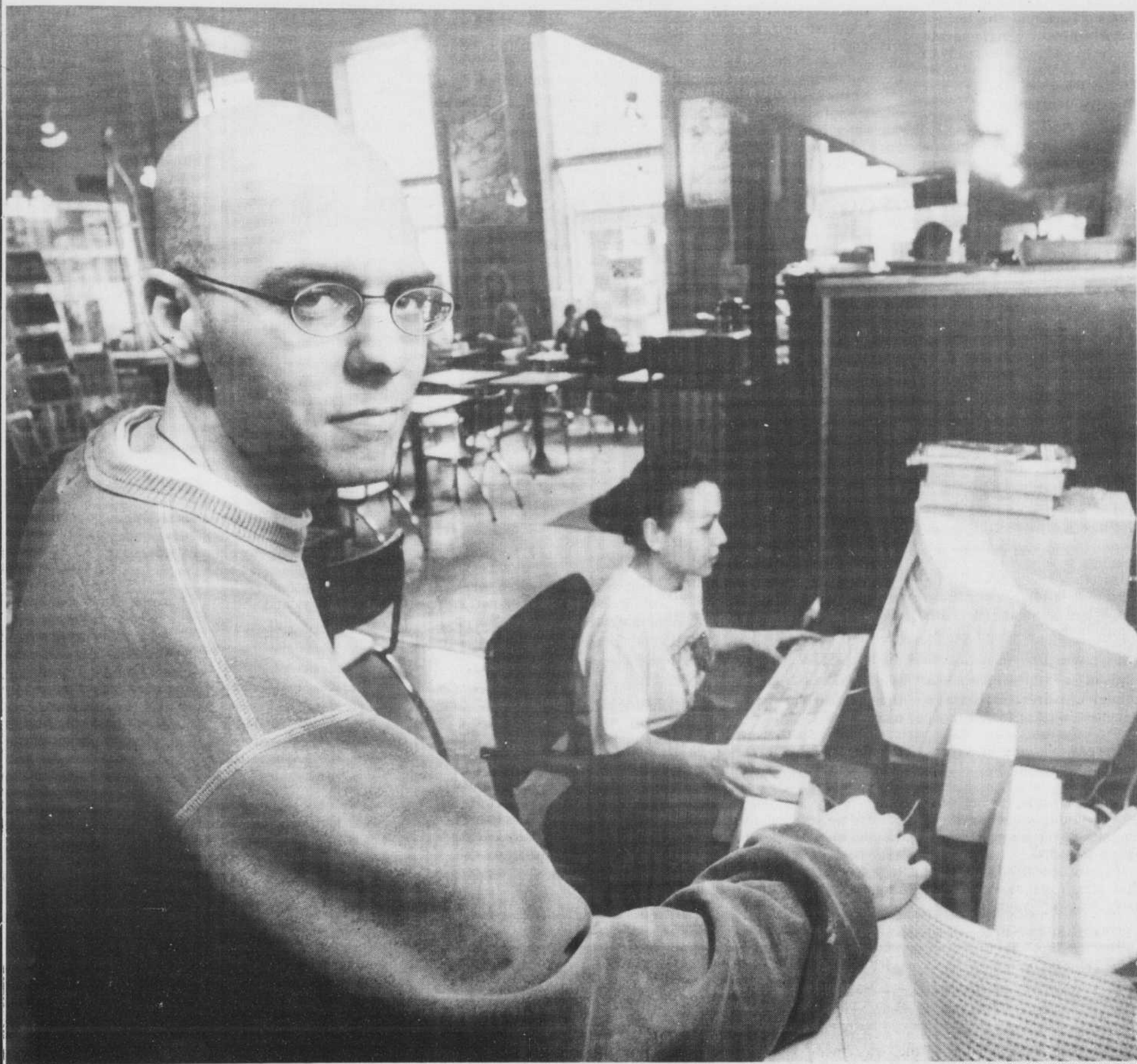

This Disneyfication of the world's culture has become so pervasive under Disney's massive promotional apparatus now that it controls much of radio, television and publishing that every other icon is smothered.

