When memory fails the file card can take over

One of the good things about keeping records when it comes to wine is that when memory fails the file card takes over. And believe me, after two thousand different wines pass the palate, a file card for each is not only good to have it is a necessity.

My own system is relatively simple. Each time I taste a new wine — and usually when I taste the same wine some time later or a of a different vintage — I record the name, bottler, price, year, alcoholic strength and any comments I feel worth making.

The card is then filed alphabetically in a metal box where it is im-

wines both of which I tasted a number of years ago and both of which I found initially less than satisfactory.

The first, an Italian red by the name of Sangiovese dei Colli Pesaresi, had been a bit rough and a trifle acidic when I had originally tried it in 1983. The 1984 vintage that I tried this week, however, is a deep red in color with a sound, fruity bouquet and a pleasant taste. At \$5.95 per bottle it has increased in price by \$1.45 but still remains a good buy and, in my opinion, the equal of Rosso Piceno the other DOC red wine from the Marches area of

Italy.

The second wine I re-sampled this week was a Hungarian Chardonnay produced by the state-owned Monimpex. This particular wine I first tried over a year ago and found to be very green with far too much acidity and little or no bouquet. Despite this, I made a note to try the wine at a future date since it is often the case with state monopolies that production is often subject to inconsistency.

Thankfully the note I made to myself was indeed correct since the 1984 version was much better balanced with a pleasant, though undistinguished, taste. And at \$5.10

a bottle it was well worth the second effort.

Both of these wines had improved either because of better production methods or because of a better growing year. And both deserved a second chance. Yet without my notes I would surely have only remembered the initial disappointment and likely not have taken the time to return to either one.

Unfortunately, my notes also tend to remind me of how prices have changed over the years — a function of dubious merit at best. Cheers!

Walker's paintings finally come 'home'

QUEBEC (CP) — Horatio Walker, the Ontario-born painter whose sentimental portraits of French-Canadian habitant life brought him widespread acclaim, finally has an exhibition in the place he came to call home.

The Quebec Museum of Art has put together an exhibit spanning the 50-year career of Walker, whose canvasses before the First World War commanded some of the highest prices on the continent.

The show of 40 oil paintings and dozens of water colors and sketches was assembled from 30 galleries, universities and private collections. And it is the first time a collection of his works has been exhibited in Quebec City.

The exhibit, which runs until Nov. 23, will travel to the Michael Canadian Collection in Kleinberg, north of Toronto, next February, and to the New Brunswick

Museum of Art in Saint John in June.

Walker — who was to know early success, as well as enormous personal misfortune — was born in the small southwestern Ontario town of Listowel in 1858. But from his early 20s, he regularly spent his summers in the Quebec City region — mainly on the picturesque Ile d'Orleans, an island in the middle of the St. Lawrence.

MADE ROUNDS

He began his career in Toronto as a photographer's apprentice, coloring prints — work that was considered essential to any artist wishing to learn about color and composition. But by the age of 20, he was confident enough to take up painting full-time and was making the rounds of New York art dealers.

As an artist, Walker soon be-

came identified with the American Barbizon movement, which had a huge following in the United States in the late 19th century.

The style took its name from a mid-19th century school of French painters who lived in the village of Barbizon outside Paris. It extolled honest toil and the simple virtues of farm life.

Walker adapted the style to his studies of Quebec habitant life — and his favorite subjects were the farmers of Ile d'Orleans.

"The island was really Walker's Barbizon," noted David Karel, an art history professor at Laval University who prepared the collection. "It was a place where rural, traditional life continued much later than anywhere else in Quebec."

Walker moved to New York in 1885 where his fortunes were taken in hand by a renowned art dealer, Newman Montross.

HIGH PRICES

At the peak of his career, his paintings were selling for as much as \$10,000 — "a fortune in those days," noted Karel. Few Canadians, even fewer Canadian museums, could afford his works. Walker only produced about five major works a year, which fuelled demand for his paintings.

As the modern world intruded into the Quebec countryside, Walker retreated increasingly to the studio on Ile d'Orleans, setting up permanent residence there after 1918.

He became a familiar sight as he roamed the island with his tweed cap and luxurious moustache. He developed a special rapport with the farmers with whom he conversed in his accented French.

Walker's portrayal of a bucolic existence in which no cars or machinery existed fell out of favor after the First World War.

Prima ballerina Hart seeks new challenges

WINNIPEG (CP) — She has grown from a tearful young dance student to an internationally-acclaimed ballerina, lauded by critics from New York to Bulgaria.

She has made guest appearances with the National Ballet of Canada, the Sadler's Wells Royal Ballet in London and the Korean National Ballet to name a few.

Her performances with her resident company, the Royal Winnipeg Ballet, have helped put this prairie city on the artistic map.

But Evelyn Hart is restless. She is entering her 11th season as a principal dancer with the Winnipeg company and it's time for another challenge.

This season, Hart will be given the opportunity to perform as a principal dancer for both the Winnipeg company and the National Ballet of Canada — a unique move for a Canadian dancer.

"I consider it a really big step," she said in an interview Wednesday at the company's studios.

"It's a big responsibility.

There's a lot on my plate this year."

