Isn't it wonderful how, for all our vaunted technological revolution, the second half of the 20th-century seems to be playing itself out in parallel with the second half of the 19th.

Sylvester Graham, for example, launched a fitness and health-food craze that insisted there were 'natural' and 'unna-

tural' foods for man — refined flour, sugar and red meat were to be regarded as deadly poison. Man's 'natural' diet was fresh fruit and vegetables, whole grain cereals and nuts — and cold water.

Mark Twain said this health-food craze meant; "To eat what you don't want, drink what you don't like and do what you'd rather not."

He went cheerfully on eating

meat, smoking and drinking to the age of 75 while Sylvester Graham was sickly all his days and, despite his high-fiber, low-fat diet, fresh air and exercise, died at 57.

The pet crusade of the latter 19th century, of course, was against alcohol primarily, tea, coffee and tobacco secondarily. Whole armies of little children were taught to say 'No' to booze just as ours are warned off drugs. But if the war against drugs is ever won, there's no reason to believe the result will be any different than the victory against John Barleycorn.

There will still be poverty, crime and violence and all the social voices now ascribed to drugs just as Prohibition could never live up to its billing. As with the Grahamites, crusades are powered more by faith than understanding.

The end of the 19th century was also big on faith — from the Petzelians, a sect that favored human sacrifice, to the Christian Scientists and the spiritualists. Today, some favour Scientology and channeling, but the parallels are there.

And I note the 'Neo-Pagans'

now claim 200,000 adherents in America — loosely organized into covens of spiritual feminists, mystical environmentalists and ecology theology.

The Covenant of Unitarian Universalist Pagans is now an official wing of the Unitarian Church and boasts over 60 chapters throughout North America. Considering the rising power of Christian Fundamentalism and the Religious Right, that could make for interesting times as we celebrate the 300th anniversary of the Salem witch trials next year.

Townshippers celebrate St. Jean Baptiste Day

SHERBROOKE — St. Jean Baptiste Day celebrations in the Sherbrooke region have been bankrolled by the provincial government to the tune of \$71,000 as 45 municipalities mark Quebec's national holiday with a weekend full of parades, fireworks, sporting events and music.

The Société nationale des Grandes-Fourches, the group responsible for co-ordinating St. Jean Baptiste celebrations in the area, has already distributed approximately \$45,000 among local organizing committees. Another \$26,000 is earmarked for general expenses incurred by the Grandes-Fourches organization itself.

And lest newcomers to Que-

bec feel excluded from the mid-summer revelry, organizers plan to stage a special intercultural love-in in front of the Sherbrooke offices of COFI, Quebec's official immigrant settlement agency. It's hoped the June 24 rally on Short Street will be perceived among members of the so-called "cultural communities" as a signal of welcome and recognition from all Quebecers.

In Sherbrooke, festivities are scheduled to take place in more than a dozen locations on June 23 and June 24.

Musical acts, jugglers, clowns and magicians entertain visitors to Jacques Cartier Park on five outdoor stages in the afternoons and evenings.

On Sunday, musical groups Les Cordes de l'Estrie and the Choeur jeunesse de Sherbrooke, singers Kate Morrison, Nicholas Desjardins and Low Hui Chih, juggler Benoit Auger, magician Frédérik Desmarais and members of the Arabesque dance school entertain. Arabesque returns on Monday, when the Jennifer Allen vocal trio, the Sabroson orchestra and singing clown Ghislain Quirion also play. Both nights end with a fireworks display.

In Magog, all are invited to Merry Point late Sunday afternoon to help celebrate with cocktails and a concert by the Stéphane Pellerin band. Fireworks begin at 9:30 p.m. At

Parc des Braves on Monday, organizers promise displays of wood-sculpting and other handicrafts, a puppet show and a folk dancing exhibition, as well as a small parade.

Québécois singer Bob Picher is scheduled to perform at Belvedere Park in Ascot on June 23, beginning at 9 p.m. His concert will be followed by a fireworks display and more

music 1 a.m.

Cowansville is also planning a St. Jean Baptiste parade, beginning at 11 a.m. on Saint-Jean Street. Activities for kids and a volleyball tournament have also been organized. Local musicians have been lined up to provide outdoor entertainment throughout the long weekend.

Sherbrooke en blues brings the best to town

Suzanne-Marie Landry is taking a 'bigger is better' approach to this year's *Sherbrooke en blues* festival, taking place from June 26 to 30.

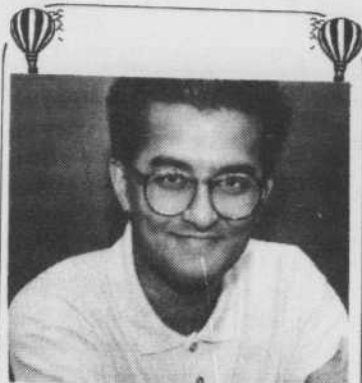
The chief organizer of the event has cooked up a stellar roster of big-name performers, a third stage on Wellington Street and an additional night of performances, extending the fest to a five-night event.