But when it comes to bedtime stories of Halloween yarns around the campfire, Disney's kazillion-dollar juggernaut must still take a back seat to a good grandma or grandpa.

That may be why storytelling groups are popping up everywhere, publishing magazines, conducting classes, holding national and international conventions, visiting school auditoriums and church basements and generally making themselves heard through the commercial thunder.

Last I looked, there were at least two storytelling groups in Montreal and a splendid little group of eight or 10 right here in Lennoxville.

The Township Tellers meet at the Womens' Centre on the third Thursday of every month

for pot-luck and yarn-spinning around the symbolic campfire — a lighted candle. On any given night, one might hear the one about the "Presbyterian and the Three Old Maids", "How the Elephant Got His Trunk", "Albert and the Lion", "Death of the Hired Man", "Jill the Giant Killer", ghost stories, folk tales, myths and legends of the American Indian, or "What Happened the Day Aunt Alice Peed on the Electric Fence".

After the first stamp in 1965 was issued to commemorate the momentous event, the flag was not depicted on stamp again until 1967. That was to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Confederation.

Although the flag can be seen flying from the Peace Tower of two definitive series of stamps, it is so small that unless you pay particular attention, it is not noticed. It wasn't until the Quick Stick definitive stamps of 1989 were issued that the Canadian flag was the prominent object in the design. Since then, of course, the definitive first-class stamp has featured the flag in addition to the Queen. It was about time our flag was shown a little more.

Anyway, to commemorate the flag's 31st anniversary, a small exhibit of the Canadian flag on stamps was assembled. Much to my surprise, enough stamps were found to make a 15-page exhibit even though a little stretching had to be done. It was even good enough to mount at the Carrefour de l'Estrie for Phila Sherbrooke's

membership drive last week and I guess it will be shown at the annual Lakeshore Stamp Club exhibition in mid-April. Some of you may have seen the exhibit while strolling through the mall. It was a good place to wave the flag.

Phila Sherbrooke's membership drive at the Carrefour de l'Estrie last week was more a case of letting the greater population of the Townships know the club actually exists. We know there are many collectors out there and we certainly would like you all to be a part of the club to share your

knowledge with others. The club meets the first and third Thursdays of the month at the cultural centre on Fairmount Street in Sherbrooke. Everyone is welcome.

A new \$5 stamp came out yesterday replacing the Bonaventure Market definitive stamp. It is the sixth in the architecture series and features the Carnegie Public Library in Victoria, B.C. The stamp was designed by Raymond Bellemare of Montreal, assisted by architect Robert G. Hill of Toronto. The stamp will remain on sale indefinitely but the official first day cover will only be on sale until August 28. The printer is the Canadian Bank Note Company and the perforation is listed as 13+.

It can't be said the whole is not worth \$17.95 but down the road, there is no guarantee. So, think twice before you leap.

Youth Orchestra to play music for the child-at-heart

SHERBROOKE — Music for children and the child-at-heart is the theme of the Sherbrooke Youth Orchestra's second concert of the season.

The 70-member orchestra will present a program of works calculated to please listeners of any age on Saturday, March 16, at 8 p.m. at Sherbrooke University's Centre Culturel.

Maestro Nicole Paiement will conduct works with youthful appeal by Rossini, Denis Gougeon and George Frock. The *piece de resistance* will be one of the greatest classics of musical storytelling — Prokofiev's "Peter and the Wolf".

The concert will also feature a solo performance by young Sherbrooke percussionist Sylvain Codère.

Opening the program with a strong dose of adventure will be Rossini's evocative "William Tell Overture". Adventure gives way to reverie in the performance of Townships native Denis Gougeon's "Le Jardin mystérieux", a colourful and romantic work written for a youth orchestra.

There's adventure of a different sort as soloist Sylvain Codère is featured in American composer George Frock's "Concertino for Marimba and

Orchestra".

