Vanasse-Martin show better in Granby than in Sutton

GRANBY — Whatever the critics say, Raymonde Vanasse-Martin is the people's choice at the Granby courthouse through June 27. Opening morning, last Monday, her works stopped lawyers, clerks, and soon-to-be-tried defendants alike, as no previous courthouse showing ever has.

The joker is, the Vanasse-Martin exhibit includes many of the same paintings that flopped miserably at Arts Sutton only last month. One

could argue that the courthouse attracts a less sophisticated audience, true enough, or that Vanasse-Martin is taking her Granby show more seriously, presenting a much wider range of work.

These are factors, but the gallery itself makes the biggest difference. The Granby courthouse favors the acrylic fire-colors Vanasse-Martin prefers, favors large and garish composition, almost requires works with eye-stopping shock value. The colored glass windows and lobby atmosphere

confirm that while Vanasse-Martin isn't a painter likely to hang in many homes, her works may be just right for bars and dance halls.

That's assuming the John Crosbie anti-pornography bill doesn't ban her. Vanasse-Martin, of Farnham, is scarcely a pornographic painter by normal community standards, but some of her works do show girls as young as 11 in poses some might find provocative, and sometimes even depict people of indeterminate age enga-

ged in what may be construed as sex acts. One can only guess whether Crosbie will attempt to bust the courthouse next year, if his sweeping bill passes.

Significantly, the courthouse crowd favorites all seem to be paintings not shown in Sutton: 'Card Party', a Lautrec-like composition with which any gambler can identify; 'Susan', showing the 11-year-old, her petticoat showing, amid a cluster of flowers;

'Dream'; and 'Alana', a surrealist nude.

Vanasse-Martin's drawing is still erratic, her colors still almost glow in the dark, she still leans toward sentimentality, especially in works of religious theme, and she still doesn't know the concept 'subtle'. But the people passing through the lobby don't give a damn about any of that - and she's gotten many of them to look at paintings who have never looked at paintings before.

Explaining 'major re-entries'

When looking through your stamp catalogue at early issues, you will run across the words 'major re-entry'. Many collectors are not aware of exactly what this means. In order to understand what a re-entry is, the method of printing should be explained.

Line engraving is the oldest method used in the printing of postage stamps. After a design was submitted, it was then cut into a small plaque of steel by the engraver. The plaque, or master die was then hardened and applied under pressure to a cylinder of softened steel. This cylinder is known as a transfer roller.

The surface of the roller, which now contained the design image, was hardened, and, the design transferred to a steel plate as often

as was needed to form a sheet of stamps. The process was known as rocking in, for that was exactly what was done. The roller rocked to and fro impressing the design into the steel plate. Guide lines and dots were all the engraver had to go by to aid him in aligning the rows. Some of these dots can be found in older stamps.

In order to print the stamps, ink was first applied to the plate, the excess being wiped off. The plate was then polished by hand before the plate and paper were brought together in the flat bed press. The process was repeated for each sheet.

Re-entries occurred when a plate started to wear and the worn places would be gone over with the master die. At times the roller would shift slightly on the return roll and cause a double impression. This is known as shifted transfer or fresh entry. Some of the entries are major while others are minor.

At times the impression on the plate was weak or shallow, necessitating the engraver to use his burin or graver. These are known as retouches.

Catalogues will only list the denominations of an issue which are known to have major re-entries. They do not tell you what part of the stamp is affected.

There have been many studies done on the older Canadian issues. Namely, the small Queens, the Admiral issue and the Map Stamp. Booklets have been written describing major and minor re-entries of each dominations.

Hairlines occurred when plates were molded onto printing press cylinders. The plate would sometimes crack during the process, causing hairline recesses. Hairlines are not uncommon in the admiral issue.

This Sunday, June 22, the Richmond Historical Society will be opening the season with a pancake brunch. The price of the brunch includes a visit to the museum. The feature attraction for this Sunday will be a stamp exhibition. The exhibition is not expected to be all that big but, it should prove to be interesting. A visit to the museum, which is situated on Main St. in Melbourne, alone, is worthwhile.

A disappointing effort

Some 13 years ago while visiting California, I was privileged to visit a variety of wineries located in both the Napa and Sonoma valleys. The wines I tasted, for the most part, varied from good to excellent and left a more than favorable impression — an impression that has only been reinforced through subsequent tastings.

I recall, at the time, thinking how provincial were the attitudes of so many of my wine-drinking friends who rejected out of hand all North American wines. Never was there a more graphic illustration of "throwing the baby out with the bath water."

Since that time, I am happy to say that most serious wine lovers — including the French — have come to accept that among Californian wines can be found some of the best wines in the world. This is not to say that California does not produce some abysmal wines; it does, as do France, Italy and any other wine-making nation. The point, however, is that given the many and diversified microclimates found in California and the expertise of its wine makers, wine drinkers have come to expect, at the least, good sound wines at a reasonable price.

Which accounts for the shocked expression on my face when I sampled Paul Masson's Nobella.

Since the venerable Paul Masson company was purchased by the international liquor giant, Seagram's, I have had serious concerns as to what might happen to the quality of the wine. Not that Seagram's is a particularly bad company, in fact many of its pro-

ducts are excellent, but the history of small wineries taken over by conglomerates has not always been a happy one.

Too often the painstaking and expensive effort needed to produce quality wines is cast aside in favor of the efficiency and mass marketing needed to increase profits. And it appears in the case of Paul Masson, at least with the Masson brands available in Quebec, this is exactly what has happened.

Two previous wines that I tried — Paul Masson Classique, white and red — left me with an unusual taste in my mouth and a vow not to buy them again. As to the Nobella (a Spanish wine imported and bottled here), Paul Masson has shown that it has developed a rather unconcerned attitude towards its once proud name.

Nobella is a thin white wine with a bitter taste that appears to be suffering from the early stages of oxidation. It has few redeeming features apart from its relatively inexpensive price and compares unfavorably — in my opinion — with the Société des Alcools 'draft' wine available at approximately \$1.50 less.

All in all a disappointing effort. Cheers!

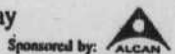

Village Culturel marks 10th anniversary

SHERBROOKE — Unicycle demonstrations and a collection of animal skulls are among the attractions at this year's Cultural

Village, to be held July 3 to 6 in Coaticook.

The *Village culturel de l'Estrie* is a corporation formed 10 years ago to promote cultural pursuits in the

Townships and to celebrate the cultural diversity of the region.

