THE QUEEN AND ROYAL FAMILY.

Her Majesty ALEXANDRINA VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, &c., Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India, Shri Shri Rani Victoria, Kaisar-i-Hind). Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the throne 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV.; was crowned 28th June, 1838; and married 10th February, 1840, to His late Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel, PRINCE CONSORT, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Cobourg and Gotha, who was born 6th August, 1819; died 14th December, 1861. Her Majesty is the only child of His late Royal Highness, Edward Duke of Kent, fourth son of King George III. The children of Her Majesty are:

His Royal Highness ALBERT EDWARD, PRINCE OF WALES, Duke of Saxony, Cornwall and Rothesay, Earl of Dublin, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., K.T.S., G.C.B., P.C., field marshal, colonel of the 10th Hussars, and colonel-in-chief of the Rifle Brigade, born 9th of November, 1841; married 10th March, 1863, to the Princess Alexandra Caroline Mary Charlotte Louisa Julia, born 1st December, 1844, eldest daughter of the King of Denmark, and has issue: His Royal Highness Prince Albert Victor Christian Edward, born 8th January, 1864, died 14th January, 1892; His Royal Highness Prince George Frederick Ernest Albert, born 3rd June, 1865; Her Royal Highness Princess Louisa Victoria Alexandra Dagmar, born 20th February, 1867, married July 27, 1889, to Alexander, Earl of Fife; Her Royal Highness Princess Victoria Alexandra Olga Mary, born 6th July, 1868; Her Royal Highness Princess Maud Charlotte Mary Victoria, born 26th November, 1869, and His Royal Highness Prince Alexander John C. Albert, born 6th April, 1871, died 7th April, 1871.

Her Royal Highness Helena Augusta Victoria, born May 25, 1846; married to His Royal Highness Prince Frederick Christian Charles Augustus of Schleswig-Holstein Sonderburg-Augustenburg, July 5, 1866, and has issue living one son and two daughters.

Her Royal Highness Louisa Carolina Alberta, born March 18, 1848; married to the Marquis of Lorne, eldest son of the Duke of Argyll, March 21, 1871.

His Royal Highness Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, born May 1, 1850; married Princess Louise Margaret of Prussia, March 13, 1879, and has issue one son and two daughters.

His Royal Highness Leopold George Duncan Albert, Duke of Albany, born April 7, 1853; married April 22, 1882, Princess Helen of Waldeck; died March 28, 1884; issue a daughter, born Feb. 25, 1883, and a son born July 19, 1884.

The licenses for carts, trucks and other vehicles used for the conveyance of goods, wares, merchandise, etc., shall be divided into three classes, as follows:—

The first class shall include all carts, trucks, waggons and other vehicles running within the city for hire or reward, not otherwise expressly provided for, and shall pay:

For every dabble.....	4 00

The second-class shall include all carts, waggons or other vehicles used by merchants, traders, manufacturers, contractors, for the conveyance or delivery of the articles or effects dealt in, manufactured, or made use of by them, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for in the first-class..... 2 50

The third-class shall include all carts, waggons, or vehicles used by expressmen, bakers, brewers, distillers, farmers, or gardeners, for each of which there shall be paid, in addition to the rates charged for, in the first-class..... 5 00

1. For every hearse drawn by one horse..... 10 00
 2. For every hearse drawn by two horses..... 14 00
 Parties obtaining licenses, as aforesaid, shall moreover pay the annual assessment on all working horses employed in drawing the above mentioned vehicles or carriages at the rate of two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) each, and also twenty-five cents for each number granted by the Chief of Police.

TARIFF OF CARTAGE.

From any place to any other in the First Division, or from any place exclusive of the Harbor wharves to any other place in the City, and vice versa, provided the distance does not exceed 3/4 of a mile.

