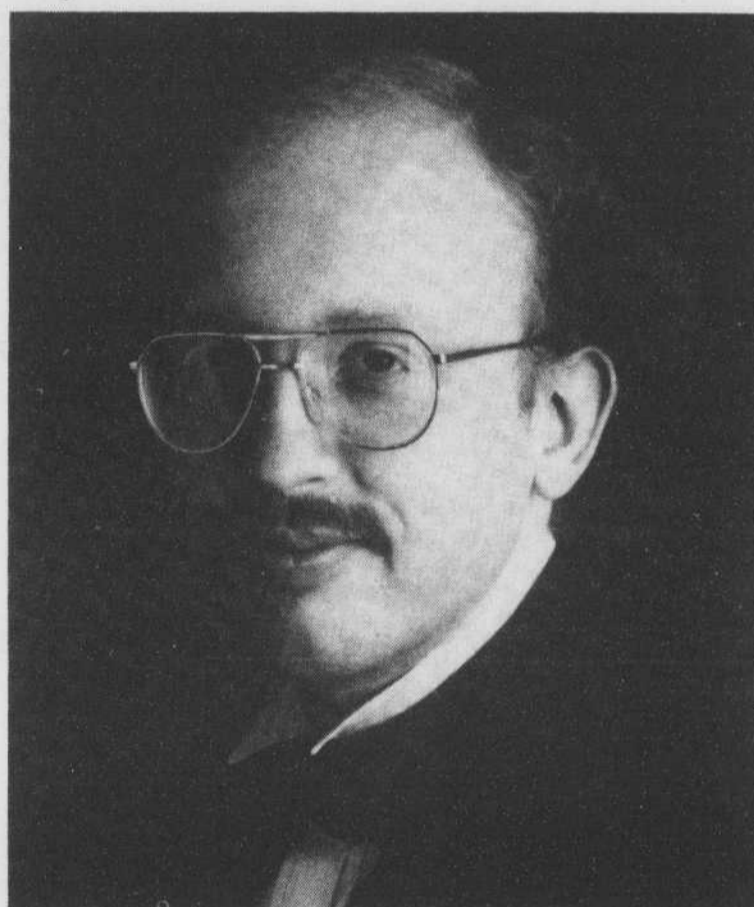

Symphony celebrates 50th birthday of United Nations

SHERBROOKE — To celebrate the 50th anniversary of the United Nations, the Sherbrooke Symphony Orchestra pays tribute to the trio of countries which founded the organization.

Works by N. Rimsky-Korsakov of Russia, George Gershwin of the United States and Edward Elgar of England will be played on Saturday, February 24, at 8 p.m. at Sherbrooke University's Centre Culturel.

Conducted by Stewart Grant, the concert will feature *The Russian Easter Overture* by Rimsky-Korsakov, *Enigma Variations, op. 36* by Elgar, and

Piano Concerto in F by Gershwin. The piano concerto, inspired by Charleston, blues and jazz, will be performed by young Canadian pianist Richard Raymond.

Adding a Canadian touch to the program will be *Scherzo*, by Canuck composer Maurice Dela.

Born in Campbellton, New Brunswick, Raymond won first prize at the prestigious International Music Competition of Montreal in 1992 and performs regularly in Europe and

Canada.

Centaur's *The Visitor* is witty and wise

MONTREAL — *The Visitor* is the type of play that is possible to watch and enjoy more so for its subject matter and content than for its style.

Currently playing at the Centaur, it is a wise work written by French playwright Eric-Emmanuel Schmitt that pits an aging Sigmund Freud against an omniscient presence who may or may not be God.

