recovered by London police.

They were the last presents bought for Crosby by his wife, Kathy.

The mementos, valued at \$46,000, were reported missing from the Crosbys' Mayfair apartment while they were in London for a show at the Palladium.

A man has been detained for questioning in the recovery of the antiques, which include two Russian icons, a gold snuff box and an 18th-century gold cigarette case.

The Queen used to call her third child Andy Pandy, but 20-year-old Prince Andrew has earned a less flattering nickname during the last few years and it's all because of a trip to Canada.

The Sun, a British tabloid that loves to boast of the voluptuous bodies on its third page, devoted its mid-section Tuesday to the life of the "Real Randy Andy."

The good-looking prince, seldom photographed without his wide, white smile, is known for his practical jokes, The Sun says, but perhaps more widely for his womanizing nature. That side of his character began to emerge during his visit to Canada in 1977, the newspaper says.

Canadian girls loved him, it added.

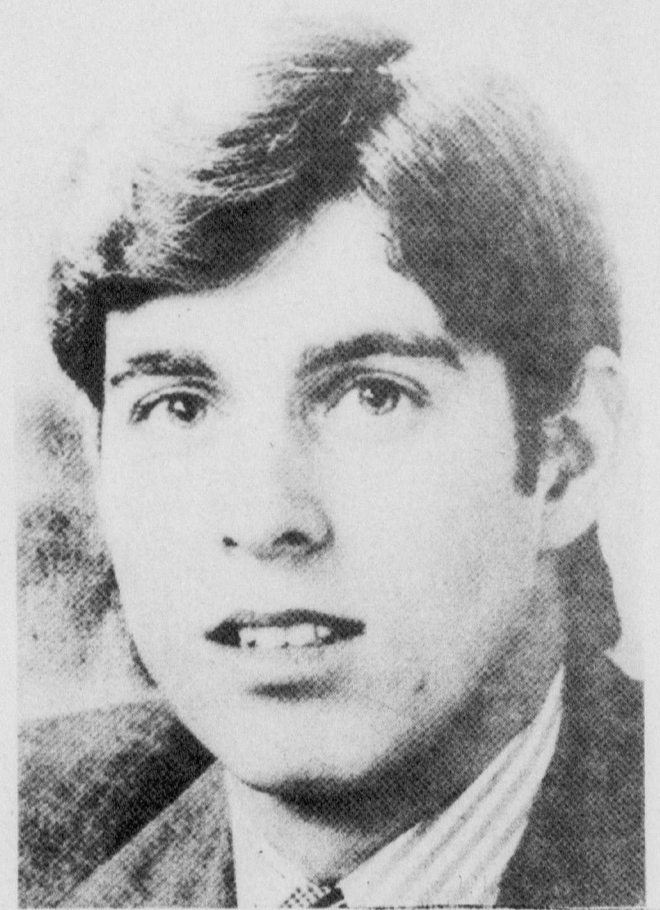
Actor David Niven has filed a \$1.7-million damage suit alleging he suffered demeaning treatment because advertising for his latest film, *Rough Cut*, did not show his picture.

The suit, filed in New York state Supreme Court, named as defendants David Merrick, the producer, and Paramount Pictures Corp. which released the film 12 days ago to 800 theatres in the U.S. and Canada.

Nivens says an advertising campaign to launch the film shows a picture of Niven's costars, Burt Reynolds and LeslieAnn Down, while a contract said Niven was to receive equal billing and credit.

More and more, Canadian television is turning out performers for daytime shows on the three American networks. Alex Trebek, until this season host of CTV's *Stars On Ice*, regularly turns up as emcee of U.S. television game shows, as does Mike Darrow of Global's *Going Places*.

She and game show host perennial Bob Barker will be co-hosts of CBS' *That's My Line*, a *Real People* imitation that will cross North America to present people with unusual hobbies and life stories.

'Falling in Place': A suburban slice of life

Ann Beattie *Falling In Place* (RANDOM HOUSE): \$13.95, 342 pp.