The second half of the evening will be devoted to Proko-

fiev's beloved tale of the little boy whose bravery and ingenuity save his life and those of

his friends. "Peter and the Wolf", narrated in French by Sherbrooke University music professor Jacinthe Harbec, features solo performances by many members of the orchestra as they play the parts of different characters in the tale.

The enthusiasm which has greeted conductor Paiement's arrival in the Sherbrooke musical community is well founded due to her impressive career in Canada and the United States.

Since making her professional conducting debut in Santa Cruz, California in 1988, Paiement has conducted in New York, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Paris and London.

Her recordings on the American label Musical Heritage Society and the European label

Entrada include works by Debussy, Germaine Tailleferre, Alessandro Stradella and Lou Harrison.

After obtaining her doctorate in conducting at the Eastman School of Music in New York state, Paiement was a professor of conducting at the University of California in Santa Cruz.

Last year, she returned to her native Canada to assume her current post as Director of Ensembles at the Faculty of Music at Université de Montréal.

SHERBROOKE — The second edition of the Solidarity Concert to benefit international development projects will be presented by Eastern Townships Third World Rally on Friday March 15 at CEGEP de Sherbrooke.

The concert, to begin at 7:30 p.m. at the Alfred-DesRochers auditorium, will group seven bands from six Sherbrooke-area high schools — Alexander Galt, Le Triolet, Le Ber, Montcalm, Du Phare and Séminaire de Sherbrooke.

The concert aims to sensitize youth to the realities of Third

World countries, raise funds for international projects, and give a chance to young Townships musicians to perform and take part in a competition.

Last year's edition was won by the College du Mont Notre-Dame, with Du Phare high school placing second and the Séminaire de Sherbrooke coming in third.

Internet cafés on the rise in the Townships

SHERBROOKE — For many Quebecers, cafés are favorite spots to meet friends, chat and watch the world go by while enjoying a bite to eat and a cup of java.

That has been the case since the early 1900s when the café culture so popular in European cities such as Paris and Vienna was exported to North America.

As the decades flew by, and new ways of communication were established via technological advances such as computer link ups and FAX machines, people discovered they need not be in the same city — or country for that matter — to have direct communication without the telephone.

To keep information-hungry customers satisfied, café owners began stocking computers and FAX machines along with coissants and coffee.

The 90s have seen the proliferation of personal computers and global computer networking — the concept of obtaining information and communicating with people from around the world, more commonly known as the internet.

BANDWAGON

Jumping on the bandwagon as it cruises along this "information highway" are savvy restaurateurs who have opened internet cafés around the world, transforming the once private meeting places into global mini-villages.

Internet cafés are now popping up all over the Townships, with establishments in Sherbrooke, Coaticook and Granby selling computer time along with croque monsieurs and café au laits. The cost for internet access at these cafés varies between \$4.95 and \$8 an hour.

They are also called cybercafés, a termed reflecting the concept of travelling through space and time on the internet, and café owners say the public

is responding well to the innovation.

A steady stream of anxious Townshippers of all ages flowed in and out of the Café Electronique in Granby on Wednesday. Since the business opened two weeks ago, opening hours have been expanded to 2 a.m. on weekdays and 5 a.m. on weekends to keep up with the demand.

"The internet brings you closer to people around the world," said co-owner Marielle Lanthier. "It's a melange of cultures."

The part-time nurse at Granby Hospital is a self-described "information maniac" who admits to spending 15 hours a day surfing the 'net since she was introduced to it last year.

PERFECT UNION

The Café Electronique itself was born out of a perfect union between info-maniacs and the internet and is an inspiring example of how technology can change people's lives.

The four owners — Lanthier, Louise Huard and Jean-Luc Chauvel from Granby, Jean Caplette commutes from Montreal — first met each other on the internet. Casual chats online soon led to serious discussions on opening up a business. "It's a dream we've realized," said Lanthier.

The St. Antoine Street café is a somewhat antiseptic environment resembling a classroom. It is equipped with six workstations with fully loaded multi-media computers, on which people can read informa-

tion, watch film clips and animation and hear sound bites on any topic under the internet sun. Clocks scattered on the wall tell the time in Japan, Sydney, Rome, Paris and Los Angeles for those wishing to communicate with their global neighbors.