"Last year, there was one really big show at the Granada — Buddy Guy (the festival's opener)," Landry said. "This year, each night is a big show."

The festival opens at the Granada Theatre on Wednesday, June 26, with Little Anthony and the Loco-Motives, with guest harmonicaists Jim Zeller, Carl Tremblay and Guy Bélanger, followed by Chicago guitarist Melvin Taylor. San Francisco bluesman — and slide guitar virtuoso — Roy Rogers and Chicago's Mississippi Heat follow on Thursday. New York native John Hammond brings his guitars and harmonicas into town Friday, when he'll play along with Cash McCall and the Chicago Rythm'n Blues Kings. Multi-instrumentalist Clarence Gatemouth Brown and the incomparable Jimmy Rogers close the fest on Saturday. Admission to these shows is \$12.

The other attractions at the festival are free, including the closing-night jam session on June 30, held indoors at the Granada for a change.

"When the jam session was on the outdoor stage, we were obliged to end it at around 11 p.m. and the musicians didn't

have enough time to play, so this is better. It won't be rushed," said Landry.

After the opener, four nights of performances will take place on the outdoor stage on Wellington St. S., with the addition of afternoon performances on June 30.

Here you'll find Township-per Marty Hall, now living and rocking in Germany, local boys The Boppin' Blues Band, KGB and Harmonica Zeke, Sherbrooke native Lou Simon, Toronto's Rita Chiarelli and Wisconsin native Bryan Lee, among others.

Of course, most outdoor acts will also be playing the local clubs in downtown Sherbrooke. This year, eight bars will take advantage of the talent — and payoff — that comes with participating in the festival.

Landry said the festival charges bars \$600-1500 (depending on their size) to

participate in the festival, which in turn pays for the artists who play there.

But the offer to be part of the fest was not too good for some bars to refuse.

Café du Palais owner Jean-Pierre Beaudoin, who has had an on-again, off-again relationship with the festival for a number of years, has decided not to participate this year, opting instead to stage his own "Off-Festival" with Monster Mike Welsch and other artists.

Beaudoin has nothing to worry about. He is one of the only bar owners in Sherbrooke to regularly hire blues bands and, in the process, has developed an excellent reputation in the community.

A new stage has also been added this year to spotlight local talent. On Thursday and Friday, Locaux Locos, Jitterbug Swing, KGB and Scrambled Eggs play at the Sherbrooke Taxi stand.

At the same location on Saturday, the festival hosts a contest among three up-and-coming acts — Triple Sec, So What and Janie and the Cool Quartet. The winner will play on Sunday at 1 p.m. on the main outdoor stage.

On Thursday and Friday night, as well as Saturday afternoon, artists with new CDs will be meeting the public at the HMV store at the Carrefour de l'Estrie.

Landry said the festival, which has a budget of \$350,000, produces \$1 million in economic benefits for the Sherbrooke area.

Landry said future plans include another stage on Alexandre Street, part of a five-

year plan for the fest.

If you think the Sherbrooke organizer is not ambitious, check out what Landry would like to see in five years.

"Three outdoor stages and B.B. King on one of them," she said with a wistful smile. "We made him an offer this year, but he was going to be in Europe."

And her wildest dream?

Landry pauses a moment, then said quietly, "I'd like to have Eric Clapton, but don't tell anybody. They'll think I'm crazy."

I don't know about that. As the confident head of a burgeoning music festival for the past six years, if there's anyone that can make it happen, it's Landry.

"It's part of the personality of the city," she said of the fest. "Special events put cities on the map."

And if Landry has her way, *Sherbrooke en blues* will be known as one of the premiere blues festivals in North America.

