FATAL EARTHQUAKE IN ITALY. THREE THOUSAND HOUSES DAMAGED. A NUMBER OF LIVES LOST. FLORENCE, May 19.—The population of this city was thrown into a state of panic last night by a series of earthquakes that did not cease until the morning. The shocks were everywhere. The shocks were so violent that houses swayed like ships in a sea and in a number of cases roofs fell, injuring many persons who were sought for in other places. The most serious damage was done at the theatres, where performances were going on as usual. The first shock caused those in the audience to fall, and the second caused the earth to sway and amid shouts of "earthquake" the crowds made wild rushes for the exits. Mad with terror, no respect was shown for the women, and in the crush many were badly hurt. Upon reaching the streets the crowds from their dwellings and the excitement that ensued made confusion worse confounded.
