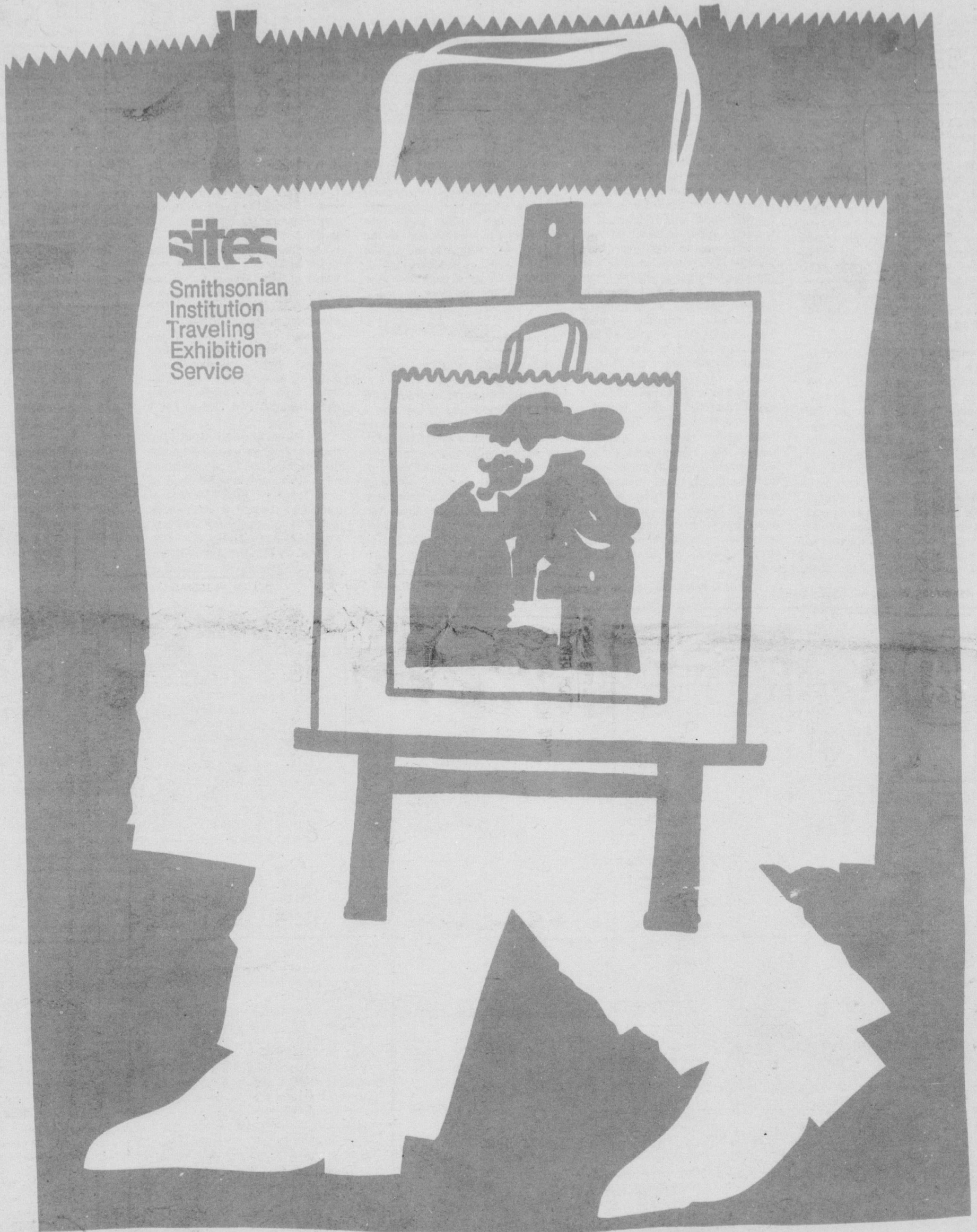

Bag as art

Mack Feldman's ass is in the bitter seltzer — what?

"The Road To Gandolfo" by Robert Ludlum (BANTAM): \$3.75, 291 pp.

Robert Ludlum -- the very name of the author conjures up a myriad of images identified with the international espionage game. Double agents, moles, informants, secret code identifications. But wait! -- What kind of code is "Mack Feldman's ass is in the bitter seltzer!" -- with the reply "Mac's in felt! His sight's in an auto bomb's flower pot!" And what kind of Ludlum hero gets deported from China for shooting the privates off a 10-foot jade statue while serving as the American military representative? The kind that inhabits Ludlum's hilarious bestseller, *The Road To Gandolfo*, because General MacKenzie Hawkins is the most unforgettable of the thriller-writer's long parade of protagonists.

When Major Sam Devereaux, an attorney with the Office of the Inspector General sets out on his orders to discredit the bawdy, irreverent Hawkins, he gets entangled in one of the most unorthodox plots in all of the literature devoted to spys and big heists. General Hawkins uses his wife and his cunning to blackmail Devereaux and force him into an unholy alliance that has as its goal the kidnapping and ransom of Pope Francesco the First for the sum of \$400 million (an assessment of one dollar per each communicant in

the world from the treasury of the Holy See).

The scam is carried out with the intricacy of plotting that readers familiar with Ludlum have come to expect -- except in this case the writer's tongue is always deep in his cheek. Devereaux is sent as emissary from Hawkins to come up with a \$40 million amount of working capital, to be bilked from a strange quartet of patsies. There is Angelo Dellacroce, an American mobster with his attendant group of heavies; Lord Sidney Danforth, a 72-year-old knighted curmudgeon in London, England; Heinrich Koenig, a Berliner who played fast and loose with both sides during the Berlin Blockage; and finally, Sheik Azaz-Varak, whose description is typical of Ludlum's comic manner in this novel --

"Below the outsized, narrow hooked nose, Azaz-Varak's lips were curled -- actually curled -- so that his thick black moustache seemed fused to his nostrils. The pallor of his skin (what could be seen) was a sickly beige, which served to emphasize the dark, deep circles under his heavy-lidded eyes".

