# Lace: A Thread Through Time

SHERBROOKE — In olden times, women wore layers and layers of undergarments, often with reams of lace edging, all crocheted, knitted or otherwise produced by hand.

Women through the centuries passed on lace-making techniques to their daughters, and nuns once taught the art in convents.

Any accomplished young lady in

many Western societies was expected to know how to make lace, and to have a good supply on hand when she got married, for edging pillow cases and other functions essential to the running of a proper household.

Lace is less of a fashion now, and few people would consider making it by hand. But an exhibition currently on at the Leon Marcotte Exhibition Centre in Sherbrooke aims to show that lace can be treated as

an art form, and not mere decoration.

The *Corporation nationale de dentelle contemporaine* has brought together about 150 pieces of antique lace from 1820 to 1920 and added 50 contemporary works of lace art to present "Lace: A Thread Through Time", an exhibition which will continue until Dec. 21.

## YEARS TO MASTER

Founded by Marie-Andrée Brière of Stratford, Quebec, the corporation consists of about 15 women who have spent years mastering the techniques of lace-making.

Brière became interested in the art at Expo '67 when she was enthralled by a demonstration being given by a woman in the Czechoslovakian pavilion. "I stayed there 15 days watching her," she said.

Then when she went to Europe to study law, she took up lace-making as a pastime. She attended schools where first students learned how to identify lace from different countries and regions of Europe, then how to make their own, using traditional techniques and incorporating their own variations.

The major techniques are bobbin lace, needle lace, crocheted lace, hairpin lace, tatting and Irish crochet. Each of these is represented in the exhibition, featuring such items as doilies, handkerchiefs, gloves, baby bonnets and bibs. Most of these require close scrutiny to appreciate the microscopic detail.

## USE COLOR

The contemporary works use the same techniques but they differ in that they use color, and they incorporate notions of fine arts. Instead of collars and edgings, the lace techniques are used to create landscapes, geometric patterns, faces and even three-dimensional 'sculptures'.

Often the contemporary artists combine lace with other materials to create their work of art.

Plexiglass, for example, were used to form a decorative room divider. What looks like a colorful stained glass pattern from a distance is actually intricately executed patterns in lace, pressed between two panels of plexiglass.

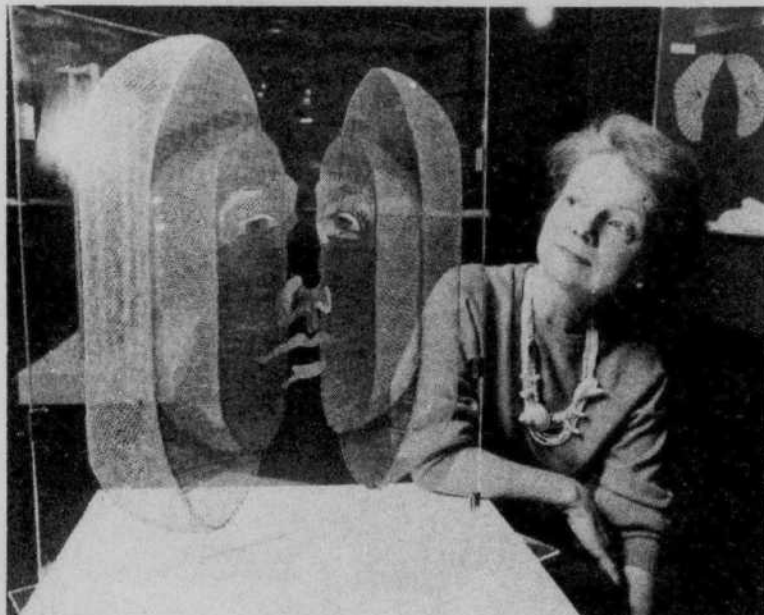
Another exhibit features a metal framework with inserts of expressionistic designs in colored lace here and there. Yet another has a tiny lace sculpture in a box made of mirrors, which reflects and multiplies its colorful flourishes.

Brière studied lace in Europe for 15 years and now she spends 10 hours a day making lace.

"It's like music," she said. "You have to do it every day to keep the suppleness in your hands."

Brière got her degree in law while in Europe, and did a lot of fine arts. But lace has always interested her more. "It's a passion for me," she says. "It allows me to express myself more than in painting."

"I hope lots of people come and see the exhibition," she said. "Because lace-making is not well-known here in Quebec and I think it deserves to be known."

## Germany's reds little known, but worth a try

Germany makes some of the finest white wines in the world. It also produces relatively little wine when compared to either Italy or France. As a result, prices for these wines tend to be slightly higher than average.

At the same time, Germany has never been known as a producer of red wine. The reasons for this are varied. Perhaps at the top of the list is the fact that they (the Germans) are so good at making white wine.

Because of this, most of the nation's wine-making expertise and research has gone into increasing the quality of the whites to the detriment of the reds.

Another reason, although not as important as generally believed, is that German vineyards are situated, for the most part, on the northern edge of what is considered to be the acceptable growing region for *vitis vinifera*.

Finally, a ready supply of both French and Italian reds has made the production of German red wine superfluous.

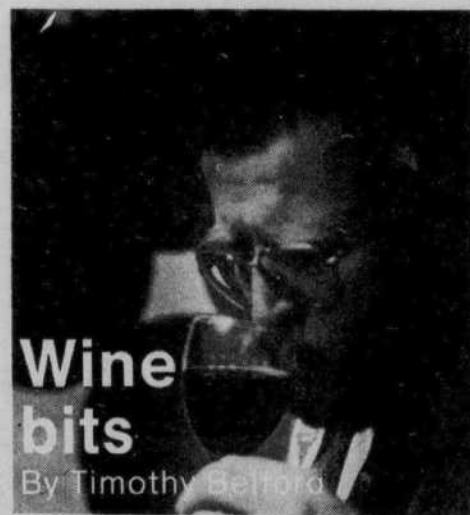
The red wine that is produced in Germany is made from basically two types of grapes — the *Portugieser* and the *Spätburgunder* with the latter accounting for about 23 per cent of production and most of the quality reds as well.

