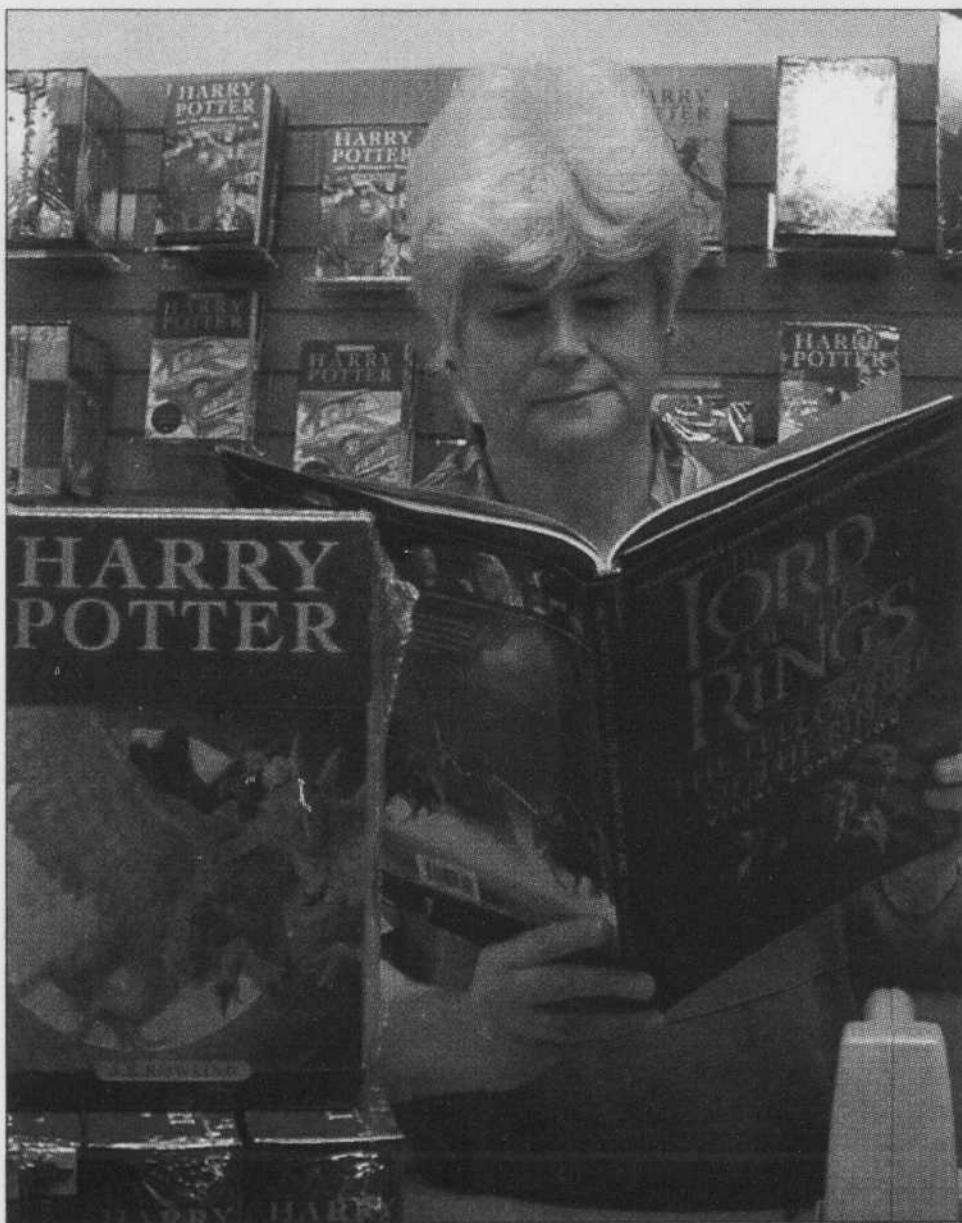

Book sales up for upcoming blockbuster movies

Sorcerers, hobbits, elves and magic are getting closer for young and old across the Townships as two extremely popular fantasy novel books are scheduled to hit the big screen within the next 40 days.

