rested in the hobby of philately. Our sympathy is extended to his family.

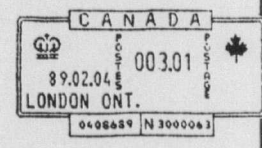
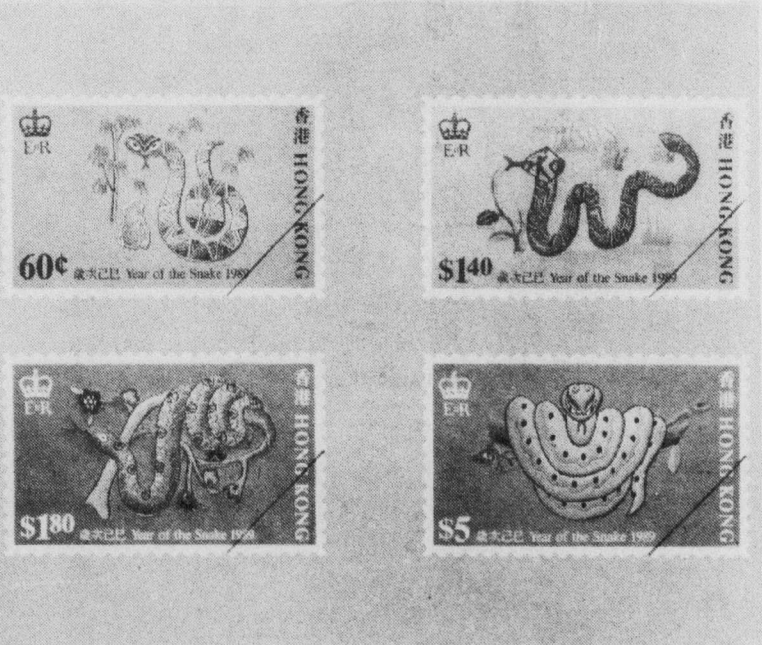
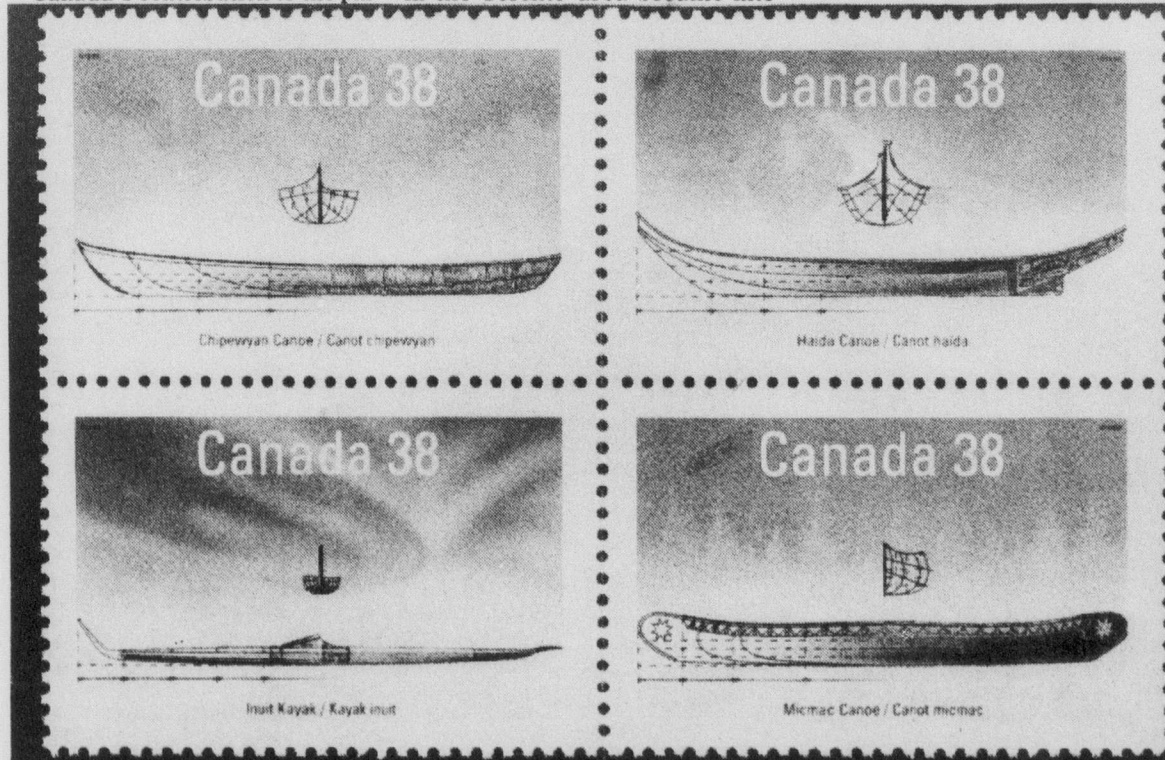
Canada Post issued a decree some time ago that, in its endeavor to improve delivery service,

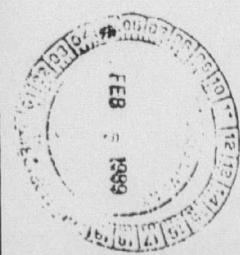
I don't know about you, I would consider London, Ontario and Sherbrooke, Quebec as major mai-

Townshippers' moveable feast got people going

The big story in the Townships this week is the moveable feast entitled "Perceptions: Our Place in Quebec Society." It is giving anglophones a chance to sound off at Cowansville, Magog, Sherbrooke, Lennoxville and Richmond and find a direction for the Townshippers' Association.

Cowansville's Rev. Peacock has the best suggestion at this writing — also the simplest and sweetest; "I LOVE QUEBEC".

Those words in English on blue-and-white lapel buttons, bumper stickers, decals, even balloons for Dollard Day, Canada Day, Townshippers' Day or any other festive occasion (they might even be bilingual as long as English predominates for once) will let the world know we are a part of this society and belong here. Being a commentary rather than a commercial sign, they'd also be perfectly legal.

