FROM TORONTO. Northern Railway—Election Trials—Death—Crucifixion—Satisfaction. TORONTO, Feb. 14. At the adjourned meeting of shareholders of the Northern Railway held yesterday, after a very long session, the report was adopted; new directors were elected as follows: Messrs.
