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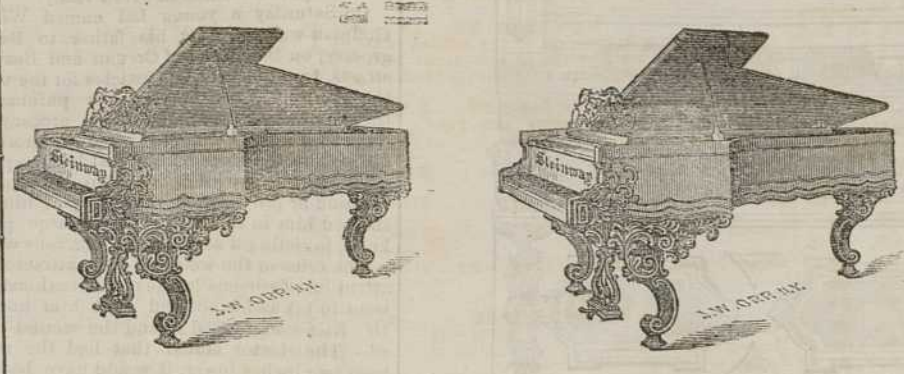
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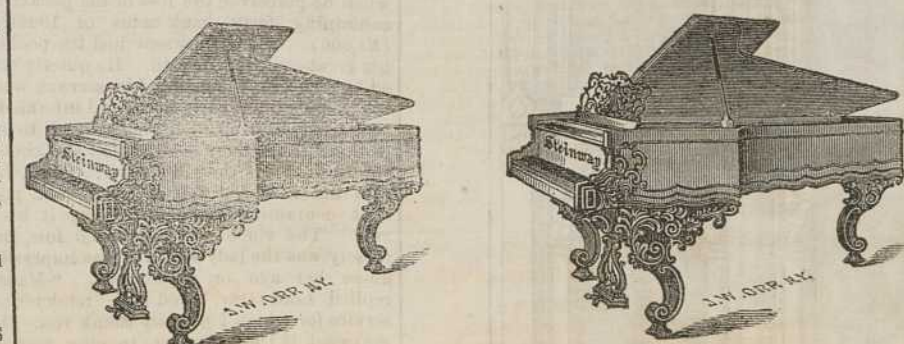

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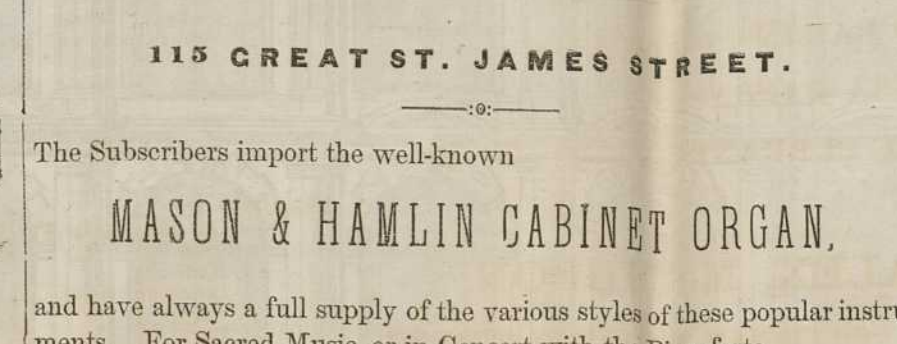

ST. FRANÇOIS XAVIER STREET.

Our engraving represents a view of the new edifice now in course of completion by the North British and Mercantile Insurance Company. This building, of which almost the entire ground floor will be occupied by the Company's offices, is situated at the corner of St. François Xavier and Hospital streets. It has a frontage of 45 ft. 6 in. on the former and 114 ft. 6 in. on the latter street. The piece of ground on which it is erected is of a very peculiar form, being wedge shaped, having what would have been an exceedingly acute angle at the junction of the two streets had it not been decided to cut off the apex, making a splay, which has been taken advantage of to form the principal entrance to the Insurance Office, thus doing away with a very objectionable feature in the site. In addition to this peculiarity, the ground tapers away from 45 ft. 6 in. on St. François Xavier street to a width of not more than 23 ft. in rear, increasing the difficulty of laying out the ground to advantage. All these, however, have been judiciously overcome in the building itself. The architectural design of the building is sufficiently explained by a glance at our illustration. Upon a handsome moulded and rusticated limestone basecourse, of about 6 ft. in height, the superstructure is executed in the finest quality of Ohio sandstone from this level to the top of the cornice. The whole of the carved enrichments and foliage over doors and windows, over the piers between the latter and in the cornice, frieze, etc., are in elegant good taste, and the execution in the best style. The roof is of that form, borrowed from the Louvre in Paris, which has lately come into vogue for many two-story public buildings, and which presents some important practical advantages. The roof itself is covered with the best galvanized iron tiles. It will be surmounted with an ornamental iron railing, with balustrade at the angles. The height of the building from the footwalk to the top of the cornice is 53 ft. 6 in., and the total to the flat portion of the roof is 60 ft. The main entrance, as we have before remarked, is at the corner of the two streets, giving access to the Company's general offices, board room, &c.; they can likewise be entered from the doorway on Hospital street, opposite the Exchange Court. From this latter entrance a handsome staircase leads to the different suites of offices on the several floors. The latter, as well as the ground floor offices, have fire-proof safes of the best construction, and are provided with wash-basins, gas and other conveniences. In the basement are the fuel and furnace rooms, keepers' apartments, etc. The whole of the site is enclosed by a wall, topped by a handsome iron railing, with stone pillars, and three gates. On the pillars on each side of the outer gate the arms of the flag and the coat of arms of the company are carved. The gates are well carved. The gates are well carved. The gates are well carved.