The conning of Hawkins's marks, his assembly of the motley crew that is needed for the kidnap caper, and the manipulation of poor Sam Devereaux by means of the General's four buxom ex-wives, take up most of the narrative of *The Road To Gandolfo*, and the comedy is varied and constant -- right up to the surprise ending when Ludlum plays with the readers' expectations in the playful, off-beat manner of the entire book. "Gandolfo" is a distinct change of pace from the master of the spy story.

Record Reviews

Cliff Richard EARLY YEARS (CAPITOL-EMI)

Younger fans of popster Cliff Richard, the British rocker who is having at least his third go-round of recording fame in Canada, may be surprised at the scope of his career. The compilation of material that covers a period of almost 25 years may take the blush off Cliff's current status as teen idol, but he pre-dates the Beatles considerably. When he was known as "the British Elvis", Cliff crooned such ballada as "Livin'

Doll", the first million seller, which despite its international success didn't tear up the American charts. His meeting with the Shadows in September of 1958 -- almost 24 years ago! -- was a landmark for English rock, and the Shadows-backed numbers are represented on EARLY YEARS.

There is "Move It", one of the first manifestations of a British reaction to the Presley-Holly stamp on rock; "Bachelor Boy" is perhaps the best-known of Cliff & The Shadows' songs; plus the cover versions of Bobby Freeman's "Do You Wanna Dance", or Jerry Lee Lewis's flip side of his first big hit record, "It'll Be Me".

The Elvis cloning even extended to the movie route, and the title tracks of "The Young Ones" and "Summer Holiday" were not much better than the film music that attempted to change Presley from a rocker into a Crosby-like crooner. There are an even dozen of these vintage Richard tracks, including a couple of forgettable items such as "Goodbye Sam, Hello Samantha" or "Theme For A Dream".

Unfortunately the best Cliff Richard was the tracks on which the Shadows played a significant role -- there are too few of those to make EARLY YEARS the kind of compelling record it could have been with more judicious selection. Rod Stewart TONIGHT I'M YOURS (WARNER BROS-WEA) Chapter Two in the continuing

perils of blown-dry Rod, and his bisexual assault on the rock world -- in which Disco Rod returns to the ever-receptive, broad arms of Mother Rock, repentant and not a little embarrassed over his sell-out to the glitter avenues of Studio 54 & the Disco-mania of the seventies. Stewart, graduate of the Jeff Beck Group, and then the Faces, has enough true rock in his veins to tear any album apart, so his capitulation to the synthetic beats and over-produced sound of disco took many fans by surprise. They should be heartened by the return of Rod on this record, and he is to be commended for not making a big deal of the fact that the closing tune is dedicated to Terry Fox -- "Never Give Up On A Dream".

Doubt is dispelled by the savage rock syncopation of "Tora, Tora, Tora (Out With The Boys)", a full-speed, chugging, enervated slice of the old Faces style, with Rod's grating vocal working overtime. Even the songs such as "Only A Boy", with its nostalgia for Eddie Cochran, recalls the days when Rod made albums such as *Every Picture Tells A Story*.

This balanced, carefully produced album, plus the "Worth Leaving Home For" tour of late '81 and early '82, should do much to return Rod Stewart to his rightful place as a rocker whose roots go back to the early British days when the Small Faces were one of the most exciting acts around.

P.E.I. politics mar awards

The first Academy of Country Music Entertainment Awards, which will be held in Halifax Sept. 26, would have been telecast across Canada, but politics has once again interfered.

This time, however, it's not the industry politics that have kept previous awards' shows behind closed doors, but the politics of Prince Edward Island. "We had everything set, a sponsor, financing, everything was ready to go, and then the premier of P.E.I. called an election," says a frustrated Gordon Burnett, president of the academy -- a 600-member national industry organization.

Burnett explains that the academy hired an independent producer, who made arrangements with CBC in Halifax to broadcast the show in the Atlantic provinces. The broadcast would have been fed to Global Television in Ontario, which would have sent the program to its affiliates in the West.

But with the P.E.I. election Sept. 27, the Halifax CBC mobile equipment has to travel to the island Sept. 23 to be setup. No equipment . . . no show.

"We scrambled right to the last minute, looked at every possibility," Burnett says. "But we can't do it right, so we'll wait until next year."

Most country fans may be able to hear a taped broadcast of the awards' show on their local country radio station. Burnett says the show will be taped by CHFX in Halifax and sent to any station that wants it. Check with the country station in your area to see if and when it's carrying the program.

The awards, which replace the Big Country Awards, are the highlight of Country Music Week activities. The sixth annual music week will be held in Halifax Sept. 20 to 26. The event was created by a small group of Ottawa country artists in 1977 and since then

it's been held in Regina, Toronto, Winnipeg, Ottawa again last year and will go back to Regina next year.

"Country Music Week is really for the fans in the area hosting the week," Burnett says. "That's why each year we move from one part of the country to another."

Virtually all the top names in Canadian country will be in Halifax for five days of shows, exhibits and fan club activities, with the weekend reserved for industry seminars.

Major events will be held each evening at the Dartmouth Sportsplex, which seats 6,000 and has the acoustics of a concert hall, says Johnny Gold, co-chairman of the Halifax committee that's producing the week.

The week's events include performances by Maritime bands, a bluegrass night, a golf tournament, an East-West hockey game and a national talent show with 12 contestants sponsored by radio stations across Canada.

