HALIFAX—The chief city, and capital of Nova Scotia, is situated near the head of Chebucto Bay, township and county of Halifax. It was called Chedabucto or Chebucto until 1749, when Governor Cornwallis proclaimed it as the seat of Government, and gave it its present name in honor of the Earl of Halifax, an active promoter of the enterprise which resulted in founding the city. It has a noble harbor and extensive fortifications. The harbor of Halifax has been pronounced by the highest authorities as "one of the best in the world." It is easy of access for ships of every class, is capacious enough to afford anchorage for the navies of all Europe, and is so situated as to afford protection from every wind. It runs over 15 miles inland, and after passing the city, and narrowing considerably about three quarters of a mile above the city, suddenly expands into Bedford Basin, a beautiful sheet of water covering an area of nine square miles, completely shut in from the sea and affording good anchorage throughout, with from four to thirty fathoms of water. Halifax is fortified by the citadel, situated on the hill rising back of the city, some

250 feet above the level of the sea, by St George's Island, in the centre of the harbor, McNab's Island, York Redoubt, Fort Clarence, Fort Ogilvie, the Prince of Wales tower, several masked batteries on both sides of the harbor, and Martello towers at Mauder's Beach and Sambro Island. The city extends over two miles north and south, and does not exceed three quarters of a mile in width. Some of its streets are exceedingly well built upon, with handsome granite and freestone structures. The Province building, on Granville and Hollis streets, is built of brown freestone, and is well adapted for legislative purposes. The various provincial offices are situated on the ground floor and the two houses of parliament, committee rooms, and legislative library, on the second floor. The new post office is also a handsome freestone building; it was built several years since, but has not yet been occupied, owing to a dispute between the Dominion and Provincial governments. The Government house, Admiralty house, Dalhousie college, Insane asylum, Wellington barracks, hospital, penitentiary, and city market are the remaining public buildings. The Queen's dockyard, on Upper Water street, is an important establishment; it contains workshops, warehouses, and stores of various descriptions, besides very commodious buildings for the residence of officers and workmen. Halifax is an important military and naval station, and it and Quebec are the only places in Canada where British troops are now retained. It is the military headquarters of the Dominion of Canada, and the chief naval station for the whole of British North America and the West Indies. It is also the seat of two bishops, the Anglican Bishop of Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, and the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Halifax, and has twenty-three places of public worship, some of them very handsome structures. There are in the city seven banks, including a savings bank, several gold-mining and other joint stock companies, two news rooms, four public libraries, a public museum, and several other institutions. The Club house and some of the Banking houses are worthy of note for the beauty of their architecture. The head offices of the Nova Scotia railway and the Nova Scotia Electric Telegraph Co. are situated here. The citizens of Halifax look eagerly forward to the completion of the great Intercolonial railway, which is not only to give them ready access to the chief markets of Canada, but make their city the grand winter terminus of the Dominion. The commerce of Halifax is considerable. In 1869 the exports amounted to \$3,169,548, and the imports \$7,202,504. Duties collected \$972,652.27. The value of assessed property in 1870 was \$16,753,872. Distant from St. John, N.B., 189 miles, from Pictou 113 miles, from Rivière du Loup 530 miles, from Montreal 656 miles, from Ottawa 786 miles, from Portland 419 miles. Mail daily. Population in 1749, 1400; 1794, 8,961; 1818, 11,156; 1827, 14,439; 1870, about 30,000.