Ann Beattie's *Falling In Place* is a slice of urban and suburban sociology which is not so firmly fixed in the ever changing present of modern America with Blondie's rock hit *Heart of Glass* reverberating from the radios of the New York City and Connecticut landscapes that serve as the novel's main settings. It is the tale of several family groups which become entangled in each other's lives in the summer of 1979: John Knapp, his wife Louise, and their two children, John Joel and Mary, are caught up in the madness of suburbia; Cynthia Forrest is a summer school supply teacher who is fighting the losing battle that asks her to arouse the enthusiasm of freshman high schoolers for the great works of literature, and who incidentally has Mary Knapp in her class; Cynthia's roommate is moody Peter Spangle, who is supposed to be in Madrid bailing out his kid brother, but instead drops in on Nina, who turns out to be the mistress of John Knapp. It is not as incestuously closed a relationship as it sounds, and Beattie does her best to create a framework of randomly interlocking lives that would do justice to a Victorian novel.

Cynthia and Spangle's friends are survivors of that protest-hippie world of the sixties, and part of the interest in Beattie's book is the view we get of the flower children at work or on vacation in a still-hostile, alien world. There is Victor, who ends up operating a light show for a Village sex show, after answering an ad for an ice-cream truck driver, Marielle, who is an actress making ends meet by jobbing in a Xerox copy-making shop; and the hilarious Bobby, whose poetic inspiration has him hauling out file cards to make hastily jotted notes that he has to print; otherwise he can't decipher his own handwriting.

Beattie turns this cast loose in the traumatized, fragmented world of late-seventies living and the results are freaky, occasionally predictable, but entertaining. Identities are sought by most of Beattie's array of characters, but by novel's end have not really been found, and several lives are on the verge of upheaval. Through it all, the lives are narrated in a highly realistic, object-conscious fashion, with attention to the details of mundane affairs. Beattie's style, with alternating chapters italicized, has

occasional bursts of stream-of-consciousness, and introspective forays into the complex minds of the now-generation survivors. Although she has been identified primarily as a short story writer, and one of the New Yorker magazine writers, *Falling In Place* marks Ann Beattie as a fresh, young American novelist whose work will be read in the coming decades.

OFF THE RECORD

Queen *The Game* (ELEKTRA-WEA)

Latest from the British supergroup Queen is a one-year span cross-section of what the four-Mercury, May Deacon

and Taylor-can do. Tracks such as *Crazy Little Thing Called Love* and *Save Me*, were recorded in June and July '79, while six of the ten songs were more recently laid down at Musicland Studios, in Munich, Germany. In spite of the punk rock stance of the stark b&w cover shot of the four, with shorn locks and Brando jackets, the music of Queen is recognizable on the album as belonging to the versatile quartet. The hits that have been already lifted from this album are deceptive, in that as usual they represent the vocal dexterity of Queen, as directed by Choir Meister Freddy Mercury. The frantic side comes through on *Rock It*, and *Coming Soon*, while that electric pairing of hard rock riffs and classy harmonies as lush as Gershwin shines through on *Play The Game* and on parts of several others. Less an album feel than the string of releases whose titles duplicated Marx Brothers movies, *The Game* appears to be a string of singles which will be released as Queen prepares another magnum opus.

Comic-thriller opens at Piggery

Next week, the comic thriller *Catch Me If You Can* begins at the Piggery Theatre in North Hatley. In some ways, this old Broadway hit is a new play, or least a new Canadian adaptation.

Originally, it was a French boulevard mystery-comedy called *Piege Pour Un Seul Homme*, "sort of a French equivalent of *Dial M For Murder*" says Piggery artistic director Charles Murdoch.

The French play, by Robert Thomas, a popular playwright whose comic thrillers have been produced locally on a number of occasions, took place in a fashionable resort town. When it was adapted for the American stage, it was relocated in the Catskills. Now the Canadian version takes place in North Hatley.

"When I read the American version," says Murdoch, "it struck me that the environment was very much like our own. So I thought, why not move it to North Hatley. But I was very leery because that can be a very gimmicky thing to do. I mean, people might think you were trying to sell your play on a gimmick."

