OTTAWA—The capital of the Dominion of Canada and one of the chief cities in Ontario, is somewhat picturesquely situated on the south shore of the Ottawa river, 87 miles from its confluence with the St. Lawrence, and at the mouth of the Rideau river. The city obtained its original name (Bytown) from its founder, Colonel By, an officer of the Royal Engineers, whom the Imperial Government commissioned in 1827 to superintend the construction of the Rideau canal. In 1854 Bytown, by an Act of Parliament, was created a city, and its name changed to Ottawa. In 1855, it was selected by the Queen as the permanent seat of Government of the then Province of Canada, and in 1860 was commenced the erection of the magnificent Parliament and Departmental buildings crowning Barrack hill. The splendor of these buildings, their fine commanding site, together with the beauty of the surrounding scenery, place them in a very enviable position compared with other structures used for similar purposes, and must ever be objects of interest to the tourist and stranger, and pride to the people of Canada. £75,000 was the original estimated cost of the buildings, but unforeseen causes, among which were excavations which had to be made in the solid rock, swelled this sum to nearly \$4,000,000. H. R. H. the Prince of Wales laid the corner stone during his visit in September, 1860. The style of the buildings, which form three sides of quadrangular figures, is Gothic. They are built of cream-colored Potsdam sandstone taken from a quarry in Nepean some 12 or 15 miles from the city. The arches of the doors and windows are constructed from red Potsdam sandstone obtained from the place of that name in the State of New York. The columns and arches of both chambers are of Arraprior and Portage du Fort marble. The external ornamental work is of Ohio

sandstone. The approach from Wellington street presents a very imposing appearance. The main building covers an area of 82,866 superficial feet, is 472 feet in length, and 572 in depth, from front of main tower to rear of library. The body of the building is 40 feet high, and the centre tower—the grand entrance—180 feet high. The Senate and Commons chambers are situated respectively on the right and left of the main entrance. Both are richly furnished, have stained glass windows, are large and airy, and in every respect well adapted for legislative purposes. A gallery is attached to each, capable of seating 1000 visitors. The Departmental buildings face inwards to the square. The eastern block is 318 feet in length, and 253 in depth, and the western block 211 by 277. The Governor General's offices are in the former. The buildings are all heated by steam and supplied with every modern convenience. The city of Ottawa is well laid out; its streets are wide, regular and uniform, and built upon with, in many instances, handsome stone structures. In the centre of the city, between Barrack and Major's hills, is situated the entrance to the massive locks (eight in number) of the Rideau canal, which divides the city into Upper and Lower town, and joins the Rideau river. A stone bridge crosses the canal connecting Sparks and Rideau streets. At the western extremity of the city are the celebrated Chaudière falls, a scene of imposing grandeur and beauty, unsurpassed in America except by the Falls of Niagara, and even these it rivals in many respects. A suspension bridge, erected at a cost of \$86,455, crosses this foaming chasm, and unites the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec. At the north-east end of the city are two other falls of some forty feet high, over which the waters of the Rideau pour themselves with wild impetuosity into the bosom of the Ottawa; although inferior to the Chaudière in point of sublimity and grandeur, they are not without many attractions to the admirers of Nature's works. Altogether the scenery around Ottawa is of unsurpassed beauty—wild, romantic, picturesque—presenting a variety rarely to be met with in any other part of the Dominion. The commerce of Ottawa is constituted almost wholly of lumber. On the Gatineau, the Rideau and the Ottawa rivers numerous mills are constantly in operation, manufacturing more of this truly Canadian staple than is done in any part of Canada. Millions of feet of square and sawn timber are annually exported from here to Great Britain and the United States. Ottawa's hopes are bright and promising; situated in the centre of a fertile and rapidly developing country; holding, as it were, the key of the lumber trade; possessing inexhaustible water power, which men of wealth and enterprise are yearly turning to account, as also every facility of communication with the principal cities and towns in Canada and the United States, it bids fair to hold no secondary position in the new Dominion. In the event of the Ottawa and Huron ship canal being carried into effect, it will stand on the great water highway to the West. Its natural capabilities of defence are great and important. Adjacent to Ottawa are several villages, prominent among which are New Edinburgh and Hull. In both large lumbering operations are carried on. Rideau hall, the residence of the Governor General, is situated in the former village. It is a handsome stone structure, with 35 acres of well laid grounds, and beautiful avenues of shaded trees attached. In Hull there is an extensive match factory, and near at hand iron mines which are being worked successfully. Ottawa returns one member to the House of Commons and one to the Provincial Parliament. The Ottawa River Navigation Company runs a daily line of steamers between here and Montreal during the summer months. Three times a day the St. Lawrence and Ottawa railway run trains to Prescott, connecting with the Grand Trunk and Ogdensburg railways. The Canada Central railway, now completed to Carleton Place and soon expected to be finished to Montreal, will also add much to Ottawa's pros-