The first will be author J. K. Rowling's Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone, the much-coveted children's novel, which opens on Nov. 16. The second movie is based upon The Fellowship of The Ring, originally published in 1954, the first of J.R.R.'s classic Lord of the Rings trilogy.

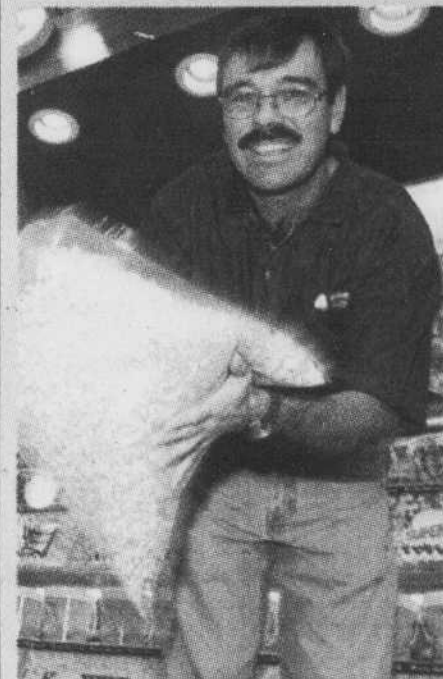
Bookstores across the Townships are already prepared for customers who will soon flock to the shelves for Tolkien and Potter paraphernalia, including calendars, colouring books, notepads, picture books and card games.

"We even have scarves," said Donna Berwick, the manager of the Carrefour de l'Estrie branch of Smithbooks, adding that readers have purchased 300 Tolkien novels and 1,000 Potter novels this year alone, not including French translations.

"We haven't seen much difference in Potter sales since the movie's release date was announced," noted Berwick. "Lord of the Rings sales have certainly increased. People want to discover or re-discover the books before they see the movie."

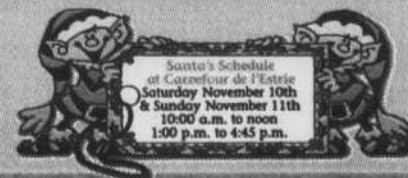

Festival popcorn flavours keep poppin' up

With more than 50 varieties, who could ask for more?

At a time when everyone seems to have a special day (or week, or month, whatever) to call their very own, it comes as no surprise to see The Popcorn Board in Chicago has declared October as Poppin' Month. (I don't believe there are greeting cards yet to mark this solemn occasion, but give it time.)

This is a good thing, I figure, because popcorn is a nutritious, low-fat food. It only becomes fat-filled, high-calorie junk food when we douse the kernels with hydrogenated death, artificial flavours and sugar.

In short, much of what comes in a microwave bag.

From a let's-get-rich point of view, you may wonder which food is more profitable: potato chips or popcorn. In both instances, it occurs to me that manufacturers are able to transform incredibly cheap raw materials into fantastically expensive snacks.

Been in a movie theatre lately? Leave with your wallet?

Of course, popcorn is the quintessential American snack food, as none of the stuff is grown in Canada. It's different from regular corn in that popcorn has a smaller kernel with an incredibly hard shell, which serves to lock in moisture until the corn is heated and explodes to become the munchies we all know and love.

In the past two decades, the popcorn industry, once rooted in long-time family-owned businesses, has changed. It is now dominated by big companies churning out mass-produced microwave packages where the flavours are as manufactured as a politician's sincerity.

Still, you've got to love it. The popcorn, I mean.

Among those who are absolutely nuts about the stuff is a fellow named Mike Pomerleau who, with his wife, Anne Taylor, has turned air-filled corn into big business.

They own all three outlets of the popular Kernels concession stands in Ottawa. They sell an awful lot of popcorn.

