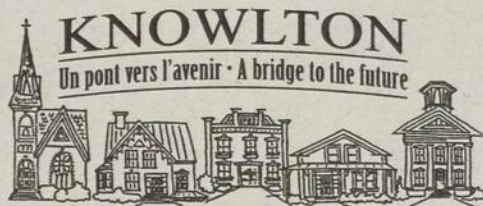

### Heather wins Gaiters' first-ever Hec Crighton Trophy, Mackey, Fox also honoured

QUEBEC CITY

The Bishop's Gaiters were the big winners at the annual All-Canadian Banquet held Thursday night, in the leadup to this weekend's Vanier Cup. Quarterback Jordan Heather won the Hec Crighton Trophy, given to the CIS football player of the year, and became the first Gaiter to win the prestigious honour.

In addition, Gaiter head coach Kevin Mackey won the Frank Tindall Trophy, given to the CIS football Coach of the Year, and receiver Alexander Fox was named a First Team All-Canadian.

Heather beat out Western Ontario quarterback Will Finch and a pair of running backs, Jordan Botel of Mount Allison and Calgary's Mercer Timmis, to win the award. He set a CIS record with 3,132 passing yards this season, an average of 391.5 per game. Heather was a three-time CIS Player of the Week, and set a

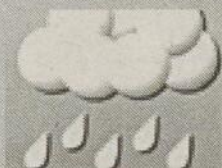

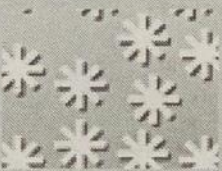

# BU Singers lend voice to cancer fighters

At Bishop's University, holiday songs begin as soon as Halloween costumes are stored away for the year. As students buckle down for exam period, or daydream of mom's turkey dinner, Centennial Theatre will be opening its doors for a two-night performance for the benefit of Leucan, presented by the Bishop's University Singers.

The event, called "A Concert For Leucan", is set for 8 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 22 and Saturday Nov. 23. All proceeds

beyond expenses will be donated to the Estrie branch of Leucan, a Quebec-based association that assists cancer-stricken children and their families throughout their fight.

Apart from providing funding for clinical research, Leucan's multi-faceted program includes physical therapy, emotional support, and a host of recreational retreats. According to Leucan's website, programs such as annual summer camps aim to reduce isolation that families tend to fall into upon their return home, and to boost the

children's self-esteem which can be dealt a heavy blow during the treatment process.

The show itself features the 75-strong members of the Bishop's Singers accompanied by 18 local professional and semi-professional musicians. The collection of seasonal songs includes the work of Benjamin Britten, Morten Lauridsen, John Rutter, and Sherbrooke-native composer Donald Patriquin, a Bishop's alumnus.

Following the Friday night show, live music by The Tim Brink Band will be held at the

student-run campus bar, while the Saturday night show will be followed by a VIP wine and cheese reception and the music of the Sylvain Daigneault Jazz Trio.

Tickets are \$35 for adults - or \$15 for students - for Friday night's show, and \$50 for all attendees on Saturday. Tickets can be purchased at the Centennial Theatre Box Office, or by calling 819-822-9692.

## First Wednesdays at Newport's Goodrich Memorial Library Author Reeve Lindbergh discusses Anne Morrow Lindbergh's diaries

Vermont author Reeve Lindbergh will discuss the diaries and letters of her mother, Anne Morrow Lindbergh, in a talk at Goodrich Memorial Library in Newport on Dec. 4 at 7 p.m. The talk, "Rowing Against Wind and Tide: The Journals and Letters of Anne Morrow Lindbergh," is part of the Vermont Humanities Council's First Wednesdays lecture series and is free and open to the public.

Lindbergh will reflect on collecting four decades of her mother's previously unpub-

lished diaries and letters, which shed light on her mother's marriage to Charles Lindbergh and her take on key world events.

Lindbergh is the author of numerous children's books and three memoirs. She is the daughter of aviator Charles Lindbergh and writer Anne Morrow Lindbergh. With other family members, she recently edited the final volume of her late mother's diaries and letters, Against Wind and Tide.

The Vermont Humanities Council's First Wednesdays series is held on the first Wednesday of every month

from October through May in nine communities statewide, featuring speakers of national and regional renown. Talks in Newport are held at Goodrich Memorial Library. All First Wednesdays talks are free and open to the public.

Upcoming Newport talks include "The British Monarchy from Victoria to Elizabeth II" with Middlebury College professor Paul Monod on Jan. 8; "An Evening of George Gershwin" with pianist Michael Arnowitt on Feb. 5; and "The Costumes of Downtown Abbey" with Middlebury College Artist-in-Residence Jule Emerson on March 5.

## Horse dies in Brompton barn fire

SHERBROOKE

A fire completely destroyed a stable in Brompton Thursday morning, killing a horse and causing over \$50,000 in damages. The cause of the fire, at 693 Ch. Desjardins, remains un-

known.

"A neighbour raised the alarm," says Sherbrooke Fire Department Operations Chief Alexandre Groleau. "The first firefighters arriving on the scene immediately triggered a second alarm," says the head of the service operations protection

against fires Sherbrooke, Alexandre Groleau. By this time, the barn was completely engulfed in flames and firefighters fought to save a nearby chicken house.

Twenty firefighters were involved in the operation, which, because of the

rural location, required the use of two tanker trucks to supply water.

Investigation into the fire has been handed over to the Sherbrooke Police because, although not described as 'suspicious,' the fire's cause remains unknown and "difficult to explain."

"We rely on the generosity of the people of Sherbrooke on this occasion and we are look-

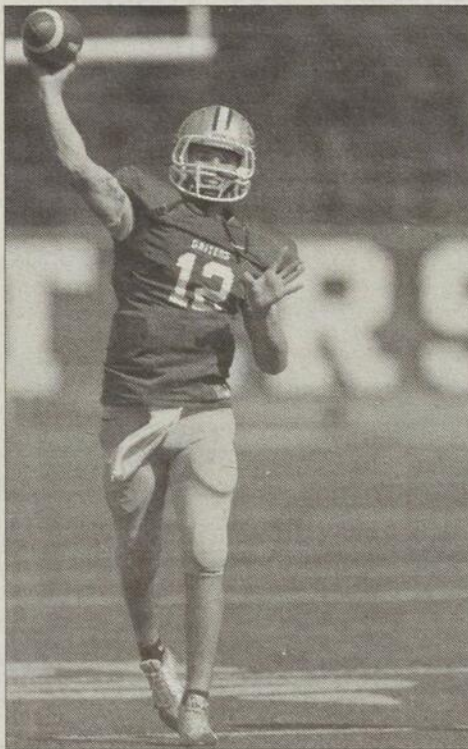
ing forward to it with great excitement."

league record with 20 touchdown passes, against only seven interceptions. His season was highlighted by his 538-yard performance against the defending Vanier Cup champion Laval Rouge et Or as he led the Gaiters to their first home playoff game since 1994.

Mackey is the third Gaiter head coach to win the Frank Tindall Trophy, following Gaiter legends Bruce Coulter (1986) and Ian Breck (1992). Mackey engineered an unprecedented turnaround, as the Gaiters went from an 0-9 record in 2012 to a 6-2 mark this year, including three one-point victories. The Ascot Corner native is one of the youngest recipients in the award's history, at just 34 years of age.

Fox, who is a two-time All-Canadian, was the only 1,000-yard receiver in CIS football this year, finishing with 47 catches for 1,009 yards. His 12 touchdowns, including two of over 90 yards, was also tops in the nation this year.

The other award winners announced were Western linebacker Pawel Kruba, who captured the Presidents' Trophy as defensive player of the year; McGill offensive tackle Laurent Duvernay-Tardif,

who merited the J.P. Metras Trophy as most outstanding down lineman; McMaster wide receiver Daniel Vandervoort, who received the Peter Gorman Trophy as top rookie; and Calgary quarterback Andrew Buckley, the recipient of the prestigious Russ Jackson Award hon-

ouring excellence in football, academics and citizenship.