There'll be shows Tuesday and Friday nights with 25 to 30 nationally known acts such as Carroll Baker, Dick Damron, Marie Bottrell, The Midnite Rodeo Band, Terry Carisse, The Family Brown, Ronnie Prophet, Laura Vinson, Gary Fjellgaard, The Mercey Brothers, Eddie Eastman, The Carlton Showband, Tony Prophet, Harold MacIntyre, The Harvey Henry Band, David Thompson, Iris Larratt, and Ralph Carlson.

Vermont's 24-hour country comes to the Townships

In October 1980, radio station WLFE-102 FM went on the air as a 24-hour country music station. John Kimell, one of the station owners, said "If we'd only known how it was going to go, we would have done it a lot sooner."

The station had been one of Vermont's many FM rock stations when the decision was made to go country, eliminating competition from other stations.

The station is owned by John and Dave Kimell and employs 24 people. Its sister station, WWSR, is located in the same building in St. Albans and plays easy listening music.

"But," said Kimell, "LFE is the better station, revenue wise. We never play more than eight minutes of commercials during one hour though, and with the economy like it is, it could be only four minutes now."

Country music on radio has always been hard to find but the people at LFE are doing their best to satisfy the country fans. "At the moment, our territory extends south of Burlington," Kimell points out, "and it stretches west to Malone, east to the Green Mountains and north to Montreal. We're installing a radar disc on the mountain sometime before Thanksgiving and that will increase our signal even more."

WLFE is fully automated, the walls stacked with tape players

which provide a continuous supply of music. These are updated weekly to include the new songs and delete the old ones. "We like to stay main-stream country," Kimell said. "We do include bluegrass occasionally, but many listeners don't like that, so we try to be consistent and lean toward conventional country."

When the station first started with country music, it had a disc jockey doing a two-hour show twice daily. Tyrone T. was on the air from 6 to 8 in the morning and from 3 to 5 in the afternoon, playing records and interviewing people in country music. "The trouble with having a DJ is that he often plays what he wants to hear instead of what the listeners want. Also, the records skip sometimes," Kimell said.

The combination of a live disc jockey and automation is called 'Live Assist' in radio language. Kimell says "We would like to try a disc jockey again if we can find an aspiring D.J. to work for two or three hours per day. It would add a personal touch to the station."

"We still have people in the booth for the news," Kimell explained, "but my philosophy is that if people want to hear the news, they'll listen to a bigger station. We just play music unless something major happens."

LFE is always looking for special programming. Two of the more popular ones on now are the 'Nashville Record Review' which

focuses on the top 10 songs in the country, and the 'Top 30 Country Countdown', heard every Saturday morning from 9 till 12. The latter is one of the more popular spots for advertisers.

"The reason country music is so popular," Kimell added, "is that a lot of people who grew up with rock and roll can't take it anymore. They can't stand the loud music, so

they turn to country."

"We know how many listeners we have in the U.S.," Kimell said, "but we would like to know how many Canadians listen to us."

"The trouble with our surveys," he pointed out, "is that our U.S. surveys include the Canadian stations, but your Canadian surveys do not include American stations. As a result, we have no

way of knowing how many listeners in Canada we have."

"We'd like to hear from people in Canada," Kimell said, "in fact, we'd like to hear from all of our listeners. We're open to suggestions about what listeners want. We try to please our audience. The problem is that we know we can get better, we're just not sure how."

No cheers for unsympathetic government

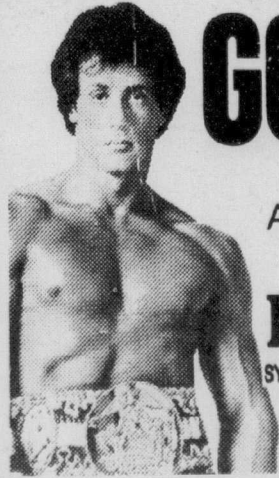

Centre culturel's new season

Sherbrooke area 'culture' addicts are in for a stupendous entertainment fix this year in the form of the program of the Centre Culturel of the University of Sherbrooke. The Centre, whose Salle Maurice O'Bready contains the largest regional performing arts stage, will be offering a program of 28 different events covering the fields of Cinema, Dance, Music, Theatre, Great Explorers and Variety.

Along with a first-rate selection of entertainment, the Centre has put together a tremendous bargain package through its Carte Acces. By subscribing to the coming season in one or more of the areas and obtaining a Carte Acces, a patron can qualify for price reductions, preferential ticket purchasing, plus a 10 per cent discount on the purchase of books, records, furniture and works of art at several stores in the Sherbrooke area.

If you are more inclined to straight music, the Centre Culturel will be presenting a full season of instrumental and voice performances. The Quebec Chamber Opera will open the season with a rendition of the comic-opera, *Le Medecin Malgre Lui* by Charles Gounod.

A little later in October, the Quebec Symphony Orchestra will be on hand to present *An Evening in Vienna* under the direction of Pierre Morin. The Centre will also present the Miroslar Vitous Jazz Ensemble, soprano Joan Patenaude-Yarnell, flutist Alain Marion and the irrepressible Canadian Brass.

The Theatre section of this year's program is also extensive. Starting on October 9 with a Bill C. Devis comedy entitled *La Chaire*, the season will include 10 other presentations.

Among these will be the well-known *Mime Omnibus* which delighted Centennial Theatre audiences last year and another comedy by Marc Camoletti entitled *La Bonne Anna*. The French-language *Deux a Dos* by Bernard Slade will arrive in November to be followed by *Le Malade Imaginaire*.