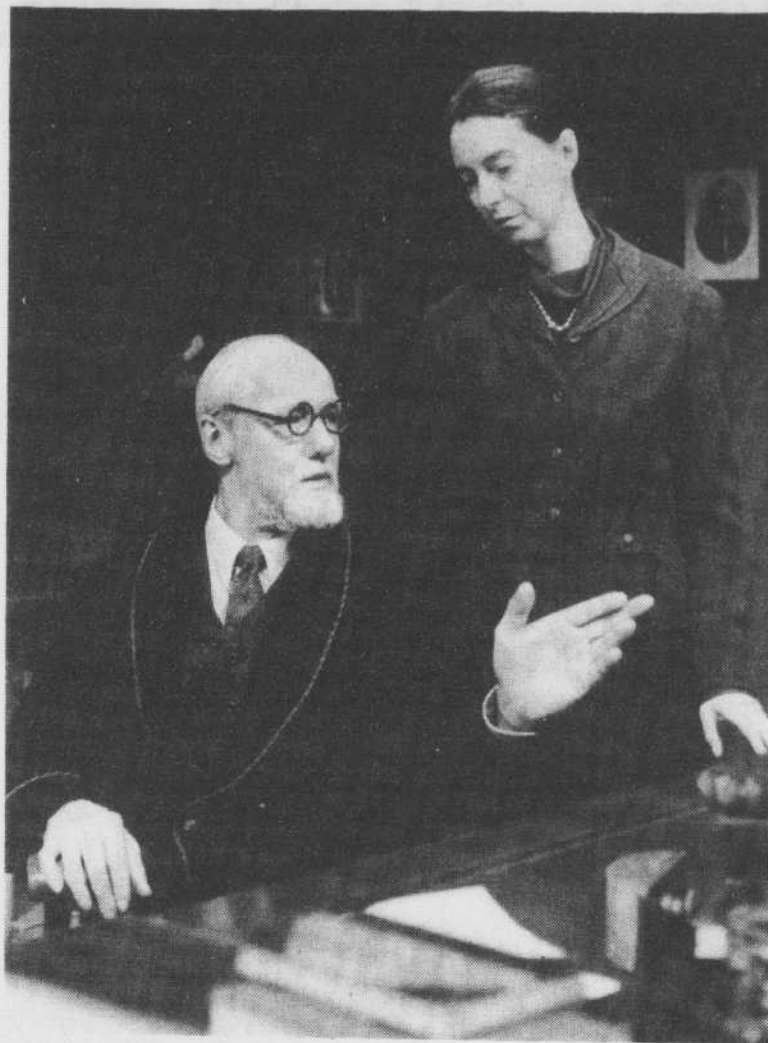
Dr. Freud and his family are planning to leave Austria at the height of its fall to Nazi hands. It is 1938 and with worldwide support behind him, Freud's departure for France — and freedom — solely depends on his willingness to sign a form absolving the Gestapo from mistreatment and tyranny.

It is at this point, when Freud must come to grips with his convictions, that the title character literally walks in on him and they exchange almost two hours worth of smartly staged philosophical debates and acute observations on faith, mankind and responsibility.

The play is capably adapted by Jeremy Sams from Schmitt's original French text. Sams retains the play's talky, sardonic wit peppered with shrewd, crackling humor. Yet it is precisely its humor that weakens the play, highlighting its pretensions.

INTRIGUING

While rewarding in its keen observations, it is not an entirely successful piece of theatre. The mere possibility of God's actual existence is already

intriguing by half. God vs. Freud, so unlike one another, pitted vis-a-vis makes for potentially interesting theatre. Yet, as *The Visitor* proves, not even God's appearance does a complete play make.

Schmitt, a philosophy major and circuit lecturer, not surprisingly writes words which read like blueprints for analytical discourse. Ironically, this is not the play's drawback. It is precisely

this that saves the play from its other handicaps.

Much like the debate which takes place centrestage, the end result is ultimately unfulfilling. We are still uncertain of God's existence, that is, unless of course we are true believers to begin with.

CASTING COUP

As a play, the work of art in *The Visitor* is the winning casting coup of Gary Reineke and

Jean LeClerc as, respectively, the Doctor and his guest. Together, they make a great pairing in contrast. As polar opposites in mannerism, style and delivery, these characters yin-yang their varying ways through conceit and contempt, revelation and denial, fear and, finally, respect.