Each year the corporation chooses a different town or village to host the celebration, enabling that municipality to spotlight its own attractions, explained *Village* director-general Louise Couture at a press conference Tuesday.

The *Village Culturel* receives financial assistance through federal job creation programs and the provincial Ministry of Recreation, Hunting and Fishing. But the bulk of the \$20-\$30,000 annual budget is provided through sponsors and weekly bingos held year-round in Rock Forest, said Couture.

New attractions have been added every year, she said, and the festival now includes drama, dance, choir recitals, band concerts, arts and crafts exhibitions and presentations by local museums and historical societies. Coaticook's La Fontalière high school, at 311 St-Paul St., will be the hub of the activities this year.

Two new features this year are a workshop in animated drawing to be given by representatives of the National Film Board, and workshops for librarians and teachers to learn about animating library activities.

One of the main exhibitions of the festival will be the "Garden of Glass" featuring stained glass creations by local artisans. These will be displayed in the green-

houses of the La Frontalière school.

Several collectors will display their unusual collections at the Mgr. Durand school. Among these is Jean-Claude L'Heureux, a St-Denis-de-Bromptonville resident, whose interest in the way the jaws of various animals worked led him to collect the skulls of various animals ranging from a horse to a shrew. Victor Hellebuyck of Sherbrooke will also be there with an impressive collection of butterflies from all over the world.

A team of unicyclists from Coaticook and Sherbrooke will demonstrate their skill in basketball games on unicycle July 5 at 2 p.m. and July 6 at 1 p.m.

Other highlights of the festival include fireworks the evening of July 3 followed by a dance with music by the Montcalm school stage band, an improv theatre night July 4 featuring students from local high schools, the play "Laissons dire, laissons faire" interpreted by an amateur group from Katevale July 5 and a performance by a Bolivian dance troupe July 5 as well.

Opening ceremonies are at 9 p.m. Thursday, July 3 at the La Fontalière polyvalent and the event closes Sunday, July 6 with a concert by a 400-voice choir at 8:30 p.m.

Murder mystery is also excellent study of domestic strife

The Suspect by L. R. Wright (BANTAM-SEAL): \$3.95, 217 pp.

While American writers of crime and detective novels proliferate in the market place there are precious few authors in the British tradition of the psychological novel of detection outside of a couple of recognized favorites in the genre such as P.D. James and Ruth Rendall (who also writes under the pseudonym of Barbara Vine). It is a pleasant surprise to find that a Canadian name may now be added to the pantheon of current crime writers, as Vancouver novelist L. R. Wright has followed her first three acclaimed novels with her first mystery, **The Suspect**.

It is a curious and interesting handling of the detective genre which begins with the actual murder of an elderly gentleman by one of his neighbors who is also his brother-in-law, in a story that keeps the reader in suspense until the last few pages, wondering what the actual motive for the domestic tragedy could be.

An R.C.M.P. Staff Sergeant named Karl Alberg is the investigating officer, and his attempts to learn the identity of the killer of Carlyle Burke proceed even as author Wright reveals details about the life of the murderer, George Wilcox, an eighty-year-old, retired widower who tends his oceanside garden overlooking the Georgia Strait, north of Vancouver, B.C. **The Suspect**, then, is not a "whodunnit", but rather an attempt to use the killing of an elderly man by another man as a plot device on which can be hung all manner of probing into the psychological make-up of the principals in the case.

Sergeant Alberg makes the acquaintance of Cassandra Mitchell, the librarian in the coastal town of Sechelt, and because of his growing romantic relationship with her, his investigation of "the suspect", George Wilcox, becomes awkward and difficult, because of the friendship between Cassandra and the man who had been one of her regular library visitors.

The character portrayals are particularly solid in Wright's mystery, and the reasons for George Wilcox's sudden moment of homi-

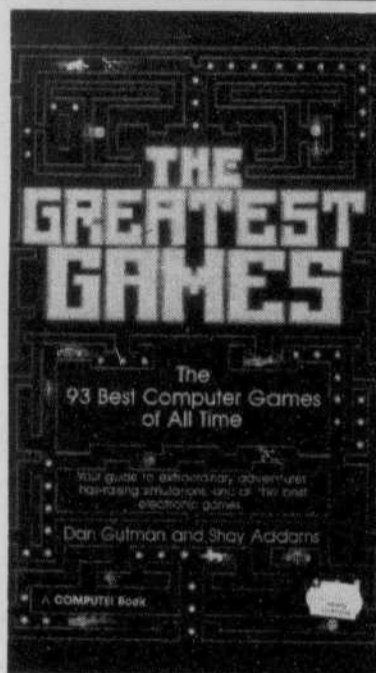
cial violence against the man who had married his sister are unfolded gradually, in this subtle, yet engaging novel of sophisticated, middle-class crime. Wright has a fine sense of place which is readily apparent in this novel which treats the reader to a taste of the tropical splendor of B.C.'s Sunshine Coast, while this excellent study of domestic strife develops with a truly mysterious motive at its heart.

COMPUTER LITERATURE
The Greatest Games by Dan Gutman & Shay Addams (McGraw-Hill Ryerson): \$13.95, 285 pp.

The mind-stunning array of games available for home computers is intimidating in the extreme, so it is often wise to turn to books such as this one for some objective criticism of available software that turns Apples and Commodores into home entertainment centres. Gutman & Addams have divided the mass of games into fairly representative categories that capture most of the qualities that the wide range of games represent: war games, driving games, maze games, adventure games, rescue games and shoot-em-ups. With lively discussions and concise examples of gameplay noted, the authors reveal the strengths and weaknesses of each game. The ever-changing versions of games are identified, as well as information about what games run on what computer systems.

For instance, "Frogger" is found under Cute Games, with descriptions of how simple this game is to play, with hints about how to turn the music off by hitting the f5 key on the Commodore 64 version, and information about what is supposed to happen when various game tricks are applied (which may be a boon if you are using a "Demonstration Disk", the euphemism for a cheap, pirated copy of the official game, at a mere fraction of original cost). Another game that is fully described is "Drol", which is indeed "amusing in an odd way". The game's odd collection of stunning graphics and animation, and the panorama of bouncing sea horses, scorpion, spinning hatchets, live turkeys, and witch doctors that perform the various operations that keep the player on his toes, are described in detail, while the compatibility chart reveals that "Drol" is available for the Apple II, Atari and Commodore 64 computers.