PATRIOTISM, BELONGING, LOVE

Patriotism over narrow nationalism. Belonging over alienation. Love over hate. Harmony over confrontation. It will steal headline thunder not only from the Parti Quebecois and the likes of Paul Rose, Hans Marotte, Gilles

Rheume, and Pierre Pescau, whose avowed aim is a "French-only" province, but also from Stephen Nowell and his Committee 178, Robin Lawrance and his Canadian People's Party and all those willing to die at the barricades on both sides.

Robin Lawrence, incidently, styles himself "a man with a brilliant mind" and boldly maintains "I favor civil disobedience — as long as it doesn't break the law."

That quotation will go in the scrapbook right alongside Hans Marotte's remark that anglophones have freedom of speech but only if they do it in French. And Jean Garon's outraged complaint that anglos "want minorities to have the same rights as majorities!"

Half-a-million anglophones proudly proclaiming their love for Quebec might do more for equal rights than all the Letters to the Editor, petitions to politicians, all the shouted slogans and spray paint in the world.

CHILLING REMINDERS

One of the most chilling religious sects in all history were the "Assassins". They began almost 900 years ago in northern Iran under the lea-

dership of The Old Man of the Mountain who sent his fanatic followers out to murder public figures he judged were opposed to his Ismaili faith.

That old man was Hasan ibn al-Sabbah who seized the mountain fortress of Alamut ("Eagles Nest") and built behind it a secret Garden of Paradise. Marco Polo passed that way in 1271 and reported his followers were fed hashish and woke up in the garden attended by "ladies and damsels who dallied with men to their hearts' content."

After a few days of luxurious feasting and drinking, sweet music, perfumes and erotic athletics, they were again fed hashish and woke up in the real world of Iran. They were then told they could attain Paradise forever if they died in the service of their Old Man.

A STRANGE TALE INDEED

These "hashshashin", hashish-

eaters, gave us the word "assassin". They were credited with the treacherous murder of Conrad, Marquis de Montferrat and Edward Longshanks at Acre along with hundreds of others throughout the Middle East during 200 years of terror.

The difference, of course, is that the Old Man of the Mountain could command only a few dozen or a few hundred Assassins.

AND NOW, IN MODERN TIMES

The orders of the Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini are instantly spread through the miracle of electronics to all corners of the world and terrorism has now broken fertile new ground. He has guaranteed Paradise to any who die in the attempt to murder Salman Rushdie and more than 6 million dollars to those who succeed and survive.

Before this chilling pronouncement, Salmon Rushdie was not well known in the western world but he has been famous in Britain for some time — at least in literary circles. Back in 1981, when he was only 33, he won the prestigious Booker Prize for Fiction (similar to Canada's Governor General's Award) for "Midnight Children". Canadian runners-up have included Mordecai Richler, Margaret Atwood, Brian Moore, and Robertson Davies while, in 1983, Rushdie himself was a runner-up for "Shame".

SHOULD BE EASY

Rushdie's photograph therefore is easily obtained. He is now 41 and although he might be safely hidden for three months, six months, a year, his chances of surviving very long anywhere in the world must be extremely slim.

Through his publisher, Penguin Books (and probably at their request because they are on the Old Man's hit-list too and much harder to hide), Rushdie said he was sorry for all the distress his novel had caused but the Ayatollah answered he "will never be forgiven even if he repents" and must be killed and "sent to hell for eternity."

TALK ABOUT BAD REVUES!

Writers are accustomed to bad reviews but this seems to carry li-

terary criticism to chilling new heights. Novelists might be used to nasty letter, angry telephone calls and the occasional law suit but there are 860,388,300 Muslims world-wide (according to the latest Canadian World Almanac & Book of Facts). If only a fraction take the Ayatollah's orders to heart and set out to assassinate the author, the word "paranoia" will have to be re-defined.

And Rushdie's crime, after all, is only a work of the imagination. He has not said "this is so" but only "suppose that this were so" — like Tolkein's Hobbit, like Star Wars but unlike Did Six Million Really Die?

BUT CANADA CUSTOMS SAYS O.K.


Canada Customs maintains its own Index Librorum Prohibitorum and employs an official expert to rule upon the artistic liberties of any book entering the country. He took the novel home last weekend, studied all 550 pages and ruled it admissible. It was not "hate literature" because it did not advocate genocide or hatred toward an identifiable group. "Blasphemy" was outside the statute.

IN THE MEANTIME - RECORD SALES

Elsewhere, the Old Man's pronouncement has made the The Satanic Verses a runaway best-seller. In Italy, the book sold out within an hour. Australia can't get enough of them. France and West Germany stopped the presses — at least temporarily — but then all 12 members of the Common Market withdrew their ambassadors from Iran and considered further action.

But, since this form of terrorism is something entirely new in the world, nobody quite knows how to answer it. Who or what might the Old Man take exception to next? A film, perhaps, like The Last Temptation of Christ? A play? A painting or sculpture? A politician? Tadeusz Letarte?

Somewhere in his epilogue to St Joan, Shaw wrote; "Must then Christ perish in torment in every age to save those that have no imagination?"

The new Lawrence of Arabia film will be here soon

NEW YORK (Reuter) — It took 26 years, but they finally got it right.

Lawrence of Arabia, Sir David Lean's epic masterpiece, has endured countless indignities dating back to its 1962 theatrical release, including sloppy editing and television presentations that lopped off more than half its running time.

But now the tale of British officer T.E. Lawrence — played by Peter O'Toole in the role that made him a star — and the revolt of his ragged band of Arab tribes against their Turkish oppressors has been restored to a pristine version that at last meets with Lean's full approval.

The restoration and re-release of the film meant far more than a mere re-editing. Since its initial release in December 1962, Lawrence of Arabia has been shortened three times, to make the 222-minute original more commercially attractive.

The camera negative of the film, a victim of overuse and poor storage, had begun to disintegrate.

MAMMOTH TASK

Robert Harris, who supervised

the restoration of Abel Gance's silent classic Napoleon in 1981, found himself sifting through four tonnes of Lawrence footage — every print of the film known to exist in the world.

Harris said the restoration began when he contacted Columbia Pictures, which originally released the film, because he wanted to see the full original version.

"I first saw it when I was 17, and it was the film that made up my mind that I wanted to go into filmmaking. Steven Spielberg and Martin Scorsese said the same thing," he said.

But Harris had no idea of the Pandora's box he would open.

