## Translation.

To the Editor of the SPECTATEUR CANADIEN.  
St. Roch, 30th July, 1817.

SIR—As I have reason to believe that, an account of the distressing accident which happened yesterday in our neighbourhood, would meet with a place in your paper, I hasten to communicate it.

Yesterday, in the course of the afternoon, a storm of wind and rain came on, accompanied by thunder & lightning, which lasted for two hours. Seven men of Grand Saint Esprit, (Nouvelle St. Ours) who were working in a ditch at the head of their fields, were obliged to fly for shelter under a tree; but unfortunately for them, they made choice of a lofty pine; flustering themselves, from the thickness of its foliage, with being quite secure. In about half an hour after, the thunder struck the tree, killed one of the men named Martinet, and wounded the other six. One had his shoulder bone broke, and his head split; one was struck over the eye, and it is apprehended he will lose it; another appears to have lost the use of one side of his body; in short, they all experienced serious injury. Unfortunately, the Doctor was unable to render them that speedy assistance which their case required, from the following accident:—Nearly about the same time that these unfortunate people met with this disaster, two young men of Saint Roch, who were covering a house, fell to the ground, and required his assistance also, and engaged it first.

A man of the name of Girard, of L'Assomption, was also killed about the same time, by thunder, and his wife wounded.

The above accident by lightning, should be a warning against flying to trees, and particularly tall ones, for shelter in a thunder storm. The sky is the securest covering in such cases.

YORK, U. C. July 21.

About 11 o'clock on Monday night, Mr. Ashley's Tavern in this town, was observed to be on fire, the inhabitants assembled with the greatest alacrity, and were shortly after assisted by the garrison, but the progress of the flames was so very rapid as to baffie every effort made to subdue them; and Mr. Ashley's family had scarcely time to effect their escape. Three men, named Day, Haines and Kenyon, who were in the house, fell victims to the devouring element. They were all married, and have left fourteen children; a fourth person, supposed to be a traveller, is said to have entered the house to save his baggage, but was not seen to come out again, no appearance of his remains however have been found, but those of the other three were taken from the ruins and interred the next day; some other slighter accidents occurred: none of the neighbouring houses were injured.
