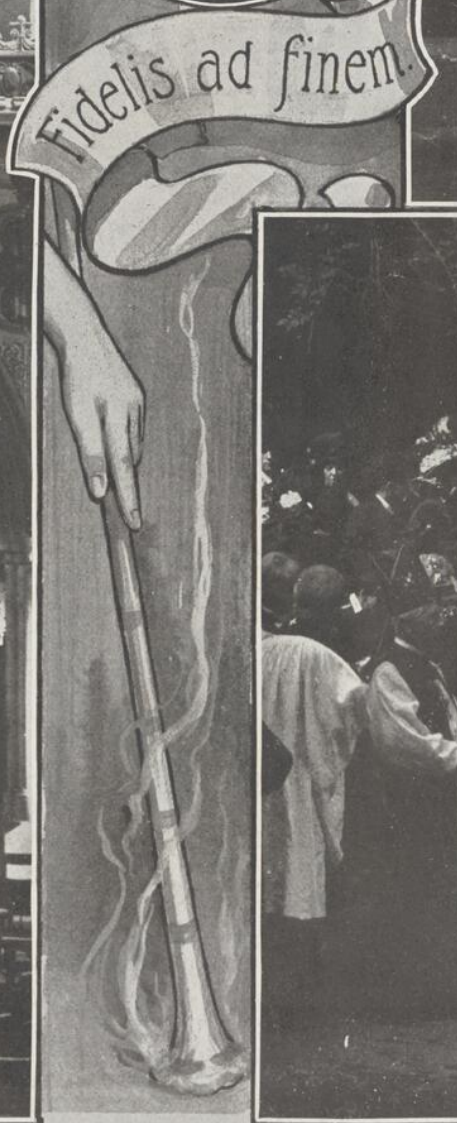
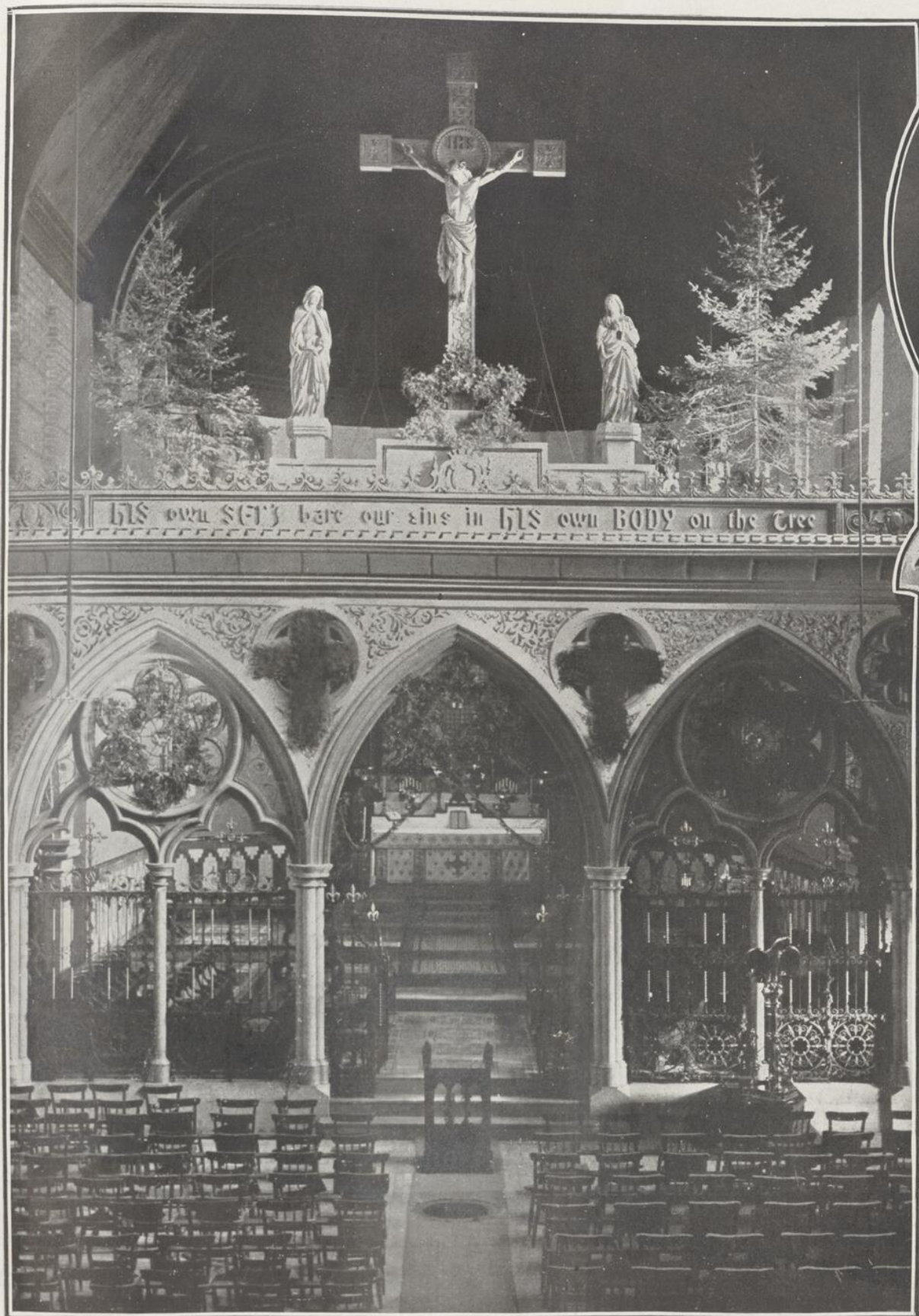