There was no surviving print of the original Lawrence and much of the sound was missing. Columbia had junked the original music tracks and there was no record of the film's sequence.

Harris and partner Jim Painten assembled their version from cuts and trims, the original camera negative, and surviving 35-mm work prints. "I had thought it would take three to five months," Harris said.

CAST CONSULTED

To replace the missing sound ele-

ments, they gathered O'Toole, Omar Sharif, Sir Alec Guinness, Anthony Quinn and Arthur Kennedy in studios in London, New York and Savannah, Ga., where Kennedy was located.

The film's original editor, Anne Coates, who won an Oscar for her work, helped advise the team on the sequence of the scenes.

More than two years and \$600,000 later, Harris and Painten presented Lean with a 70-mm, six-track Dolby version of the film that earned O'Toole an Academy Award nomination. The original took seven Oscars, including Best Picture and Best Director.

Lean then did a final cut of the restoration, trimming a few minutes and tightening it up. The new — by all accounts, the ultimate — Lawrence of Arabia now runs 216 minutes.

Harris said Lawrence of Arabia cost \$12 million US to make in 1962, a huge sum for the time. "If it were made today," he added, "it would run about \$75 or \$80 million."

O'TOOLE INTACT

The new film keeps intact O'Toole's classic performance.

"O'Toole in all his guises is so

flamboyantly brilliant that it's hard to believe that (the film) could ever have been built around any other actor," wrote critic David Denby.

Lean's sweeping desert sequences, filmed on location in Jordan and Morocco, the battle scenes with the proverbial cast of thousands and performances by Guinness, Sharif (in his first film in the West), Quinn and Claude Rains melded in what many consider Lean's greatest cinematic achievement.

Filming Lawrence of Arabia was nearly as gruelling as the hardships depicted in the film, as Lawrence leads his men with few provisions on camelback through blistering deserts.

But subsequent cuts to the film and later to television and video versions rendered much of it nearly incomprehensible.

REDUCED FOR TV

One entire reel of the film was transposed, so that Lawrence and his men seem to be pushing the Turks further into, not out of, Arabia. On television, the expansive cinematography of Oscar-winner Frank Young is reduced to about

half its size, rendering empty shots of desert into which camels oddly wander from the bottom of the screen seconds before a scene ends.

At the gala premiere this month of the restored Lawrence at New York's Ziegfeld cinema, Lean said of TV: "The box is okay — it shows the middle third of the film," but "this (the Ziegfeld's panoramic screen) is what the movies should be shown on."

Also attending the sold-out benefit for the American Film Institute were O'Toole, Sharif, and directors Martin Scorsese and Steven Spielberg, whose intervention expedited the restoration when it became mired in studio red tape.

The film is now preceded by an overture, in the tradition of legitimate theatre, and audiences enthusiastically applauded the opening credits.

Coming on the heels of a recent overhaul of *Gone With the Wind*, which played a sold-out engagement at Radio City in New York, the Lawrence of Arabia restoration is likely to clear the way for more cinematic salvage operations.

NBC's entertainment president dressed as a waiter

LOS ANGELES (AP) — NBC's Brandon Tartikoff played a practical joke on CBS president Lawrence Tisch, prompting an unusual accolade from one network to another.

Dressed in a waiter's uniform, wearing a grey wig, moustache and glasses and faking an Italian accent, NBC's entertainment president made a pest of himself at Tisch's table Wednesday night at Chasen's restaurant.

Tisch was with television producer Aaron Spelling and his wife, Candy.

The waiter gushed to Tisch about Lonesome Dove, the miniseries that got such a high rating that CBS tied NBC in the Nielsen ratings.

He then told Mrs. Spelling her wine looked curdled, picked up the glass and drank it. No one recognized Tartikoff until he pulled off the glasses and moustache.

"You're a funny guy," Tisch told

him. "No wonder your comedies are better than our comedies."

WISHEK, N.D. (AP) — A woman who won a piano once owned by the Beatles' John Lennon is selling the ebony Steinway for \$500,000.

Sandy Dejas said she decided to sell the piano, which she won in a 1985 record promotion contest, after her husband died last summer.

She said she has received offers since she advertised in the current issue of Rolling Stone magazine.

"I understand the prospective bidders have included many famous people, but so far no one has been able to get the money together," Dejas said.

Lennon was shot and killed outside his New York City apartment in 1980.

RALEIGH, N.C. (AP) — Rock star Jon Bon Jovi stood on stage and got a typical response — a frenzied crowd of 3,000 high school students screamed. But instead of singing, Bon Jovi was delivering a message — stay away from drugs.

"This is a great big world, and it's scarier than hell," the singer told his audience during an anti-drug assembly at Broughton high school Friday. "You've got to get your life together."

"When I was a kid, I got in trouble and did a lot of things wrong with my friends. Some of those guys are dead now."

Bon Jovi, 26, whose real name is John Bongiovi, is the lead singer for one of the hottest rock bands in the United States, also named Bon Jovi. The band has sold more than 20 million albums.

Bon Jovi appeared at the high school at the invitation of the Make A Difference Foundation, formed as part of a probation agreement

for his manager, Doc McGhee. The manager was convicted in a federal court in Raleigh of helping import 18.5 tonnes of marijuana into Carteret County in 1982.

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (AP) — Jazz pianist Dave Brubeck has been released from Yale-New Haven Hospital, 10 days after undergoing triple-bypass heart surgery, hospital officials said.

Brubeck, 68, a resident of Wilton, is expected to return to his concert schedule by the middle of April, his manager said Friday.

NEW YORK (AP) — Peter O'Toole says he doesn't think he has changed much since Lawrence of Arabia made him an overnight star in 1962.

"My hair is a slightly different color," the actor says in an interview in the March 6 issue of *Us* magazine. "People who haven't seen me for a long time tell me I haven't changed physically."

"And inside I don't feel any different from when I was quite a young fellow."

O'Toole, 56, said he has no regrets about the ups and downs in his life, not even his drinking days.

"I wouldn't have missed one drop of alcohol that I drank," he said, noting that most of his drinking buddies — Richard Burton, Peter Finch and Robert Shaw — are dead.