Reineke's crusty, rambling sage is a Freud who finally lays down his convictions to reveal a solid yet fragile everyman. Reineke embodies his real life character with total ease, at once comfortable and forthright.

LeClerc (known to many as Jeremy Hunter on the ABC soap *All My Children*) chooses a different path with his egocentric but charming stranger. His God exudes confidence in a slick, smart fashion. Yet, LeClerc never betrays his character's vacuous charm (and believe me, it is there with much purpose). He is perfectly in control of his character and rightly so. He does as God would.

Lise Roy (*The Boys of St. Vincent*) makes for an awkward Anna, Freud's daughter, a fierce character with stubborn flaws. At times, Roy seems to stumble on her own French accent. At others, she is extraordinarily reminiscent of American actress Jane Alexander at her best.

Martin Neufeld is stuck in an uncompromising role, a caricature that demands little more than animated villainy. Yet, it is this evil that sets the

play's pertinence in motion.

Although *The Visitor* benefits from the triumph of its two leading roles, credit must go to the play's director Daniel Roussel. Roussel has not directed a show at the Centaur since 1979's production of *Piaf*. He has, however, accomplished quite a bit since, including heading notable stage productions of *Being At Home With Claude* and Opera de Montréal's *Carmen*.

Adequate costuming, effective sound effects and, most successfully, powerful lighting permeate the staging.


One senses that Roussel has a tight rein over his cast and intimate study setting. Yet on the other hand, he should have also seen the play's flipside: its flaws and trappings, most notable in its less than profound characterizations, juvenile humor and absurd escapism. But then I would still pay my way in just to be able to attentively listen to Freud and his impossible God squaring it off if only for the stylized dialogue.

The Visitor is play not without its rewards. It is a concept in search of an appropriate treatment which, like its title character, can never truly come satisfyingly through. Still it leaves one thinking and thinking is good.

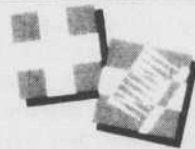

Artists stretch talents beyond expectations

If you're asked who Keith Stegall is, you might say he's Alan Jackson's producer. You may have also seen his name on Randy Travis' albums. Stegall is also much more.

These days he is head of artists and repertoire for Mercury Records, which means he's partly responsible for finding hit songs for Shania Twain, Terri Clark, Sammy Kershaw and other artists on the label.

This job was offered to him more than once but what finally convinced Stegall to accept was the fact they gave him the freedom to produce Jackson's album, despite the fact that Jackson records for another label.

But there is a side to Stegall which is less known: he is also an accomplished songwriter and when he turned 40, he decided he needed to make his own artistic statement. Now, Stegall has decided to step in front of the microphone.

A soon-to-be-released album has come out of it, titled *Passages*, on Mercury Records. It will include songs such as "Middle-Aged Man" and "My Life", which deal with divorce, and "Baltimore Street", which chronicles a life from birth to death.

From songwriter to producer to record company executive to performer, Stegall has taken quite a journey and his album might bring us a few surprises.

Ashley Judd, the younger daughter of Naomi and sister of Wynonna, will play Marilyn Monroe in HBO's upcoming *Norma Jean and Marilyn*.

The movie will premiere in the spring and Ashley will share the title role with Mira Sorvino (Ashley plays young Norma Jean while Sorvino takes over when she becomes Marilyn Monroe).

Ashley recently starred in the movie *Heat* with Robert De

Niro, Al Pacino and Val Kilmer. Things seem to be great for the Judd family as Naomi has opened a restaurant in Nashville while Wynonna just released her first album since 1993. A successful family indeed.

Don't Fence Me In (RCA/BMG) is Lari White's third album and it finds her critically-acclaimed voice in great form. The title sounds a little rebellious, this is likely how she feels about her career. It could very well at this point be considered her theme song — on the new album, there are two versions of the track made famous by Bing Crosby and The Andrews Sisters.

The first version is the album opener and you'd swear you were hearing an old gramophone recording of The Andrews Sisters. For that retro sound, White recruited Trisha Yearwood and Shelby Lynne.