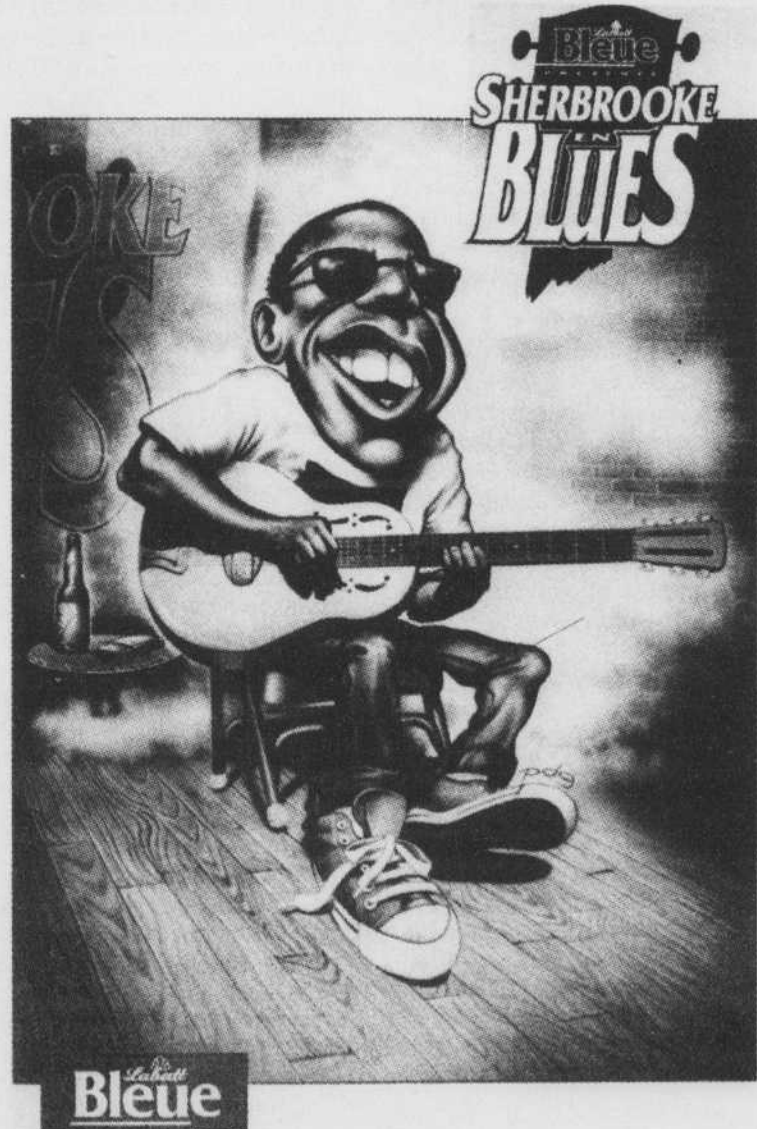

The Merchant of Venice: An Ungentle Rain

STRATFORD, ONT. — With its romantic love story and “happy” ending, *The Merchant of Venice* is usually classed with Shakespeare’s comedies.

The pattern of these plays is fairly consistent. Working their way through various complications, the plots lead toward marriage, a consummation symbolically representing a revitalized social order. Creating the necessary conflict is a malcontent or villain who, until rendered harmless, serves to hinder this successful resolution.

The problem here is the character who performs this function in the play is Shylock, a Jew, and the controversy surrounding *The Merchant of Venice* stems from its perceived anti-Semitism. It ought not to be an issue, but it is.

In our post-Holocaust era, the depiction of a Jew as a villain and scapegoat is inevitably unsettling. What makes it worse to contemporary sensibility is that Shylock, defeated and ridiculed, is forced to convert to Christianity as part of his punishment — a development presumably greeted by laughter and cheers from the Elizabethan audience.

Were it as simple as this, there would be no controversy. Written in an anti-Semitic age for a racist audience, the message of the play would seem to be unambiguous. But Shakespeare’s Shylock — unlike its model, the outrageous Barabas in Marlowe’s *The Jew of Malta* — is not drawn as a caricatured villain. He is presented as a real and sympathetic being. His humiliation and degradation is the stuff of tragedy.

The challenge for a director, then, is finding the right balance in a plot that interweaves Shylock’s demand for a pound of Christian flesh as forfeiture

on a defaulted loan and the light banter of romantic love.

The production at the Stratford Festival’s Avon Theatre doesn’t avoid the issue: It tackles both the internal disharmonies and controversial overtones head on.

The world of this play, as presented under Marti Maraden’s direction, is dark, grim and ultimately unrelieved by the various love stories.

Set in Italy in the 1930s, the production foreshadows the genocidal horror that has become part of our collective conscience. In a telling dumb show, Tubal, Shylock’s friend, buys a newspaper in the piazza. One by one the empty chairs are tipped forward by customers and waiters. There is no place for a Jew here. As with Shylock, they’ll accept his money but not his presence or his humanity.

Nor are there any Canaletto-inspired vistas of Venice. Rather, Philip Silver’s setting rolls inexorably in and out to sombre, even threatening music, reconfiguring the space with slabs of drab monolithic masonry — a suitable backdrop for the production’s bleak presentation of this society.

Even Belmont, Portia’s beautiful estate, provides no real relief from the darker world, just as the love stories played out there provide — in Maraden’s interpretation — no figurative redemption from the darker action. With its painted backdrop of a lake, its willow trees and delicate arches, Belmont is insubstantial. Unlike the heavy, rolling units of the “real” world, these all fly in. It is patently a stage set that, like its glittering inhabitants, veneers the truth.

The truth is that the male love interests — Bassanio, Gratiano and Lorenzo — are really thugs, differing from the

black-shirted fascists who occasionally wander past only by their smart clothes.

Even the elegant Portia and her companion Nerissa, wealthy, high society types, are cynical sophisticates turning lightly away from ugliness to their pleasant pastimes. In a tiny but significant moment, Portia, as she leaves her house in the charge of the eloped couple, Lorenzo and Jessica, visibly struggles to muster the necessary politeness to address the latter. Jessica is a Jew.

Jessica, played unsympathetically by Marion Day, has abandoned her father, Shylock, and robbed him blind as well. But in the process she has exchanged her heritage for a precarious perch on the fringe of this shallow society. She is barely tolerated.

The final moment of the production reinforces the point. The stage empties, leaving Jessica along with Antonio, the title character. The man who has publicly spat upon the Jew and who has been spared death

at his hand stares balefully upon the estranged daughter of his defeated enemy — two uncomprehending solitudes.

