

(CIRCULAR.)

Castle of St. Lewis,
Quebec, 31st May, 1838.

SIR,

I am directed by the Governor General to request that you will have the goodness to inform me, without delay, of the names of all persons against whom you may have issued warrants on charges of Treason, Sedition, or other Political offences, since the 1st day of October last, distinguishing, as far as is in your power, those which still remain unexecuted.—With respect to these last, I have also to request that you will forward to me such depositions as you may have received respecting them.

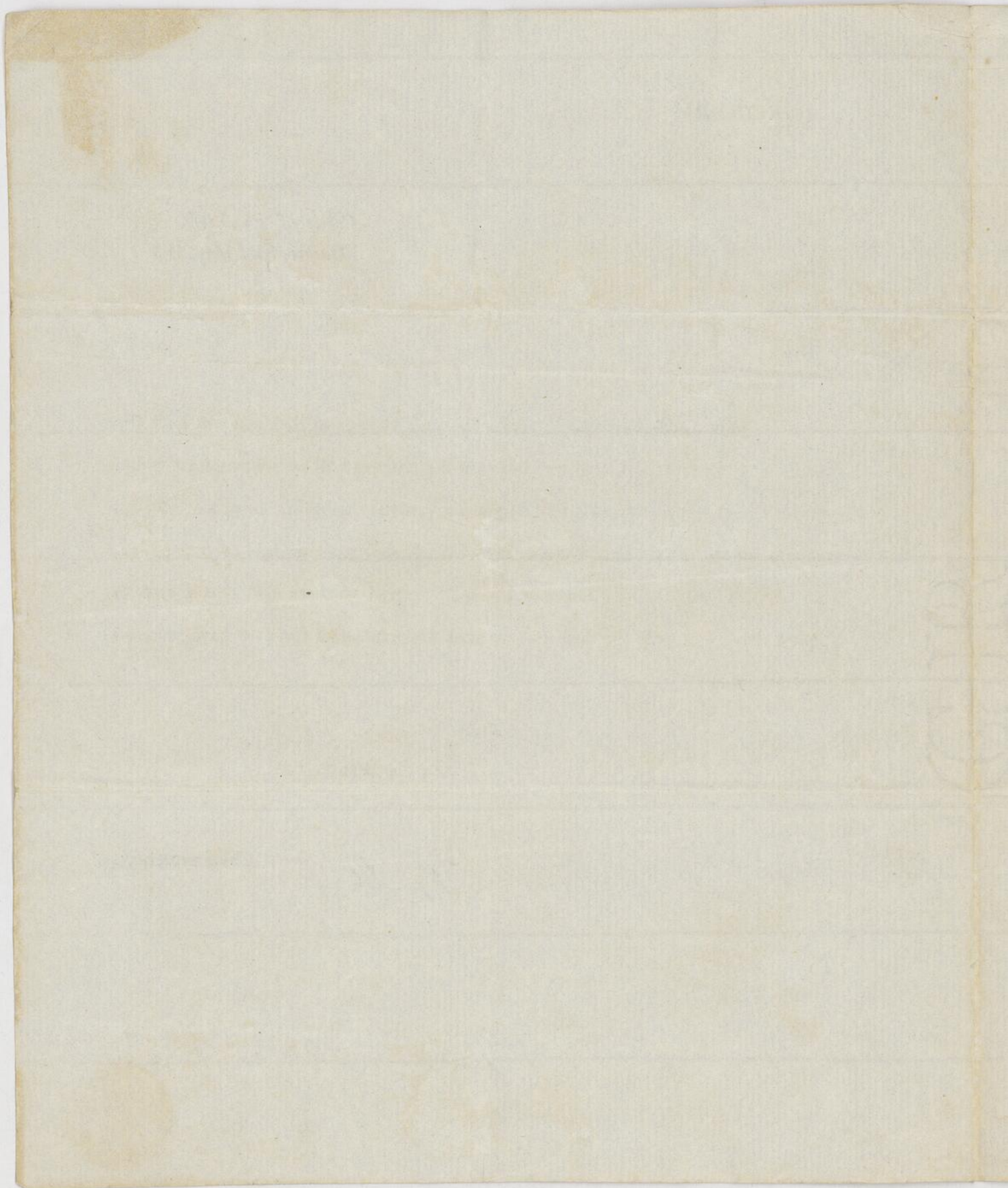

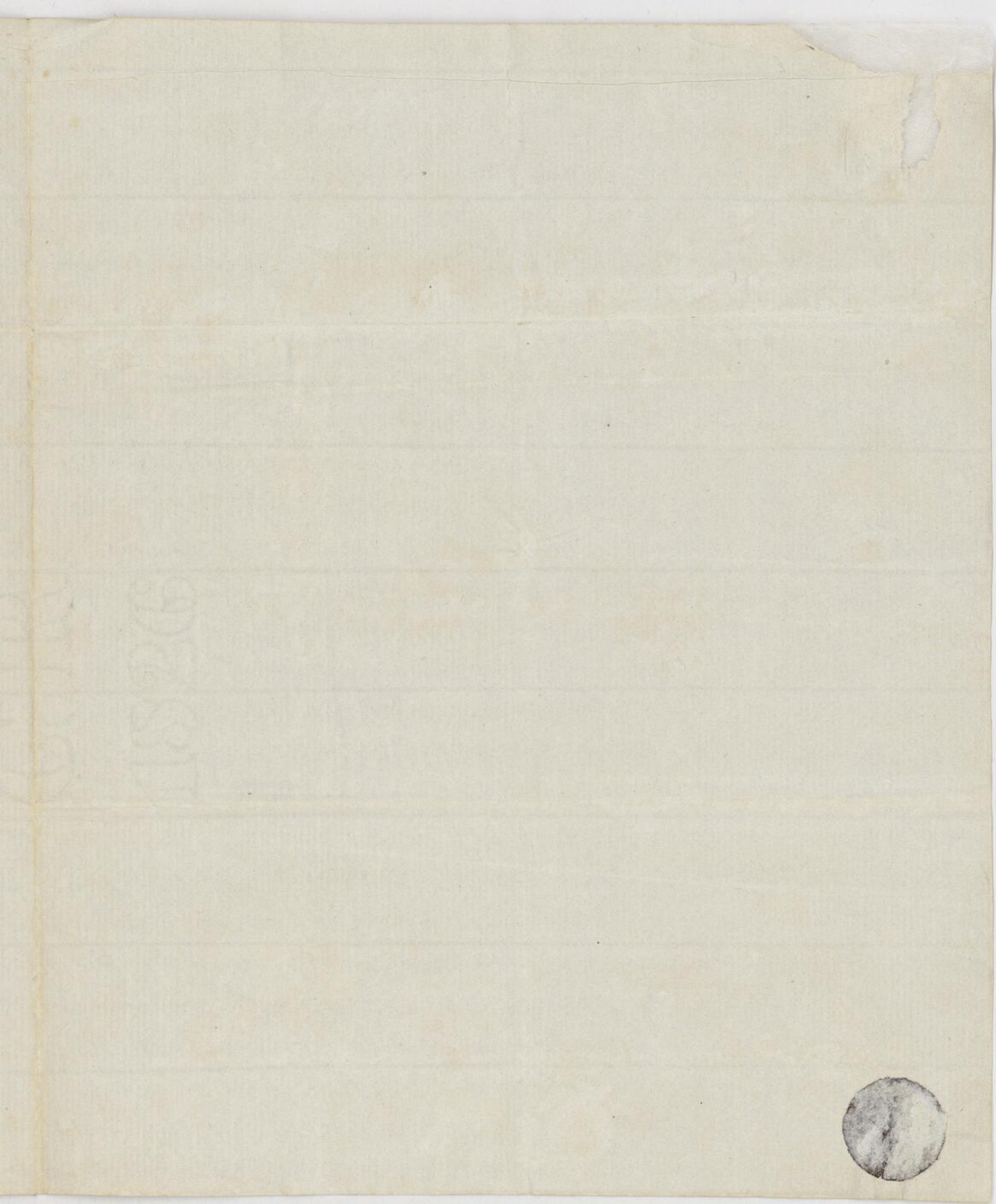
