THE QUEEN AND ROYAL FAMILY.

Her Majesty ALEXANDRINA VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, &c., Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India, Shri Shri Rani Victoria, Kaisar-i-Hind). Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the throne 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV.; was crowned 28th June, 1838; and married 10th February, 1840, to His late Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel, PRINCE CONSORT, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Cobourg and Gotha, who was born 6th August, 1819; died 14th December, 1862. Her Majesty is the only child of His late Royal Highness, Edward Duke of Kent, fourth son of King George III. The children of Her Majesty are:

His Royal Highness Victoria Adelaide Mary Louisa, Princess Royal of England and Prussia, born November 21, 1840, and married to His Royal Highness William, the late Emperor of Germany, January 25, 1858, and has issue living, three sons and four daughters.

His Royal Highness ALBERT EDWARD, PRINCE OF WALES, Duke of Saxony, Cornwall and Rothesay, Earl of Dublin, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., K.T.S., G.C.B., P.C., field marshal, colonel of the 10th Hussars, and colonel-in-chief of the Rifle Brigade, born 9th of November, 1841; married 10th March, 1863, to the Princess Alexandra Caroline Mary Charlotte Louisa Julia, born 1st December, 1844, eldest daughter of the King of Denmark, and has issue His Royal Highness Prince Albert Victor Christian Edward, born 8th January, 1864, died 14th January, 1892; His Royal Highness Prince George Frederick Ernest Albert, born 3rd June, 1865; married July 6, 1893, to Princess Victoria Mary of Teck; Her Royal Highness Princess Louisa Victoria Alexandra Dagmar, born 20th February, 1867; married July 27, 1889, to Alexander, Earl of Fife; Her Royal Highness Princess Victoria Alexandra Olga Mary, born 6th July, 1868; Her Royal Highness Princess Maud Charlotte Mary Victoria, born 26th November, 1869, and His Royal Highness Prince Alexander John C. Albert, born 6th April, 1871, died 7th April, 1871.

Her Royal Highness Alice Maud Mary, born April 25, 1843, married His Royal Highness Prince Frederick Louis of Hesse, July 1, 1862, died Dec. 14, 1878; issue living, four daughters and one son.

His Royal Highness Alfred Ernest Albert, Duke of Cobourg and Duke of Edinburgh, born Aug. 6, 1844; married the Grand Duchess Marie of Russia, Jan. 21, 1874, and has issue a son and four daughters.

Her Royal Highness Helena Augusta Victoria, born May 25, 1846; married to His Royal Highness Prince Frederick Christian Charles Augustus of Schleswig-Holstein Sonderburg-Augustenburg, July 5, 1866, and has issue living one son and two daughters.

Her Royal Highness Louisa Carolina Alberta, born March 18, 1848; married to the Marquis of Lorne, eldest son of the Duke of Argyll, March 21, 1871.

His Royal Highness Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, born May 1, 1850; married Princess Louise Margaret of Prussia, March 13, 1879, and has issue one son and two daughters.

His Royal Highness Leopold George Duncan Albert, Duke of Albany, born April 7, 1853; married April 27, 1882, Princess Helen of Waldeck; died March 28, 1884; issue a daughter, born Feb. 25, 1883, and a son born July 19, 1884.

Her Royal Highness Beatrice Mary Victoria Feodore, born April 14, 1857; married to His Royal Highness Prince Henry of Battenberg, July 29, 1885; died January 20, 1896; issue three sons and a daughter.

COURTS OF JUSTICE.

SUPREME COURT OF THE DOMINION.

The Supreme Court was constituted as a Court of Appeal in 1875 pursuant to sec. 101 of the British North America Act. The various statutes affecting its constitution and jurisdiction were consolidated by chap. 135 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, since when various acts have been passed further altering its jurisdiction. It is composed of a chief justice and five puisné judges, and has appellate, civil and criminal jurisdiction within and throughout the Dominion of Canada. The judges reside at Ottawa, where the Supreme Court holds annually three sessions; the first beginning on the third Tuesday in February, the second on the first Tuesday in May and the third on the first Tuesday in October.

EXCHEQUER COURT OF CANADA.

The Exchequer Court, constituted under a Dominion Statute, 50-51 Vict., chap. 26, is presided over by one judge, and has original exclusive jurisdiction in all claims, suits or actions against the crown. It has concurrent jurisdiction in relation to revenue cases and the enforcement of penalties, in cases in which it is sought at the instance of the attorney-general of Canada to impeach or annul any patent of invention in cases relating to trade marks and copyrights and patents of inventions, in cases relating to land patent or other instrument respecting lands, cases against crown officers for anything done or omitted to be done as such officer, and all actions or suits in which the crown is plaintiff or petitioner. The Exchequer Court has also jurisdiction as a Court of Admiralty, within Canada, under 54-55 Vic., chap. 29.

TARIFF OF WHARFAGE.

(By-law 130 of By-laws of the Corporation of the Harbor Commissioners of Montreal.)

