The U.S. Constitution has worked pretty well for over 200 years, yet the Philadelphia delegates didn't ask the man on the street his opinion.

Ratification was by delegates at state conventions except for Rhode Island, the only state to go directly to the voters in a referendum and the only state to reject the proposals.

Now everybody is entitled to an opinion and every opinion equally valid — no matter how ill-considered and misinformed.

That's democracy, see.

We are up to the dew-laps in opinion polls, call-in programs and chatter shows.

"56 per cent of the population believe Clarence Thomas over Anita Hill."

Over half of every broadcast day on CBC-TV is given over to talking heads, experts sounding off.

Ever wonder how somebody gets to be interviewed on radio and television as an 'expert'?

Do they pass a test and hang a certificate on their wall? "Qualified expert."

The *Oxford English Dictionary* defines an expert as "one

whose special knowledge or skill causes him to be regarded as an authority."

That implies a certain finality, a plateau from which an expert looks down upon those merely knowledgeable, experienced or skilled.

So why do they routinely contradict each other?

The distinct-society clause in the constitutional proposals is a case in point. It still "preserves and promotes" the French majority in Quebec while only "preserving" the English minority.

In hopes of getting a job as 'expert' someday, this wretched scribbler has been watching carefully and taking notes.

First, it appears an expert never 'talks' but always 'dialogues', and some even 'dialogue together'. Best of all was an expert therapist on a CBC chatter show who urged the need for "establishing a verbal communications relationship with another person."

'To dialogue' belongs in the flummery file with all the modern enthusiasm for turning objects into actions, nouns into verbs. We already *table* a bill, *chair* a meeting, *floor* an opponent and can quite confidently look forward to the day we *ceiling* a price, *door* a troublesome visitor or *coffee* a welcome guest.

Bobby Fisher, once a reasonably eloquent sports reporter for this very newspaper and now a tycoon versed in baffle-gab and flappedoodle, was heard on Louise Penny's chatter show to say, "I don't want to guilt people."

That was immediately picked up and passed on by another expert as perfectly reasonable but would have been blue-lined by any respectable editor.

Most of us hesitate to speak out in public for fear of sounding stupid but that never bothers experts.

The last time the Great B.M. visited his "personal friend" at Kennebunkport, President Bush told the entire English-speaking world, "There is a handful of people that sticks out like a sore thumb."

When Mike Tyson pleaded 'not guilty' to a rape charge, an expert on feminist issues erupted, "Sure he's innocent until proven guilty but what kind of message does that send men? That it's okay to abuse women?"

Some experts are so overpowering in their profundity, they get away with saying nothing at all.

On last week's *Nature of Things*, David Suzuki quite solemnly declared: "Adult females are especially crucial to the grizzly population."

A medical expert on *Newswatch* explained the virtues of a new drug which "cuts down hospitalization, makes the patient feel better and, more importantly from the patients' point of view, lets them live longer."

We're left wondering if medical experts have other priorities than extending the lives of patients — shaving a stroke off their golf score perhaps.

Sometimes the written word gets through rewrites and edits, too.

The September 16 edition of *Maclean's* said in an article: "Theories about the causes of crop circles range from unconfirmed assumptions about ex-

traterrestrial spaceships..."

"Unconfirmed assumptions" about extraterrestrials goes in the redundancy file with politicians consulting "personal friends", travellers at the border getting an "unexpected surprise", and the omnipresent "true facts" and "free gifts".

Historian Joy Parr wrote in the introduction to her last book of a need to "problematize binary oppositions", to "rethink categoricism" and to "see past conceptual signage."

Not many aspiring experts can hope to measure up to that but one on *Cross Country Checkup* habitually uses "as I have already explicated" and another on *Newswatch* said, "I am sure the unions will respect the customers' right to access their mail."

"Replicated" is a good word, too. It means copy.

"Reprise" is better than rerun.

Failure should always be "a no-win situation".

Losing money is "a negative rate of growth" while making lots of it is "maximizing profit potential."

Every good expert also knows how to reverse the common order of words to lend them import — "ongoing" for example, as in the education expert who said "We always have something ongoing going on," — up-scale, down-sizing, throughput, upturn.

MONTREAL (CP)—Veteran rocker Marjo carried off four Felix trophies and pop singer Julie Masse, a relative newcomer, won three at the annual Quebec music industry awards show Sunday night.

Marjo captured the rock record, rock show and pop song honors and appeared in the best videoclip.

She won discovery of the year and best first disc and beat out Marjo and eight others for best female singer.

Luc de la Rochelliere captured the male singer, pop-rock

record and pop-rock show categories. Richard Desjardins took the pop record and songwriter honors.

Celine Dion won two prizes, including Quebec artist with the biggest impact in a language other than French, a category formerly known as best anglophone artist. Dion caused a stir last year when she rejected the award and declared, "I am not an anglophone. I am a Quebecoise."

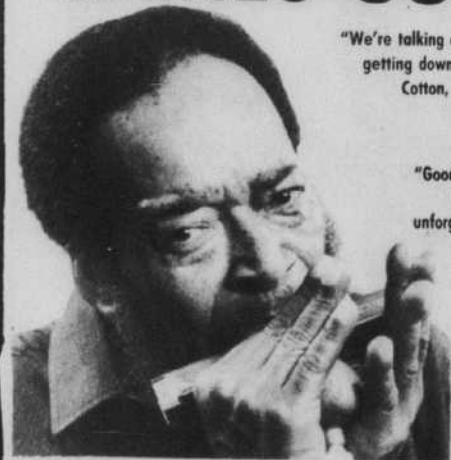
There were no such hitches in this year's show, staged at

The title for artist with the biggest impact outside Quebec went to singer Roch Voisine, who boycotted the gala because his manager was passed over in one of the backstage awards announced last week.