"So I carefully began to alter the location without altering the interior of the play. All it does is to intensify, bring closer to the audience what is going on. If you can bring that terror closer to home, it has another dimension."

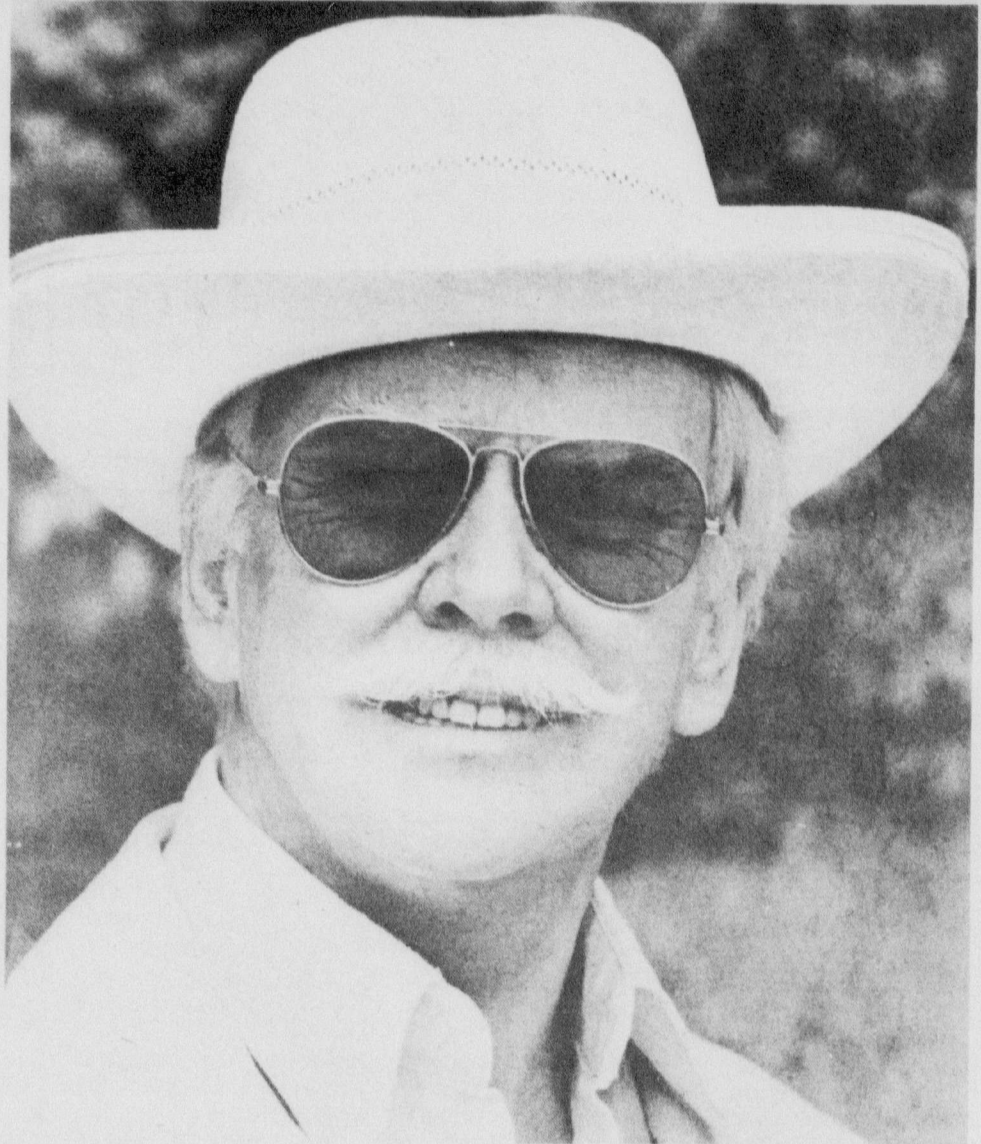
The adaptation has, in fact, an added element of linguistic as well as cultural alienation. The police inspector who is the pivotal character is, of course, French Canadian (played by veteran Montreal actor Terrence Labrosse). So is the parish priest (portrayed by Ottawa-born George Pothitos, who is bilingual).

