12th annual Friendship Day a family affair

This year's theme 'Be a kid for a day, volunteer forever' reflects day's activities

LENNOXVILLE

Jam-packed with a full slate of activities for everyone aged one to 100, the 12th annual Lennoxville Friendship Day could be the best ever when it kicks off on Saturday morning.

Organizers have put together a wide assortment of events and features, beginning with a breakfast and parade to kick off the day, and ends with a fireworks display at 10 p.m.

"People are really talking about it, and looking forward to Saturday," says Chantal Carrier, Director of Cultural, Community and Recreational Activities for the Town of Lennoxville.

"We've really wanted activities for the whole family so people can take part in as many things as they can. We really wanted to emphasize that."

Falling on National Kids Day and during the International Year of the Volunteer, this year's Friendship Day features the theme 'Be a kid for a day, volunteer forever,' which highlights the fact that activities are for all ages, and that Lennoxville has a strong tradition of volunteerism.

"Our organizing committee is made up of all volunteers, and there are extra volunteers for the different events as well," says Carrier.

Highlighting the day's activities is the annual parade, which passes through the residential district of Lennoxville. At press time, some 45 entries were registered for the jaunt through town, but Kelley Patrick-Kobelt, who is the organizer of the parade, expected more as Saturday approached.

"Between (Tuesday) and Saturday we tend to get a lot of phone calls for more floats," she says. "It's a really fun event and there is no competition with the floats. After all, it's Friendship Day!"

Beginning at 10:30 a.m., the parade starts on the corner of Queen and Charlotte Street, turns up Church, then to Hunting, takes a left onto Speid, a right on Meade and then to Warren, Bown and Amesbury Streets before concluding back on Charlotte.

"It is an opportunity for organizations to show local talent," said Carrier of the parade.

This year, antique cars, clowns, highland pipe bands, horses and a covered bridge will be just

some of the entries in the parade.

"We try and keep the parade about an hour long so people can get down to Centennial Park and get started with the rest of the festivities," Patrick Kobelt said.

By mid-morning, a number of other events will also kick off. An artisans and organizations fair gets going at 10 a.m., as does entertainment at the tent being set up in Centennial Park. Folk art artist Janna will offer her expertise on her unique paintings and productions as well.

The artisans and organizations fair will allow enthusiasts to discover more about services provided by local organizations, while at the same time discover the many treasures by Eastern Townships artists. The event takes place inside and outside St. Antoine School. Entertainment, meanwhile, will involve singing, music and dancing for everyone's enjoyment.

In the afternoon, many more activities begin. A jaws of life demonstration will start at noon at the corner of Speid and Hunting, an open swim will be available between 1 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. at Centennial Pool and a kite flying session starts at 1 p.m. at Lennoxville Elementary School.

Other features include a book sale (1 p.m. - 4:30 p.m., St. Antoine School), a magic show (2 p.m. to 2:30 p.m., LES), puppet workshop (2-3 p.m., Uplands), hip hop dance (2-3 p.m., Amédée-Beaudoin Community Hall), an art and origami exhibit, an ice cream social, a barbecue supper (5 p.m., fire hall) and a youth dance (6-9 p.m., Centennial Park Tent).

The children's activities portion of the day includes a 68-foot long multi-game structure, which has sections for bouncing, slides, a ball room and a variety of other features.

A new addition to the Friendship Day menu is the installation of a mural in Centennial Park. People can sign, draw, paint or leave their mark on the mural from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

"We invite people to sign it with some sort of personal touch and be a part of Lennoxville history," says Carrier.

A special presentation of Hansel and Gretel, presented by the Town and Bishop's University, will be on stage at 1 p.m. and 7 p.m., while the fireworks blast off from Coulter Field, on the Bishop's campus to end the day.

"The fireworks, for sure, are the highlight," Carrier says.

"It's just fantastic. The facilities are good and people always enjoy them."

