It contains 1 bank, 12 stores, 1 Roman Catholic church and convent, 1 hotel, 1 foundry, agricultural implement factory, butter and cheese factories, and several saw and grist mills, and has a large trade in flour and lumber. Steamers ply semi-weekly to and from Quebec, and every fortnight to Montreal. A ferry is also made to the south shore, viz., Lotbiniere, St. Emile and Deschaillons, every day at the convenience of patrons. Pop. 1,200.

LASALLE, a town on the North Shore of the River St. Lawrence, situated between Verdun and the City of Lachine. Was but recently erected into a town by the Provincial Legislature, which granted it a charter. At the present time it is exclusively a residential district; and is the home of many wealthy Montrealers. There are some beautiful farms which are all well cultivated. There are also several dairies which supply cream, milk and butter to the City. The Federal Government has lately opened a branch of its Savings Bank. There are also a Post Office Branch; two private schools; telephone and telegraph communication with the City of Montreal. In case of fire, the locality is protected by the City of Lachine fire brigade. The town of Lasalle is a beautiful summer resort and was formerly the "Lower Lachine Road." It has a fine view of the Lachine Rapids and the Nuns Island as well as Laprairie, Caughnawaga or the Indian Village and the Western part of the City of Montreal. The population is about 600. The town has a Recorder's Court and a Municipal Office which presently sits at No. 15, 19th Av., Lachine, pending the erection of a new Town Hall.