Possibly of interest to many local theatre goers will be a production of Neil Simon's *The Sunshine Boys*. This delightful Broadway play

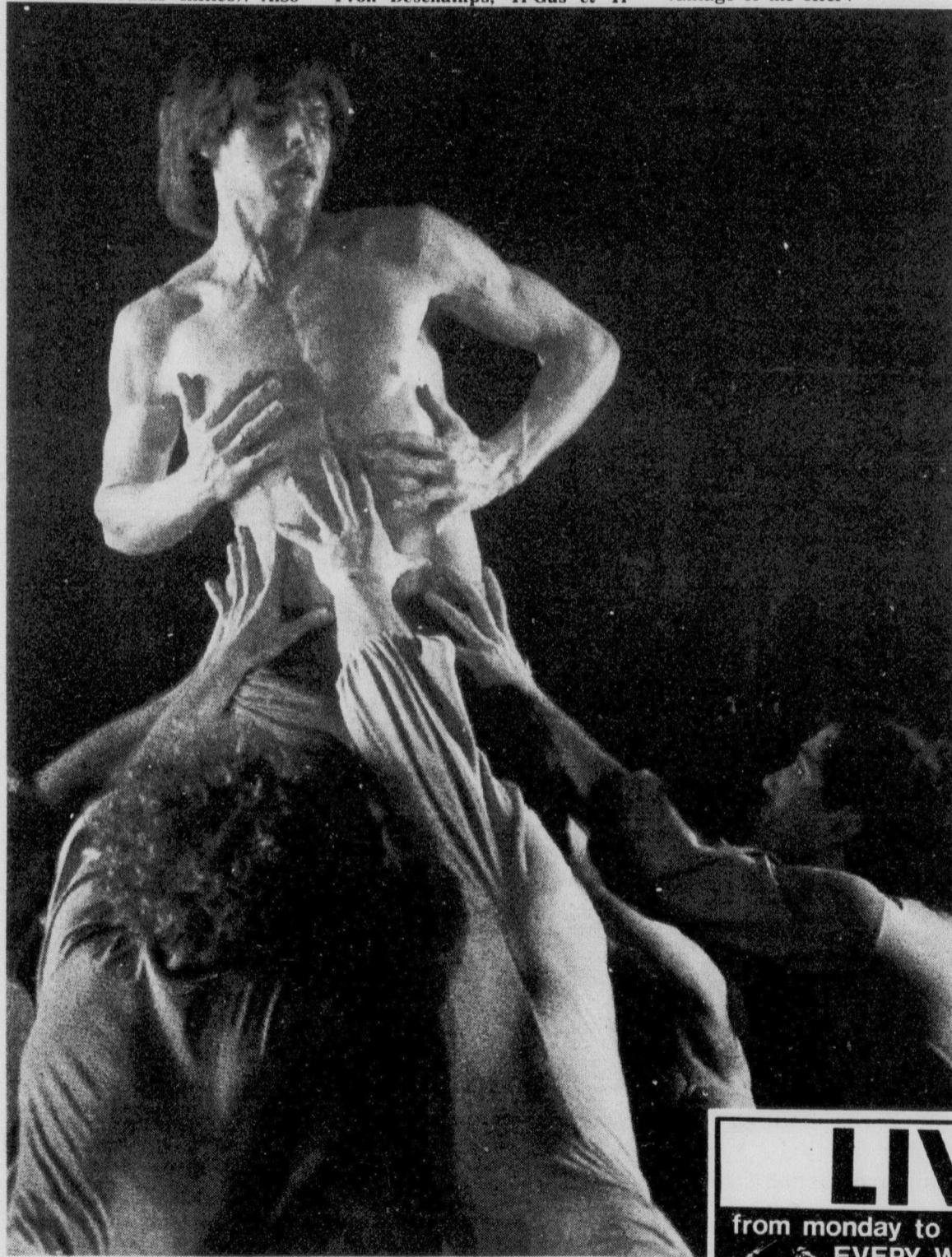

These are not by any means all of the events being offered this year. The program is wide and varied and will include a performance by Yvon Deschamps, Ti-Gus et Ti-

