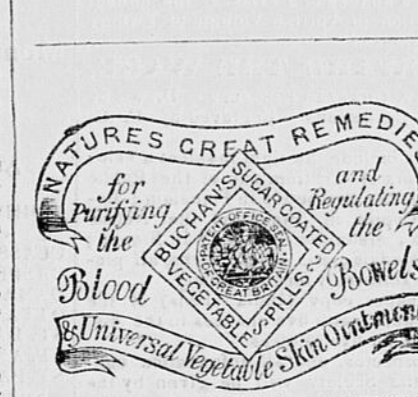

It is under the direction of a Council of the Members, whose services are honorary, and four of whom retire from office every year.