WANTS MORE ROLES

It's no secret that Hart wants to do more classical pieces and the limitations imposed by a small company like the Royal Winnipeg Ballet don't give her that chance.

During her appearances with both companies, the 30-year-old dancer will perform five classical pieces, including Romeo and Juliet, Giselle and Swan Lake. She will leave for Toronto on Oct. 13 following the Winnipeg company's opening season run of Firebird and Tchiakovsky's Pas de Deux.

"I'm excited about the possibility that this year I will have the combination of both companies and I'll have touched Swan Lake and Giselle and Romeo and Juliet, which basically is just a ballerina's dream," she said as leotard-clad dancers hurried past on their way to rehearsals.

"It's not a lot of performances but I still get the work and I still touch those ballets. One company just can't possibly have that in their repertoire all the time."

Hart, a petite figure in a burgundy leotard, stopped short of saying whether the stint with the National Ballet would be permanent.

PROVIDES CHANCE

Instead, she said she saw it as a chance to work on her weak points and lack of self-confidence.

"Challenge is not necessarily comfortable," she said. "Some people find that they have to have challenge. Sometimes I sort of feel if I don't challenge myself now, I'll never do it."

Hart, who has made her name in the classics, said she also wants to step aside and give others in the Winnipeg company a chance to prove themselves.

"Sometimes when I'm in my own company, I feel the stress and strain of being (a dancer) of my stature," she said.

"Partly, too, I wanted to remove myself from that situation a little bit in the hope that it would ease the tension for everybody."

The art of St. Mark's — A Township's treasure



St. Mark's chapel at Bishop's University is considered one of the finest college chapels in the nation. Built in the monastic style — seating for the congregation facing inwards towards the main aisle — the chapel contains many examples of Christian art including beautiful stained glass windows, exquisite wood carvings and a fascinating eagle which dominates the podium from which the gospel is read.

Originally constructed in 1857, the chapel was enlarged in 1875 and again altered in 1898. At this time the carved oak stalls and their accompanying figures were

constructed by French-Canadian craftsmen and the chapel took on its present look.

A careful examination of the many carvings shows that no two are in fact the same but each bears its own particular witness to the skill, care and vision of the individual worker.

In this montage, Record photographer Perry Beaton captures some of the more fascinating aspects of the wood and metal work found in St. Mark's giving but a hint of what can surely be considered one of the Eastern Townships' genuine treasures.

Rocker Ian Hunter slowing down at 40 plus

TORONTO (CP)—When a penniless dropout named Ian Hunter auditioned for a fledgling English rock band in the late 1960s, he wasn't just fulfilling an adolescent dream — it was his way out.

"I had come out of the factories and there was no alternative to playing rock 'n' roll except digging holes in the road," says Hunter, who still looks like a classic '70s rock star with long frizzy hair and trademark sunglasses.

The band became Mott the Hoople, whose members teetered on shiny platform boots and were

firmly ahead of their glittery competitors on the strength of Hunter's songwriting.

They also had a powerhouse sound that could form a bridge between heavy metal and Bob Dylan. Hunter's rebelliousness fuelled anthems like All the Way From Memphis and his working-class accent gave All the Young Dudes its credible bite.

Now over 40 (he won't say how much), Hunter has been working at a much slower pace since he left the band in the mid-'70s and has recorded a number of acclaimed

solo albums.

He performs at his leisure and continues to write songs, including Ships, which was adaptable enough to become a hit for schlockmeister Barry Manilow. He also writes soundtracks for movies, including Teachers and the new Michael J. Fox film, The Light of Day.

He's currently on a short tour of Central and Eastern Canada with rock veteran Roy Young, who played piano with Ringo Starr in Germany before The Beatles were formed and later with Eric Clapton, Ray Charles and George Harrison. Hunter and Young are travelling with a brass section and both perform songs from throughout their careers.

Despite the tour, Hunter said he no longer "needs" to be a rock star.

And he can't be bothered with the stress and strain of trying to be an '80s star.

"That league is full of eccentricities that I no longer want to be bothered with," he said. "I feel at lot more at ease with myself these days. I don't really need that constant jag in the arm from audiences all the time."

With his soundtrack work and royalties trickling in — Willie Nelson recently recorded his song The Other Man — Hunter says he doesn't have to compromise his standards. Even if it means going without a record deal.

"The whole trip is to make this business work for you, not to have to work for them because that's when you have to drop your knickers and I never have nor want to."

While he says the music industry

"has gone bad," he says musicians — including him — are to blame because few artists are writing songs with substance that will also suit radio.

"When there's a lull in the recording industry, it's usually because the musicians aren't in charge. The record companies are allowed to take over. And they make a mess of it because they are not the people making the music."

"It's the musicians' fault, because — apart from Prince — no one is telling them what to do."

Crocodile Dundee stays on top

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — The Down Under comedy-romance Crocodile Dundee stayed on top of the box office heap in North America for the third consecutive week, with a newcomer, Francis Coppola's Peggy Sue Got Married, nipping at its heels.

Dundee, Australian Paul Hogan's first film, earned a weekend gross of \$10.6 million US to bring its earnings over three weeks to \$32.8 million.