On any given day you can expect to find 18 different popcorn flavours at their mall outlets. In total, they have 50 different flavours to select from, which they rotate more or less on a reg-

ular basis.

That's Christmas Cheer flavour in December. Maybe red raspberry or mistletoe, lemon-lime or cherry, bubble gum or banana, at other times of the year.

Small wonder his three outlets in Ottawa sell 30 tons of kernels a year. All made on the premises in small quantities of maybe two gallons per batch.

Let's see, now . . . Pomerleau charges up to \$10.48 for a gourmet 20-cup bag of the most expensive flavour, Creamy Caramel. One-half cup of kernels makes 20 cups when popped . . .

You do the math.

Even with no calculator in hand, it's easy to see there's money in them thar' kernels.

"I absolutely love this business," Pomerleau beams, with the kind of unbridled enthusiasm one normally expects with First Love.

"People who come here want to be here."

(Sure beats hearing customers whine in his previous job as service manager at a car dealership, no doubt.)

"My popcorn customers are happy customers," Pomerleau says. "And that makes us happy. This is a nice, nice job."

"I went from cars to popcorn. When my mother heard we were going into the popcorn business she laughed sooo hard. She said I'd never make any money."

Today, his little empire employs 20 people, most part-time. His shops use only sunflower oil - no peanuts - and promote the product with the catchy slogan, Practice Safe Snacks.

Hey, you gotta love it.

"Let me tell you, we're happy," he says. "It has worked out well."

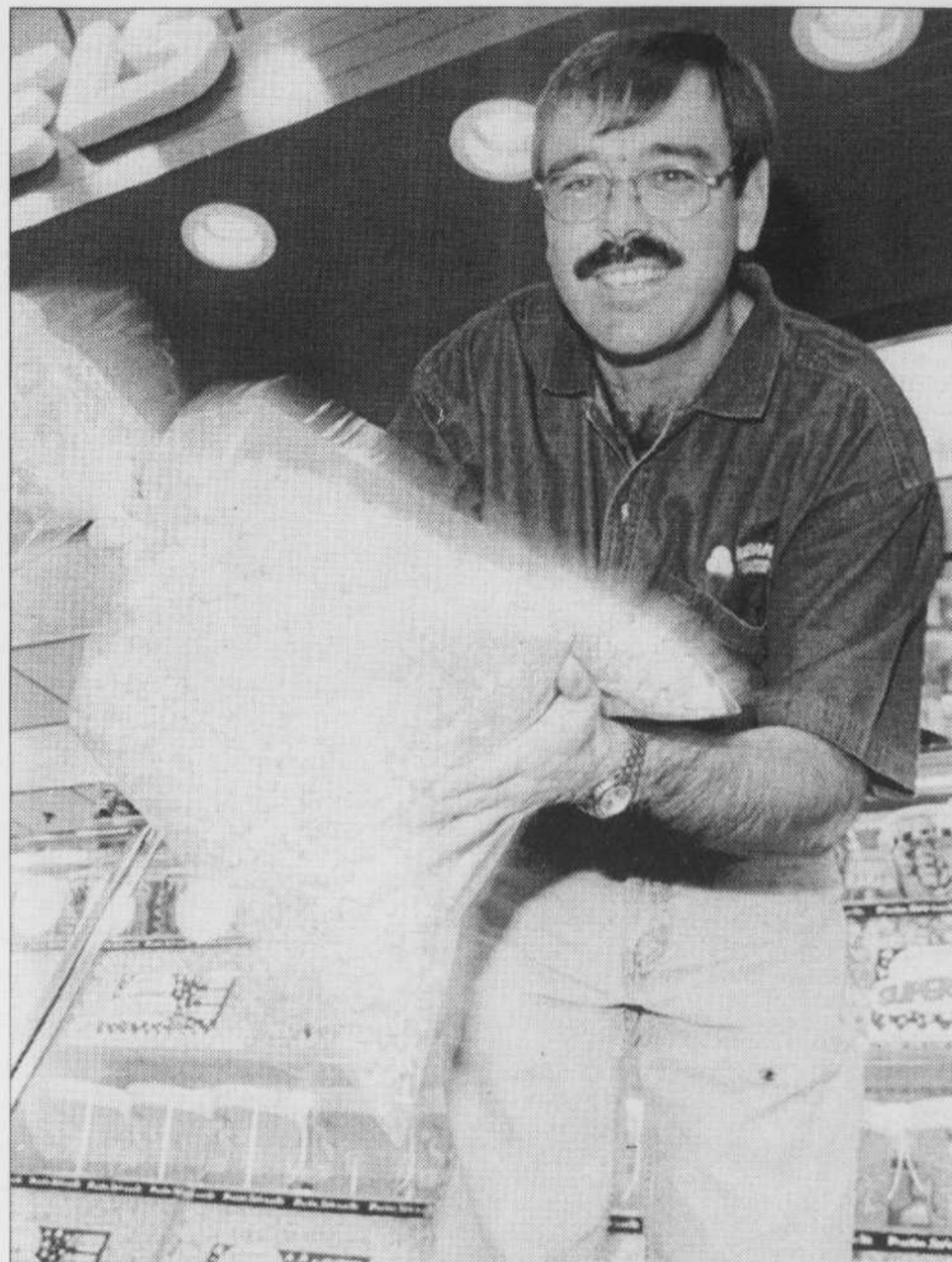
With enthusiasm like that, who better to ask for tips on proper popping techniques, not to mention a few recipes to tart up our perennial favourite snack food?

