A Legacy Project Steeped in History Yet Focused on the Future

On June 28, 2017, the Côte-des-Neiges-Notre-Dame-de-Grâce Borough inaugurated its legacy project marking Montréal's 375th anniversary.

Dubbed *Les Racines de l'Avenir (Roots of the Future)*, the legacy project was developed in parc de Kent and parc de Notre-Dame-de-Grâce, located, respectively, in the borough's two founding villages.

Each park thus features a public area that will serve as a hub for festive activities, to the great pleasure of the community.

And while each is different in its own way, the two places share an affinity in terms of design, which recalls the ties that bind them to their respective areas as well as the theme from which designers drew inspiration: *building bridges* (between the two founding neighbourhoods).

This legacy project is made up of sustainable structures that foreshadow the future. From this perspective, the plan calls for one tree to be planted annually at each site, right up until Montréal celebrates its 400th anniversary in 2042.

Trees represent the establishment of roots, the passage of time, the act of bearing witness to the past, and the potential for growth reflected in the name of the legacy project: *Les Racines de l'Avenir* (Roots of the Future).

Built at a cost of \$1 million, each of these places drew from the creative vision of students at Université de Montréal and Concordia University.

Greenhouses in the Heart of the Borough

In keeping with the Un arrondissement en santé policy promoted by elected officials, CDN-NDG, for the third straight year, is supporting the Conserre project meant to call attention to the benefits of urban agriculture and healthy nutrition.

Two large metal containers will double as agricultural greenhouses for as long as weather conditions remain favourable.

Located close to the Walkley Community Centre in NDG and parc de Kent in CDN, the garden containers will allow people to collect fresh produce until the end of October.

The NDG gardens are maintained by Ça pousse, a social economy program put forward by the NDG Food Depot to help people carry out independent urban agriculture projects. In CDN, the Société environnementale de Côte-des-Neiges is overseeing the proper growth of the vegetable plants.

New this year: The 10 or so young people from the Walkley Community Centre who took part in various stages of the project will reap the fruits of their labour come harvest time.

The produce will also be distributed to low-income households through the NDG Food Depot, which coordinates a variety of related activities.

Dear citizens,

The school year is fast approaching after an especially lively summer chock full of activities marking Montréal's 375th anniversary.

Since the start of the year, our teams have made a sustained effort to improve the road network and present unifying activities.

Our priority is to constantly improve your living conditions. We continue to be attentive to your needs, therefore, in our quest to build a healthy borough, and the work achieved in recent months has begun to bear fruit, we're happy to report.

I am pleased to inform you that the Table ronde sur la lutte contre la pauvreté (Anti-Poverty Roundtable), formed last year, has tabled its first report. The report presents an overview of the prevailing socioeconomic conditions in CDN-NDG and details the work undertaken by its members to identify factors and establish priorities. As well, an exploratory committee was established to help anti-poverty organizations find a site where they can work jointly and continue to serve the community.

Building a healthy borough also means fostering greater environmental awareness and strengthening our democratic system, with a special emphasis on our youngest citizens. The food waste collection will continue, therefore, and we've also renewed the Conserre project meant to promote awareness of urban agriculture among residents of all ages. In an effort to listen more closely to the new generation of youth, the Borough will form a youth council in the coming weeks. Its goal will be to promote engagement and civic participation among our youth, but also to encourage them to communicate their needs to elected officials.

Lastly, given that the promotion of physical activity is among the cornerstones of our Pour un arrondissement en santé policy, this newsletter features a complete list of the sports and recreation activities offered in 2017-2018.

We pledge to continue working shoulder to shoulder with you in a bid to build an ever stronger and thriving borough.

Collections

Green waste collection

The green waste collection will resume every Wednesday from September 27 to November 29, 2017.

Put your green waste in paper bags or rigid reusable containers. Place the bags or containers on the curb (as you would household waste) between 8 p.m. the day before and 7 a.m. the day of the collection.

Green waste can also be brought to the Côte-des-Neiges ecocentre at any time (6925 chemin de la Côte-des-Neiges). For details on materials that are accepted and refused, go to ville.montreal.qc.ca/cdn-ndg and click on **Collections and recycling** under the tab marked **Services for residents**.

ATTENTION

Deciduous tree branches are not included in the green waste collection, as they are subject to a special collection. Contact 311 to have them picked up.

Regular collections on statutory holidays

Collections of household waste, heavy objects, and recyclable materials will be carried out according to the regular schedule on the following statutory holidays: Labour Day (September 4) and Thanksgiving (October 9).