"The risks we took, the life we led — sadly that's all over," he said. "My health was affected, and there came a point when it was actually more difficult to go on drinking than to give it up."

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Porter Wagoner of the Grand Ole Opry donned a cap and gown instead of his trademark rhinestone outfits for an appearance this week.

Wagoner, Dolly Parton's former duet partner, was guest speaker Wednesday at a ceremony for 21 graduates of the McGavock high school degree program for people who have dropped out of school.

"I told them that it was such a great compliment to themselves that they had the internal discipline to go back and get their diploma after they were already in the workplace," Wagoner said Thursday.

"I wore a cap and gown and it was a really exciting thing for me to do."

LENNOXVILLE — She walked on stage with all the aplomb of a 25-year veteran, and before long, Julie Trudeau, just 17 and a student in pure science at Champlain Regional College, had won the heart of every member of the audience at Centennial Theatre during a Baroque music concert recently.

But, we were right about one thing. Julie was no stranger to the concert stage. She and her violin-cello have appeared in various events including innumerable competitions almost since she began studying the instrument at age five.

"It was right from the start, when I began school at Sacré Coeur in Sherbrooke that I fell in love with the cello," she said. But the piano came first according to Trudeau, who now chalks up 12 years of music study and practice with some of the greatest professors in the world.

GRADUATED

"Horace Boux was the professor who gave me my first taste of music. He played violin, repaired and even built them. And in large part, it's mainly due to him and his belief in my talent that I graduated to my present great teacher, Walter Joachim at the McGill Conservatory of Music."

Joachim recognised Trudeau's

'We foresee an even greater event for '88'

Giant 60th Annual Band Festival slated for mid May

SHERBROOKE — Once again this year, the University of Sherbrooke will host the Annual Festival of Quebec Bands.

The University is gearing up to listen to, feed and house an estimated 5000 to 6000 aspiring young musicians, here to take part in concerts and competitions included in the program for the '88 *Festival des Harmonies*.

"Even though we didn't qualify for a make work program which would have assured a permanent

staff to undertake the gigantic job of organizing such a huge event, an army of volunteers has turned out in full force, many of whom were with us last year and already know the ropes pretty well," Bruno Bisson, president of the organizing committee, said at a press conference last week.

"For the musicians who come here, the festival is a crowning achievement after a year's work to attain this specific goal," Bisson added.

"The festival last year was a re-

sounding success," honorary president Nil Allaire said. "So far this year, enthusiasm has again risen beyond our expectations and we foresee an even greater event for '88."

FOR EVERYBODY

Allaire emphasized the open welcome extended to the general public.

"I think perhaps the public are not sure if this is their event as well and I must underline the importance of their participation and their interest."

Last year the festival greeted 5,400 participants in the different classes of competitions making this festival the largest cultural event in Quebec, Pierre Mailhot, vice president of the *Fédération Des Harmonies du Québec* said.

"We have two main objectives this year," he added. "One is to encourage the musicians to mix and mingle, cultivate an understanding and mutual respect among individuals and groups."

The second, he said, is to involve the general public, motivate

people to come out and hear these young people and make the festival accessible to everybody.

The festival opens May 18 at the *Centre Culturel Sherbrooke University* with a concert by the Central Band of Ottawa.

There will also be different events ranging from soloist competitions in seven different halls, Chamber music for juniors, seniors and percussion and stage band competitions, one of general public's favorite events.

Britain facing loss of many priceless art treasures

LONDON (AP) — Britain is in danger of losing many important art works — some hanging in hallowed halls for centuries — because national museums can't match the high prices offered by foreign buyers, art critics say.

One such work is *Mappa Mundi*, a 13th-century world map on vellum that is one of the country's greatest medieval treasures. It now is held by the Hereford Cathedral, which plans to put it up for auction in June because it needs money for extensive building repairs.

Some experts say the work could fetch 2.5 million pounds — \$5 million Cdn at recent exchange rates.

In 1952, the government set up a "safety net" in an effort to keep important art treasures in Britain.

SALES REVIEWED

Under the plan, export licences are required for objects more than 50 years old and, in most cases, worth more than 16,000 pounds (\$32,000). But if an object is more than 50 years old and also has been in Britain for 50 years or more, a panel of experts is called in.

If the experts conclude the item should stay in Britain, a government reviewing committee can delay its export for up to six months while museums try to match the buyer's price.

Works are judged by their esthetic, historic and scholarly importance.

One painting that met all three criteria was *Self-Portrait as Saint Matthew* by the Dutch artist Anthony Van Dyck. It had hung in England for centuries and went on sale in 1987. The experts concluded that its departure would be a great loss to the country.

But no British museum could match the price of 430,000 pounds offered by a foreigner. The painting then was shipped to its new owner in Zurich, identified only as P. Nathan.

PRICES SOAR

Another such set-back may be in store this year.

Seascape Folkestone by the famous landscape painter J.M.W. Turner (1775-1851) sold in 1984 to an anonymous private buyer for a British record of 7.3 million pounds. An export licence was ap-

plied for recently, and since no museum has matched the record price, the licence is expected to be issued soon.

Art critics say the problem derives partly from spiraling market prices that have placed some works out of reach of all but the Gettys of the United States and the Japanese, the latest rising force on the international art market.

The Getty Museum in Malibu, Calif., for instance, spends more each year on purchases than the combined purchasing budgets of Britain's 13 state museums.

Many critics increasingly blame the Conservative government of Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher for failing to help local museums keep pace. They suggest that government strategies for keeping treasures at home aren't working.

RULES FLEXIBLE

Government officials acknowledge that British rules are among the most flexible in Europe, but they argue that tightening them would stifle an export market that brings the equivalent of \$2.5 billion Cdn a year to Britain.

"The system ... to safeguard this country's treasures is coming dan-

gerously close to being a pointless sham," Anna Somers-Cocks, editor of the respected art monthly *Apollo*, wrote in a recent editorial, *The Collapsing Safety Net*.

It was time, she said, for the government to decide "whether we are at all serious about trying to keep great works of art in this country."

The export review system created in 1952 endeavored to balance the art market's needs with that of the country's, art critic Kevin Conru wrote in a survey of the systems used by more than 50 other countries.