Pomerleau was only too obliging - to the point where he took some commercial recipes and downsized them, then tested each at home to make certain they'd work for readers.

And here, ladies and gentlemen, are the results. The bag, please.

10th annual antique show continues tradition

It took two large halls in the village — the basement of the parish church and the salle de l'âge d'or — to hold 32 dealers with vintage articles and objects d'arts for last weekend's 10th Annual Antique Show and Sale in Eastman.

Ambiance and favourable prices are the show's hallmark, as antique buffs and collectophiles ritualistically attended the yearly event, always held during the first weekend in November.

"I've never missed an exhibition at Eastman," said Pierre Riverin, the pre-

fect of the MRC Memphremagog and an ardent antique collector for 35 years. "It's a veritable passion. Normally, I'm the biggest buyer here."

The November show has effectively transformed a formerly slow and sleepy month into a high level activity for Quebec antique dealers, most of them from the Eastern Townships. This year, attendance was down from 3,000 in previous years.

Yves Duclos spearheaded this year's event, and noted one new antique dealer sold \$10,000 in merchandise, while another very successful vendor sold most of his display on the first night.

This year featured an extraordinary amount of folk art, as well as pieces of

pine furniture, silver, porcelains, glassware and china, including two matching "Bleu du roi" (Alfred Meakin, England, circa 1920) dinner sets from Antiquités Au fil du Temps (Dunham).

The show also contained restored, refurbished and decorated objects, as well as vintage jewelry, early-20th-century coloured glassware and old books. The "coin de livres" was especially popular, noted Duclos.

Also popular with collectors was a special limited edition of 10th anniversary plates. The design is a reproduction of a basket of flowers painted on two 18th century doors, which were discovered in a Saint-Denis-sur-Richelieu attic

more than forty years ago.

"We got permission from the Museum of Civilization (in Quebec, where the doors are displayed)," said Duclos. "We still have a few plates. They make a good Christmas present."

As in past years, a winning booth in each hall was selected by a panel of judges for overall presentation, including hospitality, design and unusual

items. This year, Jean-Jacques Dinand of Antiquités Le Vieux Presbytère (Eastman) and Serge and Pierre-Olivier LeBlanc of Antiquités Pierre-Elysée (Magog) picked up the "Prix d'Honneur." "Special Mention" went to Antiquités Rosalie.

Berwick is a Tolkien aficionado who has hardcover 40th anniversary editions of the trilogy at home. But she's also read all four available Potter novels.