It is a place where mothers can leave their kids to be entertained while they shop, but also one where moms themselves can enjoy. A full-time mother until five years ago when she began working at Granby Hospital, Lanthier is proof one need not be a computer major to master the internet.

EASY TO LEARN

In fact, it takes mere minutes to learn the basic moves before you're off conversing with people around the world with no long-distance charges, writing letters and sending them electronically without the participation of Canada Post, collecting vegetarian recipes from the University of Indiana, crashing parties at the Cannes Film Festival, viewing paintings that are in collections worldwide, discovering the ins and outs of any city in the world, scanning reference material from anywhere, checking out flight availabilities or following an episodic drama — a "netsoap" — all within a matter of seconds. You can even print out your findings if you choose.

Café Electronique also gives people a glimpse into the future with virtual reality games that are a dizzying experience at the very least.

The business offers its customers coffee, juices, and snacks such as chips and chocolate bars — but the main thrust here is computing.

"People like that because it's

not necessary to eat here," said Lanthier. "People passionate for the internet come here and they can get right down to it."

Lanthier encourages people to bring their own food to enjoy while surfing the 'net, and she doesn't mind if it's from the coffee shop next door.

A COMPLEMENT

The Presse Boutique in Sherbrooke is taking another approach to the internet by using it to complement an already established business — a full-fledged coffee shop and magazine store.

"Not everyone has the money to buy computers," said salesman Jean-François Miquelon, who added approximately 750 people have tried it out since the café began offering it last October.

The Wellington Street shop — half café-half magazine store — is a warm, homey place offering a full menu of coffees, sandwiches and deserts. Two computer terminals stand against a wall at the rear of the café, a semi-private location with most of the activity happening behind you while you're working.

Miquelon said most of the people who try the internet there do it out of pure curiosity, with many of them testing it out before signing on at home.

"I think in one year, about half the people in the world will have the internet at home or at the office," said Miquelon.

INTERNET GROCERY STORE

If Belgian chocolates and imported cheeses are what you desire with your 'net experience, what has got to be the first internet grocery store has opened on Galt Street West in Sherbrooke.

Due to the somewhat academic climate of the location (it's close to Sherbrooke University) owner André Randour, an immigrant from Belgium, has called his business La Sorbonne after the prestigious university in France.

The former bank director wanted a complete change in his life, so he left his home and job and moved to Canada with his wife and two children. He chose to settle in Sherbrooke because he believes the quality of life is higher than in a large metropolitan city such as Montreal.

"When I came here I took a course on the internet and thought it was a good business," he said.

He has two computers set up and offers coffee and sandwiches to internet surfers. This *epicerie fine* stocks many imports from France, including cheese, dried forest mushrooms, olives, mustard and vinegar, as well as products from the Townships such as Compton jelly and Stanstead duck paté. If that weren't

Good, bad and ugly can all be found on the 'net

GRANBY — Yanick Blanchard's face lights up like a Christmas tree when he's on the internet.

Since the 21-year-old discovered the "information highway" a week ago at Granby's Café Electronique, he's frequented the newly opened business almost daily to chat with new friends around the world.

In the middle of an electronic conversation with Babar in Switzerland, Blanchard extolled the virtues of surfing the 'net.

"It's the best mode of communication in the world," said the wide-eyed youth as he grinned from ear to ear. "You can speak with anyone anywhere in the world."

There may not be the personal touch of a human voice, but the instant connections are undeniable nonetheless.

It is one of the many positive aspects of the internet, a link-up of computers around the world that many are now accessing through cafés such as the one in Granby. Estimated figures indicate that more than one million Canadians are already connected to the internet, with another two-and-a-half million adults having access to it through home, work, school and community facilities.

In Sherbrooke, the Presse

NOTHING LIKE IT

Clerk and resident internet expert Jean-François Miquelon said there's nothing like it for accessing information and communicating with others.