Local bicycle club holds free safety clinic

SHERBROOKE — Tomorrow morning, the bicycle club *Les Amis du Vélo de l'Estrie* will be holding a "safety clinic" at Parc Jacques-Cartier.

"We're going to be checking the bicycles over," said club treasurer Roger MacKay.

He added that the service is free for all those who attend.

MacKay said the clinic will begin at 10, after which is a ride through the parc's trail.

The club was formed in April with an emphasis on serving the community.

"Our aim is to establish a good relationship between cyclists and other people on the road and people in the community," he said.

"We want to encourage the art of cycling and for cyclists to know the safe routes," he ad-

ded. "We want to give good examples as cyclists to the community and encourage new cyclists."

He said the club's main activities involve going out on tours, which usually take place on Saturdays.

"We like to go to someplace of interest," he explained. "Like a couple of weeks ago, we went to Coaticook to the gorge. Last month, we went to Rock Island on an overnight trip."

But cyclists who aren't used to long trips need not worry.

"We usually set the pace for the slowest person," MacKay assured.

He added that the bilingual cycling club is "fun" and a "great way to discover the routes in the Townships."

Though they might not plan tours during the winter,

MacKay said the club will still get together for parties and to do some charity work.

MacKay said he uses a bicycle for transportation year-round and wishes there were more safe routes in the area.

"This year alone, I was hit by a car once," he said. "Another time, I was driving on the highway and this guy tried to pass me and even though there wasn't another car in the other lane, he still hit my flag, that's how close he was."

He said the flag on a bicycle sticks out about a foot and a half on the side of a bike.

MacKay said there are currently 25 members in the club, and they're looking for more.

SHERBROOKE — In a little more than a decade, Canadian pianist André Laplante has established himself as one of the great romantic virtuosos.

Laplante, who is performing an all-Ravel recital at Centennial

Theatre next Saturday, Oct. 26, burst onto the international music scene in 1974.

That year, he won both the Geneva competition and the first International Piano Competition, held in Sydney, Australia.

Two years later, he captured the coveted International Tchaikovsky Competition's silver medal in Moscow.

Laplante has performed in major concert centres in Europe, North America and the Orient.

He has been compared to Ashkenazv, Horowitz and Rudolf Serkin.

Recently, he has appeared as orchestral soloist with the Montreal and Chicago Symphony Orchestras, the Czech Philharmonic Orchestra at New York's Carnegie Hall and toured Europe with the Toronto Symphony.

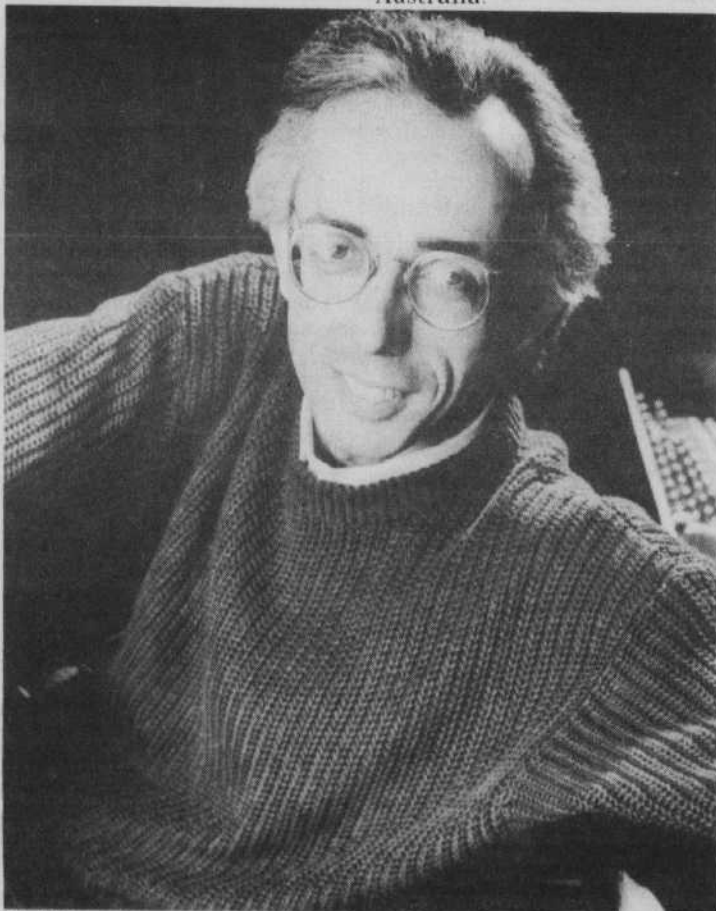
TOURED CHINA

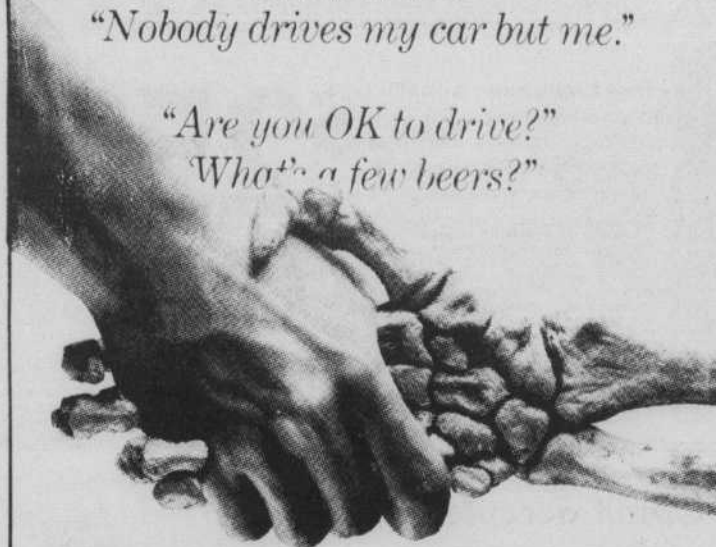

Exploring world alone can be 'real adventure'

For many people, the prospect of travelling alone is daunting.