perity. It has its terminus now at Le Breton flats, and makes connection with the Brockville and Ottawa railway for Sandpoint, on the Ottawa river, and Brockville on the St Lawrence, Montreal Telegraph Co. and the People's Telegraph Co. have offices here. Distance from Montreal 126 miles, from Prescott 54 miles, from Kingston 95 miles, from Toronto 233 miles, from Quebec 295 miles, from New York 450 miles, from Boston 485 miles, from Halifax 997 miles, from St John, N.B., 850 miles. Mail daily. Population about 25,000.

PEMBROKE—A progressive and thriving town on Allumette Lake, an expansion of the Ottawa River, township of Pembroke, county of Renfrew. It is the county seat. This village was laid out by Alexander Moffat, Esq. Thirty years only have elapsed since the ground on which Pembroke is built was reclaimed from the forest, in which time it has risen from the position of a mere lumbering post to the rank of chief town of one of the largest counties in the Province,—in enterprise, commercial prosperity, and the number and beauty of its public and private buildings rivaling many older places. The County buildings in particular, which are constructed of a beautiful freestone, quarried from an island in the vicinity, present a chaste and elegant appearance. Pembroke is the residence of a large number of lumber merchants, and being situated in the very heart of the Ottawa lumbering district, is the depot from which the supplies are drawn for the support of the army of men who are continually engaged in taking timber from the forests. On this business Pembroke mainly depends. The Muskrat River flowing out of Muskrat Lake, and emptying itself into the Ottawa about the centre of the town, is broken by a succession of falls for some distance from its mouth, thus affording an attractive acquisition to the town and several excellent water privileges. On this course numbers of saw and grist mills are erected. The scenery of the Ottawa above Pembroke is beautiful in the extreme, and were the means of reaching it more expeditious and direct, numbers of tourists and pleasure seekers would no doubt annually make their way thither. At present during the season of navigation the route to Pembroke is by the Union Forwarding Co's steamers from Ottawa daily, via Muskrat Lake and river; or by stage from Sand Point. One of the above named Co's steamers plies between Pembroke and Roch captain, the highest point of steam navigation at present on the Ottawa. Montreal Telegraph Co. has an office here. Distant from Des Jachins 45 miles, from Sand Point, the terminus of the Brockville and Ottawa railway 48 miles, from Roch captain 61 miles, from Ottawa 100 miles, from Montreal 230 miles. Mail daily. Population, including Campbelltown or Lower town, about 2000.

PETERBOROUGH—A flourishing and rapidly progressing town, situated on the west bank of the Otonabee river, in the township of Monaghan, county of Peterborough. It is the county seat. The site of the town is nearly level, with a few slight elevations, advantage of which has been taken in the location of the county and other public buildings. The streets are laid out very regularly, the principal ones being lit with gas. There is excellent water power, and manufacturing is extensively engaged in. Of sawn lumber, which is the principal production, about 23,000,000 feet are exported annually. The other manufactures embrace woollen goods, machinery, castings, agricultural implements, leather, &c. A considerable business is also done in wheat and flour. A branch of the Midland railway connects Peterborough with the main line at Millbrook for Port Hope and Lindsay. On the opposite side of the river is a large suburb, the village of Ashburnham, united to the main body of the town by a handsome bridge. The Cobourg, Peterborough and Marmora railway terminates here. Stages leave Peterborough daily for Norwood, Lakefield and other places. Montreal Telegraph Co. has an office here. Distant from Millbrook 13 miles, from Port Hope 31 miles, from Lindsay (by rail) 38 miles. Mail daily. Population about 5,500.

PETROLIA—An incorporated village in the heart of the petroleum oil region, township of Inuskillen, county of Lambton. The quantity of oil obtained in and around the place is immense, there being ninety wells now in operation, while over forty new wells are being sunk. About 8000 bbls of crude oil are produced weekly, of which 5000 crude and about 1000 refined are exported. Several large underground tanks have been built which are said to contain 100,000 barrels, and there are eight refineries at work producing over 1000 bbls weekly. The annual revenue obtained from the oil trade is over \$250,000, in addition to which lumbering is carried on here in the winter to a great extent.