Locally, the 1983 *Hyffhäuser* seems to be the only German red available. A table wine (*tafelwein*), the *Hyffhäuser* is light in alcohol (9.9 per cent) and extremely pale in color — almost a *rosé* in fact. It has a slightly woody taste to it and a dry finish which, if unimposing, is at least pleasant. The only major problem is the \$9.05 price tag. At this level, there are several wines from a variety of countries that could fill the bill without emptying your pocket quite as badly.

Nevertheless, for anyone interested in wine as a hobby, the *Hyffhäuser* is well worth trying, if as nothing else an oddity.

Another wine worth taking a look at is the 1978 *Estola*. A Spanish red from the vast *La Mancha* region south of Madrid, it is woody, dry and with considerable flavor. At \$6.00 a bottle this *Riserva* is also an excellent buy comparing well with many of the *Riojas* found in local SAQ outlets.

# Cowansville's first Christkind'l Market celebrates cultural diversity

COWANSVILLE — Christmas time can mean homesickness for many European immigrants, even years after coming to Canada.

That's why Sutton resident Inge Von Glasow has organized a special event in Cowansville next week to bring these immigrants some of the little luxuries from home that many can't get here in the Townships.

The Christkind'l Market, Sunday, Dec. 7 at the *Auberge des Carrefours* in Cowansville, will feature some 30 merchants selling traditional "Christmas goodies" imported from several European countries, says Von Glasow.

It's Von Glasow's first attempt at such an event, but she says the merchants are very excited about it, and the prospects are good for making it an annual affair.

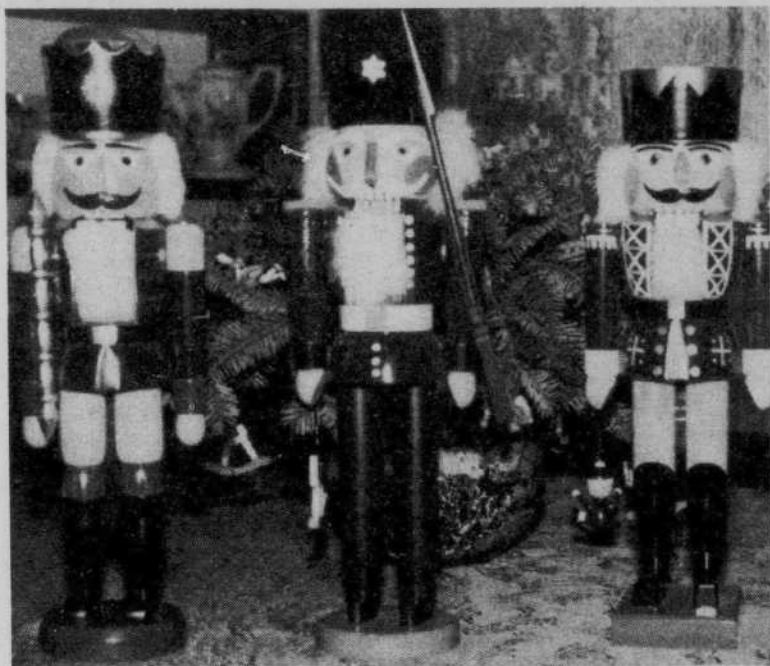
"Besides being practical it's also an education for the population at large and allows us to share cultural trends," she says. "It is also, hopefully, stimulating for the children of various ethnic communities to carry on family traditions."

**NO ACCESS**  
Being an immigrant from Worms, Germany, Von Glasow says she knows what it's like not to have access to the food, toys and other products she was brought up with, especially during the holiday season.

She has also felt the frustration of having her Canadian-born children reject the ways of her homeland, resenting anything that made them different from other children. She hopes events such as the Christkind'l Market will help teach children to be proud of their heritage.

"I believe strongly in the multi-cultural aspect of Canada because we are a country rich in traditions," she said. "Therefore, with what we are doing, in a way we hope we stimulate children to learn and carry on family traditions."

**GERMAN TRADITION**  
The Christkind'l Market is a German tradition, Von Glasow explained. In Germany, she said, instead of Santa Claus, gifts are said to come from the Christ Child. Christmas gift items, thus, are sold at markets known as Christkind'l (Christ Child) Markets, the most famous taking place annually in

Nürnberg.

Among the items at next week's market are Pennsylvania Dutch paintings, German straw Christmas ornaments, Swiss puzzles, German books and records, ethnic clothing, chocolates and Lübecker Marzipan, soaps and cosmetic items, and Else Schieder's famous Austrian baked goods.

The market will also feature crafts and other products by local residents, not necessarily representing any ethnic community.

Von Glasow says she hopes the market will be a social event — a time to meet with people of different cultures — as well as a chance to pick up Christmas gifts. Throughout the day there will be recordings of music from the various countries represented playing, and many of the merchants should be dressed in traditional garb, she says.

The Christkind'l Market will take place from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 7.