THE PASSING OF A BELOVED PRIEST—On Sunday, Sept. 26th, the death occurred of the Rev. Edmund Wood, rector of the Church of St. John the Evangelist, Montreal. GOWGANDA

PROGRESS IN THE NEW SILVER CAMP OF NORTHERN ONTARIO



The progress in the new silver camps in Northern Ontario can be shown in no better way than by the publishing of the accompanying picture of the excellent power plant of the Bartlett Mines in Gowganda.

The plant, that the buildings now house, was first erected on its concrete beds and in running order early in June, and comprised, at that time, two 80 h.p. return tubular boilers, one 12 drill compressor plant, and a large Jencks hoist. It was running then in the open, but, while proceeding with

the sinking of shafts, etc., the buildings have gradually been put up around the plant, until at the present time it is completely housed, although the buildings are not yet fully completed.

The picture herewith shows the engine room, power-house and machine shop, together with the shaft-house with its accompanying blacksmith's shop.

The Bartlett Mines, it will be remembered, was one of the first mines in the new Gowganda district to come before the public eye on account of its phenomenal surface showings. On several veins

on one claim in its south-west properties (the entire properties consist of over 500 acres) native silver was found of surprising richness and extent. Two shafts have been sunk on the property, and on one of them (shaft No. 1) cross-cutting at the 100 foot level has demonstrated that these rich ores continue with undiminished values at depth. All the work that has been done in the erection of its splendid outfit of camp buildings, and the sinking of double compartment shafts, has been with the idea of permanence, and shows the faith that the Company have in the value of the property.