Articles not herein enumerated of a convenient bulk, not over 1,500 lbs. weight, 15 cts.: ashes, pot or pearl, two barrels, 15 cts.; beef, pork or fish, five barrels or tierces, 15 cts.; coal or coke, half a chaldron or half a ton, 15 cts.; crockery, one crate or one hoghead, 15 cts.; flour or fruit, seven barrels, 15 cts.; grain, not over 1,500 lbs. weight, 15 cts.; lumber, sawn, from yard or boat, 500 feet, broad measure, 15 cts.; salt or rice, six bags or six barrels, 15 cts.; firewood, dry, from yard or boat, half a cord, three feet long, 15 cts.; firewood, green or from rafts, half a cord, three feet long, 20 cts.; furniture or luggage, per load, 20 cts.; lumber, green or hard, from rafts, 500 feet broad measure, 20 cts.; molasses, sugar or oil, one puncheon, hoghead or load, 20 cts.; pig iron, lead, copper, or tin, one ton, 25 cts.; bar iron or steel, one ton, 30 cts. For every additional half mile for all above description of goods, 10 cents, and from any of the Harbor wharves to any place in the 2nd or 3rd division within 1/2 a mile distance from the boundary line of the first division, and vice versa, or from any place [exclusive of the wharves] to any other in the City, and vice versa, provided the distance do not exceed 1 1/4 mile,—instead of 15, 20, 25 and 30 cts., the rate shall be 25, 30, 35 and 40 cents.

From any place in the western section of the first division.

To the stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine canal, 20 cts.; the stores and wharves below Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine canal, 25 cts.; the Basins above Wellington bridge, north side of Lachine canal, 25 cts.; the Basins above Wellington bridge, south side of Lachine Canal, and the stores, stations, factories, etc., at Point St. Charles, 35 cents.; the stores, factories, etc., at and above St. Gabriel Locks, north of Lachine Canal, 30 cents.; the St. Bonaventure Street Railway Station, 20 cents.; St. Bonaventure Street from the lower wharves of the Harbor, 25 cts.; and vice versa for one load.

And from any place in the Eastern section of the first division—instead of 20, 25, 25, 35, 30, 20, 25 cents, the rates shall be 25, 30, 30, 40, 35, 25, 30 cents.

For any excess over the quantity or weight fixed for a load, additional pro rata rates shall be paid.

If delay is caused to the carter by the employer, beyond the time usually required for loading, the carter shall be paid extra for such delay at the rate of five cents for every quarter of an hour.

If a carter is called, and there be no load ready for him, or if he be unable to load the goods or articles for want of assistance, he shall be paid as if he carried a load the distance thus unnecessarily travelled.

DIVISIONS REFERRED TO ABOVE.

First division.—The first division shall comprise the east, centre, and west wards (including the south-west side of McGill street and the north-west side of Craig street), and shall be sub-divided into two sections, eastern and western, the line of demarcation between them being the centre of St. Lambert and St. Jean Baptistes.

Second division.—The Second Division shall comprise the St. Ann, St. Antoine, and St. Lawrence wards (exclusive of McGill and Craig streets).

Third division.—The third division shall comprise (exclusive of Craig street) the St. Louis, St. James and St. Mary wards.

TARIFF FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

One horse vehicle.—Time allowed—fifteen minutes, for one or two persons, 25 cents; for three or four persons, 40 cents. Time allowed—thirty minutes, for one or two persons, 40 cents; for three or four persons, 60 cents.

For the first hour.—For one or two persons, 75 cents; for three or four persons, \$1; for every subsequent hour, for one or two persons, 60 cents; for three or four persons, 75 cents.

Two horse vehicle.—Time allowed—fifteen minutes, for one or two persons, 50 cents; for three or four persons, 65 cents. Time allowed—thirty minutes, for one or two persons, 65 cents; for three or four persons, 75 cents.

By the hour.—For one or two persons, \$1; for three or four persons \$1.25.

Baggage.—For each trunk carried in any such vehicle, 10 cents.

No charge for travelling bags, valises, boxes or parcels which passengers can carry by the hand.

a. When the drive exceeds half an hour, hour rate to be charged; fractions of hours for any drive exceeding one hour shall be charged at *pro rata* hour rates as above established for drives by the hour:

b. For drives between midnight and four o'clock in the morning, fifty per cent. shall be added to the tariff rates above established:

c. The tariff by time shall apply to all drives extending beyond the city limits, provided the engagement be made within said limits.

CHIMNEY SWEEPING.

Clauses of Municipal Act regulating dates for sweeping, tariff to be charged therefor, etc.

Each chimney in use in the said city shall be swept by licensed sweeps three times at least in the course of every twelve months, to be computed from the first day of January in each and every year, namely:—once between the first of January and the first of May, once between the first of May and the first of September, and once between the first of September and the first of January in each and every year.