Peggy Sue Got Married, star-

ring Kathleen Turner, vaulted to second place with a gross of \$6.9 million on its first weekend.

Third spot was held by another new release, Jumpin' Jack Flash starring Whoopi Goldberg, which earned \$6 million.

Another new release, Deadly Friend, grossed \$3.8 million on its first weekend to earn the fourth spot. Matthew Laborteaux plays a college student trying an experiment similar to Dr. Frankenstein's, with similar results.

Tough Guys took fifth during its second week of release, grossing \$3.4 million last weekend for a total of \$9.3 million.

The No. 6 slot went to long-playing winner, Top Gun, in its 22nd week on the silver screen. The Tom Cruise film collected \$2.7 million last week for a total gross so far of \$154.1 million.

Columbia's Stand by Me came in seventh, grossing \$2.05 million last weekend for a total of \$33.6 million in 10 weeks.

An excursion into the dark recesses of the mind

In the Agatha Christie tradition, some of the finest purveyors of British crime continue to be female, with P.D. James and Ruth Rendell heading the list of ladies whose talent for transcribing murder and malevolence is unequalled on this side of the Atlantic. Rendell has more than twenty-five titles to her credit, including a baker's dozen featuring Chief Inspector Wexford, plus four short story gatherings, one of which, *The New Girl Friend* merited the award of an Edgar from the Mystery Writers of America in 1984 for best short story. For the uninitiated *Live Flesh* is a perfect place to jump into the parade of prime fiction from the clever Rendell because it does manage to carry a great deal of the psychological weight that makes the James books so enjoyable.

The focus in *Live Flesh* is on a social misfit named Victor Jenner, one of those eccentrics that the English love to learn about, who has been raping defenceless women in secluded parks on the fringes of the sprawling London suburbs that aid him in his stealth and anonymity. As the book opens, Jenner has been thwarted in a rape attempt and has been cornered in the flat of a young woman, with police Detective Sergeant David Fleetwood attempting to quietly talk Jenner into surrendering the hostage and dropping what he believes to be only a replica of a German Luger. Jenner fires the gun, wounding Fleetwood in the spine, dooming him to a life as a paraplegic, and the novel then leaps ahead in time to the release of Jenner some ten years later.

Hereafter, Rendell's talent for the minutiae of the psychological thriller becomes evident as Jenner's life unfolds in strange patterns, eventually bringing him into a weird relationship with his victim, Fleetwood, and the man's female companion Clare.

Along the way, Rendell treats us to some fine writing which reveals the odd lifestyle of Victor Jenner: his overpowering phobia for all varieties of turtles; his knockabout existence in rooming houses located in outlying London towns such as Solent Gardens, North Ealing and Theydon Bois; a delightfully bizarre but believable visit to his maiden aunt who lives in absolute squalor but whose upstairs rooms and closets contain drawers and handbags jammed with thick packets of five, ten, twenty and fifty Pound notes, while her downstairs floor space is littered with thousands of magazines from which she has clipped articles about the wayward nephew; and all of these quirks and oddities about Jenner and his obsessions form a part of the hauntingly believable portrait of a criminal mind that Rendell presents in *Live Flesh*. The carefully controlled revelation of Victor Jenner's twisted mind keeps the reader fully engrossed with this book and as his phobias and uncontrollable passions bubble to the surface it becomes evident that the ending of the novel will be as gruesome as it is inevitable. *Live Flesh* is an exciting excursion into the dark recesses of

the criminal mind, with loads of surface detail about London and its residents that will delight readers who demand some Raymond Chandler-like sociology along with their blood, mayhem and first-rate mystery writing.

Harlequin RADIO ROMANCES (CBS-EPIC)

Chronicling their seven year romance with the radio waves, Harlequin puts out a strange but attractive album of their biggest hits, plus one track that highlights the newest configuration of the band after the breakup of the original ensemble in 1984. George Belanger is the notable voice on the band's hits such as "Superstitious Feeling" or "Innocence", and he has decided to put together a totally new group with not a single hold-over from the band that began in 1979 to have a sting of eight hit singles from four albums. Not even Glen Willows with whom Belanger wrote all of the Harlequin hits has made the transition into the new Harlequin, and the songwriting on the recent pressing here is by Tom Cochrane & David Bendeth, with "(It's) No Mystery" kicking off this album of mixed nostalgia and fresh hopes.

Belanger's trademark vocals are here on "Thinking Of You", a tune lifted from the LOVE CRIMES album — "This song was acutally written in New York — Jack Douglas was beginning word on a secret project (John and Yoko's DOUBLE FANTASY album) — you'll notice it's a little Beatlesque — maybe osmosis?" says Belanger. And the Beatle analogy is not too far off the mark when the collective work of Harlequin is examined. They have a classic guitar band sound like the Beatles, Badfinger or Bread, with large harmonies and an integrated, spontaneous blend of vocals and instruments that reveals its strengths on the nine chart-toppers that are featured here.