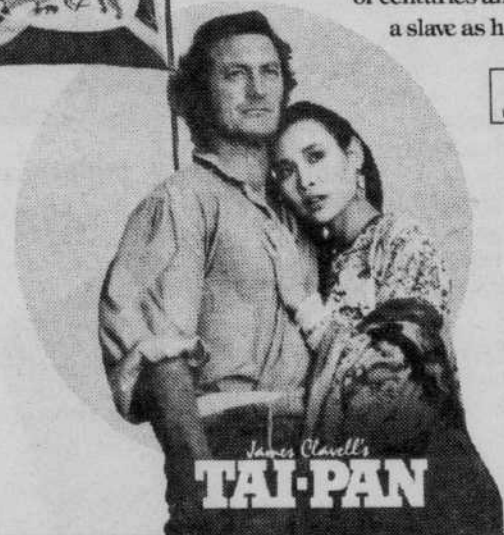

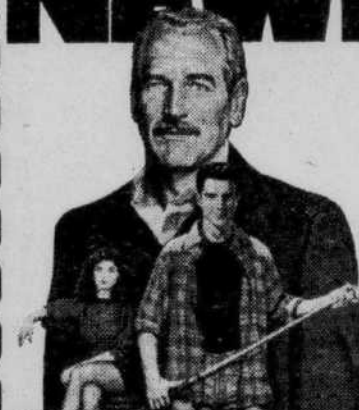

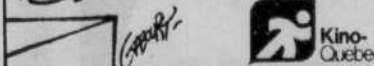

## Quebec film honored at Latin-American festival

SHERBROOKE — Quebec filmmaker Gilles Carle recently came away from the Iberian and Latin American Film Festival in Biarritz, France with a first prize in the documentary category.

So what has a Quebec filmmaker got to do with Iberian and Latin American film?

"The Iberian and Latin American Film Festival is a showcase for films of Spanish or Portuguese origin, language or culture," said French journalist Guy Braucourt, principle organizer responsible for the selection of films for the festival. "However, it also welcomes films with an Iberian or latin American flavor from other countries. *O Picasso* by Gilles Carle truly embodies the spirit of this festival."

*O Picasso* is a documentary made during the Picasso exhibit in Montreal in 1985. It features clips of interview with the artist as well as with many art critics, art dealers and people who knew the artist.

The documentary aspect of the film is alleviated by sequences featuring musical tributes to the artist. Quebec actress Chloé Sainte-Marie appears as four different women, singing songs from various periods of Picasso's life.

Sainte-Marie, a Drummondville native, was in Sherbrooke recently to promote the film. Through making the film, she says she learned to appreciate Picasso in new ways.

"It seems like before *O Picasso* I didn't see color; I didn't pay atten-

tion," she said. "I discovered color with this movie."

The petite actress, dressed in vibrant red and green for the interview, says the way the film is edited will make it interesting to everyone, not just the art connoisseurs. Unlike many documentaries on artists, *O Picasso* is brisk-paced and tightly edited, she said.

This is Sainte-Marie's second feature film. In the first, *La Guêpe*, released early this summer, she played a mother bent on revenge for the deaths of her children in an alcohol-related accident. *La Guêpe* was also a Gilles Carle film.

In the past 25 years Carle has produced 21 feature films, in addition to several shorts, television mini-series and numerous documentaries. He has won 29 prizes and is one of the few directors to have three of his films selected for the official competition at the Cannes Film Festival.

# Devon hooks readers with his childrens' conspiracy

Lost by Gary Devon (KNOPF-RANDOM HOUSE): \$26.25, 355 pp.

As good as Stephen King is at the horror genre, he takes a certain amount of licence in stepping over into the supernatural for many of his stories, although his tales are so firmly rooted in the everyday of contemporary America. Along comes rookie novelist Gary Devon with a debut in the genre, but with a slight twist—his story takes place in the Eisenhower 50s, but it is so incredibly well narrated that the effects of horror are generated from within a believable if bizarre plot that involves young children.

Lost is the story of three children in the Abbott family, living in rural Pennsylvania in the early 1950's, and the aftermath of a near fatal shooting accident that occurs when Sherman Abbott shoots himself behind the left ear and becomes a slowly convalescing patient for almost a year after.

Sherman Abbott, a failure in the fifth grade, showed signs of odd behaviour long before the train of events that led to the death of his mother and father and younger brother by a raging fire that appeared to have been created by odd circumstances.

The gun which he used to maim himself was just part of a treasure trove of nondescript items which he pilfered from the neighbourhood with the aid of his younger sister Mamie. The kids hide the loot in the doghouse of a vicious dog (the Chinaman) that is a cross between a Chow and a larger breed such as a German Shepherd, but when Sherman is strangely wounded with the gun that is part of the stolen property, author Devon has by now got the reader firmly hooked on his strange and unsettling childrens' conspiracy against adults.

On Sherman's recovery the action follows with breakneck speed as the Abbott family is wiped out in the tragic fire, and the surviving girl, Mamie, is recovering from her burns in a local hospital. At this point the novel brings onto the scene Leona Hillenbrandt, and her sister Emma May Mattingly in just one of the startling changes of direction that this twisting and turning novel of surprises offers the reader.

Leona befriends the orphaned girl Mamie, decides to spirit her away with her to Brandenburg Station, Kentucky, only to find that Mamie's brother Sherman is very much alive, and with the Chinaman in tow, is determined that he must have his little sister back.

On the journey across America to Kentucky, Leona Hillenbrandt encounters a pair of children who are being mistreated by an alcoholic, sorrowful mother that has just received word that her husband is missing in action in the Korean Conflict. Leona gathers together the kids, Patsy and Walter, and with Mamie as a reluctant, often hostile companion, they attempt to get to the solace and freedom of Leona's island in the Ohio River in Kentucky.

Sherman and the fierce dog track Leona and the kids along the

rural highways of the south-east, and Devon spins out this tale with an amount of suspense and downright spine-shuddering attacks and near-misses, that turn this novel into a page-turner of the first order.

Although the plot sounds like a classical chase sequence, the manner of Gary Devon's telling of the story is the feature to be admired here, and the constant surprises and unpredictable twists in the narrative repay the reader's attention to this harrowing tale of pre-teen dementia and its battle against a middle-aged lady's dogged determination to make a home for some ill-treated kids. Gary Devon truly makes a welcome and notable debut with this absorbing drama he just titles *Lost*.