The loneliness. The possible peril. Nobody but yourself to depend on.

However, experienced solo travellers say striking out alone is enormously rewarding.

Paul Unterberg, a Montreal lawyer specializing in travel cases who has visited 117 countries, swiftly sums up why he often travels by himself.

"It forces you to meet other people," he declares. "When you travel with a group, the more numerous the group, the more it turns inward."

"Even with one other person you turn inward a bit. But when you're all alone, you turn outward."

"And to me, it's not museums and jungles and birds that make travel so interesting. It's the people. To the ex-

tent that I don't even carry a camera any more because the important things, you can't photograph them anyway."

"If you're with another person, people don't approach you nearly half as much and you don't approach other people," agrees Jill Wykes, a Toronto-based travel-industry veteran who has frequently travelled alone.

"If you're by yourself, it can be a real adventure, it can be great. There can be a great sense of accomplishment in it."

"If," she adds, "you're a little bit careful."

PERSONAL SAFETY

Unfortunately, being a woman alone often means being vulnerable in ways men aren't. For most women, the idea of travelling solo instantly raises the issue of personal safety.

The basic rule, say women who have done it, is to take the same common-sense precautions you would at home.

"I was always careful, and in

all my travels I've never had a bad experience," says Patricia Pineault, a Montreal nurse who has travelled alone throughout Asia and Africa.

"But you have to be careful anywhere. In Montreal there are certain neighborhoods you wouldn't wander through alone at night."

In their guidebook Handbook for Women Travellers (Piatkus, \$17.95), Maggie and Gemma Moss further advise that it's important to have a confident manner and to be firm in rejecting unwelcome overtures.

The same book notes that in some ways, solo travel can be easier in Third World countries — and that applies equally for men and women.

"Spending time by yourself just observing is never dull in countries where EVERYTHING is different," the authors note.

"You are unlikely to be without any direct human input for long in countries where local people take the initiative and come and speak to you."

"And as most solo travellers find, other western travellers always come up for a chat."

FREE TO ROAM

Another advantage to solo travel is that you go where you wish, when you wish.

So what are the drawbacks? "You have to be impervious to solitude," Unterberg says. "It's not everybody that can do

it, and it's not for everybody."

For those who may want to consider solo travel, some general tips:

— Research the destination extensively. Once there, there will be nobody to insulate you from your surroundings.

— Respect the local culture and customs. Dress and behave accordingly.

— Hotel rates are invariably based on double occupancy, which means solo travellers are charged a single supplement. Be prepared to pay almost as much as two people together would pay, or seek out budget accommodation. Hostels or dormitories, where cheap rates are the tradeoff for privacy, are one alternative.

— Whether male or female, take the usual safety precautions. Carry most of your money, plus vital travel documents, in a money belt or pouch under your clothes. Don't wear expensive jewelry or flashy clothes. Be cautious when going out alone at night.

FEMALE VIEWPOINT

Women should look at possible destinations from a specifically female viewpoint.

Many Asian cities are safer for women on their own than most North American cities,

for example. But in a city like Athens, women can be mercilessly harassed. By most accounts, countries where local women have virtually no rights aren't worth the hassle.

British travel writer Jan Morris has a unique perspective on the male-female aspect of travelling solo. She's been writing about travel, and travelling alone, since before she had a sex-change operation in the 1950s.


In the March 1991 issue of the travel magazine Conde Nast Traveler, Morris was asked if she thought women had a tougher time travelling alone than men do.

She replied that both sexes have advantages.

Men, she said, are less likely to be tiresomely pawed, molested or raped, can more easily enter bars, can hit harder and sometimes run faster and are taken more seriously by mo-ros.

Women, Morris said, are treated more kindly by strangers. They have the female half of the world instinctively and often influentially on their side, can think quicker, smile more sweetly and can create an immediate effect with a robust "p--- off."



Travel tidbits

Canadian Airlines International has dropped its transborder fares by seven per cent, partly to encourage travel and partly to address what the airline calls "anti-GST cross-border shopping perception."

In this case, transborder travel means Canadian's Vancouver-California services as well as service by its partners — Time Air, Ontario Express and Air Atlantic — to cities such as Seattle, Minneapolis, Pittsburgh and Boston.

Flights to Hawaii don't count.

New return fares range from \$269 for a two-week-advance ticket on the Vancouver-San Francisco route to \$914 for a business-class Vancouver-Los Angeles trip.

Prices quoted don't include the seven-per-cent goods and services tax.

is flying to Tehran, Iran, again after a six-year hiatus. The twice-weekly service stops in at Larnaca, Cyprus, en route.

CKTS signs off after 45 years

SHERBROOKE — Former staffers of CKTS Radio were clearing out their desks this week and packing away years of memories and moments in boxes to be taken home.

Quebec's only English-language commercial radio station off the island of Montreal signed off last Friday morning after 45 years.

Following an agreement between Telemedia, the company that owns CKTS, and Standard Broadcasting, which operates CJAD, the Montreal station has replaced K-900 on the AM dial.

Seven full-time and five-part time employees were given the news at a meeting an hour before the station went off the air.

"We didn't even get a chance to say goodbye to our listeners," says deejay Leta Polson. "No liners, nothing. People have been phoning, some are very upset."

GREAT TEAM

Though Polson said she knew she would eventually have to leave Sherbrooke for a larger market, she is sad to be leaving such a great team.

"I wouldn't have stayed four years if it hadn't been so successful," she said. "I've worked in Montreal. I know what good radio is. I've learnt a lot from Ted (Silver, Program Director). We really cared about living here."

Polson and her co-workers have been offered severance packages which include generous separation pay and job counselling to help them relocate.

Some may get jobs within Telemedia, which operates CHLT and CITE FM in Sherbrooke, as well as about two dozen radio stations across Quebec and Ontario.

Throughout the years, CKTS has served as a good starting point for people in the industry.