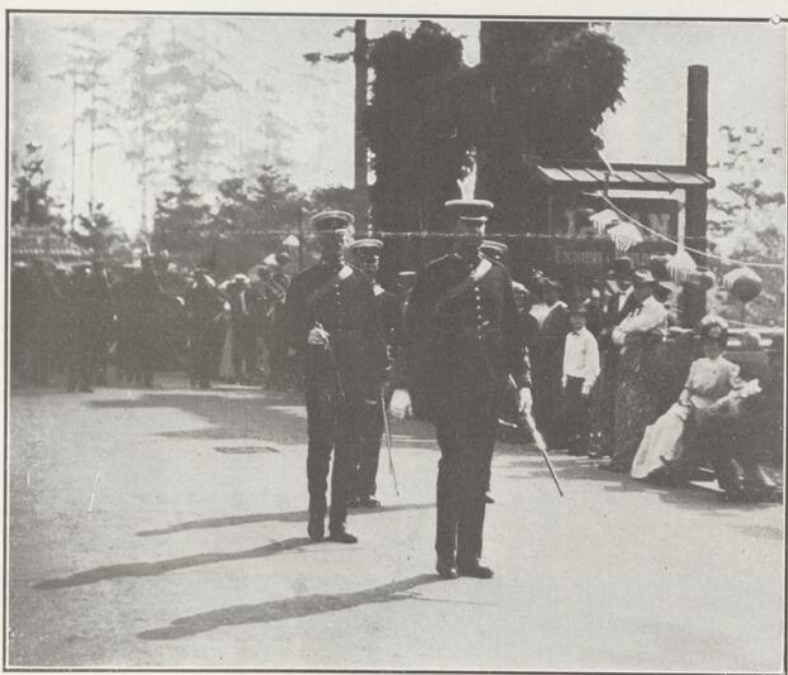

Canada—at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition.

THE footsteps of all loyal Canadians visiting the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition must ere long turn southward through that Ivory City by the Lake, to where is seen their loved flag floating over the long, low, cream-colored structure known as the "Canadian Building." Well may their hearts swell with pride as the wonder and wealth of their country is in part laid before them, and the knowledge of their great and marvellous heritage must strike them most forcibly, for here is gathered richest minerals, gold and silver, coal and coke, copper, cobalt, nickel arsenides, great varieties of building stones, such as marble in splendid and rare shades of rose, violet and turquoise blue; granite, equal, if not excelling the famous Scotch article, the total values of which products comes to fabulous sums annually. These are facing you and surround you on either side of the main entrance.

On the left, as you face the far end of the building, is a wonderful horticultural exhibit, most attractively set, with a background painted and representing an apple-gathering scene in an orchard. Part of the picture is painted, and part is nature itself, and the rich

their life-like appearance form a great attraction, and surely the familiar scenes of the old and new homesteads, the farm fields green and yellow, the cattle and horses, the ploughing and the reaping of dear old Canada's broad acres must cause a pang of homesickness to many of our land who gaze upon them.

The eye catches on every side facts and figures concerning the exhibits, and one is led to believe that there is more solid information stored within a few feet of the Canadian Building than there is in the buildings of any other country at the Exposition. This is an education in itself alone, and every young Canadian from the surrounding provinces of the Dominion should be taken to visit this place.

Occupying the entire breadth of the edifice in the rear is a panorama entitled "Past and Present," which is always surrounded by people. This shows a home of the present day in the midst of wheat fields, peace and plenty,

which we are told was only ten years ago one vast prairie. In the foreground is placed some splendid stuffed specimens of Canada's big game, such as

moose, elk, wood buffalo, and bear. At one side, erect upon his hind legs, stands a most gigantic cinnamon bear, upholding on a wooden tray a glass urn

of Canadian hard wheat, while from his teeth hangs this inscription:

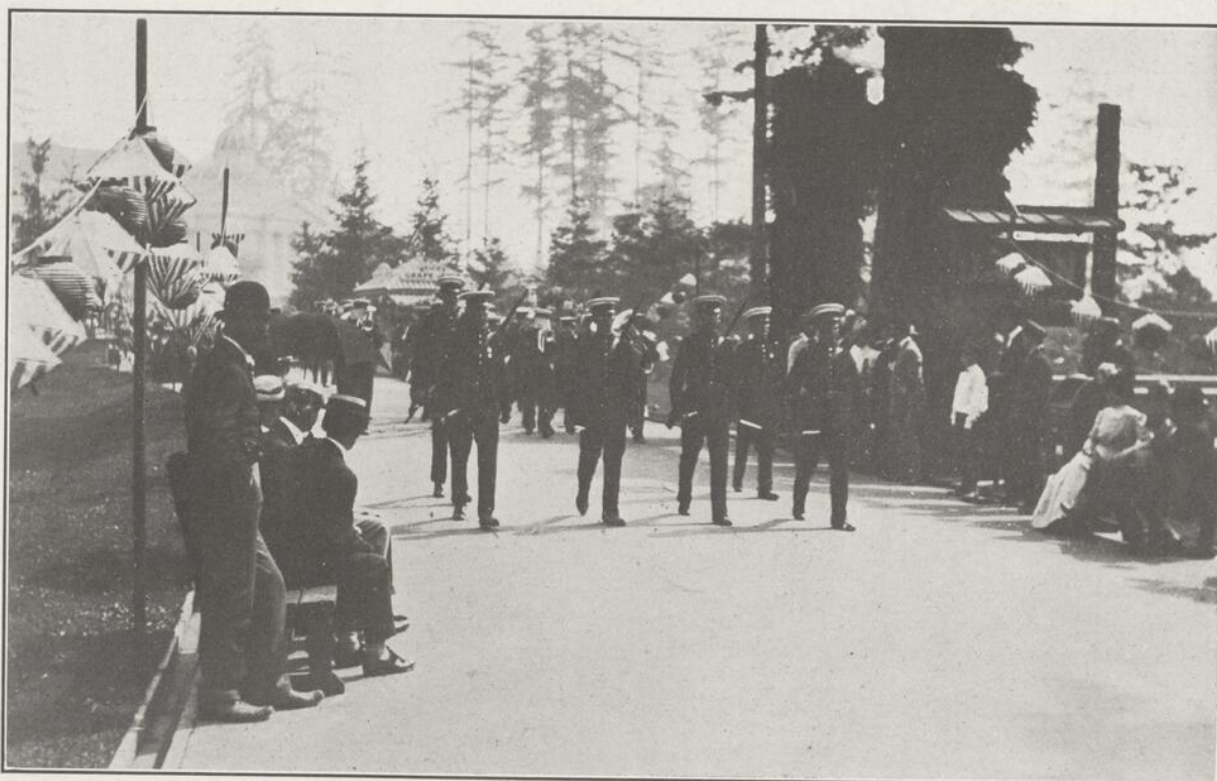
"Yes, hard wheat has removed my prairie friends, and our family, through railroad building in the Rockies, has found life not worth living."

The beaver-dam is also very interesting, with its live specimens lying below, and is one that seems especially to attract the little folk.

But we pass on to the fisheries, the wood and grain exhibits, and as we gaze upon the latter we hear a murmured "That's the only country that can grow wheat, I reckon," from an eager-looking man at your elbow, and you almost feel that another soul will be added to the exodus of Americans into Canada this year!

We read with almost incredulous wonder the tablets placed above the different exhibits. Of the pulp industry, which within three decades ago was unknown in Canada, but now operating hundreds of mills representing a capital of over \$30,000,000 with a million and a half square miles of pulpwood in sight, and enough to supply the whole earth for thousands of years; also that Canada produces 90 per cent. of the world's product of asbestos; that its fisheries are the greatest—as are her wheat fields—of all the world; and we read, too, the opinion of Earl Grey, the Governor-General of Canada—his own words—"Rich as are the separate streams of wealth that flow from Canada's minerals, its timbers and fisheries, their joint and mighty volume will be inferior to the streams of national wealth, of domestic contentment which is one day destined to grow from out the orchards of British Columbia,"—and we poor exiles turn away sighing, "Oh, why left I my home?"

