John Smith, convicted of an Assault and Battery, sentenced to pay a fine of 6s. 8d. and to be imprisoned for one week.

Donato Ferraro, convicted of Assault and Battery, sentenced to be imprisoned for one calendar month.

William Boardman, convicted of Petty Larceny—to be confined six calendar months in the House of Correction, and kept at hard labour.

Joseph Augé, convicted of Petty Larceny, to be confined six months in the House of Correction, and therein kept at hard labour.

Etienne Lessard, convicted of Petty Larceny—to be imprisoned six calendar months in the House of Correction, and therein kept at hard labour.

François Daigle, convicted of Petty Larceny—to be confined six calendar months in the House of Correction, and therein kept at hard labour.

Joseph Odlir, convicted of an assault with an intent to ravish—to be confined twelve calendar months in the House of Correction, and therein kept at hard labour.

Thomas Pearson, convicted of an assault with intent to ravish Ellen M. Mullen, an infant under 10 years of age—to be confined twelve calendar months in the House of Correction, and therein kept at hard labour.

Louis Laisel, Joseph Deroche and Magdelaine Marshall, convicted of Petty Larceny—to be severally confined for 12 months in the House of Correction, and therein kept at hard labour.

Rose Girard, indicted for the murder of her bastard child, convicted of having been delivered of issue of her body male, which is horn-alive would be bastard, and that she did conceal the birth thereof—to be confined for two years from the date of her conviction, in the House of Correction, and therein kept at hard labour.

Joseph Larose, convicted of Grand Larceny—to be hanged on the last Friday of October.