PERSONALITIES

One longtime Townships radio personality, Gordon Breen, worked at CKTS for 25 years. Now he works in Ottawa.

"We still get mail for Gordon even though he left 10 years ago," Silver said.

In Montreal, Kathy Coloumb, a broadcaster on CJAD, worked at CKTS in the late 70s.

"She worked as a copy writer and was also on air," said Silver.

Other *Record* reporters like Melanie Gruer, Craig Pearson and Avril Benoit also got a start at the station. But even though CKTS was a terrific breeding ground, it was not a money-maker.

Michel Fortin, general manager for Telemedia in Sherbrooke, said that since 1969 the company has lost \$2.9 million on the station — \$250,000 last year.

Claude Beaudouin, president of the radio division for Telemedia Quebec, said the company has been searching for a solution to the station's financial woes for some time.

SOLUTIONS

He said they were left with the choice of selling, closing down or finding a new partner to operate the station.

"We didn't want to close it down," Beaudouin said, "but we

couldn't improve services with the financial resources we had."

He added the deal with competitor Standard Broadcasting was the best because it ensured Townshippers were still served.

Under the agreement with Standard Broadcasting, Telemedia retains the CRTC license for the station and CJAD provides programming. Both radio empires will share the costs of the re-broadcast line.

Beaudouin also said there will still be a 900 AM studio located at CHLT which CJAD will be able to use to broadcast from Sherbrooke.

CJAD has already begun broadcasting daily news capsules from *The Record*, as well as Sherbrooke weather and school closings. It also plans to cover major events in the Townships.

But it's clear locals are mourning the loss of the station.

MOURN LOSS

Della Goodsell, of the Townships Association, is unhappy with the decision to close the station down.

"This is a vital sector of our social and cultural fabric of the Eastern Townships," she said.

She added while CBC radio is sensitive to the needs of the Eastern Townships, it only has one reporter here.

"And with budget cuts there are no guarantees there won't be further cuts and the regional and rural bureaus will be the first to go," she lamented. "That will leave us with nothing."

Goodsell also noted that, with the departure of the radio station, more than a dozen jobs for the anglophone community are also gone.

"That's another sad fact," she said.

CKTS copy writer Gisèle Aubut said the station had its place.

"I feel bad because of the institution," she said. "It served the community, and not only the English community. Eighty per cent of our audience was francophone, they were bilingual."

IMPROVE ENGLISH

She said K900 even helped some francophone youngsters improve their English skills.

"I was picking up a package at the bus terminal once and the man said, 'Ah, CKTS,

thanks to you my son is bilingual."

"I'm French, my wife is French and when my son was eight years old, he started listening to K900," Aubut continued. "And he picked up words and phrases and now he has a good job because he's bilingual."

CJAD general manager Rob Braide said there will be some advantages to the switchover, pointing out that Townshippers will be able to listen to the live hockey and other sports broadcasts for the first time.

While Townships' adapt to their new station, K-900 staffers are all looking for jobs. For some, it isn't the first time.

Sixteen years ago Silver was forced to leave Quebec City when the exodus of anglophones from the capital area forced Telemedia to close CHOM, its English radio station there.

LEAVE PROVINCE

Now Silver and many of his

staffers will be forced to leave the province.

He said he will stay with the company and be offered another job, probably in Ontario, where Telemedia operates half of its 25 stations.

"It will be hard," Silver said. "I'm one of the old boys. I've been here longer than most of the furniture."

Polson is also sad to leave the Townships, but she is resigned to the news. But she said she feels an institution of the Townships is gone with K900.

"No matter what people think of CKTS, it's taking one element of culture away."

"But what can you do? You move on."

Polson had a special message for all of K900's listeners.

"We're all sorry it happened so suddenly," she said. "We didn't have a chance to say goodbye. We thank everyone who listened. It's been a good time."

Hong Kong stamps are a collector's dream

The year 1997 will more than likely prove to be a rather traumatic one in world history.

It's the year that Hong Kong will revert back to mainland China.

The British Crown Colony is located off the coast of Southern China and includes Kowloon Peninsula on the mainland. Lord Palmerston added Hong Kong to the British Empire in 1841. Great Britain then leased some 230 islands from China in 1898 on a ninety-nine year lease. That lease include the island of Hong Kong.

In this day and age when countries are tearing down walls of repression and fighting for their freedom, the people of Hong Kong on the other hand, are preparing themselves to live under a non-democratic system. It's no wonder then that so many are emigrating or are preparing to emigrate to the western world.

In the philatelic world, it would seem there is a waiting game going on in so far as the stamps of Hong Kong are concerned.

Those that have are not anxious to let go. That is quite evident by what is available through auction catalogues.

HIGH VALUE

This is an extremely interesting area to collect. Not only are the stamps high in value but they have also produced a great number of varieties.

The various postmarks are also very highly sought after, especially on the early Victorian issues.

Scott's catalogue has only gi-

ven the stamps of Hong Kong a cursory listing, as they do all countries.

However, there are footnotes to guide the collector. This of course must be understood. If Scott's or any other major catalogue producer were to list each country in exquisite detail, one could never afford the catalogues. Speciality catalogues are available.

The enjoyment of collecting stamps of Hong Kong lies its definitives. One can begin in almost any era and spend a great deal of time with each denomination. As an example, lets quickly examine the King George VI era.

THREE ISSUES

There are three issues of the King George VI definitives.

The first was released in 1938 and consisted of fourteen values; one cent to ten dollars. As the other issues, this one is watermarked with the standard Crown Colonies Crown Script CA.

The highlights of the issues are broken Chinese characters in the fifteen cents denomination, a short "R" in the word dollar in the \$1 denomination and a dot after cents in the eight cents denomination.

In addition there exists variable shades of colour in several denominations.