Newer, more sophisticated software, such as Flight Simulator II, Archon and Sargon III, comes in for detailed treatment in this handy book which shows just how far computer games and simulations have progressed since "Pong" was introduced 15 years ago. If you're curious about how some of these games are played, how points are scored, and how you win, after reading a review of "Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy" you'll know



all about the elements of the game, its playability, and the graphics which offer special effects. This book takes the worry out of buying a new computer game — especially when they all claim to be the greatest thing since "Pac-Man."

RECORD REVIEW
Dwight Twilley **WILD DOGS** (COLUMBIA)

Southern rocker Dwight Twilley has been making music for about a decade now, ever since he was discovered by Leon Russell and began to turn out solid, if unheralded albums, much in the manner of an underground regular like Todd Rundgren. With **WILD DOGS** Twilley may have latched on to the formula which could bring him more of the notoriety he enjoyed when his single "Girls" became a much-programmed M-T-V favourite video. Lots of help on this album comes along in the person of producer Val Garay and his gathering of such notables as Jerry Scheff (Elvis's bottom man) on bass, Waddy Wachtel on guitar, Jimmy Haskell conducting the strings on the single "Sexual", and Harmony vocal appearances by Kim Carnes, Phil Seymour and Susan Cowsill.

On the title track the echo machine is turned up high for a novelty number, but the character of the record doesn't come clear until "You Don't Care", which has Top-40 written all over it. Twilley's writing has developed into a style that reflects the music of the 70s that he has obviously absorbed, and "Hold On" pulls in many of the influences, using Carnes's baking vocals and a driving guitar solo by Waddy to create a fine song.

"Shooting Stars" is a soulful ballad which closes off side one on a high note, while the songs on side two are slick and up-tempo, "Radio" being perhaps the best of them. Twilley's teaming with players such as Waddy Wachtel ensured that this record finally gave his songwriting talents a proper

showcase — the difference between this album and all of the other Dwight Twilley recordings is that a larger number of people will be hearing this one.

VIDEO SCREENINGS
REMO WILLIAMS (THORN-EMI)

Move over James Bond, the ever cool Remo Williams has just laid claim to part of the territory you have staked out in the action — film territory. Remo, the hardrock cop, is recruited in startling fashion by corporate/computer mogul Harold Smith (played by Wilfred Brimley), given a plastic surgery facelift and disguise, and informed that he will be the scourge of crime in high places. Says Smith: "Everywhere you look, slime is on the loose...you're going to be the 11th Commandment...Thou shalt not get away with it!" It's a case of "Death Wish" goes corporate, as Remo Williams is programmed to take on a scoundrel who is using his corporation to rip off the U.S. military and produce faulty combat rifles and other toys that fail to meet the American standards for fail-safe carnage.

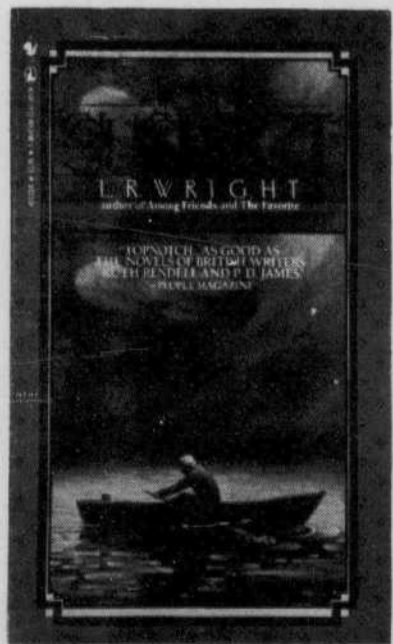
Before Williams goes into the field, however, he is put through a rigorous endurance apprenticeship with a Korean sage (played by "Cabaret's" Joel Grey) in an ancient art that makes ju-jitsu and karate and all the others seem like child's play. Director Guy Hamilton has borrowed quite blatantly from films such as "Karate Kid" for the initiation scenes as Remo learns dedication and devotion and patience, and from the Bond series for the glib, laid-back approach that Fred Ward's character Remo brings to his often violent, sometimes entertaining little epic.

ROCKY IV (CBS-FOX)
Sylvester Stallone pumps Rocky

up for one more go-round, hopping on the bandwagon that he created himself with his execrable **Rambo II**, descending to what Dr. Samuel Johnson decried as the last refuge of a scoundrel, in draping Rocky Balboa in the American flag, in this overblown marriage of patriotism and prizefighting. As the director of this flick, Stallone has as much trouble as the audience does in imagining how Rocky could get pumped up for yet a new fight with anything that would be an advancement from the frame after frame of Rocky doing push-ups, roadwork and sparring rounds already done to death in the previous three opuses.

But in IV, Rocky goes up against the blond Soviet man-machine, so the training sequences play up the angle that the Russkie uses steroids, is guided by monitor-perusing technicians, and is molded into the kind of athlete that has been giving NHL hockey players fits since 1972. Rocky, on the other hand, is turned out into the Russian tundra to pull stone-boats for peasants, run through highly-drifted snowbanks, and generally pit his sculpted body against everything natural and, of course, truly American.

The saliva flies a little further on a right cross to the chops, the blood gushes in even large floods from each of the combatants, and the careful choreography of the final fight scene (does it really go on for about 30 minutes, or is it a trick of Stallone's film-making?) wrings every emotional ounce of sweat from this idea which is rapidly becoming trite and cliché ridden. Bequest makes attractive new library wing possible

NORTH HATLEY — About 14,000 books have found a new home.

A new wing to the North Hatley Public Library is now open and the books have been rearranged in the added space.

The section houses biographies, histories, English and French fiction, antique texts and other types of literature. It will also be the showplace for many exhibits and guest lecturers throughout the summer and months to come.

The addition was made possible by a bequest from Jeanette Virgin's estate. Virgin was a wealthy North Hatley resident who died some four years ago and left money to various North Hatley establishments such as the library and the Piggery Theatre.

Nicole Clément, president of the North Hatley Library Association, is not saying how much the library inherited, but she did say the wing cost \$100,000 to build. The price, she says, does not include painting and redecorating done in the existing parts of the library.

The money only became available to the library two years ago

because, explained Clément, "It took a long time for her (Virgin's) will to be settled because she had a large estate."

WANTED BLEND

The firm of Werleman and Guy provided the plans for the addition. Says Clément, "We wanted something that would blend well with what we had." She added although the new section is not exactly the same as the rest of library, "It has the same atmosphere and the same subtle color."