### RECORD REVIEWS

#### Elvis Presley RETURN OF THE ROCKER (RCA)

Talk about a misnomer! Either the Colonel figures it's time to parade his "boy" around one more time just for fun, or else with Priscilla preggers she reckons that a fresh Elvis album might fatten the coffers of Lisa Marie's estate.

But in either case such reasoning can be the only justification for this re-release of a lot of Presley material. A stylized cover of Elvis sitting astride a large Harley, with posters of the young Senator from Boston, Massachusetts, now president, forming the backdrop, tells us that it is the early 60s, and the King is back from his army stint.

The irony that escapes someone named Gregg Geller, A&R director of this "project", is that when Elvis came back from his U.S. Army's Germany posting his career as a "rocker" was essentially finished. Until the dynamic return to television and widespread popularity that resulted from the electrifying performance he put on in the "Singer Special" in December of 1968, Elvis as rocker was a contradiction in terms.

In spite of the release of some of the legitimately innovative cuts on this compilation, the return of Elvis was orchestrated by the Colonel so that his boy could become the next Frank Sinatra, or another Andy Williams, and the move was to Hollywood movies and singing songs that even Elvis found execrable. Tunes such as "Courtesy of The Fort Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce" that Presley was forced to croon in movie soundtrack walk-throughs apparently drove him to distraction and fits of anger that reportedly led to his trashing the studio in an attempt to rip up the offending lyrics of the movie songs.

So the inclusion of several of these offending vehicles on RETURN OF THE ROCKER represents the ultimate irony—here we have "King of the Whole Wide World", a forgettable ditty that

was the lead song in *Kid Galahad*, "Return To Sender" from *Girls, Girls, Girls* and the title track of *Follow That Dream*. Even the dating of many of the songs on this quickie assembly is out to lunch. Many of them were not recorded by Elvis until 1961 or 1962, in spite of the fact that his first studio appearance after a farewell in June of 1958 was in March of 1960, resulting in the album *ELVIS IS BACK!*

So we have commercial ventures such as "Little Sister" and "Stuck On You" on the same record with a couple of tracks that did have a bit of soul to them, namely "A Mess of Blues", and "Like A Baby", which was one of the better recordings from the album that marked Elvis's return to the album game.

Neophytes who may be wondering what all the fuss was about with this hillbilly cat from Memphis are implored to forsake this unfortunate exploitation and to return to the "real Elvis" and pick out anything recorded between the 1954-55 Sun Sessions, and the pre-Army sessions in 1958. Otherwise, they're likely to associate this album's artist with the fabricated facsimile that was paraded on Las Vegas stages up until about August 16, 1977.

#### David & David BOOMTOWN (A&M)

Some bands have made careers out of hating Los Angeles the way The Eagles did, but a pair of David's named Baerwald and Ricketts have cornered the market, it seems, with their stunning debut album, *BOOMTOWN*. Says Baerwald, "I don't want to accept Los Angeles—I don't want to be brain-dead". But the diatribe against Glitter City continues on their track "Welcome To The Boomtown", which picks up the glamorous life where "Hotel California" left off.

The opening lines of their haunting track are being quoted often: "Ms cristina drives a .944/ satisfaction oozes from her pores/ she keeps rings on her fingers/ marble on her floor/ cocaine in her dresser/ bars on her doors/ she keeps her back against the wall/ so I say/ I say welcome/ welcome to the boomtown/ pick a habit/ we got plenty to go around".

That last throwaway line is so typical of the somehow folksy yet urban sentiments expressed by Baerwald and Ricketts on this album that has a lot of people talking.

To describe the stylistic flourishes on David & David's record is difficult, but if you could imagine Dylan, or better yet, one of his hipper disciples such as Eric Anderson taking a songwriting walk through Rod Sterling's Twilight Zone, you might approach the off-the-wall trendiness of this album. The title track, however, is merely

a 1986 version of Billy Joel's "Piano Man" in many respects, telling as it does of Ms cristina, handsome kevin and their expensive habits: "and all that money makes such a succulent sound".

But one tune does not an album make, and luckily, David & David bring home the bacon with the balance of this quirky, but most necessary album for anyone wishing to stay in touch with current rock. The dobro and lap steel sound on the song "Heroes" is a perfect contrast to a track such as "Swallowed By The Cracks", which has all the influences of Anderson, the Byrds and a large contingent of American rockers over the past two decades. If you decide to pick out one single album as a very special Christmas gift for a rocker on your list, let it be David & David's superb *BOOMTOWN* documentary.

### VIDEO SCREENINGS

#### 9&1/2 weeks (MGM-UA VIDEO)

This steamy little movie based on sensationalism and sex will probably melt down the playback heads on a few video machines! 9&1/2 Weeks is a simply boy-meets-girl type of film that takes on a few new wrinkles, not to mention kinks.

When Mickey Rourke decides to initiate Kim Basinger into the exotic of sensual love against a backdrop of bustling, cosmopolitan New York City, the result is a torrid screen romance that flip-flops easily from moments of raw sexual passion to scenarios that often drift over into forbidden ground.

Basinger plays Elizabeth, on the rebound from a failed marriage, who makes a chance meeting with Rourke's character John, who deals in the big money markets of Wall Street and dwells in a high-tech condo that features walls of televisions and chic furniture. The

whirlwind affair quickly moves into intimacy, with John and Elizabeth finding some very weird locales to consummate their torrid romance—inside the symbolically engaging and disengaging clockworks of a gigantic clock, or in the midst of a spur of the moment taunting of a carful of hoods who chase them and are rebuffed—when they are not indulging in some of the most erotic food scenes since the sensuous fig-eating tableau from *Tom Jones*.