The second issue which came out in 1941, remained in use through the war until 1946. Whereas the first issue is perforated 14, the second issue is perforated 15 x 14. Six denominations make up the second issue; 2 cents, 4 cents, 5 cents, 10

cents, 30 cents and a 50 cents.

In addition to the perforations, one may distinguish between the two issue by the paper. The first issue was printed on thin paper up to the 50 cents value while the second issue was printed on a heavier paper.

The third issue appeared in 1946 and remained in use until 1952. This issue went back to the perforation 14 format and there were changes in colour. Several additional values were added to the issue; namely an 8 cents, two 20 cents denominations of different colours released at different dates, and an 80 cents value.

FLAWS

The same plates must have been used to produce the third issue as the first, for many of the same flaws exist. Several additional minor flaws are known to exist and new ones are continually showing up. There are also many shades for each denomination in addition to various papers.

The George VI definitives were used as an example simply because they are the least complicated of the Hong Kong definitives.

The real challenge lies with the definitives of the Victorian era. Here we have three issues

with each issue having as many as four series. This is due to surcharge overprints, specimen overprints, watermark differences and colour changes. The era is a speciality in itself and should definitely be considered as a great addition to a collection.

COMMEMORATIVE STAMPS

Keep in mind the commemorative stamps for they have a lot to offer.

The first such were issued to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the colony in 1891. The consisted of an anniversary overprint on the two cent carmine 1882 Queen Victoria definitive. Many varieties ap-

pear in this particular issue. All having to do with overprint.

No other commemorative stamp was issued until the Silver Jubilee issue celebrating the 25 year reign of King George V in 1935.

After this issue, commemoratives appeared on a regular basis. Hong Kong has issued some of the nicer stamps of the commonwealth countries.

While the stamps of Hong Kong are still reasonably priced, they most assuredly won't always be. We have only scratched the surface of what is available in Hong Kong philately.

There is a great deal available which will be presented to you from time to time.

NBC drops Garner and Guillaume

NEW YORK (AP) — Low-rated shows starring TV veterans James Garner and Robert Guillaume are being dropped from NBC's schedule during the November sweeps.

Man of the People, starring Garner, was 78th among 86 shows in the latest ratings. Guillaume's Pacific Station was 73rd.

NBC said Tuesday the half-

hour comedies will be pulled from their Sunday night slots after Oct. 27 and return in new time periods in December.

They will be replaced on Sundays by a country music variety show, Hot Country Nights, starting Nov. 24.

The November ratings sweeps, which will start on Oct. 31 and end on Nov. 27, are one of four key ratings periods crucial to local TV stations. The stations use the results to set advertising rates.

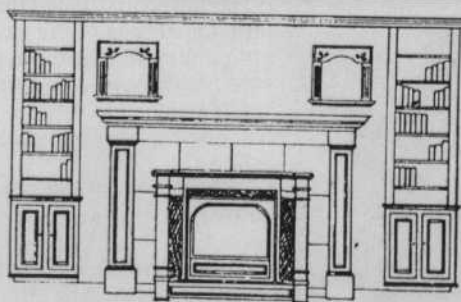

Dread Zeppelin coming to town next week

SHERBROOKE — One of the things I was told about Dread Zeppelin by their record company, IRS, was that everything they do, they do in character.

While I realized this meant my interview with lead singer Tortelvis would be a lot of fun, I wasn't sure how many true facts about the band he would reveal.

The members of Dread Zeppelin, who will be appearing at Café du Palais in Sherbrooke next Wednesday, performs songs by popular 70s band Led Zeppelin in a reggae style with an Elvis impersonator on lead vocals.

Sounds interesting, at the very least.

Armed with this information, I called Tortelvis in Toronto, where the band was performing, and tried to find out what makes Dread Zeppelin tick.

Warning: what you are about to read may or may not be true.

Tortelvis had a slight cold when I spoke to him, but he bravely answered my questions without sneezing even once, a fact I would've appreciated more if I was interviewing him in person and not on the phone, but I digress.

POPULAR

He said he really can't explain why Dread Zeppelin is so popular.

"Maybe it's the concept itself," he explained. "Maybe the music's good, I don't know. We're just going out there night after night enjoying ourselves."

Night after night indeed!

Dread Zeppelin has been touring since February, 1990 and its members won't be taking a break until next February.

They've been around the world on their musical trek, including Europe, Japan and Scandinavia, as well as the States and Canada. Next month, they perform in Brazil and Argentina before going on to Germany, Australia and New Zealand.

Though the cultures are different, Tortelvis said people everywhere react the same way to their music.

"It's a similar response everywhere we go, it's amazing," he gushed. "One thousand to 1500 people waiting to hear you!"

He said the only major difference was in Japan.

"They really believe I'm El-

vis there. They were screaming and ripping my clothes off." (Certainly not a pleasant thought just before lunch!)

PHENOMENON

But how did the Dread Zeppelin phenomenon begin?

"We formed in 1989 and played in L.A. for about a year," Tortelvis explained. "Then, in Feb. 1990, we went out on what was to be a two-week tour and it just snowballed and we haven't stopped since."

Fair enough, but where did the unusual idea for the band come from?

"I heard Robert Plant and Jimmy Page (formerly of Led Zeppelin) joking about it, how their songs should be done in a reggae style," said Tortelvis, who then met up with the other members of his band on a street corner and decided to actualize this new musical style.

Two albums later, *Unleaded* and their latest, *5,000,000*, the band is still having a good time while making new fans everyday — including a former member of Led Zeppelin.

"Plant's a big fan of ours," boasted Tortelvis, "so I guess they're into it as well."

And why not? 5,000,000 Tortelvis fans can't be wrong!

Tortelvis, now 30, agreed he has come a long way since his days delivering milk.

MILKMAN

"I was a milkman in L.A.," he said. "I was also singing in lounges, in a Frank Sinatra-Tony Bennett style."

A far cry from what he's doing now?

"Actually, it's the same in a way. I'm sort of crooning these Led Zeppelin songs."

