THE QUEEN AND ROYAL FAMILY.

Her Majesty **ALEXANDRINA VICTORIA**, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, &c., Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India, *Shri Shri Rani Victoriae, Kaisar-i-Hind*). Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the throne 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV.; was crowned 28th June, 1838; and married 10th February, 1840, to His late Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel, Prince Consort, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Cobourg and Gotha, who was born 6th August, 1819; died 14th December, 1861. Her Majesty is the only child of His late Royal Highness, Edward Duke of Kent, fourth son of King George III. The children of Her Majesty are:

Her Royal Highness Victoria Adelaide Mary Louisa, Princess Royal of England and Prussia, born November 21, 1840, and married to His Royal Highness William, the late Emperor of Germany, January 25, 1858, and has issue living, three sons and four daughters.

His Royal Highness **ALBERT EDWARD**, PRINCE OF WALES, Duke of Saxony, Cornwall and Rothesay, Earl of Dublin, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., K.T.S., G.C.B., P.C., field marshal, colonel of the 10th Hussars, and colonel-in-chief of the Rifle Brigade, born 9th of November, 1841; married 10th March, 1863, to the Princess Alexandra Caroline Mary Charlotte Louisa Julia, born 1st December, 1844, eldest daughter of the King of Denmark, and has issue His Royal Highness Prince Albert Victor Christian Edward, born 8th January, 1864, died 14th January, 1892; His Royal Highness Prince George Frederick Ernest Albert, born 3rd June, 1865; married July 6, 1893, to Princess Victoria Mary of Teck; Her Royal Highness Princess Louisa Victoria Alexandra Dagmar, born 20th February, 1867; married July 27, 1889, to Alexander, Earl of Fife; Her Royal Highness Princess Victoria Alexandra Olga Mary, born 6th July, 1863; Her Royal Highness Princess Maud Charlotte Mary Victoria, born 26th November, 1869; married July, 22, 1896, to Prince Charles, second son of Crown Prince of Denmark; and His Royal Highness Prince Alexander John C. Albert, born 6th April, 1871, died 7th April, 1871.

Her Royal Highness Alice Maud Mary, born April 25, 1843, married His Royal Highness Prince Frederick Louis of Hesse, July 1, 1862, died Dec. 14, 1878; issue living, four daughters and one son.

His Royal Highness Alfred Ernest Albert, Duke of Cobourg and Duke of Edinburgh, born Aug. 6, 1844; married the Grand Duchess Marie of Russia, Jan. 21, 1874, and has issue two sons and three daughters.

Her Royal Highness Helena Augusta Victoria, born May 25, 1846; married to His Royal Highness Prince Frederick Christian Charles Augustus of Schleswig-Holstein Sonderburg-Augustenburg, July 5, 1866, and has issue living one son and two daughters.

Her Royal Highness Louise Carolina Alberta, born March 18, 1838; married to the Marquis of Lorne, eldest son of the Duke of Argyll, March 21, 1871.

His Royal Highness Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, born May 1, 1850; married Princess Louise Margaret of Prussia, March 13, 1879, and has issue one son and two daughters.

His Royal Highness Leopold George Duncan Albert, Duke of Albany, born April 7, 1853; married April 27, 1882, Princess Helen of Waldeck; died March 28, 1884; issue a daughter, born Feb. 25, 1883, and a son born July 19, 1884.

COURTS OF JUSTICE.

SUPREME COURT OF THE DOMINION.

The Supreme Court was constituted as a Court of Appeal in 1875 pursuant to sec. 101 of the British North America Act. The various statutes affecting its constitution and jurisdiction were consolidated by chapter 135 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, since when various acts have been passed further altering its jurisdiction. It is composed of a chief justice and five puisné judges, and has appellate, civil and criminal jurisdiction within and throughout the Dominion of Canada. The judges reside at Ottawa, where the Supreme Court holds annually three sessions; the first beginning on the 3rd Tuesday in February, the second on the first Tuesday in May and the third on the first Tuesday in October.

EXCHEQUER COURT OF CANADA.

The Exchequer Court, constituted under a Dominion Statute, 50-51 Vict., chap. 16, is presided over by one judge, and has original exclusive jurisdiction in all claims, suits or actions against the crown. It has concurrent jurisdiction in relation to revenue cases and the enforcement of penalties, in cases in which it is sought at the instance of the attorney-general of Canada to impeach or annul any patent of invention, in cases relating to trade marks and copyrights and patents of inventions, in cases relating to land patent or other instrument respecting lands, cases against crown officers for anything done or omitted to be done as such officer, and all actions or suits in which the crown is plaintiff or petitioner. The Exchequer Court has also jurisdiction as a Court of Admiralty, within Canada, under 54-55 Vic, chap. 29.

For the pilotage of any sailing vessel propelled by steam, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$1.75; downwards, \$1.75.

For the pilotage of any vessel under sail, for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$2.60; downwards, \$1.90.