Planning with the architects began last May and building began in October 1985. It was finally completed in March of this year and a reception was held in May to officially open the addition.

The new wing, like the rest of the library, is painted in muted blue-grey tones and has a large bay window and triangular gable which provide a great deal of light.

Clément says the older members of the library like the addition because it incorporates some of the old features. "It still has old moldings and of course, the same old furniture that was donated to the library," says Clément.

The library has a few old tables



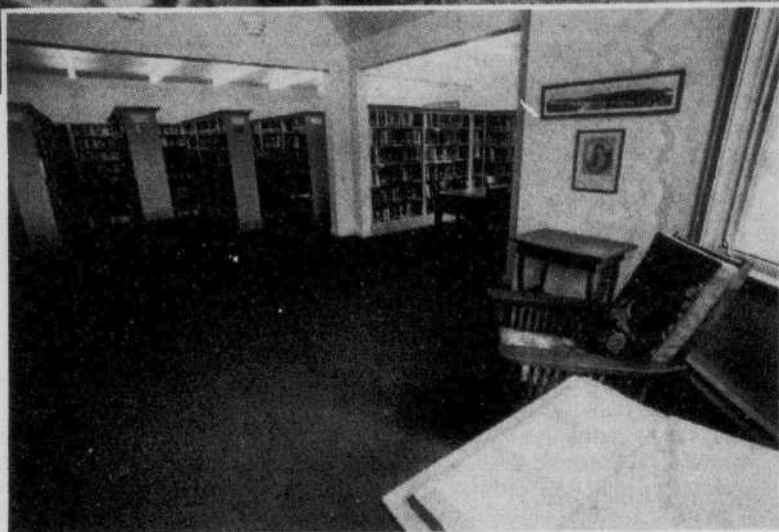
The new wing of the North Hatley Public Library (on the right) was designed to blend in with the old. The design was attractive enough to be mentioned in the Canadian Architect magazine.

and a comfortable chair to sit in which are strategically placed by the light of the bay window. The chair was donated to the library in 1929 and a large table was donated last year.

MAGAZINE MENTIONED

In fact, the design of the wing is so successful and attractive that it has been mentioned in *The Canadian Architect* magazine. The magazine shows a photograph of the model of the library and talks about the shingle-style angular projection. The magazine's picture shows a clock above the front door but Clément says there is no clock in the library because "we ran out of money."

The North Hatley library began in the late 1880s in a room above LeBaron's store. The townspeople eventually decided to expand their tiny library and the Main Street

building was completed in 1904. The building was designed by a Boston architect and a second wing was added as a Centennial project in 1967.

The project was first funded by donations from locals and summer residents. Today, funding comes from membership fees (\$10 per family or individual) and other donations. There are no grants from the either government or from the municipality.

Clément notes most of the members are elderly people. There are also a lot of young members too, she adds, but there aren't many members in the 30-50 age bracket. She says she understands most people in this age bracket work and can't come to the library during the hours it is open, preferring instead to visit libraries in Sherbrooke or at Bishop's University. "We would like them to come here for the best sellers," says Clément.

FOR EVERYONE

Clément believes that many people do not join the library because they think it is only for summer visitors. "We would like it to be a place where villagers stop to read their mail or to look at a magazine," says Clément and adds, "It's not just for visitors, it's for everyone."

The library has many events this summer including an exhibit of works by local wood carver W.H. Cripps Saturday afternoon, July 12. Ron Graham, author of *One-Eyed Kings* will give a reading one day, and there will be a story hour for children every Wednesday

morning. As well, the library buys large print books for elderly readers at the Connaught Home in North Hatley.

The library is open from 10 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Tuesday through Friday and from 10 a.m. to noon on Saturday. On Wednesday evenings, the library is open from 6:30 until 8:30 p.m.

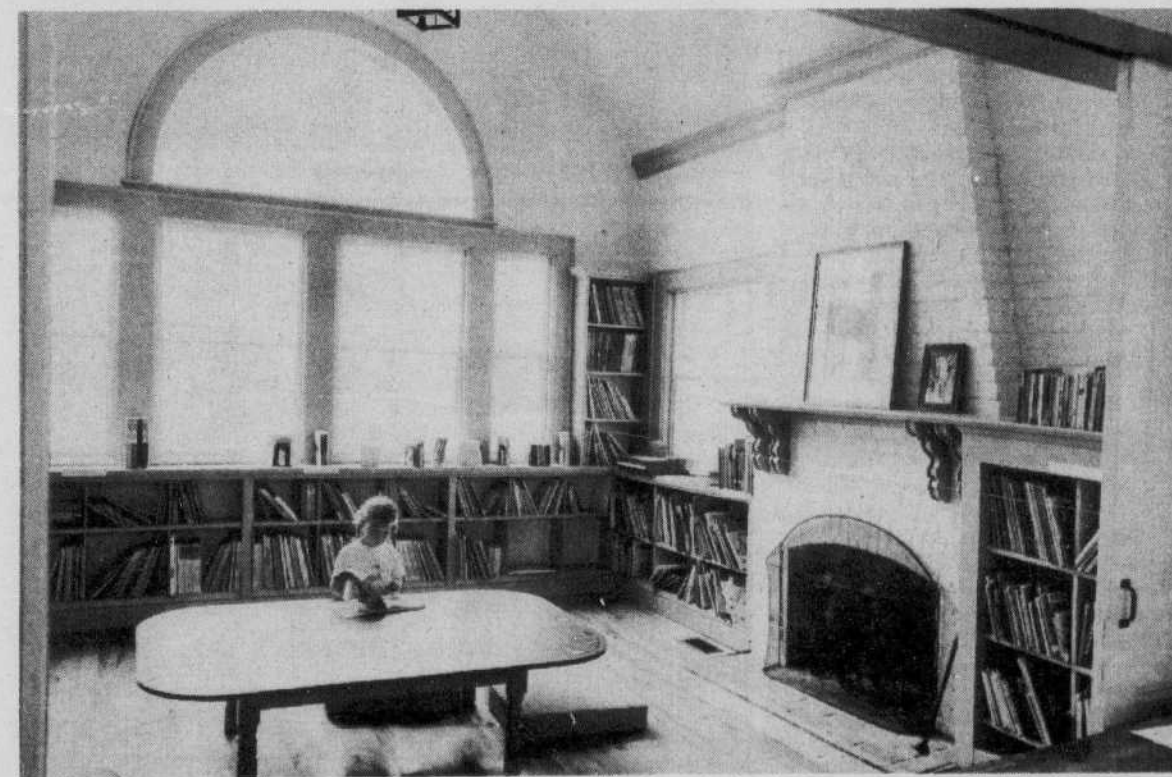
Despite the recent construction, Clément says, "I'm sure in a few years people will pass by here and not realize it was built in stages. They'll think it was always like this."