Indeed, tunes such as Dread Zeppelin's remake of "Stairway To Heaven" do have a certain torch-song quality to them.

But, Tortelvis insists the band is a group project and I asked him to describe his fellow musicians.

"Well, Fresh Cheese is our drummer, and he's the former light heavyweight boxing champion of the world," Tortelvis said quite seriously.

"Carl Jah (known to his fans as the "guitar God") has his own acting school in his spare time.

"J.P. Nelson (Jah Paul Jo, The Prince Of Peace and Love, on rhythm guitar) drives a

truck in his spare time.

"Ed Zeppelin is a great congo player and a fairly good keyboard player as well.

"And Butt Boy (also known as Put-Mon and Bun-Slopes, on bass) is a former male exotic dancer. We've got him to put on a few extra layers of clothing on stage, but it's still not as much as we'd like."

Finally, a man who is not on the album, but one that Tortelvis felt he must recognize, is Charlie Haj.

"He hands me the water and towels on stage," Tortelvis said. "He's very important to me."

By this point in the interview, I had to ask if they take anything seriously.

"We just take seriously going out and having fun," Tortelvis

said.

Dread Zeppelin's job is to entertain, which is why listening to the album is simply not enough. The band must be experienced live to truly be appreciated, or so Tortelvis said and promised concert-goers will have a good time.

"If everyone can leave our show with a smile on their faces, we've done our jobs," he said.

On a rare serious note, Tortelvis admitted he didn't think the idea for Dread Zeppelin would stand the test of time.

"I didn't think it would last very long," he said. "I was just going to do one show, but there was so much interest in it."

All seriousness aside, Tortelvis said he doesn't have a special line to his namesake, Elvis Presley.

"I haven't seen him. I think he's gone. I know people who'd like to have seen him, though."

Don't we all. Elvis has been spotted at motels, grocery stores and fast food restaurants everywhere.

FAST FOOD PROMOTION

Tortelvis said Dread Zeppelin has done promotion at fast food restaurants around the world, but I don't think that's a reference to the kind of music they make.

With his job more entertaining than most of the stuff we find on television today, does Tortelvis ever watch the tube?

"I find the Elvis 1968 Comeback Special always inspiring," he revealed. "It gets me going. I can feel like a King after watching that. My performance is always better."

Does Tortelvis promise that our performance will be better after watching the special?

"Maybe not entertainment-wise, but hopefully in other respects."

Ah, so we should watch it at night?

"Right."

And with that, the man who spends most of his time making others smile laughs a hearty laugh.

Poitier carved niche for blacks in Hollywood

MONTREAL (AP) — In English, it's an "ah-midge." In French, it's an "oh-mahge." In either language, it was agreed that Sidney Poitier was deserving of an homage at the recent Montreal World Film Festival.

The reasons are all there: two Academy nominations, and the big prize for Lilies of the Field, 1963; success as a film director (Uptown Saturday Night, Hanky Panky); an Emmy nomination this year for Separate But Equal.

Most importantly, Poitier is recognized as the Jackie Robinson of films, a man who carved his way through Hollywood's discrimination and proved that a black actor could become a box-office star.

Before a near-capacity audience in a Place des Arts theatre, Poitier reminisced with humor and remarkable frankness about his early years.

He was born on Feb. 20, 1924, in Miami, where his parents had come to sell a boatload of tomatoes from their farm on Cat Island in the Bahamas.

Poitier spent his first 10½ years on Cat Island, living close to nature in a place with no electricity and no running water.

His parents moved to Nassau, where he proved such a troublemaker that he was shipped off to Miami to live with a brother.

"I knew absolutely nothing about segregation, but I found out in a hurry," he recalled.

LEARNS LESSON

As a drugstore delivery boy, he brought a small package to a woman's house and was puzzled when she insisted that he go to the back door. That night the Ku Klux Klan visited his brother's house with a warning.

After several encounters with bigotry, he boarded a bus for New York City, arriving with \$3 in his pocket.

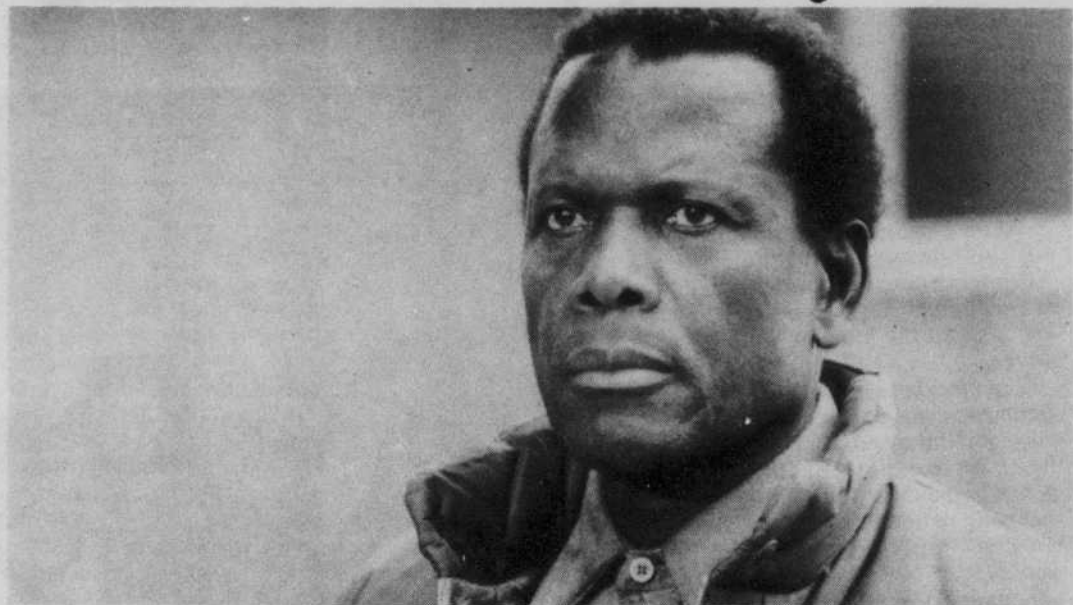
Poitier worked as a dishwasher, sleeping for a time on the roof of the Brill Building, a new absolute district building long an enclave of songwriters and producers.