From the harbor of Quebec to Sorel and the opposite side of the River St Lawrence, or any place above Three Rivers and below Sorel:

For the pilotage of any vessel, in tow or propelled by steam (except as hereinafter mentioned), for each foot of draught of water, upwards, \$1.50; downwards, \$1.50.

TARIFF OF WHARFAGE.

The following rates shall be levied as hereinafter set forth on the after mentioned articles when landed or shipped in the harbour, or moved by rail on the harbour tracks or deposited within the harbour. No discount allowed.

Coal, coke, grain, seeds of all kinds, unhulled rice, wet wood pulp, 6 cents per ton.

Ballast, cement, clay, fire-bricks, gypsum, phosphates, sand, scoriae-blocks, earthen drain-pipes, marble and all other stone, slate, whiting, iron ore, coarse salt in bags and bulk, 8 cents per ton.

Apples, bottles in crates or mats, corn starch and malt, crates and their contents, dry wood pulp, fish, flour and meal, glucose sugar, glucose syrup, h 13, horses, lard, lard-oil and oil-cake, meat, neat cattle, onions and vegetables, oranges, lemons and other green fruits, pitch, potatoes, sheep, straw, swine, tallow, tar, tobacco, steel rails for railways and tramways, zinc and lead ores, 12 cents per ton.

Pig and scrap iron, pot and pearl ashes, raw and refined sugar, 16 cents per ton.
 Bricks, 8 cents per thou-and.
 Cordwood, 4 cents per cord.
 Lumber and timber, 8 cents per thousand feet board measure.

On all goods, wares and merchandise, except bullion and specie, not elsewhere specified, 20 cents per ton.

On goods upon which, in the opinion of the Harbour Commissioners, it is not convenient to ascertain the rates according to the above provisions, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners to levy a rate of one fifth of one per cent. on the value thereof.

On packages measuring under 10 cubic feet and weighing less than two hundred and fifty pounds, 5 cents.

No entry shall be less than 5 cents.
 Only one rate shall be levied on property covered by the foregoing provisions when landed on the wharves for reshipment, and not having been removed from the wharves.

Barges landing bricks, cordwood, sand and hay allowed ten running days in which to discharge their cargo on which the above wharfage rates will be paid. After that delay they will pay one half of one cent per day on their registered tonnage for every day that they remain at the wharf.

No fish is allowed to be sold on the property of the Harbour Commissioners.

On all goods except bricks, cordwood, sand and hay remaining on the wharves more than four clear working days after notice given for their removal by the Harbour Master in the case of goods imported, there shall be levied additional rates as follow:—

On cement, one cent per barrel per day.
 On salt, one-half cent per bag per day.
 On iron, one-half cent per hundredweight per day.
 On bricks, 10 cents per thousand per day.
 On drain-pipes and all other non-enumerated articles, one half cent per hundredweight per day.

For the purpose of this By-law a ton shall be calculated as being 2,000 pounds weight, or forty cubic feet measurement, according as the goods to which the same applies have been or shall be carried by water by ton weight or ton measurement.

Re Directed Letters.—Re-directed letters are not liable to any additional postage, if handed back to the Post Office with a changed address at the moment of delivery or as soon as possible thereafter, provided always the change in the address does not require the letter to be sent to any place to which the postage rate is higher than was at first payable.

Re-directed letters should not be dropped into a Post Office Box or receiver unless additional postage has been put on to carry them to their second destination.

Request Letters.—Letters from places in Canada and the United States covered by envelopes bearing a "Request," either printed or written, that the letters be returned to the sender if not delivered within a certain specified time, will be returned as requested if not delivered in the time stated.

Printed or written requests for direct return may be complied with in the case of undelivered letters from Newfoundland.

Special Delivery.—The senders of letters posted at any Post-office in Canada and addressed to a city Post-office not having free delivery by letter carriers shall, on payment by special delivery stamps of the face value of 10 cents, affixed one to each letter in addition to the ordinary postage to which the same are liable, will secure their special delivery to the persons to whom they are addressed within the limits of letter carrier delivery at any of the following Post-offices in cities, viz: Halifax, St John, N. B., Fredericton, Quebec, Montreal, Ottawa, Kingston, Toronto, Brantford, Hamilton, London, Winnipeg, Victoria and Vancouver.

Post Cards.—For Canada and the United States, 1 cent each. For Great Britain, Newfoundland, and all Postal Union countries, 2 cents each. Reply cards, for Canada and U. S., 2 cents each. Nothing must be attached to a Post Card.

Second Class Matter.—Newspapers and Periodicals posted from the office of publication are authorized to pass at the bulk rate of a half cent per lb. to regular subscribers in Canada, the United States, and Newfoundland.

An exception is made in favor of newspapers and periodicals published not more frequently than once per week, and addressed (for regular subscribers) to post offices situated within a circular area of 40 miles in diameter, the centre of which must either be the place of publication or some point not more than 20 miles distant therefrom. Such papers will continue to enjoy exemption from postage as heretofore.