ST. JEAN BAPTISTE STREET.

An elegant store, of stone, four stories high, for Mr. V. Hidon.

JACQUES-CARTIER SQUARE.

Mr. S. Giraldi has just completed, on this fine growing square, two plain, neat, story cut stone stores, each about 27 ft. by 30 ft. These stores, from their size and the advantage of good cellar, and rear entrances, will attract public notice, and will have the effect of retaining trade in this locality. The proprietor deserves credit for his enterprise, these being the largest stores on the square. The cost will be about \$12,000. Contractors: Laberge & Bertrand, brick work; Lamoureux & Barnet, plastering; Mr. Moss, painting and R. Paton, plumbing. Mr. H. M. Perreault, Architect.

Mr. C. S. Chénier has removed three un-

likely wooden sheds from the corner of Jacques-Cartier Square and St. Amable street, and erected in place a neat 2 story building, with cut stone front and brick and stone front on St. Amable street. The building is divided into four small shops, each required in this locality. The cost will be about \$2,000. Contractors: Laberge & Bertrand. Mr. H. M. Perreault, Architect.

The Recorder's Court and Police Station, on Jacques-Cartier Square, have been enlarged, ventilated, and improved, under the direction of Mr. John James Browne, Architect.

Two houses in this street have been erected for Mr. Wm. Wilson, 50 ft. front by 32 ft. in depth. They are 2 stories high, basement and attic, built of brick, with elaborate limestone dressing to the doors and windows. They are fitted up with all modern improvements. In the rear is built a coach-house and stabling, with fine cellar underneath. Mr. Jas. Garven, Architect.

UNION AVENUE.

Mr. J. H. Joseph has erected three neat two-story brick houses on Union Avenue, fitted up with all the modern improvements. Mr. M. Laurent, Architect.

Mr. Ferdinand David has erected a neat terrace of six substantial dwelling houses on Union Avenue, each 22 ft. front by 28 ft. deep, 2 story cut stone, exclusive of basement and attic, and completed with all modern improvements. Mr. M. Laurent, Architect.

PHILIPS' SQUARE.

On this square a very substantial and neatly designed cut stone building has been erected for Mr. Alexander Henderson, for the purpose of his photographic establishment and residence. The frontage on the square is 30 ft. 6 in., and the depth of the main building is 40 ft. 6 in. The building is two stories in height, and 17 ft. by 50 ft. contains the studio, operating, printing, and other rooms connected with the photographic department. This portion of the building has been arranged with the strictest attention to the requirements of a first class establishment of this kind. The residence occupies the two upper and basement of the main building. Mr. Hopkins, Architect.

MUSKOGEE STREET.

Mr. François Desautels is erecting a terrace of three brick houses on Muskogee street, two stories high, with good basement and attic, fitted up as complete tenements, with all the modern improvements usual in such buildings. The whole under the design and superintendence of Michel Laurent, Architect.

SHERRIDGE STREET.

Owing to the result of Sherbrooke street the wooden fence in front of Fairmount Villa, the residence of Mr. S. C. Bagge, has been replaced by a handsome iron railing, with stone pillars, and three gates. On the pillars on each side of the outer gate the arms of the flag and the coat of arms of the company are carved. The gates are well carved. The gates are well carved.

ST. ANTOINE STREET.

A 2 story brick dwelling house, with finished basement and attic, is now in course of erection on a portion of the ground owned by Mr. Henry Miller, and on the remainder of which he intends shortly to put up buildings of a similar character. The one now advancing towards completion is intended for his own occupation, and will possess all the essentials in the way of comfort and convenience. The trimmings to the windows are of Ohio stone and Prescott white brick. Mr. James Nelson, Architect.