Is this text forced into a conceptual straitjacket? Sometimes. Susan Coyne’s intelligent, likeable, but cynical Portia must occasionally give an ironic twist to some of her poetic utterances. Her gigolo-like love interest, Bassanio (Paul Haddad), seems mismatched in age, in physique and in his inability to convey anything like her truth in delivery. Consequently, their love scenes seem forced.

Perhaps the most glaring example of de-emphasizing or restraining the comedy was Launcelot Gobbo (Gerry MacKay) and his father (Douglas Chamberlain), both of whom seemed uncomfortable. The latter in particular, garbed inexplicably in bowler hat and grubby formal wear, seemed out of place — like one of the existential clowns of Godot.

The rest of the characters

are played with an admirable conformity to the central vision. They are all flawed if not detestable. As an Antonio driven by market forces, Roland Hewgill alternated between a suitable smugness and self-pity. Wayne Best’s self-important Gratiano seemed destined in the sequel to lead Mussolini’s armies to defeat, while the multi-talented Michelle Fisk’s Nerissa will cuckold him continuously. Undoubtedly, Michael Shanks’ Lorenzo will spend all of Jessica’s money before dumping her.

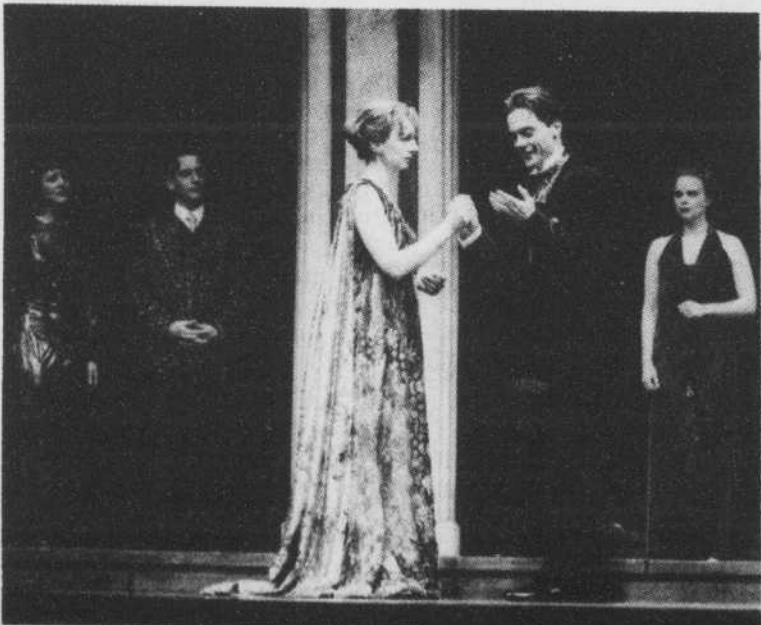
Towering above this fine production, and forming its focus, is Douglas Rain as Shylock. He breathes life into every line; we always understand precisely what he means and more importantly we always know what he thinks. There is never a moment of “acting”. With an incisive, intelligent performance of enormous power, he emerges as the only individual in the play with integrity. Unlike the rest of the shallow, self-serving community, he stands on principle, however vengeful and self-destructive.

Especially fine was the trial scene, where Shylock whets his knife in preparing for his pound of flesh. This can so easily be played as comedy with Portia acting as disguised advocate, making it up as she goes along. The restraint here by Coyne was remarkable. There was no comic mugging; the focus remained clearly on Rain, whose precise delivery, dignified stance and final degradation was not some joking come-uppance for the Jew, but powerfully moving.

Looking for the thread that connects the action, we find it not so much in Portia’s restrained proclamation on mercy that “droppeth as the gentle rain from heaven” nor in an ironic and self-serving notion of justice, but in Shylock’s misguided attempt to stand on principle, to keep faith, to be true to one’s bond.

This theme is clearly asserted by Maraden at the end. The ring sequence, in which both Bassanio and Gratiano have pawned their keepsakes for expedience, serves as an emblem of the casual faithlessness of the young lovers. But it doesn’t really matter. Their renewed world has been cleansed of unpleasantness.

Dead Together to keep Piggery audiences guessing

NORTH HATLEY — Like the characters in his mystery thriller *Dead Together*, playwright George Rideout met director Greg Tuck some 25 years ago.

But unlike the virtual strangers who come together for a chilling reunion in the Piggery Theatre's season opener, Rideout and Tuck never lost touch.

"We've worked on all kinds of projects, so there's a mutual trust there," said Rideout, who first met the director when he moved to Thunder Bay from Texas. Tuck got there via Victoria, B.C. Both ended up teaching at Bishop's University about nine years ago.

"I just feel confident about the whole thing," added Rideout during rehearsals of his play at the North Hatley Curling Club. "Sometimes you don't know the director and you're on edge as to what's going to happen."

Under the helm of the Piggery's artistic director Tuck, Rideout knows exactly what to expect as his play receives its Quebec premiere next week.

It's audiences that will be kept guessing.