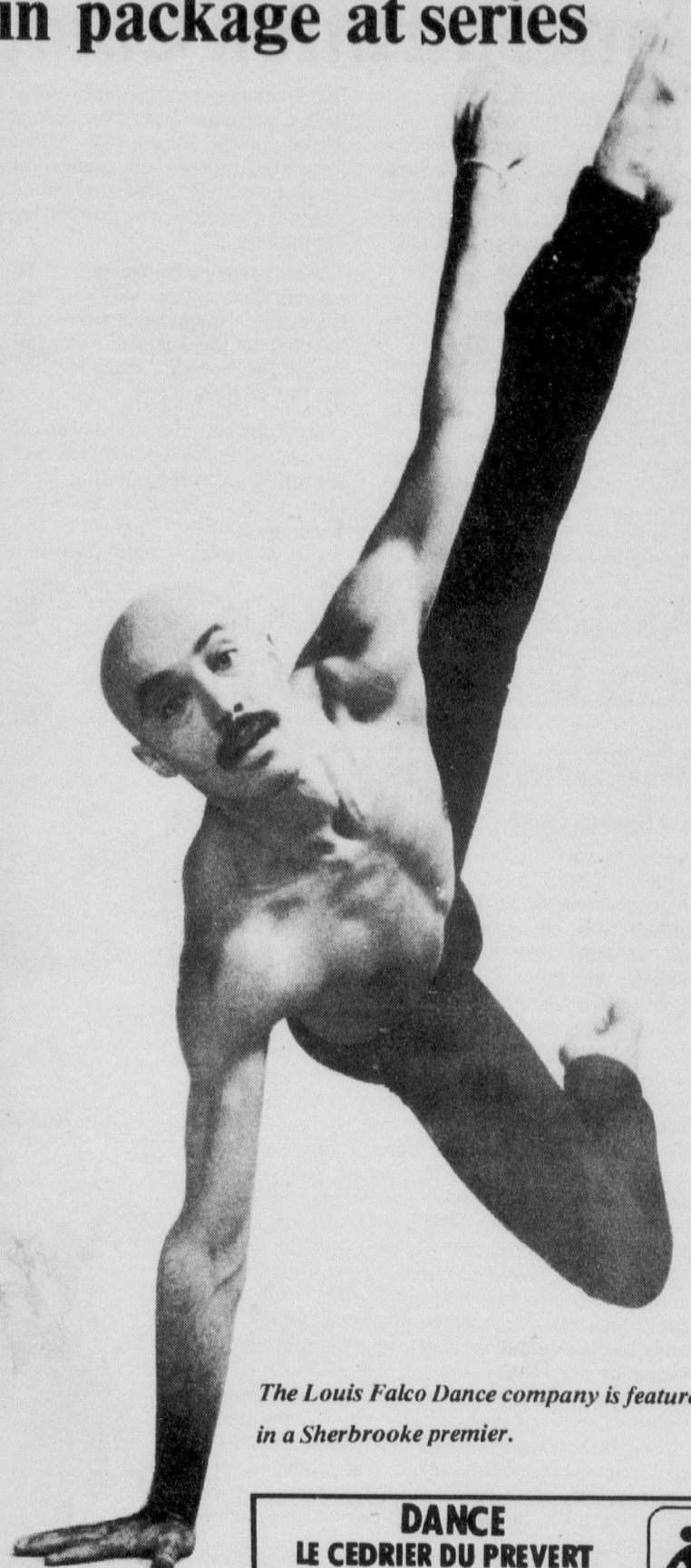

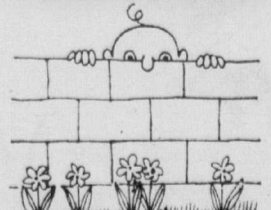

Concentration Camps bound to cause discomfort

Concentration Camps: North America - Japanese in the United States and Canada During World War II, by Roger Daniels, Robert E. Krieger Publishing Company Inc., Malabar, Florida.

On Thursday, February 19, 1942, a day "that should live in infamy", the then President of the United States, Franklin Roosevelt signed an executive order that resulted in the deportation of thousands of Japanese-Americans from their homes in California, Washington and Oregon into the interior of the United States.

Five days later, on February 24,

the Canadian government under heavy pressure from the United States and the citizenry of British Columbia issued an order in council resulting in the same basic fate for Canada's ethnic Japanese community.

With a sweep of the pen, both nations had given way to the hysteria and latent racism that had bubbled to the surface following the attack on Pearl Harbour and the fall of Hong Kong.

Although both the west coasts of the United States and Canada had a tradition of racism dating from the first contacts between Europeans and Indians, and reflected again during the late 19th

century anti-Chinese laws, it took the confusion and fear of war and invasion to codify the anti-Asian sentiments lingering barely below the surface.

In his book, Robert Krieger takes us once again to that period but with the benefit of hindsight and historical analysis. The author moves step by step through the legal and not-so-legal manoeuvrings of both governments and exposes their actions for what they were. It is his contention that the dislocation of both Japanese Americans and their Canadian counterparts was caused essentially by racism and economic greed, but even more important, that the compliance of

politicians in the infamous task came from fear of losing votes.

Whatever the case, it is clear that the property of the Japanese populations of the west coast was seized and in most cases sold to the local caucasian population usually at prices much less than the market value. It is also true that proper financial restitution was never provided for any of those affected.

Finally, it is true that thousands of loyal citizens of both countries were denied the basic rights available to their fellows because of their racial origin. The treatment of North America's German and Italian population who remained free throughout the war

bears witness to the essential racial character of the law.

Concentration Camps: North America, is not a new book. It was written originally in 1971. However, this second edition has been published with corrections and the addition of a section dealing with Canada and its Japanese population which is bound to cause a certain amount of discomfort for those who read it.

Too often, nations tend to gloss over the unsavory aspects of their history. **Concentration Camps: North America** is the unvarnished truth written in a compelling and lucid style. It is a book that all Canadians and Americans should read.

Assassins: A look at a too common phenomenon

American Assassins The Darker Side of Politics, by James W. Clarke, Princeton University Press.

The phenomenon of political assassination is no stranger to human society. It was the assassination of an Austrian arch-duke in Sarajevo that set off the first war and likewise it was an assassin's bullet that ended the life of Thomas D'Arcy McGee one of Canada's Fathers of Confederation. No where however, in the recent history of supposedly civilized western man, has there been greater concern over political assassination than in the United States of America.

From Richard Lawrence's attempt on the life of an aging Andrew Jackson in 1835, to the most recent attempt on the life of a president — that of John Hinckley against Ronald Reagan — assassination has been a regular feature of American life.

James Clarke, a political science professor at the University of Arizona, examines this tendency towards political violence in his book **American Assassins** and comes up with several interesting observations.

Chiefly among his conclusions, is that few of those involved in assassinations or attempted assassinations can be considered 'insane'. Clarke attacks, in no uncertain terms, the tendency by federal courts to accept a plea of insanity as a defense for those accused of violent attacks upon political figures.

Instead, the author offers four categories into which he places 14 of the most interesting cases starting with the unfortunate Lawrence and ending with Samuel Byck who desired to kill Richard Nixon and instead ended his life in a vain attempt to high-jack an airplane.

Two other individuals, Carl Weiss who shot Louisiana governor Huey Long, and James Earl Ray the man responsible for the 1968 slaying of civil rights leader Martin Luther King, are placed in a separate classification as 'atypical.'

Apart from Lawrence, who thought he was Richard III; Charles Guiteau, whose attack upon President James Garfield was motivated by the delusion that Garfield had unjustly refused him a cabinet post; and John Schrank whose insanity drove him to attack Theodore Roosevelt; there is, according to Clarke, little justification to claim any of the other assailants were in fact mad.

Clarke does not attempt to justify the motivation that drove the remaining individuals to their attempts except insofar as they shed light on the essential sanity of the individual involved. Whether it be Lynette Fromme, whose attack on Ford was in fact motivated by the prevalent environmentalist and humanitarian concerns of the sixties, or Lee Harvey Oswald who was driven by a confused amalgam of leftist rhetoric, each and every one is presented as a person who in fact was very much aware of their actions and the consequences.