Richmond museum retains charm of family home

This is the second in a series of articles on Townships museums to be featured in the Record over the summer months.

MELBOURNE — If James Mairs was to walk into the wood-frame house his family owned for 90 years in this town but sold in 1958, he would probably be quite pleased to see what was going on.

Undoubtedly someone would have a fire going in the wood stove in the kitchen. The kettle would be boiling.

A group of people might be enjoying a friendly game of cards or just sitting and chatting.

Upstairs, if it was an exceptionally busy day, some visitors might be pouring through some books or studying a map.

Now if there was some kind person standing there, he might gently tap old Mr. Mairs on the shoulder and fill him in on the changes his homes has seen in the years since he moved along.

For this house, which at different points in time has acted as an inn and a hospital and was an important stop on the stage coach line to Waterloo, today is the Richmond County Historical Society museum.

2000 VISITORS

So even though the stage coach line is a thing of the past and the days when people stopped at Elliott's Tavern for a draft are long gone, the old building is still receiving about 2000 visitors a year.

And as is apparent when you enter, it has retained the charm and friendly ambience of a country home, despite the fact groups of

people converge on it as a tangible link with their past.

Curator Connie Vaitekunas likes to point out that more than just a display of old stuff, the museum is evidence of a day-to-day existence that is far different from life as we now know it.

"What we try and do is keep it as a typical English middle-class family home," says Vaitekunas. "It's not a museum per se, it's supposed to be a home."

That would explain why the society is planning to sell ice cream out the back door this summer, and why the ladies set up tea tables in the kitchen, surrounded by the implements and roughly hewn gadgets their forefathers used when they pioneered life in the county.

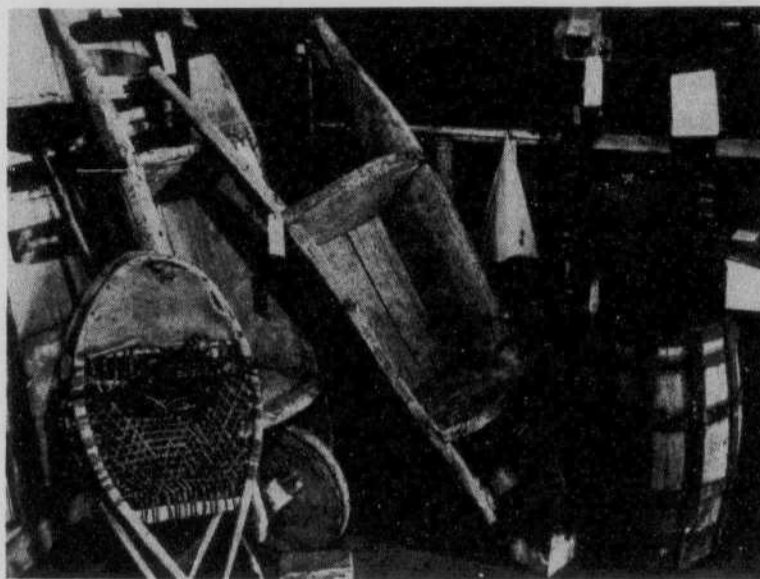
After their refreshments, they might even be tempted to wash the dishes in the kitchen's slate sink, a throwback to the days when a local vein of the stuff was mined and saw many uses.

HELPED CREATE IT

All this makes for a museum that today stands as a dear reminder for many people. And the reason they feel so attached to it is because they all helped create it, over the years donating everything from wedding dresses to school pencil boxes.

The official story of the museum lays intertwined with the past of the historical society itself, created in 1962 as a committee of the Richmond County Women's Institute.

The society's aims, as drawn up with the help of the first president — Alice Dresser — were to discover and rescue from the unsparing

hand of time the records which remain of Canada's history.

The second goal was to preserve documents found in hitherto unexplored areas.

But along the way something happened. At the same time as the local historians were peering into their past, people started giving the society things which they felt should be preserved, including the house itself, sold to the society for \$1 in 1967 by Newlands Cobourn, nephew of artist Frederic Cobourn.

"The museum came along almost accidentally," says Donald Healy, vice-president of the society. "As soon as that (the building) came along people started to donate."

THINGS ARE SAFE

"I guess a lot of people like to have a place where they know things are safe," Esther Healy, Don's wife and archivist, says. "It's a place to see things they'll never see again."

A classic example is the old chain-style scouring pad which hangs over the wrought iron soap dish near the kitchen sink.

"That was a very common thing but you hardly ever see them," says Esther Healy.

On the other hand, the tags which identify where the museum's eclectic collection came from are also an outlet for people who want to give something in memory of others. Sometimes it is an item left in the old family home and the family is planning to move along. The tags are a unique idea as museums go, say the Healys.

The museum does all this on a showstring budget of about \$8,000, \$5,000 of which comes from a provincial government grant. The rest is raised through fundraising events (including this Sunday's sausage-pancake brunch). The money allows the historical society — which has 200 members — to pay for its summer guides and generally keep the place going, say the Healys.

HARD TO FIND

The original collection — and it is packed into three floors — came from the homes of the once large population of old English families which used to pepper the Rich-

for a visit.

The prize piece in the collection has to be the old Upper Melbourne post office interior, moved intact when the original building was closed. The names of the original box owners — still attached — are a remarkable record of the residents of the area.

Richmond's first piano is there. It was donated by Edith McCourt and dates back to 1880.

George Dresser's violin is in the museum. It was donated by his daughter and includes a box which was made by Dresser's brother.

In the small ante room off the kitchen, you can see the fire tongs (called lazy legs) made by a group of Italian railway workers and given to the Mairs. The Italians were working on the Orford Mountain railway but living in the house. The rolling pin they used to make the spaghetti they enjoyed to eat is still in the kitchen. *See next page*

This room's prize possession is its unique stove, designed low to the ground for easy baking and stirring. A blessing, says Vaitekunas, for anyone who had to spend hours at its side. The waffle iron on the stove is a real gem.

The children's room upstairs features a drop side crib and a set of toys donated to the museum by the sad parents of a nine-year-old girl who died of cancer.