# Man who walked around the world to talk in Richmond

Today, his business card identifies him as a public speaker, and he's much in demand by the media. In August of 2000, he was a somewhat depressed individual setting out over the Jacques Cartier Bridge on the Quixotic quest of walking around the world.

He made it.

It took him 11 years and two months. He covered 75,500 kilometres, and wore out 54 pairs of shoes. He stayed with 1,600 different families in 64 different countries. If his math is right he took 113,000,000 steps.

"It wasn't courage that prompted me to set out, even though many people assume it was," says Jean Béliveau, whose book, *L'Homme qui marche*, tells the story of his odyssey. "In some ways, it was cowardice. I was walking away from problems I didn't want to face. Though perhaps at some point during those 11 years cowardice and courage met, and crossed paths."

Jean Béliveau was born in Asbestos and spent his childhood on the family dairy farm between Asbestos and Danville. (Jean's father, Ben Béliveau, was the founding president of the Richmond Holstein Association.) Before he reached adolescence, the growing slag heaps of the Johns-Manville mine resulted in the farm being expropriated. The family tried fighting the mining giant but without success and eventually purchased Mont Scotch Hill with the intention of running a camp site and reception hall.

Jean was artistic but not academically inclined. He took a commercial art course and eventually became part owner of a small business in Granby which specialized in making neon signs. One day his bank manager called him in and suggested that his best option was to save what he could and give up the business. Now with a new partner, Luce, he moved to Montreal. He and Luce were avid walkers and occasional runners. Jean had been quite serious about running and cross-country skiing when he lived at Scotch Hill; he turned to running again after the Ice Storm of 1998 to help him deal with depression.

In November of 1999 he was 44 years old and just recovered from depression. He was jogging across the Jacques Cartier Bridge—the site of a number of suicides including that of film maker Claude Jutra—when the sidewalk seemed to beckon to him. "It was as if the sidewalk was calling me to run away," he

says. "I wondered how long it would take to run to New York, and why not much further."

"The idea of walking around the world grew from that moment," Jean continues. "It kept bouncing around my head and I started planning the trip the same way I would have made a business plan."

There were constraints. He had all of \$4,000 in the bank.

He nurtured his plan in secret for eight months before finally telling Luce one morning in late July over breakfast that he was going to leave on his birthday, August 18, to walk around the world. "Luce looked at me for a moment," he recalls, "and then asked if this meant that our relationship was over. No, I told her, and I took her in my arms and hugged her. She said, if you're going to do this, why not dedicate it to the children of the world, why not do it for world peace? And suddenly, in my mind, this became our project; Luce was as much a part of it as I was."

In fact, Luce kept the home fires burning. She set up Jean's first two web sites and was very busy with communications, both with Jean and with a growing list of other people. Once a year she travelled to wherever Jean had reached and joined him for two or three weeks. "It was always wonderful seeing her," he says. "It was

as if we had 11 honeymoons."

Similarly, Jean's 20 year-old son and 18 year-old daughter were supportive of the idea and both joined him for a week or two at a time on several occasions during his trip. He met both his grand-daughters for the first time while on his trip.

"For all my planning," he says, "my departure was hectic. I wasn't really prepared even though I was firmly decided. I bought a three-wheeled baby carriage, a tent, a sleeping bag and a few other supplies including notebooks just a day before leaving."

At the end of his first day on the road he faced the quandary of where to sleep. He saw a young woman as he was passing by a farmhouse and stopped to ask if he might sleep in her fields. "She was very nice and told him to pitch his tent on the lawn behind the house. But at four in the morning the woman's husband and father-in-law were waking me up and telling me to get off the property."

In Plattsburg a few days later he made the front page of the local paper. "I had barely started my journey," he says, "and they treated me like a returning hero."

Fifteen days later he found himself in New York City. "It was Friday afternoon and I was in the heart of the city and I realized that I didn't have a place

to stay. You can't pitch a tent in Central Park the way you can at the side of a country road. A tourist befriended me and suggested I go to the Canadian consulate. It was quite close and when I told my story to the receptionist she gave me a frosty reception but told me to wait and she'd see what she could do. She disappeared into another room and came back 20 minutes later. She was smiling happily at me and told me the vice-consul would provide me with I bus ticket back to Montreal."

"No, I'm sorry," Jean said, and he explained his journey again and eventually was directed to a nearby Catholic Church run by French-Canadian priests who gave him a bed for the night. He ended up staying with them for a week.

Jean walked south along the eastern seaboard before crossing westward to Texas and then south into Mexico and Central America.

"It seems that regardless where you go, people always see what they do as natural and normal while what others do is judged to be strange and unusual," he observes.

In Peru he spent a few days with a family. They had a big pot on the stove and in it they were brewing a beer made from corn. Every now and again the mother or daughter would take a taste of the liquid, swirl it

around her mouth and then spit back into the pot. What struck Jean as disturbingly unhygienic, the family considered perfectly ordinary.

"In Egypt," he continues, "a chemist explained to me that the enzymes in our mouths hasten fermentation. There was a scientific explanation for spitting into the beer, and I needn't have worried about bacteria because they would have been killed by the fermentation."

There were low points. He almost quit four years into his trip. "I was in Ethiopia and feeling discouraged," he says. "I called Luce to tell her I was coming home but she encouraged me to continue, and I'm glad I did."

The people he met along the way were helpful. In Algeria he was operated on for a prostrate problem and he wasn't charged for either the surgery or the week he spent in hospital. He developed sore feet in China and in Korea he was fitted with two pairs of insoles for arch support at no cost. After having walked the world's five inhabited continents, his flight from New Zealand to Vancouver was paid for by New Zealand Air.

Often, as he walked, he was joined by people who accompanied him for a few kilometres or a few hours, even though not all his companions were of his choosing. "In Egypt," he recalls, "soldiers marched along side me for the entire length of the country. I was walking for peace and I didn't want these men with guns, but they told me they didn't want anything to happen to me and they insisted on escorting me."

One of the highlights of his trip was meeting Nelson Mandela in South Africa. And, in a classic case of "small world" he met a cyclist in Peru, a professional clown, who was also doing a world tour, only to meet him two more times over the course of the next ten years.

Since returning home Jean Béliveau has become something of a minor celebrity. He had fifteen publishers anxious to sign him to a book deal. He's had numerous requests for video and film projects. His book, *Jean Béliveau, l'homme qui marche* will shortly be released in Russian and a Korean translation is also in the works.

Jean Béliveau will be speaking at Richmond Regional High School on Tuesday, Nov. 26 at 7 p.m. The evening is being hosted by the Richmond 4-H and there is no charge but there will be a basket for donations at the door. The talk will be in both French and English. Jean Béliveau is a good public speaker and he has a fascinating story to tell. For more information contact Maria Enright at 819 826-1377.

## Habitual burglar faces 124 charges

A career burglar arrested last week in Sherbrooke now faces charges for 77 burglaries in Thetford Mines and 47 in Sherbrooke between October 2012 and November 2013, or one every three days.

Derek Carrier, 39, was charged yesterday at Sherbrooke courthouse before Justice Paul Dunnigan of the Court of Québec.

"I have never experienced a situation like this in 31 years of

service," says Thetford Mines Police Chief François Gagnon. "It is not the worst crime we've had to solve, but the one that has used up the most resources and caused the most concern among the population."

"Meticulous hard work and collaboration between police forces who worked on the investigation allowed us to bring these charges," says initiating Crown Prosecutor, Andy Drouin.

Carrier was arrested in Sherbrooke, last Thursday. Two charges filed then allowed him to be kept behind bars until the

three separate occasions, but arrived too late.

Carrier allegedly committed his crimes in Thetford Mines between October 2012 and August 2013. During the next two months he operated in Sherbrooke.

The accused allegedly targeted houses with nobody home during the day or early evening, looking for cash, primarily.

At a press conference, Gagnon said the 'modus operandi' in the wave of burglaries was similar and that police almost caught the thief on

three separate occasions, but arrived too late.

