# Timid Ottawa thwarts espionage plans

It was close for a while — nip and tuck, touch and go, neck and neck — but good old Pete Cadieux came through in the pinch last week and managed to keep it all pretty hush-hush besides.

Problem was, see, they had this big, all-party Commons committee snooping into CSIS business for over a year. They heard all these witnesses, took all this testimony, studied all these reports, spent all this time and money and, five months ago, came up with 117 recommendations.

## Who's Who

Last week, Solicitor General Pierre Cadieux tabled a 79-page report rejecting almost every one of them.

They wanted to chain us up, you see. Wanted to make us obey the law, respect people's privacy, freedom of speech and all that garbage. It was nothing less than a blatant attempt to keep us from spying on innocent people.

(We'll keep an eye on those interfering old nannies in future — and on all those who voted them into office.)

One of their recommendations would have set up a permanent committee to watch over our spending and operations — spying on the spies, if you can believe such a thing. How would *you* like someone looking over *your* shoulder? And once you start something like that,

where will it end? Who watches the watcher watching you?

Our budget — now up to something more than \$190 million a year — is secret and it's none of the taxpayer's business how we spend their money. If they don't like it, they can write letters to the editor. We keep an eye on those, too.

A second recommendation was for an oversight committee on our sister agencies: the RCMP's Security Intelligence Directorate and the super-secret Communications Security Establishment which eavesdrops on telecommunications. That, too, was rejected in the interests of national security while the reasons for that rejection were kept secret in the interests of national security. Isn't the spy game great?

Another recommendation was that Canada consider setting up a

new agency for spying abroad. Rejected. We have all the subversion we need right here at home.

Another was that CSIS be forbidden to spy on peace groups, labor unions and crackpot political factions who pose no real threat to national security. Rejected! Another proposed tightening the legal definition of espionage, sabotage and terrorism. Rejected!

They wanted to draw a line between legal and illegal ways of changing political policies, see, and prevent CSIS agents from stepping over that line. Rejected!

Best of all, we don't have to worry about such another Parliamentary snooping session until 1998.

Woodrow Wilson once declared that spies have no place in a democracy.

What did he know? Somebody

should have reminded Mr. Woodrow X. Wilson that Moses was the first big-time spy-master and got his instructions directly from God. He was told to send a dozen secret agents — Israel's first Mossad — to "spy out the land of Canaan... and the people that dwelleth therein, whether they be strong or weak, few or many; And what the land is that they dwell in, whether it be good or bad; and what cities there be that they dwell in, whether in tents, or in strongholds; And what the land is, whether it be fat or lean, whether there be wood therein or not."

And so they did and brought back reports of a land of milk and honey which, as everybody knows, began 2500 years of peace and prosperity in the region.

Spying is God's work, see. Henry Kissinger understood that.

When the CIA was criticized for trying to overthrow the democratically elected government of Salvador Allende, he grumbled: "I don't see why we need to stand by and watch a country go Communist due to the irresponsibility of its own people."

Exactly. You can't trust ordinary, everyday people to run a democracy either. They need a little secret guidance by those of us who know exactly how a country should be run. We can't say much, of course, in the interests of national security.

But it should come as no surprise to most people that there are forces at work to tear apart this great country of ours. Sleep soundly, however, in the assurance we'll be closely watching Slippery Bob's convention tomorrow — and *you* may be next.

Moral: Don't.

## War to End All Wars

My earliest years were spent in the small village of Abercorn, some two miles from the Vermont border. The Abercorn railway station has been gone for many years, but back then it was an important asset to the region, for it was the main line linking Boston and Montreal, and numerous passenger and freight trains passed through.

There was, of course, a station agent who dealt with freight, passengers and the telegraph office. His name was Mr. Bowker. Although we enjoyed a sort of "free trade," the government considered it essential that it be informed as to who and what crossed its border; therefore, a Canada Customs and Immigration Officer was always on duty at the station, day or night.

Francis Fyles was in charge of the customs office, located in part of his spacious farm house on the main highway.