Conru and others say the export review system, one of the first of its kind in the world, now is in need of re-appraisal.

In the last year, 12 objects worth \$21 million were saved, while a dozen worth \$17 million went abroad.

Sir Peter Wakefield, director of the only private "art charity" helping public collections, says the small number of objects reviewed indicates something is wrong.

"The great bulk of art objects are flowing out without any restraint at all," he said in an interview.

Isabella Rossellini is torn between two lovers in newest film

NEW YORK (AP) — Isabella Rossellini's film career has included mostly off-beat movies, notably David Lynch's underground classic, *Blue Velvet*, Norman Mailer's *Tough Guys Don't Dance* and the sleeper hit, *Fiesta*.

But in *Cousins*, the American remake of *Cousin, Cousin*, the popular French film, Rossellini plays a woman torn between the love of two men — the kind of part that was a specialty of her mother, Ingrid Bergman.

Fans of *Casablanca*, who agonized over whether Bergman would end up with Humphrey Bogart, the man she loved, or husband Paul Henreid, to whom she felt responsible, can see Rossellini forced to make a similar decision in *Cousins*.

"I do what I like," the actress said in a recent interview. "If a commercial film comes about that

I like, I love to do it. I have a different reason why I want to do each film."

She plays Maria Hardy, who ends up falling in love with Larry Kozinski (Ted Danson) after her husband (William Petersen) has an affair with Kozinski's wife (Sean Young).

Rossellini's participation in the film, which also stars Lloyd Bridges and the Argentine actress, Norma Aleandro, came about by accident. She had originally been asked to look at the script as a favor to friends who were putting the film together.

A NICE FEELING

"There was a kind of a warmth and nice feeling to it," she said. "I was a little bit bashful."

Rossellini and her twin sister, Ingrid, were born in 1952, the children of Bergman and Italian director Roberto Rossellini, whose affair in the late 1940s shocked the

film world and led to Bergman's estrangement from Hollywood for many years.

With her mother one of the world's most famous actresses and her father a major director, Rossellini was reluctant to get involved in filmmaking.

"I guess I never dared," said Rossellini, who has been married twice — to director Martin Scorsese and model Jon Wiedemann. "I thought it was kind of presumptuous."

"My father wanted me to finish school. They always felt being an actress would be difficult and they were right!"

So at age 20 she worked as a translator for Italian television and eventually spent three years conducting interviews for the Italian comedy series, *The Other Sunday*.

'MORE TOGETHER'

"That was rewarding. The fact

that I was able to become successful made me more secure about myself and helped me become an actress. I think if I would have started at 18, I would have been devastated. I was little more together when I started at 30-31."

A modelling career blossomed in 1980 after she agreed to have her picture taken by photographer Bruce Weber and ended up on the cover of *Vogue* magazine. She appeared in a few minor films, *The Meadow* and *Il Papocchio*, and became popular with American audiences in 1984 playing Gregory Hines's Russian-born wife in *White Nights*.

Rossellini wasn't adverse to stepping out of the mainstream. In 1986, she played Dennis Hopper's abused wife in *Blue Velvet*, one of the strangest and most critically acclaimed films of the year.

"It was very original, very rich," she said. "I had imagined it like this. It was all in the script."

Somers-Cocks says the expert advisers tend to lack vigilance, knowing that "their efforts will be useless" since the museums lack the money to buy objects back.

Museum purchase grants, many smaller than the cost of a single Impressionist painting nowadays, have been frozen since 1982 and will remain so until 1991.

Arts Minister Richard Luce has agreed to review the grant system, although not necessarily to strengthen it, said the government's Office of Arts and Libraries.

Lord Blake, chairman of the Royal Commission on Historical Manuscripts, has called for a ban on exporting objects like the *Mappa Mundi*, but doubts it will happen.

Among those opposing a ban is Lord Charteris, chairman of the quasi-governmental National Heritage Memorial Fund which has spent more than 100 million pounds (\$200 million) saving important art objects.

"One of the beauties of London is that it's the centre of the art trade and I wouldn't want that changed," he said. "Still, I'm worried about the future."

Don DeLillo's *Libra* is riveting, brilliant, stunning

Libra by Don DeLillo (LESTER & ORPEN DENNYS): \$24.95, 464 pp.

When Truman Capote published his gruesome crime study *In Cold Blood*, he made the outrageous statement that he had pioneered a completely original genre—what he called a “non-fictional novel”.

After painstaking research, Capote wrote his story about two young killers in the American midwest, reconstructing their crimes and taking the reader inside the minds of his anti-heroes who terrorized Holcomb, Kansas in 1959. Don DeLillo's stunning achievement with his powerful novel *Libra* is perhaps due as much to his audacity in tackling such a well-documented crime as Lee Harvey Oswald's as it is to his quietly transformig Capote's genre into the novel of the decade.

DeLillo, the author of more than a half dozen novels including *White Noise*, *End Zone* and *Great Jones Street*, is the kind of masterful stylist who can digest the endless storm of paper that the Kennedy Assassination has engendered, reshape the morass of factual contradictions and turn the controversial historical event into brilliant fiction.

DeLillo treads the thin line between what Capote claimed his “non-fiction” was doing, and the actual task of any prose fiction stylist, when he confesses in an author's note that he has “altered and embellished reality, extended people into imagined space and time, invented incidents, dialogues, and characters”. What may sound rather clinical becomes an engrossing book at the hands of DeLillo, whose control of his subject is exact and fascinating.

All of the major players in the Lee Harvey Oswald/John F. Kennedy drama are shaded in on DeLillo's broad canvas, as he takes a Hyronomous Bosch-like plunge into the underworld of Dallas, the C.I.A., the F.B.I. and the confused background to Oswald's chequered political career.

Oswald the libra figure, represented by the scales that may tilt either way, is also linked to the complicated political situation that has developed since Fidel Castro's overthrow of Cuban dictator Batista—a movement to Cuba libra, a free Cuba. Tracing Oswald's early life with his mother Marguerite, DeLillo attempts to reveal how the odd upbringing of the boy could have influenced his later confusions about his citizenship and political orientation.