Police in Thetford tried all kinds of methods and techniques to try to nab the thief, including extra patrols in residential area, searches, neighbourhood watch programs, photographic line-ups, and geographic profiling, a technique new to the Sûreté du Québec. For a full month, three police officers were assigned to visit virtually every residence in the Sainte-Marthe neighbourhood. The Sûreté du Québec forensic identification experts

were also involved.

"My staff has worked extremely hard," Gagnon said. "I want to congratulate them as well as the specialized services of the SQ. There isn't an officer involved who didn't dream about collaring him. Everyone experienced a lot of stress, including the population."

Carrier, who already has an extended criminal record in this kind of crime remains in custody until his bail hearing next Monday. He is being defended by lawyer Benoit Gagnon.

## Locals swept up in child abuse operation

Police are publishing the pictures of three Eastern Townships men arrested in an anti-child sexual exploitation operation in the hopes that this will encourage possible victims to come forward.

Operation Mainmise, carried out by the Sûreté du Québec in several Quebec regions from Nov. 18 to 21, resulted in 28 arrests, three of which were in the Estrie region.

Most of those arrested in the sweep have already been charged with counts related to

the sexual exploitation of children, including the possession, production, and distribution of child pornography, and, in some cases, sexual assault.

Gabriel Morin, 31, of Sherbrooke, Luc Lessard, 39, of Marbleton, and Jacques Martin, 35, of Westbury, along with Sebastien Couture, 30, from Drummondville, are among those arrested and police are distributing photos because they believe there may be as yet unidentified victims whom police would like to interview.

Operation Mainmise (Grip) was initiated in June by the SQ

team investigating the sexual exploitation of children on the Internet (ESEI), in collaboration with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and municipal

forces. It is the largest child pornography operations ever carried out in the province, it says. Between June and October, ESEI investigators were able to

identify suspects on the internet, searches were conducted in their homes, and computer equipment was seized for analysis.

## Heavy fines for Magog tobacco traffickers

Memphremagog Police are making public penalties imposed on those guilty of offences under the Tobacco Tax Act in the region between 2010 and 2012, two Magog men who have either pleaded or been found guilty and been condemned to fines totalling \$168,375.

The first, aged 46, was fined \$115,000 for trafficking and possession of contraband tobacco, and the second was fined

\$53,375 for similar offences.

Three others, facing charges from the same police operations have been fined, but have not yet been found guilty. If convicted, the two men, 51, and 67, and one woman, 51, face fines of \$47,966, \$23,848, and \$501, respectively.

**Suspect sought in elder beating, robbery**

The Sûreté du Québec is asking for the public's assistance in the identification and location of a man who attacked a 71-year

old woman in her home in Lac Drolet Wednesday evening.

At around 9:30, the suspect broke into the woman's apartment on Deschênes while the woman was at home.

"An altercation followed between the two," says SQ spokesperson Aurélie Guindon. "The suspect then fled with an as yet undetermined sum of money. The woman suffered an injury to her head during the scuffle."

Police believe the suspect to be a small, slim man in his

twenties, standing perhaps 5'5." Anyone with any information that could help police in

this case is asked to call the SQ Criminal Investigation Centre at 1 800 659-4264.

## Accident knocks out power in Stanstead

STANSTEAD

A single-vehicle accident on Fairfax Road in Stanstead left the driver with serious, but not life-threatening injuries early Thursday morning.

The driver of an SUV, a 48-year old man, failed to make a turn, left the road, bounced off a tree and ended up breaking a Hydro pole, knocking out power in the area. The accident occurred at around 1:30.

The driver suffered injuries serious enough to require hospitalization but doctors expect him to recover.

While police cannot say for sure what caused the accident, the damages incurred indicate speed might have played a role.

## Hydro power now goes with the flow

Canada is showing up at the bottom of the class of most environmental evaluation lists, including being last within the 28 nations that form the OECD. It would have been easy to pile up here the diplomatic consequences and sour comments about Canada's stance in this second week of the Warsaw COP 19 Climate Conference, but why bother? With the ongoing failure of Canada in the Climate talks, one has to wonder why Minister Aglukkaq, toeing the Harper line in Warsaw, even went in the first place. The Harper administration has made its point: it doesn't care, period!

Instead I would like to draw your attention to an energy venture that recognizes the need for solutions, then bothers enough to put money where many just flare empty words. RER Hydro, a renewable energy company that is about to go worldwide with a water turbine technology that is...well, invisible!

In a major announcement last week, right in the heart of the Bécancour industrial park, RER confirmed an alliance with Boeing, yes, the Seattle aeronautics giant. The joint venture, along with the Quebec government, will pave the way to 600 high tech jobs in the near future. Boeing will use the might of a worldwide network, add top level research and get in return exclusive rights to promote and sell the turbines globally.

The technology behind RER's water turbines is simple, not new, but it is proven. The engine resembles a jet airplane motor at first glance, but it never leaves the bottom of the river where it is installed. The flow of the current is sufficient to extract electricity without

any negative effect to the environment. The stronger the current, the more energy you get.

No dams, no noise, nothing to be seen, just pure hydro power to be gained 24/7. The first turbine was installed in August 2010 just a few feet from the clock tower in Montreal harbour. It has been running silently, without a problem for over 28,000 hours. The best performance by this type of technology anywhere, ever. Four of these machines will churn out one megawatt of continuous power.

You might think that with Hydro-Quebec's current surpluses we don't need other sources of electricity, but RER is not aiming to sell electricity here. The market is not the power but the technology.

All of this is happening in our backyard and if all goes according to plan, it will eventually go all around the world. The success of this clean energy source is 'a no brainer.' Mismanagement from Boeing is unlikely and the need for light, quickly installed and high performing clean energy sources of this sort is limitless.

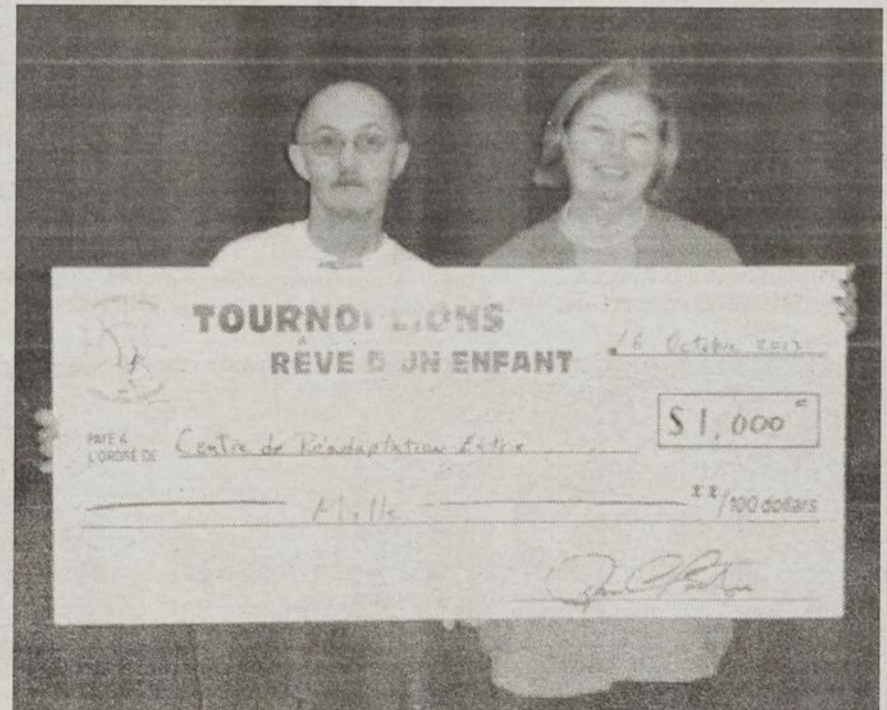
When the Quebec government shut down the Gentilly nuclear power plant it meant the loss of 800 well paid jobs. Less than a year later high tech jobs have come back to Gentilly and there is a good chance some of these will be taken by the engineers that worked at the power plant. Sure beats grandstanding in Warsaw!