Workshops

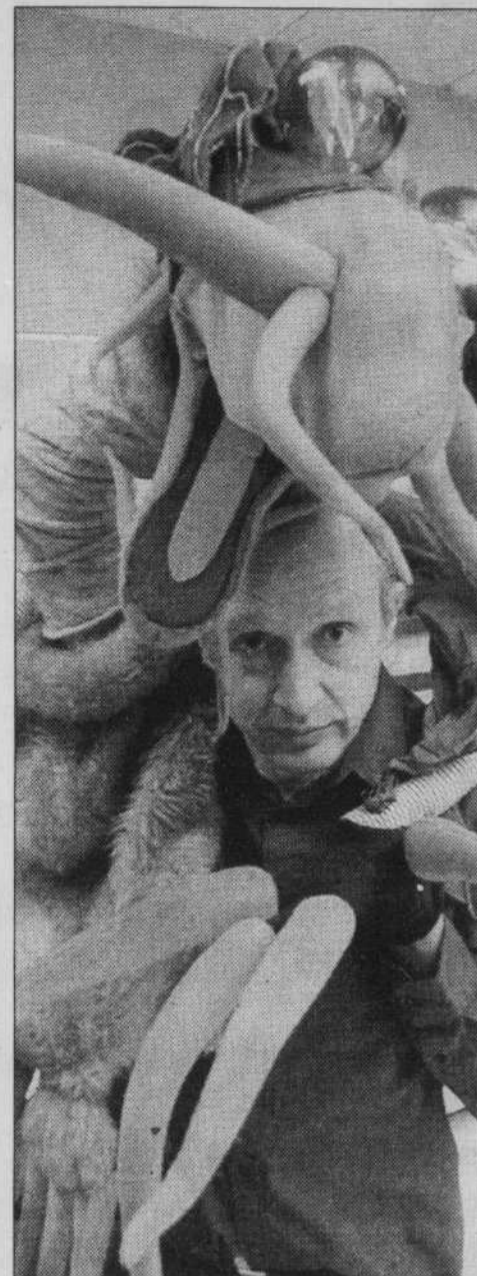

Montreal hip hop instructor hosts workshop

Jonah Leslie, guest dancer from Montreal, will host a hip-hop dance workshop at the Amédée-Beaudoin Community Hall from 2 - 3:30 p.m.

Leslie, a young performer experienced in dance, grew up in a family of performers, and has been performing himself since he was seven-years-old.

The Montreal-native has studied martial arts, contact improvisation, break dance and Capoira. Additionally, Leslie has attended workshops at the prestigious International Dance Festival in Vienna each summer from 1997-99.

Highlighting an illustrious career, Leslie has also choreographed and performed in the New Year's Eve 2000 celebrations on Parliament Hill in Ottawa. For the last five years, he has taught hip hop dance classes at the National Theatre School in Montreal.

The workshop will last an hour and a half. Participants must wear jogging pants and shoes. Jeans will not be allowed.

Hansel and Gretel play

The Town of Lennoxville and Bishop's University will join forces Saturday to present the ever popular children's play 'Hansel & Gretel' at the Amédée-Beaudoin Community Hall at 4 and 7 p.m.

Students from Alexander Galt High School and Bishop's College School will present the fairy tale classic under the direction of Bishop's University drama student Amanda McCoy.

The idea for the production came out of a discussion the third year student had with drama professor Jo Jo Rideout.

"We were discussing how much we were interested in fairy tales," McCoy told the Record in an earlier interview.

"Jo Jo and I were talking about how sometimes the children we're working with don't know the fairy stories any more and I kept coming back to this one. I wrote a whole bunch of different versions and I sat down and wrote it up."

The play's director decided it would be fun to tackle some of the nagging doubts she'd had about fairy tales throughout the years.

"I just wanted to make it a bit more fun," she added.

This is not McCoy's first project. Last semester she worked on plays for the summer drama camp, and also created a drama handbook that featured games and activities to be used for teaching drama to children, with the assistance of Jo Jo Rideout.

The production lasts approximately a half an hour. Admission is free.

Good Food

There will be plenty of places to enjoy good food at this year's Friendship Day.

Enjoy a wholesome start to the day by attending the United Church Community Breakfast, served in the church hall from 8:30-10 a.m. Families eat for \$20, \$7 for adults and \$6 for children (six to 12 years of age). Children under five eat for free.

The Unity Lodge #8 will once again offer its canteen services at Centennial Park. Located beside the pool's building, the canteen will offer hot dogs, hamburgers and drinks.

The Lennoxville Curling Club will also offer lunch, accompanied by the Historical Society's Ice Cream Social. The social will be held from 1:30 to 4 p.m. at the Uplands Cultural and Heritage Centre.

Closing out the day is the annual Firefighters Association barbecue. For \$8 adults will sample succulent barbecue chicken served with fries and coleslaw. Children can eat two hot dogs for \$3.50. The barbecue starts at 5 p.m. and is served in the Fire Hall.

The weekend will end in fine fashion Sunday morning with the Firefighters breakfast. Served from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m., the breakfast/ brunch features bacon, eggs and pancakes for \$5/person.

Kite workshops

Kite flying and introductory workshops are just a few highlights at this year's Friendship Day.

Visitors can make their own kites thanks to the guidance of on-site workshop leaders from Cerfs-volants en fête (A Festival of Kites). The Workshops are designed for kids aged five and over. Parents should accompany their children.

Participants will learn about kite history and styles. There will also be a festival of kites on Saturday.

Admission is free to both events.

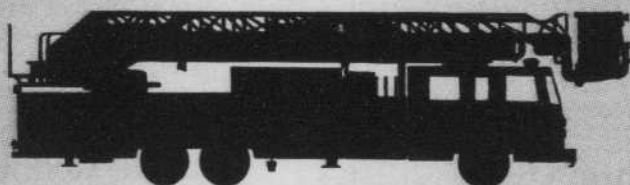