Fyles was an ardent supporter of Robert Borden, and I listened to many a spirited discussion between him and my father. My father was very firm — but hardly popular — about conscription.

"I have no sons, and I will not vote to send my neighbor's sons into battle." And he never did.

My most vivid and poignant memory from this war is of the troop trains coming up from the States, always at night.

They were held up at our R.R. station for a while, and that was the signal for my father and mother to rush frantically about the house and pantry, filling baskets with homemade bread and butter, pies, cakes, doughnuts, anything eatable. Then a dash to the train... the long, dark cars, wide open windows, with dozens of eager, wai-

# Students perform *Romeo and Juliet* at Centennial

SHERBROOKE — Romeo, Romeo, wherefore art thou Romeo?

From March 14-17 he'll be at Centennial Theatre. For the first time in three years, Bishop's University drama students will put on a production in the 600-seat venue, Shakespeare's *Romeo and Juliet*.

Director George Rideout says that the reason students haven't played at Centennial for so long is because of the new facility at Bishop's, Studio Theatre.

"Studio Theatre is very versatile, but it isn't as large as Centennial," Rideout said, in an interview during rehearsals. "It only has a hundred seats."

Rideout feels that *Romeo and Juliet* is one of the half-dozen plays written by Shakespeare that students are capable of doing properly.

"Romeo is a play that capitalizes on the best things a student can bring to this type of production: energy, youth and a belief in love," Rideout said.

## YOUTH IMPORTANT

"Also, the characters in the play are pretty young themselves. Juliet is only 14 years old. Her mother is only 28; she had Juliet when she was 14. The oldest character in the play is about 38. The students are of pretty appropriate age," Rideout said.

"Also, this has been the best and most committed group we've ever had," he gloated. "I expect it to be great!"

The set for the play is impressive. Designed by Peter McHugh, it is done in Spanish-American style, circa 1830. Not only did the students build the set during the university's reading week, they built an addition to the stage itself.

"It was necessary just to improve the visibility from some sections of the theatre," Rideout said.

The only problem will be moving the set when they go to play the Quebec University Drama Festival on April 5th. The festival runs from April 2-6 at the University of Montreal.

For those who see the play two nights in a row, there will be at least one difference worth noticing: two different students, Sarah Clarke and Rachel Elie, play Juliet. They take turns in a non-speaking role the other night.

## BUDDY SYSTEM

Elie says that it's been difficult sharing the role, but that it's helped in some ways.

"It hasn't been very competitive, which is nice," she said. "We've been able to practice with each other on the dancing scenes, and we've gone through the scenes together, gotten the character's motivation down."

"Mind you, there are some scenes when I'm not playing Juliet I want to call out to Romeo!" Elie said.

Romeo, played by Dave Menard, says it hasn't been a problem for him.

"As long as I make sure of who's playing whom at the beginning, I'm fine," Menard said. "The only problem is that only one of them can be Juliet at the festival: they're gonna flip a coin."

The play is a lot of work for the students. They still have to get their school work done in between rehearsals. Derek Badger, who plays the Friar, says that it has been a problem for him.

"It's been hard to balance sometimes, but I've really enjoyed doing it," Badger said. "I'm in political science and sometimes the profs aren't as understanding as the theatre profs would be, but it's been a good time."