"Potter books are definitely younger than Tolkien books," she noted. "Tolkien's language is more difficult to read and it is more complicated."

"I've been working here for 19 years, and I haven't seen anything like this before. I wonder if Potter will stand the test of time like Tolkien."

Two displays in her store are testimony to the popularity of the fantasy novels. Tolkien's classics stand in a dark corner, ready for fans of Middle Earth and long quests. Meanwhile, bestselling Potter novels are colourfully displayed at the front of the store, and behind the cash register.

Children aren't the only ones delving into Potter's Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry. Scholars and university students are also exploring Potter's magical world at Bishop's University in a young adult literature course offered by the department of continuing education.

"It's mainly aimed at our education students," said Lynn Thomas, the director of the school of education. "It tends to be popular. We have 40 students enrolled in the course at Bishop's, which is a pretty significant number. We've looked at Harry Potter twice over the past three terms."

Thomas added that the objective of reading Harry Potter is to get future teachers to appreciate what kids are leafing through in class.

"I taught Harry Potter last year," she said. "I felt it's an interesting example of a popular book and genre."

Thomas added that Potter's popularity, before the announcement of the movie release, is a good indication the novels are

accessible. Her only surprise is they became popular in Canada despite their British character.

Thomas finds many similarities between Potter and the Lord of the Rings, including the quest of good versus evil. However, Tolkien's language makes it less open to younger children than Potter.

"Harry Potter is more accessible, except perhaps for The Hobbit," noted Thomas, adding that her students enjoyed the pace, of the Potter novels, as well as "quiditch", a new sport invented within the book.

"Harry Potter has both male and female characters that take part in school life. Tolkien has few leading female characters. It shows the book is somewhat dated. Today we can't overlook male and female characters in a book."

Colleague Joanne Norman prefers calling Tolkien's Lord of the Rings an adult fantasy rather than a children's novel. She said students are occasionally taken back by its serious nature, again with the exception of The Hobbit.

"Tolkien is one of the major Anglo-Saxon medieval literature researchers," said Norman, who is also a medievalist in BU's English department. "Lord of the Rings contains many parallels between his research and fantasy work. It was kind of his private sideline."

However, she acknowledges Potter is as much a commercial phenomenon now as Tolkien was when his books were released.

"I've had adults pick up my Harry Potter novels from my bookshelf," Norman noted.

At Lennoxville Elementary School, Principal Patricia Mogensen agreed that Potter novels are extremely popular among kids.

"We have Harry Potter in our library," she said. "They're out all the time. The children love reading them."

Sounds to soothe the savage beast

Hewitt of Piano Six visits the Townships

Music lovers could travel far and wide to find world-class Canadian musical talents like Janina Fialkowska, Angela Hewitt, Angela Cheng, Jon Kimura Parker, Marc-André Hamelin and André Laplante.

But Townshippers will have to go no further than Sherbrooke, Richmond, Granby or Drummondville, as the Piano Six project brings the impeccable perfor-

mance of Angela Hewitt.

Born in Canada, the internationally renowned pianist, who was also appointed as an Officer of the Order of Canada, is one of the original members of Piano Six. Judith Rice-Lesage, Quebec co-ordinator for the group and numerous other tours, explains that Piano Six fills the need for quality classical music performances from internationally recognized performers at a local level.

"Normally small communities would not have the resources for a classical

music artist like Hewitt," said Rice-Lesage, adding that members of Piano Six take a break from their international touring schedule to spending a 10-day period touring a rural area of the country.

"This is a wonderful opportunity to give something back to the community. Schools are no longer putting emphasis on classical music and some small concert halls have had to close their doors. "I am really hopeful that as many young people as possible will take advantage of this golden opportunity to see an international artist. It would be good if school teachers encourage students to go."

Hewitt, who has played with London's Royal Philharmonic and Philharmonia Orchestra, the Japan Philharmonic, and many other major Canadian orchestras, has most recently toured in London where she has received international acclaim for various recordings.