## Wrapping up this year's Christmas project

What are you doing for Christmas to make it special? Signs of Christmas seem to be showing up earlier and earlier every year and not just in those stores trying to get an early grab on your money. Christmas decorations and lights beautify houses and a few people have admitted to putting up their Christmas trees already.

At first we might roll our eyes and shake our heads condescendingly, but their explanations make sense to a lot of us. With all the dodgy characters reported endlessly in the media, self-serving politicians and political parties and the bad news of suffering from places such as the Philippines streaming into our living rooms

we have to agree that the beauty, magic and good cheer we associate with Christmas couldn't come soon enough.

With all the plans and preparations for Christmas parties, dinners and concerts I'm pretty sure that Christmas has already imposed its presence into your lives and calendars making it hard to figure out how you will use your limited dollars and Saturdays to celebrate.

This brings us closest to the One who came to give Himself to a dark and needy world. It brings us to the beating heart of Christmas.

## Harper commits up to \$95 million for Lac-Mégantic

Prime Minister Stephen Harper is committing up to \$95 million in federal funds to help decontaminate Lac-Mégantic's water and soil.

Harper says the money is part of a 50-50 cost-shared agreement with Quebec.

"Our government is proud to be providing substantial additional assistance to Lac-Mégantic to help its residents return

to normalcy in the aftermath of the deadly train derailment in July," Harper said in the Quebec town on Thursday.

"The support announced thursday will help decontaminate the affected areas, including the soil near the derailment site and the Chaudiere River and lake. This is an essential stepping stone toward the town's reconstruction and recovery," Harper added.

Harper was accompanied by federal cabinet minister Christ-

ian Paradis and the town's mayor, Colette Roy-Laroche.

The federal government says Quebec has estimated the clean-up costs after last summer's deadly train derailment at \$190 million.

award Thursday at the 15th Quebec Police Awards Gala in Montreal for their performance during the Lac Mégantic rail disaster in July.

François Boulé, Sophie Demers, Jean-François Laliberté and Marc-Antoine Maynard of the Sûreté du Québec began their shift just a few hours before the accident and were recognized for their courage, teamwork, perseverance, and commitment to their community. They were among 40 po-

lice officers and two civilians honoured by the Association des policiers provinciaux du Québec (APPQ) at the event.

"Time was pressing, and downtown was burning," says an AAPQ press release. "Police sometimes had to intervene to protect people from the consequences of their own curiosity. That night was not like any other. Completely unexpectedly, four officers were left in the middle of an unprecedented catastrophe."

# Target grand opening today

At 8 a.m. this morning the doors of Sherbrooke's new Target department store will be open to the public. The store is one of the final two of 124 locations across the country to open, along with the Target in Niagara Falls, marking the last step of the American retail giant's Canadian launch.

"Opening 124 stores in less than nine months is a never before seen level of expansion in Canada," said Sébastien Bouchard, manager of Public relations for Target in Canada, as he gave a tour of the new store to members of the local media Thursday morning. "In the

United States the stores are all older; this fresh start gave us the opportunity to build from the ground up... All the stores were remade in their entirety."

Overall Bouchard said that Target invested close to \$4 billion in the Canadian expansion, once store acquisition, hiring of roughly 20,000 employees, and \$11-12 million in renovations per location is taken into account. 25 of the 124 stores Target has opened this year are in Quebec, representing about \$300 million of that \$4 billion before elements like translation and French marketing campaigns are factored in.

"This is the first time Target is working in a language other than English," the PR Manager explained, "we've trans-

lated four million words this year."

Pascal Forcier, the store's manager (or "team leader" in the company's terminology), explained that every store in Quebec has a "French Language Captain" charged with making sure that translations in the store are well made and that any errors are taken care of quickly.

Asked about English service, Bouchard explained that Target's approach is market based. "Certain stores are bilingual. This one is mostly French," he said. "If you go in Westmount, the store is bilingual, the signs are bilingual: it really depends on the market and we'll make changes as we hear from our guests." The PR manager referred to the example of stores in Sudbury, Ontario, and Moncton, New Brunswick as places where local French speaking populations had requested and received more French service in their Target Stores, and said that the same thing could happen here for English if the need became apparent.

Walking the aisles of the store, it starts out looking like a more spacious version of its predecessor, Zellers, but Forcier explained that, in his opinion, the store's colours are the only thing people should see as being in common with the older store. He pointed to a vast increase in staffing and a team spirit among the store's 150 employees that, in combination with a physical expansion and streamlining of design, he believes will differentiate Target and make it more than just a "new Zellers."

"In Canada Target has taken on a unique model," Bouchard continued. "We have tried to take a hybrid model between the U.S. "City Target" and "Regular" Target stores." He pointed out that the store holds a mix of design elements from traditional department stores and a more boutique-oriented approach to display and sales. He emphasized the fact that Target never plays music in its stores and does not display goods in its pathways, allowing for a more open, less congested feeling to the store.

Every entrance to the store, of which there are four on the ground floor and one on the second, features an information panel with a map identifying different sections. The panel also contains pamphlet versions of the map that customers ("guests" in Target-speak) can take with them.

Bouchard also pointed out a series of price scanners distributed throughout the store, as well as red "help" buttons and information telephones that customers can use to summon a staff member for immediate assistance. Every employee, including the managers, carries a walkie-talkie that is paged when

ever someone pushes the call button. Though innovative in Canada, he said that the system has been in place and very helpful in the stores in the United States for some time.

The Sherbrooke store, according to Forcier, covers close to 140,000 square feet over its two floors. For comparison purposes, Bouchard pointed out that the majority of Canadian stores are in the range of 108,000. "It's not the biggest," the PR Manager said, "but it's big."

The Target representatives explained that shoppers will be able to find all the same brands in Canadian Target stores as in the U.S. equivalents, although only some will be at equivalent prices.

"The business model is different in Canada than in the States," Bouchard explained, "the Tariffs to import to Canada are different. Even if we wanted to (charge the same price) we couldn't." From that point, though, he explained that all of the stores' limited time collections and offers will have the same prices in the US and Canada, and that the percentage of items in store that are the same price as their American equivalents will vary depending on the season.

"We're obviously trying to be as competitive as we can," Bouchard continued, pointing to efforts to keep prices low in context. "Prices are adjusted on a daily basis. We have a team that actually shops all of our competitors to make sure that we're always on par." He added that customers signing up for the company's "red card" loyalty program will be able to get items for five per cent off a price matched from another store, guaranteeing that they get the lowest price in town.

Early in the process of opening the Canadian stores, Target was struck with supply issues, with locations not being able to keep up with the demand on certain items. While not guaranteeing that those issues would not come up in Sherbrooke, Bouchard said that the company has learned from the experience and that a lot of the problems had to do with greater than expected interest. "We have made a bunch of changes," Bouchard said, "certain stores, especially when we first opened, got more traffic than we thought they would."

Both Bouchard and Forcier said they had no particular goals for the grand opening, other than making sure it is a positive experience.

"We want to make sure people have the best experience possible," Bouchard said. "First days are always busy, and given that this will also be the opening of the first Starbucks in Sherbrooke, I'm pretty sure it will be busy."

## David Grenville — 1928 - 2013

Losing a friend is never easy. Somehow we manage to pick ourselves up and move on, always remembering the good times.

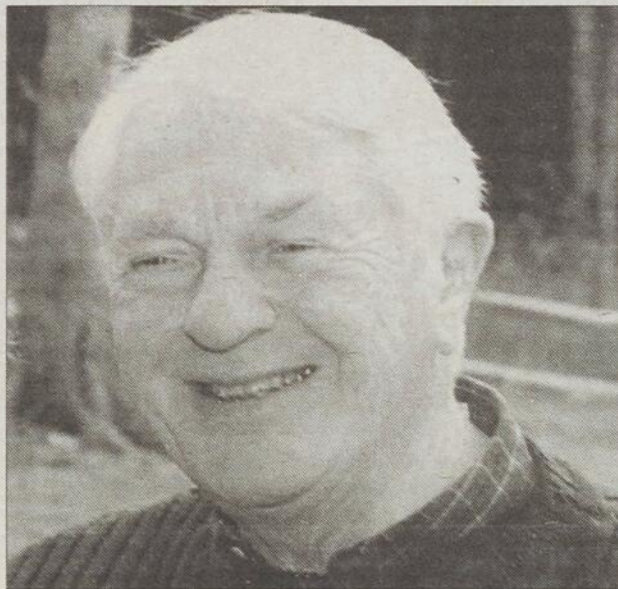
David Grenville was my friend, one of the people who played a huge part in bringing community radio to Brome Missisquoi and parts of Shefford. He passed away at the age of 85 on November 14, 2013.