There are countless other items in the collection, everything from the old postmaster's desk to a peddle-operated dental drill that no one should have to mess with today. Ask to see the potty with a silencer that sits under one of the museum's beds or the hair wreath in the livingroom.

Together they represent an accurate picture of life in days gone by in Melbourne. But for the specific history of individual families, the museum has a vast store of old records in its archives room, including the ledgers from local stores. Obviously it is not the fact that Henry Jones bought a dozen oranges in 1892 that is important to the history buff but the fact that he was there in 1892 period.

LOOKING FOR CLUES

Some recent snooping into the collection of old family stories and Bibles has been done by people working for mining companies, hoping to find clues of secret family-owned mother lodes which could today be profitable.

The list of achievements at a museum that is run almost entirely by volunteers is long and according to managers is largely due to the community spirit that pervades in the Melbourne area.

"People who come here tell you a lot of stories," says Vaitekunas,

resting her feet for a few moments after taking a reporter through the whole place. "People are interested in their past."

She, for example, learns all kinds of historical tidbits from people who know the town's history

and drop in to either see additions to the collection or refresh their memories of what life for their parents was like.

Often all it takes is a look at an old artifact to jar their memories and the stories start to flow.

Fête National spotlights economy

SHERBROOKE — In between the dancing, drinking and eating, the *Mouvement national des québécois* wants partyers June 24 to stop and think about the provincial economy.

The economy is the theme of this year's *Fête nationale du Québec* — perhaps too serious a subject for those bent on celebrating Quebec's birthday the more traditional boisterous way.

But *Mouvement national* representative Jean-Charles Gagné said Wednesday the economy forms the basis of Quebec's prosperity, and deserves thought. He lamented the province's economic backwardness prior to the 1960s, and praised the Quiet Revolution, which catapulted Quebec out of what Gagné called "a subsistence level economy rather than one of expansion."

MOST GRADUATES

Gagné is happy Quebec has finally come into its own economically, with *caisses populaires*, the Montreal stock exchange and the highest number of graduates in administration in the country. "There is a wave of entrepreneurship," he beamed.

"But much still needs to be done," he warned. The province is too dependent on American trade, and care must be taken with the environment, youths, the elderly and women.

The president of the Townships organizing committee, André Côté, also connected the economy to the festivities.

He said changes had been made in the structure of this year's event. Instead of one huge party, the event has been decentralized. Thirty-seven different parties are planned throughout the Townships.

He said one large festival usually attracted fewer people who were more inclined to drink than celebrate the existence of Quebec. Smaller neighborhood gatherings mean more intimate, focussed partying.

PARTY ROUND-UP

In Ascot Township, the festivities are June 24 in Belvedere Park. In Coaticook, June 24 at the *Foyer Boiscastel*. In Compton, activities will be held from June 21 to June 24 at the *Camping de Compton*.

In East Angus, things will be happening at Nicol Park on June

23; in Eastman, June 24; in Fitch Bay, June 23 and 24; at the Desranleau Park in Fleurimont June 24; the park in Johnville June 21; Camping Chez Ben in Katevale June 23 and 24; on June 23 and 24 in Lake Megantic and June 24 in Marbleton.

In Nantes, the days to watch for are June 23 and 24; June 21 at 805 Deschênes road in St-Denis-de-Brompton; June 23 in Racine; behind the arts centre in Richmond June 24; Mi-Vallon Park in Rock Island June 24; the Saint-Claude ballpark June 23 and 24; Ma Villa Park in Saint-Elie June 22 and 23; June 23 and 24 at the sports centre in Saint-Malo; the ballpark in Saint-Venant June 21 and June 24 in Sawyerville.

There are eight activities planned for Sherbrooke, including: June 23 at Chauveau Park; June 24 at Genest-Delorme Park; June 24 in London Park, the Foyer Saint-Joseph, Place Goupil, D'Youville Hospital, and the hall in Sainte-Famille Church; and on June 23 at the Quatre-Pins Park.

The action in Stanhope is June 23 and 24 at the ballpark, June 23 and 24 in Stoke; and June 22 to 24 in Weedon.

cision they had made.

Turning to each other and, say witnesses, with the devil in their eye, they decided there was only one way to really celebrate their big decision...so they wandered inside for a drink.

Of course that just goes to show, you never know who will drop into this place next.

The museum is open this month on Sundays only. In July and August it is open Wednesday through Sunday from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Everyone is welcome to attend this Sunday's brunch. The griddles will be going from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at St. Andrew's Church across the way. A stamp show opens at the museum at the same time. To get there take Highway 55. It's right off the Melbourne exit.