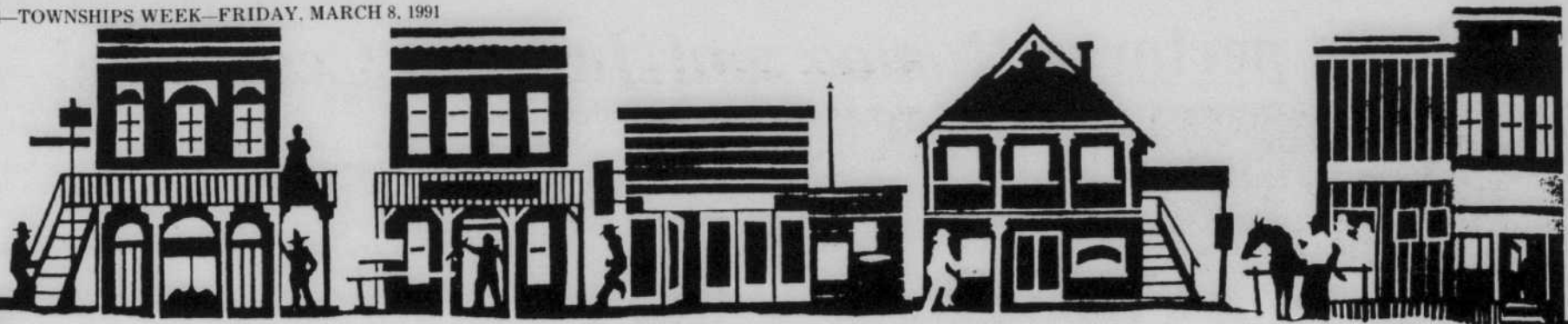

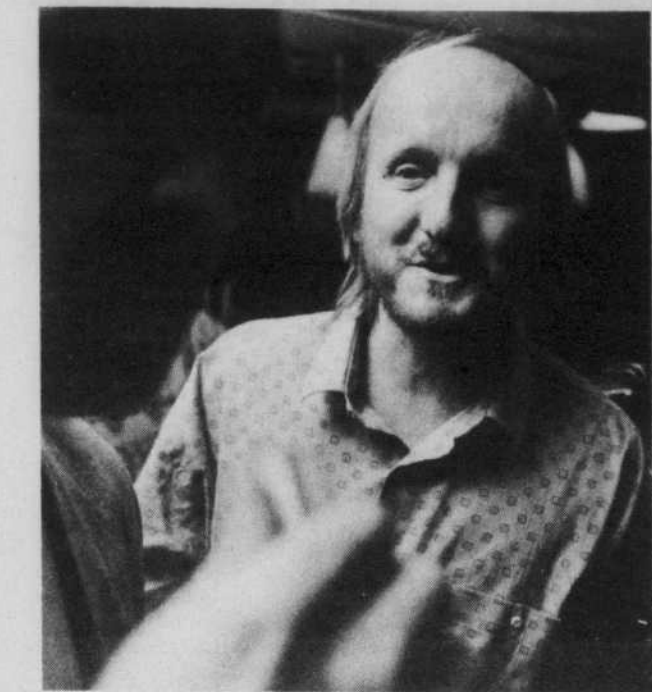

SHERBROOKE — Community radio station CFLX-FM was covered in purple, pink and green balloons, with ribbons hanging down from the pipes and walls. The reason for the decorations? A visit from Sherbrooke-born superstar Jim Corcoran.

Parents Jack and Patricia Corcoran showed up, along with about 20 friends and admirers, to a belated birthday party for Corcoran.

The party was supposed to be held on Tuesday, but the bad weather kept Corcoran trapped in Montreal.

He was at CFLX as a guest on Jocelyn Dubé's radio show. He answered questions from Dubé, joked around with his fans, talked about his upcoming show March 15 at Salle Maurice O'Bready and looked over items in the scrapbook his mother brought.

Jack Corcoran said that he wasn't surprised that his son turned to music.

"He has a very musical background. His grandparents on both sides of the family are musicians, my wife and I are musicians — it didn't surprise me at all.

### SINGING IN FRENCH

"I was a little concerned when he wanted to go into it full-time, especially when he told me he wanted to do it all in French!" Jack Corcoran said. "I just thought there would be a bigger market in English.

"I mean, look at what some of the major francophone stars are doing today. Celine Dion, Roch Voisine. They're all doing songs in English now," Jack Corcoran continued. "But he said that he loved the language so much that he wanted to make a living with it."

Patricia Corcoran said she is always surprised by the way people react to finding out she's related to Jim.

"They always ask 'Corcoran? Are you related to Jim Corcoran? Oooh!' I can never get over the reaction. He'll always be just Jim to me."

"All his success, it hasn't changed him at all," she said. "If that was me, I would have a really swelled head!"