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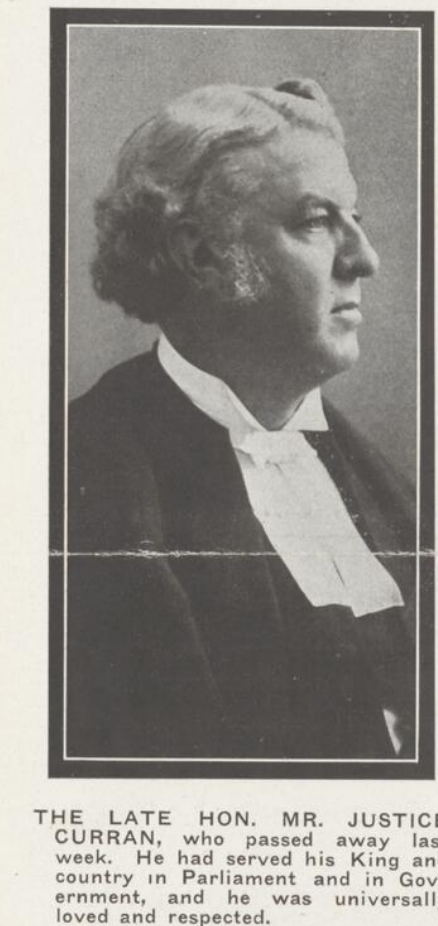
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THE LATE HON. MR. JUSTICE CURRAN, who passed away last week. He had served his King and country in Parliament and in Government, and he was universally loved and respected.

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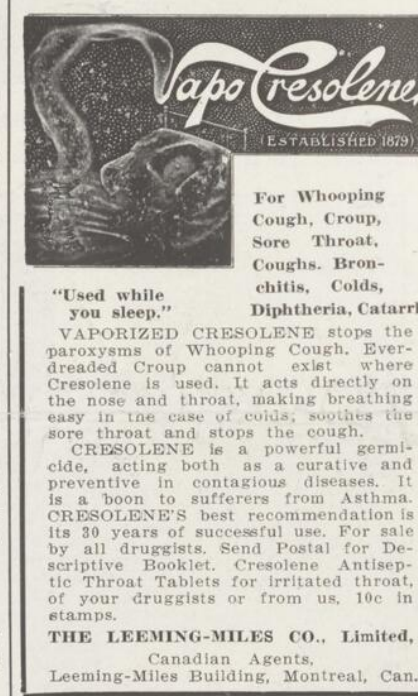

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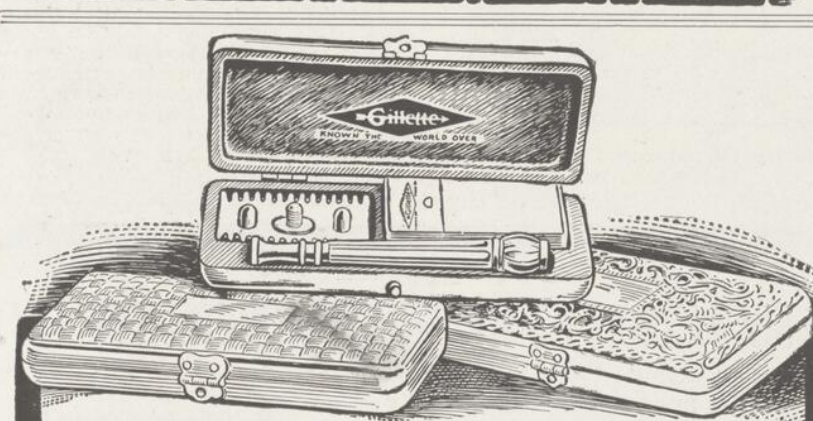


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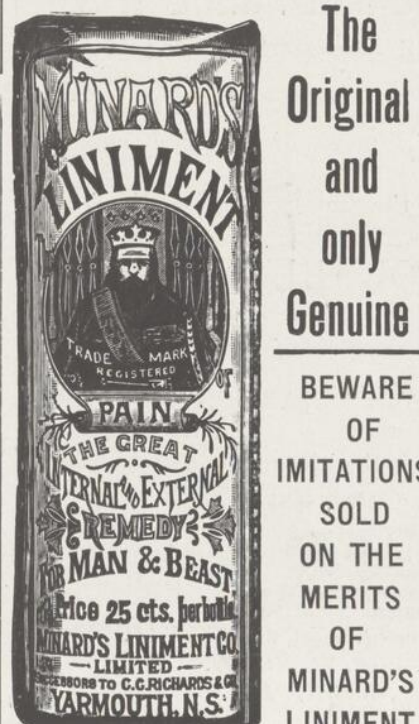
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