After a year in the army, he answered an ad for actors at the American Negro Theatre. One night when Harry Belafonte was unable to appear in a play, Poitier substituted for him.

A career was born.

In an interview at the Hotel Meridian, headquarters for the festival, Poitier talked of other matters, including the upsurge of a new generation of black filmmakers such as Spike Lee (Do the Right Thing, She's Got to Have It) and John Singleton (Boyz n the Hood).

"I'm impressed with them as filmmakers," he commented, "and I hope that their output will be exemplary of a healthy variety. That's just a wish on

"Their films should be their vision of the world, their vision of life itself, of humankind. I wish that they have a sense of history. I wish they exercise some time for hopefulness and positiveness. That would make me very happy."

Although Poitier's career and public life have been marked by "hopefulness and positiveness" from the beginning, it has not always been a smooth journey.

KNEW TROUBLE

"Mine was not an easy road," he admitted. "But to characterize it as all difficult would be incorrect. Serendipi-

ty was running up and down all those years. It wasn't all my doing.

"It was the good graces of a lot of people — some names I recall, some I can't recall. Some faces I've forgotten.

"But a good deed here, a good deed there, a good thought here, a good comment there, all added up to my career in one way or another. So it's been kind of a long road, but it was a good journey altogether."

Poitier made his film debut with *No Way Out* in 1950, a time when black actors were largely absent from the screen. He established his presence with *The Blackboard Jungle* (1955), *So-*

me thing of Value (1957) and *The Defiant Ones* (1958), his first Oscar nomination.

The 1960s brought a succession of hits: *A Raisin in the Sun*, *Lilies of the Field*, *A Patch of Blue*, *In the Heat of the Night*, *To Sir With Love*, *Guess Who's Coming to Dinner*.

He started directing in 1972 with *The Western Buck and the Preacher*.

While in Montreal, the 67-year-old Poitier attracted wonder for his youthfulness. Said one admirer: "Whatever it is, you ought to bottle it. You could outsell Paul Newman's salad dressing."

Jean-Claude Van Damme kick-boxes way to top

NEW YORK (AP) — "Do you trust me?"

The voice, slightly taunting, belongs to 30-year-old martial arts superstar Jean-Claude Van Damme, about to demonstrate how close he comes to your face with his deadly high kick.

It sounds like a line from *Double Impact*, his latest in a string of kick-boxing blockbusters. But this time it's no movie.

Van Damme flexes his powerful chest, the result of daily four-hour workouts, and gazes down at his pointy-tipped cowboy boots.

He abandons his stance for a minute and walks over sympathetically.

"I'm pretty good but there's always a chance I hit you," he says in his lilting Belgian ac-

cent, flashing a wide smile.

Then he moves back. His leg comes up so fast the winds blows by your face in a blur. Reflexes don't work.

"He came this close," says his wife, Gladys, holding her thumb and forefinger about a centimetre apart.

NEWEST HERO

Van Damme throws back his head and laughs. It's just another delightful moment in the enchanted life of Van Damme, Hollywood's newest action hero and the latest European emigre to land in America and mop up the competition.

He is charming, without appearing too calculating, and intense, grilling those who interview and photograph him.

And to call him a little flirtatious is like saying the Sultan of Brunei has a few dollars in the bank.

"My one weakness is women," he confides in a hotel restaurant, while his third wife eats a plate of pasta nearby.

Van Damme plucks several vitamins from his shirt pocket and slides them furtively across the table.

"They will make you strong sexually," he whispers.

BRAWN AND BRAINS

Like Arnold Schwarzenegger, Van Damme arrived in California virtually penniless in 1980. He navigated his way to stardom by a canny combination of brawn and brains.

Though he was a karate star and health club owner in Belgium, Van Damme decided to pursue a lifelong dream of movie acting.

"I don't care about the money; it's only paper to me," says Van Damme, whose films

such as *Lionheart*, *Cyborg*, and *Deathsport* have grossed millions. "I just want to make good movies."

Like Schwarzenegger, Van Damme speaks with an evangelical fervor.

"When you have two feet and two hands, anything is possible," he says, mouthing a familiar refrain of how a humble immigrant can arrive with little more than discipline and ambition and easily overtake the soft Americans.

"The people who run the studios come from good families and have college educations but they know nothing of the street," he says. "They all follow the rules. That's not my way. If I follow rules, I have to wait years to be an actor and I have to develop a Shakespearean accent or something."

To jump-start his career, Van Damme sought out independent film-makers more like himself — brassy streetwise producers such as Menahem Golan who gave him his first starring role in 1987's *Bloodsport*.

Van Damme said he was forced to sign a contract when he was "starving" to do a series of martial arts films, and he never envisioned that the movies would turn him into an international star.

In *Double Impact*, he plays dual roles as twin brothers and had his first love scene. He also co-wrote and co-produced the film.

"I found out that 75 per cent of my fans are women," Van Damme says, his face lighting up. "So we put in a love scene for them."