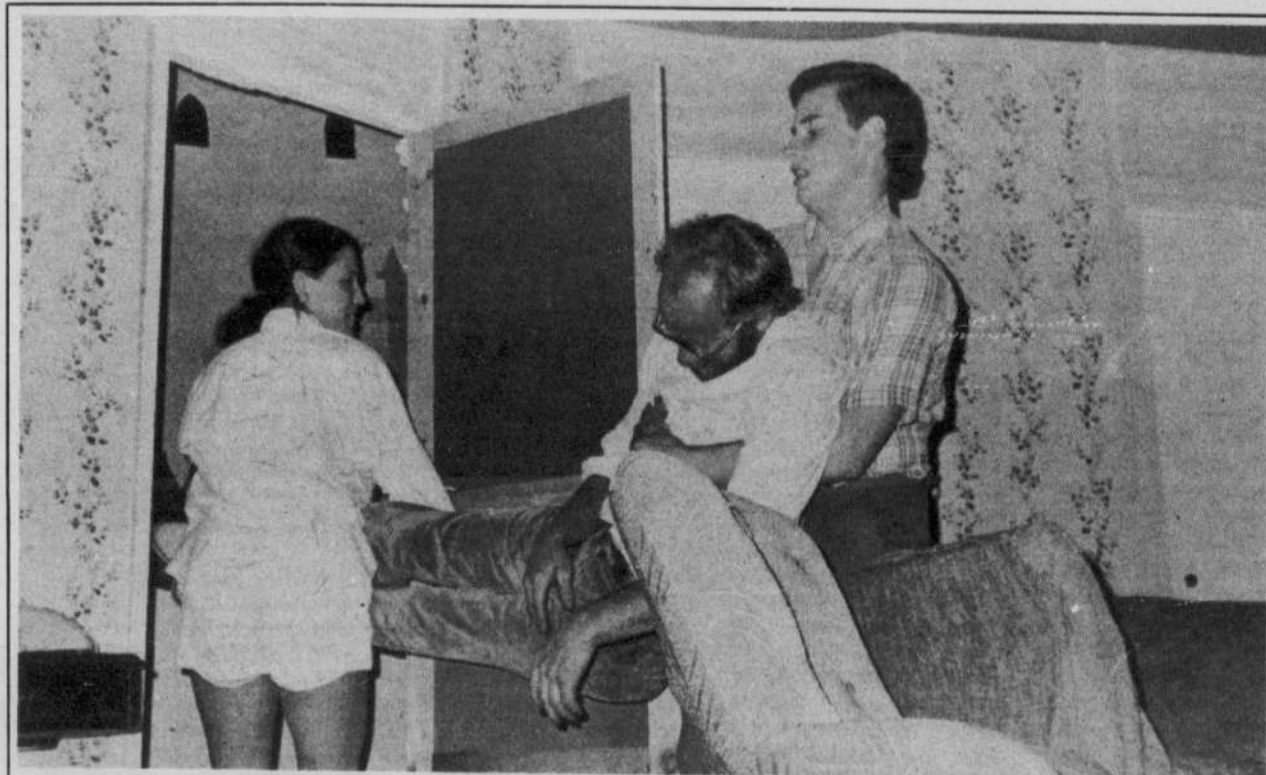

Naturally there's an ice-cold, Germanic-featured reigning king of the air to be dethroned, and an award and a girl to be won, not to mention the expendable nice guy and good buddy who has to meet an untimely end. Scenes wherein these plots develop serve to splice together air battle sequences that, admittedly, draw the viewers to the edges of their seats, but then go on so long that by the end you've thoroughly memorized the theatre's wallpaper and light fixtures.

I suspect we're supposed to see something lovable under the surface of this unjustly maligned scrapper, but he comes across as an egotistical jerk throughout most of the movie. And some of the lines in this movie... well, let's just say the dialogue was not a strong point either.

Now that I've enticed you into seeing this winner, it's playing for the next week at the **Merrill's Showplace Cinemas** in Newport Vt., nightly at 7:10 and 9:15, with bargain matinees Saturday and Sunday at 1:55.

Also playing at **Merrill's** for the next week is **Short Circuit**, a delightful fantasy about a tank-destroying robot who becomes a living being full of child-like wonderment when struck by lightning. There are lots of laughs here, as well as some good action scenes, as the two people who believe in the miracle try to save the robot (No. 2) from the military types who think he's just a dangerous machine gone haywire. There are definite echoes of **ET**, but enough originality to let the movie stand on its own as a good evening's entertainment. It shows nightly at 7 p.m. with matinees Saturday and Sunday at 1:45.

Cobra, starring **Sylvester Stallone** as a crusading cop out to eliminate the bad guys, also shows at **Merrill's** at 8:50 nightly. There's a fourth movie there too, but information about that wasn't available in time for my deadline. You'll have to give them a call at (802) 334-6830.

The one English film at the **Cinemas du Carrefour** in Sherbrooke this week is **9½ Weeks**. **Mickey Rourke** and **Kim Basinger** star as lovers whose passion for each other goes beyond a desire to enjoy, becoming a desire to possess, manipulate and ultimately control. This shows at 7:10 and 9:30 Friday and Saturday, and at 1:40, 2:50, 5, 7:10 and 9:30 Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

Over at the **Capitol**, **Robert Redford** plays a lawyer with problems, including threats on his life, in **Legal Eagles**. **Darryl Hannah** and **Debra Winger** co-star. This comedy, from the director of **Ghostbusters**, shows nightly at 7 and 9 p.m. There's a special admission price of \$2 Wednesdays.

At Cowansville's **Cinema Princess**, **To Live and Die in L.A.** shows nightly at 7:15 and **Poltergeist II** follows at 9 p.m.

The **Maison du Cinéma** in downtown Sherbrooke has **The Glen Miller Story**, in English, tonight through Monday night at 7 p.m. This is, of course, a portrait of the great jazz musician who revolutionized popular music in the 1930s.

New Brunswick: a world of vacations

It's a funny thing about travellers. You'll notice them standing in a particularly lovely spot somewhere thousands of miles from where they live and they'll be saying, "Doesn't this remind you of home?"

I've done it myself. There I'll be, heading through the piney woods that lead to the Grand Canyon in Arizona and I'll say, pleased as punch, "This really could be New Brunswick."

Or we'll be parked at a scenic lookout above the Rhine Valley and we'll agree that, "If you took away the castles and replaced them with farms, it would look like the St. John River Valley."

In Italy last summer as we drove through the golden grain fields of Tuscany, we were delighted that the countryside so strongly resembled the area around Norton and Hampton in New Brunswick.

Occasionally you even wonder why you're come so far to appreciate the beauty of your own province.

Of course, there are advantages to travelling in other countries. It brings one a broader perspective and an understanding and respect for other people, their customs and way of life.

EXPLORE HOME

But sometimes, instead of spending a fortune on hours of tedious air travel to unfamiliar places, it's

enjoyable to explore your own territory. It's not unusual to find that some of the loveliest of Elysian fields are the green, green grasses of home.

The advantages of vacationing close to home are numerous. A major incentive is money. There's no need to change your carefully hoarded vacation fund into francs, pounds or U.S. dollars with the accompanying discouragement of seeing it dwindle to less than one-third before you've even left the bank.

There's something to be said too, for being able to hop into your own vehicle to drive leisurely to the destination of your choice — master of your own fate.

Although a few hour's motoring either north or south can take us to areas where cultures and languages are intriguingly different, there is the security of knowing that your bank, your family, even your own doctor are still within reasonable reach.

LESS THAN A DAY

Travellers abroad often like to mention the fact that in some sections of Europe, you can drive through parts of three countries in a few hours. In New Brunswick we have something of the same situation. As an example we can go from Loyalist to Acadian coast with a sidetrip into a centuries-old Danish community in less than a day.

There's no need to fly to foreign lands for variety. On any morning

you could be sitting on a sunny wharf, surrounded by lobster traps, listening to raucous gulls and watching fishermen setting out in their sturdy little craft.

In the afternoon you might be in a canoe, gliding down a jade green river, deep in the heavy forests of the Tobique.

One evening you could be enjoying a sophisticated menu in a gourmet restaurant in a busy city. The next night may find you feasting on fresh-caught fish in a quiet, 100-year-old hotel on a remote island that is a two-hour ferry trip from the mainland.