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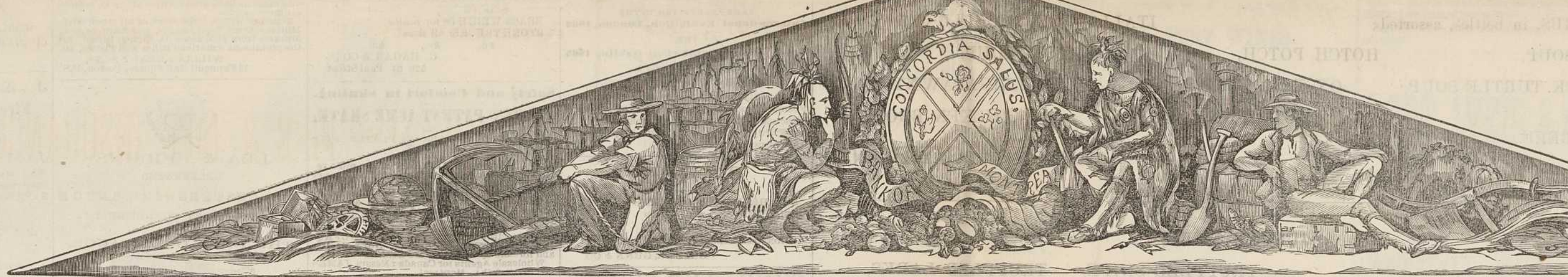
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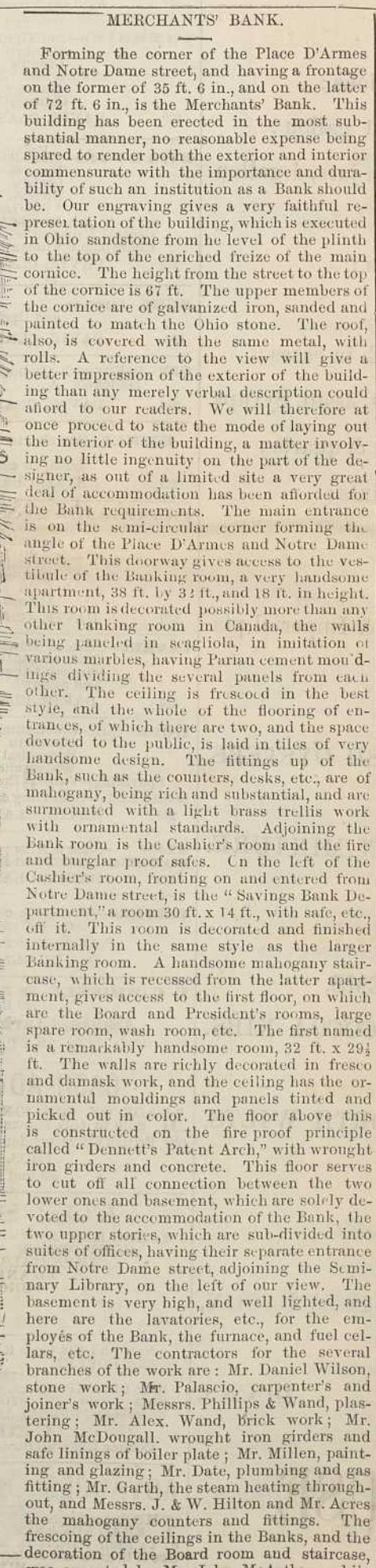

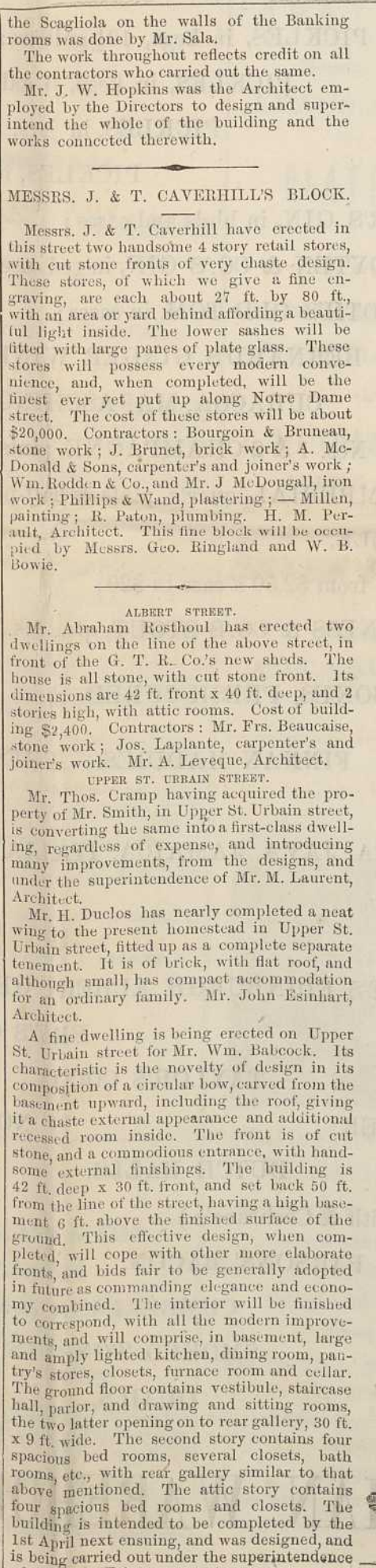
PEDIMENT FOR THE BANK OF MONTREAL. (See Letter Press on First Page.)