The book is at one and the same time a frightening look at American society and a condemnation of a justice system that tends to equate insanity with opposition to the accepted political status quo. It is entertaining, if disturbing reading, and is an illuminating look at a practice that has become all too common.

Hale, McDermott, Plomteux talent graces Arts-Sutton show

SUTTON — Amanda Hale, A.D. McDermott, and Myriam Bardoul-Plomteux juxtapose similar composition and color-sense in different mediums this weekend at Arts Sutton. Hale's forte is watercolor, McDermott masters pastels and tissue collage, and Bardoul-Plomteux is the most accomplished batik dye artist ever displayed here.

All three show Oriental influence, but from different parts of the Orient. Hale draws her themes from ancient Egypt and India. McDermott's most striking pastel is a harbor view of Istanbul with the mosque-cathedral Santa Sophia in the background. Bardoul-Plomteux's deceptively simple curves, fine dark lines, and board sweeps of color meanwhile call to mind 19th century Japanese prints.

All three also provide plenty to look at, pricing relatively low by Arts Sutton standards. The show's only weakness is that Hale and

McDermott each venture somewhat into the other's medium, with results falling short of what's across the gallery. McDermott's brush-work, both in oil and watercolor, isn't yet equal to her drawing and collage.

At the same time, Hale's drawing appears competent but uninspired beside watercolors like 'Layers', which assemble a variety of Egyptian artifacts in a manner calling to mind both hieroglyphics and multiple-exposure photography. 'Layers' belongs to a group of paintings whose texture resembles that of parchment. The overall effect is a multi-dimensional bridge from past to present.

Hale's many mandalas are very quiet compared to those the Hare Krishna people used to sell on sidewalks. They're probably also more authentic.

McDermott seems most energetic in approaching boats and water. Another especially brilliant pastel is 'Cinques Madeira',

depicting painted fishing boats lined up on a beach. Her most impressive collages include 'Wings O' Th' Morning', of a sailing ship in rough weather, and 'Sampan.' But the same talent for making much of inexpensive materials appears in 'España', of a bullfight, and 'Artemis', of a Greek temple on a mountaintop.

Bardoul-Plomteux uses the most difficult approach to batik—waxing and full-dip dyeing rather than brushing on her dyes—to get even colors. This is a difficult medium to begin with, since the colors change between application and development via sunlight or a hot iron. The true measure of her skill is that she makes it all look easy and uncomplicated. Her subjects are unremarkable—flowers, a woman sitting in a field—but her execution is smooth, harmonious, and distinctive.

Arts Sutton will be open on Saturday and Sunday, September 18 and 19, from 11 a.m. until 6 p.m.