When our communities lose supporting members, such as David, we need to recognize their good works so that future generations, and the current one for that matter, realize their contributions. Part of David's legacy is CIDI 99.1 FM and it would be a shame not to remember him for his tireless efforts in getting the station up and running.

David Morgan Grenville was born February 16, 1928 in London, England. He attended Stowe School in Buckingham from 1941 to 1945 and was then commissioned in the British Army from 1946 to 1948, seeing service in India in 1946/47.

From 1948 to 1950 he did graduate studies at Cambridge University, receiving an MA in economics. In 1950-1951 he took his MBA at the University of Kansas. He married Nancy Martin of Washington DC in 1951 and they had three children, Sally, Geoffrey, and Andrew. She died in 1994 and in 1996 he married Patricia Jequier (Patsy).

When David started volunteering in 2008 at Radio Communautaire Missisquoi (RCM) he was 80. I remember the first time I met him: he was attending an interview Patsy (a retired nurse) was having at CIDI. Her involvement as a volunteer at Diapason, the palliative care centre in Brome Missisquoi, attracted the attention of sisters Marie and Lucie Fortin, who hosted an interview show on CIDI.

At the time CIDI was broadcasting with a 50-watt transmitter, a small antenna on the roof of its studio building in downtown Knowlton and had great expectations for the future. The time was ripe for someone as competent as David to hop on board.

Since his semi-retirement to an old Sutton farmhouse in 1989 (he served as chairman of Canpolar East from 1989 until 1995), David said he had been looking for something special to capture his interests and keep him busy throughout his retirement years. He and Patsy moved to Knowlton in 2007.

He was very interested and impressed with the idea of community radio. This was something he could see himself getting involved in. Most of all, it was something he believed would make a difference in his community; a worthwhile creative project he could help develop.

In 1954 David emigrated to Canada and began work for the British Newfoundland Corporation (Brinco), based in Montreal. From then until 1970 he was at various times assistant to each of Brinco's presidents, he was also development manager, and finally Brinco's assistant general manager.

From 1966 until 1969 he was responsible on behalf of Brinco's subsidiary Churchill Falls (Labrador) Corporation for planning and managing the provision of

construction and town-site services for the \$1 billion (1969) 6 million horsepower hydro-electric project.

As director general of RCM at the time, I was looking forward to David's input in regard to CIDI's need for the planning and managing of its Patch Hill tower project (which would bring CIDI from a 50-watt station to a 1,500 watt broadcaster). Approximately \$150,000 needed to be raised from different government sources requiring business plans and application forms to be written and filled out.

He became part of RCM's advisory committee along with retired "corporate hounds" Warren "Woody" Woodworth and Donald Gray-Donald.

David didn't disappoint as he authored two business plans, wrote up funding applications for different levels of government as well as conceptualize in writing the vision and purpose of RCM. "Communications," he would say, "is key to getting the community onboard."

"I remember David riding his bike to the station in the morning with his briefcase," said Patsy recently, "and returning home to continue his work later."

We would have meetings at the station and at restaurants over breakfast. David was a writer and loved to make sense out of what RCM was trying to accomplish. We would philosophize, discuss and evolve ideas for the corporation's direction.

David always wanted things to be perfectly clear on paper and had a knack for rendering thoughts cursorily onto a pad of paper. His boyish energy controlled his pen as he channeled our thoughts. Later in the day I would receive, by e-mail, a transcript of our meeting.

Out of such meetings came the RCM Radio Theater Drama Writing Awards project (his brainchild). He had raised single-handedly over \$10,000 for the project through the Chawkers Foundation and the Townshippers Foundation. He also managed to enlist Louise Penny as its patron.

The STOP! Show was also included in many of the brainstorming conversations since it was originally conceived as a promotional vehicle for CIDI and incorporated in RCM's business strategy. We can thank David in part for its longevity. The first STOP! show was produced in the fall of 2007.

How fortunate we were to have encountered such a talented, eminently qualified and enthusiastic person, so passionate and devoted to the cause. Thank you David.

A memorial service and celebration of David's life will be scheduled for the spring; announcement by his family to follow in local papers.

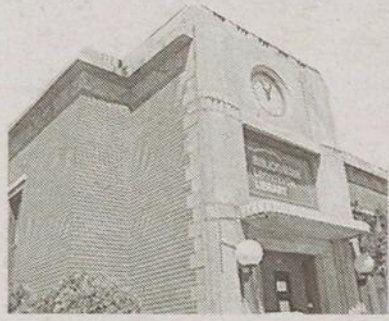

# Cory Doctorow wants to give you his book, free

## Digital guru seeks a new world order

Cory Doctorow is a digital guru living in a world that's still largely stuck in the analog. He does things many people consider to be bananas.

"I've been giving away my books ever since my first novel came out, and boy has it ever made me a bunch of money," he once wrote in Forbes magazine.

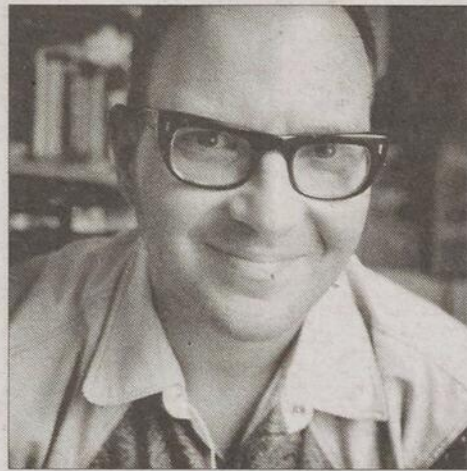
The free downloads of his sci-fi, he argues, are read by people who would never bother to actually buy his books, but his unorthodox methods give him high visibility with such folk. This, Doctorow believes, leads to well-paying gigs — such as the Forbes piece.

Plus, those readers who are fans will go on to buy the book as a gesture of support.

Critics argue that Doctorow can afford to make this argument because of his day job(s) — he's intermittently an academic, computer coder, and an editor at the tech/pop culture website Boing Boing. And it's true that his work boosting the internationalist, cooperative and personally empowering politic of the decentralized Internet has made him famous.

His Young Adult novel, *Homeland* (2013), can be found — free! — on his website, [craphound.com](http://craphound.com). It's a sequel to *Little Brother* (also free, it's one of the 10 books on this year's CBC Radio Canada Reads list). In that first tale, young Marcus Yallow is arrested by an American government gone mad with panic after a terrorist attack in San Francisco. Yallow is an innocent, tortured by agents of a "tyrannical security state."

As for *Homeland*, it can also be found, in print, on the Lennoxville Library's New Arrival shelves (in Young Adult Fic-

tion). And just like Doctorow, it's all about the new electronic frontier. Marcus Yallow is back, jobless and poor, camping at the annual Burning Man, held in a Nevada desert, "dedicated to community, art, self-expression, and self-reliance" (according to the festival's website — Burning Man is a real thing!). The gathering also runs as a gift economy, where everyone who attends is expected to give something back — sunblock, cookery, reading material, entertainment....

Unexpectedly, Yallow is handed a data key and instructed to leak the documents within to the world if his source disappears. A few paragraphs later, she does.

What follows is a thriller inspired by Julian Assange and the Wikileaks website (see also the motion picture *Fifth Estate*, released in October and starring

current heartthrob Benedict Cumberbatch), the US government's apparent overstepping in the War on Terror, and the ever-more complex mixing of federal agencies and private enterprise operating as paid mercenaries for the state.