It was recorded with all the musicians in one room and Yearwood, Lynne and White singing into one microphone, totally live and mixed to sound as much like an old victrola as possible.

The second version, which

closes the album, features a rockin' infectious beat that drives the message where she wants it to go. Both versions are equally interesting, showing what is possible with some creativity.

The first single, "Ready, Willing And Able", and it is a potential radio hit with very strong lyrics. There's also "Wild At Heart", which reinforces the message of the title track.

"Ghost Of A Chance", which White co-wrote with husband Chuck Cannon, explores the battle of a woman against the shadow of a lover's ex. Listen carefully, you'll hear the ghost.

"The Test" deals with relationships which are difficult at times, reminding us that true love is worth fighting for.

"Ain't Gonna Worry" is the type of song that would have

sued Scarlett O'Hara with the southern belle's I'll-worry-about-it-tomorrow attitude.

In "Next To Love", you find a definite R&B influence but just like in "Do It Again" and "I've Been Waiting For Your Love", it celebrates the qualities of being perseverant and persistent and all the joy it brings.

"Soul Searchin' Blues" and "Woman of The World" are two numbers which any modern woman can relate to, with all the decisions and choices to be made today.

White wrote or co-wrote seven of the 12 cuts and listening to this album is like going on a journey of different moods and feelings. It is a great album and White gains by not getting fenced in.

Since people enjoyed the lip-synch contest so much the first time, it will be on again this Friday at Bar Wildwood in Lennoxville.

Neil Diamond goes country with new album, TV special

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — There are distinct advantages in being Neil Diamond.

For instance, if the new songs aren't flowing as they were in the old days, you can rent a house in Nashville for a year and put the word out that you're available to co-write.

The chance to work with the guy who wrote "I'm A Believer", "Sweet Caroline", "Song Sung Blue", "Cherry Cherry" and a host of other classic pop tunes didn't go unnoticed.

Heavyweight Nashville songwriters like Hal Ketchum, Beth Nielsen Chapman, Harlan Howard, Gretchen

Peters and Raul Malo of the Mavericks agreed to collaborate.

And so Diamond, who had put out stop-gap Christmas collections for two years, is now promoting *Tennessee Moon*, his first album of new material in five years. It's being promoted as a return to the style of his early singles, and a remake of "Kentucky Woman" punctuates the point.

An ABC-TV special to air Saturday, Feb. 24, at 10 p.m. is built around the album (another advantage of being Diamond is you can promote your new CD to a prime-time network TV audience).

The show is called *Neil Diamond . . . Under a Tennessee Moon* and features Waylon Jennings, Chet Atkins and newcomer Buffy Lawson. It was taped at the former home of the Grand Ole Opry, The Ryman Auditorium.

Diamond says he hasn't felt so good about one of his new records since *The Jazz Singer*.

"It does hearken back to the simplicity of a lot of my early records," Diamond said as he dismissed the notion that he'll be seen as another faded pop star looking to ride on country music's commercial coattails.

"No, that doesn't worry me. The songs tell the story. You can't hide. It's out there for

people to reach conclusions about."

Tennessee Moon, with 18 songs, is evidence that the Nashville experience was the cure for any songwriting torpor Diamond was going through.

"Win the World" is the type of bittersweet ballad Diamond has specialized in during the second half of his career. This one was inspired by his second divorce. Another standout is "Talking Optimist Blues (Good Day Today)", a breezy diatribe against being a worrywart.

Co-writing, which Diamond rarely had done before, appears to have been the right strategy to beat a slight writer's block.

"For some reason in the late '80s I became discontent to a certain degree to what was happening with the songs I was writing," he said. "The airplay that I used to get wasn't there, so I kind of backpedaled on the writing."

"It became a secondary thing."

Another advantage to being Diamond is a fan base so loyal he didn't need hit records to sell concert tickets. So he decided to do some serious touring while he was young enough to take the physical strain.