Director Adrian Lyne's has a tendency to use blatantly obvious bits of a screen imagery—a bedraggled cat with a large mouse or rat dangling from its sordid jaws in the midst of the chase through the urban bowels of New York; the hasty exit beaten by Basinger's kitty-cat when the pair of lovers get into the nitty gritty. The whole of the drama is played out against a blistering sound track which points up the savagery of the romance—a strip-tease by Elizabeth to Joe Cocker's "You Can Leave Your Hat On" is a visual and musical highlight of the film.

The ending of 9&1/2 Weeks may leave many viewers cold, as will the tacked on morality of Elizabeth's rebellion against John's sexual excesses, but the lyrical moments in the movie are welcome after the intensity of the raw interpersonal exchanges. # Artifacts suggest Abenakis weren't first on the lake

In his book, *I Don't Remember Getting Born*, (1986), my friend Edwin Earle writes at the beginning of page 6: "The Lake-- as every one who has been around probably knows- is perhaps the most beautiful in the world. I say -perhaps- guardedly in case some world traveler has met its match." Finally someone has dared to write what I have always thought since my tender childhood.

I've had the luck to travel in different countries and have made the acquaintance of many people. The first question asked: "Where do you come from?" My answer: "Magog." This immediately brings on a second question: "In what country is Magog located?" My answer: "The name Magog probably comes from the last two syllables of the name Memphemagog of the Abenakis language — Memlawbagak meaning Beautiful Waters and I continue bla-bla-bla.....an easy task for me.

To prove that Memphemagog has been of special importance for communication for a long time is difficult, but a couple of years ago I discovered a piece of pottery at a 120-foot depth and because of its size and drawings on it, one could believe that a civilization preceding that of the Abenakis had existed on the shores of the lake. This artifact was given to the *Ministère des Affaires Culturelles* and in December, 1984 they presented me with a report done by Mr. Mandeville. This report can be examined at my office at any time.

Other artifacts had been found previously and this passage from a book entitled *Sherbrooke*, by Louis-Philippe Demers, 1969, we

of the Société d'Histoire du Lac Memphémagog Inc.

read on page 31:

"John Meagher, an amateur underwater diver, discovered on September 1967, a canoe in the style of late 18th century, lying at a 35-foot depth, in the waters of Memphemagog, a little north of Georgeville. It measured 15 foot long by 3 foot wide: it was not of Indian construction. Were the rare pieces of metal connecting certain sections of this boat of French or English workmanship? Mr. J.D. Ferguson, president of the Historical Society of Stanstead, delegated the study of this artifact to experts in Ottawa!"

At Merry's Point at the beginning of the century a father Coiteux had found a rare piece of jade, one of the most beautiful artifacts ever found in this area that can be seen now at the Musée du Séminaire in Sherbrooke.

Whenever studies are made on these two artifacts we will definitely know more about our past.

## Entertainment shorts

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP) — An NBC correspondent who reported links between Wayne Newton and organized-crime figures testified Tuesday the late actor Phil Foster was known among law officers as "the candyman" because of his cocaine contacts.

Foster, who died in July at the age of 72, was best known for his role in the television comedy series *Laverne and Shirley* as Frank De Fazio, father of Laverne.

NBC correspondent Brian Ross testified he was told by Los Angeles authorities that Foster "had become known on various Hollywood sets as the candyman, the distributor of cocaine for Guido Penosi."

RUTLAND, Vt. (AP) — Cartoonist Al Smith, who drew the Mutt and Jeff comic strip for nearly half a century, has died at the age of 84.

Mutt and Jeff — the long and short of the cartoon set — was the oldest continuous comic strip in the United States, running from 1907 to 1981.

It was created by the late Bud Fisher, making its debut in the *San Francisco Chronicle*, where Augustus Mutt brought racing tips to pony-playing readers. Little Jeff joined Mutt in 1920.

In 1932, Fisher, by then America's highest-paid cartoonist, earning \$4,000 a week, hired Smith to draw the strip.

In 1954, Fisher died and Smith assumed the full task of keeping Mutt and Jeff alive.

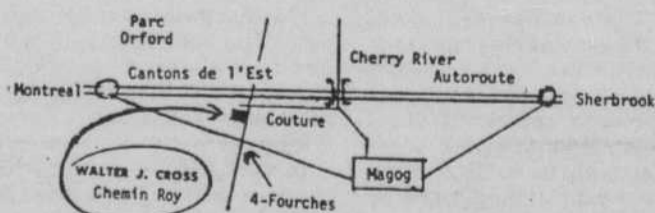

# University Singers celebrate Christmas in song

LENNOXVILLE — It has become a tradition of the season. Every year at about this time the University Singers present their Christmas concert, generally tackling two major works of sacred music, and a selection of carols. And the people of Lennoxville and area turn out faithfully to hear them.

This year the 50-voice choir has chosen to perform Telemann's Christmas Cantata, *Ein Kindlein so lobelich*, and Benjamin Britten's Ceremony of Carols. Their concert takes place at the Centennial Theatre Sunday at 4 p.m.

It won't be the first time they've performed these works. Last week the choir presented the same program at the Cathedral of the Holy Trinity in Quebec City, and choir director Nancy Rahn was pleased to report some 100 people turned out to hear them.

Rahn says doing the Christmas concert twice, once in Lennoxville and once somewhere else, is a trend the choir will likely follow in coming years. Last year, in addition to Lennoxville, the University

Singers performed in Richmond. **STANDS OUT**

The University Singers are far from being the only choir in the region providing a concert of sacred music during the holiday season. But Rahn says there are ways in which the group stands out.

One is in the mix of French and English, students and non-students.

"Because we have the university and the community together it gives us a definite mix of ages," she said. "We also have francophones and anglophones which gives us quite a different mix."