"You can send e-mail (electronic mail) to people anywhere in the world, and it costs nothing, just the internet subscription," he said, adding the quantity and speed at which one

can scan reference material is tremendous.

"One of our clients is doing some research of countries around the world, looking for information on war, law, government and the like," Miquelon said, "and he bought many magazines and newspapers and he said he didn't get all the information he needed from them. He also said it took 10 hours reading papers and magazines to get the same type of information as spending one hour on the internet."

Miquelon added that libraries may not have the reference books needed.

"The internet is like an encyclopedia of the world," he said, adding that many of its sites are updated daily. "No magazine or reference book can boast that."

At the Wellington Street café, elementary school teacher Danielle Des Rosiers spent her first hour on the internet.

"There's so many things on it, it's unimaginable," she said.

Making the internet available in a setting such as a café is

also a non-threatening way for people to get used to the technology.

SHARE POINT OF VIEW

Patrick Ethier, a student of electrical engineering at Sherbrooke University, said one of his favorite aspects of the internet is being able to share his point of view with people around the world.

"You can write articles on it, it's like becoming a journalist," he said. "You don't have to write for a magazine, and you're certain that thousands of people will see it."

But with everyone becoming a publisher of information on the internet, a great deal of junk and dangerous material has emerged, including everything from nude photos of actor Brad Pitt to racist propaganda.

This had led to much debate on the topic of censoring the public access medium.

AGAINST CENSORSHIP

Most people who enjoy using the internet, however — Townships internet café owners included — are firmly

against any censorship whatsoever.

"The internet is international. If you censor it, it's finished," said Jean Caplette, co-owner of the Café Electronique.

"If you want to conduct research on how to make a bomb, you will get the information," Miquelon offered. "If you don't, then you won't. It's what you want. As for the others, they will find out one way or another."

As far as its negative influence on children, they agree it's the responsibility of parents to monitor what their kids are doing.

At the Café Electronique in Granby, co-owner Marielle Lanthier said it's a balancing act since children and teens regularly frequent her business.

"I have to be careful," she said, adding that on the one hand she doesn't want to censor adults from viewing erotic material, yet on the other she needs to keep it out of children's reach.

"If an adult wants to keep erotic photos, they can do it on their diskette, not on the computer itself," she said is one safeguard. "During the daytime we have to be careful because of the kids. At night, it's okay because it's mostly adults."

Lanthier added the internet is a victim of bad press.

"Any negative stories, the media jump on. In the United States, they found a pedophile on the internet," she said.

If the internet can help police locate criminals, it is a very good thing, she added.

"There's a lot of good on the internet," summed up Lanthier. "The bad things, you need to look for them. You won't just stumble onto them."

As another youth at the Granby café exclaims, "Hey, I'm speaking with someone," it is once again clear how the internet is giving a whole new meaning to making friends.

It's a small world, after all.

enough, Randour also rents videos.

YOUTH TAKING CHARGE

Young people have traditionally hooked onto computers faster than other groups and are among its main users. Now they are also taking part in offering the technology to others.

Three CEGEP de Sherbrooke students will open the Café Bistro Internet next week on King Street near the Delta Hotel.

"We were talking about opening a restaurant and saw (an internet café) in Montreal," said 21-year-old Joshua Danis. "We thought it was a good