In the American version, there was a Jewish delicatessen owner who provided comic relief. For the Piggery production, this character miraculously becomes a colourful French-Canadian lady who runs a boulangerie-charcuterie in the centre of town. Heather Hodson, who works at the Montreal comedy club Yuk Yuk's, will bring to the Piggery stage her impersonation of North Hatley's own Dame Jacqueline, with permission from the original.

A newly-married couple from Toronto (Karen Lazar and Damir Andrei) arrive in North Hatley for the summer. Suddenly the wife disappears for several days. When she finally returns, her husband insists that she is a stranger, an imposter. No one believes him. He's surrounded by people whose language he does not speak and framed for a murder he did not commit. Everyone takes the word of the imposter.

"She's perfectly bilingual and his cultural alienation," says Murdoch, "just adds another twist to the whole framework."

"This is a very good play. Mystery and comedy is a delicate balance, a very fine line, and requires performers and a pacing which is right on so that you can get the audience drawing their breath in with fear one minute and laughing the next."

After-theatre cabaret idea becomes reality

When the play is over and you're too keyed up to go home, the Piggery has an added feature to make your evening complete.

Plans for the after-theatre cabaret began last fall. But limited funds dictated that the idea of a theatre club be broken in slowly. So the inauguration of the full-fledged restaurant-cabaret, with a seating capacity of 150, complete with a moveable stage and built-in sound and light equipment, will have to wait until next summer.

In the meantime, just to get everyone used to the idea, Bridget O'Sullivan and Eric Hughes, the two more impressive members of the Rodgers and Hart show,

will be putting on a tribute to Harold Arlen every show night after *Catch Me If You Can* the cover charge will be \$3.

The Piggery Board members have been urging a move in this direction for many years. Thanks to a successful season last summer, the commitment has been made. Despite this year's small-scale operation, Murdoch says, "We know it will have a terrific draw and what we're doing is building up the knowledge of the community so that when we get the more permanent and larger space next year, we will already have established this as another type of theatre we do."

Three owners are life of Quebec jazz club

QUEBEC (CP) — The saxophone blows softly then frenetically, telling tales which lull or inspire as it leads the other instruments through the changing moods of jazz.

On warm summer evenings when cars are forbidden on Quebec City's St. Jean Street in favor of pedestrians, passers-by look up two storeys to the open windows from where the music comes. At the base of the two-metre-high windows are flower boxes.

Inside, standing at the copper-and-wood bar with the customers, are Hector Botta-Iregui and Ninon Dugas. Behind the bar, wearing a man's straw hat and a gee-isn't-this-fun smile is Elizabeth Turgeon.

The three are owners of the popular Cafe Rimbaud.

Botta-Iregui doesn't like to brag about it, but the secret of his success is Black Forest cake.

About four years ago he and Ms. Dugas opened the cafe with the winning combination of the cake and espresso coffee. Today the Rimbaud is a jazz club,

where musicians play to a full house seven days a week.

Not only does this man from Uruguay whip up the meanest Black Forest cake in town, he also is an accomplished actor-director.

GOT 'GLOWING REVIEW
Building on the Rimbaud's successful start and a grant from Quebec's cultural affairs department, Botha-Iregui soon added live theatre to the menu. Then came music and, on one occasion, jazz and theatre together on the small stage.

A newspaper review of the event was headlined: "Le Rimbaud a la Vocation de Jazz" (the Rimbaud was made for jazz), recalls Ms. Turgeon.

A lawyer by training, she has given up her practice to join Botta-Iregui and Ms. Dugas in her dream of making Quebec City the New Orleans of the north.

"The law leads to everything — why not to jazz?" she laughs, recalling her switch from belonging to the bar, as

lawyer for the Rimbaud, to tending bar as part-owner of the club.

The flowers under the windows were her idea. In New Orleans, Ms. Turgeon explains, the jazz clubs have flowers. "It's part of the atmosphere."

Botta-Iregui wants to produce plays again at the Rimbaud, and perhaps a musical. Music and Black Forest cake may be the stuff dreams are made of, but if you don't have the dough, you can't do-re-mi.