This particular mix is beneficial both to the students — most of them in the faculty of music — and to the members of the community, says Rahn, who has directed the choir for the past four years.

For the students it's a chance to perform, and a chance to hear the magic of the four parts coming together. For many members of the community it provides a musical challenge beyond what most church choirs offer.

Because the choir is associated with an English university, says Rahn, the choice of works to be performed differs from the other choirs in the region.

#### A CHALLENGE

Although the format for their recitals is generally about the same, Rahn says the Telemann work is "very different from anything we've ever done" and Britten's Ceremony of Carols, with its old English words, presents a particular challenge.

The concert doesn't only consist of choral works. It will also feature the University Strings, a chamber orchestra directed by René Béchard, which will perform Haydn's Divertimento in E flat major, Opus 1.

For the Telemann piece, the University Strings will accompany a chamber choir and soloists Leslie

Piper, mezzo, and Simon Maxwell, bass.

The concert will conclude with the lighter material: traditional Christmas carols in French, Latin and English.

The University Singers usually present two concerts every year, one at Christmas and one in the spring. In the spring of 1987 the choir will perform at Centennial and at the Plymouth-Trinity United Church in Sherbrooke.

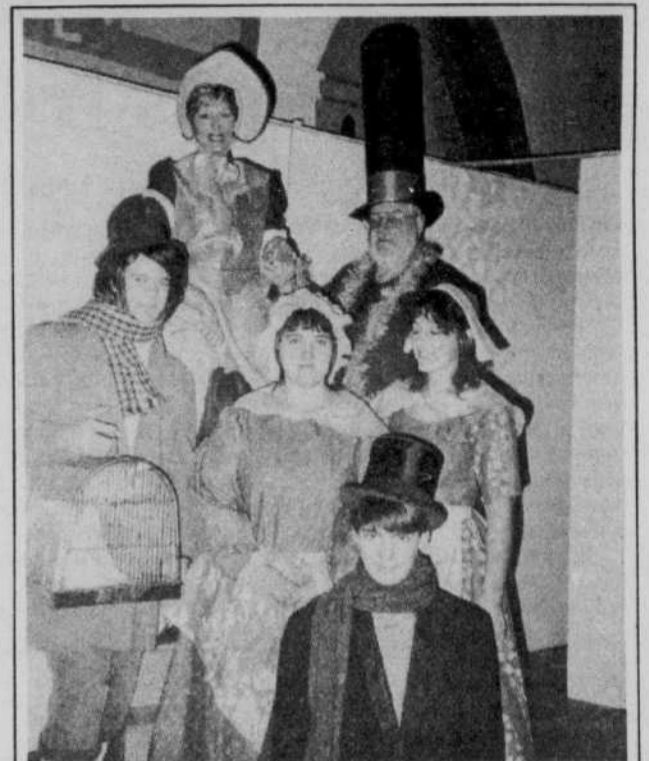

## Marijuana is free for the picking in Dali

DALI, China (Reuter) — The picturesque city of Dali in southern China can boast one tourist attraction probably not found anywhere else in the world — marijuana, free for the picking.

"The word is out that you can get dope in Dali," said a young Australian visitor to the town perched on a narrow plain between a lake and a wall of mountains in Yunnan province. He had just accepted surplus marijuana from three Japanese who were heading home after a vacation.

"This place is like Kathmandu 20 years ago," said French travel journalist Sabine Lecarpentier, re-

ferring to the Nepalese capital's popularity among seekers of high altitude, meditation and drugs.

Although one of the proudest boasts of the Communist party is to have wiped out opium addiction in China, western marijuana smokers said local authorities showed no interest in their activities.

But in today's profit-minded China, some tourists think it only a matter of time before Dali people are selling marijuana to foreigners — a mini-reversal of the drug trafficking by foreigners to Chinese that provoked last century's opium wars.

For the moment, smokers seek

their own supplies, which can be found growing wild at the roadside only a two-minute walk from the gilded wall tower of the northern city gate.

Fields near the three pagodas just outside Dali also yield good pickings, say customers at one of the western-style cafes that have sprung up since the town was opened to foreign travellers two years ago.

In the Coca-Cola cafe, where pancakes or mushroom-and-garlic pizzas can be ordered as a change from Chinese food, wall decorations include a poster of Karl Marx and a psychedelic drawing of a

goat's head.

Foreign devotees of marijuana said they were unaware of any Chinese who shared their smoking preference. Some said they had heard local people used it for chicken feed or as a pharmaceutical ingredient.

Dali, capital of an independent kingdom from the sixth to the 11th century, has a long association with drugs.

The late Australian journalist George Morrison wrote in 1894 that opium poppies probably grew higher around Dali than anywhere else in the world — up to his forehead, and he was a tall man.

Another Australian, historian C.P. Fitzgerald, described hosting parties in Dali 50 years ago at which after-dinner guests would sprawl on broad couches, dreamily smoking opium.

"All Yunnanese with very rare exceptions smoked opium, but not to excess," he said.

But even for modern non-smokers, Dali has attractions that lure scores of foreigners to make the 10-hour bumpy bus ride along the landslide-prone hill road from Kunming, the provincial capital, 400 kilometres away.

Things have not changed much in Dali since the mid-1930s, when Fitzgerald said the scenery was unsurpassed, the climate most agreeable and the cost of living minimal.

As people in northern China donned overcoats against the first winter winds, peasants here were out under a hot November sun, harvesting crops or building new houses in their traditional way, the external walls decorated with arabesque patterns of flowers and animals.

## Egypt woos Canadian tourists

MONTREAL (CP) — With terrorism and a rise in religious fundamentalism threatening to cut Canadian tourism to Egypt in half this year, Cairo has undertaken a public relations offensive.