Corcoran has been busy the last couple of years. Besides writing and producing his last album *Corcoran*, which won three Felix awards last year, he has been hosting a show on CBC radio called *A Propos* for the last two years. He has also won critical acclaim for the role of Emile Nelligan's father, David, in the opera *Nelligan*.

### GOOD TO BE BACK

Corcoran says his busy schedule makes being back home in Sherbrooke even better.

"This is where it all began, where I first started writing songs, where I first got encouragement," he said. "I rarely have time to come back now, so to see all my friends at once like this is great."

### The future, as Corcoran sees it?

"Bigger and better things. The show I'm doing now is the biggest I've ever done, but nothing is too big.

"It took me a little while to learn how to handle all of this, but now that I have the people to handle most things, I can just take care of the music," Corcoran said.

# Seven artists recreate inner workings of a poet's mind

SHERBROOKE — Last summer, Kevin McKenna had a dream. It had to do with frames and a window. When he woke up, he wrote it down as a poem.

That poem is the basis of a new exhibit called "Synergy" at Horace Gallery in Sherbrooke. Seven artists have created their own vision

of what floats around inside McKenna's mental attic.

The gallery has set aside a room, a black space, in which the artists placed items that, for them, are visual clues. The black room contains suspended chairs, gas masks, a paper maché man, a copper tube, dusty old piano keys,

among other things.

The room is surrounded by a thin wall spotted with windows every few feet. Each window was designed and painted by one of the participating artists.

As the viewer walks from one window to the other, their visual perspective on what's inside the

room changes; therefore, a static and two-dimensional tableau suddenly takes on movement and added compositional possibilities.

"The thing about art is that it always frames something," McKenna said. "It's just a fragment of reality, a selection."

"What we have here is like a theatre set for everybody," he said. "Everybody has images that belong to the others, and the whole is greater than the parts."

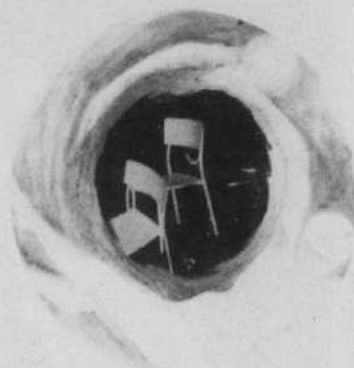
## OLD FRIENDS

McKenna is a writer and painter who works at his family's flower shop in town. He studied fine arts and printmaking at Pratt Institute in New York for four years. He has been a member of the *Regroupement des Artistes des Cantons de l'Est*, known as RACE, for eight years now.

Their goal was to work on something together without it being a case of one person putting something down, then another person adding to it, and so on.

Cécile Gingras of Magog designed her section around a circular window. Two human figures appear to wrap themselves around the window as if pulled by a centri-

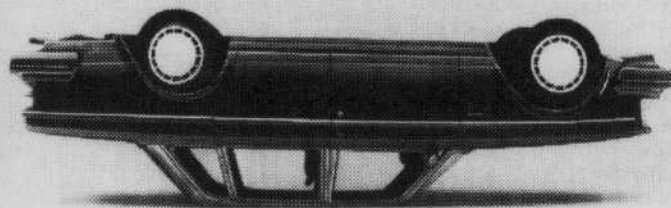
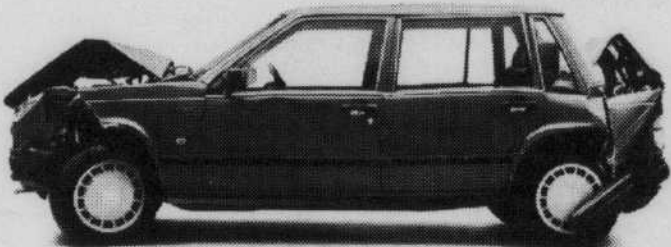
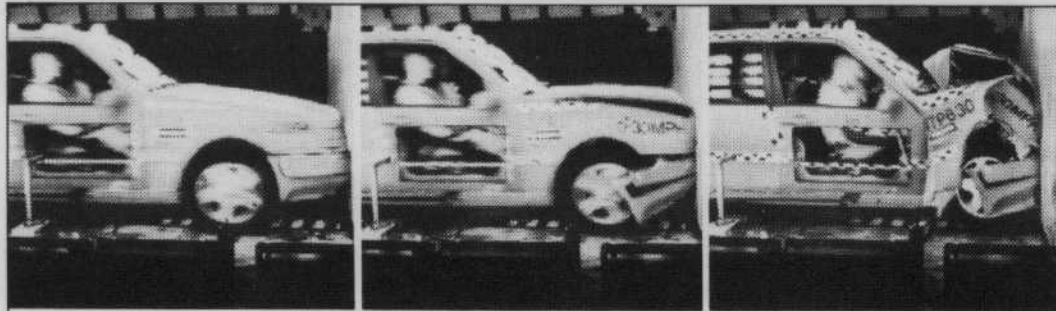
fugal force.