"I always felt that I could write way into my '90s," he said.

Sherbrooke fine arts museum heading for the future

SHERBROOKE — When the Eastern Townships Bank built its head office in Sherbrooke in 1877, what the growing community in the area needed most was a financial institution to help them build a future.

Now, more than 100 years later, the building is getting a new lease on life, and this time it is the arts that is needed to help the community thrive.

It is a turning point in the history of the building and of the Sherbrooke Fine Arts Museum, which is currently completing its move from the building it's occupied on Palais Street for the past seven years to the former bank building at 241 Dufferin Street.

Along with the move comes some major renovations to the building, most recently a branch of the CIBC bank.

Museum director Michel Forest has an apt analogy for the move, physically just a couple of blocks away. Speaking like an explorer of brave new worlds, Forest said one small step for the museum is a giant leap for the Townships.

QUALITY MUSEUM

"Sherbrooke and the Townships are now going to have a quality art museum up to norms," he said.

The former building wasn't up to government and museum standards.

"The major problem was one of humidity control and temperature control," explained Forest. "When you want to borrow from other institutions, you're limited if you don't have it. We couldn't borrow from places like the National Gallery or any major museum. And as regards to donations and collectors, if you're not up to standards, it's less interesting to give to a museum that doesn't offer the norms. So in that sense the museum is now going to be fully functional."

For the \$2.3 million project, the museum received help from

the provincial and federal governments, the Conseil regional development Estrie, and the city of Sherbrooke.

Forest estimates the cost of running the new facility to be between \$230-250,000 per year.

Construction was originally slated to be completed for the end of November, but as the full force of the project was realized, the date was pushed back. It is now expected to be ready for the move by the first week of March, with an opening expected by mid-April. The inaugural exhibit will be a 120-work retrospective on Melbourne native Frederick Simpson Coburn (1871-1960).

'QUITE A JOB'

"To the general public, putting it up to norms doesn't mean much, but it's quite a job. Half the project was mechanics," said Forest, referring to the complex network of ducts that all meet at a main control room on the top floor.

"The humidity and heat control will now be computerized. It'll be state of the art, so we're good for the next century," said Forest.

"We'll be able to be a player at the same level as most other museums in the region and in the province and in the country."

Two floors were built onto the original two, with two exhibition spaces measuring approximately 42 feet by 50 feet, and the main hall measuring roughly 42 by 42.

Windows were re-located, hardwood floors are on the way, and the plaster molding was restored in the main hall, with gold paint helping to return the building to its former glory.

Other additions include washrooms on each floor, drinking fountains, a large elevator, a parking lot, a gift shop and a café overlooking the Magog River.

The underground floor will house the administrative offices, library, documentation and conference rooms and a kitchenette.

The bank's vault will be used as a permanent exhibit space on the Eastern Townships Bank itself. Forest said they are seeking artifacts for the collection, including old bills issues by the bank, miniature toy banks and silver pens.

A new work of art, a floor piece, created by Gerard Gendron of Megantic Lake, will soon be installed.

"It's a gorgeous space," enthused Forest. "It's a gorgeous location. There's much more space than we had where we were. So we're going to have a nice little Quebec museum."

SECOND EMPIRE STYLE

The building was built in what is now referred to as the Second Empire style, which combines Italian and French motifs from the Renaissance and Baroque periods (16th and 17th centuries). Its source was Paris during the Second Empire (1852-1870) of Napoleon III, responsible for such monuments as the New Louvre and the Paris Opera.

This style spoke to bank manager Richard Heneker, a man who had big plans for the development of the Townships.

"He had a lot to do with putting Sherbrooke on the map," said the museum's new curator, art historian Monique Nadeau-Saumier.

"The bank had many branches in many towns in the Town-

ships and even out west — it was a going concern."

Now the building Heneker helped establish will help put the Musée des beaux-arts on the cultural map.

CHARMING

Nadeau-Saumier said they couldn't have chosen a finer location, in a patrimonial zone on one of Sherbrooke's most charming streets.