Even as the biographical data about Oswald is spun out for us, it is the network of oddball characters who are affiliated with the shady Dickensian oddities and memorable quirks. Win Everett and Laurence Parmenter reminiscing about what might have been had Kennedy given their Bay of Pigs invasion the promised air-support; T. J. Mackey, whose twenty years with “the Bureau” offer him only sordid memories of the Dillinger bust outside of a movie house in Chicago; Guy Bannister, another aging Bureau man who is just to

the right of Attila the Hun; Jack Ruby, the nightclub owner with the squalid life, a refuse-littered automobile, and a penchant for taking stacks of sandwiches and drinks to his buddies on the Dallas police force; Bobby Dupard, the black cellmate who has his star hitched to Oswald's for a brief period of time in the brig in Atsugi, Japan; and a broad array of other bit players whose lives touched those of Lee Harvey Oswald in Japan, New Orleans and Dallas in the early sixties.

Then there is Nicholas Branch, almost a surrogate for author DeLillo, who acts as an omniscient voice, as he sits, harried and perplexed, in a room inundated with the Warren Commission Report, or the one hundred and twenty-five thousand pages of the FBI's papers on the assassination.

Branch must attempt to rationalize the incredible string of deaths which befell principals in the Oswald case—“Shot in the back of head. Died of cut throat. Shot in police station. Shot in motel. Shot by husband after one month of marriage. Found hanging by torso in jail cell. Killed by karate chop... A printout of the names of witnesses, informers, investigators, people linked to Lee H. Oswald, people linked to Jack Ruby, all conveniently and suggestively dead”.

But for all of *Libra*'s attempts to clear up the speculation about Oswald's position in the Kennedy killing—and DeLillo offers a fictional solution which is as valid as the dozens of other scenarios put forth—his book remains a riveting, brilliant novel that adds fresh life to figures that have been written about ad nauseum. *Libra* makes fresh work out of some of the most scrutinized events and characters in American history.

The Replacements Don't Tell A Soul (SIRE-REPRISE—WEA)

When this Minnesota-based punker band scored in 1981 with the album titled *Sorry Ma, Forgot To Take Out The Trash* even the terminally hip Rolling Stone Record Guide granted that their refusal to take themselves seriously was admirable—even if they would never be heard from again!

Well, here they are some eight years down the line hitting us with the kind of album that pulled R.E.M. from the depths of underground specialty work to the dizzying heights of the top ten of the *Stone*'s very own charts. Tongues still firmly in cheek, Paul Westerburg and the other three Replacements—Slim Dunlap, Tommy Stinson and Chris Mars—get off an acoustic-guitar backed parody of their rise to the top with “Talent Show”. On “We'll Inherit The

years ago (*Inside*, called “one of 1986's unrecognized gems”), Matthew Sweet has been recording and touring with The Golden Palominos. With the release of his second recording Sweet conjures up me-

Young in his “Southern Man”, “Harvest” days, while the stunning experimentations with guitar sounds and chords point to Sweet's working with such pop luminaries Alan Tarney, of England, and Athens, Georgia's Don Dixon.

The hooks here spin off in unexpected directions and the vocal spirit of the album is genuinely playful, immediately placing Matthew Sweet in the musical company of Marshall Crenshaw, Jules Shear and everybody's producer, Don Dixon.

The Dead Pool (WARNER BROS. HOME VIDEO)

Clint Eastwood goes to the well one more time with his Dirty Harry character, but unless you're an Eastwood fanatic, this film will ring about as false as the others in the series.

Harry Callaghan is being harassed by gungels of a former victim who operates from the Big House, which means that Harry gets blasted by car squeezes, uzis and sundry shellings as the plot unfolds. The title refers to a pool that features the names of prominent media, and even cop types like Harry, that a popular horror-movie director bets will start to get killed.

The twist on the standard office pool in football or hockey scores, is that each one of the names on the pool begins to turn up dead. Harry Callaghan, between sessions with his superior officers who wish that he would take advantage of the publicity brought on by his most recent arrest, gets on the trail of the perpetrator wiping out the media folk. Along the way Harry encounters Samantha Walker (Patricia Clarkson), who is an aggressive television broadcaster who wants an interview with the celebrated Dirty Harry.

Clarkson, bearing an uncanny resemblance to Eastwood's previous protege, Sondrs Locke, and equally bereft of either beauty or an iota of acting talent, warms up to Harry and becomes the affection-interest in the flick (never love-interest, Harry's too cool and granite-jawed for that stuff!). Liam Neeson does a turn as the Steven King-like figure who churns out horror flicks, and Evan C. Kim plays Chinese-American Al Quan, who is delegated as Harry's sidekick by the image-conscious police department.

The de rigeur cop chase at the end of the film is reminiscent of Steve McQueen's classic tour of the streets of Frisco in *Bullitt*. The difference here is that one of the cars is a remote-controlled Corvette which is armed and ready to blast Dirty Harry into the Bay. Lots of mayhem and cartridges expended in this one but the style is getting a tad limp and the action can't hold a candle to something like *Die Hard*. 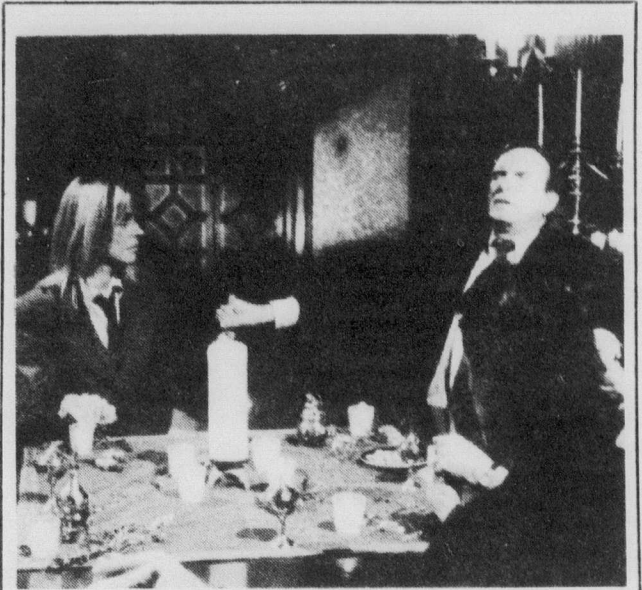

The Bay of Fundy tides are the highest in the world

The tides in Nova Scotia's Bay of Fundy are the highest in the world. Twice a day 115 billion tonnes of water move in and out of the 160-mile-long, v-shaped pocket of sea water.