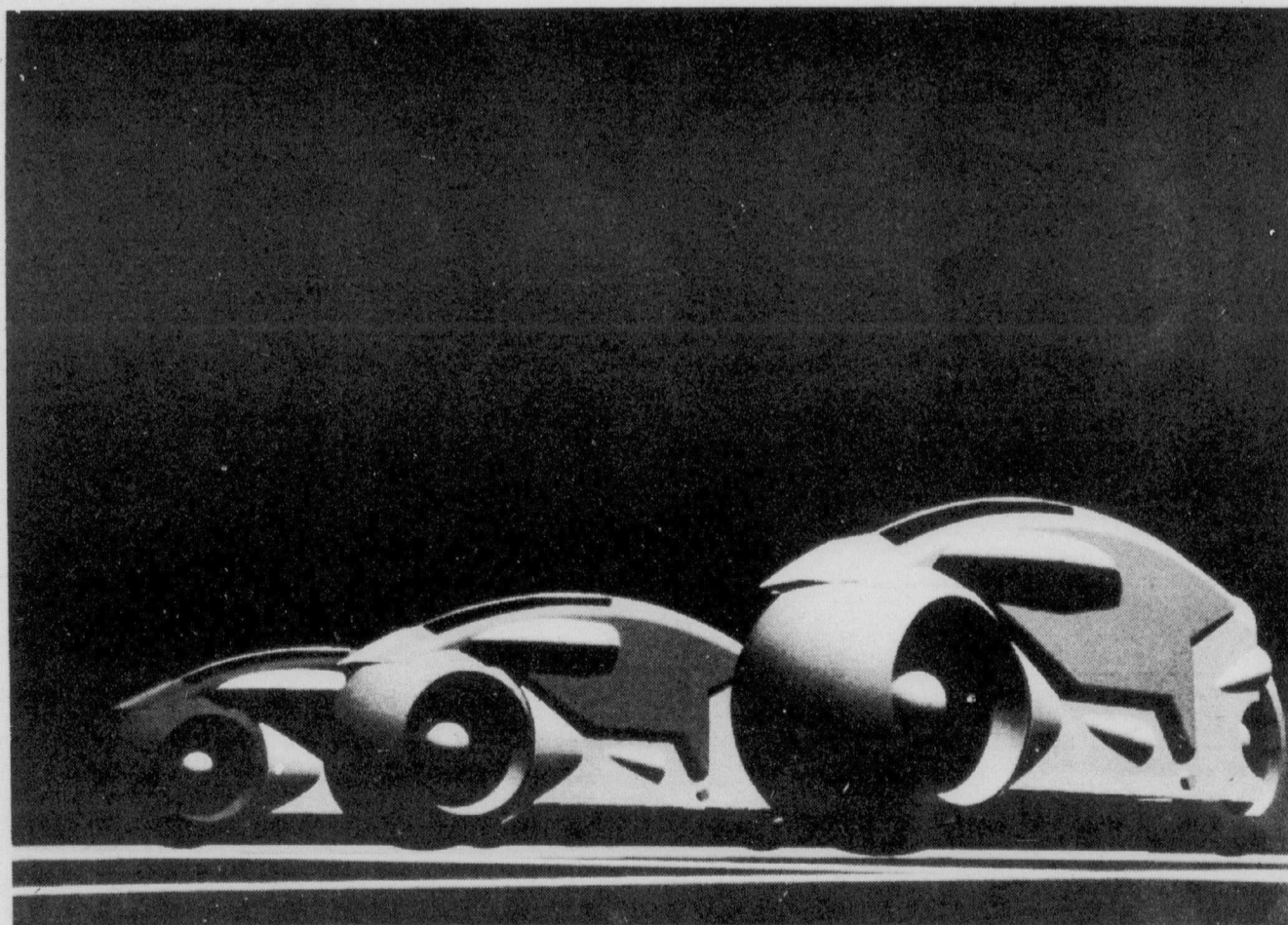

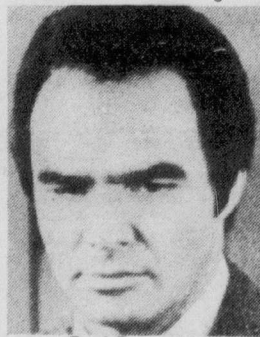
Burt will be active with his USFL 'Bandits'

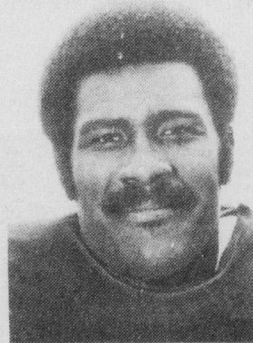

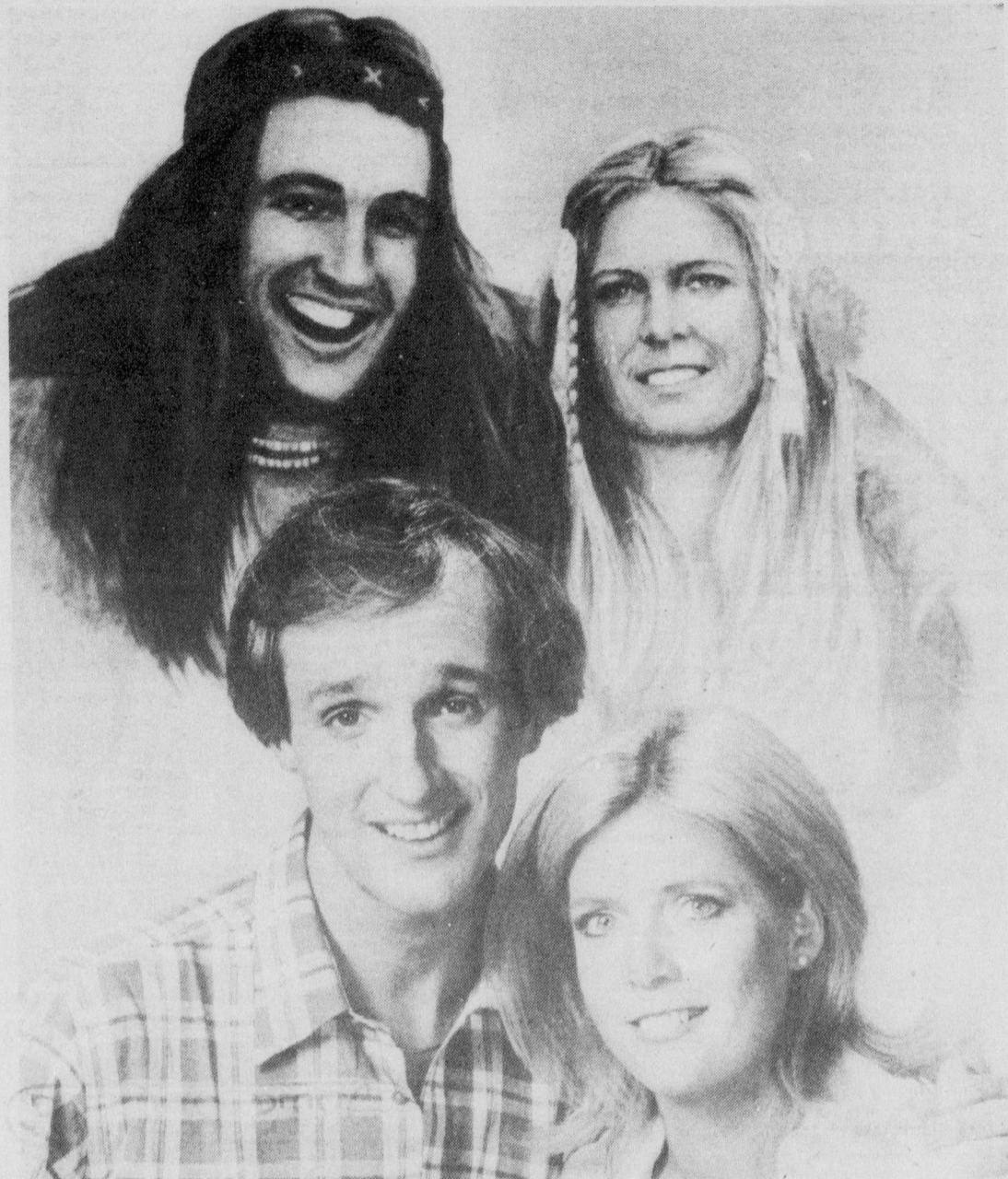

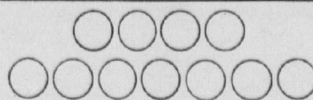

VIRGINIA BEACH, Va. — Nicholas Benedict, a lead player in soap operas over the last eight years and twice nominated for an Emmy Award as best actor, has joined the cast of the Christian Broadcasting Network's continuing daytime drama, "Another Life."