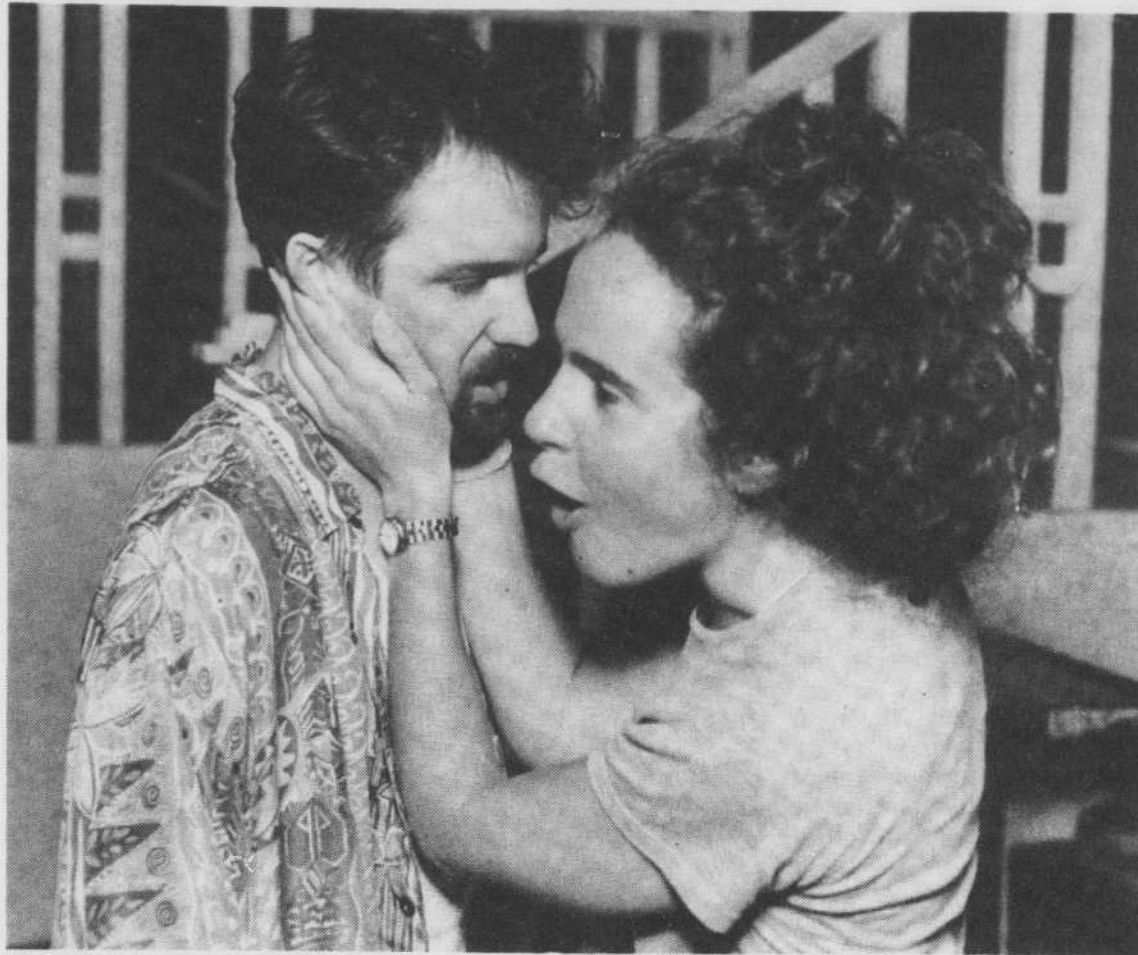
TWISTED TALE

Dead Together tells the twisted tale of five adults who have one thing in common. During a college protest in 1968, these strangers broke through a crowd of hundreds to occupy the records office for two-and-a-half days. They went their separate ways after the ordeal, but made a pact to meet 25 years later.

As the play begins, they have converged to an island home on Lake Superior at the invitation of one in their group — and soon start dropping like flies.

While the mystery genre appeals to Rideout, he said he aimed to write more than a simple whodunit.

"It's also a social commenta-

ry. The events that push forward the present action occurred 25 years before," he explained. "These people had an identity then, and now they are somewhat different people though all those old grudges come to bear. We've all changed over the past 20 years and there's fun to be had with that, to throw into the mix of a thriller."

Tuck said he appreciates Rideout's writing.

'FUNNY, INTRIGUING'

"It's funny as well as intriguing, and artistically it was successfully done and regarded as a new wrinkle in the genre," Tuck said.

"It's a thriller, but it's also a sophisticated comedy of manners. He's having fun with the 60s generation. It's kind of *The Big Chill* with murders."

"It's contrasting the values and interests of a Gen X with wilting flower children," Tuck added.

The reunion organizer was the photographer of the group in 1968, and the photos she took are flashed on screen at the opening of the play.

Slides depicting the characters during the Age of Aquarius were created with the help of lookalike Bishop's University drama students — minus the eyebrow and nose rings.

"We matched them up with each of our actors, and the match isn't too bad," said Rideout.