From and after the date of the coming into force of the present by-law, rates shall be levied as hereinafter set forth on the following articles, when landed, shipped or moved by rail or other conveyance on the wharves in the Harbor of Montreal

- On coal, coke, grain and seeds of all kinds, 7½ cents per ton.
- On ballast, clay, fire-bricks, gypsum, lime, marble, and all other stone, phosphates, sand, salt, scorice blocks, 10 cents per ton.
- On apples, oranges, lemons and other green fruit, crates and their contents, flour and meal, fish, meat, pitch, potatoes, tar, horses, neat cattle, sheep, swine, hay, straw, wood pulp, 15 cents per ton.
- On pig and scrap iron, pot and pearl ashes, 20 cents per ton.
- On bricks, 20 cents per thousand; on cordwood, 5 cents per cord; on lumber, 10 cents per thousand feet board measure.
- On all goods, wares and merchandises, except bullion and specie not elsewhere specified, 25 cents per ton.
- On goods upon which, in the opinion of the Harbor Commissioners, it is not convenient to ascertain the rates according to the above provisions, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners to levy a rate of one-fourth of one per cent, on the value thereof.
- No entry shall be less than five cents.
- Only one rate shall be levied on property covered by the foregoing provisions when landed on the wharves for reshipment only.
- 19th May, 1896. That (upon the approval of the Governor in council being given) the above tariff be subject to a reduction of twenty per centum, (20%)
- On all goods remaining on the wharves more than four clear working days after notice having been given by the Harbour Master for that removal, in the case of goods imported, there shall be levied additional rates as follows:
On cement, one cent per barrel per day.
On salt, one-half cent per bag per day.
On iron, one-half cent per hundred weight per day.
On bricks, ten cents per thousand per day.
On drain pipes and all other non-enumerated articles, one-half cent per hundred weight per day.
- For the purpose of this by-law, a ton shall be calculated as being 2000 pounds weight, or forty cubic feet measurement, according as the goods to which the same applies have been, or shall be, carried by water by ton weight or ton measurement.
- The weight of the articles hereinafter described may be estimated as follows:
Ashes, pot or pearl, three barrels to one ton.
Apples, flour, meal, potatoes, nine barrels to one ton.
Fish, meat, pitch, tar, seven barrels to one ton.
Horses, two to one ton.
Neat cattle, three to one ton.
Sheep, five to one ton.
Swine, ten to one ton.

On "Drop" letters, whether posted in the city or at a suburban office, addressed to any point within the letter carriers' delivery, the rate is 2c. per oz.

Drop letters posted at any suburban office for delivery therefrom, 1 cent per oz.

Drop letters posted at any suburban office for delivery at another suburban office, 3 cents per oz.

Re Directed Letters.—Re-directed letters are not liable to any additional postage, if handed back to the Post Office with a changed address at the moment of delivery or as soon as possible thereafter, provided always the change in the address does not require the letter to be sent to any place to which the postage rate is higher than was at first payable. Thus a drop letter re-directed to a place outside the city or town becomes liable to a higher rate, and the difference must be prepaid, otherwise double the difference will be collected on delivery.

Re-directed letters should not be dropped into a Post Office Box or receiver unless additional postage has been put on to carry them to their second destination.

Request Letters.—Letters from places in Canada and the United States covered by envelopes bearing a "Request," either printed or written, that the letters be returned to the sender if not delivered within a certain specified time, will be returned as requested if not delivered in the time stated.

Printed or written requests for direct return may be complied with in the case of undelivered letters from Newfoundland.

Specimen numbers may be sent at 1 cent per lb. British and Foreign newspapers and periodicals mailed to subscribers in Canada, by Canadian news agents, are subject to the prepayment of a bulk rate of 1c per lb.

Third Class Matter, Newspapers and Periodicals.—Transient newspapers for any place in Canada or United States, 1 cent per 4 oz., but a paper not more than 1 oz. will go for ½c. Local newspapers and periodicals not weighing more than 1 oz., for delivery in city ½c. each. For Great Britain and other European countries, see Foreign Postage Table.

Books, etc., and Miscellaneous Matter.—The postage on Books, Pamphlets, Circulars (wholly in print), occasional publications, etc., addressed to Canada, is 1 cent per 4 oz. To the United States, Newfoundland, Great Britain and all European countries, 1 cent per 2 oz. The postage on Printers' Proof Sheets, Maps, Prints, Drawings, Engravings, Lithographs, Photographs, Sheet Music (whether printed or written, including music books, whether stitched or bound), etc., addressed to Canada, the United States, Newfoundland, Great Britain, or any European country is 1 cent per 2 oz. No package must exceed 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth. The limit of weight for Canada and United States is 5 lbs., for other Postal Union countries 4 lbs. Limit of weight for a single book addressed to places in Canada is 7 lbs.

Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs, Roots and Scions or Grafts can only be sent to the United States as 5th Class Matter; when posted for delivery in Canada, the postage is 1 cent per 4 oz., and the limit of weight 5 lb.

Commercial Papers and Legal Documents may be sent to Great Britain, Newfoundland, United States, and all Foreign countries, at 5 cents for the first 10 ounces, and 1 cent for every additional 2 ounces. These Papers, when posted for delivery in Canada, must be prepaid at Letter or Parcel Post rates—but Deeds, Wills and Insurance Policies may be sent if prepaid 1 cent per 2 oz.