## Ann Fowlis's quiet affection for her community

SHERBROOKE — International Women's Day always generates a stream of tributes to wonderful women who've dedicated their lives to achieving wonderful goals. Women who inspire us by their brave example. Who deserve kudos, applause, and praise.

More often than not, their names are familiar to us, for they are either the talk of the town or the toast of the media.

But Ann Hayes Fowlis is about as low key a role model as one can find.

Fowlis, 33, is a supervisor at Bell Canada. From 9 to 5, Monday to Friday, she oversees the work of 71 telephone operators and three managers. She has worked her way up from the bottom ranks of the phone company without any high falutin degrees or diplomas: she was hired as a cashier at a Télé-Boutique 15 years ago when she was 17.

It's not surprising that she's done so well at Bell. It's in her blood. Her father, John Hayes, worked in installations and repairs for 36 years before retiring in 1990. Joan Hayes, her mother, worked at Bell before she got married and raised the family. And her three siblings all had summer jobs at Bell.

### STRONG ROOTS

Everything about Ann Fowlis's adulthood demonstrates admirable perseverance and stability.

For the past nine years she has taught pre and post-natal swimming at Bishop's University pool. When she started, the activity had yet to win the approval of some doctors who still questioned whether expectant mothers should exercise. But Fowlis stayed with it,

because she knew it was right.

She and her husband, Dave Fowlis, have been married for 14 years. They live in St-Elie and are expecting their first child.

It was Dave who introduced her to Plymouth-Trinity United Church on Dufferin Street, their home away from home. The couple is actively involved in a variety

of church goings-on, from choir to Church Council.

"If somebody asks me, I tell them I'm still a Catholic," she says. "It's just that this church is very accepting of women; and even though I'm not a crusader for women's rights, I appreciate that the United Church makes a genuine effort to include women — and children, for that matter."

At least half of the church's council members are women.

### NO RESENTMENT

Fowlis, whose parents attend St. Pats Catholic Church a few blocks away, insists she feels no resentment toward the Catholic Church. On the contrary.

It is precisely because she appreciated that no religion is morally superior to another that she takes a lead

role in organizing ecumenical events in the region. She is also called upon to promote musical concerts at the church.

For all the credit her admirers heap on her for the great job she does at the church, she heaps even more credit on the parishioners whom she admires.

She says she's a big fan of Vivienne Galanis who works at COFI, an organization that helps immigrants integrate into Canadian society and that fights for the rights of new Canadians. Galanis is on the church council and, according to Fowlis, is "the wheel that keeps the concerts going here."

"Vivienne is really up on all the issues," Fowlis says. "I'm not up on them, I'm just a people-person who joins a lot of things."

### FITTING IN

Fowlis also looks up to Pam Gill Eby, the church organist.

"Pam has two kids, she's a teacher, she leads the choir, she has studied music in England and France," Fowlis says, awed. "On top of it all, she came to Quebec from Ontario and made an effort to fit in, unlike many others who come here."

Ruth Atto, a retired nurse who volunteers much of her time in the Sherbrooke Hospital palliative care unit, is another of Fowlis's role models. Atto is active in the church administration.

There's a clear pattern here. Fowlis clearly believes in setting down roots in her community.