This is a great read for people who are just dipping their toes into the politics of technology. There's explanations of 3D printers, details on the "dark web" (note however, that the secret, illegal drug- and arms-selling Silk Road website was just shut down by the real-world FBI), and arguments made for less onerous copyright laws.

In a recent interview, Doctorow said: "It's a tradition in techno thrillers to have spycraft excerpts. James Bond explains his cypher wheel. On one hand, this is in that tradition. I grew up with books like *Steal This Book* [by 1960s counter-cultural hero Abbie Hoffman] and *The Whole Earth Catalog* — books that were filled with recipes or instructions for doing stuff. That was back when facts were expensive. How do you cheat a pay phone to give you a dial tone without a quarter?" Now, of course, Doctorow offers a primer and, fingers crossed that you'll follow up, directs you to the Internet for more.

Proud nerds will be entertained by a cameo by Wil Wheaton (the teenaged crew member on the *Star Trek: The Next Generation* TV show) and a series of well-known Internet free speech activists playing *Dungeons And Dragons* in a yurt.

But Marcus Yallow is also interested in

old-style tech: Doctorow uses his protagonist to showcase his own zen-like obsession with how to make the perfect cup of cold-brewed coffee.

This is not a subtle book. It's about a small group of tech-savvy freedom fighters valiantly fighting against dystopia.

"Once upon a time, my government turned my city into a police state...."

"I decided that the problem wasn't the system, but who was running it. Bad guys had gotten into places of high office. We needed good apples. I worked my butt off to get people to vote for good apples. We had elections. We installed the kind of apples everyone agreed would be the kind of apples we could be proud of...."

"And then, well, the good apples turned out to act pretty much exactly like the bad apples. Oh, they had reasons. There were emergencies. Circumstances.... But there were always emergencies, weren't there? .... when would the emergencies finally end?"

Power corrupts, and the emergencies are used for nefarious ends. The thousands upon thousands of Yallow's leaked documents are filled with tales of torture, kidnappings, secret surveillance (including of elementary school children), and of lobbyists sneaking through laws that will soak the poor for the benefit of the already very, very rich.

Not surprisingly, various people want that data key back. And they set out to find Yallow, who in turn spends a lot of time considering and refining his ideas

## Toby Keith: One of country music's most prolific writers

Toby Keith has impressive work ethic in his career and as a businessman. The singer/songwriter puts out one album a year and tours every summer, all while running enterprises like his restaurants, his horse ranch and his record label.

Actually, he is one of the most consistent recording artists and touring draws of his era as he continues ranking as one of the genre's top grossing live performers. Forbes ranked him as the top-earning country artist of 2012.

With his new album titled *Drinks After Work*, Toby Keith has brought his fans, brand new music available in 10-track standard and 13-track in an awesome ZinePak Deluxe Edition of the album.

Keith is the sole producer for the new record and main songwriter with credit on nine of 10 tracks. His longtime collaborators Scotty Emerick, Bobby Pinson and Rivers Rutherford return as co-writers on many songs.

Each year, the bunch of songs he wrote, are different from the previous ones, this year's batch, found on *Drinks After Work* is definitely among some of his best work.

Devoted fans should consider investing in the Deluxe "ZinePak Edition," a Walmart exclusive that also includes two drink coasters and a 64-page magazine with exclusive interviews and photos, cocktail recipes and song lyrics.

Toby Keith is entering a third decade of making great country music. The singer is one of very few hitmakers to pen the majority of his hit songs. Keith's blue-collar songwriting and attitude as well as his baritone drawl are well established and easily recognizable.

Early in his career, vulnerable songs about love and heartbreak were his signature style. Later, the Oklahoman's patriotic fibre became very evident, and now it seems like rowdy drinking songs are serving him well. For his devoted fans, most of *Drinks After Work* will be both refreshingly new and comfortably familiar.

This album is dedicated to the memory of Chuck Goff, Keith's longtime bandleader-bass player. "He will live on forever in our thoughts and in our performances. We miss ya, Shmudlo," you can read in the booklet.

The song "Chuckie's Gone," is Toby Keith's honest and poignant memorial for Goff, who died last February in a car accident. This tribute is powerful, meaningful and emotional and one of the best songs on this new release.

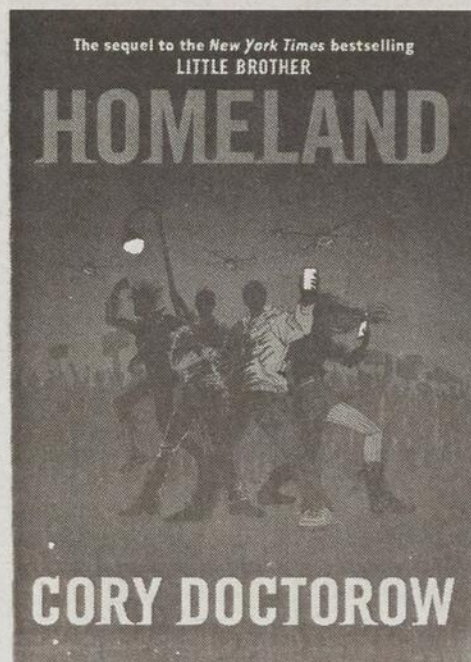
If 52-year-old Toby Keith has learned anything since the release of his first albums, it is to know what his fans like and stick to the winning formula. As expected from a traditionalist, most of the album is driven by big hooks and country guitar. However, here Keith takes some different avenues stylistically, but nothing drastic.

His first single released was the title track "Drinks After Work" while "Shut Up And Hold On" is the current song on the radio. Written with Bobby Pinson, the song is pure Toby Keith. It's a fun little party song and is perfectly paired with the happy successful title track.

Both of these songs find the singer going places musically he has rarely gone before with such good results.

Doris Lessing

Writer Doris Lessing — born in Iran, brought up in Zimbabwe, later residing in Britain — died this month at 94.

When she found out a few years ago, from a reporter, that she'd won the Nobel Prize for Literature, she responded with an expletive. (Later, she announced: "I'm 88 years old and they can't give the Nobel to someone who's dead, so I think they were probably thinking they'd probably better give it to me now before I've popped off.")

Her biographer, Michael Holroyd, called her work "outstandingly rich and innovative... [her themes] universal and international... They ranged from the problems of post-colonial Africa to the politics of nuclear power, the emergence of a new woman's voice and the spiritual dimensions of 20th-century civilisation. Few writers have as broad a range of subject and sympathy.

"She is one of those rare writers whose work crosses frontiers, and her impressively large output constitutes a chronicle of our time. She has enlarged the territory both of the novel and of our consciousness." Exactly.

is filled with small-town nostalgia and it also showcases what a talented singer Toby Keith is while he delivers with emotional savvy, a tear-jerking ballad with "The Other Side of Him."

Nobody in country music could probably get away with a song such as "Show Me What You're Working With" but Toby Keith does it easily.

The singer also effectively uses good, old-fashioned country storytelling when he pays tribute to hard-working farmers with "Hard Way to Make an Easy Living" while "Last Living Cowboy" offers old-time fiddle, dobro and banjo. "He ain't rode off into the sunset yet, naw/he's still kickin' 'round," sings Keith.

Toby Keith is at his best when turning phrases and showing off a quick wit and many of his songs offer just that. The luckless story song "I'll Probably Be Out Fishin'" has an easy come, easy go feel that you will enjoy.

There's also the R&B-flavoured "Little Miss Tear Stain" in which Toby Keith tries to get back with a former girlfriend. He has a born storyteller's knack for capturing the moment when he sings "Could we ever get back together?" he asks here, "Or is never still a good time to call?"

Another one of the album's best songs is exclusive to the Deluxe Edition. "Call a Marine," his hilarious tribute to leathernecks but mostly a salute to the hardworking marines out there. It showcases the kind of "talking" song recitations that used to be

very popular in country music (no it's not rap).

Finally the Deluxe Edition closes with Keith and pal Sammy Hagar crooning a cover of Jimmy Buffett's "Margaritaville." The duet also appears on the Red Rocker's new album Sammy Hagar & Friends.