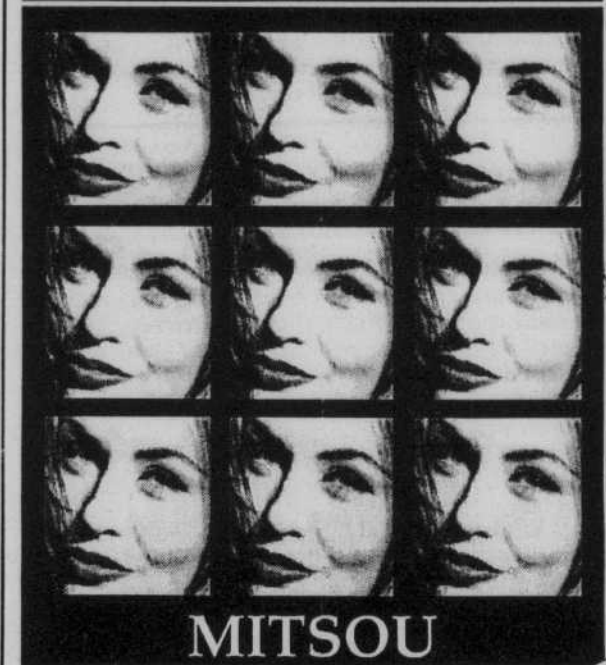

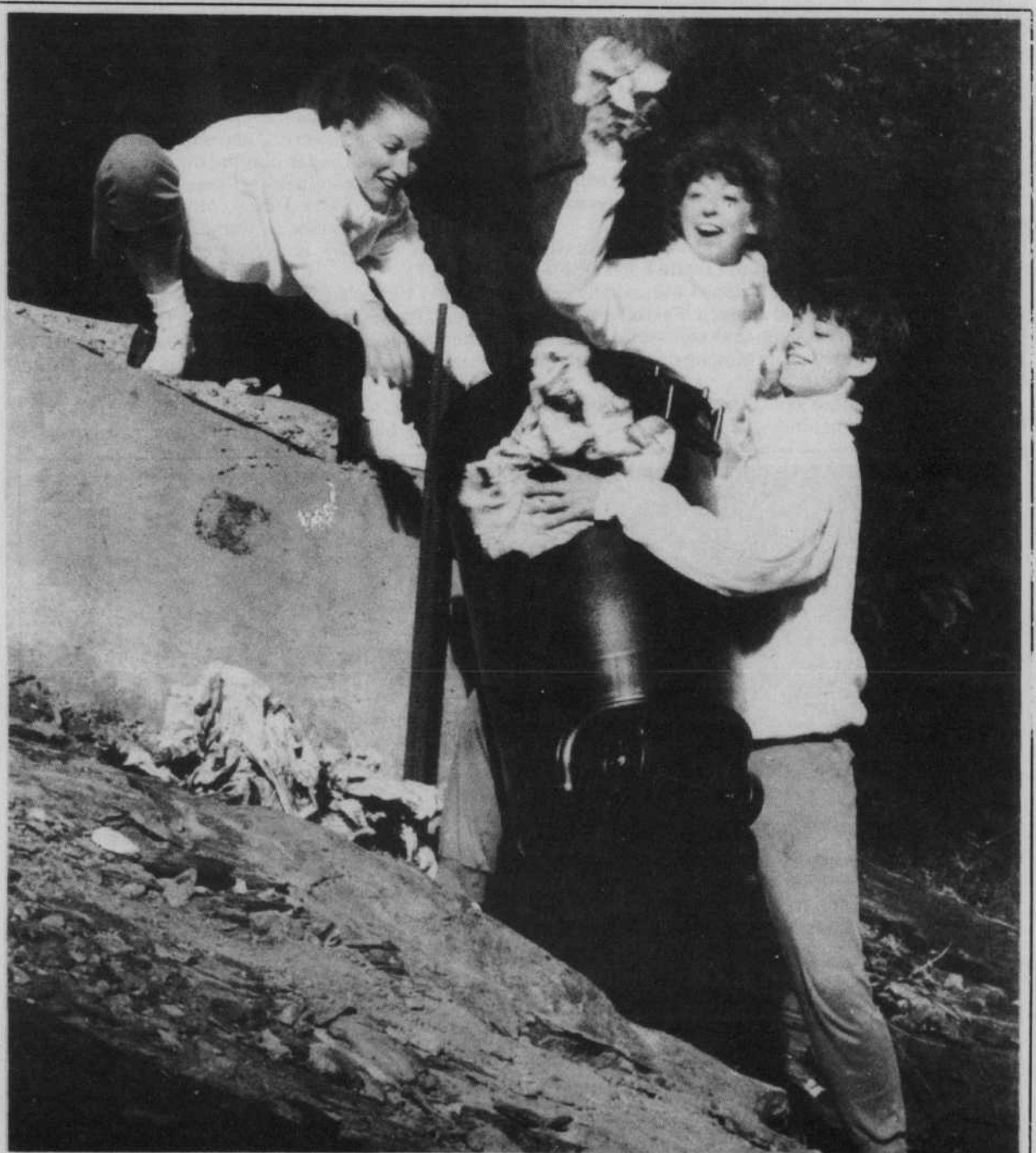

The four-hour miniseries also includes the obligatory cat-fight between Krystle and Alexis. "What would a miniseries about 'Dynasty' be like without our annual fight?" says Evans, whose tussles with Joan Collins' Alexis became a series trademark.

"Joan is better verbally, so they give her most of the great dialogue, and I get all the good punches," Evans explains.

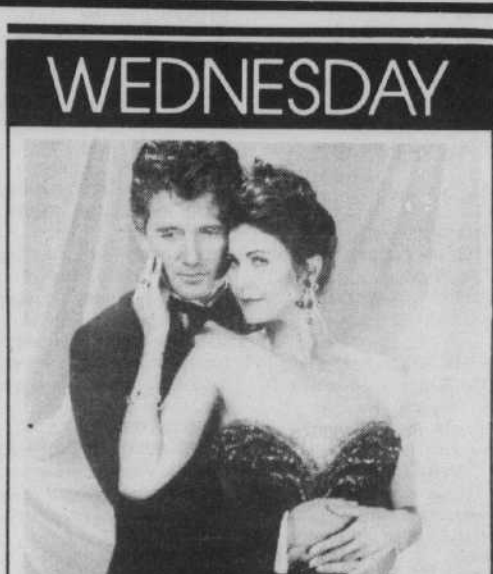