The said inspector may grant licenses to sweep chimneys as aforesaid to so many qualified persons as he may deem necessary; and he may revoke and withdraw the said licenses whensoever and as often as he may deem expedient; provided, however, that no licensed sweep shall use any brush, broom or other contrivance for the purpose of sweeping chimneys without first having submitted the same to the inspector of buildings for his approval.

The inspector may, for the purposes aforesaid, divide the city into as many districts as he may deem necessary to efficiently carry out the provisions of the next preceding sections, and he may assign a district to every such sweeper, subject, however, to such changes from time to time as the said inspector may deem expedient to make.

Such sweepers will be under the superintendence of the said inspector, and it shall be their duty to obey such orders and instructions as he may from time to time issue in connection with the sweeping of chimneys.

For sweeping each chimney in a one story house, eight cents; for sweeping each chimney in a two story house, ten cents; for sweeping each chimney in a three story house, thirteen cents; for sweeping each chimney in a house of four or more stories, fifteen cents. When any sweeper is especially called upon, outside of his ordinary rounds, to sweep any chimney, the charge in that case shall be twenty-five cents.

Such fees shall be payable by the occupant of the house or building wherein such chimneys have been swept, so soon after and as often as such chimneys are swept; and any person who shall refuse or neglect to pay such fees, or shall prevent any such sweeper from entering into any house or building, or shall in any way obstruct or molest him in the execution of his duties, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

Whenever any chimney shall take fire, and it shall appear that the occupant of the house or building where such chimney may be had refused or neglected to have the same swept at any of the periods hereinbefore specified, every such occupant shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

COURTS OF JUSTICE.

SUPREME COURT OF THE DOMINION.

The Supreme Court, as a high Court of Appeal, constituted by Dominion Statute (Revised Statutes of Canada, chap. 135), is composed of a chief justice and five puisn  judges, and has appellate, civil and criminal jurisdiction within and throughout the Dominion of Canada. The judges reside at Ottawa, where the Supreme Court holds annually three sessions: the first beginning on the third Tuesday in February, the second on the first Tuesday in May, and the third on the fourth Tuesday in October.

EXCHEQUER COURT OF THE DOMINION.

The Exchequer Court, constituted under a Dominion Statute, 50-52 Vict., chap. 16, is presided over by one judge, and has original exclusive jurisdiction in all claims, suits or actions against the crown. It has concurrent jurisdiction in relation to revenue cases and the enforcement of penalties, in cases in which it is sought at the instance of the attorney-general of Canada to impeach or annul any patent of invention or any patent case or other instrument respecting lands, cases against crown officers for anything done or omitted to be done as such officers, and all actions or suits in which the crown is plaintiff or petitioner.

7½c. per ton on coal and coke, grain and seeds of all kinds.

Special: bricks, 10c. per 1000; cord wood, 5c. per cord; lumber, 10c. per 1000 feet, board measure.

Free — bullion, specie.

On all goods wares and merchandise whatsoever the quantity of which by weight, measurement or other mode of estimate provided for in the tariff, cannot be conveniently ascertained, it shall be lawful for the Harbor Commissioners to levy a rate of ¼ of one per cent. on the value thereof.

Each entry shall pay not less than 5 cents. All property landed on the wharves for re-shipment shall only pay one wharfage.

The ton mentioned in the Tariff of wharfage dues shall be 2000 lbs. weight, or 40 cubic feet measurement, according to the bill of lading.

POSTAL INFORMATION.

Postage.—Letters addressed to places in Canada and United States, 3 cents per oz., or fraction thereof.

Newfoundland and Great Britain (by Canadian or New York Mail Steamers), 5 cents per ½ oz., or fraction thereof.

On "Drop" letters, whether posted in the city or at a suburban office, addressed to any point within the letter carriers' delivery, the rate is 2c. per oz.

Drop letters posted at any suburban office for delivery therefrom, 1 cent per oz.

Drop letters posted at any suburban office for delivery at another suburban office, 3 cents per oz.

Suburban Offices.—For Cote-des-Neiges, Outremont, Cote St. Antoine, Cote St. Louis, Cote St. Paul, Cote Visitation, DeLorimier, Mile End, Notre Dame de Grace, St. Cunegonde (including Dorchester and Metcalfe Avenues), Maisonneuve, St. Henri (Tannery West), St. Lambert, Longueuil and Montreal South, 1 cent per oz.