She has also garnered a 1999 Juno Award for Book I of The Well-tempered Clavier, as well as a nomination for the Goldberg Variations in the 2001 Juno Awards.

Internationally, Hewitt is one of two Canadians among a register of the finest classical musicians in the world recognized by BBC Music Magazine's Who's Who in Music.

"Piano Six was founded by the artists. They donate their time and they play the same program for the recitals that they would play elsewhere in the world," explained Judith Rice-Lesage.

The local program in the Townships consists of Bach's Toccata en D Minor and Toccata in G Minor, followed by

Beethoven's Sonata in D Major (Pastorale), Opus 28. Allegro, Andante, Scherzo: Allegro vivace and Rondo: Allegro ma non troppo.

A contemporary Canadian piece by David L. McIntyre is also on the bill, as is Dance & Pastorale, an extract from Sonata number 2, composed in 1999. McIntyre's music is perhaps best known for its light, flowing nature, inspired by the elegant grace of Hewitt's performance. The piece was chosen for world premiere at the MusicCanadaMusique Festival in 2000. Schumann's Sonata number 1 in F Minor, Opus 11 with Introduzione: Un poco

Rounding out the evening, Hewitt will perform Adagio - Allegro vivace, Aria Scherzo e intermezzo: Allegrissimo and the Finale: Allegro un poco maestoso.

Piano Six was first established in 1994 by Janina Fialkowska, who trained under the watchful guidance of Arthur Rubinstein in Montreal, Paris and New York. Entering their eighth season, Piano Six has become so popular that the group has added Michael Kim, Stéphane Lemelin and Bernadene Blaha to meet the increasing demand.

The group has also undertaken the commissioning of new solo piano pieces by numerous noteworthy contemporary Canadian composers, including Linda Bouchard, Isabelle Panneton, Peter Tiefenbach and Bishop's University Music Professor, Andrew MacDonald.

From the Pacific, to the Arctic and back to the Atlantic in countless rural schools, churches and concert halls, the group has received resounding, international praise from concert attendees, students and teachers.

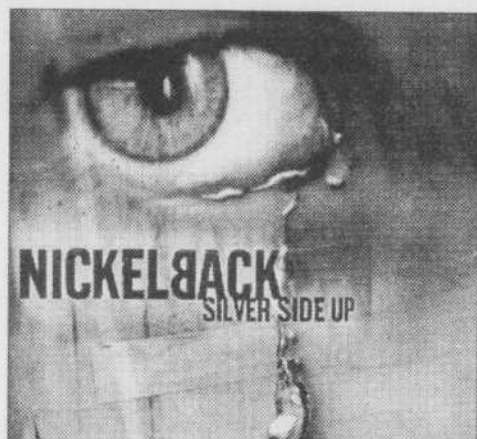

Nickelback contends for 'album of the year' honours

**NICKELBACK**
Silver Side Up
(EMI)

Every so often, listeners are treated to an album that transgresses an overplayed single ushered by a babbling compilation of 10 other songs. Every so often, the music industry produces a disk that reeks of originality, diversity and quality — characteristics that endure on Nickelback's latest album, entitled *Silver Side Up*. Headlined by 'How You Remind Me', which is perhaps the best single of the year, Nickelback exhausts such pure alternative rock sounds accompanied by a slicing metal edge on *Silver Side Up* that every track has enormous massive appeal. To go one step further, singles like 'Never Again', 'Too Bad' and 'Hangnail' are all Top 10 songs destined for No. 1 on rock/alt charts across Canada and the U.S. Chad Kroeger's prominent songwriting role on the album is exceptional, while his ragged vocals are catchy and refined, if not inspiring. Also, Ryan Peake provides some outstanding, screaming guitar solos of his own on singles like 'Money Bought' and 'Hollywood', that the album is allowed to break free of stayed musical one-dimensionality. The question then for *Silver Side Up* and Nickelback is not so much where to start, but where to end, as the tremendous talent and rising stardom of this Canadian quartet appears limitless.