The announcement was made today by David M. Hummel, "Another Life's" executive producer.

Benedict, recognized as one of the top actors in the world of soap opera, played a lead role in "All My Children" on ABC-TV for six years, and in both 1978 and 1979 was an Emmy nominee for the best actor award. More recently, he starred for two years as Michael Scott on ABC-TV's "The Young and the Restless."

He has been guest host three times on the "Mike Douglas Show," and has made appearances on such programs as the "Dinah Shore Show," "The Carol Burnett Show," "The Phil Donahue Show" and "Good Morning America."

He has played leading roles in many television shows as well as in films, plus making national television commercials.

"The presence of Nicholas Benedict on the show will increase the dramatic value of 'Another Life,'" Hummel said, "and will go a long way in helping us realize our goal of making it the number one dramatic show on cable television."

"Another Life" is on nearly 3,200 cable systems

that make it available to about 17 million households throughout the United States and is seen also on about 20 broadcast stations.

Hummel said Benedict will play the role of Ron Washington, an underworld character who challenges Vince Cardello (Michael Ryan) for pre-eminence in the Kingsley crime scene.

"We're sure that he will add to the excitement level of 'Another Life' as our story takes a new twist," Hummel said. He would not disclose anything further about Benedict's role with "Another Life."

Emily MacLaughlin still Jessie after all these years

It's only been two years since "General Hospital" came to national attention, scoring a first for soap operas by capturing the covers of both Newsweek and People. As Luke Spencer, Tony Geary has almost become a household name.

But "General Hospital" has been around a lot longer than Tony. Perhaps the biggest celebrity to true "GH" fans is Emily MacLaughlin who has played nurse Jessie Brewer since "GH's" first episode on April 1, 1963.

As Jessie, Miss MacLaughlin has gone through more traumas than anyone on daytime television. Over the years, she's been married at least five times. The one great love of Jessie's life, Phil Brewer, was played throughout the years by five different actors.

Up until when producer Gloria Monty took over the show three years ago, Miss MacLaughlin always had a front-burning storyline. But when asked about her current show activities, Miss MacLaughlin deadpans "What storyline?"

Though relegated to a few short lines spoken from behind the nurse's desk on each episode, Miss MacLaughlin accepts the situation as the true acting pro that she is.

"I think Gloria Monty is an incredibly good

producer. And it's good to feature young people — it's made us No. 1 in the ratings. And I always remember that before Gloria took over we were headed for a definite cancellation by the network."

Although Miss MacLaughlin's air time is limited on the show, in her off-hours, she makes as much as possible from her fame as Jessie. Recently, she and long-time castmate John Berardino, who plays Dr. Steve Hardy, did a cameo in the hit film "Young Doctors in Love."

Says Miss MacLaughlin of that experience: "I haven't had so much fun in years. When John and I came to the film studio there was no script and no wardrobe call. Gary Marshall, our director, asked us to improvise. We tried to get as much GH 'in' stuff, like a reference to the black sweater Jessie has been wearing for the last 19 years."

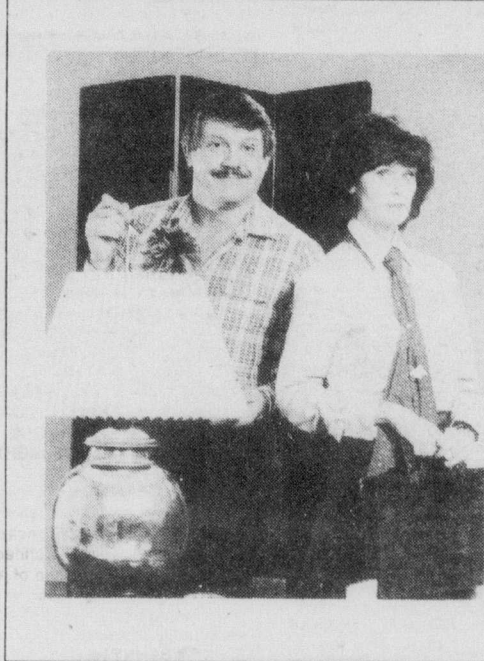

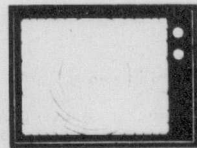

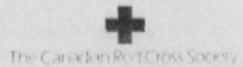

The 34th Emmy Awards, TV's version of the Oscars, will air on ABC, Sunday, Sept. 19, from the Pasadena (Calif.) Civic Auditorium.

Co-hosts are John Forsythe (Blake Carrington on "Dynasty") and Marlo Thomas ("That Girl").

Among the highlights of this year's nominations:

NBC's "Hill St. Blues" received 21 Emmy nominations. The police-action show, which struggled in the ratings when it debuted in 1981, won many Emmy awards last year. The

show's impressive Emmy showing helped boost its fortunes in the prime-time wars.

"Fame," another NBC entry, has been nominated for 12 Emmys, despite the fact that the show has yet to lure a sizable audience. Both "Fame" and "Hill St. Blues" were nominated for Outstanding Drama Series.

Ironically, "Taxi," which was canceled by ABC and subsequently picked up by NBC, has eight nominations. If the show wins a few Emmys, NBC's decision will seem justified.

'82 Emmys: 'Hill St.,' 'Fame,' lead pack

Prime-time's two hottest series, "Dynasty" and CBS' "Dallas," each have two nominations.

Other canceled shows that have not escaped the attention of the Academy of Television Arts and Sciences include ABC's "Barney Miller" with five nominations, CBS' "WKRP" and ABC's "Police Squad," both with two.

Off-network shows did well. "A Woman Called Golda" which was telecast on the Operation Prime Time network, drew seven nominations, while PBS'

"Brideshead Revisted" received 11.

NBC's Broadway adaptation of "Ain't Misbehavin'" obviously piqued the Academy's interest, since it received eight nominations.