Drop letters for the city office, for Point St. Charles, St. Gabriel, Hochelaga and St. Jean Baptiste wards, 2 cents per oz.

Letters addressed to places in Canada must be at least partially prepaid, and those addressed to the United States must be prepaid at least a full rate, 3 cents, otherwise they will be sent to the Dead Letter Office.

Letters addressed to places in Canada, and partly prepaid, will be forwarded, subject on delivery to double the amount of unpaid postage.

Re-Directed Letters.—Re-directed letters are not liable to any additional postage, if handed back to the Post Office

with a changed address at the moment of delivery or as soon as possible thereafter provided always the change in the address does not require the letter to be sent to any place to which the postage rate is higher than was at first payable. Thus a drop letter re-directed to a place outside the city or town becomes liable to a higher rate, and the difference must be prepaid, otherwise double the difference will be collected on delivery.

Re-directed letters should not be dropped into a Post Office Box or receiver unless additional postage has been put on to carry them to their second destination.

Request Letters.—Letters from places in Canada and the United States covered by envelopes having printed thereon a "Request" that the letters be returned to the sender if not delivered within a certain specified time, will be returned as requested if not delivered in the time stated. But undelivered envelopes merely bearing the imprint of a firm's name or of a hotel in the top left hand corner will not be considered "Request" letters, but will be sent to dead letter office.

Printed or written requests for direct return may be compiled with in the case of undelivered letters from Newfoundland.

Post Cards.—For Canada and the United States, 1 cent each. For Great Britain, Newfoundland, and all Postal Union countries, 2 cents each. Reply cards, for Canada only, 2 cents each. Nothing must be attached to a Post Card.

Second Class Matter.—Newspapers and Periodicals posted from the office of publication, are authorized to pass free of postage to regular subscribers in Canada and the United States.

Specimen numbers may be sent at 1 cent per lb.

British newspapers and periodicals received here by the trade in closed mails direct from the United Kingdom can be remailed free to regular subscribers in Canada, not otherwise.

Newspapers from offices of publication for Newfoundland, 1 cent per 4 oz.

Third Class Matter, Newspapers and Periodicals.—Transient newspapers for any place in Canada or United States, 1 cent per 4 oz., but a paper not more than 1 oz. will go for ½c. Local newspapers and periodicals not weighing more than 1 oz., for delivery in city ½c. each. For Great Britain and other European countries, see Foreign Postage Table.

Books, etc., and Miscellaneous Matter.—The postage on Books, Pamphlets, Circulars (wholly in print), occasional publications, etc., addressed to Canada, is 1 cent per 4 oz. To the United States, Newfoundland, Great Britain and all European countries, 1 cent per 2 oz. The postage on Printers' Proof Sheets, Maps, Prints, Drawings, Engravings, Lithographs, Photographs, Sheet Music (whether printed or written, including music books, whether stitched or bound), etc., addressed to Canada, the United States, Newfoundland, Great Britain, or any European country is 1 cent per 2 oz. No package must exceed 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth. The limit of weight for Canada and United States is 5 lbs., for other Postal Union countries 4 lbs. Limit of weight for a single book addressed to places in Canada is 7 lbs.

Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs, Roots and Scions or Grafts can only be sent to the United States as 5th Class Matter; when posted for delivery in Canada, the postage is 1 cent per 4 oz., and the limit of weight 5 lbs.

Commercial Papers and Legal Documents may be sent to Great Britain, Newfoundland, United States, and all Foreign countries, except Orange Free State, British Bechuanaland, and other more remote places in the interior of Africa, served by way of Cape Colony or Natal, at 5 cents for the first 10 ounces, and 1 cent for every additional 2 ounces. These Papers, when posted for delivery in Canada, must be prepaid at Letter or Parcel Post rates—but Deeds and Insurance Policies may be sent if prepaid 1 cent per 2 oz.

Patterns and Samples.—*Bona fide* Patterns and Samples of Merchandise, not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, may be sent to any place in Canada at 1 cent per 4 oz. Must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Goods sent in execution of an order, however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private individual to another, not being actually Trade Patterns or Samples, are not admissible.