In a matter of hours you can be transferred from the dignified atmosphere of historical Kings Landing to the unrestrained exuberance of the hydroplane races at Cocagne.

LOOK FOR EXOTIC

The reasons for travel are many. Foremost among them are sightseeing, adventure, education, relaxation, shopping or simply visiting relatives or friends. Sometimes we're looking for the exotic. Travel in New Brunswick comes under all these categories although, like the old saying that a hero is unsung in his home town, many of us often ignore or downplay that which is at our own front door.

Take sightseeing, for instance. We have one of the loveliest waterfalls of North America at Grand Falls. Its magnificent cascade has cut a gorge nearly as deep as that of Niagara and a misty walk around its perimeter is a scenic adventure.

Although New Brunswickers take for granted the 40-foot tides whose effects are seen in high Fundy wharves, the rapid surge of water into the Petitcodiac and huge sea-carved rocks at Hopewell Cape, they are phenomena with a unique attraction to visitors from the west coast of Europe where tides rise by only about eight inches.

As for adventure, there are few experiences in Canada quite so exotic as the sight of six to eight giant Right whales diving and cavorting beside your boat off Grand Manan Island. When one of these creatures, as big as five elephants, surfaces beside you long enough to give you an eyeball to eyeball stare before favoring you with a spray

from his blow-hole, you have a travel story which will hold your grandchildren wide-eyed in years to come.

NATIONAL TREASURE

If the Old Market in Saint John were located in Alberta or California, it would be classed as a national treasure. So would Fredericton's Government House, the Audubon books and a 1783 edition of the Domesday Book in the Legislative Library. But hundreds of New Brunswick natives have never taken a peek. If these items were on display in a far-away place it would be part of a Maritimer's tra-

vel itinerary to see them.

The Beaverbrook Art Gallery is classed as a "gem" by tourist guide books and tour companies from out of the province. Foreign visitors who come to the capital city make it a top priority. Many residents have never walked up its steps. If it were located in Europe, its collections including Dali's Santiago el Grande would be a "must see" item on any traveller's list.

For true relaxation there's no beating the escapism of the Fundy Isles or the clear air and summer sands of Kouchibouguac and Shediac.

Lake Memphremagog serpent sightings

On September 3, 1985, *Le Journal de Montréal* published an item which prompted me to write this article. It stated that "Nessie the Loch Ness Monster is more popular than the UFO phenomena".

I have been in correspondance for a few years with Joseph W. Zarzinski, Honorary dracontologist of *la Société de Dracontologie du Lac Memphremagog*. He wrote a book entitled *Champ beyond the Legend* in which he reports 224 sightings of unusual animals, especially one commonly known as "Champ" in lake Champlain beginning with Samuel de Champlain the first one to report a sighting in July 1609. The debate goes on...

When I started studying the history of "Beautiful Waters" I immediately was involved with some legends about a sea serpent in our lake and up to this day I have 37 sightings registred either by history, writings, tapes, notes etc....

The first one recorded not counting the Indian legends is dated Jan. 7, 1847 in the *Stanstead Journal*.

Fortunately I found a new source this week from Ralph Merry's IVth Journal. On Sept. 17, 1854 he wrote about some troubling facts:

"Put up at night with brother Henry Wadleigh he told me the following as near as memory serves me. Within a few years he saw one of the great serpents of Magog opposite his farm and Wadleigh, being on high land, and the sun shining, he had a good opportunity to view him.

"The serpent appeared to be about 30 rods from the west shore (it is said that when one is seen a great part of the tail end is under water). What he saw of the forward part was a long as a skiff and as large as a good sized mill log. His head was large enough to take in a man and he held it out of water about 2 feet. The wind blew down the lake and he saw it swimming in an indirect course towards the easterly shore (that is it swam somewhat north-easterly) it went as swiftly as men would row a skiff and seemed but a few minutes in crossing nearly to the east side. When it arrived there it dropped its head and immediately disappeared.

"Wadleigh is a man on whom I can rely. I have not the least reason to doubt his having seen the monster. Elder Rider and his son saw one and thought it was a mill log at first till they saw it move. They had a plain view of the animal and its motion.

"Steward Channel and his wife and Uriah Jewett all saw one of them at once at Georgeville. It is said that some have seen about 25 or 30 feet of one above water and the neck bowed and the head and neck looked like a horse. Benjamin Merry and his wife before they were married were crossing the lake and near the northend saw a huge monster of the serpent type on a fair day 50 rods from the west shore. The water perhaps 10 feet deep at one end partly out of water and the body slanted towards the bottom of the lake. It had 12 or 15 pair of legs about a foot apart the legs were the size of a boy's arms 12 years old and a foot long the feet were as large as a boys hands 14 years old with the fingers cut off at the knuckles and the claws were spread apart. He saw 15 feet of its length but did not see the whole. The body was two thirds as large as a man and the color of a white sheep's skin with the wool off they were within a rod of it and both young had good eyesight and a fair view of it and the lake was calm and the weather fair. She was frightened he set her on shore and returned with two men to find it made considerable search for a considerable time but did not see it again.

"I heard them tell the story at that time and now he tells me the same. They saw the above about 38 years ago, about 54 years since soon after he came to Canada. I heard it said that indians would not go into this lake because they said there were great serpents or alligators in it."

That is 6 sightings by eight different persons — not bad. In his account Merry speaks of Uriah Jewett, the same gentlemen of whom a book was written in 1917 in Newport: *Uriah Jewett and the Sea Serpent of Lake Memphremagog*.

Play takes comic look at lottery craze

DEAUVILLE — The *Théâtre Entre Chien et Loup* continues its celebration of Townships dramatic talent in its sixth summer season, starting with a humorous look at lottery mania.

Loto-Clip, opening June 25 at the *Théâtre Thé des Bois* in Deauville, tells of a young man who gets lucky on his first purchase of a lottery ticket, becoming one of three people to compete for \$1 million in a televised gala.

In the scene performed Tuesday, Pierre (Denys Caron) is persuaded to spend his last \$2 on a ticket, which Wilbrod claims 'smells' like a winning ticket.

Loto-Clip also stars Martine Dostie, Jacques Routhier and Andrée Soucy.

The play also uses, and makes fun of, the style of American B-movies, which "don't trouble themselves with nuances", presenting clearly defined good and evil cha-

racters, uninvolved plot and the inevitable happy ending.