HELPS PAY REGULARS

The Cafe Rimbaud has found an angel in the Quebec government, which has provided a one-year renewable grant of \$73,000 under its Operation Solidarite Economique program.

"No one ever thought we could fill a club seven days a week," says Hebert.

Hebert explains that the regular musicians make up two alternating groups. While one group plays a week-long engagement the other practises.

"With jazz you need a rest."

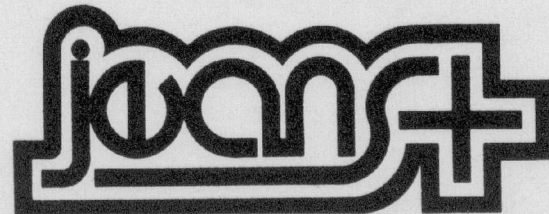

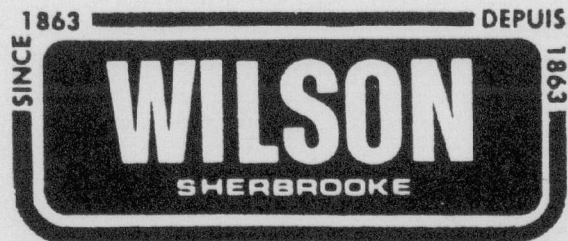

OTTAWA — It is, to the best of my recollection, the first time a country singer has felt the need of a bodyguard while doing an interview with me. But there he is: short, fat, solemn, with only black, horn-rimmed glasses to suggest that this rear shadow of long, lean Hank Williams Jr. is not nearly as menacing as his total silence suggests.

He gets Williams a bottle of Jim Beam, a Kentucky bourbon whiskey, and plants it on the small, arborite table in the rear of the band's tour bus, and then slouches on guard, blocking the passageway of the narrow aisle to the front of the bus. The Silver Eagle is parked behind the sportsplex, a hockey rink in Nepean, a suburban city attached to the northwestern perimeter of the nation's capital.

Williams and The Family Brown are giving a concert here tonight. The acoustics are atrocious. Much of the concert will be lost in the echo of last night's hockey game. Williams pours himself a drink and the interview begins.

In some ways, the son of country music's most famous and influential artist doesn't have much to say, because he's already said it all in his autobiography, *Living Proof* (Academic Press). With assistance from country music writer Michael Bane, it's an extremely well-written account of growing up as Hank Williams' son; a role which gave him financial security, but has made him an artistic albatross.

Still, as the book clearly shows, Hank Jr. inherited not only his father's talent, but a strong personality and intense determination not to die at the age of 29 like his father. He's succeeded. He was 31 on May 26.

Although he has insisted during the past few years that he will no longer perform as an incarnation of his father, Hank Jr. still sings some of his father's songs, and refers to him in his own songs.

"But I'm doing it my way, not their way," he explains. "That's the fun part. I'm the only one who can sing about being Hank's son. I want to show the happy side of his music, not the morbid part."

During his concert, hundreds of people walk out before his show is half over. Some complain they expected a sound closer to his father's. Others say they didn't expect that, but that Williams' music is nearly hard rock. It's far from hard rock but "heavy metal country" is close. Williams presents himself on stage with an arrogant intensity, which almost dares the audience not to like him. It's as if he's trying to convince himself, as much as the

audience, that he's his own man.

That's strange, because Williams has certainly shown he's his own man on the albums he's released in the past few years, beginning in 1975 with *Hank Williams Jr. and Friends*. The friends included Charlie Daniels, Toy Caldwell from the Marshall Tucker Band, and Chuck Leavell, then with the Allman Brothers Band.

"*Friends* was recorded in 1974," Williams says, correcting the impression given in his autobiography that it was recorded following his near fatal accident, when he fell 500 feet down the side of a mountain in August 1975. "The accident held up the release of the album and cancelled the tour that was all set with Marshall Tucker. I had quit the old show (re-creating Hank Sr.) and was waiting for contracts to run out, so I could get on with my music. Then the accident stopped it all."

