LENNOXVILLE.

A village very attractively situated at the junction of the Massawippi and St. Francis Rivers; on the line of E. T. Railway, three miles south-west of Sherbrooke. It has a population of about 800. Mails are received twice each day from Montreal, (which is distant about 104 miles), and once a day from other directions. There is a good deal of activity observable in this village, and the number of persons who visit the place, especially in summer, is large. There are two churches, two large hotels, and it boasted two years ago of a large number of stores, but a destructive fire took place at that time which completely destroyed the main portion of the village, taking with it some fine buildings. There are at present about eight or nine stores.

The principal feature of Lennoxville, however, is its University of Bishop's College, which was constituted by a Royal Charter granted in the year 1852, and empowered to confer degrees in Divinity, Arts, Law and Medicine.

Bishop's College School was founded in 1857. Its general government is under the control and supervision of the College Council. The object of the School is directed to the imparting of such a general education as may fit boys for any calling in after life.