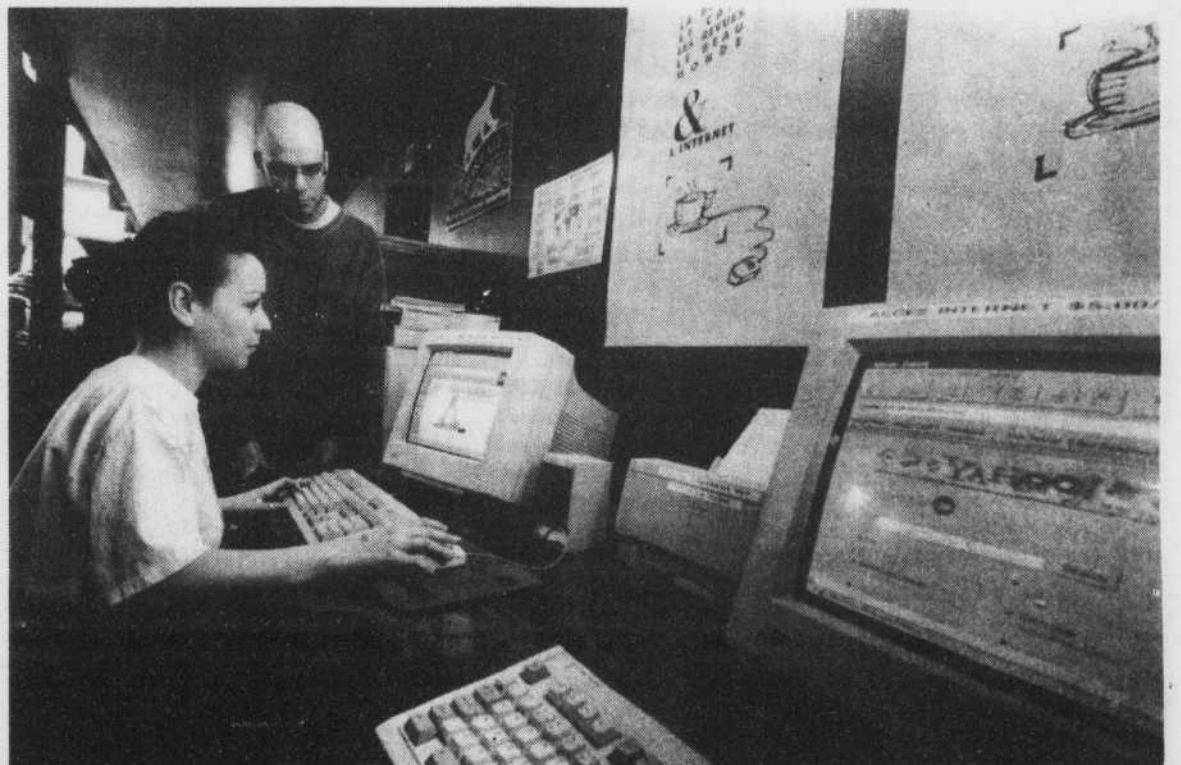
idea."

Danis said a market study of the Sherbrooke area confirmed that people are interested in trying out the internet.

He said six computers will be set up and the restaurant will serve "healthy, simple food" such as sandwiches, salads and soups along with coffee and alcoholic beverages.

Another twist on the internet café flux can be found at the Info-Détente in Coaticook which, aside from offering sandwiches and coffees, is also a bookstore.

The café culture is thriving as never before, and now its possibilities are endless.

TELEVISION

Gemini Awards a three-night celebration

TORONTO (CP)—Canada's burgeoning television industry is about to spend Friday, Saturday and Sunday both praising and poking fun at itself.

But there's no way of measuring whether winners at the 10th annual Gemini Awards actually stand to benefit.

Like their sister Genie Awards for theatrical film, the Geminis are voted by members of the Academy of Canadian Cinema and Television. And the ceremonies will occupy an entire weekend, culminating in a gala show televised nationally in prime time on Sunday night.

Academy organizers are unable to point to any specific material benefits to winning a Gemini, though — unlike the Oscars, for example, which are worth millions of dollars in

extra box-office revenues for a feature film.

"It would have to be in terms of viewers and the viewer time-frame is so fickle," says Ann Medina, academy chairwoman, adding that measuring the impact of a Gemini win on audiences is virtually impossible.

Medina says there have been examples of shows that avoided cancellation or had their budgets increased after a Gemini nomination, but she declined to name any.

Maria Topalovich, the academy's chief executive officer, prefers to accentuate the positive.

"I think it'll be a very, very fun night," she says of Sunday's telecast.

"There's some hysterically funny moments in it. There are going to be some very poignant moments as well. Our tribute

to Bruno Gerussi will be a very special moment."

