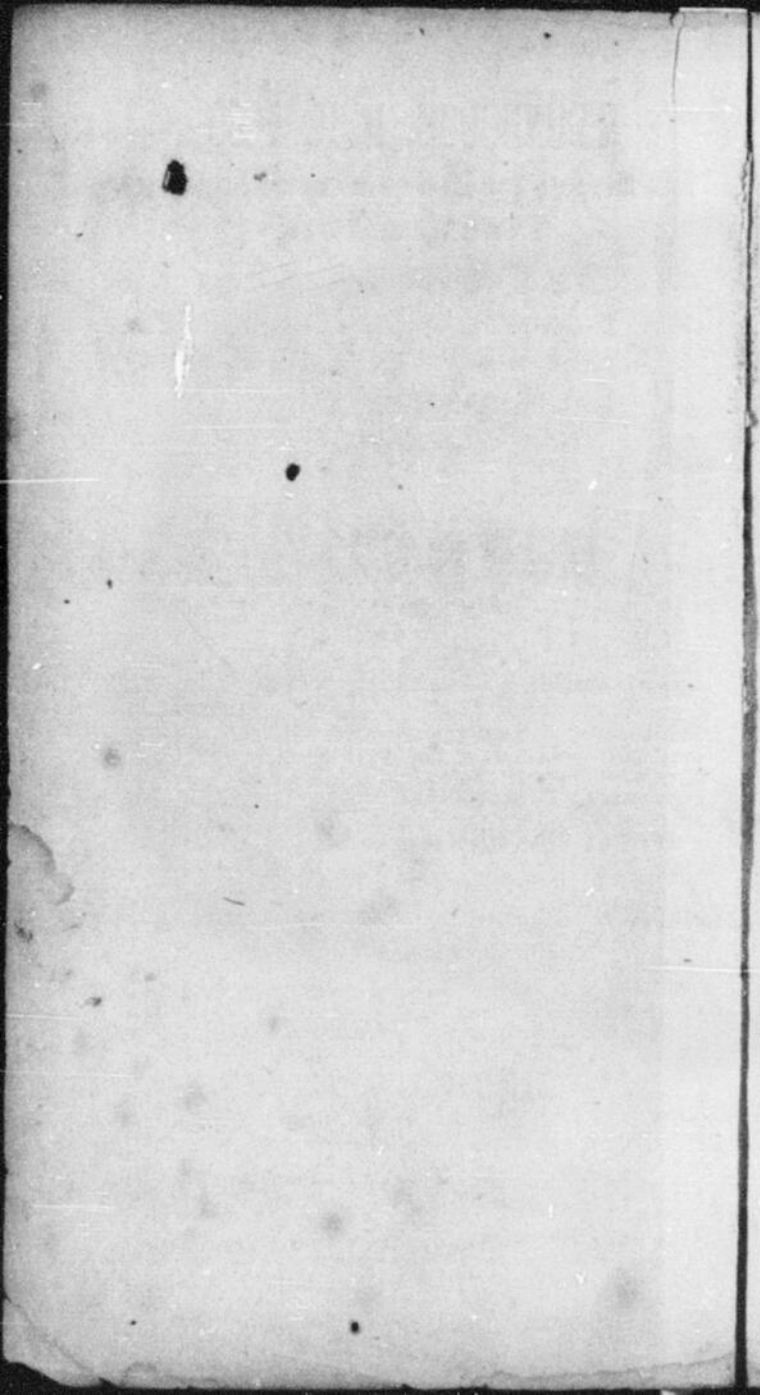

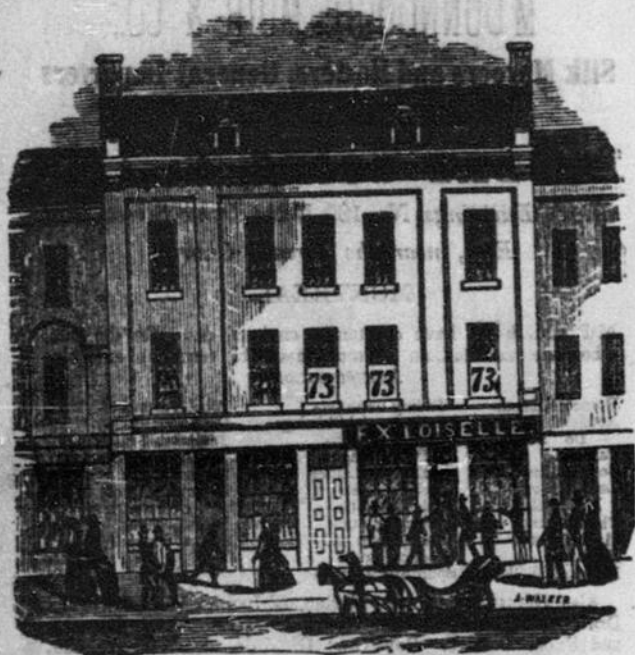

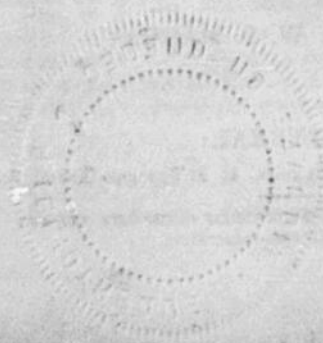

## PREFACE.

---

In continuing a work, to which her late husband devoted so much of his time and attention, the undersigned is aware, that although the little assistance she could give him, in the details of the labor, has afforded her some valuable experience in the undertaking, now that it has pleased the Almighty by removing him to leave her to struggle with the world alone, yet she can hardly hope to have attained to that accuracy, of which the great support extended to the work in her deceased husband's hands is sufficient evidence, that it has hitherto possessed. She can say, however, that her desire to make the present edition of the Directory as worthy of the patronage of the community, as its predecessors have been acknowledged to be, has not been less ardent than was that of Mr. Mackay himself; and she trusts, with somewhat of diffidence, that the great pains she has taken to accomplish that desire have not been without success. She has bestowed much labor in procuring the necessary information, and hardly less in compiling and arranging it in due form.

Under the many difficulties she has had to encounter, she ventures to think, that the public will be disposed to look with an indulgent eye, upon any deficiencies or errors, which may be detected in the present volume, satisfied that the efforts of the widow to earn her bread cannot fail to be charitably regarded by the citizens of Montreal; her principal excuse for them, should they exist, is her comparative newness to the many details of, to her, so great an undertaking,—the impossibility of commencing it before the 6th May, in consequence of the numerous removals at that date,—the great increase in the population of the city within the last three

years,—and the necessity of her doing so much with her own hand. To the same causes, also, she has to attribute the delay that has taken place in the appearance of the work, but she has reason to believe that, with the experience she now possesses, such is not likely to occur again, but that she will be able to issue her future editions by the second or third week of June.

The undersigned now throws herself on the favor of her deceased husband's numerous friends, and the kind consideration of the public in laying the present volume before them. In one thing, at least, she is fortunate, that the nature of the work itself apart from any merits or demerits of her own, makes it a necessary companion in the establishment of every man who carries on business of any kind in the city, and that in an industrial city, like Montreal, comprises almost every class of the population.