The postage on newspapers and periodicals issued less frequently than once a month and addressed to regular subscribers or new agents, and on all specimen newspapers, is 1 cent per lb. or fraction of a lb.

British periodical publications, and other foreign publications, can be remailed by newsdealers to regular subscribers in Canada and the United States at the bulk rate of 1c. per lb.

Third Class Matter, Newspapers and Periodicals.—Transient newspapers for any place in Canada or United States, 1 cent per 4 oz. For Great Britain and other European countries, see Foreign Postage Table.

Books, etc., and Miscellaneous Matter.—The postage on Books, Pamphlets, Circulars (wholly in print), occasional publications, etc., addressed to Canada, is 1 cent per 4 oz. To the United States, Newfoundland, Great Britain and all European countries, 1 cent per 2 oz. The postage on Bank pass books, Exhibitors Entry Tickets, Manuscripts, Printed Stationery, Printers Proof Sheets, Maps, Prints, Drawings, Engravings, Lithographs, Photographs,

Sheet Music (whether printed or written, including music books, whether stitched or bound), etc., addressed to Canada, the United States, Newfoundland, Great Britain, or any European country is 1 cent per 2 oz. No package must exceed 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth. The limit of weight for Canada and United States is 5 lbs., for other Postal Union countries 4 lbs. Limit of weight for a single book addressed to places in Canada is 7 lbs.

Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs, Roots and Scions or Grafts can only be sent to the United States as 4th Class Matter; when posted for delivery in Canada the postage is 1 cent per 4 oz., and the limit of weight 5 lbs.

Commercial Papers and Legal Documents may be sent to Great Britain, Newfoundland, United States, and all Foreign countries, at 5 cents for the first 10 ounces, and 1 cent for every additional 2 ounces. These papers, when posted for delivery in Canada, must be prepaid at Letter rate—but Deeds, Wills, Insurance Policies and Mortgages may be sent if prepaid 1 cent per 2 oz.

Patterns and Samples.—*Bona fide* Patterns and Samples of Merchandise, not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, may be sent to any place in Canada at 1 cent per 4 oz. Must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Goods sent in execution of an order, however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private individual to another, not being actually Trade Patterns or Samples, are not admissible.

The limit of weight to United Kingdom is 5 lbs; limit of size, 2 ft. in length by 1 foot in width or depth.

The limit of weight to other postal union countries is 12 oz; limits of size: 1 ft. in length by 8 in. in width and 4 in. in depth.

The postage on sample packets to postal union countries is 2c. for the first 4 ozs., and 1c. for each additional 2 ozs.

Fourth Class Matter.—Comprises such articles of general merchandise as are not entitled to any lower rate of postage. Postage 1 cent per oz., or fraction of an ounce. Limit of weight 5 lbs.; of size, two feet six in. in length by one foot in width or depth. Matter claiming to be 4th Class must be open to inspection, and there must be no correspondence enclosed. Packages of Fourth Class Matter may be sent to the United States for the same prepayment as is required within the Dominion, but the contents will be liable to Customs Inspection and collection of duty in the United States. Sealed tins containing fish, lobster, vegetables, meats, &c., if put up in a solid manner and labelled in such a way as to fully indicate the nature of their contents, may be sent as 4th Class Matter within the Dominion, but no sealed matter can be forwarded to the United States under this head. Liquids, oils and fatty substances may be sent to places in Canada and the United States as 4th Class, if securely put up.

Registration.—Every article intended for registration must be handed in at the wicket, and a receipt obtained therefor. The fee on all classes of articles addressed to countries to which matter may be registered is 5c.

The sender of a registered article addressed to any Postal Union country may entitle himself to a certificate as to the disposal of the said article by the Postmaster at the office addressed, on prepayment of an additional fee of 5 cents. All Classes of matter may be registered to all destinations in Canada and throughout the Postal Union; and letters may be registered to most of the countries not included in the Union.

The public are reminded that registered letters are only carried on trains that are accompanied by railway mail clerk. Hence a registered letter and an ordinary letter posted simultaneously will often be received at different times.

Prohibited Articles and Publications.—Explosive, dangerous or destructive substance, or liquid, or any matter likely to injure usual contents of the mails, or the person of any officer or servant of the Post Office.

Glass, in any form, matches, liquids, fish, fruit and oils are prohibited unless put up in the manner prescribed under 4th class matter. Any obscene or immoral book, or other publication of an indecent, immoral, seditious, disloyal, scurrilous or libellous character, or any post card or post band or wrapper upon which there are words of the character aforesaid, or any letter or circular concerning an illegal lottery, so-called, gift-concert or other similar enterprise offering prizes or concerning schemes devised and intended to deceive and defraud the public, and newspapers, etc., containing advertisements of any obscene and immoral prints, publications, etc.

Letters containing Gold or Silver Money, Jewels, or precious articles, or anything liable to Customs duties, cannot be forwarded by Post to any of the Postal Union countries, except to the United States.