The University of Toronto graduate said he drew on a number of events from the 60s as he wrote the play.

"It's a bit of (my) campus experience, and a little bit of the Sir George Williams affair where they trashed the computer center and threw everything out the window, and in Wisconsin they took over the press office," said Rideout.

TOWNSHIPS ACTOR

This production is significant not only because it is a professional mounting of a work by a Townships playwright, but also because it features a local actor.

Bishop's University drama professor JoJo Rideout is among the cast of former students hiding secrets and sins in *Dead Together*.

"It's weird," she said of the work. "And I'm married to him!"

Rideout, making her Piggery debut, said she never expected to act in a thriller.

"I thought I could never be in one because it's so twisted, but you just hit your marks and it

hasn't affected me," said Rideout, who suddenly acquired a nervous tick to the roar of laughter from her colleagues.

Also starring in the production are three other actors making their debuts at the summertime playhouse and a Piggery veteran. Peter Smith, Ian Watson and Patricia Rodriguez join fellow Montrealese Diana Fajrajsl, who has appeared in 10 previous Piggery productions, on stage this summer.

CHALLENGING

Smith said its elements of black comedy make the play even more challenging.

"In thrillers, there are these terrifying moments that build. The double thing for this is the rhythm established in the piece is directly related to comedy. There are places that are funny, but it's a matter of trying to find the rhythm," said Smith. "There's a lot happening. It goes at a lickety-split pace."

"It's a juggling act," he added.

Rodriguez said she is enjoying her first experience in a thriller.

"I'm finding the layers really different (from straight dramas) — all the lies, and who thinks what and when, and the constant suspicion. I find those layers really interesting," she said. "In acting, it's good to have a secret."

Smith said although all the characters are strange, they aren't typical of the genre.

"Thrillers can go too far, but here the characters are rooted in reality," he said. "Greg said it's a whodunit and a whydunit."

Fajrajsl, who has also starred in Piggery productions

including *The Dining Room* and *Crimes of the Heart*, said she loves the genre. "Thrillers are my favorite films, thrillers and spookies. I'll take two or so at a time and start at midnight."

KILLER BEATLES

The music in this production also differs from the typically over-dramatic scores found in most film thrillers. Here it is in keeping with the 60s theme as characters start getting murdered according to images in the song "I Am A Walrus" from the Beatles' *Magical Mystery Tour* album.

The multi-level set was designed by John C. Dinning, a National Theatre School graduate who has worked at the Piggery on shows such as *The Perils of Persephone* and *The Dining Room*. He also helped create the opulent elegance of the Bishop's production *Dangerous Liaisons* earlier this year with his breathtaking set design. This time around, audiences can revel in his interpretation of rustic tastefulness with his multi-level set.

Dead Together was first produced in March 1994 in Richmond, British Columbia. The production was then taken to Kelowna in June.

Rideout has written 10 plays, including the acclaimed *Texas Boy*, although *Dead Together* is his first to receive a professional production in Quebec.

Rideout said it isn't easy for Quebec playwrights to get their plays produced in the province.

"It's inexplicable. I've heard the same things from others as well, that it seems to be done at a distance than locally. Colleen Curran has said the same thing."

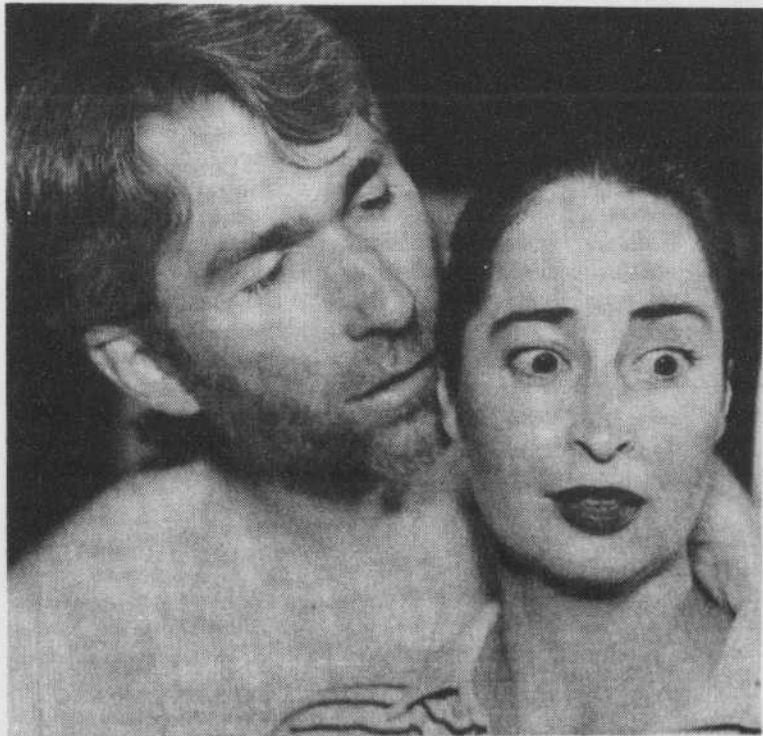
The play is also set apart from most other mysteries because some of the murders are committed in view of the audience.

