THERE was recently held on the links of the Royal Montreal Golf Club at Dixie, Que., a most interesting Golf Tournament for lady golfers, in which competitors from many of the leading clubs in Ontario, Quebec and the Maritime Provinces took part. To-day The Standard reproduces the photos of several of these players, the poses being characteristic and natural.

Miss V. Henry-Anderson, of the R. M. G. C., won the Royal Canadian Golfing Association Ladies' Championship and the gold medal, defeating Miss Dick, of the Lambton Club by 5 up and 4 to play.

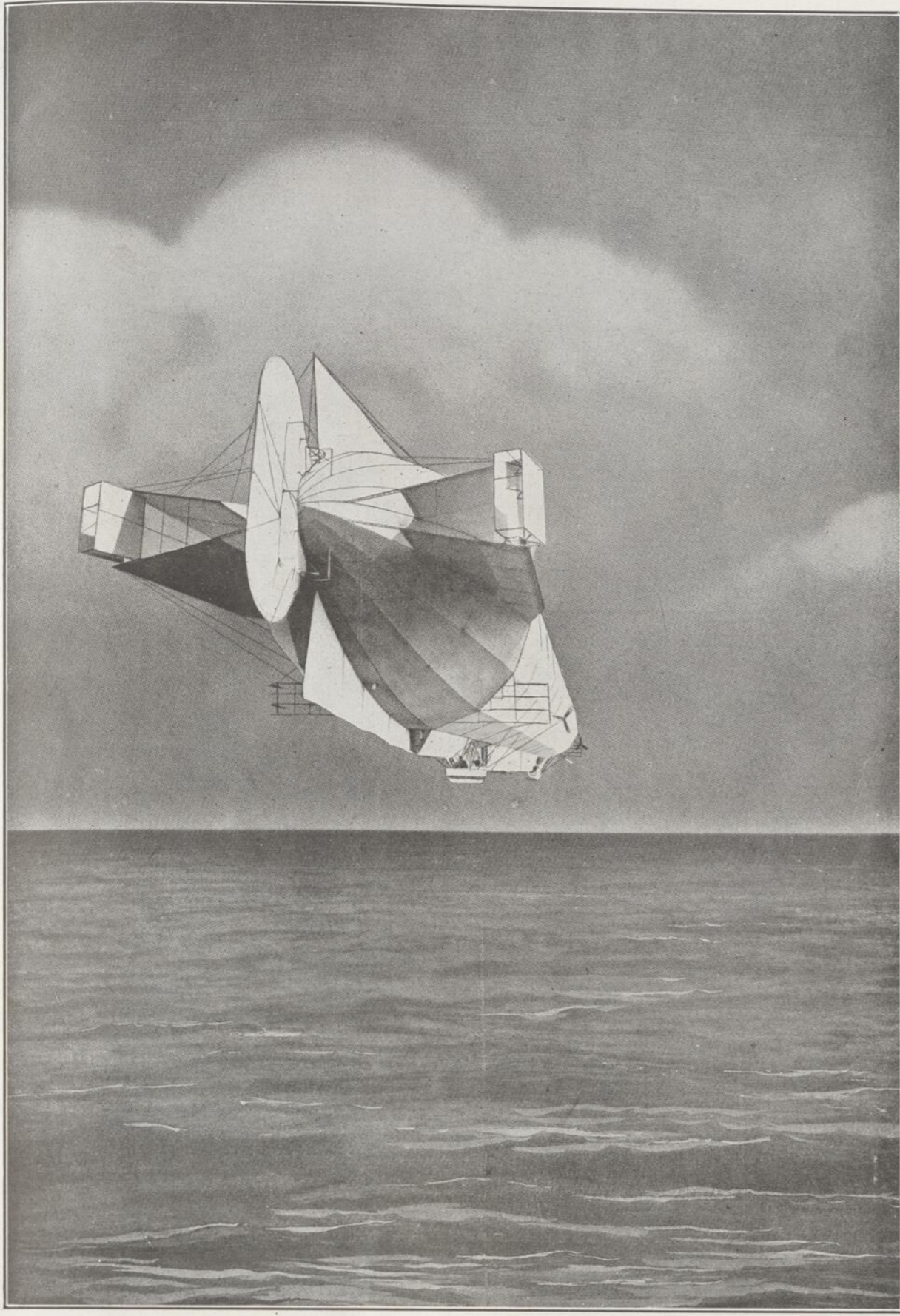

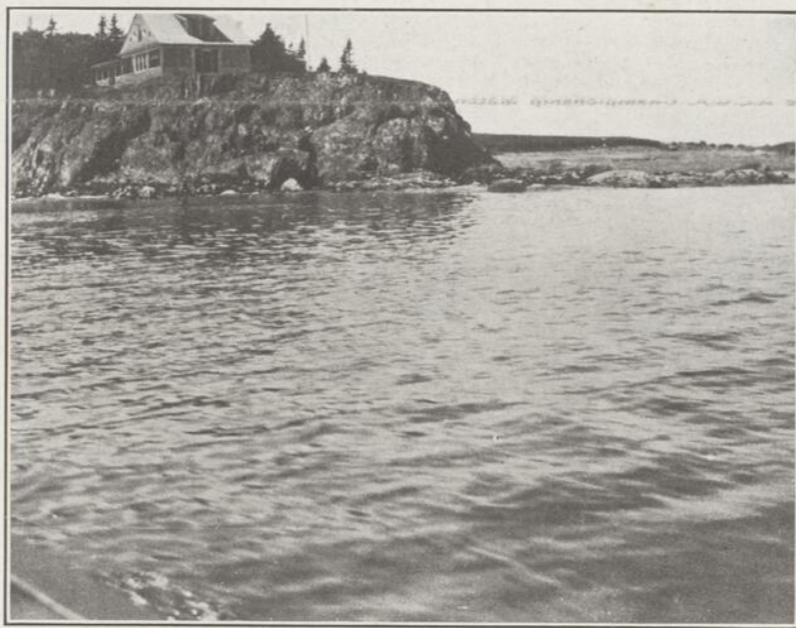

PEARY'S HOME.
Eagle Island, the summer home of Commander Peary, lies where the blue waters of Casco Bay, fretted by the sweep of the great Atlantic, fling the surf in eternal foam upon the reefs. On the highest cliff of the lonely island stands the house where Mrs. Peary and her daughter, Marie, have