Williams underwent several operations and spent 16 months convalescing before getting back on his feet. He says since the accident he's "more cautious in some ways and a lot wilder in others. Health and family are number one; music, hunting and fishing are tied for second. I've been performing for 23 years, and I don't eat, sleep and drink country music." Williams lives with his third wife and one-year-old daughter on a lake in northwestern Tennessee.

WHAT'S ON

Theatre

The final three performances of **MUSIC BY RODGERS, LYRICS BY HART** are on tonight and tomorrow at the Piggery in North Hatley - songs grouped thematically and performed with enthusiasm by Eric Hughes, Bridget O'Sullivan, Joanne Kerwan Clark and Ted Simonett.

Opening next Thursday, **CATCH ME IF YOU CAN** remains shrouded in mystery. All we've been told is that Jack Weinstock and Willy Gilbert's thriller has been re-set in North Hatley where a Torontonian brings his wife. She disappears and is replaced by a stranger who claims to be his wife. The cast for this second production of the Piggery season includes Terrence Labrosse, Damir Andrei, Karen Lazar, George Pothitos and Heather Hodson. (See preview).

There's still time to take advantage of the Piggery's three-show subscription - a reasonable \$14 (\$11 for senior citizens). **THE WONDERFUL WORLD OF SARAH BINKS** begins August 12. There are shows Tuesday to Friday (\$6) at 20:30 and Saturday (\$7) at 18:00 and 21:30.

Festival Lennoxville is in full swing now. Of the three plays, the most serious, best-written and best-performed is Sharon Pollock's **ONE TIGER TO A HILL**, a social drama loosely based on events surrounding the 1975 hostage-taking incident at the B.C. Penitentiary. Projecting tension and excitement, Brian Paul, Guy Bannerman, Michelle Fisk, Michael Ball and a fine supporting cast make **Tiger** an exhilarating theatrical experience.

Peter Colley's thriller, **I'LL BE BACK FOR YOU BEFORE MIDNIGHT** indulges in some soggy melodrama and cliches. But good acting, the nifty twists and turns and surprise ending will keep you riveted to your seat in the final act.

W.O. Mitchell's **THE BLACK BONSPIEL OF WULLIE MACCRIMMON** could stand both editing and Ouzounian's golden touch with one-liners, especially to beef up those magnificent but undeveloped characters (Guy Fawkes, Judas Iscariot and MacBeth).

There are excellent characterizations by Michael Ball and Hugh Webster and, despite small parts, by Brian Paul and Guy Bannerman. The special effects, when well-co-ordinated are most impressive.

All three plays deserve to be seen and reasonable subscription rates provide an economical way of doing so.

To reserve call 819-835-5464. **Entre Chien et Loup** is a company doing some of the most innovative and exciting theatre in the area, if not in the province. Be sure to check them out.

This summer's musical comedy at the Theatre de Mar-

joline in Eastman is **TOURNEZ CHEVAUX DE BOIS** by Louis Georges Carrier and Leon Bernier.

If you are looking for an amusing way to pick up French, you might try the Union Theatrale's **MONSIEUR MAZURE OU LES PARTICULARITES DE MADAME** at Le Domaine Montjoie in North Hatley. You may not be aware of this 145-seat theatre behind the ski lodge. Despite its hard lecture-room seats, poor equipment and amateurish management, the Union Theatrale's young cast actually makes one forget the surroundings and become involved in the very accessible situation comedy. The play is standard French bedroom fare and the acting surprisingly credible but the most amusing aspect of watching this semi-professional production is the accidental. There are shows Thursday to Saturday right through to September. Admission is \$4 (\$3.50 for students).

LES CARCASSES are at the Theatre le Vieux Clocher in Magog until Sunday with their latest creation. "Histoire de Rire" is a comic voyage through the ages from pre-biblical times to the Roman empire, the Middle Age all the way up to the second World War. Festi-jazz is the 'real thing'

Blues that keeps its powder dry

The Powder Blues Band left a trail of smoke when they beat it to Montreal after a smoldering one-night affair at La Poupee recently. This was no powder puff blues. Packing the Georgeville hot spot to the rafters, Powder Blues threatened to blow the place sky high with a dynamite performance.