"It's the beginning of the whole city, the first mills were along the river, that's where we're going to be," she said proudly. "It's nice to claim a fine historical building and give it another life."

The building set the tone for nearby buildings which were built in the same style, including the former post office, now the Sherbrooke Historical Society, and the old courthouse, now City Hall.

Apart from the new museum building and the Sherbrooke Historical Society, Dufferin

Street also boasts the old Stanstead Fire Insurance building with its brownstone facade and yellow bricks, one of the oldest houses in Sherbrooke, built in traditional American style, and one of its oldest churches, Plymouth Trinity.

Forest said the building was given to the museum by the CIBC.

"That kind of support is what allows a museum like this to thrive," said Forest, who said the museum's annual St. Valentine's fundraising auction raised \$11,000.

Community involvement has always been key to museum's survival. In fact, Forest said the museum itself was born out of a wish by the people of the area.

"It was built out of the tenacity of people in the region, not because of an historical society. It was inconceivable that Sherbrooke didn't have an art museum," said Forest. "When it began, we were renting four to six rooms on a second floor of a building on Wellington St. The first exhibit was in the windows of stores on Wellington St."

That was in 1982, and the museum would remain in cramped quarters for six years before moving to the building on Palais St., owned by the University of Sherbrooke. In 1990, it received museum accreditation by the Ministry of Culture.

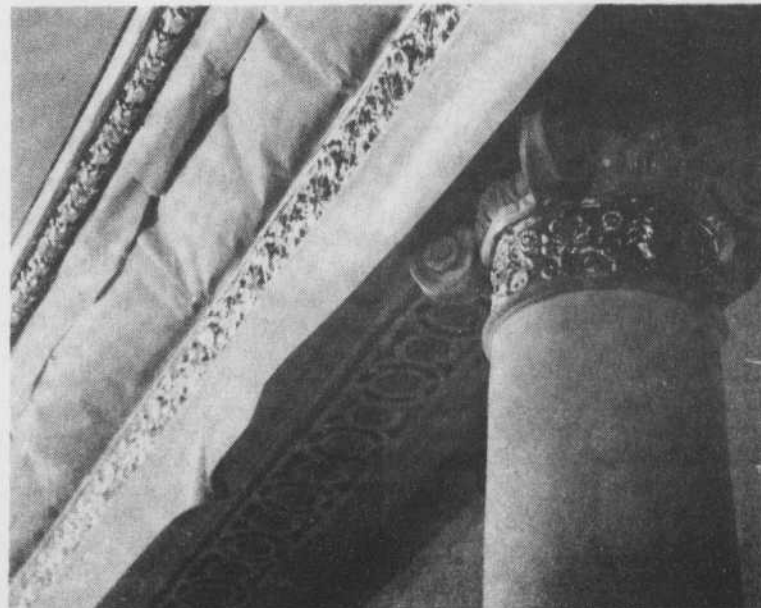
Forest plans to continue the educational programs he's developed over the past seven years at the museum, and plans to organize an art camp for the summer.

"The museum has a two-fold mission. One is to promote Eastern Townships art but also to be a door, or an entry-way for things coming in from elsewhere in the world and in the country. So we'll now be able to serve that purpose much better than we did before."

offered in the village under the supervision of an energetic staff. Alice's Wonderland Child Enrichment Centre, Smugglers' nationally certified, million-dollar childcare facility, is as creatively designed and equipped as the name implies. No need for parents to feel guilty about leaving junior there. However, a package of free skiing and lessons for children six and under is an incentive for little ones to give skiing a try.

While about half of the total 58 trails offered at Smugglers' are rated intermediate, expert skiers have not been forgotten. Advanced skiers will find single or double diamonds on 23 per cent of the runs. Moreover, Smugglers' vertical rise of 2,610 feet (higher than Mt. Tremblant's 2131' or Sunday River's 2300') ensures long runs with splendid views. An army of 250 ski instructors are available for lessons twice daily that are included in the package price and did wonders even for my performance and confidence.