"One thing I've discovered is people sure like to get scared. Watching it in Vancouver, there are moments in the play when people in the front row were holding programs in front of their faces. They didn't know what was going to leap out," Rideout said with a sly smile. "And what's fun is when the audience expects something to happen here and then it happens there."

Next Thursday, it will happen at the Piggery when *Dead Together* begins its two-week run.

"Hopefully people will get a laugh and get a little scared," said Rideout. "I predict they will."

The current single, "Sure Enough", following in the footsteps of "I Waited", should do great on both TV and radio.

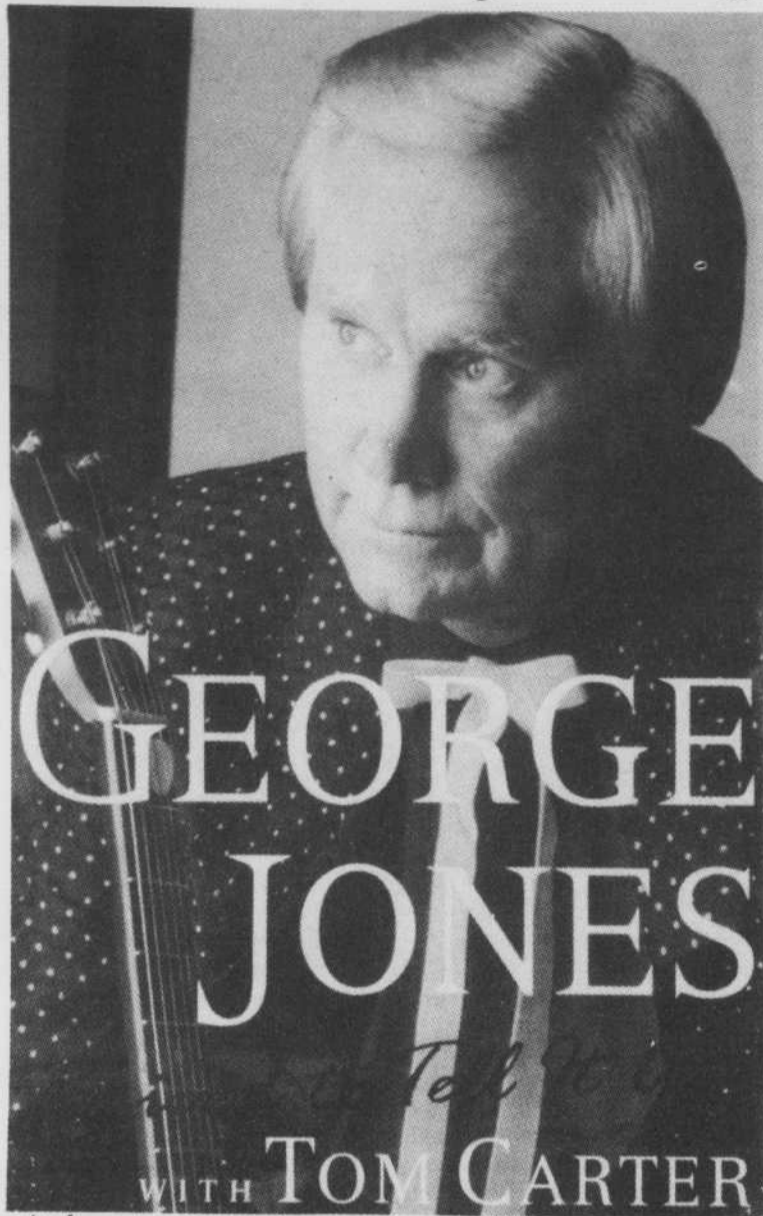

The title is appropriate because it is indeed some kind of miracle for someone to go through such an ordeal and live to talk about it.

In this compelling book, written with Tom Carter, the country legend tells us how he got started in the business (his first gig was at age 11) but he also shares what his frenzied life was all about.

Jones recalls the drunken rages, the wild bar-room brawls, his bad marriages — Tammy Wynette included. The appreciable fact is that he never tries to run anyone down in the process. He is just looking back at what happened, like the time he became the prime suspect in a murder case.

Jones also honestly explains how he got the reputation of "No Show Jones" and how he deserved it. Of all the money he earned, he almost never saw the color of it due to crooked management and, under the influence of booze and drugs, he never did anything about it.

He also tells us what a blessing it was meeting Nancy, his wife.

"No teenage boy ever fell harder for a girl than I fell for Nancy Sepulvado. When I met my future wife on a blind date in November 1982, I had no idea that someday she would save my life," Jones writes.

"God should give all of the angels a name, and each should be called Nancy."

It's the true story of a hard-living country artist, and Jones does not excuse his behavior. He is honestly sharing the terrifying experiences that drugs and show business can bring.

Jones has learned from his mistakes — and he still don't need a rockin' chair.

Another magical event is cooking-up for this weekend. Many musicians will gather at Bar Wildwood in Lennoxville on Sunday, June 23, at 2 p.m. for a giant jam session.