But the combination of impressive technical virtuosity and hard-sell hype by the band's leader, Tom Lavin, left little room to bare Powder Blues' heart and soul. Lead guitarist Lavin looked like he was born fingering strings but a fat cigar would have gone well with the dark three-piece suit he wore that night. His slick veneer of cool made it difficult to take his music seriously.

Laying it on a bit thick about swinging Magog-town, Lavin took his seven-piece band through some standard numbers, bringing the second set to a rousing finish with their big hit "Doin' It Right", prefaced by the comment "I know we're into overtime, but you make us feel so-o-o-go-o-od!" The set, which included only one other original tune (a rockabilly "What's This I'm Drinkin'" from their platinum-selling debut album "Uncut"), was a short and sweet 45 minutes.

A nifty 3-man brass section led by tenor saxophonist Dave Woodward added a big band dimension to the sound.

Willie MacCalder's piano work had a funky bounce but his Hammond organ sounded like a demo from the nearest shopping centre. Bassist Jack Lavin's rich and resonant voice was enough to send Dutch Mason back to the bottle. And brother Tom showed his guitar savy to the nearby dancing girls.

Powder Blues is obviously going places. Let's hope they don't forget where they're coming from.

Buddy Guy, one of the world's great blues guitarists, has said, "You can still play the blues without ever having had the experiences of the blues, but the best blues players have lived the blues." If you want to hear the people who have inspired the likes of Powder Blues, Dutch Mason, Highstreet, the Blues Busters, to say nothing of the Stones, the Beatles, Eric Clapton, Elvis, Allman Brothers, etc., Festi-Jazz is bringing a bunch of them together this weekend. For the third consecutive year, Roue Doudou Boicel, who runs the Rising Sun, has organized a blues and jazz extravaganza at the Place des Arts that is the envy of the country.

Last night, the four-day event took off with Taj Mahal, enticed to Montreal for the first time ever. So diverse and knowledgeable is the Taj repertoire, it stretches from slide guitar Mississippi country blues (he did the film score for as well as appearing in "Sounder") to the very

roots of black music from West Africa and the Caribbean.

Sonny Terry and Brownie McGhee, the popular duo last seen in Sherbrooke about a year and a half ago, were also on hand, along with the legendary Texas bluesman Lightin' Hopkins and Louisiana Red, whose commitment to the Eastern Farm Workers Association and other social activist groups is never divorced from his

Tonight, the great singer and song interpreter Nina Simone, a rare sight in Montreal, gets a whole evening to mellow you out with her soulful, blues-influenced, gospel-tinged, African-inspired approach to music. With an ever-growing selection of songs, from Dylan to Langston Hughes, Gershwin to Willie Dixon, Ms. Simone absorbs influences but leaves a powerful, distinctive imprint all her own.

Some of the legendary blues singers and musicians to be heard tomorrow in an evening devoted to Chicago blues have lived with the reality that blues, while giving birth to lucrative rock and roll, is not itself a commercial commodity. In order to do what they love, musicians like Buddy Guy and Junior Wells have had to moonlight \$15-a-night dates while making a living during the day in whatever way they could.

Buddy Guy appreciates white groups like the Rolling Stones and the Beatles for bringing the blues to public attention and acknowledging their debt to the original masters they were imitating. "Whenever some one asked, they gave the credit to the American blues artists, but the big record companies still won't record and promote us." So when Buddy is not touring, he runs one of only two existing Chicago nightspots that play the blues.

Luther Allison has also taken on the responsibility of keeping blues alive. "I'm considered to be the youngest black blues artist and I'm 38 years old. B.B.

and Muddy can't hold it. When those people are gone, if I don't do it there's nobody there to play blues." A cross between B.B. King and Jimi Hendrix, Allison bridges the gap, synthesizing traditional blues with contemporary rock. He too will be on hand tomorrow night as will Big Mama Thornton.