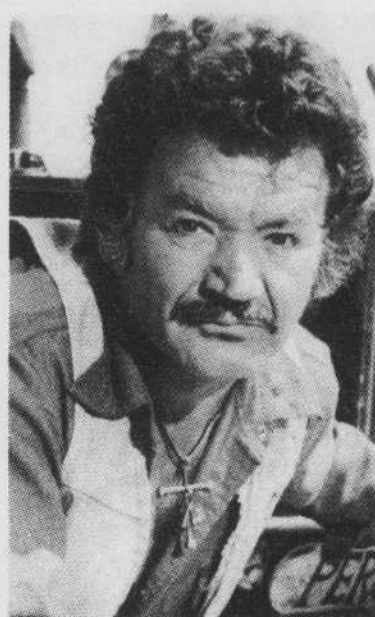
Medina also promises lots of clips, famous faces and self-parody from the industry.

"Comedy is Canadian, one of our strengths," she says.

In past years, viewers have been pleasantly surprised to see well-known but usually dead-serious news personalities like Lloyd Robertson and Wendy Mesley in sketches that parodied their own stiff images.

Squaring off this year will be two prime-time dramas that reflect the duality of the industry. One is an all-Canadian production, the other a hit show on both sides of the Canada-U.S. border.

Due South, CTV's series about a straight-laced Mountie partnered with a noticeably scruffier Chicago cop, heads into the awards with 15 nominations, including best series and best actor for both its lead

Due South has been frequently criticized for perpetuating a weary stereotype of the RCMP to pander to American tastes. But Medina is quick to defend the concept, saying the series has enjoyed some "quite magical moments" that could only have been written by and for Canadians.

North of 60, CBC's more sombre show about life in a territorial native community, netted 11 nominations, as did the CBC's *National* and *Prime Time News*. *North* is a show that has a strong viewership outside metropolitan areas like Toronto, but stands little chance of ever jumping the border.

The 10th Annual Gemini Awards will be broadcast live on CBC-TV at 8 p.m. Sunday from the Metro Toronto Convention Centre's John Bassett Theatre.

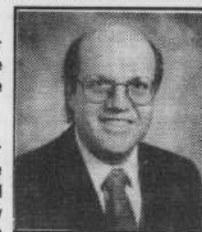

He considered suicide, but was saved by a miracle. Later, he would tell his wife how he had gone into his tour bus to get a .38-calibre pistol he kept in a hidden compartment. When he reached for it, it wasn't there. Most likely, it was stolen and Van Shelton considered it a miracle that God permitted to make him realize he was derailed.

Since that very dark day, the country artist has worked his way back, thanks to renewed faith in God and the help and support of his wife Bettye and friend Andy Landis, who co-wrote the book.

In a recent interview, Bettye Shelton said this book was

about the commitment that a husband and wife have for each other.