Four top Egyptian officials are travelling across Canada to wine and dine journalists in high style, blitz travel executives and lobby Ottawa for landing rights for Egyptian planes, as well as for \$5 million in aid to develop a resort catering to "Canadian tastes."

They are also trying to open up a new market — the low-cost charter trade that would likely be keener on lolling on the beaches and scuba diving in the Red Sea than in seeing the pyramids. At present, Canada has no charter package tours to Egypt, and regular non-charter air fares make Egypt prohibitive as a fun-in-the-sun destination.

"We want to make it easy for the average man from Saskatchewan to go to Egypt," said Tahseen Basheer, delegation head and Egypt's former ambassador to Ottawa. "We want to blaze a new trail."

### CALM JITTERS

But much of the delegation's work seems aimed at calming jittery Canadian nerves, rubbed raw by terrorist incidents.

Tourism to Egypt started falling after the hijacking in October 1985 of the Achille Lauro cruise liner during which an American tourist was killed. Egypt did not condone the incident, but gave the Palestinian hijackers safe passage out of the country.

Then came the well-publicized Cairo police riots last February. Several hotels were burned one night when rioting policemen were joined by Moslem fundamentalists, who have been growing in strength and influence in recent years.

To try to repair the damage done to tourism, the Egyptian government has dispatched envoys to various countries. In Montreal, the Egyptian officials spoke to journalists during a four-course lunch at the exclusive Mount Stephen Club.

"Egypt is an island of peace," Basheer said. "There is more terrorism in Paris than there is in Cairo... Most big Canadian cities at night aren't as safe as Cairo is."





# Findlay isn't comfortable with just plain mystery

Just talking about lies makes author Timothy Findlay angry. Especially the big ones.

"The whole North American version of civilization is woven with lies," he says, jabbing the air with his cigarette.

"That bastard Reagan talks about what his government is doing for the country and America

is in disarray. And there is appalling poverty.

"And our government is destroying our integrity to follow the United States."

Findlay calls his latest book, *The Telling of Lies*, a novel in mystery form.

But the author of such serious fiction as *Not Wanted on the Voyage*, *Famous Last Words* and *The Wars* isn't comfortable with just plain mystery.

In the *Telling of Lies*, everyone lies.

Innocuous lies — Vanessa Van Horne lies to herself about taking her heart pills — provide the framework for the soul-destroying lies, the kind that make people kill.

And since this is a mystery, someone does get killed. The greenish corpse of drug mogul Calder Maddox, about 90, is found slumped in a deck-chair on the beach. It looks like a stroke, but that's a lie.

Findlay's bleak commentary on North American society is set in and around the Aurora Sands Hotel, based on the real, though closed, Atlantic House Hotel in Scarborough, Me.

The author spent part of every summer for 50 years in this four-storey, multi-windowed hotel with its peeling white paint and green roof.

**THE LAST SUMMER**

Van Horne, wealthy and almost 60, her childhood friends, and her mother's rigidly corseted friends are spending their last summer at the hotel. It has been sold.

With Maddox's death, the well-maintained illusion of propriety, sophistication and gentility is shattered, at least for those who try to learn the truth.

Van Horne, not your average sleuth, hunts for an abducted friend, Maddox's mistress, and stumbles on some sinister truths about the CIA, Maddox and drug experiments with human guinea pigs.

Now about the iceberg that looms ominously just offshore in this book. Why an iceberg?

"The iceberg is almost a joke," Findlay says. "I caught sight of it in my mind as Vanessa was walking down the beach.

"I thought, 'Let's have a symbol that looks like the Capitol Building in Washington.'"

**PICK MEANING**

It could be a symbol of ecological damage, the horror of drugs and disease, he suggests.

"I can almost believe that AIDS was stage-managed in a society that is both homophobic and terrified of drugs.

"This isn't wildness. Where did legionnaire's disease and AIDS come from?"

And the CIA did experiment with drugs and people in the '50s.

"The iceberg is part of that."

Yes, it could be that. Then maybe it's just an iceberg that floated south so a major-general from Winnipeg, a guest at the hotel, could yell, "Blow the bugger out of the water."

Findlay says his favorite part in the book is when a plane flies over the iceberg trailed by a long banner reading: BERGSGO BETTER WITH COKE.

How truly American, he says. He means it too.

**CAN BE WITTY**

On the whole, this is not a funny book but Findlay does occasionally display a skewering wit.

A Filipino maid is named Imelda although the passage about her shoes was dropped because Findlay's editor didn't get the joke.

Between lies in this book, Findlay indulges his fascination with things Japanese.

Van Horne and her parents were interned in a Japanese camp during the war; entries in Van Horne's diary, which is the book, are numbered rather than dated.

Findlay explains this is tied to the Japanese pillow book Van Horne is reading. It's a different approach to time.

And Van Horne herself, an aging virgin who decided long ago that love is treacherous, creates Japanese gardens and finds life in elaborate designs raked in sand.

Findlay plays with time and reality in this book. And he raises disturbing questions about power and justice.

He sees truth as a fragile and rare thing — and it's awfully depressing to think he may be right.

The *Telling of Lies* is a good read and the character of Vanessa Van Horne deserves to live in more than one novel.

## Season's glossy coffee-table books range from Expo 86 to wildlife art

As regular as the first snow of winter, a new array of those big, glossy coffee-table books is piling up on book store shelves to tempt the Christmas shopper looking for gifts exotic and memorable.

This year's sampling ranges in geography from China to Ireland and the cities of Ottawa and Vancouver; in subject matter from Expo 86 to Canadian nostalgia and a portfolio by North America's finest wildlife artists.

**China — The Long March:** Said to have cost \$1 million to produce, with the government of China as co-publisher, it is the most thrilling of this season's output with hundreds of often breath-taking color photos by scores of international photographers.