Toby is one of country music's most prolific writers and the man most certainly knows what works for his audience. If you like Toby you will want to pick up a copy of the Deluxe version as the three bonus tracks are definitely worth the price.

will take on the defending national champions in Saturday's Vanier Cup at Université Laval Stadium.

The host Rouge et Or will be in search of their fifth national title. The game kicks off Saturday at 1 p.m. local as the sec-

ond- and third-ranked teams, both undefeated at 11-0, do battle.

The Dinos and Rouge et Or both enter the Vanier Cup undefeated, marking just the fifth time in the 49-year history of the championship game that

both combatants go in undefeated. Both are looking to become the 14th CIS program to complete an undefeated season, a feat last accomplished by Laval in 2010. It's the fourth meeting in the last six years between the Dinos and Rouge et

Or, with Laval taking all three previous meetings.

The Dinos are 7-16 on the road all-time in the postseason, with the last away win coming in the 2009 Uteck Bowl in Halifax against Saint Mary's.

## Local hero Audette leads QMJHL over Russian All-Stars

Before Wednesday night's Subway Super Series contest, Sherbrooke Phoenix general manager Patrick Charbonneau said about Daniel Audette, "I can't wait to see what he does tonight."

His protégé did not disappoint, as Audette's two-point performance led the QMJHL to a 4-3 win over Team Russia at the Sports Palace. The 17-year-old sniper, the youngest member of Team QMJHL, had a veritable coming-out party, as he impressed throughout the game.

"Daniel was very good. He played with a lot of confidence, using his speed and skills, and going to the net," said Benoit Groulx, head coach of the Gatineau Olympiques and Team QMJHL. "We could tell this

morning that he was ready for the game. I'm really happy for him."

"It went well," said Audette, a master of understatement. "I started off with a goal and the rest of the game, my line played great and we came out with the win, so that's what counts."

Coming on the heels of their 3-2 win in Hull on Monday night, Wednesday gave the QMJHL a sweep of their two games in the series, only the fourth time in the 11-year history of the event that Team QMJHL has swept the Russians. The QMJHL is now 12-7-3 all-time in the series.

"You want to make sure you put a good show on the ice and that you're competing," said Groulx. "For me, winning both games is huge because that gives respect to our league. Having the last three Memorial Cups won [by the QMJHL], that's

good for our league, so I'm happy."

That sentiment was echoed by league Commissioner Gilles Courteau, who tweeted his congratulations to the team after Wednesday night's win.

Audette opened the scoring at 3:11 of the first period, much to the delight of the 3,302 fans in attendance, as he charged to the net to pick up a rebound off Laurent Dauphin's wraparound attempt. Dauphin had stolen the puck in the Russian zone to set the play up.

"Dauphin made an excellent pass in front of the net, and I was just there to tap it in," said Audette.

After Dauphin was ejected for a check from behind on Viktor Baldaev, the Russians took advantage of the five-minute power-play to tie the game on a goal by Mark Skutar. Anthony Mantha put the QMJHL back in

front with a power-play marker of his own at 16:24, but Igor Rudenkov pulled the Russians back level with only 8.2 seconds left in the period.

The QMJHL came out stronger in the second period, dominating the play for the first half of the period. Chris Clapperton of the Blainville-Boisbriand Armada put the QMJHL up on top at 4:33 of the second on a deflection, but the Russians responded at 9:58 on a goal by Ivan Barbashev against the run of play.

"We wanted to make sure we do the right things and keep going. We thought that having the puck behind their net was a good plan for us to create offence," said Groulx. "So [the plan] was to be smart with the puck and put the puck in the right place on the ice."

The game-winner came at 12:26 of the third, as Anthony

Auclair finished off a nice passing play. Nikolas Brouillard and Audette picked up the assists.

Sébastien Auger of the Saint John Sea Dogs made 22 saves to pick up the win, while Igor Shesterkin made 37 saves for the Russians, who were outshot 41-25. The QMJHL was 1-for-4 on the power-play, while the Russians were 1-for-6.

The six-game series continued on Thursday night in Oshawa, Ont., as the Russians took on Team OHL and resumes next week in Sudbury before heading to Alberta for games in Lethbridge and Red Deer.

Audette, meanwhile, rejoins the Phoenix for their games against Rouyn-Noranda and Val d'Or this weekend with a ringing endorsement from Groulx.

"He got the first star tonight, and it's not the last honour he will receive in his career. We'll see what he does later."

## Emmy award winner Terry Tompkins lives healthy to combat stress

Have you ever wondered how some people manage to stay healthy and fit despite dealing with extensive travel and work schedules? While many others can't seem to find the time to work out, or have the fortitude to maintain a healthy diet, some of the busiest and most stressed among us find a way to get it done.

Terry Tompkins is a good example of this.

When it comes to having a positive attitude and trying to combine a busy career and an active lifestyle, look no further than 52-year-old Torontonian Tompkins, an Emmy award-winning producer/composer. Tompkins won an Emmy in 2009 for best original song, children's or animated category for *FETCH*.

For 10 years he has been a partner with Egg Plant Productions - an award-winning Canadian production company. He began his career as a music producer and writer for the critically acclaimed Canadian band, *Lost & Profound*.

Tompkins says eating healthy and staying fit can be a challenge at times, especially being on the road often. However, he takes his workout routine seriously and always tries to incorporate them into his busy schedule.

In a phone interview from his Toronto office, Tompkins offered a slice of how he stays healthy while on the road. He also talked about his latest project - *Hollywood Death Trip* - a documentary on unsolved celebrity deaths.

Brunswick. I was on vacation and I have a place there. The time being away was effective and now I am ready," chuckled Tompkins, adding, "A typical day for me while in production is lots of travel, long hours that can be stressful."

Tompkins shared with a laugh the role which coffee plays in helping. Further, "I take vitamin C a couple of times per day, I work out 4-5 days per week on the bike and do weights in the hotel fitness gym," he said.

Currently in the middle of making a record, he says, "Cardio helps your mind and sets the tone for your day. Foods like

sushi, seafood, are brain food," laughed Tompkins.

Tompkins' company, Eggplant Television, just sold a one-hour special - 'Hollywood Death Trip' to E! Television - a U.S. top global destination for all things pop culture. Tompkins is the show writer/producer and Scott Michaels is the host. The show concept was created by Tompkins and stars famed celebrity death expert Scott Michaels (*Dearly Departed Tours*) and actress Danielle Harris (*Halloween, Hallows Eve, Hatchet 2 and 3*).

The show essentially is a behind-the-

scenes view of L.A.'s most famous tragedies. That includes probing the deaths of *Sons of Anarchy* actor Johnny Lewis and actress Brittany Murphy.

"The show follows an investigative format," Tompkins noted. "We wanted the show to be both creepy and fun, while still investigating conspiracy theories around the deaths of the famous," he said, adding, "we wanted to create a show which unveiled the mysteries surrounding celebrity deaths."

*Hollywood Death Trip* features Michaels, along with Halloween scream Queen Harris. The feedback from the network has been nothing short of positive. "The ratings said we rock," Tompkins said, adding, "I also had an interest in true crime and the dark side of things. The target audience would be anyone interested in celebrity sensation or interested in a crime show." The show will also air in Canada, but has yet to confirm a date.

No matter where Tompkins travels may take him, he is motivated to stay healthy, maintain his fitness and keep hydrated. He is an example of someone who makes the best of a situation and lives the cliché: 'You want something done, you ask a busy person.'

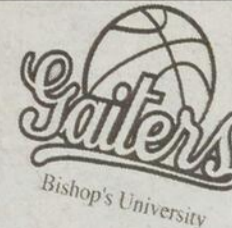
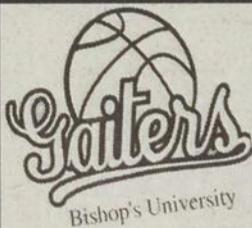

## Annie's Mailbox

Dear Annie: I recently moved into an apartment with a longtime friend. We both have dogs, but I was misled about hers. He is 15 months old and not trained.