"You get your values from your parents," she says. "So if your parents are like mine and place a high value on community service, then you do too."

## Grandparents and grandkids travel well together

"Grandparenting is the only experience that isn't overrated," a client once told travel agent Hele-

na Koenig.

Koenig agrees wholeheartedly, partly because she has a grandchild of her own and partly because her company, Grandtravel, spe-

cializes in tours for grandparents and their grandchildren.

In fact, she was a pioneer in the field.

"It started five years ago with my daughter-in-law coming in and telling me she was going to have a baby," Koenig said in an interview from her base in Chevy Chase, Md.

"It just flipped me out — it made me a grandmother for the first time.

"I'd been a travel agent for so long and I said, I wonder if they do tours for grandparents. And I looked and there weren't any. So I tried it.

"Everybody said, you must be crazy — but it worked."

A check of several Canadian companies specializing in seniors travel failed to turn up tours specifically for grandparents and grandchildren.

Canadian tour operators say the concept is interesting but that, for now, there may not be enough of a market.

In the United States, Grandtravel and at least one other company, R.F.D. Travel Corp. of Mission, Kan., offer a variety of escorted coach tours designed to appeal to both generations.

The trips are all during the summer, when school's out. Grandtravel says children of any age are welcome but suggests that kids seven and up would enjoy themselves the most. R.F.D. suggests a bottom age limit of nine or 10.

### PIZZA PARTIES

The tours take in educational at-

tractions like national parks, historical sites and museums as well as amusement parks.

The coaches make more frequent stops than they would on a tour just for seniors, so that children can let off steam.

Evening activities range from movies to pizza parties, with the emphasis on keeping the kids active and entertained while allowing grandparents to join in or not, as they wish.

Grandtravel tours feature both a tour guide and a tour escort. The escort is a teacher or counsellor who's responsible for the educational component of the tour and who occasionally supervises separate activities for the children.

R.F.D. Travel trips have just one escort, says spokeswoman Alice Gregory, because the whole reason for the trip is for the two generations to spend time together.

"In our society the extended family is sometimes sprinkled all the way across the continent, and this kind of thing is an opportunity for the grandparents to spend time with the grandchildren," Gregory said.

"Grandchildren are very different when they're away from their parents — they're probably a lot nicer," she added with a laugh. "And it gives the parents a bit of a break too."

### 15 TRIPS

The tours also relieve grandparents of the burden of finding ways to keep the child entertained and

interested.

"A lot of grandparents don't want to take the children on a vacation just in the car because they're afraid the children will get bored stuck in the car all day," Gregory said. "And in the evenings, what activities are there going to be for the children?"

"With a specifically designed tour, those issues aren't problems."

Grandtravel's summer catalogue this year features seven trips in the United States and eight to Europe.

The U.S. trips include tours of New England, Washington, D.C., the Southwest, the Grand Canyon and area, western parks, the California coast and Alaska.

They are a week, 10 days or two weeks long. Based on double occupancy, rates range from about \$2,000 US per person for the week-long tour of Washington to about \$5,000 for a two-week trip in Alaska. There are triple and quadruple occupancy rates too.

R.F.D. offers a 10-day tour of Washington, D.C., and a 10-day trip to the Grand Canyon and national parks in Colorado and Utah.

The rate is \$1,249 US per person for a single grandparent and child. If there are two grandparents, the adults pay that same rate while the child costs \$900 US.

## Security tips for international trips

The Gulf War may over, but the threat of terrorism hangs like a cloud over air travellers everywhere.

In fact, the threat has existed for years, security experts remind us. It's just that people tend to forget about it when there's a long lag between terrorist attacks.

So the following tips, while particularly apropos right now, apply to all international travel all the time.

The advice is culled from a variety of sources, including the International Air Transport Association, the Commercial Travellers' Association handbook on business-travel tips, and a book by U.S. security consultant Anthony Scotti titled *Executive Safety and International Terrorism — A Guide for Travellers*.