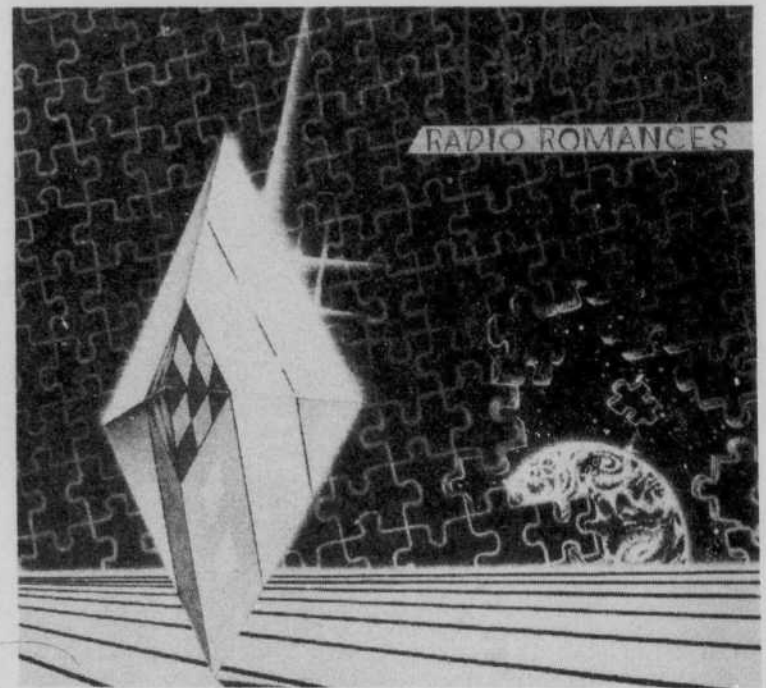
From "Innocence" with Paul

McCartney imitation "oohs", to the bridge on "I Dit It for Love" on which Belanger claims the tune almost goes into a polka — "You'll hear this guy in the background going 'Oomba, oomba, oomba'. Well, that's me, and it's the funniest thing I've ever recorded in my life" — the mark of a real Harlequin track is a careful balance between lyrics that tell a distinct story and guitar inserts that provide timely punctuation. Harlequin may never achieve the heights they soared to with their first four recording ventures, but RADIO ROMANCES is a valuable reminder of the fine music that was provided by this homegrown rock product.

Marti Jones MATCH GAME (A & M)

Her first album after the dissolution of her Akron, Ohio group colour Me Gone was a fine record titled "Unsophisticated Time", but this second recording venture with many of the same players is head and shoulders above the earlier work. Marti Jones chooses a number of superb songs on MATCH GAME, which are indeed matched with her distinctive voice, and then Mitch Easter and Don Dixon shape and direct a distinguished group of studio players such as Marshall Crenshaw, Paul Carrack and Vinnie Zummo, with a resulting quirky, catchy feel to this record similar to Easter's Let's Active and the work Easter and Don Dixon achieved with Georgia's underground rock raves, R.E.M. Marti does an eerie interpretation of Elvis Costello's "Just a Memory", and chooses two exciting tracks to get the album off to a memorable beginning: "We're Doing Alright", with Darlen Love helping on vocals, and "Chance of A Lifetime", written by Dwight Twilley, and a superb choice for a single from this Joni Mitchell for the eighties.

Song choices on side two are no less carefully selected, from Marshall Crenshaw's "Whenever You're On My Mind" with its tricky timing and strange layering of vocals over the barebones of Joe Jackson's band; or "Crusher", a Liam Sternberg song played with African water drums and delta blues slide guitars; or a song called from the Searchers' 1979 comeback album, "It's Too Late" or the lush string quartet that lends a Yesterday feel to a song that's a decade and a half old, once performed by Paul Rodgers and Free; or "Soul Love", a Bowie song from Ziggy Stardust. The oddly variable backing tracks would be nothing, however, were it not for the fact that Marti Jones has a compelling set of pipes and she really knows how to belt or croon, depending on the many moods created on MATCH GAME. Mark this one down as one of the most ambitious and pleasing albums of the waning year 1986.



VIDEO SCREENINGS

F/X (THORN-EMI/HBO VIDEO)

With the increasing importance placed on Special Effects (F/X) in movies these days, it was inevitable that someone would take the idea of hiring an F/X man to pull off a spectacular crime that would fool observers into thinking that what they had seen was totally real. If it happens that the party wishing to pull off the deception is the American government, through one of its clandestine operations such as the Witness Protection Program, then the scam becomes even more insidious. When transplanted British F/X expert Rollie Tyler (played by newcomer Bryan Brown) is approached by a secretive contact with a request that he rig a phoney murder of a mafia boss who will then be relocated and given witness protection, he decides to perform the special effects, with a degree of reluctance. Tyler, creator of such memorable film classics as "I dismember Momma", stages a believable hit on the mafia boss, Nick DeFranco, only to discover that the

government agency, headed by the ruthless Colonel Mason, has decided to bump him off as well to maintain total control of the affair. F/X turns into quite an exciting adventure/action film with car chases, double crosses and lots of good cops/bad cops conflicts and several intriguing plot twists that keep the film moving along at a breakneck pace. The fact that the evil Colonel Mason is played by Mason Adams, one of the most recognized mellifluous voices ever to hawk a product on television, detracts just a tad from the believability, but it's not enough to spoil the overall impression of F/X. Director Robert Mandel gets the most out of this predictable plot and the acting, particularly by Brian Dennehy as the good cop, is more than adequate. F/X is every bit as spectacular as the latest Bronson/Norris mindbender, but with a few wrinkles of plot to keep the viewer from feeling that he's wasting two hours on a orchestrated fireworks show. Sarah Hoblyn and pianist Tom Gordon present an afternoon's entertainment at Plymouth Trinity

United Church in Sherbrooke on Sunday, October 19 at 4p.m. The concert is also the first of a series

being planned for the church itself.

