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ABOUT THE NATIONAL COLLABORATING CENTRE FOR HEALTHY PUBLIC POLICY

The National Collaborating Centre for Healthy Public Policy (NCCHPP) seeks to increase the expertise of public health actors across Canada in healthy public policy through the development, sharing and use of knowledge. The NCCHPP is one of six Centres financed by the Public Health Agency of Canada. The six Centres form a network across Canada, each hosted by a different institution and each focusing on a specific topic linked to public health. In addition to the Centres' individual contributions, the network of Collaborating Centres provides focal points for the exchange and common production of knowledge relating to these topics.

FOREWORD

The National Collaborating Centre for Healthy Public Policy (NCCHPP) seeks to support the efforts of the Canadian public health community and its partners in promoting healthy public policy through more informed strategies. Among other things, the Centre focuses on Health Impact Assessment (HIA), a tool that helps shed light on decision making related to the development of policies, programs or projects that could have effects on the population's overall health.

There are many HIA guides and tools. The NCCHPP identified them from the main Internet sites on the subject during the spring of 2008. The instruments are divided into three groups corresponding to the three following sections:

- general guides and orientation documents;
- applied guides and tools (particular activity sectors or themes);
- general tools.

Each guide and tool has specific characteristics. It is therefore up to users, whether they are decision makers, policy analysts, public health actors, or community groups interested in HIA, to choose which ones best suit their needs.

General Guides

To help users make an informed choice, the Centre draws their attention to the following guides:

HIA Step by Step

Health Impact Assessment: A Practical Guide (Australia, 2007)

A structured and substantial guide covering both the practical aspects of HIA and the concepts and theories that go along with them. The material is supported by examples drawn from HIA experiences.

HIA at the Local Level

Health Impact Assessment Toolkit for Cities: Vision to Action (Europe, 2005)

A guide that presents the broad lines of HIA and a way to introduce it at the local level, without being linked to a specific national context.

HIA at the Strategic Level

A Guide to Health Impact Assessment: A Policy Tool for New Zealand, 2nd ed. (New Zealand, 2005)

A complete guide offering a variety of tools that can be applied at the government level. The tools were developed from two case studies and reviewed based on users' comments.

Applied Guides

Certain guides and tools were developed based on a particular theme (e.g., equality, mental health), by applying to a precise activity sector (e.g., housing) or by targeting a specific population (e.g., Aboriginal). The Centre draws the attention of users to the following guide:

Community Development

PATHways II: The Next Steps – A Guide to Community Health Impact Assessment (Canada, 2002)

A guide offering a participative approach to HIA at the community level.

Finally, even though they often touch on health or certain determinants of health, a number of guides and tools were not listed because they were more about other types of impact assessment (e.g., social impact assessment). However, these approaches are still valuable and may be relevant for actors who are interested in health.

Reading the Charts

Language: French (FR) or English (EN)

Classification of guides on a scale ranging from no information (--) to very rich in information (+++). For more detail, see the classification system in the appendix.

Clarification about the guide, its purpose, target audience and the context of the guide, as well as emphasis on certain themes (e.g. participation).

Statement of the principal characteristics and basic notions of HIA.

+	Clearly presents at least one of the following elements: • Definition of HIA or at least one related notion (e.g., health; determinants of health; impact on health); <u>OR</u> • Objectives pursued with HIA (e.g., goals, objectives, justifications, advantages).
++	Includes at least one of the elements identified in the + category, along with: • Other elements related to the basic notions described in summary form (e.g., basic principles and values associated with HIA [e.g., democracy, equity, transparency, ethical use of data], the place of HIA in relation to other types of impact assessment).
+++	Includes the elements identified in the + and ++ categories, but in a detailed manner.

Procedures and Methods

Description of the steps involved, the means to use and the methods to follow in the realization of an HIA.

--	No elements about procedures or methods.
+	Summary, with or without diagrams, of the steps involved – i.e. the steps are named and very briefly described; there is no major discussion about methodological or practical aspects.
++	Detailed description, with or without diagrams, of the steps involved – i.e., the steps are named and described (e.g., the people who should be solicited to participate and the roles of each; the order of the steps and when to take them; ways of doing things), but there is no major discussion about methodological or practical aspects.
+++	Very detailed description, concrete, and with diagrams, of the steps involved – i.e., the steps are named and described in a more detailed manner than in category ++, notably in the treatment of methodological or practical aspects (e.g., types of data to use; consideration of constraints in terms of available resources; cost of the HIA).

Tools

All work instruments proposed to facilitate the realization of the steps of an HIA (e.g., screening grid).

++	Three or four (3-4) tools are suggested.
+++	Five or more tools (≥ 5) are suggested.

Resources

The body of collected documents or Internet sites referenced that can shed light on HIA or facilitate it being put into practice¹.

+	From one to five (1-5) resources are suggested in relation to HIA.
++	From six to ten (6-10) resources are suggested in relation to HIA.
+++	More than ten (> 10) resources are suggested in relation to HIA.

Characteristics and Distinctive Features

Characteristics of the guide, particularly in terms of its purpose, target clientele, context and specific content elements (other impact assessments, participation, Aboriginal).

¹ The resources suggested must be specific to HIA. For example, legislative documents used to put information into context and resources used for developing a population's profile (e.g., national statistics) are not included in this classification.

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