Patterns and Samples.—*Bona fide* Patterns and Samples of Merchandise, not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, may be sent to any place in Canada at 1 cent per 4 oz. Must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Goods sent in execution of an order, however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private individual to another, not being actually Trade Patterns or Samples, are not admissible.

The limit of weight to United Kingdom is 5 lbs; limit of size, 2 ft. in length by 1 foot in width or depth.

The limit of weight to Belgium, Egypt, France, Hawaii, Roumania, Austria, Italy, Switzerland and Portugal is 12 oz.; limit of size, 1 foot in length by 8 in. in width and 4 in. in depth. If in form of a roll it may be 12 in. in length and 6 in. in diameter.

The limit of weight to other postal union countries, including the United States, is 8 oz.; limits of size same as for Belgium, Egypt, &c.

The postage on sample packets to postal union countries is 2c. for the first 4 ozs., and 1c. for each additional 2 ozs.

Fourth Class Matter, Closed Parcels.—Parcels for Canada must be prepaid 6 cents for 4 oz., and must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight, nor 2 feet in length, by 1 foot in width or depth. No correspondence must be enclosed. Invoices, accounts or receipts may be enclosed in parcels.

Fifth Class Matter.—Comprises such articles of general merchandise as are not entitled to any lower rate of postage. Postage 1 cent per oz., or fraction of an ounce. Limit of weight 5 lb.; of size, two feet in length by one foot in width or depth. Matter claiming to be 5th Class must be open to inspection, and there must be no correspondence enclosed except invoices or accounts. Packages of Fifth Class Matter may be sent to the United States for the same prepayment as is required within the Dominion, but the contents will be liable to Customs Inspection and collection of duty in the United States. Sealed tins containing fish, lobster, vegetables, meats, &c., if put up in a solid manner and labeled in such a way as to fully indicate the nature of their contents, may be sent as 5th Class Matter within the Dominion, but no sealed matter can be forwarded to the United States under this head. Liquids, oils and fatty substances may be sent to places in Canada and the United States as 5th Class, if securely put up.

Parcel Post with the United Kingdom, Newfoundland, Japan, Jamaica, Barbadoes, Leeward Islands, and certain other countries. Closed parcels may be sent to places in Newfoundland, Jamaica, the United Kingdom, Japan, Barbadoes, Leeward Islands and all other countries and colonies with which the United Kingdom maintains a Parcel Post. No correspondence must be enclosed. A Customs Declaration of the contents and value of each parcel must be filled up at the Post Office, or at one of the branches, by the sender.

Parcels for Newfoundland must be prepaid 15 cents per lb. or fraction of a lb., and must not exceed 7 lbs. in weight nor 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth.

Parcels for Jamaica and Barbadoes, Grenada, St Lucia, St Vincent, British Guiana, Turk's Island and Caicos Islands, must be prepaid 20 cents per lb. or fraction of a lb., and must not exceed 7 lbs. in weight, nor 2 feet in length, by 1 foot in width and depth.

Parcels for the United Kingdom must be prepaid 16c. for the 1st lb., and 2c. for each additional lb. or fraction of a lb., and must not exceed 11 lbs. in weight nor 2 feet in length, by 2 foot in width or depth.

Parcels for Japan must be prepaid 20c. per lb. or fraction of a lb., and must not exceed 7 lbs. in weight, nor 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth.

Information as to other countries to which parcels may be sent, and the rates applicable to each, may be obtained on application at the Inquiry Office, General Post Office, or at any of the Branch offices.

Registration.—Every article intended for registration must be handed in at the wicket, and a receipt obtained therefor. The fee on all classes of articles addressed to countries to which matter may be registered is 5c.

The sender of a registered article addressed to any Postal Union country may entitle himself to a certificate as to the disposal of the said article by the Postmaster at the office addressed, on prepayment of an additional fee of 5 cents. All Classes of matter may be registered to all destinations in Canada and throughout the Postal Union; and letters may be registered to most of the countries not included in the Union.

The public are reminded that registered letters are only carried on trains that are accompanied by railway mail clerk. Hence a registered letter and an ordinary letter posted simultaneously will often be received at different times.

Prohibited Articles and Publications.—Explosive, dangerous or destructive substance, or liquid, or any matter likely to injure usual contents of the mails, or the person of any officer or servant of the Post Office.

Glass, in any form, matches, liquids, fish, fruit and oils are prohibited unless put up in the manner prescribed under 5th class matter. Any obscene or immoral book, or other publication of an indecent, immoral, seditious, disloyal, scurrilous or libellous character, or any post card or post band or wrapper upon which there are words of the character aforesaid, or any letter or circular concern-

ing an illegal lottery, so-called, gift-concert or other similar enterprise offering prizes or concerning schemes devised and intended to deceive and defraud the public, and newspapers, etc., containing advertisements of any obscene and immoral prints, publications, etc.

Letters containing Gold or Silver Money, Jewels, or precious articles, or anything liable to Customs duties, cannot be Forwarded by Post to any of the Postal Union countries, except to the United States.