**JETHRO TULL**
The Very Best Of
(Chrysalis Records)

What can I say about Jethro Tull. One of the symbols of late 60's and early 70's counter culture is back. Unlike the vast majority of Greatest Hits albums, which are thrown together in about 15 minutes to make a few bucks, some serious thought went into this one. The tracks almost melt into each other, while giving the listener an overview of their extensive careers. The record features hits like 'Aqualung', 'Thick as a Brick', and 'Too Old Too Rock'n'Roll, Too Young To Die'. The most impressive thing about this album, however, is the flow. None of the songs are new, as they represent a variety of the band's many sounds. Leave it to Jethro Tull to release a greatest hits record with more flow than most albums released today.

**DAWN TYLER BLUES PROJECT**
ten dollar dress
(Preservation Records Inc.)

What is perhaps most striking about the music on Dawn Tyler Blues Project's album, entitled *ten dollar dress*, is its throwback to untainted '50s and '60s sounds, accompanied by contemporary blues numbers on a handful of singles. Made up of Dawn Tyler Watson on vocals, Andy (Chuck) Dacoulis on guitar, Domenic Romanelli on bass and Sam Harrison on drums, 'Project' boasts more talent in one band than most artists on today's Top 10 lists. Traditional blues songs like 'Cigarette' and 'Abused', clearly the album's best track, scream of passion and musical mastery. Yet, singles like 'Take it Outside' and 'Rollin Joe' sound as though they come from an entirely different band — perhaps a Proclaimers Swing Daddies-type group. Yet, leave it to members of the 'Project' to limit themselves only insofar as their talents bring them. The good news for listeners then is that in this, the group's debut album, that talent seems endless.

**JERMAINE DUPRI**
Instructions

(So So Def/Sony Music)

Think of an old pair of worn-in shoes — they're comfortable, and not quite ready to be thrown out. Jermaine Dupri is much like those old shoes, as she uses familiar beats, sounding at times like Outkast, Timbaland and Swizz Beats. In her latest creation, *Instructions*, Dupri features 20 tracks (including an intro and five interludes) weighing in at a little over 53 minutes. Featuring a plethora of 20-something guests rhyming with Dupri, including Da Brat, Usher, Jadakiss and Ludacris, the album spotlights two decent tracks in 'You Bring the Freak Out of Me' and 'Rock With Me'. Overall, while the intro and some interludes are funny, the resulting 13 songs are mediocre at best, lacking a distinct style and infringing on the trademark sounds of others.

(Last Chance) At The Romance Dance

Serial Joe's album *(Last Chance) At The Romance Dance* reaffirms my belief that anyone under 18 should not be allowed to make records. This band is in the same genre as Silverchair was — they seem able to play one or two songs well, but they do it 12 times over. *(Last Chance) At The Romance Dance* is missing a lot to for it to even be a decent album. The lyrics are forced, as though the singer is saying something that will change everyone, while they certainly won't change anyone. Also, the guitarist and bassist repeat the same riffs throughout the album. Serial Joe's one saving grace, however is their drummer, who somehow managed to learn a few tricks on the drums, thus keeping the album about as interesting as the latest Leonardo DiCaprio movie. Not very.

*A world of adventure, comedy and drama awaits**movies*

Columbus stays true to author's vision of Potter

One American director wanted the world of Harry Potter transported to a trendy Hollywood high school.

Another was prepared to set Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone in England, but felt Harry himself had to be an American because otherwise audiences in the U.S. wouldn't want to see the movie. Yet another wanted Harry's two friends - Hermione and Ron - to be American as well.

"I was stunned by some of these notions," says Chris Columbus, the filmmaker who finally won the job of directing what promises to be the most successful children's movie of all time.

"I heard some suggestions that would make your skin crawl. Someone wanted to combine the first two books, not realizing that each book exists as its own story. To throw two books together was just absurd."