The limit of weight to United Kingdom is 5 lbs; limit of size, 2 ft. in length by 1 foot in width or depth.

The limit of weight to Belgium, Egypt, France, Hawaii, Roumania, Austria, Italy, Switzerland and Portugal is 12

oz.; limit of size, 1 foot in length by 8 in. in width and in. in depth. If in form of a roll it may be 12 in. in length and 6 in. in diameter.

The limit of weight to other postal union countries is 8 oz.; limits of size same as for Belgium, Egypt, &c.

The postage on sample packets to postal union countries is 2c. for the first 4 ozs., and 1c. for each additional 2 ozs.

Fourth Class Matter, Closed Parcels.—Parcels for Canada must be prepaid 6 cents for 4 oz., and must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight, nor 2 feet in length, by 1 foot in width or depth. No correspondence must be enclosed.

Fifth Class Matter.—Comprises such articles of general merchandise as are not entitled to any lower rate of postage. Postage 1 cent per oz., or fraction of an ounce. Limit of weight 5 lbs.; of size, two feet in length by one foot in width or depth. Matter claiming to be 5th Class *must be open to inspection*, and there must be no correspondence enclosed. Packages of Fifth Class Matter may be sent to the United States for the same prepayment as is required within the Dominion, but the contents will be liable to Customs Inspection and collection of duty in the United States. Sealed tins containing fish, lobster, vegetables, meats, &c., if put up in a solid manner and labelled in such a way as to fully indicate the nature of their contents, may be sent as 5th Class Matter within the Dominion, but no sealed matter can be forwarded to the United States under this head. Liquids, oils and fatty substances may be sent to places in Canada and the United States as 5th Class, if securely put up.

Parcel Post with the United Kingdom, Newfoundland, Japan, Barbadoes, and certain other countries. Closed parcels may be sent to places in Newfoundland, Jamaica, the United Kingdom, Japan, Barbadoes, Leeward Islands and all other countries and colonies with which the United Kingdom maintains a Parcel Post. No correspondence must be enclosed. A Customs Declaration of the contents and value of each parcel must be filled up at the Post Office, or at one of the branches, by the sender.

Parcels for Newfoundland must be prepaid 15 cents per lb., or fraction of a lb., and must not exceed 7 lbs. in weight nor 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth.

Parcels for Jamaica and Barbadoes, Grenada, St Lucia, St Vincent and British Guiana must be prepaid 20 cents per lb., or fraction of a lb., and must not exceed 7 lbs. in weight, nor 2 feet in length, by 1 foot in width and depth.

Parcels for the United Kingdom must be prepaid 20c. for the 1st lb., and 16c. for each additional lb., or fraction of a lb., and must not exceed 11 lbs. in weight nor 2 feet in length, by 1 foot in width or depth.

Parcels for Japan must be prepaid 25c. per lb., or fraction of a lb., and must not exceed 7 lbs. in weight, nor 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth.

Information as to other countries to which parcels may be sent, and the rates applicable to each, may be obtained on application at the Inquiry Office, General Post Office.

Registration.—Every article intended for registration must be handed in at the wicket, and a receipt obtained therefor. "It is desirable that the stamp used should be a registration stamp." The fee on all classes of articles addressed to places in Canada, United States, Newfoundland, Great Britain and all European countries is 5 cents.

The sender of a registered article addressed to any Postal Union country may entitle himself to a certificate as to the disposal of the said article by the Postmaster at the office addressed, on prepayment of an additional fee of 5 cents. All Classes of matter may be registered to all destinations in Canada and throughout the Postal Union; and letters may be registered to most of the countries not included in the Union.

The public are reminded that registered letters are only carried on trains that are accompanied by railway mail clerk. Hence a registered letter and an ordinary letter posted simultaneously will often be received at different times.

Matter which cannot be forwarded through the Post.—Any Explosive Substance, Liquid, etc., not properly put up, and other matter likely to entail risk or injury to the ordinary contents of the mail, will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, Ottawa.

Glass in any form is also inadmissible, except eye-glasses, spectacles and microscopic slides, when properly put up and prepaid at parcel post rate or 5th Class Matter rate.

Letters containing Gold or Silver Money, Jewels, or precious articles, or anything liable to Customs duties, cannot be forwarded by Post to any of the Postal Union countries, except to the United States.