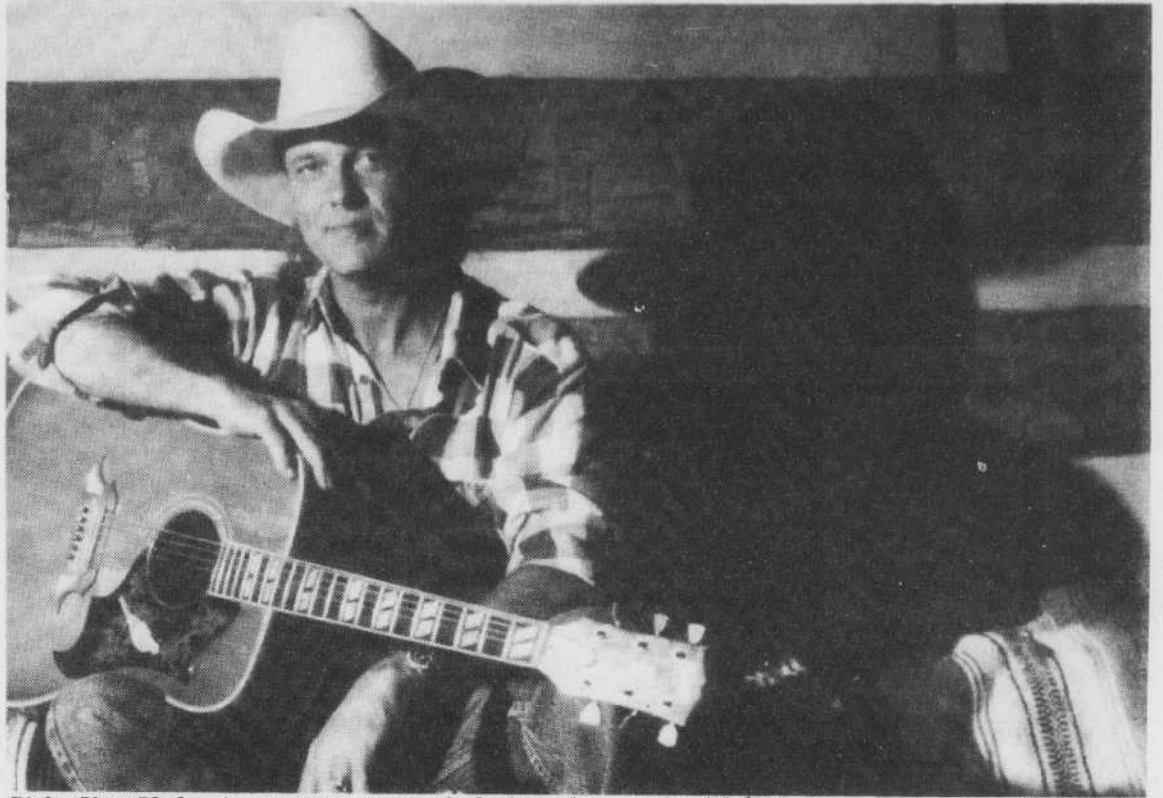
She also added one doesn't give up on somebody just because you're having a hard time.

Today alcohol is a thing of the past in Van Shelton's life and he and his wife rediscovered this sincere love for each other. They've got the ability to communicate and they also share and undying faith in God.

This reunited couple, who will celebrate their 10th anniversary in August, hope the book will spread a message of hope and help others with similar problems.

Van Shelton has since recorded a few albums, including one of Christian music, and has written books for kids.

When it comes to today's country music, some well-

established artists agree on how disappointed they are with it, including Randy Travis and Travis Tritt.

"The quality of the music is not up to what it should be," Randy told one journalist recently. "It's sad to see that happening. So much of the heart-and-soul-music is being lost. I listen to the radio and there are songs being played and I think, 'Why did somebody record this, and why is radio playing it?'"

Travis agrees. "The biggest problem is the mentality that says to take the word 'art' out of 'artist' so you can be some sort of clone, the flavour of the day. I'm tired of turning on my country music radio station and hearing five or six new artists, and they all sound like

Garth Brooks or Clint Black or Joe Diffie. I love them to death but the fact of the matter is we have one of each of those!"

Though I partially agree with these statements, I don't think we should refuse to give newcomers a chance just because they remind us of another act. When I think of all the talent that is out there, just in The Townships for example, I would hate to see it go to waste.

Also, maybe radio stations should abolish the Top 40 format and play all country artists. This would destroy a form of marketing that is very influential with fans and which can make or break careers depending on whether the artist is the flavor of the day or not. After all, the flavor of the

day might not be everybody's favorite.

I believe there's a normal process of elimination which will cause the really talented artists to remain while, in the long run, the clones will never be anything more than a flash-in-the-pan.

Q. What is the difference between a funeral arrangement that costs \$35 and one that costs \$75 or \$135?

A. The main cost of a funeral arrangement is based on the cost of the flowers multiplied by the number of flowers. Other less important factors include the cost of the greens, the container, the floral oasis and a small percentage added on to pay for the florist's time. Things become somewhat complicated since all flowers don't have the same monetary value e.g. roses are usually 3x the cost of carnations, and even more complicated since flowers are not all the same size. In general however when you spend more on an arrangement you will definitely get something which is bigger and has flowers in it of higher value.