### For air travel:

- Pack your own bags, and take only those items truly necessary. Less luggage helps speed the security screening process. Given the current heightened security, IATA, which represents some 200 international carriers, is asking passengers to limit themselves to one carry-on bag.
- If possible, leave behind electro-

nic or battery-operated devices — such as portable tape players, laptop computers and video cameras — which are subject to manual inspection. If you must carry them, pack them in one place for easy access and examination.

- Be prepared to answer questions from security personnel about where you're coming from, where you're going, and what's in your luggage.

- IATA member airlines are currently recommending that passengers arrive at airports in North America a half-hour before the usual recommended check-in time. Make it two hours earlier than usual at airports like Frankfurt and Heathrow outside London.

- Don't let corporate logos or company names show on luggage tags. Write your name and company address on the card, then slip the card into the tag face-side down. Or use a covered tag, so that the face of the tag has to be flipped up to be read. If the bag is lost, the card will provide identification, but your identity will be concealed from bystanders.

- Leave gifts unwrapped for the journey: at airport security, any wrapped packages will have to be unwrapped.

- Never agree to carry or take responsibility for someone else's luggage, gifts or packages unless the person is well-known to you. Even then, examine the contents yourself.

- Never leave baggage unattended. Any pieces of unattended luggage noticed at an airport should be reported to security or airline personnel.

- Business travellers should limit information on their itinerary to office and family. If travel plans are changed, immediately notify whoever needs to know.

- Where possible, choose direct flights: this avoids the possibility of going through another security check when changing planes.

**On arrival, particularly in countries where there is overt hostility toward North American or western tourists and businesses:**

- Have the phone number of the Canadian Embassy with you at all times. Learn to operate the local public telephones and always carry the coins necessary to use them. Also, carry a card listing local emergency telephone numbers, such as police and hospitals.
- Try to blend in with the local population. Avoid prominent, expensive clothing and jewelry. Don't talk loudly in restaurants.

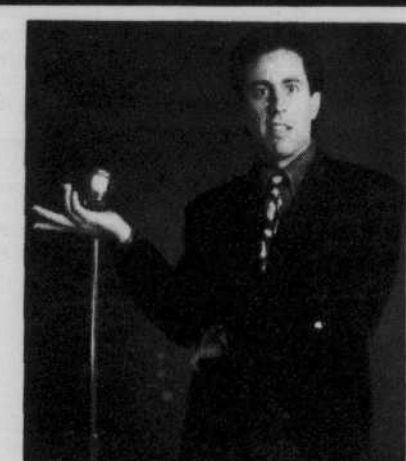

## SOAP SCOOP

### Blue-collar characters are at the fore of 'GH'

Based on just the three or four weeks of "General Hospital" scripts we've seen air since the return of executive producer Gloria Monty to "GH," she looks to be sparking a second soap revolution.

First, let's chart the cast changes Monty has made.

As you now know, Tony Geary's new character (Luke Spencer's cousin) is named Bill

Monty loves character actors, and Geary plays well off them. (Remember cabdriver Slick Jones, played by Eddie Ryder?) Also joining "GH" under Monty's regime is a hunky younger brother for Robert Scorpio (Tristan Rogers) named Mac. Playing Mac is John J. York, a non-Australian actor who played the title role in the Fox series "Werewolf."

Why do we call this a second soap revolution? Well, even before the above people began to air, "GH" scripts began to change radically.

These scripts began to include both non-soap reality and sitcom-like humor. Two weeks ago, we hailed the episode in which the casually deadpan Frisco (Jack Wagner) played a hilarious Mr. Mom to some day-care center kids.

Telling Anna Lavery (Fiona Hughes) about it, Frisco's wife Felicia (Kristina Milandro) cracked: "You should have seen Frisco! He looked like Donna Reed in drag." This is Felicia, who normally is daytime's Barbie Doll?

Even those scenes disposing of characters leaving town to make room for the new Eckert bunch were radically different. Normally compassionate psychiatrist Tom Hardy Jr. (David Wallace) told off a bored, suburban matron: "There's nothing wrong with you that can't be cured by getting a job," he said. "I'm sick of rich people."