Soprano Sarah Hoblyn's career has earned her respect and admiration on both sides of the Atlantic, as well as in every genre of the singer's art. A powerful interpreter of opera, she brings intimacy to her performances of Lied and a fresh simplicity to the British and North American folksongs frequently included on her programmes. Reviews of her performances marvel equally at her vocal virtuosity and her dramatic delivery.

Like many singers before her, Sarah Hoblyn began her musical studies as a pianist. She is a graduate of the Guildhall School of Music (London), holding diplomas in both piano and singing. After several years of teaching, Mrs. Hoblyn began singing professionally. A recitalist throughout the United Kingdom, Mrs. Hoblyn was also featured in major opera and oratorio roles. Since immigrating to Canada, Sarah Hoblyn has sung with the St. Lawrence Choir and the Lakeshore Operatic Society. Her concert appearances have included solo recitals in the Music Through Worship series (Montreal), le Festival du Lac Massawippi (North Hatley, Québec) and Musique Chez Nous (Bishop's Uni-

versity). In 1985 she was appointed instructor of voice in the Department of Music at Bishop's University, Lennoxville, Québec.

Sarah Hoblyn's flexibility and dramatic power are well displayed in the programme selected for her fall 1986 tour. In addition to songs by Schubert, Fauré, and Britten, Mrs. Hoblyn will perform operatic excerpts by Puccini, Mozart, and Johann Strauss.

A versatile musician — performer and musicologist — Tom Gordon was born in Wisconsin where he took his early musical studies. After brief periods at the American Conservatory of Music in Chicago and Washington University in St. Louis, he pursued a Bachelor of Music degree in piano performance at Missouri State University, where he also earned a M.A. in Music History. In 1973 he left the States, settling in Toronto where he earned a Ph.D. in musicology from the University of Toronto. A music and art critic as well, Dr. Gordon has held academic appointments in Canada at the University of Toronto, the Ontario College of Art and Bishop's University in Lennoxville, Québec. His special interest in the music of the early twentieth century is the focus not only of his teaching and publication, but in his performance as well.

In addition to occasional appearances as a solo pianist, Dr. Gordon performs frequently in a duo-piano team with his wife, Mry O'Keefe. As an accompanist, he has performed with singers and instrumentalists throughout Canada and the United States.

John Carradine at 80: A Bohemian to the bitter end

LOS ANGELES (AP) — His hands are gnarled with arthritis and his walk is halting, but at 80 John Carradine's voice still rumbles with the deep authority he's given 500 films.

"That's right. I've made 500 movies," he said proudly during a recent visit from his San Diego home. "I never knew how many there were, but my manager asked the Screen Actors Guild, and that's what they told him."

It should be noted record books list approximately 225 feature movies for John Carradine. Yet he has also made many television appearances, so his claim of 500 films may be correct.

Many of them are highly forgettable: *Monster in the Closet*, *Billy the Kid vs. Dracula*, *The Astro-Zombies*, *The House of the Seven Corpses*.

SOME GREAT ONES

However, Carradine also has appeared in classics. What does he recall of *Stagecoach*?

"Duke — John Wayne. He sat on the floor of the stagecoach with a rifle across his lap. I got to know him well during the picture, and we played a lot of chess together. He beat me three out of five times," he said.

The *Grapes of Wrath*?

"Hank Fonda. In my first scene I

climbed out of a ditch and met him (as Tom Joad) just after he got out of prison. He did something with his cap — lifting it as if it was too small for him. I thought: What a hell of a piece of business! He was a great actor."

In both films and several others, Carradine worked under the brilliant, cantankerous John Ford.

"Surprisingly, I got along well with Ford," the actor recalled. "But you had to keep an eye on the old man; he was tricky — like telling the actors he was doing a rehearsal when he really was photographing the scene. He thought he got a better quality that way."

Carradine came to town to help launch his latest movie, *Revenge*, co-starring Pat Wayne, the late John Wayne's son. In the film, being released in videocassettes, Carradine plays "a pious old fraud," a senator who in reality heads a murderous devil-worship cult. It's that kind of movie.

NEW YORK BORN

He was born Richmond Reed Carradine in New York, the son of remarkable parents in artsy Greenwich Village.

"My father was an attorney, poet and painter who became the Associated Press correspondent in London," the actor said. "He died when I was four, but I still remem-

ber him. My mother was penniless, but she managed to put herself through medical school, and she became a noted surgeon."

A born bohemian, Carradine bummed his way across the United States, earning enough to eat by drawing sketches of people he met. A banana train brought him to Los Angeles, where he sought studio work as Peter Richmond. He became better known as the lean character who strolled Hollywood Boulevard in velvet suit and cape, spouting Shakespeare to no one in particular.