New features mark 15th edition of folklore fest

SHERBROOKE — Are you ready for an international exchange?

Jump into the melting pot of cultures at the 15th annual Drummondville world folklore festival, taking place from July 5 to 14.

This year, the Festival Mondial de Folklore de Drummondville will host 1,000 performers from 20 countries, including Brazil, Croatia, France, Italy, Mexico and the Ukraine. Canada will be represented by Mackinaw, the festival's host

troupe from Drummondville, and Madawaska, from New Brunswick.

Countries sending folk dance troupes to the festival for the first-time this year are the Buryatia Republic, Cyprus, Ecuador, Georgia, Latvia, Basque Country (Spain), Reunion Island and Sri Lanka.

More than one million visitors are expected to attend the 10-day event.

"By creating the *Festival mondial de folklore* in their region in 1981, the Drummond-

ville organizers showed great audacity and their vision is now bearing fruit," said Jean Houde of the National Bank, one of the festival's sponsors, at a news conference in Montreal on Tuesday.

"The *Festival mondial de folklore* is special because it has no pretensions," added Claude Henri Léveillé, festival president. "The people who pioneered this event wanted, initially, to showcase the richness of Québécois and international folklore. Public response was

very positive and interest in the festival grows each year."

Recognized as the leading folklore event in the world, the festival is constantly improving as organizers try to add new features for visitors to enjoy.

Once again this year, an impressive array of activities will be held on 10 sites.

"As this is the 15th anniversary of the festival, we have made an extra effort," said Maurice Rhéaume, general manager of the festival.

Among its new features, the festival is offering a one-day visitor's package designed for the individual. For \$20, people can purchase a "festipasse" for Woodyatt Park (the outdoor site) and a ticket for an indoor show at La Grande Place (except for the opening and closing shows).

The shows held each evening at La Grande Place will be hosted by actor France Labonté.

For the first time, the festival will also be offering a "Camp sans frontières" (camp without borders) from July 12 to 14 to give young people from 9 to 12 years of age the chance to explore the world by participating in activities, including workshops and meetings with folklore groups.

The Singing Angels choir will give a special concert on July 9 at 8 p.m. in St-Frédéric church. Composed of 60 young

people between the ages of 12 and 18, the choir has performed for such dignitaries as the Pope, Prince Charles and George Bush.

Visitors may enjoy a glass of wine at the new Bistro du Monde at Woodyatt Park, where international cuisine and handicrafts are also readily available.

To mark the festival's 15th anniversary, a retrospective exhibit featuring photos, objects, musical instruments, folkloric costumes and puppets is being held at Drummondville's Centre Culturel through the end of August.

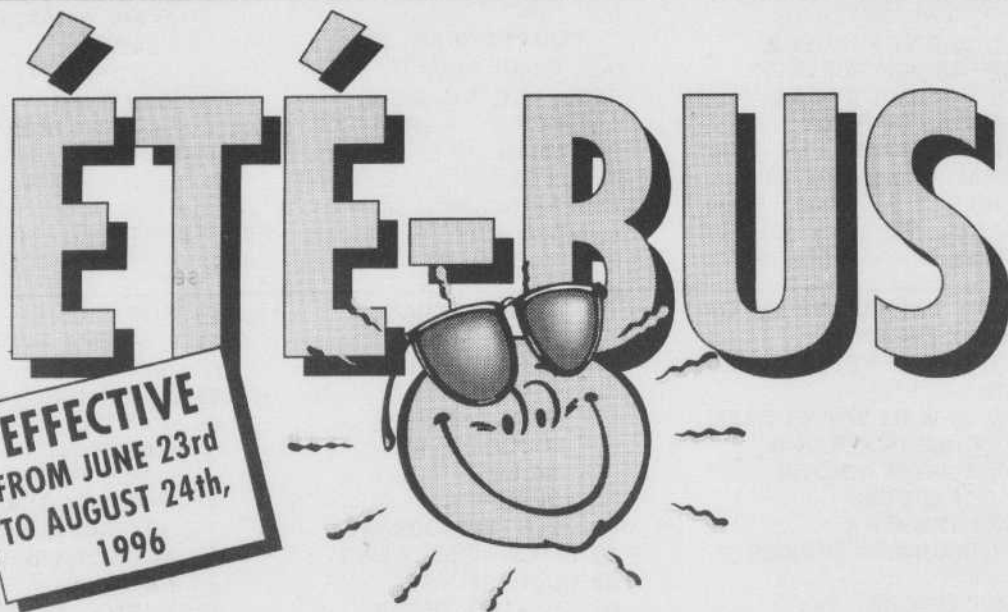
Since its inception, more than three million visitors have taken part in some 5,000 shows performed by more than 12,000 artists at the festival.

It relies on the work of approximately 2,500 volunteers who, since 1982, have contributed some 250,000 hours of their time to the event.

Thus far, the festival has injected \$40 million into the local economy.

From July 5 to 14, visitors to the festival will once again have the opportunity to travel the world and discover the customs and traditions of countries they have only dreamed of visiting.