Having recently made headline news with her appearance at a special concert paying tribute to blues women at the Newport Jazz Festival in New York City, Big Mama Thornton will probably receive a standing ovation at the Place des Arts. How many people know that

"Hound Dog" was hers before Elvis cashed in on that phenomenal hit? But she bears no grudges. Although she may appear weak and frail (she was in a serious auto accident three years ago), when she begins to blow that harmonica, all the old power and depth of feeling returns.

Memphis Slim is one of the authentic, active proponents of the blues from its cotton-pickin' riverboat origins to its evolution in urban centres like Chicago where Slim played with Big Bill Broonzy before setting out on his own. Recognized stateside, he carried the blues message to Europe

where the music has always had a healthier appeal than in the land of its birth. Slim will be on the Place des Arts stage tomorrow night too.

So will Willie Dixon, the original "Hoochie Coochie Man", "The Seventh Son" who penned some of the all-time classics recorded by a seemingly endless list of blues and rock greats.

Sunday night is reserved for the jazz giants, Gerry Mulligan and his quartet and Woody Herman with the Young Thundering Herd. Neither make frequent appearances in Montreal. Mulligan began by writing and playing for

Gene Krupa at age 19. Association with Miles Davis, Charles Mingus, Max Roach and Thelonius Monk eventually led to the formation of his first pianoless quartet which featured Chet Baker on trumpet and Chico Hamilton on drums. Since then, with concerts on both sides of the Atlantic, T.V. appearances, records and film scores behind him, he is well-known as a composer, arranger and performer of jazz today.

Woody Herman brings in a big band sound with the Young Thundering Herd. In the business for over 40 years, Herman claims he may never retire.

"Idleness just doesn't work out for me." And he still draws fine young musicians to "the Herman herd". Before going on to solo careers, they cut their teeth with the Grand Master of Big Band Jazz.

Always into promoting the music he loves, Doudou Boicel has started a trend. This summer Terre des Hommes was the site of a similar festival. And next month Quebec City will follow suit—a first in the old city. But Festi-Jazz is still the most comprehensive festival of its kind this side of the border and it's become the place to be for mid-summer music madness.

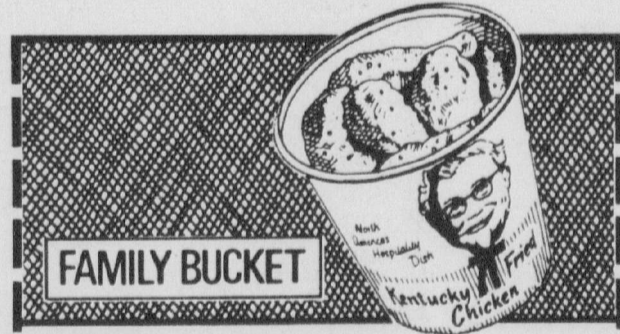

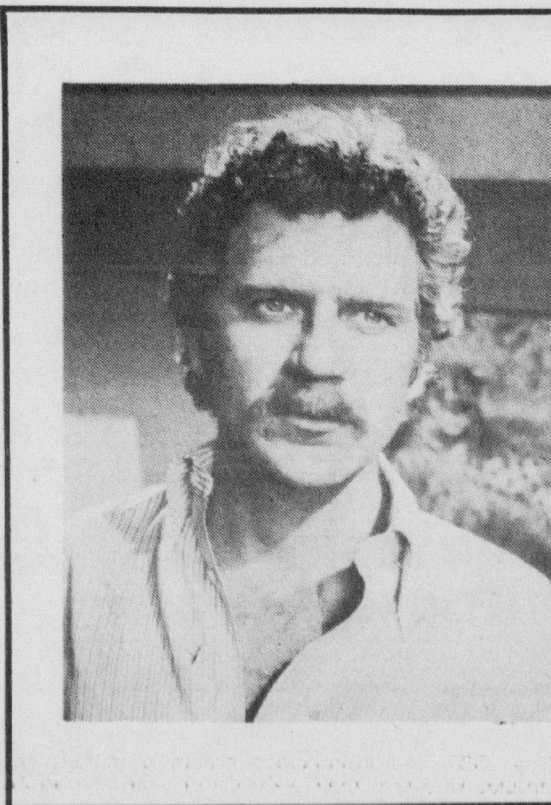