He made his film debut in 1930 with the talkie remake of *Tol'able David*. By 1935 he had become John Carradine, and his Mephistophelean face and glorious voice attracted the attention of John Ford and other directors. He became one of Hollywood's busiest character actors, but he always returned to his beloved Shakespeare, touring the country with his own company.

NO BIG MONEY

"I never made big money in Hollywood; I was paid in hundreds, the stars got thousands," he reflected.

Carradine's three marriages ended in divorce and produced five sons, of whom three have achieved notice as actors — David, Keith and Robert.

Success always a surprise for singer Lionel Richie

PHOENIX, Ariz. (AP)—“Outrageous.”

Lionel Richie's favorite word.

It's also the title of his new world tour and the best way to describe his meteoric music career and massive record sales.

The singer-songwriter has passed Paul McCartney, Stevie Wonder and Cole Porter for the most consecutive years of having a No. 1 song on the charts and is tied with Irving Berlin at nine. A record-setting 10th year appears certain with Dancing on the Ceiling, the title track of his new top-selling LP.

But to the soft-spoken native of Tuskegee, Ala., success always is something of a surprise.

“I can never get used to the idea of an album or a song going all the way to the top. That's still like

Christmas to me. I go out and celebrate,” Richie said in a recent interview before starting his 60-city American tour, which began in Phoenix.

Fifteen years with the Commodores produced 10 LPs and two No. 1 hits — Three Times a Lady in 1978 and Still in 1979 — plus such smash singles as Easy and Sail On. Richie also wrote the No. 1 single Lady for Kenny Rogers in 1980 and topped the charts with Endless Love in a duet with Diana Ross the following year.

PRODUCES HITS

As a solo artist, he's had five straight No. 1 songs starting with Truly in 1982 and followed in annual succession by All Night Long (All Night), Hello, We Are the World and Say You, Say Me.

Say You, Say Me also was on the White Knights movie soundtrack and earned the 37-year-old musician an Academy Award and a Golden Globe this year in the Best Song category.

He won six American Music Awards in 1985, two Grammys in each of the past two years and has been named ASCAP Writer of the Year the last three years in a row.

Dancing on the Ceiling was due out last December, yet didn't surface until mid-summer. Rumors circulated that Richie had writer's block.

“I wish it was something that simple,” he said. “I started the album right up through the We Are the World project. That was like an album by itself. But you cannot get involved with a program like that and walk away unaffected.

“I had written another album and I was all ready to put it out and was quite proud of it until my consciousness was raised by what was happening in the world. So I stopped the album and said, ‘I don't want to do those songs.’ I felt I needed to express what I felt the world was boxing itself into.”

EXPRESSES FEELINGS

The end result was the new album, which features such upbeat ballads as Love Will Conquer All and the reggae-inspired Se La.

“What you hear in the lyrics is basically what Lionel Richie is about. Each album is a documentation of my life at that particular time. I'm pretty much an open book,” he said.

A live album and cable-TV concert may emerge from the world tour. Richie has also been

asked to do a Miami Vice episode and is searching for a movie deal.

An economics and accounting major at Tuskegee Institute, Richie planned to be an entertainment lawyer until the Commodores opened a 1971 concert for the Jackson Five.

“They came offstage after a 45-minute show and Michael had a check in his hand for \$108,000,” Richie said. “I never saw any real viable career in the music business until then. I just thought it was a bunch of guys having fun.”

Richie hoped the Commodores would become the black Beatles. “And they were. We had everything — ambitions, hit records. I had dreams and passed them about five years ago. I was going to retire happily as a very famous Commodore.”

Females on TV overrepresented?

MONTREAL (CP) — The image of women on television has improved “tremendously” — to the point that they are currently overrepresented in TV roles as professionals, says an NBC executive.

“One male executive has remarked that this year, (TV) is female-dominated to the point of sexism,” Bettye Hoffman, NBC's vice-president for program information resources, told a recent conference of the Association for the Study of Canadian Radio and Television.

Hoffman cited studies showing that 20 per cent of the roles played by television actresses portrayed professionals — a proportion that is higher than that found in real life and even higher than that por-

trayed by male actors.

And, women make up 36 per cent of prime-time television characters, she said, noting that such shows as Kate and Allie, Golden Girls and Hill Street Blues portray women as intelligent, competent and independent.

Most important, however, is that no television show ridicules the concept of sexual equality and that characters who do mock women's rights don't get away with it, she said.

The big hurdle for women in television today “is breaking through from middle management to top management,” she said, suggesting that the problem is the men holding those jobs are of an older generation that has no experience

working with women.

CREDITS COMMERCIALS

Also addressing the conference earlier this month on the “male-female equation in broadcasting” was Guy Fournier, vice-president in charge of programming at Quatre Saisons, Quebec's new private television network.

Fournier said the improved image of women was first reflected in commercials as a result of pressure from female consumers.

“I would say that television commercials reflected the change in women's situation faster than television itself,” Fournier said. “Advertisers react faster because they are very sensitive to the signal that the cash register sends them.”

Lemmon is in Israel for a two-week run of Eugene O'Neill's **Long Day's Journey into Night**, which opens in Tel Aviv this week after a stint in London.