The rise and fall is 20, 30, often 40 feet in some places. During periods of high winds and a full moon, some Bay of Fundy tides have risen as high as fifty feet. The record variance between high and low has been measured as 54 feet in a place called Burncoat Head on the Minas Basin.

The dramatic tides of the Bay of Fundy can best be observed in Nova Scotia along the Glooscap Trail -- a paved scenic highway -- which travels for 225 miles from Amherst, at the Nova Scotia/New Brunswick border, to Cape Blomidon in the Annapolis Valley, overlooking the Minas Channel.

The Glooscap Trail, named for the Micmac Indian god, follows the shoreline of Chignecto Bay, Greville Bay, the Minas Channel, the Minas Basin, and Cobequid Bay, all narrow bodies of water, where long stretches of mud flats are exposed during low tides and where curious backward waves called tidal bores occur during high tide.

Further south, along the mouth of the Bay of Fundy, where the bay widens, are other, less dramatic, examples of the amazing Fundy tides. St. Mary's Bay, Digby, the Annapolis Basin, and the north coast of the Annapolis Valley (the North Mountain shore) are all influenced by the Fundy flow.

As a natural phenomena, the Bay of Fundy tide is not a sudden

and dramatic event, but rather a gradual, remarkable occurrence that takes twelve hours to complete. However, in some places, like Cobequid Bay, the high tide comes in as fast as one inch per minute, fair warning for adventurous beachcombers who stray too far from shore.

Ships and fishing boats that use Bay of Fundy ports like Delap's Cove, Parker's Cove, Hampton, Parrsboro and Hall's Harbour are found flush and even with the adjacent wharves during high tide, but become stranded, high and dry, 20 feet below the wharf tops when the tide recedes.

Rivers running into the Minas Basin, Cobequid Bay and Chignecto Bay often experience a tidal bore -- a wave of water that moves upstream against the current, making it seem like the river is running backwards.

Tidal bores regularly occur in the Macaan River and River Herbert near Amherst, the Chigonis and Salmon rivers near Truro, the Meander River which empties into Minas Basin near Windsor, and the Shubenacadie River.

The Shubenacadie, one of Nova Scotia's longest rivers, has become the locale for exciting white-water tidal bore raft rides. Rafters wait for the arrival of the bore then ride the crest of the wave upstream enjoying white water thrills in comfort and safety. There are two commercial raft rides on the Shubenacadie. One begins at Shubenacadie Tidal Bore Park, on Route 215, about half-way up the river, and the other, Tidal Bore

Rafting, starts at Maitland at the mouth of the river.

For those who are content to just watch this strange event, the Salmon River near Truro is acknowledged as the best place to view the arrival of the tidal bore. Tide times are well posted and there is parking near the viewing sites.

Unlike the gradual tide change, a tidal bore occurs in a matter of minutes. It passes in seconds.

As the high tide reaches its peak, a small wave of water (the wave increases in height with wind direction and the phases of the moon) suddenly appears at the mouth of the river and works its way upstream. The bore stretches from bank to bank. At some places the bore causes white water turbulence as the river fights to push back the advancing tide.

But the mighty Fundy tide always wins and soon the mud-covered river sides are engulfed in water. The on-coming tide fills the river banks and the advancing bore disappears gradually upstream.

A remarkable and unusual sight -- found nowhere else in North America, part of the magic and mystery of the amazing Fundy tides.

A taste of the ocean

CHICAGO (Reuter) — Far from the nearest salt spray, a taste of the ocean is taking shape on the icy shores of Lake Michigan.

The 58-year-old Shedd Aquarium is building the world's largest indoor, inland oceanarium. The glass-walled pavilion will house dozens of whales, dolphins, sea otters and penguins.

William Braker, the aquarium's director, believes the salt-water attraction may draw as many as 2.5 million visitors a year — more than double the one million who come to the aquarium now.

The aquarium already claims to have the world's largest indoor display of aquatic animals — more than 8,000 mammals, reptiles, amphibians, invertebrates and fish.

But they are largely exhibited in traditional, static in-wall settings along dimly lit corridors. The exception is a circular coral-reef tank into which divers descend to feed the inhabitants by hand.

SPACE DOUBLES

The new facility is a half-moon shaped addition on the lake side of

the present building, resting on landfill which displaced more than 100 million litres of lake water. It will nearly double the floor space of the museum when complete in the fall of 1990.

The oceanarium's interior is designed to duplicate the rocky shoreline of the Pacific Northwest, with a winding nature trail under mossy pines. A multi-tiered roof with large glass windows will flood the area with light.

A curving glass wall on the perimeter facing Lake Michigan is supposed to make the indoor water seem to merge with the lake outside.

A tank 55 metres long and 25 metres wide will give three Pacific black whales and four Pacific white-sided dolphins room to leap and splash. A second pool will house three beluga whales and include a cove for six to 10 seals.

In another area sea otters will frolic. Farther along there will be an area duplicating the Falkland Islands coastline with 30 to 50 penguins, probably representatives of each of the four species found there.

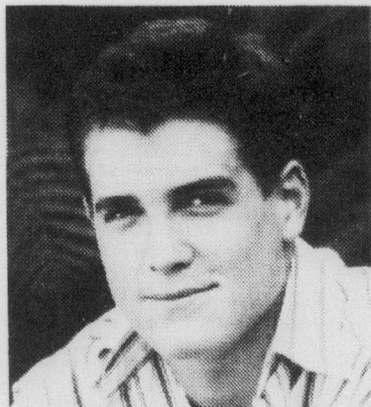

Movie takes up where series left off

The updated antics of agents 86 and 99 provide welcome relief from heavy TV movie fare when *Get Smart, Again!* airs Sunday, Feb. 26, on ABC.

"We think there's a whole new world to make fun of, and a whole new audience to reacquaint with this show," said Allen Sabinson, vice president of motion pictures for television and miniseries, ABC Entertainment.