Free distribution of compost and wood chips

Place: Parc Notre-Dame-de-Grâce (near the chalet, on the avenue Marciil side) and parc Jean-Brillant (near the chalet, close to the corner of rue Jean-Brillant and avenue Decelles)

Date: Saturday, October 7

Time: 10 a.m. to noon

First come, first served! Proof of residence is required. Don't forget to bring your own containers.

A More Welcoming Avenue for Pedestrians

Over the past several weeks, the layout and appearance of the avenue have been improved in a number of ways, between boulevard Édouard-Montpetit and Université de Montréal (UdeM).

The changes, the fruit of co-operation between the CDN-NDG borough, the Environmental Design Faculty of the UdeM and HEC Montréal, are intended to promote the benefits of urban agriculture and student and citizen initiatives.

The team in charge of the initiative painstakingly analyzed the avenue and found that it was actually used more by pedestrians than automobiles. So to better adapt it to foot traffic, the pedestrian zone has been widened by converting one of the lanes previously given over to cars.

The street furniture was designed to measure by students from the UdeM Faculty of Environmental Design and manufactured by Les Ateliers d'Antoine, a social integration business that trains young people in woodworking trades.

To make things safer for pedestrians, fluorescent bollards have been installed along the avenue to clearly define the spaces for automobile and foot traffic.

The project is sure to meet with approval from the many people using the widened pedestrian zone of the avenue, recognized as one of the busiest spots in Montréal. This is part of the city's program to create pedestrian and shared streets.

For a Fairer Borough

At its meeting in May, the Côte-des-Neiges-Notre-Dame-de-Grâce Borough Council officially endorsed the steps taken by the city of Montréal to be recognized as a "Fair Trade Town."

The city's application to obtain this designation is currently being studied by Fairtrade Canada, a Canadian organization that promotes the world's largest fair-trade system.

Elected officials in CDN-NDG are committed to the principles of equity, socially responsible purchasing and sustainable development promoted by the fair-trade movement, and want to see these values applied throughout the borough.

The Borough Council has stated that it intends to instruct borough departments to develop a local fair-trade purchasing policy, in particular by selling certified fair-trade products, once Montréal has been designated a "Fair Trade Town."

It is also prepared to support communities and institutions in launching local initiatives for this purpose, and to encourage the collective commitment by local partners, community organizations and political stakeholders, to develop fair trade.

Remember that this type of trade is an acknowledged means of reducing poverty among producers and their socio-economic inequality, and of ensuring better working conditions in developing countries.

The Placette Côte-des-Neiges Marks Its Second Year

Successful pilot project

From July to September 2016, some 96,000 pedestrians crossed the site. Close to 95% of users said they were satisfied or very satisfied with the project.

The Placette Côte-des-Neiges was inaugurated on June 19, 2017. The new pedestrian space borders chemin de la Côte-des-Neiges between chemin Queen-Mary and rue du Frère-André.

The site commands an impressive view of Saint-Joseph's Oratory and Mount Royal, and it lies in a well-shaded and quiet space where citizens can unwind, far from the pedestrian hustle and bustle and car traffic.

The Placette CDN features an information booth, tables, rocking chairs, flower terraces, lower terraces at store level, and stands that also serve as a show stage. The Placette CDN is accessible to persons with reduced mobility.

Thanks to its information booth, the Placette CDN also helps promote local businesses by providing information about nearby stores to citizens and the scores of tourists who flock to Saint Joseph's Oratory.

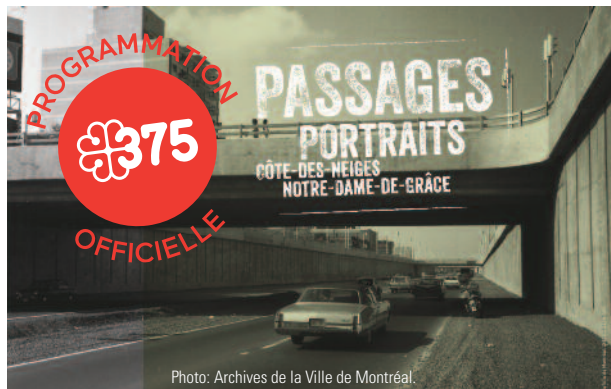

The *Mayor's Report*, which presents an overview of the previous year's financial statements, was tabled at the borough council meeting in August.

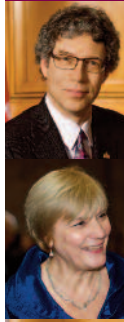
The borough's 2016 report presents its operating budget for ongoing operations (e.g., snow removal, household waste collection, sports and recreation activities) as well as its budget for one-time investments – the Three-Year Capital Works Program (PTI) – in road and water supply system repairs, park redevelopments, and so forth.