Lemmon said the company will travel to Toronto next month to tape the three-hour play for cable television.

He plays the role of James Tyrone, an ex-matinee idol gone to seed with a morphine-addicted wife and a son dying of consumption.

SANTA MONICA, Calif. (AP)—Actress Heather Thomas went home from a California hospital after nearly a month of treatment for leg and knee injuries she suffered when struck by a car, a spokesman said Wednesday.

Thomas, co-star of the cancelled television series **The Fall Guy**, will continue to get physical therapy both at home and at St. John's Hospital, said hospital spokesman Mary Miller.

She'll be on crutches for the next few weeks, Miller said.

The actress underwent a series of operations and plastic surgery after both legs were fractured and one knee damaged in the Sept. 16 accident.

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Actor Aldo Ray, expelled by the Screen Actors Guild for violating its ban against working in non-union films, says the guild let him down in the past when he needed help.

In a report published this week in the trade newspaper **Daily Variety**, Ray said the producers of several of his movies still owe him hundreds of thousands of dollars, and the guild “never went to bat for me.”

Ray, 60, cited several instances in which he said he had been cheated out of portions of his salary, but he said that when he called guild lawyers, “they'd say there's nothing they can do about it.”

Guild officials declined to discuss the issue.

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Companies that use computers to color old black and white films should not be able to copyright their product, the Directors Guild of America said Wednesday in a brief to the U.S. Copyright Office.

The guild described the tinting process as a “trivial variation” on the original work that destroys an art form and “puts at risk a unique American cultural heritage.”

The Turner Broadcasting System recently announced plans to color 100 black and white films, including **Casablanca**, **The Maltese Falcon**, **Yankee Doodle Dandy** and **The Postman Always Rings Twice**.

Companies that perform the work say they are helping introduce a new generation of viewers to classic movies because black and white films are becoming harder to syndicate on television and are rare in the video market.

MONTREAL (CP)—Toronto-based Cineplex-Odeon Corp. has acquired several cinemas with a total of 24 movie screens from France-Film of Montreal.

The deal cost Cineplex \$5 million and brings to 104 the number of screens the chain runs in Quebec.

A Cineplex spokesman said French and English films will be shown on the newly acquired screens.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP)—**Ronnie Milsap's** **Lost in the Fifties Tonight** (in the **Still of the Night**) is the year's most recorded song of 1986 licensed by the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers.

The group, which collects royalties for songwriters, also chose-

Troy Seals as songwriter of the year on Wednesday. He and **Mike Reid**, a former defensive linebacker for the Cincinnati Bengals, wrote the song recorded by Milsap.

Seals' songwriter award was for **Lost in the Fifties Tonight**, **Country Girls**, **Drinkin' and Dreamin'**, **Seven Spanish Angels** and **Who's Gonna Fill Their Shoes**.

WASHINGTON (AP)—Actor **Dennis Weaver**, recipient of a Presidential End Hunger Award, says high-profile fund-raising events such as **Hands Across America** should be only the beginning of daily efforts to feed the hungry.

“Those events are very helpful. They're great PR,” he said Wednesday. But “my concern ... is that they were so successful and flashy ... and got so much media attention ... that the public, at large, figures that the problem is over.”

Weaver, known for his television roles in **Gunsmoke** and **McCloud**, founded **LIFE** (**Love Is Feeding Everyone**). His organization brings food to more than 20,000 people in the Los Angeles area by collecting from supermarkets, bakeries and produce outlets and distributing to non-profit neighborhood agencies.

(AP)—Bass player **Teddy Gentry** of the group **Alabama** says doctors have told him to take it easy because of his bad back.

Larry Paxton of Nashville will fill in for Gentry while he's ailing. “My doctors have advised me to stay off my feet as much as possible for a while, preferably in bed, to avoid any potential injury to the spinal cord,” Gentry said, adding that he suffers from chronic back problems.

Gentry, 34, did not appear with the four-piece vocal band Monday night during the televised Country Music Association awards show.

Scotland in September—definitely the place to be

"Oh to be in Scotland now that September's here." September? That's right. It may pay to be in England when April arrives but for touring enjoyment, September is the month to be in Scotland.

By the time the leaves begin to wither in Canada and autumn colors hail winter's advance, the British Isles, and Scotland in particular, are often enjoying the last days of summer. Gone are the damp days of July and gone too are the hordes of tourists that make peak-season travel too often an exercise in "queing" and frustration.

Another advantage of fall travel is the normal drop in plane fares that accompanies an off-season booking. Depending upon the dates you intend to travel, a return-trip excursion fair to London can be anywhere from \$465 to \$645. Flying to Prestwick airport in Scotland, although possible, is more expensive since there are no direct flights from Montreal and passengers are forced to fly via Toronto or Halifax.

Once you arrive in London at Heathrow airport's newly-constructed terminal four, you have several options. Bus and subway service will connect you with anyone of several London train stations where you can secure tickets to all major regions of the British Islands or you can board a connecting flight to Glasgow or Edinburgh. A third option is the rental of a "hire car" allowing you to experience all the joys of touring Britain on your own. But beware, driving yourself means adjusting to the intricacies of left-hand drive and the peculiarities of British drivers.