"I know that for the movie department it's a very pleasant change from many of the more morality-driven movies that we're making," he said.

Get Smart, Again! finds Maxwell Smart longing for a break from his new post as protocol officer. He gets his chance when he learns of a plot by KAOS to overthrow the world by changing the Earth's weather patterns.

Returning in their roles from the 1960s series *Get Smart* are Don Adams, as Smart; Barbara Feldon, as

Agent 99; Dick Gautier, as Hymie; Robert Karavelas, as Larrabee; and Bernie Kopell, as KAOS agent and Smart nemesis Conrad Siegfried.

The subtle humor of the series, as it satirized government intelligence agencies, remains a common theme today, as evidenced by the success of movies, such as *The Naked Gun*. However, *Get Smart* was also designed to spoof the overabundance of spy thrillers popular in its day.

Except for the fact that Smart bumped into furniture and people, couldn't impress the ladies and often unintentionally destroyed the very things he set out to save from the enemy, Maxwell Smart had a lot in common with James Bond.

One similarity was their use of advanced gadgetry in stopping their foes. However, Smart's gadgetry left a lot to be desired. *Get Smart, Again!* promises familiar gadgets—the shoe phone, the Cone of Silence and cuff buttons—as well as new ones that will keep the satire alive.

Psychological thriller delves into matters of spirit world

Bruce Boxleitner, Lindsay Wagner star

"Joanna is an interesting character," said Lindsay Wagner, "because in the middle of everyday life she suddenly is faced with experiences that can't be explained in the usual ways. In order to regain control of her life, she has to open herself to understanding a whole new level of experience."

Joanna Darby, Wagner's character in the four-hour, psychological thriller, *From the Dead of Night*, which airs Monday and Tuesday, Feb. 27 and 28, on NBC, is a fashion designer working for a successful design house.

While she is still learning to cope with the recent death of her mother, she falls into a pool and drowns, undergoing what is called a near-death experience. Joanna goes through a "death tunnel" or a "tunnel of light," as it has been described by several people who have actually had a near-death experience.

"Then, there's an element of fiction that has been added," Wagner said. "As she was coming back to earth, because she wasn't a strong entity of her own, at that point, the evil spirits on the other side—as we have evil people on the other side, if you will—who prey on the weaker people here, they have the ability to latch onto someone's body for a short period of time. As soon as a person's dead, these spirits occupy the body as long as the body is functional."

But Joanna only knows at first that she is experiencing a series of horrifying encounters with strangers who seem determined to kill her. Her pragmatic boyfriend, Glen (Robin Thomas), thinks she is haunted by unresolved feelings about her mother's death. But Peter, a former flame (played by Bruce Boxleitner), isn't so sure.

"Glen tries to explain what is happening in traditional psychological terms," Boxleitner said, "while Peter, an anthropologist familiar with other cultures, is more open to accepting the

existence of supernatural phenomena. This allows him to be completely sympathetic to her."

Disbelieving at first, Joanna discovers that she's the target of six beings who have crossed the line between life and death, through her experience, and who want to reclaim her as one of their own. "They have a time limit," Wagner said. "They only have so long to get her, and if they can't get her in that period of time, she's home free."

Wagner, who has expressed an interest in the things of the spirit world, was pleased that they formed a basis for the miniseries. "I don't think there's really been a show done where they showed the 'tunnel of light,' talking about that whole thing and really enacting it," she said.

She was also pleased with the handling of the issue in terms of the characters. "It's exciting that people are really willing to start doing that, and that educated people ... we have educated people in universities and that kind of thing dealing with these concepts. That thrilled me. I thought that was terrific, very brave."

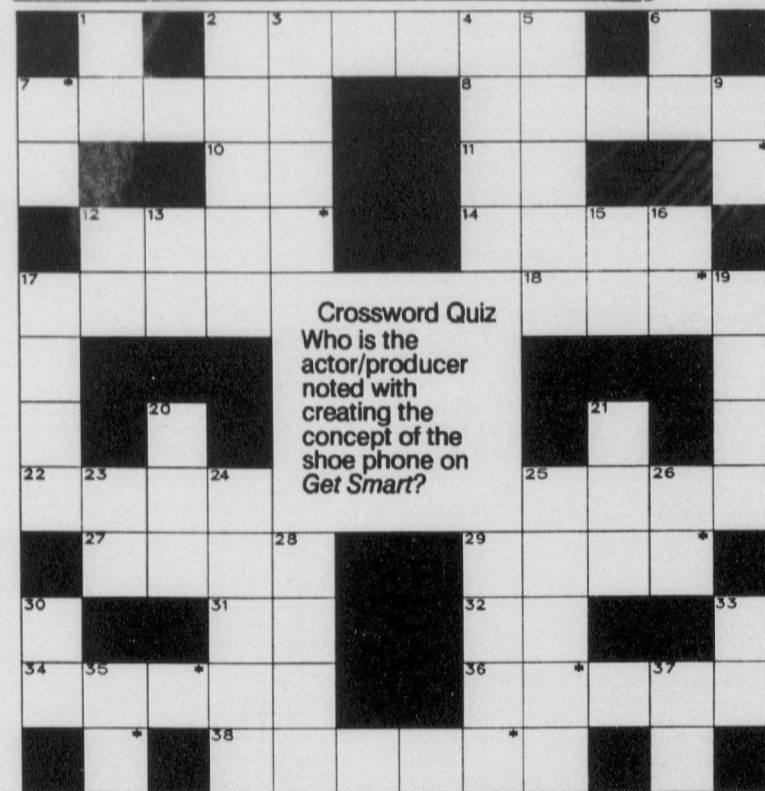
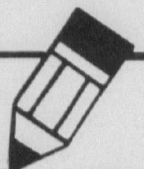

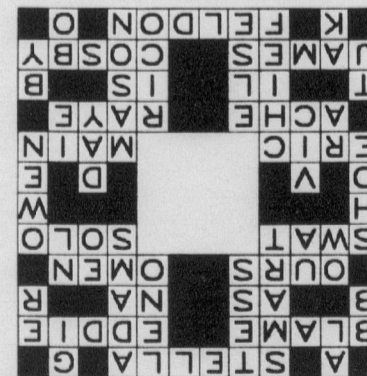