With an extensive text by Anthony Lawrence, the BBC's Asia correspondent, it retraces the legendary long march of 1936 when the Red Army, along with many women and children, set out on a 9,600-kilometre retreat to escape annihilation by the Nationalist forces of Chiang Kai-shek.

The book is packed with full-page photos that capture lush green fields, churning rivers, smoky mountaintops, moonlit bays. But best of all are the faces of China — piercing, full-face portraits and pictures of Chinese peasants at work dyeing indigo cloth, playing cards in teahouses, washing vegetables in a river or at worship.

Published by Merehurst Press of London, it is distributed in North America by Cupress of Toronto, has 320 pages and costs \$59.95.

**From the Wild:** Wildlife artists, sometimes scorned by connoisseurs and "serious" artists, have in recent years been crying all the way to the bank. Nowadays, collecting big-name wildlife artists has become something of a rich man's game, with original works sometimes fetching \$50,000 to \$100,000.

Many individual artists have produced books of their art but now Christopher Hume, art critic for the Toronto Star, has brought together in one volume works re-

presentative of the best of North America's artists in this field. It's a handsome book, including 95 pages of color reproductions that range from animal and bird life to field-and-stream scenes by Lanford Monroe and under-sea art by Stanley Meltzoff.

Canadians represented include Robert Bateman, probably the most successful wildlife artist today, Montrealer Claudio D'Angelo, Fenwick Lansdowne with his exquisite, pinpoint-sharp bird portraits, and Glen Loates, perhaps best known for his magnificent Siberian Tiger painted in 1984.

Published by Summerhill Press, it is 192 pages and priced at \$50.

**Times to Remember:** Subtitled *A Canadian Photo Album*, this is a nostalgic look at the last 50 years of Canadian life and the personalities and events that brought tears and laughter, excitement and foolishness. Through 190 black-and-white snapshots it captures images of the Depression — the unemployed huddled beneath a billboard depicting a steak dinner, the infant Dionne quintuplets, wartime flappers and the D-Day Normandy invasion.

The text by Knowlton Nash of CBC-TV's *The National* strikes an evocative chord to go with photos of Terry Fox and Steve Fonyo, a young Princess Elizabeth square dancing, pianist Glenn Gould, high-jumper Greg Joy in victory, Rene Levesque in defeat and mass murderer Clifford Olson in prison.

Published by Key Porter, it is 192 pages, \$24.95.

**Ottawa: An Illustrated History:** This is more an academic work than a pretty picture book. John Taylor traces the city from early military outpost through brawling lumber town to federal capital, and he has selected 150 archival photos to illustrate a story told with skill and wit. His thesis is that although federal funding has made Ottawa the spoiled child of Canadian cities, it has always been dominated by external masters — the British military, lumber barons and finally big government.

Published by James Lorimer,

it is 232 pages, \$27.95.

**Vancouver: A Year in Motion, and The Expo Celebration:** Two more of those big, flashy, gloriously colorful books that are the work of groups of photographers.

Vancouver, subtitled *A Year in Motion*, suggests the city may be "the most beautiful place on earth," and then sets out to make the point with some 200 photos tracing, month by month, the year leading up to Expo 86. The result is a glamorous, sophisticated, sometimes comical portrait of a city celebrating its 100th birthday. Published by Collins, it is 208 pages at \$49.95.

The Expo book, a classy volume called the official retrospective book, takes the reader through the 165-day extravaganza, depicting royal and other visitors, fireworks, exotic entertainers from abroad, clowns and just plain folk having lots of fun. Published by Whitecap Books, 224 pages, \$39.95.

**Trans-Canada Country:** This is a photo album of the Trans-Canada Highway, starting at the junction of Parade Street, Carter Hill and Freshwater Road in St. John's and fanning 7,750 kilometres across to Victoria. In fact, renowned photographer Brian Milne and companion Dawn Goss, who wrote the foreword, crossed the country five times, in all seasons, taking more than 18,000 photos from which the 200 most spectacular were chosen for this book. The result is a treasury of colorful images of personalities and changing landscapes along the legendary highway.

Published by Collins, it is 208 pages, \$39.95.

**A Day in the Life of America:** Perhaps the best of the *Day in the Life of ...* books that earlier captured shimmering images of Hawaii, Australia, Canada and Japan. This volume was also created by a team of international photographers assigned to snap the United States on one day — May 2, 1986. Most every page is a joy, from the 77-year-old modelling a bridal gown, the granny with a ghetto blaster and young bare-bottomed twin brothers to a Manhattan down-and-outer with an "I'm hungry" sign.

Published by Collins, 268 pages, \$49.95.

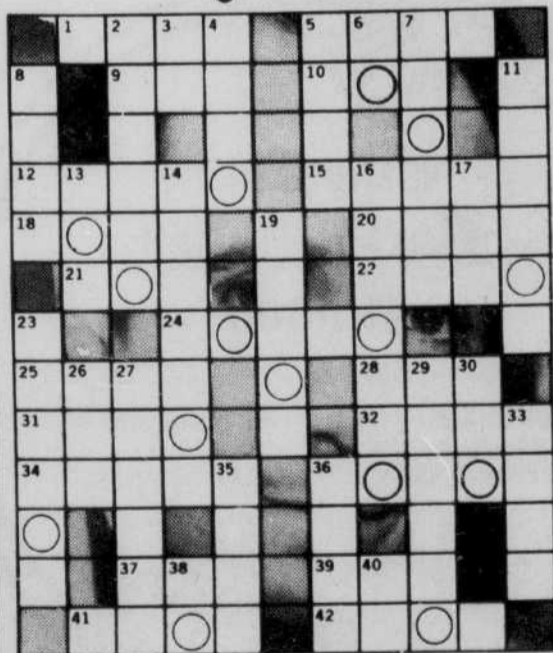