With the construction of Britain's motorway system, driving to Scotland in one day is no more difficult than a trip from Montreal to Toronto. However, with a little bit of planning and a willingness to take your time, travelling the back

roads can be a much more rewarding experience since nearly every mile offers the likes of Blenheim Palace, Warwick Castle and Chatsworth House.

Once you reach Scotland, the options again are numerous. The east coast of Scotland offers the likes of Edinburgh and its famous castle, St. Andrew's and the Royal and Ancient golf course our a trip through the whisky country of Glenlivet.

On the other hand the western highlands of historic fame is a nation unto itself with shimmering lochs and brooding hills that bear witness to the glory and tragedy of Scotland's heartland.

For the really adventurous, a two hour drive up the west coast will bring you to the port town of Oban, the gateway to the Western Isles. Oban itself is a medium-sized tourist resort with ample accommodation at that time of the year and more than enough shops and 'sites' to keep anyone busy. The latter includes the famous McCaig's Folly—a replica of a Roman colosseum built in the 19th century.

From Oban you can catch the daily ferry to the Outer Hebrides which includes calls at both Castlebay, on the island of Barra, and Lochboisdale on the island of South Uist. South Uist, in turn, is connected to Benbecula and North Uist by causeway and these four, along with Lewis and Harris to the north, make up the major islands of the Outer Hebrides.

The village of Lochboisdale is typical of the island communities. Composed of a hotel-pub, a small general store, post office and scattering of homes, it can be desolate or charming depending upon the whim of mother nature. There is nothing unfriendly about the Lochboisdale Hotel however, as guests are greeted with all the hospitality and cheer the islands have to offer. Here you can enjoy a quiet beer, an

evening meal, or, for a minimal fee, the delights of salmon fishing on one of the many lochs that dot the island.

Like most of the hotels and pubs in Britain the Lochboisdale offers a room and breakfast, the latter consisting of cereal, bacon, sausage, eggs, toast and gallons of steaming hot tea. For the fisherman or long-term guest, it also of-

fers a weekly rate that includes dinner as well as breakfast for the incredible price of \$50 per day.

The Lochboisdale Hotel is not an exception either. Throughout Britain room rates, including breakfast, are considerably lower than in North America with accommodation being available at around \$20—\$22 per day. Admittedly many of the more inexpensive rooms do not include a private bath

but by the time the average traveller finishes breakfast all is forgotten and forgiven.

The British tourist board tactfully refuses to give guarantees concerning September's weather but the observant traveller will soon notice a strange phenomena—the few tourists one does encounter are invariably Britons themselves. Get the hint?



Amhuinnsuidhe is Scottish salmon farming centre

AMHUINNSUIDHE, Scotland (Reuter)—The inlets and lochs of the Scottish Highlands and islands are filling up with salmon farms.

In the village of Amhuinnsuidhe on the Isle of Harris—some 55 kilometres off mainland Britain—more than half a million salmon eggs are hatched each winter in fresh water diverted from a misty loch nearby.

Using a method perfected over the past decade, the farmers duplicate the natural migration of wild salmon from birth in fresh water, a move downriver to mature in the sea, then a return upstream to spawn and renew the cycle.

"It was a matter of getting it right," McConnell Salmon managing director David Windmill said

in an interview. It took years to refine the process and protect the silvery fish from disease and stormy weather on Scotland's western coast.

Production figures show most problems have been solved. Scotland produced 7,000 tonnes of farmed Atlantic salmon last year, compared with 1,000 tonnes of wild salmon. Production is expected to reach 10,000 tonnes this year and double that amount by 1988.

NORWAY LEADS

In production terms, Scottish salmon farms are second only to Norway's, which last year produced 28,000 tonnes. Canada, Iceland, Ireland and the United States are

also developing farms.

With annual sales expected to total the equivalent of \$84 million Cdn in 1986, the Scottish industry creates welcome new job opportunities in the western islands where unemployment averages almost 20 per cent of the work force.

Young salmon known as smolts are moved from hatcheries into saltwater pens dotting hundreds of previously tranquil waterways. There is increasing concern that the industry threatens the islands' austere natural beauty.

"These are places where people come for peace and quiet," said Scottish Scenic Trust chairman Neil Jamieson. "Salmon farming

has changed the environment. Storage buildings go up. Heavy lorries

(trucks) come and go, noisy motor-boats ride about."

CHOKING — CONSCIOUS CASUALTY

- Do not interfere unless the casualty is unable to speak or cough effectively
- Only then, give four sharp blows with the heel of the hand between the shoulder blades
- If unsuccessful, give four chest thrusts, by wrapping your arms around the casualty, in line with the armpits, and positioning a fist, thumb side-in on the lower half of the sternum
- Alternate back blows and chest thrusts until the obstruction is cleared or the casualty becomes unconscious
- For a child, the technique is the same but the force exerted proportionately less
- For an infant, straddle over your arm with head lowered, deliver four back blows with light force
- Turn in the face-up position and give four chest thrusts, to the mid-sternum using two finger tips
- Casualties who have been treated for choking should always be seen by a doctor.