GOOD SNOW COVER

The snow cover was surprisingly good considering the January thaw, thanks to Smugglers' modern, computerized snowmaking facilities. The only surprise in technology was the absence of high-tech lifts. However, the numerous chair lifts seemed to do an admirable job with lineups at the bottom or congestion at the top noticeably absent. The Mogul Mountain Magic lift for kids, which offers lower and slower transportation on Morse Mountain, is a safe and sensible innovation that more ski centres would do well to copy.

Cross country skiers at

Smugglers' rendez-vous at a cozy lodge, designed like a sugar shack. From there, they can set off on a variety of loops of varying distance and difficulty that are similar to those at the nearby Trapp Family Lodge. While they are not as challenging as Mont Tremblant Park trails or as extensive as those at Orford, they provided a welcome alternative to the slopes on a frigid Sunday morning.

Canadian visitors to Smugglers' are welcomed with a Canadian flag at the entrance and prices at par for lift tickets (\$39 for adults on weekends or \$20 for the lower half of the mountain). Most of the packages are also at par and include use of all facilities. This makes it easier for families to budget while well-equipped kitchens and the village store make dining-in an easy option in the studio units as well as the larger condos.

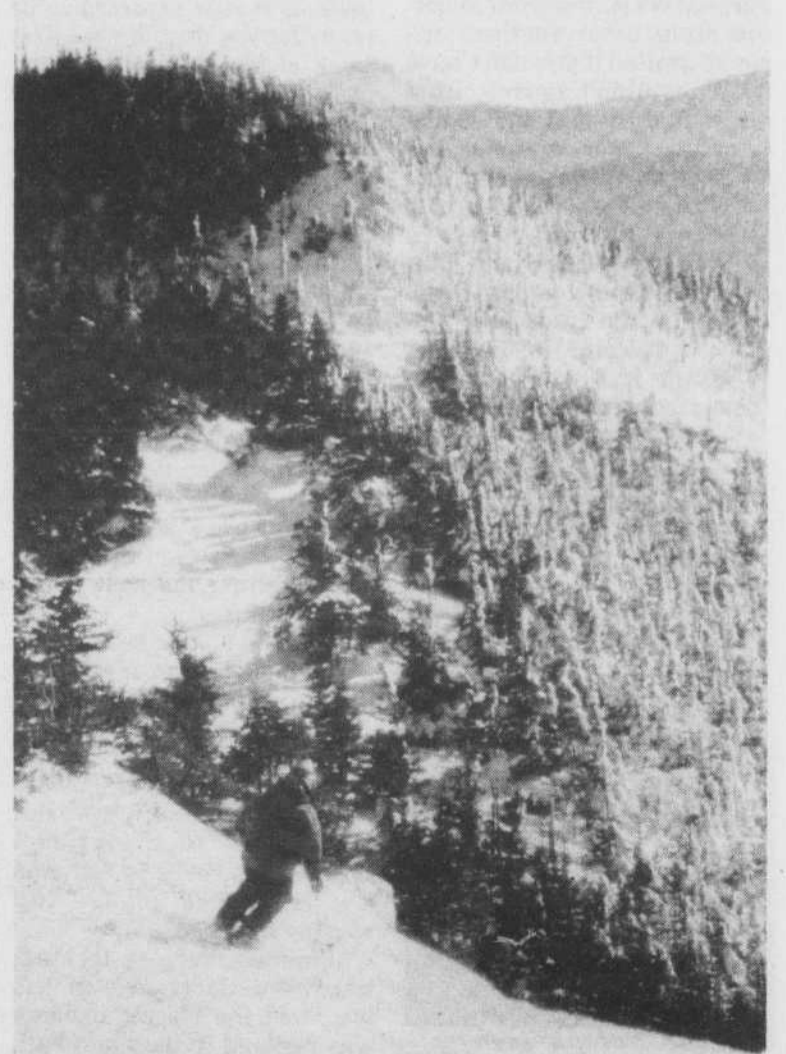