My roommate has no time for the dog. She takes college classes and works two part-time jobs. The dog usually sits in a crate all day. She rarely takes him out and doesn't feed him regularly. When she does take him out, she is too tired to exercise him, which means he goes nuts in the apartment, peeing everywhere and chewing up the furniture — which is mine. He tried to bite me last week. He also barks incessantly, and her solution is to put a muzzle on him. My roommate takes no responsibility and blames me, saying I am making the dog uncomfortable.

I feel so bad for this animal. I've asked her repeatedly to spend more time with the dog and train him, but she hasn't. I cannot live in my own apartment. Now we have a ruined friendship and eight months left on a lease. Help! — Dogged Out

Dear Dogged: It is unfair to you that this animal is not trained, but we would consider it abuse to keep the dog in a crate all day, not exercising, feeding or disciplining him appropriately. Present your roommate with a bill for the ruined furniture, and then re-

port her to the humane society. She is not capable of caring for this animal. The friendship may be over, but you can still protect the dog.

Dear Annie: I have lupus, but because I usually look OK, people assume I'm doing fine. I am part of a small group of Christian ladies that meets monthly. Often, I'm unable to attend because I'm not well. I notify our group's coordinator and tell her specifically what is wrong that day — headache, fatigue, achiness, etc. — so that the ladies can pray for me. No one has ever called to check on me afterward.

Our group has provided meals for families when one woman had emergency surgery and two others had bouts with cancer. Yet, no one has ever offered to bring my family a meal. My husband's job limits the time he can assist me. Many days, we order takeout because I don't have the energy to cook.

The women know this, but I'm an outgoing, positive person, so they don't see the pain I endure daily. I'm thinking of leaving the group because it causes me stress, but they are otherwise wonderful women. I think they simply don't understand. Am I wrong to feel this way? — Sick and Confused

Dear Sick: There is no right or wrong to how you

feel. Lupus is an autoimmune disease that damages joints, skin, kidneys, blood, heart and lungs. The women may not understand the severity of your illness. But the other part of the problem is that the disease is ongoing. Emergency surgeries and bouts with cancer are finite. It's easier to bring meals when you know it won't be forever. You could voice your hurts to these women, or you could look for support elsewhere. Also visit the Lupus Foundation of America at lupus.org.

Dear Annie: This is in response to "Little Doctor," the ob-gyn who is too "busy and forgetful" to remember patients' names and uses an all-purpose term of endearment, claiming it makes the patient "feel relaxed and comfortable."

I am also a busy doctor, but I address each patient by name and also review their medications, lab test results and notes from the last visit. I can't imagine anyone could feel comfortable and relaxed knowing the doctor was so busy and forgetful that he calls you by a generic endearment. It is disrespectful and a red flag. How can such a busy, forgetful doctor be alert and responsive to issues that pertain to a patient's health? — Conscientious Doctor

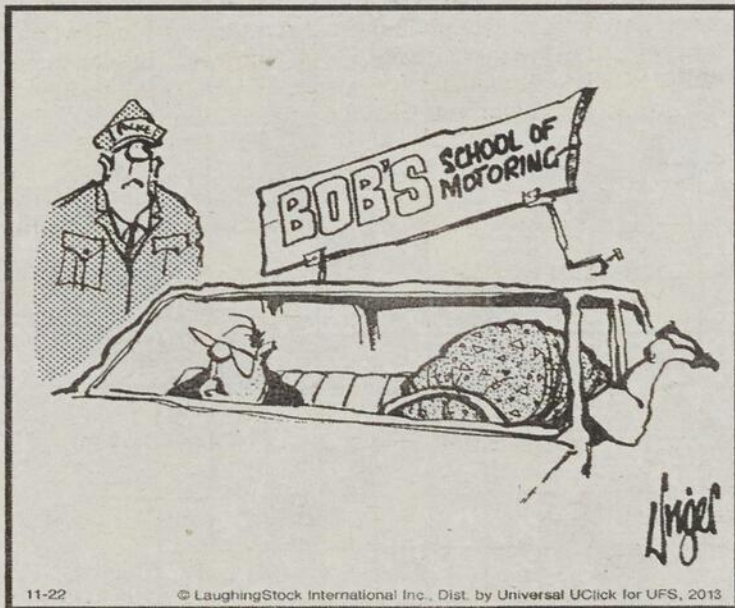

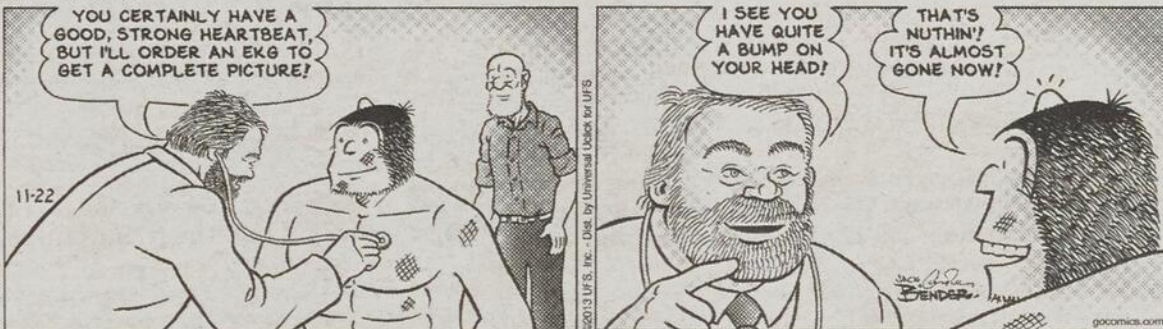

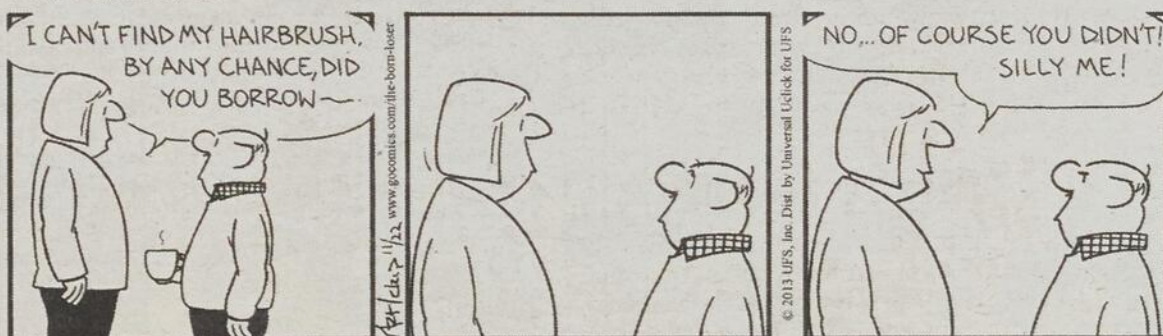

## More bridge words from the antipodes

New Zealand Bridge is published six times a year in a small-page format. It contains the usual mix of tournament reports, quizzes, hands to bid with your partner and compare your final contracts with top players, and a bidding panel with experts from around the globe who answer six problems.

Most magazines like to concentrate on accurate bidding and play, but do include some errors — as in this example from New Zealand Bridge.

How would you analyze the bidding? West's opening bid showed 9-12 points. East's two-club response was Stayman. And South's two-no-trump intervention indicated at least 5-5 in the minors.

Against three no-trump, West led a low heart. How many tricks do you think declarer took?

Down Under they like weak no-trumps. East sensibly used Stayman to play in two of a major. South's overcall was crazy — his hand was far too weak. When an opponent opens with a weak no-trump, you must bid constructively, not destructively, because your side could have the high-card values for game. North's raise to three no-trump was iffy with no spade stopper, but since he thought his partner had at least opening values, it was reasonable.

West led the heart two. East won with her queen and shifted to a low spade. West won and returned the heart jack. This allowed the defenders to take nine major-suit tricks. South discarded badly, keeping only two clubs in each hand. So when East now led a club, West took the last four tricks in the suit for down nine!