spent the last summer, awaiting news of the explorer's success. A huge sun-parlor, hung with walrus-tusks, bears' heads, small strangely-shaped snowshoes and other trophies of Arctic trips, surrounds the entrance at the front of the house, and here the master sat and planned the work that has gripped and held him many years, that has taken his life, and wealth, and crippled him, and would not let him go until he had "made good."
Anyone landing at the island is first greeted by a large husky, or Esquimau dog, which lopes down the sweep of velvety turf from the house to the little cove to welcome new-comers. This dog, the only one that Commander Peary did not take back north with him, is as kind and gentle as any lap-dog. His coat is thick and soft, white and glossy, and every one of his graceful movements reveals the power which makes his kind invaluable to his master's project.

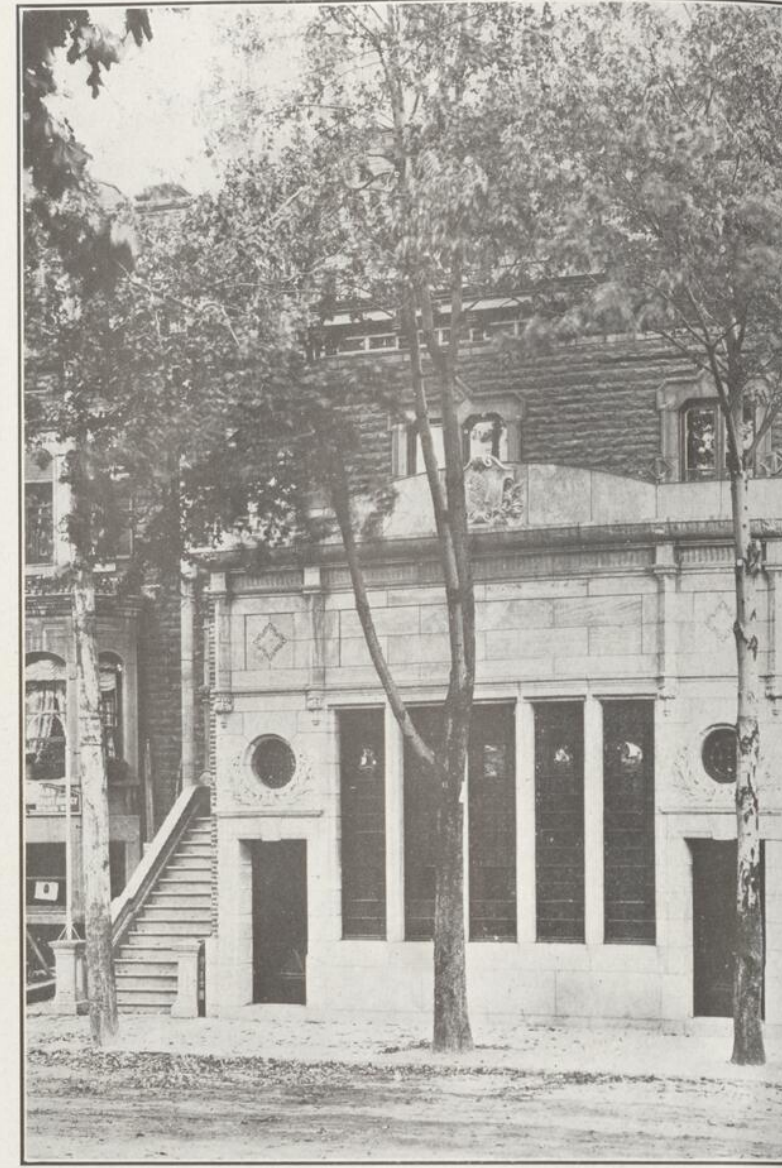