The report details the sums invested and major projects completed, and it also includes a link that lets users view the list of contracts for more than \$25,000 awarded in 2016.

Marking for Safety

Vehicles and pedestrians can sometimes take each other by surprise as they make their way through the city.

Just an instant's distraction, no matter how brief, can cause an accident. It's essential to remain alert at all times to avoid a tragedy.

With that in mind, the borough has marked pictograms on the sidewalk next to a lane on the east side of boulevard Décarie, near chemin Queen-Mary, to warn pedestrians to watch for vehicles entering and leaving.

The marking is clearly visible for the hundreds of pedestrians crossing the lane every day, and will make this busy spot safer for everyone.

If this preventive measure proves to have a positive effect on pedestrians' behaviour, the borough plans to add sidewalk markings at nearby lanes where there are similar risks.

Elected Officials Listening to Young People in CDN-NDG

The borough intends to create a youth council by the end of 2017, patterned on the one established by the city of Montréal. Our elected officials feel that this kind of council is essential, since 30% of the borough's population is under age 25.

The council members will serve as the voice for young CDN-NDG residents in dealings with the borough's elected officials. They will define local youth priorities and advise elected representatives on certain issues.

The council will also be responsible for encouraging young people to get involved, by explaining the workings of municipal government and how they can influence it as citizens.

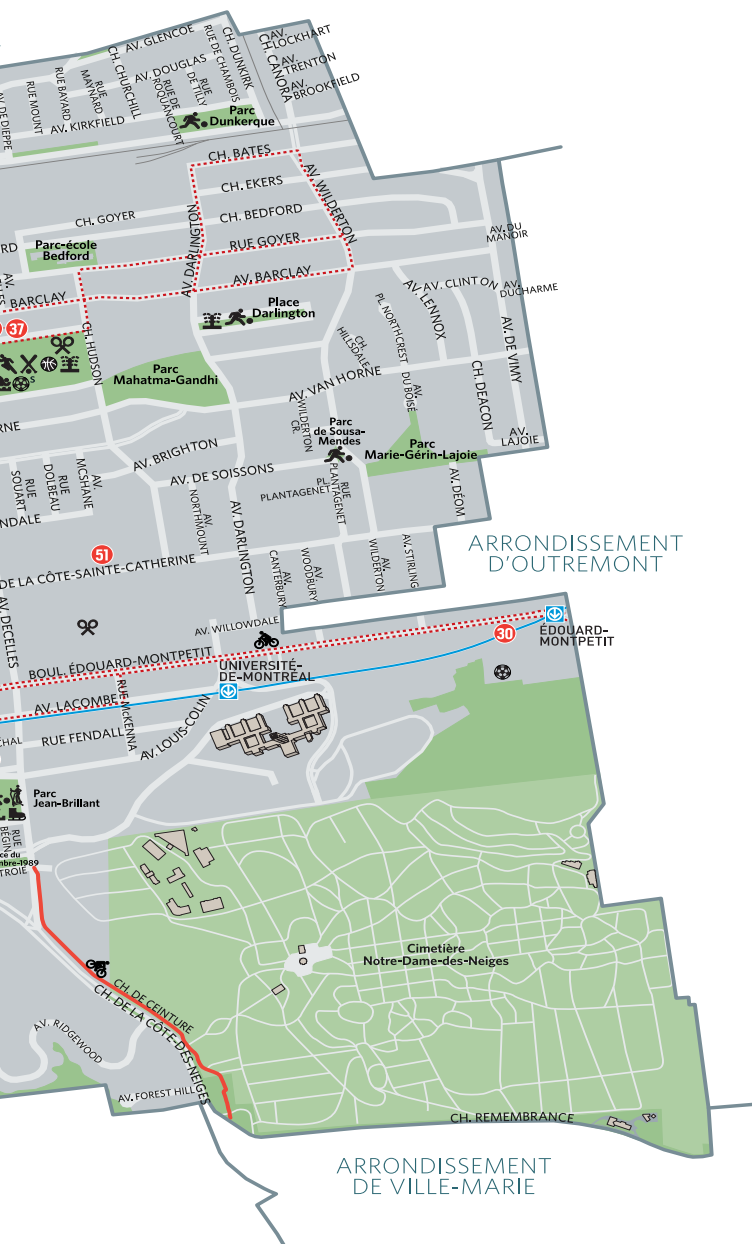