Then there was what Columbus disdainfully calls "the Toy Story idea" - turning Harry Potter and the world of the Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry into a computer-animated feature.

"I thought this was just insane. A computer-animation version of this story with Haley Joel Osment's voice is as bad as it gets."

By that time, Columbus was on the short list of directors being considered for the monumental task of bringing the first of J.K. Rowling's Harry Potter novels to the screen. And it soon became clear to Rowling and producer David Heyman he would be by far the best choice because of his burning desire to protect the integrity of the book.

Columbus, an Chicagoan whose previous hits include Home Alone and Mrs. Doubtfire, argues that the obligations Harry Potter imposes on a director should be self-evident.

"It all feels painfully obvious to me," said Columbus. "There's a reason why millions of children and adults have fallen in love with the Harry Potter books.

"To destroy the basic foundation of this world and these characters would alienate our audience. So I was adamant about being incredibly faithful to the books, which meant shooting the films in England, with an all-British cast."

In the process, Columbus would also be honouring a commitment to Rowling, who had initially been reluctant to approve a film deal with Hollywood for fear it would take unacceptable liberties with this quintessentially English tale about a boy who at the age of 11 discovers he has powers of magic and wizardry.

Columbus feels that 12-year-old Daniel

Radcliffe proved to be a wonderful choice for the role of Harry, and that he also struck gold with the casting of two inexperienced but engaging newcomers as Harry's best friends: Rupert Grint plays the mischievous Ron Weasley and Emma Watson plays the bossy Hermione Granger. And he's surrounded them with some of Britain's finest actors: Robbie Coltrane as the half-giant Hagrid, John Cleese as Nearly Headless Nick, Richard Harris as Professor Dumbledore, Alan Rickman as Professor Snape, Maggie Smith as Professor McGonagall and Julie Walters as Mrs. Weasley.

Even so, as soon as Columbus was announced for the film, he continued to be targeted with proposals to add some American elements.

He had a spat with Rosie O'Donnell, who phoned him pleading to play Mrs. Weasley. "That's ridiculous!" she snapped when he told her he couldn't use her because she wasn't British, but Columbus stuck to his guns.

"I just felt it would be unfair," he said. "I was committed to do the movie with a British cast."

Columbus's love affair with Harry Potter started four years ago when his young daughter Eleanor started pestering him to read the first of the Rowling books. At the time Columbus was working hard on plans to film Spiderman "but then Eleanor thrust Harry Potter into my hands and I read it and loved it and Harry Potter took over my imagination."

Columbus called his agent but when he was told that Steven Spielberg had his eye on the book, he backed off. Then when Spielberg lost interest, Columbus started campaigning hard to direct it.

The film opening Nov. 16 is chock full of special effects: a monstrous three-headed dog, an aerial ball game in which the players ride broomsticks, a cloak that makes the wearer invisible, a wand that can create wind and lightning on command. But Columbus sees such magical moments as essentially garnishes to a story about credible human beings functioning in a world that has its own unique credibility.

"The key to the whole movie was creating a place that fans of the book - both kids and adults - could believe existed," explained Columbus.

"We could have made the film over-stylized in terms of set design, but then people wouldn't really believe these kids were going to Hogwarts School because they couldn't believe the school existed."

The aim was to anchor the wonder and magic in a naturalistic environment. Performances which were "over the top or fantastical" were not welcome.

"I cast kids who were very real and they provided some of the moments I was proudest of," the director admitted.

Columbus believed he would be on the right track if he could make the movie work without special effects, and he was vindicated when he tested a rough version several months ago for an audience in Chicago. "The effects were very crude," he says now. But audience members, both young and old, still adored what they saw.

He talks about the need for subtle balance in the Harry Potter stories because of the fact that they function on a level of matter-of-fact realism.

"My feeling is that the effects should be real and feel as though they exist within this world, but also that they don't overtake the film," Columbus said.
